

HEADLINES

- Temple is 16-5 overall with a 6-2 mark in American Athletic Conference play.
- The Owls fell 97-69 at the hands of #1 UConn on Wednesday, giving Temple back-to-back losses for the first time this season.
- Tanaya Atkinson tallied a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds, while Alliya Butts (14 points) and Khadijah Berger (12 points) also scored in double figures.
- Feyonda Fitzgerald finished with seven points and seven assists, while Ruth Sherrill had six points and six boards to round out the highlights against UConn.
- Tulane is 15-7 overall with a 6-3 mark in The American.
- The Green Wave have won five out of their last six games, including a 57-49 win at Houston on Tuesday.
- Temple head coach Tonya Cardoza is in her ninth-season at the helm of the Owls, compiling an overall record of 180-105.
- Cardoza became the program's all-time winningest coach on January 1, surpassing Dawn Staley's 172 victories from 2000 to 2008.

NEWS AND NOTES

CARDOZA'S CREW

In her ninth season at the helm of Temple women's basketball is Tonya Cardoza. In her time on North Broad Street, she's led the Owls to six post-season berths, including three NCAA Tournament appearances and a spot in the WNIT Final Four. The 2011 Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year and three-time Big 5 Coach of the Year notched her 100th career win in 2013 at St. Bonaventure (1/13/13).

Prior to taking the reigns at TU from former college teammate Dawn Staley, Cardoza spent 14 seasons as an assistant coach at UConn with Geno Auriemma. During her tenure, the Huskies captured five national championships.

SCOUTING TEMPLE

Temple is 16-5 overall with a 6-2 mark in American Athletic Conference play. Temple had a string of 12-straight victories snapped by #23 USF last Sunday and also fell to #1 UConn on Wednesday.

Four Temple players average in double-figures in scoring, led by senior guard Feyonda Fitzgerald's 17.4 points and 7.5 assists per contest, with the assist number ranked her sixth in the nation. Junior Alliya Butts averages 15.0 points per game with a team-best 45 steals. Junior Donnaizha Fountain averages 13.1 points and 7.4 rebounds per game, while classmate Tanaya Atkinson (12.2 ppg, 8.4 rpg) contributes on both ends of the floor.

Senior Ruth Sherrill has started the last 14 games for the Owls and averages 5.2 points and 7.2 rebounds per game. Junior Khadijah Berger averages 5.2 points and 2.9 boards per game, while senior Safiya Martin (2.0 ppg, 3.3 rpg) tops the team with 23 total blocks.

Temple averages 70.4 points per game, giving up 60.8. The Owls shoot 39.2% from the field and 31.9% from long-range. Temple forces an average of 16.6 turnovers per game, and out-rebounds opponents by a +5.4 margin.

LAST TIME OUT

Temple fell 97-69 at the hands of the top-ranked UConn Huskies on Wednesday night. UConn built a 54-18 lead at the break, negating a third-quarter that saw Temple out-score the Huskies, 29-22. For the game, the Owls out-rebounded UConn, 42-30, including 26-8 on the offensive glass, but the Huskies forced 19 Temple turnovers and outshot the Owls, 61.3% to 36.5%.

Tanaya Atkinson recorded her sixth double-double of the season, scoring 20 points with 10 rebounds (nine offensive) and adding a career-high four assists. Alliya Butts finished with 13 points, five assists, and two steals, while classmate Khadijah Berger notched 12 points. Feyonda Fitzgerald scored seven points and dished out seven assists, while senior Ruth Sherrill had six points and six rebounds and junior Donnaizha Fountain had six points

SCOUTING TULANE

Tulane is 15-7 overall, with a 6-3 mark in conference play, and have won five out of their last six games.

The Greenwave are led by Kolby Morgan's 18.5 points per game, while Leslie Vorpahl adds 11.7 points and 6.0 assists an outing. Both players are threats from long-range, with Morgan connecting for a team-best 44 threes, shooting 36.7% and Vorpahl second with 33 makes and a 36.3% shot from beyond-the-arc.

The Green Wave starters include Courtnie Latham (7.5 ppg), Harlyn Wyatt (7.0 ppg, 4.7 rpg), and Meredith Schulte (5.4 ppg, team-high 4.9 rpg). Wyatt leads the team in field goal percentage, shooting 55.8% on the season, while also blocking 17 total shots.

