Series Notes: Alabama and Tulane will now have met in the WNIT for the second straight season. The Green Wave has won four of the last five meetings in the series.

OPENING TIP

- ▶ Alabama heads into Thursday's game with a 21-13 overall record after advancing past Little Rock in the second round, 55-53. The Crimson Tide is making its second straight appearance in the WNIT and sixth overall. Alabama also competed in the tournament in 2011 and in three consecutive seasons from 2000-02. UA holds an overall record of 7-5 in WNIT games.
- ▶ Alabama and Tulane are meeting for the 12th time in the series on Thursday and the second year in a row in the WNIT. In the 2016 tournament, the Green Wave edged the Tide by one point, 53-52, in the first round on Tulane's home court.
- → The Crimson Tide reached the 20-win milestone on Thursday, March 16 in its victory over Mercer, marking the first time Alabama has won 20 wins in a season since the 1998-99 campaign.
- → Junior Ashley Williams has paved the way for Alabama in the WNIT, averaging a double-double of 17.0 points and 10.5 rebounds per game.
- **>>** Freshman Ashley Knight set the Alabama single season block record on March 1 in the Tide's victory over Vanderbilt in the SEC tournament. Knight now has 85 for the season, which is already eighth most in a career. She's ranked 18th in the nation, and first in the SEC, in overall blocks and 23rd nationally and second in the league on blocks per game at 2.5.
- ▶ Both junior Hannah Cook and Ashley Williams scored their 1,000th career point at the SEC tournament. Cook recorded hers in Thursday's game against Tennessee, while Williams followed up the next day in Friday's contest versus Kentucky.
- **>>** Jordan Lewis was selected as the Southeastern Conference Newcomer of the Year by the Associated Press. She is the first freshman from Alabama to earn the award since its inception in 1997.

- >> The Green Wave is led by junior Kolby Morgan and senior Leslie Vorpahl. Morgan averages a team-high 18.9 points and 5.6 rebounds per game, while Vorpahl chips in 11.8 points and 6.2 assists per contest.
- >> Tulane nearly pulled off an upset over top-ranked UConn as the Green Wave fell by only three, 63-60, to the Huskies.
- >> Tulane is under the direction of Lisa Stockton, who is in her 23rd season as head coach of the Green Wave and 26th season overall as a head coach. While part of Conference USA, Tulane finished first in the league six times. Her squads have advanced to the postseason 18 times, including 11 trips to the NCAA tournament.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Freshman Jordan Lewis grabbed the rebound off her own miss and put it back to score the game-winning basket with 5.1 seconds remaining to give the Alabama women's basketball team a 55-53 victory over Little Rock in Coleman Coliseum. The win advances the Crimson Tide (21-13) to the round of 16 in the Women's National Invitation Tournament.

Alabama was led in scoring and rebounding for the second straight game by junior Ashley Williams, who finished with 15 points and nine rebounds. She was joined in double figures by sophomore Shaquera Wade with 10. Lewis recorded seven points and added five rebounds, three assists and three steals, while fellow freshman Ashley Knight chipped in eight points, seven rebounds and five blocks.

The Trojans (25-9) were led in scoring by senior Sharde' Collins with 20 points, while senior Kaitlyn Pratt pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds.

Little Rock knocked down the first shot of the game and led throughout the quarter, pulling in front by as many as eight. With the Trojans leading 12-4, Alabama embarked on an 8-2 run to cut it to two, 14-12, at quarter's

The Tide continued its run in the second quarter and grabbed the lead at the 6:15 mark off a three from junior Quanetria Bolton. Little Rock responded with back-to-back threes and finished out the frame by scoring 18 of the next 24 points to lead 32-23 at the half.

Alabama scored four consecutive points to open the third, however the Trojans responded with 13 of the next 18 to take a 45-32 lead with 4:23 to go in the period. The Tide closed out the quarter on a 9-3 run to cut the Little Rock lead to seven, 48-41, with 10 minutes to go.

