Two key conference games take center stage in Week 3 of the season as Houston visits Cincinnati Thursday and Tulane hosts Navy Saturday night.

Houston, which has won 16 of its last 17 games, faces a stern test in Cincinnati, where the Bearcats have been nearly unbeatable, particularly in prime time matchups. The Bearcats were 5-1 at Nippert Stadium last season, are off to a 1-0 start at home this year, and scored a 34-23 win against Miami (Fla.) last year in a Thursday-night prime time affair.

Tulane's matchup against Navy will pit two of the nation's top running teams against each other. The Midshipmen ranked second nationally in rushing last year, while the Green Wave churned out 437 rushing yards in Saturday's win against Southern.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Quinton Flowers • Jr. • QB • USF • Miami, Fla. 
Flowers keyed USF's 48-17 win against Northern Illinois as he completed 21 of 33 passes for a career-high 350 yards and four touchdowns and added 53 rushing yards on 11 carries. Flowers had 403 yards of total offense, engineering the Bulls' 658-yard performance that ranks second in school history.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Alohi Gilman • Fr. • LB/DB • Navy • Laie, Hawaii 
Gilman registered a team-high 10 tackles to go with a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries in Navy's 28-24 win against UConn in the American Athletic Conference opener. Gilman made a key defensive play with a fumble return for a touchdown after he stripped the ball, giving the Midshipmen a 21-0 lead.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sherman Badie • Jr. • RB • Tulane • Metairie, La. 
Badie had 175 all-purpose yards, including 135 on kickoff returns, to help Tulane to a 66-21 win against Southern. Badie had an 86-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and averaged 33.8 yards on four kickoff returns to go with 40 rushing yards as the Green Wave topped the 60-point mark for the first time since 1998.

The American Athletic Conference was one of five FBS leagues that had at least three 10-win teams in 2015 (Houston, Navy, Temple). The others were the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12 and SEC.

Poll Position

Houston is ranked No. 6 in the Sept. 6 Associated Press poll, marking the best ranking for an American Athletic Conference team since the league's formation in 2013. The Cougars were ranked No. 8 in the final polls of the 2015 season.

People Watching

The Sept. 3 game between Houston and Oklahoma drew 5.7 million television viewers on ABC. The American had 18 games that drew at least one million television viewers in 2015, including Temple's Oct. 31 game against Notre Dame that had a league-record 5.9 million viewers.

Crunch Time

The American Athletic Conference has gone 2-0 in College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls or Bowl Championship Series games since the league's formation in the 2013 season.

Moving The Turnstiles

Average attendance at American Athletic Conference home stadiums improved by 9.1 percent in 2015. The average home crowd in The American was 31,842 in 2015 after an average of 29,193 in 2014.

Through two weeks of the 2016 season, The American has had an average home attendance of 33,721.

Chart Toppers

The American Athletic Conference has had a team finish in the national top 10 of the Associated Press and USA Today polls in two of its first three seasons. Houston was No. 8 in the final polls of 2015, while UCF was No. 10 to close the 2013 season.

The American placed two teams in the top 20 of the final national polls in each of those years.

Breaking Ground

Since the formation of The American, several teams have enjoyed unprecedented success in FBS football. Houston (13), Navy (11) and Temple (10) all set or tied school records for wins in 2015. Memphis won 10 games in the 2014 season to match its school record, set in 1938.

Individualism

In its first three seasons, American Athletic Conference football players have earned some of college football's most prestigious individual awards. Former Temple linebacker Tyler Matakevich won the Bednarik Award and the Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player in 2015, while former Navy quarterback Keenan Reynolds finished fifth in the Heisman Trophy voting and won the AAU Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete. Former Memphis punter Tom Hornsey was chosen as the 2013 Ray Guy Award winner as the nation's top punter.