As a team, Tulane scores 64.0 points per game, holding opponents to 61.2. The Green Wave shoot 43.5% from the field as a team, and 32.5% from three. Tulane forces 15.9 turnovers per game, but is being out-rebounded by a margin of 1.6 boards a game.

LAST TIME OUT

Tulane grinded out a 57-49 road victory at Houston on Tuesday night. Up just 51-45, Kolby Morgan and Meredith Schulte connected on back-to-back three's to hand Tulane its lone double-digit lead of the game. Tulane's defense then did its part by limiting Houston to just 2-of-12 from the floor in the fourth to seal the win.

Morgan secured her seventh straight game with 20+ points with 25 on 10-of-19 shooting, nearly earning her second straight double-double with a team-high nine rebounds. Harlyn Wyatt tallied her second straight game with double-digit points with 10 points, seven rebounds, on a 5-for-7 effort from the field.

THE OWLS VS. THE GREEN WAVE

Temple leads the all-time series with Tulane, 5-1, including winning four-straight against the Green Wave. The teams did not meet until Tulane began American Athletic Conference play in 2014.

LAST TIME THEY MET: January 8, 2017 - Temple 86, Tulane 71

Temple won its seventh-straight game, downing visiting Tulane, 86-71, at McGonigle Hall. Three players reached the 20-point mark for the Owls, including Tanaya Atkinson, whose 21 points included the 1,000th of her career. Alliya Butts tied for team-high honors with 21 points, while Feyonda Fitzgerald tallied her fourth-straight double-double with 20 points and a career-high 13 assists. Ruth Sherrill also grabbed a double-double, posting 10 points and a game-high 10 boards, while Atkinson added eight rebounds.

Temple jumped out to a 21-7 advantage after the first quarter and worked around hot three-point shooting from the Green Wave in the second half to seal the victory. Both teams shot over 50% in the final two quarters, but Temple finished with the final shooting edge, 48.5% (32-66) to 41.4% (29-70). The Owls also held a 43-34 advantage on

the boards, the ninth time this season that the cherry and white have out-rebounded their opponent.

BIG 5 TITLE

Temple took home the 2016-17 Philadelphia Big 5 title on January 25 at the Palestra with a 63-53 win over Penn. The victory sealed the Owls' 4-0 record against Big 5 opponents this season, giving Temple its first title since the 2010-11 season.

Temple now has 10 Big 5 Championships in school history, with Cardoza claiming three in her time on North Broad Street. Dawn Staley won a record five Big 5 titles for the Owls, with Linda McDonald winning two.

FITZGERALD MAKES THE LIST

Senior Feyonda Fitzgerald joined an elite group of players on Tuesday, being named to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association mid-season watch list for the Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's National Player of the Year Award.

Balloting for the USBWA's Women's All-America Team and the association's individual awards will take place in March. The Ann Myers Drysdale Award, National Coach of the Year and the Freshman of the Year awards will be presented at a news conference in conjunction with the Women's Final Four in Dallas.

TONYA ON TOP

Head coach Tonya Cardoza became Temple's all-time winningest coach with an Owl victory at Memphis on January 1, 2017.

Cardoza passed former teammate, Dawn Staley, who tallied 172 total victories for Temple between 2000 and 2008.

RECEIVING VOTES

Temple now appears in the "also receiving votes" section on both of the national polls. In the Associated Press poll, the Owls got 4 votes this week, while in the USA Today Coaches Poll, Temple got 13 votes.

The last time that a Temple team was nationally ranked was the 2005-06 season when the Owls closed out the year ranked No. 19 (AP) and No. 23 (USA Today) in the final poll. Temple's highest ever national ranking came during 2004-05 season when the Owls reached No. 15 on both polls.

FITZGERALD RE-WRITES THE RECORD BOOKS

Temple senior Feyonda Fitzgerald broke a 34-year old Temple record on January 11, recording her 508th career assist. The guard surpassed Donna Kennedy (1979-83) for the most all-time in program history.

