Tulsa, Oklahoma — “Green Country”

Tulsa is nestled in the northeastern quadrant of Oklahoma, right in the heart of “Green Country.” The rolling green hills and wooded terrain of the city lies at an elevation of 700 feet above sea level and offers a temperate climate. Tulsans enjoy 227 days of sunshine a year and an average daily temperature of 61 degrees. The rainfall average is approximately 40 inches, and continually changing conditions occur in the city during all four seasons.



INTRO



What began as Tulse Town in 1836 under a sturdy oak tree, which still stands today at 18th and Cheyenne Streets, is today the second largest city in Oklahoma. Ask people to describe Tulsa, and you'll likely get many different answers. It was a city forever changed by the discovery of oil in 1901. It is home to art deco treasures and nationally renowned museums. Its African American heritage left its mark, in both the business and music worlds. And it's a city of nostalgia and special memories for countless Americans due to its location on historic Route 66.

Tulsa boasts a widely diversified business base, including aerospace, telecommunications, manufacturing, construction, high technology, healthcare, education, transportation and energy.

Tulsa has the second shortest commute time in the nation, ranks 15th in the nation for the highest rate of high school graduation and boasts a cost of living at 11.5 percent below the national average while the

county per capita income is 20.7 percent above the national average.

Tulsa, one of “America’s Most Livable Communities,” is known as the Mecca for arts in Oklahoma. Art deco masterpieces are prevalent in many of our downtown buildings and churches. Spectacular works of art dot the trails of our beautiful River Parks. From the Tulsa Ballet and Tulsa Opera, to Broadway plays and musicals at the Performing Arts Center, to the Philbrook and the largest collection of Western American art at the Gilcrease, Tulsa’s rich cultural legacy greatly enhances our citizen’s quality of life.

The BOK Center hosts the top names in entertainment, as well as major sporting events including the 2011 NCAA Basketball Second & Third Rounds. For a great shopping experience, a visit to Cherry Street or Utica Square is a must, and for those who would rather spend the afternoon on the links, Tulsa has several exclusive golf courses to choose from. During summer

months, Rodgers and Hammerstein’s classic musical, *Oklahoma!*, is performed at the Discoveryland amphitheater where a barbecue dinner and roping lessons add to the evening’s entertainment. Tulsa is also home to several outstanding events too numerous to list, but those worth a mention include Mayfest, the Gatesway International Balloon Festival, Oktoberfest and the Tulsa Pow Wow of Champions.

The Tulsa Port of Catoosa is acclaimed as one of the largest, most inland river-ports in the United States. The Tulsa International Airport offers direct service to most major U.S. cities and is another important contributor to our economic growth.

Ten higher education facilities serve the metropolitan Tulsa area. Options range from community college and vocational studies to undergraduate, graduate, and professional degree programs at both public and private universities.



Collins Family Softball Complex

The Collins Family Softball Complex is home to The University of Tulsa softball team.



The complex opened for play in 2002 as TU softball's first on-campus softball home. The softball stadium is a picturesque setting featuring a burned sitting area with a facade of Tennessee LedgeStone that matches the rest of the TU campus. The field also features a shrub-lined outfield fence, as well as an outfield warning track, bullpens and batting cages along with a press box and scoreboard. Sunken dugouts are located just below the seating, which includes a capacity of approximately 800. Completed in January 2012, the locker room facility was added beyond the right field fence. The new building provides the Hurricane a team locker room and team room, as well as coaches' game day office and umpire locker rooms.

In its 13-year history, the TU softball facility has provided the scenery for some of the greatest moments in Tulsa softball history:

- 2002, TU posted a 16-2 home record in the new stadium, still the best home winning percentage in program history.
- 2006, Tulsa won the Conference USA Championship in its first season in the league with a 3-0 win over Marshall with an eighth-inning three-run walk-off home run.
- 2009, Tulsa won the C-USA regular season championship on its home field the final weekend of the season with a sweep of Southern Miss.

The softball field and locker room facility complex, named in honor of former Chairman of the TU Board of Trustees, the late Fulton Collins, and his wife Susie, is part of the larger Donna J. Hardesty Sports Complex that also includes the soccer field, track, multi-purpose recreational field, student health and fitness center, student apartments and additional campus parking. The cost of the development exceeded \$31 million.

