### 5 THINGS TO KNOW

- Elijah McGuire** enters tonight's game needing 212 all-purpose yards to pass Tyrell Fenroy (5,231) as the Ragin' Cajuns all-time leader.
- With 5,020 all-purpose yards in his career, McGuire is one of four active FBS players with 5,000 all-purpose yards.
- McGuire enters tonight's contest tied with **Alonzo Harris** (270) for third-place in school history in scoring.
- The Ragin' Cajuns have 21 players from the New Orleans Metropolitan Area (Orleans, Jefferson, St. Charles, St. John, St. Tammany and Plaquemines Parishes) on its 2016 roster.
- Tonight's game is the fifth straight played in the state of Louisiana for the Ragin' Cajuns after playing their last four games at home dating back to the 2015 finale.

### PLEASE CALL US "LOUISIANA"

**Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns®** is the nickname of the University's athletic teams. Teams also may be referred to using shorter versions of that nickname. In most cases, Ragin' Cajuns plural is proper, though Ragin' Cajun in the singular form can apply. **UL Lafayette** may be used as an abbreviation to refer to the academic institution when clarification is necessary.

• Please do not use the following in any instance: ULL, La.-Lafayette, La.-Laf., LLU, Lafayette (not to be confused with Lafayette College in Pennsylvania).

### WORKING PRESS AREA

The entrance to the Cajun Field press box is through the press elevator, located at Gate B adjacent to the elevator tower on the west side of Cajun Field.

The press box opens approximately three hours prior to game time and meals will be served in the press box beginning approximately 90 minutes before kickoff.

Working media credentials are required for admittance to the press box and for meals.

The Level 1 area is reserved for media members as well as game staff and statistical personnel. Broadcast outlets, coaches booths, game management areas and restrooms are located on Level 2. The camera deck is below Level 1.

### PRESS BOX MEDIA SERVICES

Pre-game notes, programs, guides and statistics along with other information will be provided to all media members prior to kickoff. Play-by-play and stat sheets are provided at the end of each quarter. Live running stats are also available via monitors throughout press row and on the internet at [www.ragincajuns.com](http://www.ragincajuns.com) during the game.

Members of the Louisiana SID staff will man the press box phone number, (337) 851-2255, which should be used for any questions or information needed during the game.

Louisiana and the Football Writer's Association of America (FWAA) remind you that the Cajun Field press box is a working press facility and that cheering for either team will not be tolerated. Violators will be asked to leave by security personnel.

### CAJUN FIELD CROWDS

Since the arrival of Mark Hudspeth in 2011, fans have flocked to Cajun Field in record numbers with eight of the top 15 single-game marks and 10 of 20 occurring since 2011.

For three of the past five seasons, Louisiana has led the Sun Belt Conference in average attendance, including a single-season average of 29,171 in 2011.

On page 6 are the top 20 crowds in Ragin' Cajuns football history with games in **bold** occurring since 2011:

### THE SERIES

- Tonight's contest is the 28th meeting in the series with Tulane holding a 21-6 lead.
- The Green Wave hold a 19-5 advantage in the series in New Orleans, including a 48-32 win in the last regular-season meeting between the teams (Oct. 16, 1999) in the Crescent City.
- Tulane holds a 2-1 lead in the series in games played in Lafayette.
- Tulane has officially claimed the last four meetings in the series after games in 2012 and 2013 were vacated by the Ragin' Cajuns due to NCAA sanctions