Fitzgerald is also gunning for Dallese Jackson's season record of 202 assists. Last year, Fitzgerald dished out 186 total helpers, landing her second all-time on the season list. This season, she's tallied 157 through 21 games.

As a scorer, Fitzgerald is now tied for third all-time in Temple women's basketball history with 1,636 points. She recently tied Pam Balogh's 1,636 points from 1985 to 1989, and can pass Candice Dupree (2002-06) who is second on the Owls' all-time list with 1.698.

FIRE FROM OUTSIDE

Junior Alliya Butts became Temple's all-time career leader in threes on December 22, with six makes from beyond-the-arc. She passed former teammate and current Director of Operations, Tyonna Williams' 171 makes from long-range.

Butts also owns two of the top three best single-season numbers for threes. As a freshman in 2014-15 she made 71 from long-range, which ranks second all-time. Last season, Butts had 77 threes, which tied Shey Peddy's 2011-12 season for the most in school history.

TALE OF TWO HALVES

Temple's first half and second half could not have been more different against UConn on February 1. In the first half, the Owls scored just 18 points, shooting 19.4%, while in the second, Temple exploded for 51 points, shooting 52.6%.

Temple's second half turnaround way keyed by a 29-point third quarter, which matched the most points that UConn had given up in a quarter this season. The Owls finished with 51 second half points, the most against UConn this season.

In addition, Temple's 51-45 second-half edge against the Huskies was the first time they had been out-scored in a half this year.

EVERYONE DESERVES A SECOND CHANCE

The Owls put on an offensive rebounding clinic against #1 UConn on February 1, as Temple pulled down a season-best 26 offensive boards. The offensive rebounding led the Owls to a 25-9 advantage in second chance points against the Huskies.

The 26 offensive rebounds were the most for Temple since grabbing 29 in an 81-58 win over Georgetown on November 21, 2014.

NATIONALLY-RANKED OPPONENTS

Temple is 1-3 against nationally-ranked opponents this season. The Owls knocked off #17/16 DePaul 84-74 at home on December 15, making the first win for TU against a non-conference ranked opponent since November 24, 2007 when the Owls upset #22 Purdue 61-47.

The Owls came up short in three games against nationally-ranked foes. Temple fell at #19/23 Florida on November 20, 83-76, and then dropped a 55-51 game to #23 USF on January 29. Most recently, the Owls dropped a 97-69 game to #1 UConn on

RING OF HONOR

Temple women's basketball inducted its first-ever honorees into Temple Basketball Ring of Honor on Wednesday, February 1. Aggie Stegmuller ('45) and Lynn Blaszczyk Petruzzelli ('83) nowl have their names permanently displayed on the Ring of Honor that adorns the walls above the upper bowl of the Liacouras Center.

A four-sport student-athlete when she attended Temple in the 1940s, Aggie Stegmuller was a key member of three Owl teams that posted an unblemished 27-0 mark from 1942-43 through 1944-45. A member of the Temple Athletics Hall of Fame, Stegmuller also earned two degrees from the University and was a fixture at all Temple athletics events as a prominent member of the Owl Club before passing away in April of 2010 at the age of 87.

One of the top inside players in Temple women's basketball history, Lynn Blaszczyk Petruzelli patrolled the paint for the Owls from 1979 through 1983. The Temple Athletics and Philadelphia Big 5 Hall of Famer finished her remarkable career as the school's second all-time leading scorer with 1,329 points and is still the Owls' second all-time leading rebounder with 949 rebounds. She is one of only four Temple players to average double figure rebounds for a season.

STREAKING OWLS

When #23 USF ended Temple's 12 game winning streak, it was the longest for the Owls since the 2011-12 season that saw the cherry and white take 14 in a row. The 2016-17 streak began on December 10 at Villanova, with an 83-48 win over the Wildcats, and carried through a 63-53 win over Penn on January 25.

The Temple record for consecutive wins is 25, set during the 2004-05 season. When the streak ended, it was the longest in the nation among NCAA Division I men's and women's teams. That team finished the year 28-4 overall, advancing to the second round of the NCAA tournament, and ended with a number 15 national ranking.

FITZGERALD NAMED TO AMERICAN HONOR ROLL

Senior Feyonda Fitzgerald earned a spot on the American Athletic Conference Weekly Honor Roll on Monday.

