

THE AMERICAN TODAY

Two American Athletic Conference teams came away with wins in the league's first weekend of the 2020 season.

Memphis made a winner of new head coach Ryan Silverfield in his home debut as the Tigers scored a 37-24 win against Arkansas State at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. QB Brady White led the way with four touchdown passes as part of a 275-yard day, while TE Sean Dykes returned to the lineup after a medical redshirt year to finish with 10 receptions for 137 yards and two TDs. RB Rodrigues Clark rushed for 105 yards and a TD in his first career start.

SMU went on the road for its first win as the Mustangs took a 31-24 decision at Texas State in their seasonopener. QB Shane Buechele, who led The American in passing last year, picked up where he left off as the went 26-for-36 for 367 yards and a touchdown. RB TJ McDaniel topped the 100-yard mark against Texas State for the second straight year as he rushed for a game-high 130 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries.

Navy, which had not conducted a full-contact practice in its preseason, was handled by a physical BYU squad Monday as the Midshipmen dropped a 55-3 decision to the Cougars at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. Navy was limited to 149 yards and seven first downs and uncharacteristically had possession for only 22:40.

Three games that were originally scheduled for Sept. 12 were either postponed or rescheduled, leaving only two contests on this week's docket.

USF will begin its season Saturday as first-year head coach Jeff Scott and the Bulls welcome The Citadel to Raymond James Stadium (7 p.m. ET, ESPN+). Scott, who previously served as co-offensive coordinator at Clemson, is expecting as many as three quarterbacks to see action in the early part of the season as returning starter Jordan McCloud is challenged by Cade Fortin, a transfer from North Carolina who saw action as a starter in 2018, and Noah Johnson, who was the 2018 SWAC Offensive Player of the Year at Alcorn State.

Tulane, which begins its season Saturday night at South Alabama (7:30 p.m., ESPN2), also will rely on a new starter behind center as Keon Howard is expected to make his first start in a Green Wave uniform. Howard saw limited action for Tulane last season, but made nine career starts at Southern Miss before transferring.

Looking ahead to Week 3, nine of the 11 American Athletic Conference teams will be in action, while intraconference play begins with two key league games (Houston at Memphis Sept. 18, Navy at Tulane Sept. 19).

It's A Start

The American Athletic Conference has two teams ranked in the Associated Press and USA Today presason polls for the first time in the eight-year history of the conference.

The Power 6 Is Real

Four American Athletic Conference teams (No. 17 Memphis, No. 20 Navy, No. 21 Cincinnati, No. 24 UCF) were ranked in the top 25 of both the Associated Press and the Amway Coaches' polls to close the 2019 season.

Only the Big Ten (six) and SEC (five) had more ranked teams than The American. The four top-25 teams for The American were more than the Big 12 (three), Pac-12 (two) and ACC (one) among others

Rank And File

The American has had at least three teams ranked in the final polls in two of the last three seasons.

A League Of Our Own

American Athletic Conference teams were a combined 30-2 (.938) against opponents from outside the power conferences/Notre Dame this season.

Conference Call

American Athletic Conference teams went 8-1 against Conference USA in 2019. The American was 4-0 against the Sun Belt, 3-0 against the Mountain West and 1-1 against the MAC. Teams from The American were 4-1 against FBS independents in 2019.

Home Is Where The Wins Are

UCF has won 21 straight home games, trailing only Clemson (22) for the nation's longest home winning streak. Cincinnati has won 13 straight at home, which is seventh.

Happy New Year

American Athletic Conference teams have played in a New Year's Six bowl five times in the conference's first seven seasons. The American is 3-2 in New Year's Six games since the 2013 season.

Double Digits

Memphis won 12 games for the first time in program history in 2019. Cincinnati has registered back-to-back 11-win seasons. Navy matched its program record with 11 wins in 2019. SMU registered its first 10-win season since 1984. UCF has turned in three consecutive 10-win seasons.

Bowling League

The American had seven bowl-eligible teams in 2019 (UCF, Cincinnati, Memphis, Navy, SMU, Temple and Tulane). The American has had at least seven teams in bowl games in each year of the league's 12-team alignment, which began in 2015.

Behind Center

Nine of The American's 11 teams return their regular starting quarterback from the 2019 season.

The American welcomes two new head coaches for the 2020 season. Ryan Silverfield was promoted to head coach at Memphis after serving as deputy head coach and offensive line coach last season. Jeff Scott is in his first year at USF after serving as co-offensive coordinator at Clemson.

SportsCenter Is Next

Thanks in part to The American's new 12-year media rights extension with ESPN, the conference already has nine games slated for ESPN in the 2020 season. By comparison, The American had 10 games on the primary ESPN channel in the 2019 campaign.

Long Division

After playing five years as a 12-team, two-division conference, The American will feature 11 teams in a single-division format for the 2020 season. Each team is scheduled to play eight conference games this season. The top two teams in the final regular season standings will play in the 2020 American Athletic Conference Football Championship, which will take place either Dec. 5, 12 or 19 at the home stadium of the first-place team.

Polling Place

Six of the 11 American Athletic Conference teams received votes in the 2020 USA Today preseason coaches' poll.

Well Rounded

East Carolina and Houston are the only two American Athletic Conference teams that return their leading rusher, passer, receiver and tackler from last season.

Tulsa offensive tackle Chris Paul is the chair of the American Athletic Conference Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and is one of 32 student-athletes nationally on the NCAA SAAC, which reports directly to the NCAA Division I Council. Paul is the first football player from The American to be named to the national SAAC.