### THE LAST MEETING - Louisiana 24, Tulane 21 (Dec. 21, 2013 • New Orleans, La.)

- **Hunter Stover** kicked a 27-yard field goal – the first of his collegiate career – with 9:56 remaining and the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns earned its third straight bowl victory when Tulane's **Cairo Santos** missed a potential tying 48-yard field goal in a 24-21 win over the Green Wave before an R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl-record crowd of 54,728 Saturday night at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.
- Stover, who served as the Cajuns primary kickoff specialist before assuming all kicking duties against South Alabama, helped Louisiana stave off a furious comeback by Tulane (7-6) after **Sean Thomas** picked off his second pass of the game at the Tulane 28. The junior broke up a 21-21 contest after **Terrance Broadway** was injured on a three-yard scramble on third-and-10 to the Tulane 10.
- Tulane, playing in its final game after 38 years in the iconic downtown building, had one final chance to send the game to overtime after a **Daniel Cadona** punt was downed at the Tulane 5 with 1:35 remaining. **Devin Powell** connected with Justyn Shackleford on a 34-yard pass on third-and-10 to the Tulane 39 before a 27-yard pass to **Ryan Grant** pushed the ball to the Cajuns 34.
- After gaining 568 and 591 yards in victories over San Diego State (2011) and East Carolina (2012), Louisiana finished with 325 yards of total offense, including 168 on the ground. The Cajun defense picked off three Tulane passes with Thomas tying a bowl-record with two interceptions and Corey Trim returning an interception 82 yards to set a bowl record.
- **Terrance Broadway**, who returned to the lineup after suffering a broken arm in the Cajuns' home finale against ULM on Nov. 30, completed 12 of 19 passes for 143 yards while **Elijah McGuire** rushed for 45 yards on 11 carries while grabbing seven passes for 94. **Alonzo Harris** added 74 yards on the ground for Louisiana, who controlled the ball of over 36 minutes and held Tulane to 3-for-12 on third-down.

### CAJUNS HIT THE 500-MARK IN WINS ... AGAIN

- Louisiana's 30-22 victory over in-state rival McNeese State on Sept. 10 marked the 500th career victory for the program. The victory marked the second time the Ragin' Cajuns hit the 500 mark with 22 wins from 2011-14 vacated due to NCAA sanctions.
- Ironically, the previous 500th win came against a Southland Conference school when the Cajuns defeated Nicholls State, 70-7, in 2013.
- Louisiana's official record against all opponents dating back to 1901 is 501-539-34.

### FORMER RAGIN' CAJUN PEANUT TILLMAN JOINS CREW AT "FOX NFL KICKOFF"

- After announcing his retirement this summer after a spectacular 13-year career in the NFL, former Ragin' Cajuns star Charles "Peanut" Tillman was announced as a new member on FOX NFL Kickoff.
- Tillman, a member of the UL Athletics Hall of Fame, played for Louisiana from 1999-02 and was the first Ragin' Cajuns player to be named to the All-Sun Belt Conference team (2001).

### KEEPING IT IN THE BAYOU STATE

- Louisiana will avoid using their "Frequent Flyer" miles for much of the 2016 as the Ragin' Cajuns will play eight regular-season games within the state borders.
- The Ragin' Cajuns will play six games at Cajun Field and will travel to face Tulane and ULM.
- Louisiana will not leave the state during the month of September as it will play Boise State (Sept. 3), McNeese State (Sept. 10) and South Alabama (Sept. 17) at home before traveling for the first time in 2016 to face Tulane (Sept. 24) at Yulman Stadium.
- Louisiana's first trip out of state will be on Oct. 1 when it visits New Mexico State in a Sun Belt Conference game.

### HOMEGROWN CAJUNS

- As with most schools, Louisiana has placed a heavy emphasis on recruiting players within its state borders as 56 players on the roster, including 19 from the nine-parish Acadiana region, hail from the state of Louisiana.

### THE CAJUNS ALSO HAVE THE INTERNATIONAL FLAIR

- Two members of the Ragin' Cajuns squad are international players: punter **Steven Coutts** (Australia) and reserve lineman **Christian Cederquist** (Denmark).

### SBC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME COMING IN 2018

- The Sun Belt Conference will hold its first ever football championship game as the league's presidents and chancellors, as well as athletic directors, voted unanimously to play the game beginning in 2018. The announcement was made on June 8, 2016.
- Details regarding how the two participants will be selected will be available at a later date. Rules set forward by the Division I Council in January require conferences with fewer than 12 members to hold championship games in football, as long as they meet one of two conditions.
- A conference can choose to either play their championship game between division winners after round-robin competition in each division or between the top two teams in the conference standings following full round-robin, regular-season competition between all members of the conference.

### CAJUNS PUT IN WORK IN COMMUNITY AFTER HISTORIC FLOODS

• After the historic flooding that took place in many parts of Louisiana in August, the Ragin' Cajuns football team did their part in helping in the recovery.