The 30-acre development to the west of Delaware Avenue extends from 10th Street to Fourth Place and Delaware Avenue to Columbia Avenue.

The facility has impacted all facets of the softball program since the first game took place during the 2002 campaign.



Steadman Upham President

Steadman Upham currently serves as the 19th president of The University of Tulsa, first arriving at TU in 2004. Prior to coming to Tulsa, he served as president and chief executive officer of Claremont Graduate University, a research university and a member of the Oxford-style consortium known as The Claremont Colleges in Claremont, California.



Upham received his Ph.D. degree in anthropology in 1980 from Arizona State University. In 1981, he joined New Mexico State University where he was chief archaeologist and assistant professor of archaeology. He achieved the rank of tenured professor of archaeology in 1989.

Before leaving New Mexico State in 1990, he served as the faculty affiliate, Center for Social Research (1985–90); curator of Archaeology, University Museum (1984–90); and associate dean of the Graduate School (1987–90). From 1990 to 1998, Upham served as vice provost for research and dean of the Graduate School and professor of anthropology at the University of Oregon.

Upham is a widely published archaeologist, having written or edited 10 books and more than 75 book chapters and journal articles. In 2001, he received the Academy Gold Medal of Honor by the Academy of Transdisciplinary Learning and Advance Studies. He was named to the Graduate College Hall of Fame by Arizona State University and named an ASU Distinguished Alumnus in 1998.

The University of Oregon presented Upham its Martin Luther King, Jr. Award and Director's Award for Service and Achievement in 1998. His teaching skills were recognized by New Mexico State University, which presented him the Donald C. Roush Award for Excellence in Teaching in 1987, and a year later named him a Master Teacher.

Upham's extensive professional service and accomplishments have included commissioner of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges; chairman, Board of Directors of the Council of Graduate Schools; president, National Physical Science Consortium; director, The American Mutual Funds; director, St. Francis Health System; director, Tulsa Chamber of Commerce; director, American Council on Education; director, National Collegiate Athletic Association, and member, Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education National Board.

In October 2014, Upham was being honored by the Oklahoma Center for Community and Justice. OCCJ is dedicated to eliminating bias, bigotry, and racism in our state and promoting understanding and respect among all races, religions, and cultures through advocacy, dialogue, and education.

During the past decade, TU has achieved a remarkable transformation. It is ranked No. 86 among all U.S. doctoral universities by U.S. News and World Report

and among the top 100 law schools and top 100 graduate business programs. During the past decade, TU has added more than 1 million square feet of usable space, including student apartments and activity centers, academic and administrative buildings, and athletic facilities, among others. The university's seven-year Embrace the Future campaign raised more than \$698 million. Thanks to the campaign, TU created: \$119 million in scholarship endowments, 1,182 new awards, \$87 million in faculty endowments and 47 new endowed positions.

Dr. Derrick Gragg VP and Director of Athletics

Dr. Derrick Gragg enters his second year as The University of Tulsa's Vice President and Director of Athletics. He was appointed to the position on March 20, 2013, and began his tenure with the Golden Hurricane 39 days later.



In his brief tenure, Gragg has overseen Tulsa's transition into the American Athletic Conference and has administered the development and in his second year will coordinate the implementation of the athletic department's Strategic Plan. He also hired new head coaches in the sports of men's basketball, women's golf and volleyball.

Under Gragg's leadership, Tulsa teams won seven Conference USA Championships in 2013-14 and eight teams participated in NCAA postseason competition. More than 200 student-athletes were named to the Commissioners Honor Roll and a league-best 63 recipients earned the C-USA Academic Medalist honor, awarded to student-athletes with a cumulative 3.75 GPA or better, during Gragg's first year at Tulsa. Six student-athletes earned All-America accolades, while two were selected as Capital One Academic All-Americans.

As Tulsa enters its first season of membership in the American Athletic Conference, Gragg serves on the league's Athletic Directors Council.

Before coming to Tulsa, Gragg spent seven years as the Director of Athletics at Eastern Michigan University, where he was responsible for an intercollegiate athletic program with 21 teams, 550 student-athletes and 80 staff members. Gragg's experience covers 20 years in progressively advanced roles at the universities of Arkansas, Michigan, Missouri and Vanderbilt.