Alabama recorded eight unanswered to begin the fourth, taking a 49-48 lead at the 6:33 mark. The game would go back and forth for the duration with three ties and two more lead changes, including the final lead change that came on the Tide's last possession with the Lewis put-back. The Trojans used a timeout to advance the ball with 5.1 seconds to go, but they were unable to get a shot off before time expired.

For the game, Alabama shot 35.0 percent (21-60), while Little Rock finished at 40.4 percent (21-52) from the floor. The Tide outrebounded the Trojans, 38-35, holding a 15-8 advantage on the offensive glass. Alabama also outscored Little Rock in the paint, 38-10.

ALABAMA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

20 WINS THE MOST UNDER CURRY AT ALABAMA

With its win against Mercer on March 16, Alabama reached 20 overall victories for the season, which is the most since head coach Kristy Curry took over and the most since the Crimson Tide reached that same number during the 1998-99 season.

BALANCE ON THE BOARDS

Alabama is leading the SEC in rebounds with 41.5 boards per game, however the Crimson Tide doesn't have anyone ranked in the top 20 in the league individually. Alabama has seven student-athletes that average between 3.8-6.3 rebounds per game or higher.

SENIOR-FREE ROSTER

Alabama will return its entire roster next season as it does not have a single senior on the 2016-17 squad. The Crimson Tide will also add three transfers in Amber Richardson (NC State), DaiJia Ruffin (UT Martin) and Jasmine Walker (Florida State) as well as true freshman Ariyah Copeland.

SHOT-BLOCKING SENSATION

Freshman Ashley Knight has been stellar thus far defensively in the paint. She already has 84 blocks on the season, for an average of 2.5 rejections per game. Her 2.5 block average ranks the Austin, Texas native second in the Southeastern Conference and 23rd nationally, while her 84 overall blocks is first in the league and 18th in the country. Knight recently took over the No. 1 spot on the Alabama single season top 10 list and already entered the Tide's career top 10 list where she stands in eighth.

TIDE POSTS BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK WINS OVER LADY VOLS FOR FIRST TIME

With Alabama's 72-64 victory over Tennessee on March 2, its 54-46 win over the Lady Volunteers on Feb. 28, 2016, and the Tide's 65-57 victory against UT on Feb. 16, 2017, UA recorded its first set of consecutive wins over Tennessee in program history. Head Coach Kristy Curry is also now just the second coach of the Tide women's basketball team to collect multiple wins against the Lady Vols, joining Ken Weeks, who was the coach for the other two wins against Tennessee in 1981 and 1984.

ALABAMA PUTS UP 29 IN FOURTH QUARTER VS. TENNESSEE

Alabama scored 29 points in the fourth quarter to seal its victory over the Lady Volunteers in the second round of the 2017 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament. That was the highest point total against an SEC opponent all season for the Crimson Tide.

COOK MOVES UP CAREER THREE-POINT CATEGORIES

Junior Hannah Cook has been one of the best shooters from long range since arriving on campus and has moved her way into the Alabama record books in every three-point category for a career. She currently has 199 makes, which ranks seventh and is two away from the No. 6 spot held by Brittney Ezell (1994-98). Cook's 589 attempts is seventh, 53 away from Ezell, who is also sixth in that category.

BOLTON AMONG ALABAMA'S TOP 10 IN CAREER BLOCKS

With her 31 blocks thus far this season, junior NeNe Bolton moved into Alabama's top 10 in career blocks. Heading into Thursday's game she has 97 total, which ranks sixth. She is now one blocks away from the No. 5 spot currently held by Terri Hillard (1980-84).

LEADING LEWIS

Freshman Jordan Lewis has started every game at the point guard position for Alabama and has shown poise and confidence running the offense beyond her years. She is currently averaging a team-best 4.2 assists per game, ranking her fifth in the Southeastern Conference. Lewis has also scored double-digit points 20 times, led the team in steals nine times and rebounding three times.

GETTING TO THE LINE

Alabama finished the 2015-16 season ranked 73rd in the nation in free throw attempts (615) and 77th in free throws made (430) while averaging 69.9 percent made per game. The Crimson Tide is making an even stronger showing this season getting to the line a total of 763 times, 244 more times than its opponents (519). Alabama ranks first in the SEC and fourth in the nation in free throw attempts.