Fitzgerald averaged 13.5 points and 7.5 assists in a 1-1 week. On Wednesday at Penn, the guard helped the Owls seal the Big 5 title with 13 points and seven assists in a 63-53 win at Penn. On Sunday, Fitzgerald scored 14 points with eight assists and four rebounds as Temple's fourth quarter rally against #23 USF fell just short.

DOUBLE THE FUN (x4!)

Four different Temple players have notched double-doubles for the Owls this season -- junior Tanaya Atkinson, senior Feyonda Fitzgerald, junior Donnaizha Fountain, and senior Ruth Sherrill. That's tied for the most of any team in the American Athletic Conference this season.

Atkinson leads the pack with six, Fitzgerald has five, Fountain has four, and Sherrill has three.

Both Atkinson and Fitzgerald have had strings of three-straight double-doubles, the first for Temple since Erica Covile '16 accomplished the milestone last season. Fitzgerald went further and extended that streak to four in a row, accomplishing the feat against Fairfield, Memphis, Kennesaw State, and Tulane.

THE OFFENSE DOESN'T STOP

Temple has out-scored its opponents in three out of four quarters of action this season, plus overtime. The only quarter that Temple is being out-scored in is the second, due in large part to the Owls being outscored 27-10 against #1 UConn in the second.

FITZGERALD EARNS NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Feyonda Fitzgerald earned national recognition on December 19, being named the National Player of the Week by ESPNW on Monday. The ESPN honor caps a weekly performance that saw her also grab American and Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Week nods.

The guard led the Owls to a 2-0 record, which included an upset victory over #17/16 DePaul and a win over Rutgers. Fitzgerald averaged 22.0 points, 4.0 assists, and 3.5 steals as Temple moved to 7-3 overall. In the 84-74 win over DePaul, she led all players with 25 points, adding four rebounds, and three assists. Closing the week with a win at Rutgers, Fitzgerald tallied 19 points, six steals and four assists, as Temple topped the Scarlet Knights for the first time in six years. In two games, she shot 47% (15-32) from the field, and her six steals at Rutgers tied a career-best.

GRABBING THAT OT WIN ON THE ROAD

Temple's overtime win on the road at Memphis on January 1, was the first for the Owls in eight seasons.

Before the extra time win against the Tigers, the last time that a Temple team won an OT game on the road was a 75-71 victory at Tulane on December 28, 2008.

CONFERENCE OPENERS

For the fourth-straight year, the Owls opened American Athletic Conference play against Memphis. With an overtime win over the Tigers this season, the Owls are now 4-0 in American openers.

In overall conference openers, Temple stands 20-14 overall (since 1983-84) and is currently riding a seven-game winning streak.

OWLS VS. OWLS

The January 1 game at Kennesaw State was just the third ever Owl vs. Owl meeting in Temple women's basketball program history.

Seven US colleges claim the Owl as their mascot:

- · Florida Atlantic (NCAA Div. I)
- · Keene State (NCAA Div. III)
- Kennesaw State (NCAA Div. I)
- Oregon Institute of Technology (NAIA)
- · Rice (NCAA Div. I)
- Southern Connecticut State (NCAA Div. II)

Temple is now 3-0 against other teams nicknamed the Owls. TU won a pair of one-point games against Southern Connecticut State, one in 1975, and the other in 1983, before topping Kennesaw State by 41 points in January.

DEFENSE WINS

Temple played lock-down second-half defense in a win at Rutgers on December 17. The Owls allowed the Scarlet Knights just 11 points in the final 20 minutes of a 48-37 win.

The 37 points that Temple allowed was the best defensive effort for the cherry and white since a 55-35 win over SMU at home on February 3, 2016.

In addition, the four points that Temple allowed in the fourth quarter was the lowest total for Owl opponents this season. It also ties for the second-lowest opponent output in a quarter since the NCAA moved to the four-quarter system.

GLASS MASTERS

After pulling down a season-best 50 rebounds in a win at Villanova on December 10, Temple topped that number with 51 to upset #17/16 DePaul on December 15.