Under Gragg's leadership, Eastern Michigan enjoyed successful campaigns not only on the field, but also in the classroom. EMU athletic teams accumulated 22 Mid-American Conference (MAC) championships in that time. Meanwhile, Eastern Michigan's student-athlete graduation rate exceeded the general student body graduation rate by 20%. Impressively the EMU student-athletes posted the highest cumulative grade point average in history four consecutive semesters during Gragg's tenure.

Eastern Michigan also saw its athletic fundraising levels reach new heights with four of the top five funding years occurring under Gragg's tenure as athletic director. Additionally, Gragg spearheaded the construction of EMU's \$3.9 million multipurpose indoor athletic practice facility and was nationally recognized for his leadership, earning the Black Coaches & Administrators (BCA) Administrator of the Year Award in 2008-09.

Gragg spent six years at the University of Arkansas before his appointment at Eastern Michigan. He joined Arkansas in 2000 as an associate athletic director and was promoted to senior associate athletic director in 2003 and then to deputy athletic director. In his tenure at Arkansas, Gragg was involved in various areas including: athletic administration, sport program oversight, marketing, sports information, recruitment, budgeting, student-athlete support, compliance, facilities and game management, fund-raising and research.

Before that, Gragg spent three years as assistant athletic director for compliance at Michigan beginning his tenure in 1997. Previously, he was the director of compliance and operations at Missouri from 1995-97. During his two years in Columbia, he was the game event manager for 10 Olympic sports programs and chairman of the Big 12 Compliance Coordinators Group during his last year as compliance coordinator at the university.

Gragg began his career in athletic administration at his alma mater, Vanderbilt, where he served from 1993 to 1995 as an academic counselor before adding the title of director of student life in his final year.

During his career, Gragg has published several articles and editorials on intercollegiate athletics as well as a nationwide study on sports-related gambling. He has been a presenter and panelist at events such as the NCAA Future Coaches Academy, Champions for Athletic Directors and Football Coaches, Emerging Administrators Academy Professional Development Conference and the NCAA Annual Convention. Gragg also authorized two Title IX studies while demonstrating continual improvement in Title IX compliance and gender equity issues.

He is a former member of the NCAA's Minority Opportunities & Interests Committee, having served as co-chair of the committee in 2004-05. Gragg recently served as a member of the NCAA's Legislative Council and is currently a member of the NACDA Division I-A Athletic Directors Scholarship Ad Hoc Steering Committee.

A former collegiate wide receiver, Gragg lettered four years at Vanderbilt while earning his bachelor's degree in human development in 1992. He earned his master's degree in sports administration from Wayne State University in 1999. Gragg received his doctorate in higher education administration from the University of Arkansas in May of 2004 and also taught several college courses during his tenure there as an athletic administrator.

A native of Huntsville, Ala., Gragg was inducted into the Huntsville-Madison County (Ala.) Athletic Hall of Fame in 2010. He is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and the Black Coaches and Administrators (BCA).

Gragg, 44 (11-19-69), and his wife, Sanya, have four children: daughters DeSha and Saniyah and sons Avery and Phillip-Raymond.





John Bargfeldt

Head Coach
10TH YEAR

In nine years as head coach at The University of Tulsa, John Bargfeldt has built TU softball into a nationally competitive program and one of the premier programs in its conference. After leading one of the top programs in Conference USA, Bargfeldt takes the Golden Hurricane into a new era in the American Athletic Conference.

The longest-tenured softball coach at TU, he has the most wins and highest winning percentage in school history, and has built a program accustomed to winning championships. Under Bargfeldt, the Golden Hurricane has won Conference USA Championships in five of his nine seasons, totaling nine league championships. TU earned C-USA regular season titles in 2006, 2009, 2011, 2012 and 2014, and C-USA tournament titles in 2006, 2009, 2012 and 2014. The Hurricane has also reached the NCAA Tournament seven times, including six of the last seven years – 2006, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Bargfeldt has been named C-USA Coach of the Year three times.

Bargfeldt has led the Golden Hurricane to a winning record in each of his nine seasons, and is the only coach in Tulsa history to post as many as four winning seasons. Tulsa has won at least 40 games four years in a row and in five of the last six years, and he has a career record of 352-169-1, and a .675 winning percentage.