BALANCED OFFENSE

One of Coach Curry's team goals for the season is to have at least four in double-figure points each outing. The Crimson Tide reached that goal in 15 of its 34 games this season as five recorded 10 or more points six times and four did so on nine occasions. Alabama was just shy in its games against Georgia Southern, as three finished in double figures and one had eight, and Alcorn State, where three had double figures and two had nine points.

ALABAMA IN OT

Alabama has played in three overtime games this season and holds a 2-1 record in those contests. The Crimson Tide first beat Kansas, 71-65, on Dec. 4, in extra time. Alabama's next overtime matchup came at Auburn on Feb. 20, where the Tide won 63-61. That was followed by a, 71-65, loss at Georgia on Feb. 23. The last time Alabama played three overtime games in a season was during the 2012-13 campaign, and the last time it had back-to-back overtime games was on Dec. 28 and Dec. 29, 1998, against Boston College and St. Joseph's.

CRIMSON TIDE PICKS UP FIRST ROAD OVERTIME WIN SINCE 2013

Alabama's 63-61 overtime victory at Auburn on Feb. 20, marked the Crimson Tide's first overtime win on the road since it beat Michigan, 76-74, on Nov. 24, 2003, in Ann Arbor. Alabama had played in two overtime games on the road since then.

LIMITING POINTS

Alabama has held its opponents to 15 points or fewer in 81 of 139 periods (.583) played this season. Even more impressive is that in 29 of those 139 quarters, the Tide opposition has put up 10 points or fewer and in five quarters, five points or fewer.

ALABAMA SETS AUBURN ARENA REBOUNDING RECORD

In Alabama's, 63-61, overtime win at Auburn on Feb. 20, the Crimson Tide pulled down 56 rebounds, which set the Auburn Arena record for most rebounds in a game. The previous high was 52, which had been achieved four times (last on Nov. 15, 2013 by Auburn vs. Alabama State).

TIDE PUTS TWO ON SEC ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM

Freshmen Jordan Lewis and Ashley Knight were both named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. This is the first time in program history that Alabama has placed multiple student-athletes on the team and its first selections since Ashley Williams in 2014.

ALABAMA FRESHMEN TAKE HOME SIX SEC FoW HONORS

Alabama won six of the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week honors this season, which is one more than it had won in its program history overall heading into the year. Point guard Jordan Lewis picked up the league honors on Nov. 15, Dec. 27, Jan. 10, Jan. 24 and most recently on Feb. 21, making her the only freshman in program history to earn weekly honors five times and the only student-athlete to accumulate five SEC weekly awards throughout her career. Ashley Knight has also been recognized, earning her award on Dec. 20.

WIN AT MIZZOU MARKS FIRST SEC ROAD VICTORY SINCE 2014

Alabama's 59-58 victory at Missouri on Sunday, Jan. 8, marked the Crimson Tide's first win in a Southeastern Conference road game since it defeated Vanderbilt, 66-62, on Feb. 23, 2014.

MEO KNIGHT POURS IN 29 TO LEAD ALABAMA OVER OLE MISS

Junior Meoshonti Knight scored a career-high 29 points in the win over Ole Miss on Thursday, Jan. 5. Her 29 points were the most scored by an Alabama player since Ashley Williams scored the same amount against Alabama A&M on Nov. 26, 2014.

CURRY COACHES IN GAME No. 100 AT ALABAMA

Alabama's game against Kansas was head coach Kristy Curry's 100th game on the sidelines at Alabama. She enters today's contest with a 63-64 (.496) overall mark in her four seasons with the Tide, which includes a 43-14 (.754) record against non-conference opponents.

WILLIAMS EARNS UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE

Junior Ashley Williams completed her undergraduate degree in criminal justice in December and has begun work on a master's degree in sports business management. Her jersey now has an SEC Graduate patch to signify her accomplishment.