The last time a Temple team had 50 or more rebounds was February 8, 2016, when the Owls had 63 in a five-overtime, 100-97 loss at Memphis. The last time a Temple team had 50 or more rebounds in a regulation game was when the Owls pulled down 51 vs. Georgetown on November 21, 2014 in an 81-58 win.

Temple's +23 rebounding margin against Villanova was the largest for the Owls since a +26 margin in a win over Sacred Heart on December 9, 2015.

Feyonda Fitzgerald has contributed in all aspects of the game for the Owls during her career. Shooting up the all-time career points and assists chart for Temple, the guard can also be counted on to rebound. Three times in her career, she has led the Owls in points, rebounds, and assists in the same game:

- 27 pts, 9 rebounds, 3 assists at Rutgers, 11/22/15
- 16 points, 7 rebounds, 7 assists at #20 USF, 2/27/16
- 27 points, 9 rebounds, 9 assists vs. La Salle, 11/14/16
 Prior to Fitzgerald's 2015 game against Rutgers where she accomplished the feat, the last Temple player to do it was Shey Peddy in 2011, when she recorded 26 pts, 9 rebounds, and 4 assists vs. Duquesne.

FUTURE FAB FIVE

Temple has signed five talented recruits to join the Owls for the 2017-18 season. The signing class includes Mia Davis, Emani Mayo, Desiree Oliver, Breanna Perry, and Tajae Stevenson.

Mia Davis is a 5-11 forward hailing from Baltimore, Md. A student at St. Frances Academy High School, she plays for the MD Shooting Stars AAU team. A two-time first-team All-Conference selection, she was named Beast of the East MVP, as well as an Adidas Uprising MVP. As the leading scorer on her high school team, she led them to the State Championship with an undefeated record, while averaging 22.2 points per game. An honor roll student, Davis is the Senior Class President at her high school.

Emani Mayo is a 5-8 combo guard from Hephzibah, Ga. A Hephzibah High School student, she also plays for the GA Lady Havoc AAU team. Mayo reach 1,000 career points as a junior, averaging 22 points per game, including a career-best 34. Selected to play in the CSRA All-Star game, she was also an Under Armour Kentucky Nationals All-Star game selection. A National Honor Society student, she has been the number one ranked student in her high school class the last three years.

Desiree Oliver is a 5-7 combo guard from Pittsburgh, Pa. A student at Penn Hills High School, she plays for the Western PA Bruins AAU team. A two-time All-State player, she's also been named first-team All-Section for three years, as well as a Post-Gazette Fabulous Five team member. Oliver most recently led her team to a 24-4 overall record, which included a repeat performance as section champions, and a spot in the PIAA Quarterfinals. As a junior, she averaged 19 points, eight boards, and six steals, and is both an ESPN and Prospect Nation Top 100 player.

Tajae Stevenson is a 6-0 forward from Peterson, N.J. A PlayHerz AAU team member, she attends Paterson Kennedy High School. Last season, she led her high school to the Group 4 state title, averaging 18.3 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. A two-time All-North Jersey selection, Stevenson was named to the All-State first-team last season. She is also an honor roll student.

Breanna Perry is a 6-1 forward, from Mt. Morris, Mich. A Flushing High School student, she plays for the Michigan Crossover AAU team, which she helped guide to Nike Nationals twice in her career. Perry has led her high school team to two metro championships, including boasting a 23-0 record her sophomore year, while holding every opponent under 40 points per game. An honor roll student, she is also an accomplished high jumper, ranking number one in Michigan in the discipline her sophomore and junior year.

OWL OPENERS

The Owls opened the 74th season of Temple women's basketball on November 11, 2016, with an 86-70 win at La Salle. TU is 51-25 all-time in season openers, including a 9-1 mark under Tonya Cardoza. Since 1995, the Owls are 19-4 in season openers.

Tonya Cardoza, Temple women's basketball's all-time winningest coach, is in her ninth season as the helm of the Owls.