Tulsa's nine league championships and seven NCAA Tournament appearances both lead Conference USA since 2005. Under Bargfeldt, TU has never finished lower than third place in the league, and has a .719 conference winning percentage (146-57). The Hurricane leads C-USA with 26 first-team all-conference selections and 44 total all-conference players since 2006.

Players on Bargfeldt-coached teams have broken into the school's individual season top-10 in 15 categories, and his seven teams have set school records in 19 categories. In addition, 20 of Bargfeldt's pupils rank among the top-10 in various areas, filling every major individual career statistical category.

Under Bargfeldt's tutelage, Tulsa has produced five All-Americans, 44 all-conference players and 17 NFCA all-region players. In addition, the Golden Hurricane boasts 20 C-USA Academic Medalists, 12 C-USA All-Academic Team members, three Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and five Academic All-District student-athletes. Pitcher Aimee Creger, a three-time All-American, became Tulsa's first student-athlete to represent the United States on the USA Softball Women's National Team. Additionally, three players – Jill Barrett, Samantha Cobb and Caitlin Everett – all represented the United States on the USA Baseball Women's National Team. In 2014, Barrett was Tulsa's

first second-team All-American, and the first player to earn Academic All-American and All-America honors in the same season.

Since 2006, the TU offense has set 13 separate single-season school records, including batting average, hits, runs, RBI, home runs, slugging percentage and on-base percentage. The Hurricane defense has twice matched the school fielding percentage record (.975) and in 2010 committed a program-low 36 errors. His pitching staffs have set seven records, including strikeouts, fewest hits allowed and opponent batting average.

In 2013, the Golden Hurricane posted a 42-16-1 record and a 19-5 mark in C-USA play, matching the program's best conference record. TU climbed as high as a No. 17 national ranking – the highest in school history – tied for second place in C-USA, just one-half game out of first, and reached its sixth NCAA Regional. The Hurricane placed four players on the first-team All-C-USA team and three players on the NFCA Midwest Region Team. TU also set four offensive records, and players set five individual single season marks.

The 2012 team won the C-USA regular season and tournament championships and played in the NCAA Regional. The Hurricane finished with a 42-14 record and set the mark for the fewest losses by a TU team, and placed four players on the first-team All-C-USA team and three players on the NFCA Midwest Region Team. In addition to posting the fewest losses in school history, TU set five single season offensive records.

Bargfeldt's 2011 squad won its third C-USA regular season title and reached the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time. Tulsa, the No. 2 seed in the regional for the first time, advanced to the final round of the NCAA Norman Regional, within one win of the Super Regionals. The Golden Hurricane, driven by pitching and defense, set five school pitching records and matched the school record for highest fielding percentage. Pitcher Aimee Creger became Tulsa's second

NFCA Third-Team All-America selection, and the first freshman to receive the honor.

In 2010, Bargfeldt became the winningest coach in school history. His squad finished among the top three in C-USA and won at least 13 league games for the fifth straight year. TU produced four all-conference selections. Lauren Lindsay (2007-10) became Tulsa's All-American when she was selected as a 2010 NFCA Third-Team All-America.

The 2009 season was one of the most accomplished in school history. The Hurricane posted record of 40-17 overall and 16-4 in C-USA play, and won the programs' second C-USA regular season and tournament championships to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament for the third time in school history. The Golden Hurricane won its first NCAA Regional game, and advanced to the championship round of the NCAA Norman Regional. In addition, the 2009 squad set 10 team and five individual single season records.

In 2008, Bargfeldt led Tulsa to a 34-25 overall record and 14-10 in C-USA play and its second NCAA Regional appearance. That squad tied a school record in on-base percentage with .352, set by his 2006 team. Hurricane players in 2008 set or tied seven single-season school records.

In 2007, he led Tulsa to a 30-28 record to become the first coach in program history to post winning seasons in his first two years at the helm. In his first season as skipper, Bargfeldt led TU to the program's first-ever conference championship, in addition to the school's first-ever NCAA Regional bid by winning Conference USA's automatic bid. In that campaign, Bargfeldt led TU to a 34-24 record and three tournament titles to go along with its regular-season and post-season conference championships. Tulsa also set team records for walks drawn and on-base percentage, all while playing in the fourth fewest games in the program's history. Prior to coming to Tulsa, Bargfeldt served as assistant

coach at Georgia Tech for the 2003-04 season. While at Tech, his primary duties involved working with the pitchers and catchers. He was the recruiting coordinator, served as the bench coach and was a batting practice pitcher for the Yellow Jackets.