• On Aug. 16, the Ragin' Cajuns football team along with the coaching and support staff, loaded three buses and assisted residents in Youngsville's Highland Ridge Subdivision.

• The team helped remove debris from flooded homes, assisted in ripping out floors, with several team and strength staff members physically moving a car.

• On Aug. 20, head coach **Mark Hudspeth** would later be interviewed by Sarah Walsh on ESPN's SportsCenter with footage of the Cajuns' work being shown to a national audience.

### SPECIAL TEAMS DEMON REGGIE MILES AWARDED SCHOLARSHIP

• After earning a spot on the Ragin' Cajuns as a walk-on in 2013 and leading the team in special teams tackles in 2015, fifth-year senior Reggie Miles was awarded a scholarship on Aug. 19.

• Miles, who spent his freshman year at UL watching the Cajuns play from the stands at Cajun Field in 2012, played in 18 games prior to the 2016 season. As a junior in 2015, Miles recorded nine tackles - all on special teams - with three stops coming against Kentucky.

• During a team meeting on Aug. 19, Miles was presented with the award of MVP of fall camp. Head coach **Mark Hudspeth** then told the senior in front of the team that he had been awarded a scholarship for his final season with the Cajuns.

## QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- Senior transfer **Anthony Jennings** tied a career-high with three passing touchdowns against South Alabama to lead the Ragin' Cajuns to a 28-23 victory. He passed for three touchdowns as a sophomore at LSU against Sam Houston State in 2014.
- Jennings posted a career-best 256 passing yards going 18-for-26 in the win over the Jaguars. His previous career-high for passing was 239 yards against 14th-ranked Wisconsin in the 2014 season opener for LSU.
- Jennings has thrown for a touchdown in all three games in 2016.
- Jennings accounted for three of the Cajuns four touchdowns in the win against McNeese. His two rushing touchdowns are a career-best. The last time Jennings rushed for a touchdown was in the first quarter of the 2013 Outback Bowl against Iowa.
- Jennings is averaging just over 10 carries per game on the season and is second on the team with 91 yards on 32 carries through three games.
- Jennings saw his first career action for the Ragin' Cajuns in the season opener against Boise State. He threw for 186 yards and a touchdown against the Broncos.
- Jennings also rushed 16 times in the contest picking up 18 yards on the ground despite losing 38 yards on five sacks.
- Jennings spent three seasons at LSU seeing action in 24 games including 13 starts. He passed for 1,611 yards and 11 touchdowns as a sophomore for the Tigers.
- Jennings rushed for 310 yards and two touchdowns in his career at LSU.
- Jennings earned his degree from LSU in August.
- Senior **Jalen Nixon** saw action at quarterback against Boise State rushing for 20 yards on three carries.
- Nixon had the second most experience among the quarterbacks coming into the season passing for 937 yards and eight touchdowns in three seasons.
- Nixon has rushed for 469 yards on 75 carries while finding the endzone five times in his career.
- Nixon started in four games for the Cajuns in 2016 including road games at Louisiana Tech and Arkansas State and home games Texas State and ULM.
- Nixon joined **Brian Mitchell** as the only Ragin' Cajuns quarterbacks to record 200 yards rushing and passing in a single-game after passing for 253 yards and two TDs while rushing for 201 yards and adding a 75-yard TD run.
- Nixon saw action in the Cajuns 2013 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl appearance.
- Sophomore **Jordan Davis** saw limited action in three games as a freshman completing 26 of 41 passes for 256 yards and a touchdown.
- Davis' longest outing came in the series finale against Troy going 19-for-33 through the air for 196 yards and a touchdown.
- Davis recorded his only rushing touchdown of the season on the final drive of the game at Appalachian State. He went 7-for-7 through the air before capping the drive with a 20-yard TD run.

## RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- Senior **Elijah McGuire** became the first running back in school history to post multiple 200-yard rushing performances in a career after rushing for 223 yards on 23 carries against South Alabama. **Brian Mitchell** is the only other player in program history to record more than one 200-yard game for the Ragin' Cajuns with three in four seasons. The 200-yard performance is just the tenth in school history including McGuire's 265-yard game at Arkansas State in 2014.
- McGuire's fourth quarter touchdown against South Alabama moved him into a tie with former teammate **Alonzo Harris** on the Ragin' Cajuns career scoring list with 270 points in over three seasons. He is 16 points back of **Brian Mitchell** for second all-time with 286 points, while **Tyrell Fenroy** holds the school record with 294 points in four seasons.
- McGuire ranks second all-time in career rushing yards with 3,593 in over three seasons. He has passed both former teammate **Alonzo Harris** and **Brian Mitchell** on the all-time list this season. McGuire is 1,053 yards back of Tyrell Fenroy for the school record of 4,646.
- McGuire has 14 career 100-yard games including two this season. He rushed for 139 yards on 19 carries against McNeese.
- McGuire ranks sixth nationally in active career rushing yards and fourth in active career touchdowns.
- McGuire is the only active running back in the FBS to post 3,000 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving.
- McGuire holds the school career record for both receptions (107) and receiving yards (1,185) by a running back.

• Wright and Calais both have made at least one carry in all three of the Cajuns games in 2016.

### WIDE RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

• Senior **Al Riles** had a career game against South Alabama posting a career-best 139 yards receiving on eight catches and a touchdown. His touchdown came on a career-long reception of 71 yards.

• Riles became the second player on the Cajuns squad to post 1,000 career receiving yards joining **Elijah McGuire** after his 139-yard effort against South Alabama. He currently has 1,025 career yards and is averaging 11.1 yards per catch.

• Riles needs eight catches to reach 100 career catches for the Cajuns despite starting his career with the Cajuns on the defensive side of the ball in 2013. He switched to over to receiver as a sophomore.

• Sophomore **Keenan Barnes** found the end zone for the second time this season against the Jaguars. After making just one catch a year ago, he has reached paydirt on two of his six receptions this year.

• Redshirt freshmen **Michael Jacquet** registered his first career touchdown against South Alabama on his only catch of the game. He posted two catches for 17 yards in his first action as a Cajun against Boise State.

• Jacquet joins **Ja'Marcus Bradley** and **Gabe Fuselier** as the only freshmen to catch a touchdown pass in the Hudspeth era.

• Former Ragin' Cajuns quarterback **Michael Desormeaux** takes over as the new wide receivers coach in 2016. Desormeaux ranks fifth all-time in career rushing yards and ninth in passing yards in school history.

• Five Cajuns receivers have caught at least one pass in each of the last two games. Both Riles and Bradley are averaging 16 yards per catch through three games.

• Bradley was limited to just one catch against South Alabama after leading the Ragin' Cajuns in receptions the first two weeks of the season.

• Barnes posted the only touchdown for the Cajuns against Boise State. He made just one catch for 27 yards in 2015 seeing action in nine games as a true freshman.

• In 2015, Riles caught at least one pass in all 11 games that he saw action in, making nine starts.

• Riles recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game with 103 yards on eight receptions and a touchdown at Georgia State in 2015.

• Fuselier comes into 2016 as the second most experienced receiver on the corps behind Riles having hauled in 68 passes for 632 and three touchdowns in over two seasons.

• Fuselier notched 146 all-purpose yards at Kentucky after catching seven passes for 69 yards while adding four kickoff returns for 77 yards.

• Fuselier finished third overall on the team in all-purpose yards (642) in 2015.

• Sophomore **Gary Haynes** posted 25 grabs for 174 yards in 10 games as a true freshman.

• Junior **Jared Johnson** saw his first action in over a year against McNeese after missing the 2015 season with a torn ACL. He recorded 161 yards and three touchdowns on 16 catches in two seasons.

• All three of Johnson's touchdowns came during his sophomore campaign.

• The Ragin' Cajuns will be without the services of senior **Devin Scott** after suffering a season-ending injury during summer workouts. Scott has posted 326 yards receiving over three seasons on 18 catches.

## OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- The Ragin' Cajuns return five offensive linemen who made at least one start in 2015 with senior **Eddie Gordon** and junior **Grant Horst** making double-digit starts.
- Gordon started in all 12 games in 2015 including 11 starts at center. He appeared in six games as a reserve lineman in 2014 at both center and right guard.
- Horst started in 10 games during the 2015 season at four different positions: left tackle (5), left guard (3), center (1) and right guard (1). He appeared in six games as a freshman as a reserve offensive lineman.
- Junior **D'Aquin Withrow** played in nine games during the 2015 season, starting in seven straight games for the Cajuns at left tackle.
- Freshman **Robert Hunt** has started in all three games for the Ragin' Cajuns at left guard.
- **Kevin Dotson** has started the last two games at right guard. His first career start came against McNeese.
- Sophomore **Adrian Goodacre** saw action in all 12 games in 2015, serving primarily as a reserve offensive lineman and a member of the Ragin' Cajuns PAT unit.
- Goodacre made two starts at right guard as a true freshman.

## DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- The Ragin' Cajuns made a change from a three defensive lineman scheme against Boise State to a four defensive lineman look against McNeese and South Alabama.
- Junior **Taboris Lee** had the most tackles among defensive lineman against South Alabama making five stops for the second straight contest. He also had 1.5 tackles-for-loss (TFL) on the night.

- Senior **Otha Peters** takes over as both the leader of the linebacker corps and the defense with the departure of **Dominique Tovell**. Peters was the third-leading tackler for the Ragin' Cajuns a year ago, recording 68 stops (41 solo) and six tackles-for-loss (TFL).
- An honorable mention All-Sun Belt selection in 2015, Peters was tabbed to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Second Team.
- Peters ranks third on the team in total tackles with 20 this season and is tied for the team lead in TFL with 3.5.
- Senior **Tre'maine Lightfoot** led the Cajuns with a career-high 10 tackles against South Alabama. He ranks second on the team in tackles this season with 23.
- Peters also made a major contribution in the win over the Jags with nine stops, 1.5 TFL, a sack, a forced fumble and two pass breakups.

### GAME 1

#### BOISE STATE 45, LOUISIANA 10

**LAFAYETTE** – Jeremy McNichols rushed for a pair of first-half touchdowns and added a 48-yard scoring pass in the second quarter as Boise State built a 35-3 lead at halftime and defeated the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns, 45-10, in the season-opener for both teams on Saturday at Cajun Field.

Brett Rypien completed 22 of 33 passes for 347 yards and a pair of TD passes as Boise State (1-0) scored touchdowns on four of its first five possessions while gaining 387 of its 584 yards of total offense in the first half.

With 17 players seeing their first action in a Ragin' Cajuns uniform, Louisiana (0-1) finished with 267 yards of total offense with graduate transfer quarterback Anthony Jennings completing 21 of 33 passes for 186 yards and a TD pass. Elijah McGuire led the Ragin' Cajuns with 46 yards rushing while catching a team-high six passes. Ja'Marcus Bradley caught three passes in his debut while Keenan Barnes caught an 11-yard scoring pass from Jennings for his first career TD.

Boise State scored on its first two possessions as McNichols scored on a 1-yard TD run before Rypien connected with Cedric Wilson on a 42-yard scoring pass. The Broncos increased their lead to 21-0 in the second quarter as McNichols caught a 48-yard TD pass from receiver Thomas Sperbeck before McNichols added a 7-yard scoring run with 12:35 remaining in the second quarter.

Rypien tossed his second TD for Boise State as he connected with Sperbeck on a 35-yard scoring pass for a 35-0 lead with 1:29 remaining in the half before Louisiana closed out the half with Stevie Artigue connecting on a 44-yard field goal.

Jennings, making his first start since 2014 when he was at LSU, and Jalen Nixon combined to engineer a 15-play, 75-yard drive that was aided by a pass interference penalty by Boise State on fourth-and-8 at the BSU 38. Five plays later, Jennings hit Barnes on a slant pass in the left side of the end zone that cut the lead to 38-10 with 12:53 remaining.

Travis Crawford recorded a career-high 10 tackles to lead Louisiana with Otha Peters adding eight tackles with two stops for loss.

#### LOUISIANA 30, McNEESE STATE 22

**LAFAYETTE** – A pair of scoring plays over a three-minute span in the third quarter carried Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns Football past McNeese and to a 30-22 triumph Saturday evening at Cajun Field.