Temple's 2015-16 season marked the second-straight 20-win campaign, as Cardoza guided the Owls to an overall mark of 23-12. In the tough American Athletic Conference, Temple finished third, compiling an impressive 13-5 record, the best finish for the team in American history. During the regular season, Temple made waves with a sixgame win streak, including a thrilling 68-66 win over #20 USF. The culmination of the 2015-16 season again saw the Owls earn a post-season bid. The team advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2016 WNIT, before a narrow 77-76 loss at Michigan. Individually, Cardoza's guards again shined, as sophomore Alliya Butts earned the program's first American Athletic Conference first team nod, while also being named a first-team All-Big five selection.

The 2014-15 Owls showed that they are ready to make a return to the national stage. Cardoza's squad made the first post-season final four in program history, advancing to the WNIT semifinals before falling in overtime at West Virginia. The Owls finished with a 20-win season, going 20-17 overall, including a 12-6 mark in the tough American Athletic Conference. The 2014-15 season saw the breakout of Butts, who was named Big 5 Freshman of the Year, while also earning spots on the American All-Conference team, the American All-Rookie team, and the All-Big 5 team. Junior combo quard Erica Covile also received All-Big 5 and All-American Athletic Conference honors, while

senior Tyonna Williams earned the American Sportsmanship Award, as well as one of six spots on the All-WNIT team.

2013-14 marked a new era of women's basketball at Temple for Cardoza—competing in the inaugural season of the American Athletic Conference. Guided by true freshman point guard Feyonda Fitzgerald, the Owls faced seven nationally ranked opponents—tying the school record for the most in season—including two games against defending national champion and No. 1 Connecticut and Final Four participant Louisville. The young Owls finished fifth in American play after predicted to finish ninth, showing the league and the nation that they had fight.

Fitzgerald was a unanimous All-Freshman Team honoree from the conference as well as a second-team All-Conference selection. Junior Rateska Brown earned the American's inaugural Sixth Player of the Year Award. Senior Natasha Thames was a second-team All-Conference honoree, and freshman Taylor Robinson was named to the All-Freshman team.

The 2010-11 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year, Cardoza led the Owls to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, advancing to the Second Round in both 2010 and 2011. The Owls narrowly missed earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament in 2011-12, but took a top spot in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) and advanced to the third round.

Along with earning Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors for the Owls' performance in 2010-11, Cardoza was honored as the Big 5 Coach of the Year for a third time. She earned that honor in each of her first three seasons at Temple, and the Owls earned their sixth straight Big 5 title in her first year with the program. Temple won the Big 5 again in 2011, and finished as runner-up in both 2010 and 2012.

Cardoza led Temple to at least 20 wins in her first four years at the helm. During her inaugural season in 2008-09, Cardoza guided TU to a 21-10 mark and an NCAA Tournament appearance. She was a finalist for the National Rookie Coach of the Year award. The Owls reached 25 wins in 2009-10 which tied for the second-most in the history of the program. In 2010-11, the Owls finished 24-9 which included a 15-game win streak and a 13-1 record in the Atlantic 10. The 2011-12 season saw Temple go 23-10 and win 14 in a





row, once again with a 13-1 mark in the conference. During their final year of Atlantic 10 Conference play in 2012-13, Cardoza guided the nation's second-youngest team (six freshmen).

After spending 14 years as assistant coach at the University of Connecticut under Hall of Fame coach Geno Auriemma, a tenure in which she helped the Huskies to five National Championships, few doubted that Cardoza had what it takes to build a successful program

The Owls finished in the Top 3 in the Atlantic 10 for three consecutive seasons. In Cardoza's first season she coached the squad to an upset over No. 13 Xavier, making her the first coach in TU women's basketball history to upset a ranked team during her rookie season.

Cardoza was instrumental in All-Conference selection LaKeisha Eaddy's transition to point guard in 2008-09, nearly helping the upperclassman set a new single season record for assists. Cardoza also retained then-freshman recruit Kristen McCarthy, who was named to the A-10 First Team in 2010, as well as taking home the title of Big 5 Player of the Year.

Cardoza's best recruit had to sit out a year after transferring from Division I Wright State in 2009, but Shey Peddy then became one of the top players in the history of the program. Peddy took home both the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year awards in 2012, and was named the Big 5 Player of the Year for a second straight time. Peddy was a two-time Atlantic 10 First Team selection and made her mark on the all-time career record lists despite playing only two years with the Owls. Peddy became Cardoza's first WNBA draft pick (as a head coach) when she was taken 23rd overall in the 2012 WNBA Draft by the Chicago Sky.