Draft Status

The American Athletic Conference has had at least two players chosen in the first round of each of the last three NFL drafts. Former Houston cornerback William Jackson III was taken at No. 24 overall by the Cincinnati Bengals, while former Memphis quarterback Paxton Lynch went at No. 26 to the Denver Broncos in the 2016 draft. The American has had three quarterbacks taken in the first round in its first three seasons.



The second annual American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be played Saturday, Dec. 3, 2016, at noon ET and will be televised nationally on either ABC or ESPN.

The 2016 season will be The American's second in its 12-team, two-division format, in which each team will play eight conference games. Each team will face the other five teams in its own division as well as three teams from the other division.

The American's East Division includes UCF, Cincinnati, UConn, East Carolina, USF and Temple. The West Division lineup is Houston, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Tulane and Tulsa. The two divisional champions will meet in The American Championship at the home site of one of the participants.

The winner of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will have the opportunity to participate in one of the College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls if it is the highest-ranked team among the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference.

Last year's matchup saw Houston claim the inaugural American Athletic Conference Football Championship with a 24-13 win against Temple at TDECU Stadium. Cougar quarterback Greg Ward Jr., was named the Most Outstanding Player of the game as he rushed for 148 yards and two touchdowns.

Divisional Champions

The divisional champions will be the teams from each division with the highest winning percentage in all conference games – both divisional and non-divisional.

In the event of a two-team tie within a division, the head-to-head result between the tied teams will determine the divisional champion.

Championship Site

The site of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be the home venue of the divisional champion with the best record in conference games.

If the two divisional champions have the same conference record, then the regular-season head-to-head winner between the divisional champions would host the championship. If the divisional champions have the same conference record and did not play in the regular season, then the team with the better overall regular-season record would host the championship.

Houston is off to a 2-0 start to the season following a 33-23 win against then-No. 3 Oklahoma and a 42-0 decision against Lamar last Saturday ... The Cougars did not allow Lamar to cross the 50-yard line and finished with a 511-73 advantage in total offense and a 25-4 edge in first downs ... The Cougars were without several key performers against Lamar as QB Greg Ward Jr. (shoulder) and RB Duke Catalan (ankle) were held out for precautionary reasons ... Ward threw for 321 yards and two touchdowns in the win against Oklahoma, while Catalan had 88 rushing yards on 22 carries against the Sooners ... The defense has been led by LB Steven Taylor, who has 3.5 sacks through two games, while true freshman DT Ed Oliver has 10 tackles, 2.0 sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss ... Houston has won 16 of its last 17 games.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, comparative outcomes of common opponents and other factors.

Two Days

New Year's Eve and New Year's Day belong to college football, with two semifinal games and four other top bowl games continuing a wonderful tradition. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Kirby Hocutt (chair), Barry Alvarez, Jeff Bower, Herb Deromedi, Tom Jernstedt, Bobby Johnson, Jeff Long, Rob Mullens, Dan Radakovich, Condoleezza Rice, Steve Wieberg and Tyrone Willingham.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American will have either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current six-year bowl cycle. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The **Miami Beach Bowl** was played for the first time in 2014 at state-of-the-art Marlins Park in Miami, which sits on the site of the historic Orange Bowl stadium. An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year, beginning with last year's matchup against Brigham Young. Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference and the Sun Belt Conference are scheduled for future years, though institutions from other conferences also will have the opportunity to participate.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The **Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **St. Petersburg Bowl** is played at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The **Marmot Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in

Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from either the Mid-American Conference or Conference USA in 2016.

The **Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl** is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

The **Popeyes Bahamas Bowl** is played in at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium in Nassau, Bahamas. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mid-American Conference or Conference USA in 2016 and 2018.

The **AutoNation Cure Bowl** made its debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The **R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl** is held at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans. The American Athletic Conference has agreed to play in the bowl in 2018 and 2019.

The Hawai'i Bowl is played on Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will participate in the bowl in 2015, 2017 and 2019, facing an opponent from the Mountain West.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the **AutoZone Liberty Bowl** in Memphis, Tennessee, the **Duck Commander Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, Louisiana, and the **San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl** in San Diego, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.