Freshman Raymond Calais' first career touchdown run came at 7:18 of the third quarter and vaulted the Ragin' Cajuns (1-1) back into the lead at 21-15.

After forcing the Cowboys (1-1) into a three-and-out, Anthony Jennings connected with Al Riles for a 34-yard gain to the McNeese 16. After a roughing the passer penalty brought the Ragin' Cajuns into a goal line situation, Jennings scored two plays later on a five-yard scamper at 4:02 that increased the lead to 27-15.

Louisiana's defense cornered the Cowboys their next three possessions, forcing a punt each time to protect the lead. McNeese added a touchdown in the waning moments of the fourth quarter on a Dylan Long rush with 12 seconds remaining.

Jennings completed 15-of-21 passes for 170 yards and a touchdown. His two touchdown runs, the latter which opened a two-score lead in the third quarter, were his first rushing scores since the 2013 Outback Bowl appearance at LSU.

Elijah McGuire gained 139 yards on 19 attempts, increasing his career rushing total to 3,370. McGuire moved past Alonzo Harris (3,330) and Brian Mitchell (3,335) into second place on the school's career rushing yards list.

Ja'Marcus Bradley led all receivers with 97 yards. He hauled in a 17-yard touchdown pass from Jennings at 4:11 of the first quarter which gave Louisiana the lead for the remainder of the opening stanza.

On their first possession of the second half, the Cowboys moved the ball to the UL 11 before settling for a 28-yard field goal by Trent Manuel that provided a 15-14 lead.

After a 37-yard kickoff return by Calais and 29 yard rush by McGuire, the Ragin' Cajuns were deep inside McNeese territory at the 25 yard line. Two Darius Hoggins rushes that totaled 15 yards set up Louisiana with first-and-goal, then two plays later Calais bowled over a McNeese defender to the go-ahead score.

#### LOUISIANA 28, SOUTH ALABAMA 23

**LAFAYETTE** – The offense came alive in the second half, fueled by 168 yards rushing from Elijah McGuire and 135 yards receiving by Al Riles, as the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns topped South Alabama 28-23 in the squad's 2016 Sun Belt Conference opener.

Riles was on the receiving end of a 71-yard touchdown pass from Anthony Jennings at 10:39 of the third quarter as Louisiana (2-1, 1-0 Sun Belt) began to extend its lead over South Alabama (1-2, 0-2 Sun Belt), opening a 15-7 lead.

On the team's next possession, Jennings found Keenan Barnes on a 38-yard hookup for a score that stretched the lead to 22-7 with 4:46 remaining in the third quarter.

Just as he sealed the win over the Jaguars in the 2014 meeting at Cajun Field with a touchdown run in the fourth quarter, McGuire came through again. The senior running back broke through the USA defensive line for a 68-yard score with 7:05 remaining to end a string of 10 unanswered points by the Jaguars and increase the lead to 28-17.

After Dallas Davis connected with Gerald Everett for a touchdown with 3:17 left to play, Riles and McGuire made the plays which allowed the Ragin' Cajuns to run out the clock. Riles gained 22 yards on a reception that brought Louisiana near midfield, then McGuire provided another first down with a 24 yard scamper down to the Jaguars 28 yard line.

McGuire ended the night with a season-high 223 yards rushing, his second-highest career total and the 14th 100-plus effort of his career.

Riles' final tally of 139 yards receiving marked a career-high amount for the senior receiver. Jennings completed 18-of-26 passes for his season-best total of 256 yards. He tossed three touchdown passes tying his career-high.

The Ragin' Cajuns outgained the Jaguars 512-338, with an even split of 256 yards between rushing and passing, and exploded for 378 yards in the decisive second half.

After stopping the Jaguars on a fourth-down conversion on the game's opening drive, Louisiana drove 75 yards capped by a 13-yard Jennings touchdown pass to Michael Jacquet at 4:22 for an early 6-0 lead.

USA gained the lead at the onset of the second quarter on a Tyreis Thomas touchdown run and remained ahead until a 31-yard field goal by Stevie Artigue with 37 seconds remaining before halftime gave the Ragin' Cajuns a 9-7 lead.