FAB FROSH

Alabama's freshmen, Ashley Knight and Jordan Lewis, have made an immediate impact in the Tide's lineup. Lewis, who has started at point guard, leads the team, and ranks fifth in the Southeastern Conference, in assists (4.2 apg) and is third on the team in scoring (9.6 ppg). Knight, the 6-5 post, averages a team-best 2.5 blocks per game while adding 6.4 points and 5.1 rebounds per contest.

UA GOES UNDEFEATED IN NOVEMBER FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON

Alabama closed out its first month of the 2016-17 with a perfect 5-0 record, marking the second straight season the Crimson Tide has gone undefeated in November. In 2015, Alabama posted a 6-0 mark, which was the best start since the 2002 season.

SIX GAMES ... SIX DIFFERENT LEADING SCORERS

Head Coach Kristy Curry has multiple options when it comes to scoring this season. In its first six games, Alabama has had six different leading scorers. In the opener, junior Meo Knight led the way with 18 points. Freshman Jordan Lewis put up 21 in the Tide's second game, while junior Hannah Cook posted 13 to pace Alabama offensively in game No. 3. Junior Ashley Williams scored 19 in the win over Georgia Southern and sophomore Shaquera Wade chipped in a career-best 22 to lead the Tide over Alabama A&M. Against Alcorn State, junior NeNe Bolton and Knight each added 18 points.

VETERAN LEADERS PROPEL TIDE TO WIN OVER GEORGIA SOUTHERN

Alabama trailed for the first time at the half this season in its game against Georgia Southern on Nov. 22. The Crimson Tide's veteran leaders made a statement coming out of the locker room and scored all 21 of Alabama's third quarter points, led by junior Meoshonti Knight, who finished the frame with eight points, hitting all of her attempts. For the game, UA's juniors scored 53 of its 66 points.

ALABAMA MISS BASKETBALL JASMINE WALKER SIGNS WITH THE TIDE

Jasmine Walker, the former Jefferson Davis High School standout and one of the nation's top recruits in the 2016 class, signed with Alabama on Tuesday, Jan. 17. Walker, who began her collegiate career at Florida State, is enrolled in classes this semester but will sit out from competition for one calendar year due to NCAA transfer rules.

Walker, a 6-3 forward from Montgomery, Ala., was rated the No. 23 overall prospect and No. 5 post by ESPNW in the 2016 signing class. She earned every state player of the year award including 2016 Alabama Miss Basketball, Gatorade Player of the Year and Class 7A Player of the Year. Walker made history by becoming the first student from a Montgomery public school to be named Alabama Miss Basketball, and was only the second selection ever from Montgomery, joining former Crimson Tide forward Leslie Claybrook. Walker was also a two-time state tournament MVP, three-time all-state selection, a two-time Advertiser All-Metro Player of the Year and was named to the Naismith High School All-America Watch List and a McDonald's All American Game nominee.

Walker finished high school with 1900 points and 908 rebounds and guided Jeff Davis to a 102-26 record throughout her career, where she was a four-year starter for coach LaKenya Knight. Walker led the Lady Vols to back-to-back Class 7A titles in 2015 and 2016. During her senior season, she averaged 19.6 points, 7.9 rebounds and 2.6 assists per game while collecting 13 double-doubles. In the 2016's title game against McGill-Toolen, Walker recorded 18 points and six rebounds. During the 2015 matchup between the two teams in the state championship, she poured in 23 points, setting her season average at 15.9 points to go along with 8.1 rebounds.

ALABAMA ADDS AMBER RICHARDSON TO ROSTER

Amber Richardson, a 6-0 guard out of Garner, N.C., has signed with Alabama and will begin classes and practicing with the team this semester. The NC State transfer must sit for one calendar year due to NCAA transfer rules, making her eligible in December.

Richardson played in 33 games over the past two seasons for the Wolfpack, finishing with 80 points, 49 rebounds, 12 assists, nine steals and four blocks. As a freshman, she scored a career-high 11 points against Davidson, paced by a 3-for-5 performance from beyond the arc.