Arriving at Connecticut at the start of the 1994-95 season, Cardoza helped guide the Huskies to an unprecedented 465-41 record, seven Final Four appearances and six No. 1 National Rankings in the final Associated Press poll. Cardoza was a part of four undefeated regular seasons, including two unbeaten national championship teams in 1994-95 and 2001-02. The Huskies also won a NCAA record 70 consecutive games from 2001 to 2003. In Big East play, the team won 12 regular-season titles and 12 conference tournament championships.

Cardoza worked primarily with the guards at UConn, producing numerous All-America and All-BIG EAST performers, including WNBA stars Sue Bird, Renee Montgomery, and Diana Taurasi.

A 1991 University of Virginia graduate with a degree in anthropology, Cardoza starred for the Cavaliers, leading the team to four consecutive NCAA National Tournament appearances. As a senior, she led Virginia in scoring (15.5 ppg), and tied Dawn Staley for the rebounding lead (6.1 rpg) while earning the following honors: Kodak Honorable Mention All-America; Kodak First Team All-District III; First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference; NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team, and NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team. She was also a First Team All-ACC pick in 1988-89.

Cardoza played in 121 games for UVa and graduated ranked third on the career steals list (375), fifth on the school's career blocked shots list (110), eighth in points (1,622) and 10th in rebounds (667).

In 2002, Cardoza was named to the ACC 50th Anniversary Women's Basketball Team along with seven other former Cavaliers including Staley.

Cardoza played professional basketball in Segovia, Spain, before taking the job at Connecticut.

Veney was instrumental in the success of the 2014-15 squad that earned the first postseason final four spot in program history. The Owls advanced to the WNIT Semifinals, relying heavily on its guards. Rookie guard, Alliya Butts flourished under Veney, being named Big 5 Freshman of the Year, while also earning spots on the American All-Conference team, the American All-Rookie team, and the All-Big 5 team. Junior combo guard Erica Covile also received All-Big 5 and All-American Athletic Conference honors, while senior guard Tyonna Williams earned the American Sportsmanship Award, as well as one of six spots on the All-WNIT team.

After Veney's arrival, the Owls earned three consecutive NCAA Tournament berths, advancing to the Second Round in both 2010 and 2011, and took a top spot in the 2012 Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT), advancing to the third round.

The guards Veney has coached have been hugely successful. She was instrumental in the development of Butts, a multiple award winner in her rookie season, as well as unanimous American All-Freshman and second-team honoree Feyonda Fitzgerald. Veney also guided All-Atlantic 10 selections LaKeisha Eaddy, Kristen McCarthy, Shey Peddy, and Qwedia Wallace. McCarthy and Peddy earned a total of three Big 5 Player of the Year honors over three seasons, with Peddy taking the award in both 2011 and 2012. Peddy became only the second player in Atlantic 10 history to earn both Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2012.

As recruiting coordinator, Veney helped sign transfer Peddy as well as forward Natasha Thames and center Victoria Macaulay.

Veney spent two years as an assistant at Providence College prior to joining the Temple staff. She instructed the guards and was responsible for the defense. She also was in charge of all recruiting.

Prior to her arrival at Providence, Veney spent three seasons (2002-05) at the College of William & Mary. She was responsible for recruiting as well as tutoring the Tribe guards. In addition, Veney assisted with scouting, practice planning, and day-to-day operations of the women's basketball program.

Veney began her coaching career at American University during the 2000-01 season, the school's final year in the Colonial Athletic Association.

Veney is a 2000 graduate of East Carolina University, where she earned a bachelor's degree in communications. She was a two-year starter for the Pirates at the guard position and earned Second-Team All-CAA honors in each of her two seasons. She also was among the league leaders in scoring, assists, and steals. Veney earned CAA All-Tournament team honors in 2000 after leading the Pirates to the championship game of the CAA Tournament.

Veney began her collegiate playing career at the College of Charleston, where she led the Cougars in scoring during her sophomore campaign.

Upon completion of her college career, Veney participated in professional tryout camps for the WNBA's Detroit Shock (2000) and the Los Angeles Sparks (2001).
