HURRICANE FINISHES 20TH AND 29TH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Senior Marc Scott finished 10th and junior Luke Traynor came in 34th to lead the Tulsa men's cross country team to a 20th-place finish at the NCAA Championships at E.P. Tom Sawyer State Park in Louisville, Ky. The women's team finished 29th, led by senior Rachel Baptista's 69th-place finish.

Scott's 10th-place finish was Tulsa's highest-ever individual finish at the NCAA Championships. He earned All-America honors for the second year in a row, while Traynor earned an All-America honor in his first year at TU. Baptista's 69th-place finish was the highest-ever for a TU women's runner at the NCAA Championships, and the No. 29 team finish was the highest in program history for the Hurricane women's team.

Scott ran the 10K in 30:02.6 and Traynor finished with a time of 30:22.3 to lead the Tulsa men's team, which totaled 468 points to finish in 20th place. TU finished four points behind Minnesota and 18 points behind Oklahoma State. Syracuse won the men's title with 82 points.

Baptista ran the 6K in 20:39.1, and her 69th-place finish paced the Hurricane women's squad, which totaled 646 points to place 29th. TU trailed San Francisco by 10 points in the team standings. New Mexico won the women's title with 49 points.

Sophomore Ben Preisner placed 114th with a time of 31:06.1, sophomore Adam Roderique placed 188th with a time of 31:52.2, and freshman Austin Del Rosso ran a 32:27.9 to place 228th as Tulsa's fifth men's scoring runner.

Junior Stacie Taylor finished 144th with a time of 21:10.8, sophomore Nicole Lee finished 149th with a time of 21:12.6, sophomore Danielle Medearis placed 223rd in 22:01.0, and senior Clara Langley finished 229th in 22:06.1.

Tulsa will lose only two of the 14 athletes that competed at the NCAA Championships this year to graduation, and return 12 runners in 2016 with experience at the national meet.

TU ATHLETES EARN ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Marc Scott and Luke Traynor were selected as All-Americans by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association after their performances at the NCAA Championships. Scott earned All-America honors for the second year in a row, while Traynor earned an All-America honor in his first year at TU.

TULSA TEAMS EARN AT-LARGE BERTHS TO NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Tulsa men's and women's cross country teams earned at-large berths to the NCAA Championships. It is the first time in school history that both the men and women have qualified in the same year. The Tulsa men will make their seventh appearance and fifth-straight showing at the NCAA Championships. Previous appearances came in 2007, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. The Hurricane women will be making their second NCAA Championships appearance. The first came in 2010.

MARC SCOTT NAMED MIDWEST REGION ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

TU senior Marc Scott was named the Midwest Region Athlete of the Year by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association for the NCAA Division I Cross Country season. Scott won the NCAA Midwest Regional individual championship, leading the Golden Hurricane to a fourth-place finish. He unbeaten in four races this season, also winning the American Athletic Conference Championship, Wisconsin adidas Invitational and the Chile Pepper Festival.

TU TEAMS PLACE FOURTH AT NCAA MIDWEST REGIONAL

Senior Marc Scott won the NCAA Midwest Regional individual championship, and both the Tulsa men's and women's cross country teams placed fourth at the regional meet at Rim Rock Farm in Lawrence, Kan.

Scott turned in a 10K time of 29:37.1, and qualified as an individual for the NCAA Championships, which will take place Nov. 21 in Louisville, Ky. Senior Rachel Baptista led the TU women's team with a fifth-place finish in a 6K time of 20:22.7.

The Tulsa men's team finished fourth with 127 points, behind Oklahoma (104), Minnesota (95) and Oklahoma State (59). The women's team placed fourth with 151 points, behind Minnesota (125), lowa State (98) and Oklahoma State (51). TU tied in points with Kansas, but claimed fourth place by beating KU runners in three of the five positions. The fourth-place finish tied a program-best for the women's team, matching the 2014 result.

Scott and Baptista earned all-region honors along with junior Luke Traynor and sophomore Ben Preisner for the men's team, and sophomore Nicole Lee for the women's team.

TULSA MEN AND WOMEN RANKED IN USTFCCCA NATIONAL POLL

The Tulsa men's cross country team is ranked No. 20, and the women's team is rank No. 27 in the latest U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association Division I National rankings, released Nov. 16. The TU men jumped into the national rankings at No. 13 on Oct. 20 following its eighth-place finish at the Wisconsin adidas Invitational on Oct. 16. The women's team debuts this season at No. 27 after a fourth-place showing at the NCAA Midwest Regional, and a berth in the NCAA Championships.

TULSA TEAMS RANKED FOURTH IN MIDWEST REGION POLLS

The Tulsa men's and women's cross country teams are both finished fourth in the USTFCCCA Midwest Region Poll. Both teams placed fourth at the NCAA Midwest Regional meet on Nov. 13 in Lawrence, Kan. The men's team was previously ranked 2nd, and the women's team was ranked sixth.

BACK-TO-BACK: CROSS COUNTRY WINS AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Senior Marc Scott won the men's individual title and senior Rachel Baptista placed third in the women's race to lead The University of Tulsa cross country teams to their second consecutive American Athletic Conference Championships Saturday morning at Lake Kristi.