While at Georgia Tech, the Yellow Jackets finished the 2004 season with a 49-17 record and an NCAA Regional appearance. Ranked as high as 18th in the country that season, Georgia Tech and third-team All-American Jessica Sallinger broke 15 school records while finishing fourth nationally in earned run average with a 0.97 mark. Tech also registered 29 shutouts in 2004, while defeating two top-10 teams for the first time in school history.

Before his one-year stint at Georgia Tech, Bargfeldt

coached at Pendleton Heights High School and Pendleton Middle School for 22 years, including the 2004-05 school year. While there, he helped lead the Arabian varsity baseball team to five sectional championships and one regional title.

From 1980-82, Bargfeldt was an assistant baseball coach at Anderson University in Anderson, Ind., serving as pitching and hitting coach. He completed his bachelor's degree in 1981 while serving as an assistant coach at Anderson.

An NAIA Honorable Mention All-American in football and baseball, Bargfeldt was drafted in the 31st round of the 1977 Major League Baseball amateur draft by the Chicago Cubs.

Bargfeldt, a former ASA National Player Representative,

was also a member of the ASA National Board of Directors (2000-2004). He served on the Men's National Team Selection Committee during that time as well. As a member of the board, he assisted with the selection of the coaching staff and the national team members. The 2002 team won the program's first Pan-American Qualifier Gold Medal.

As a member of the ASA's Men's Fast Pitch national team in 1991, Bargfeldt won a silver medal at the Pan American Games as the starting shortstop. In 1993, he was on the gold medal-winning team at the U.S. Sports Festival. He was also a five-time ASA Men's Fastpitch All-American.

Bargfeldt and his wife, Barbara, have three children: Kenny, Alexya and Jeb.



Crissy Strimple
Associate Head Coach
8TH YEAR

Former Golden Hurricane slugger Crissy Strimple is in her eighth season as an assistant coach at The University of Tulsa. She was promoted to associate head coach before the 2011-12 academic year.

At Tulsa, Strimple's main responsibilities include working with the Hurricane infield and serving as recruiting coordinator. Strimple coordinates Tulsa's travel while overseeing the program's budget.

In six years, Strimple has coached an infield defense that contributed to two record-setting seasons in fielding percentage and one in fewest errors. The 2010 squad committed a program-low 36 errors, and the 2010 and 2011 teams fielded at a .975 clip, matching the 2005 team for best fielding percentage.

Since 2008, the TU offense has set eight separate single-season school records, including batting average, hits, runs, RBI, home runs, slugging percentage and on-base percentage.

Strimple played third base for TU during the 2002 and 2003 campaigns, following a two-year tenure at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M.

Strimple came to TU after serving as an assistant coach at Central Arkansas for one season. While at UCA, Strimple was responsible for the coordination of recruiting, as well as supervising the academic progress of the team. She also worked heavily with the defensive schemes for the Bears. Prior to her stint at UCA, she served as the director of softball operations at Arkansas for two years. Strimple was also a team manager where her duties included travel, equipment,

field maintenance and general management of the softball office.

As a player with the Golden Hurricane, Strimple led the team in home runs with 10 as a senior and was the team offensive player of the year in both her junior and senior seasons. Her 18 career home runs still ranks sixth all-time at TU. Defensively, she holds the top two single-season assist totals in the Tulsa record book. Strimple also became the first freshman in NEO history to earn first-team NJCAA All-America Region II honors.

Strimple graduated from The University of Tulsa in 2003 with a degree in exercise sports science. She earned her master's degree in education with emphasis on sports administration from Arkansas in 2006. She resides in Tulsa.



Kirin Kumar
Assistant Coach
6TH YEAR

Kirin Kumar returns to Tulsa, where she spent five years as an assistant coach from 2006-10. Prior to her rehiring with the Golden Hurricane, she held stints at North Carolina, Western Kentucky and Tennessee Tech.

While at Tulsa from 2006-10, Kumar's duties included working with the outfielders, and serving as recruiting coordinator and dugout coach. During that period, the Hurricane won two regular season and two tournament championships in Conference USA, and played in three NCAA Regionals.

