Head Coach

Sixth Season

Matilda Mossman is in her sixth season at The University of Tulsa after being appointed as the head women's basketball coach on March 22, 2011. Mossman took over a five-win team and in just her second year won a conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

In her first season at the helm of the program (2011-12), the Golden Hurricane posted 13 wins, and finished league play with an 8-8 record and a sixth-place finish, but a year later, the program took another big step forward as the Hurricane captured the 2013 Conference USA tournament title, advanced to the NCAA Tournament and posted the first non-losing record (17-17) since 2006.

During the 2013-14 season, Tulsa posted a 12-16 overall record, including a 6-10 mark in Conference USA, but bounced back to tally the first winning record (18-14) since 2006 and advance to the WNIT Second Round during the 2014-15 season.

In the 2015-16 campaign, the Golden Hurricane recorded a 12-19 mark, including an 8-10 record in The American for a sixth-place finish.

During her tenure, Mossman has coached two-time all-Conference USA performer Taleya Mayberry, and helped Kelsee Grovey earn C-USA All-Freshman team accolades, as well as Mayberry, Grovey and Tiffani Cousnard receive C-USA All-Tournament team recognition in 2013. She also coached Ashley Clark to all-C-USA second team accolades as a sophomore, second team all-conference accolades and Sixth Man of the Year recognition as a junior in the American Athletic Conference, and third-team all-conference accolades as a senior.

In 13 years as a collegiate head coach, Mossman has registered an overall 219-174 record. She had a 67-27 mark at Arkansas (1981-84), an 80-66 mark at Kansas State (1984-89), and has a 72-81 record in five seasons at Tulsa. She also coached on the high school level for nine seasons. In 22 years as a head coach, Mossman has compiled a 410-2274 record for a .643 winning percentage.

Mossman earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1979 and her graduate degree in education in 1980, both from Western Kentucky.

She has two sons, Scott and Matt.

On the Bench

The Golden Hurricane returns eight letterwinners, including two starters, and one squad member, and welcomes five newcomers this season. The roster features three seniors - Ashley Hughes, Jessica Pongonis and Teanna Reid; three juniors - Ebony Parker, Liesl Spoerl and Erika Wakefield; three sophomores - Tatyana Perez, Crystal Polk and Tyjae' Scales; and five freshmen - Jasmine Butler, Shug Dickson, Kendrian Elliott, Alexis Gaulden and Addison Richards.

Returning Starters

Tulsa returns two starters from last season, including junior Erika Wakefield and sophomore Tyjae' Scales. Wakefield averaged 8.7 points, 3.0 assists and 2.9 rebounds per game, while Scales posted 2.1 points and 4.1 rebounds per game.

Hitting Their Mark

Junior Liesl Spoerl and sophomores Crystal Polk and Tyjae' Scales hit their marks last season, boasting the three best field goal percentages on the team in 2015-16. Polk posted a 48.9 percent clip (64-131), while Spoerl has a 48.7 field goal percentage (37-76), and Scales had a 48.0 percentage (24-50).

Parker for Three

Tulsa junior-transfer Ebony Parker knocked down an NJCAA Division I record 144 three-point shots last season. In comparison, then TU senior Kelsee Grovey had a team-best 68 three's last season and 233 in her career. The most in a single season at Tulsa was 77 by Athena Pirpich (2000-01), while Grovey's 233 career three's is a school best.

Hurricane Picked Ninth in The American Preseason Coaches' Poll

In the American Athletic Conference coaches' poll, UConn was predicted to win the 2016-17 American Athletic Conference Championship, while Temple was second and USF third. Tulane, SMU, East Carolina, Memphis, UCF, Tulsa, Cincinnati and Houston round out the poll.

Mossman Has 219 Career Wins

Matilda Mossman reached the 200-win milestone as Tulsa captured a 70-61 win over UCF on Jan. 31, 2015. Mossman had 67 wins at Arkansas, 80 wins at Kansas State and currently 72 wins at TU for 219 career victories.

In Tulsa's Top 10

Three current Tulsa women's basketball players have earned their way into Tulsa's Top 10 career lists.

- Ashley Hughes is second in free throw percentage with a .861 clip (31 of 36)
- Crystal Polk is seventh in field goal percentage with a .489 clip (64 of 131)
- Teanna Reid is eighth in three-point field goal percentage with a .363 clip (61 of 168)

13 Opponents in 2016 Postseason

Thirteen of Tulsa's opponents played in the postseason in 2015-16, including NCAA teams BYU, Kansas State, Oklahoma, UConn and USF; WNIT teams Arkansas State, Little Rock, Memphis, Saint Louis, South Dakota, Temple and Tulane; and WBI participant New Mexico.

The Non-Conference Slate

Tulsa announced the 13-game non-conference schedule, which features a potential eight games against 2016 postseason teams, five home contests, including games against Arkansas and the 2016 WNIT Champions South Dakota, and a trip to Albuquerque, N.M., for the UNM Thanksgiving Classic. All 14 of TU's potential non-conference opponents finished last year with double-digit wins, while eight teams played in the postseason.

The League Opponents

Tulsa will host 11-time National Champion UConn, as well as three other teams that played in the postseason, in American Athletic Conference action. Five teams in The American advanced to postseason play last year, as UConn and USF played in the NCAA Tournament, and Memphis, Temple and Tulane participated in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. (Tulsa will not host Tulane at home this season.)

Tulsa Women's Hoops to Have 10 Games Broadcast Live

The American Athletic Conference announced that four Tulsa women's basketball games will be produced and distributed live by The American Digital Network (ADN) and will air on TheAmerican.org/dn free of charge, while three additional games will be carried on ESPN3, two will be on the SNY Network and one will be on ESPNU.

Tulsa in Postseason

Tulsa has made five postseason appearances, including WNIT bids in 2004, 2005 and 2015, and NCAA bids in 2006 and 2013. TU lost in the first round in 2004 (Memphis), 2005 (Texas A&M) and 2013 (Stanford), but went 1-1 (W, North Carolina State; L, DePaul) in 2006 and 2015 (W, Missouri State; L, Eastern Michigan), for a 2-5 overall mark in postseason play.

A Hurricane in Tulsa?

The Origination of The University of Tulsa nickname - Golden Hurricane - was created in 1922. A new football coach, Howard Archer came to town and inherited a slew of nicknames dating back to 1895. In the past, Tulsa had been named "Kendallites," "Presbyterians," "Tigers," "Orange and Black," "Tulsans," and of course, "Yellow Jackets." The team started working out in the fall with a new nickname "Yellow Jackets" which was apparently due to the fact that the team was wearing new black and yellow uniforms. The team opened the season and it was apparent that Tulsa was going to have a great year, and trying to seize some publicity for his team, Archer wanted to find a new nickname quickly. After a remark was made in practice one day about "roaring through opponents," and because of their new jersey colors, he thought of "Golden Tornadoes." But a check showed that Georgia Tech already had chosen that tag in 1917. From the tornado, he evolved meteorologically to the hurricane. A few days before the team left for a game against Texas A&M, Archer asked the squad to vote on the name, and thus "Golden Hurricane" was born.