This is the sixth straight conference title for the Golden Hurricane men, and the third straight conference championship for the TU women's team. Scott won The American individual championship for the second year in a row, running an 8K time of 23:28.32. Baptista finished the 6K race in 20:30.82.

Tulsa placed four of the top five finishers in the men's 8K race, and all five scorers finished among the top-11 runners. The women's team placed three of the top six runners, and all five scorers finished among the top-18 in the 6K race. All five men's scorers, as well as Baptista, Taylor and Lee on the women's side ran their fastest times at TU in their respective distances.

TEN TU ATHLETES EARN ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS; HURRICANE EARNS NATIONAL COACHING STAFF OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Senior Marc Scott, sophomore Ben Preisner, junior Luke Traynor, sophomore Adam Roderique, redshirt freshman Austin Del Rosso and sophomore Elijah Silva earned men's All-American Athletic Conference honors.

Senior Rachel Baptista, junior Stacie Taylor, sophomore Nicole Lee and junior Clara Langley earned all-conference honors from the women's team

In addition, the TU coaching staff earned both men's and women's American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors.

MARC SCOTT NAMED USTFCCCA NATIONAL ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

Marc Scott was named the Division I Men's Cross Country Athlete of the Week on Oct. 19 by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association.

Scott won the award after placing first at the prestigious Wisconsin adidas Invitational, running the 8K race in 23:35.0. He led Tulsa, which was the 22nd-highest ranked team at the meet, to an eighth-place finish, eclipsing 14 higher-ranked opponents.

BAPTISTA AND SCOTT NAMED AMERICAN CONFERENCE XC ATH-LETES OF THE WEEK

Marc Scott and Rachel Baptista were named the American Athletic Conference Cross Country Male and Female Athletes of the Week on Oct. 20.

Both runners led the Golden Hurricane in their respective races at the Wisconsin adidas Invitational. Scott won the men's 8K race with a time of 23:35.0, and Baptista placed 21st in the women's 6K race with a time of 20:09.6.

TULSA SHOWS WELL NATIONALLY AT WISCONSIN INVITATIONAL

Senior Marc Scott won the Wisconsin adidas Invitational 8K race with a time of 23:35.0, leading the Tulsa men's cross country team to an eighth-place finish at the Thomas Zimmer Championship Cross Country Course in Madison, Wisc.

Scott's victory paced the Golden Hurricane, which placed eighth as a team with 328 points. TU finished ahead of 14 higher-ranked opponents, including nine in the top-30 of the USTFCCCA National Poll. The Hurricane had entered the race as the 22nd-highest ranked team in the field. Of the 36 competing men's teams, 28 are ranked either in the top-30 of the USTFCCCA National Coaches' Poll or receiving national votes.

Senior Rachel Baptista finished 21st in the 6K race with a time of 20:09.6 to lead the TU women's team, which totaled 601 points and tied for 27th place with West Virginia. Of the 36 women's teams in the race, 25 were either ranked in the national top-30, or receiving votes in the poll.

SCOTT WINS CHILE PEPPER; MEN PLACE SECOND, WOMEN THIRD

Senior Marc Scott won the men's individual title with an 8K time of 23:30.90, lead the Tulsa men's cross country team to a second-place finish, while the TU women placed third at the Chile Pepper Festival in Fayetteville, Ark.

The Golden Hurricane men scored 60 points, while Arkansas won the men's race with 24 points. The TU women totaled 113 points, trailing Arkansas (18 points) and Abilene Christian (99 points) in team scoring. Senior Rachel Baptista paced the TU women with a 5K time of 17:06.86 to finish 23rd.

TU RUNS AT OKLAHOMA STATE IN SEASON-OPENING MEET

The University of Tulsa men's and women's cross country teams opened the 2015 season Tuesday morning, with the running of the Cowboy Preview at

the OSU Cross Country Course.

The men's 5K and women's 3K races represented the first events of the new year for Tulsa, Oklahoma State, Arkansas and Oklahoma. The Golden Hurricane men's squad completed the meet with a team duels record of 1-2, while the women's side posted a 0-3 mark in the team duels.

Redshirt freshman Austin Del Rosso was the top finisher for the Tulsa men, placing 10th with a time of 16:18.3 in the 5K run. Redshirt freshman Isaac Dobos and sophomores Dallas Elmore and Adam Roderique followed in succession at 11th, 12th and 13th, with respective times of 16:19.0, 16:21.4 and 16:21.4. Sophomore Steven Salvano rounded out the TU scoring with an 18th-place time of 16:38.7.

Sophomore Alyssa Jones paced the Hurricane women with a 17th-place time of 11:11.8 in the 3K race. She was followed closely by juniors Olivia Lopez and Stacie Taylor, who placed 18th and 19th with times of 11:12.7 and 11:13.2, respectively. Redshirt freshman Alyssa Bolliger finished 22nd with a time of 11:18.3, and sophomore Emma Galbraith rounded out the scorers with a time of 11:27.2, placing 25th.

The Hurricane men's team defeated Arkansas, 21-36, and fell to Oklahoma, 32-23, and Oklahoma State, 41-15. The TU women fell to Oklahoma, 38-18, Arkansas, 47-15, and Oklahoma State, 45-15.