Kumar spent the 2013-14 year at Tennessee Tech, where she coached the infield and outfield positions, as well as baserunning, and served as bench and defensive coach during games.

Kumar was previous an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Western Kentucky from 2011-13. She oversaw the development of the infield and outfield positions, as well as slap-hitting and baserunning, and helped lead the Hilltoppers to the program's first conference championship and NCAA postseason appearance. She was also responsible for all aspects of recruitment and managed camps.

She left Tulsa to take an assistant coaching position at North Carolina in 2010-11. She served as hitting coach and infield/dugout coach, and held responsibilities for the program budget and camps. UNC earned its highest conference finish in four years and reached the finals of the ACC Tournament.

Kumar graduated from Georgia Tech in May 2005 with a degree in business management. She was a starting utility player for the Yellow Jackets for four seasons, playing a total of six positions. Kumar played under Bargfeldt at Georgia Tech during the 2004 season.

The Santa Ana, Calif., native saved her best season in a Yellow Jacket uniform for her senior campaign in 2005. Starting 61 of the team's 65 games, she helped Tech win the ACC regular season and tournament titles and finish as runners-up at the NCAA Regional in Athens, Ga. During the postseason, she led the Ramblin' Wreck with a .353 batting average, including a .500 average at the ACC Tournament while earning a spot on the all-tournament team.

During her senior season, she finished fourth on the squad with a .322 batting average with six doubles and 20 RBI. Kumar also posted a .348 on-base percentage and a .986 fielding percentage, and was the 14th toughest player in the country to strike out as a senior.

In her career, Kumar played in 251 games, ranking second all-time at Georgia Tech. Her senior class also graduated as the winningest class in Tech history, while leading Tech to its first two ACC titles and four straight NCAA appearances.

2015 Tulsa Softball Preview

When looking forward to the start of a new sports season, it is often impossible to avoid considering the events of the previous season. Such is the case for the 2015 Tulsa softball team.

In 2014, the Golden Hurricane went 53-9, won the Conference USA regular season and tournament championships, produced two All-Americans, set 19 team and individual records, and reached its highest national ranking – 15th – and the final game of the NCAA Regional. It was the greatest regular season in program history.

Looking on those accomplishments, it would be fair to wonder how TU can produce a better season in 2015. The Hurricane must replace the middle of its defense, including both All-Americans – shortstop Jill Barrett and pitcher Aimee Creger. All of last year's seniors experienced the best, or one of the best, seasons of their careers. Tulsa, led by 10th-year Head Coach John Bargfeldt, will turn to some of the players already on the roster, as well as the four incoming freshmen.

"We had such an outstanding regular season. I guess the one thing that I look at is we didn't expect that to happen," Bargfeldt said. "There were some holes that we had to fill and we weren't quite sure how they were going to be filled. A lot of those holes were filled by players that were already on the roster, and it was a matter of them improving and making some adjustments in their play. That's one of the things that we'll be looking for this year. A lot of those players that were champing at the bit, waiting for their opportunity to get consistent playing time – well, that time is here for them."

While it may seem a tall task to replace the production of that group of seniors on both offense and defense, it is important to note how much offensive production and pitching is still on the roster. When the team met for the first time in the fall, Bargfeldt immediately emphasized exactly how much they return in 2015.

"I told them how many .300 hitters we have returning. Some of those were small samples, but we have five .300 hitters returning," Bargfeldt said. "We hit a school-record 59 home runs last year. Well guess what? 33 of them are still on this roster. Some of those numbers were accomplished in part time duty. We have 24-7 coming back (in the circle). And both of them were under a 2.50 ERA. There's an awful lot coming back."

Tulsa returns a total of five players that started at least 35 games last year. That includes starters in senior Bailey Erwin and junior Caitlin Sill in the circle, junior Catherine Horner at catcher, senior Julie Kernen at first base, sophomore Maggie Withee at third base and senior Erica Sampson in left field. In addition, junior outfielder Jodi Edmiston started 35, while senior outfielder Jocelyn Sheffield, junior infielder Kaitlin Allen, and sophomores Maddie Withee and Brittany Walker are back for another year.

In all, those returning players totaled 33 of Tulsa's

school-record 59 home runs, 168 of its record 333 RBI, 166 of its record 368 runs, and 90 of its 166 extra base hits.