Richardson played for Southeast Raleigh High School, helping her team to a 26-4 overall record as a senior and a state runner-up finish. She was a 2015 McDonald's High School All-America nominee and earned first team honors from the All-Greater Neuse River Conference. As a junior, Richardson was named to the News & Observer's All-Metro Team and the Greater Neuse River Player of the Year after leading Southeast Raleigh to a conference championship.

Richardson earned a scout grade of 95 from ESPNW, ranking as the No. 9 wing and No. 72 overall recruit in the class.

TIDE SIGNS ARIYAH COPELAND TO 2017 CLASS

Ariyah Copeland, one of the top-rated post prospects of the 2017 class, has signed with Coach Kristy Curry and the Alabama women's basketball program.

Copeland, the 6-3 4/5 post from Columbus, Ga., is rated No. 50 overall by Prospects Nation and No. 72 overall by All Star Girls Report. Prospects Nation also has her as the No. 7 post, while HoopGurlz espnW ranks Copeland No. 14 at her position.

As a junior, Copeland averaged 15.0 points, 11.0 rebounds, 2.5 blocks and 1.7 assists per game for Columbus High School. She helped lead the Blue Devils to the 2016 AAAAA quarterfinals after winning the region 1-5A championship, where she had 17 points.

Copeland was named honorable mention all-state by the Atlanta Journal Constitution at the conclusion of last season and was also named to the Ledger-Enquirer All-Bi-City Team. She was awarded MVP honors at the 2016 All-Star Game, featuring players from Harris and Muscogee counties, and was selected to participate in the 2016 Valley All-Star Underclassmen Game.

#CATCHUSATCOLEMAN

On May 31, Alabama women's basketball announced it would be returning to Coleman Coliseum starting with the 2016-17 season. The Crimson Tide has played primarily at Foster Auditorium following the building's renovation in 2011.

The women's basketball team split time between Foster Auditorium and Coleman Coliseum from 1974-81, until permanently moving to Coleman from 1981-2011. The Crimson Tide reopened Foster with its game against Florida on Feb. 13, 2011, following an extensive renovation of the building. Since then, women's basketball has played all but four of its home games, which includes two season-opening doubleheaders with men's basketball and a pair of 5th Grade Fastbreak games, at Foster Auditorium.

CURRY RECEIVES CONTRACT EXTENSION

Head Coach Kristy Curry received a contract extension prior to the 2016-17 season, keeping her on as head coach of the Crimson Tide women's basketball team through 2020.

Each season under Curry has produced significant wins, beginning in 2014 when her team won seven Southeastern Conference games marking the most since the 2001-02 season. Included in those wins was the first in Lexington against Kentucky since 2002, the first against Georgia since 2004, snapping a 23-game losing streak to the Lady Bulldogs, and the first in program history at Vanderbilt's Memorial Gym. In 2014-15, the Tide reached double-digit wins in non-conference play for the first time since 2010, which included a victory over 12th-ranked Nebraska.

Perhaps the most significant win, however, was the 54-46 victory over Tennessee on Feb. 25, 2016. It was the first in the series for the Tide since 1984, ending a 42-game losing streak to the Lady Volunteers, and the first victory in the series in program history in Tuscaloosa. Later that year, Alabama also made it back to the postseason after having been out the five previous seasons.

CLASSROOM CHAMPION: NENE BOLTON

Heading into her junior season, NeNe Bolton has been a key to Alabama women's basketball's quest to return to the elite level both at the Southeastern Conference and national level. She has also been an important part of the Crimson Tide's ongoing mission of being dominant in the classroom.

"Coach (Kristy) Curry and the staff really emphasize that we are studentathletes and that the student part of that comes first," Bolton said. "They keep us focused on academics and let us know that what we do in the classroom is first and foremost." That emphasis on academics paid dividends when Bolton earned a summer grade point average of 3.468, helping pace the women's basketball team to an outstanding 3.58 team GPA for the summer.

Among the women's basketball players who attended classes this summer, all 11 posted better than a 3.0 GPA including Taylor Berry and Jordan Lewis who both hold career GPAs of 4.0.