2020 COLLEGE FOOTBALL RULES CHANGES

Players Numbering

No more than two squad members may be assigned or wear the same jersey number. There were no limits to duplicate numbers in previous seasons. With the recognized popularity of the single-digit numbers, the digit "O" is added as a legal number. Any number to be preceded by "0" such as "07" or "00" remains illegal.

Targeting - Disqualified Player

There were no changes to the targeting rule from an on-field officiating perspective and the rule continues to serve the game well and is changing player behavior in terms of use of the helmet. The change for 2020 is that now a player disqualified for targeting will be declared ineligible for further participation in the game, but the player may remain in the team area.

All other disqualifying fouls such as fighting, two unsportsmanlike conduct fouls, flagrant personal fouls, etc. will be reclassified as fouls requiring ejection. Players ejected will be required to leave the playing enclosure and must remain out of view of the field of play under team supervision.

Pregame Warmup /Officials' Jurisdiction

The Rules Committee address issues of unsportsmanlike behavior in the pregame and took steps to clean this action up. The officials' jurisdiction will now begin at 90 minutes before kickoff (previously 60 minutes). Additionally, when any squad member enters the playing enclosure prior to the game, the head coach or an assistant coach from that team must be present on the field. Furthermore, when any squad member is present within the playing enclosure after the officials' jurisdiction, they must be wearing their jersey or have their numeral readily visible. Players without their numeral readily visible must leave the playing enclosure.

Defensive Linemen on Scrimmage Kick Plays

To further enhance the protection of the snapper on scrimmage kicks, if the offense is in a scrimmage kick formation at the snap, any defensive player within one yard of the line of scrimmage must be aligned completely outside the frame of the body of the snapper at the snap. This change paired with the current rule that does not allow the defense to initiate contact with the snapper until one second has elapsed on these type plays will further protect the snapper on kick downs.

Instant Replay/Clock Adjustment and Review Time

If the clock expires at the end of a half, and replay determines that there was time remaining on the clock, and the clock would start on the referee's signal after review, there must be at least three seconds remaining when the ball should have been declared dead to restore time to the clock. With two seconds or one second remaining on the clock, the half is over. This change will not impact situations when the clock is stopped and will remain stopped until the snap such as incomplete passes and runners out of bounds. In addition, the expectation is that the instant replay official will not exceed two minutes to complete any review. The exception is if the review has end-of-game impact or has multiple aspects as a part of the review, it should be completed efficiently but will have no stated time limit.

Other Changes:

- A second jersey meeting all requirements of the jersey rule worn concurrently is allowed.
- · The penalty for a team not complying with the jersey rule (i.e., legal and contrasting numbers or a colored jersey in violation of the rule) will be a 15-yard penalty after the kickoff of each half and the loss of a timeout in each quarter that illegal jerseys are worn.
- Defensive team substitution infractions will now be treated as a live ball foul.
- All fouls that have an option to carry over to the succeeding kickoff will also contain an option to carry over to the succeeding spot in extra periods.

- K Jake Verity set ECU's single-season and career records for field goals made in 2019. Verity had 24 field goals last year and has 60 in his career, the most among active NCAA FBS players entering the 2020 season.
- The Pirates had three players finish with at least 50 receptions and 600 receiving yards. WR Tyler Snead had a team-high 66 receptions, while WR C.J. Johnson, an FWAA Freshman All-America, had 908 receiving yards.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Gary Barta (chair), Paola Boivin, Tom Burman, Joe Castiglione, Rick George, Ken Hatfield, Ronnie Lott, Terry Mohajir, Ray Odierno, R.C. Sllocum, Todd Stansbury, Scott Stricklin and John Urschel.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat annearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

The American Bowl Lineup

American Athletic Conference teams are guaranteed at least seven bowl appearances annually as part of the conference's new postseason lineup, which begins with the 2020 season and is in place through 2025..

The American, as it has done three times in the first five years of the current bowl cycle, will continue to send its champion to a New Year's Six bowl if that team finishes higher than the champions of four other conferences in the final College Football Playoff rankings. American Athletic Conference teams are also eligible for the College Football Playoff if they are among the top four teams in the final CFP rankings.

As part of the new bowl cycle, The American will annually send teams to the Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent, the Fenway Bowl in Boston, also against an ACC team, and a third annual spot which will alternate between the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl and the SoFi Hawaii Bowl.

Additionally, The American will annually have four appearances in a group of eight bowls. The American has extended its existing partnerships with the TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl, the Gasparilla Bowl, the Cheribundi Boca Raton Bowl, the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl and the Cure Bowl.

New to The American's lineup are the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl and the Myrtle Beach Bowl.

THE AMERICAN ON TELEVISION

The American and ESPN reached agreement on a 12-year media rights extension that begins with the 2020-21 academic year.

With the new agreement, The American will have a stronger and more extensive presence on ESPN's primary TV networks - ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU. The Conference will also be a valuable part of ESPN+, ESPN's industry-leading direct-to-consumer sports streaming service.

In football, a minimum of 40 regular-season telecasts per season will be televised on ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU, including at least 20 across ABC, ESPN and ESPN2, which represents increased annual exposure across those ESPN networks. The American Championship game will be televised each year on ABC or ESPN.

Beyond select Navy football games, all conference controlled football games from The American will air on an ESPN network or ESPN+.