"It's just a matter of, how can this team mesh to come up with a lineup that can strike from anywhere? That's what we had last year," said Bargfeldt. "We've always played good defense here, and we feel like we have the players where we can do that again. We've always had good pitching. We have a lot of high on-base, high average hitters returning. Can they duplicate, or improve on that?"

The four freshmen – pitchers Lexi Blevins and Emily Watson, and infielders Shelby Estocado and Kate Myers – will have an opportunity to plug some of the gaps in the lineup and the middle of the defense.

"We are excited about some freshmen that we have coming in," Bargfeldt said. "We feel like there is the possibility that those players are going to fill some of the holes."

Advancing farther into the NCAA Tournament is always the ultimate goal for the Hurricane, but the primary goal of each season is to compete for conference championships. 2015 brings even more new challenges for Tulsa, as it plays its first season as member of the American Athletic Conference. TU will face recently familiar opponents in East Carolina, Houston, Memphis and UCF, but will also see new opponents in UConn and South Florida. All four ex-Conference USA teams have recently played in the NCAA postseason, and South Florida is a perennial postseason team, having reached the Women's College World Series in 2012.

"Playing for a conference championship has always been very important for us. When it comes to conference play, I think that's where we're going to face even stiffer competition in The American," Bargfeldt said.

"The majority of the teams that have been representing Conference USA are in The American now. This is going to be a new conference, where a lot of the teams are familiar with us. But we've never played South Florida or UConn. Most of the other teams went (to The American) the year before, so a lot of their rosters have changed. It'll be somewhat of a learning experience in seeing how their teams are doing this year."

The Hurricane will play six conference weekend series and six non-conference tournaments. TU will also play its typical round of regional midweek games against Oklahoma State, Arkansas, Wichita State and Missouri State, and a weekend series against Kansas.

"It's a pretty balanced schedule. I always try to give us opportunities to play against some of the best teams in the country, and we'll have that by going and playing Baylor and Oregon at Baylor. We'll play a lot of Big 12 teams this year. We'll run into a couple of Big 10 teams in some of our tournaments."

In all, Tulsa's schedule will feature up to 15 games against seven teams that played in the NCAA postseason in 2014, including Women's College World Series participants Baylor and Oregon.

The Golden Hurricane has experienced many of its 2014 accomplishments in recent history. Tulsa won its fifth conference regular season championship and fourth league tournament title. The NCAA Regional appearance was its fifth in a row and seventh overall, and for the third time, TU played on the final day of the regional. Attempting to top an outstanding season is certainly something the program has become accustomed to in Bargfeldt's tenure.

"It was really easy to celebrate, with what that team accomplished last year," he said. "They did a great job, but: A) We didn't expect them to do that when they went through the fall, and B) we have a lot coming back from what was accomplished last year. I'd say there's a lot of optimism with what could happen with this team."

American Athletic Conference

#AMERICANRISING

Not entirely unlike the nation that provides its name-sake, the American Athletic Conference was born from an ideal in which members with ambitious goals are provided with the means to succeed in their quests for excellence.

With roots that extend to three conferences, the American Athletic Conference membership in 2014-15 consists of 11 institutions: the University of Central Florida, the University of Cincinnati, East Carolina University, the University of Connecticut, the University of Houston, the University of Memphis, the University of South Florida, Southern Methodist University, Temple University, Tulane University and the University of Tulsa.

The 2015-16 season sees the U.S. Naval Academy join the ranks in football only.

Under the leadership of commissioner Mike Aresco, The American, which operated as the Big East Conference from 1979 to 2013, has immediately taken a place at the forefront of Division I athletics, with schools that have played in four Bowl Championship Series games, won four NCAA men's basketball titles since 1999, and won nine NCAA women's basketball championships since 1995.

Two American Athletic Conference football teams were ranked in the top 15 of the final 2013 Associated Press poll. Five were selected for bowl games, including UCF, which won the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and finished the season ranked No. 10 nationally. The con-

ference produced 14 players who received All-America recognition by a major outlet.

The American had four players chosen in the first round of the 2014 NFL Draft, trailing only the SEC and the ACC among FBS conferences. UCF quarterback Blake Bortles highlighted a group of 12 American Athletic Conference players chosen when he was taken No. 3 overall by the Jacksonville Jaguars.

The success of The American in Year 1 was not limited to the gridiron. UConn won NCAA titles in both men's and women's basketball. The conference had the best postseason winning percentage of any league in men's basketball, while The American produced top-10 teams in baseball, men's soccer and men's golf and sent half of its participating teams to the NCAA Softball Championship.

The American Athletic Conference holds television partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports that will give the conference unprecedented national exposure. The football portion of the contract, which begins in the 2014 season, calls for nearly 90 percent of conference-controlled games on national broadcast or national cable platforms. The first American Athletic Conference Football Championship, which will be played in 2015, will be carried either on ABC or ESPN on Championship Saturday.

In men's basketball, the television deal calls for all conference-controlled games to be televised, with more than 63 percent slotted for national broadcast or national cable — a minimum of 107 games. The entire postseason tournament will be televised, including the championship game, which will be either on ABC or

ESPN. Sixty percent of the American's women's basketball games will be carried on either national cable, regional sports networks or ESPN3.

American Athletic Conference teams will have access to the pinnacle of college football's postseason structure. An American representative would be chosen for the College Football Playoff semifinals if it is among the top four teams following the regular season. Otherwise, the league would place its champion in either the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl or Peach Bowl if it is ranked higher than the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference.

Additionally, The American has announced primary or secondary partnerships with 12 bowls for the next six-year cycle, ensuring multiple annual matchups against the nation's top conferences and providing desirable postseason destinations to member institutions and their fans.

The American Athletic Conference administers to its membership from a state-of-the-art office located in Providence, R.I. The location of the conference headquarters — just steps from the city's Amtrak station and 10 minutes from T.F. Green International Airport — gives the conference easy access to its member schools.

The conference headquarters is equipped with a complete video production studio, serving as the home of the American Digital Network, and small- and large-scale meeting rooms to accommodate the many coaches' and administrators' meetings held on-site each year.

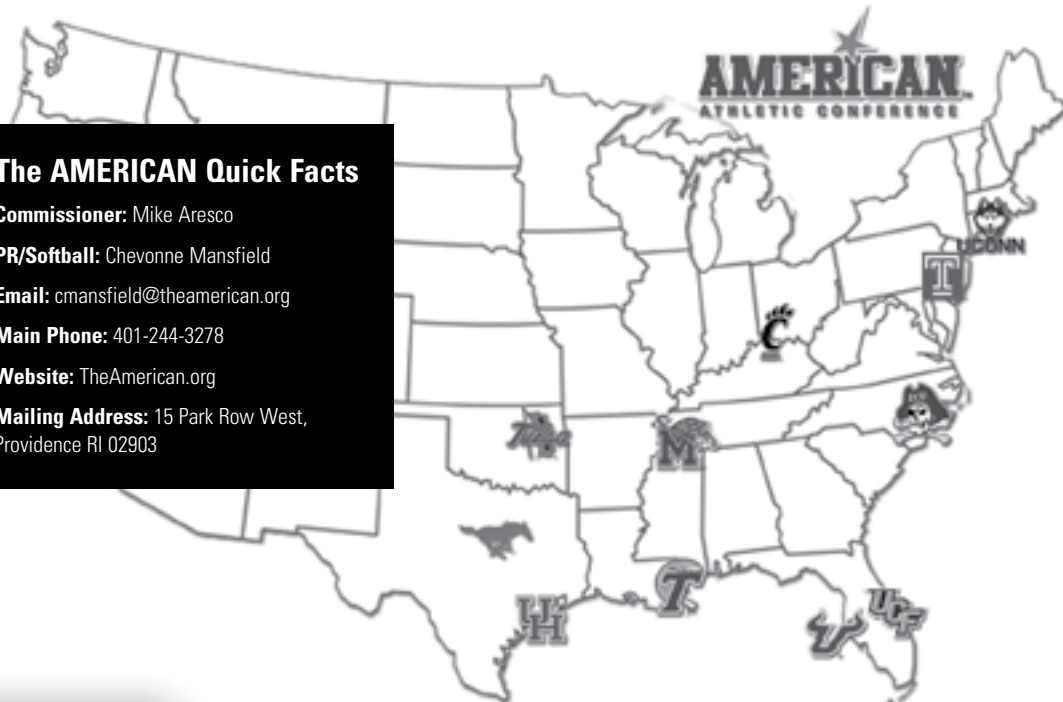
