#### THE STORYLINES . . .

- This is the seventh meeting between Tulsa and Fresno State
- Fresno State won the first four games of the series, while Tulsa has won the last two meetings.
- Tulsa and Fresno State were members of the Western Athletic Conference together from 1996-2004.
- Tulsa has won the two non-conference games between the two teams.
- Tulsa has the smallest FBS enrollment with 3,473 students, while Fresno State has an enrollment of 24,136 students.

#### QUICK HITS . . .

- A total of 15 freshmen have seen action in at least one of the first three games this year, including 10 red-shirt freshmen and five true freshmen . . . two transfers also made playing debuts this year.
- The five true freshmen who have played this season include DB Manny Bunch, LB Cooper Edmiston, DS Robert Hill, LB Robert Revels III and DT Shemarr Robinson . . .
- Tulsa returned 27 different players who had previously started at least one game in their careers, either on offense (15) or defense (12).
- Only two players OG Tyler Bowling and DT Hayden Carman had not made a previous start among starters in the first three games this year . . . Bowling and Carman have started all three games for the Hurricane in 2016.
- Tulsa's defense has had three interceptions, and two have gone for touchdowns, covering 24 and 65 yards.
- In 16 games under Philip Montgomery, Tulsa has scored over 40 points nine times and has posted a 7-2 record when doing so.
- Through three games, Tulsa's defense has allowed 26.3 points, which is 12.7 points less than the defensive unit allowed last year through three games.

# PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN SECOND SEASON LEADING TULSA FOOTBALL PROGRAM . . .

- Philip Montgomery is in his second season leading the Tulsa football program.
- He became the 29th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2014.
- Montgomery has an 8-8 overall head coaching record with the Hurricane.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 Tulsa season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU.
- In his first year, Montgomery led Tulsa to six wins and to the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.
- He became the fifth Tulsa head coach to lead his first team to a bowl game.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the final three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.
- Under his guidance, Baylor led the nation in total offense and scoring offense in each of his final two seasons.
- Quarterbacks he tutored included 2011 Heisman Trophy winner Robert Griffin III as well as Bryce Petty and Nick Florence at Baylor and Kevin Kolb and Case Keenum at Houston.
- Before moving to Baylor, he spent five years at Houston, also under Art Briles.
- Has coached in 10 Bowl games in his 13 years as a collegiate coach.
- Before moving to the college ranks, he spent one year as the offensive coordinator at Denton (Texas) HS, and before that spent six years at Stephenville HS, where he was a part of back-to-back Class 4A state championships in 1998 and 1999.

#### THE SERIES . . .

- This is the seventh meeting between Tulsa and Fresno State.
- Fresno State leads the series 4-2.
- The Bulldogs won the first four games, while Tulsa has won the last two games.
- FS has a 2-0 mark at home with those wins coming in 2000 and 2002.
- Fresno State has outscored Tulsa by 18.5 points in their four wins, while Tulsa has a 4.0 win margin in its two wins in the series.
- Fresno State's four wins were when the two were members of the Western Athletic Conference
- Tulsa's first win in the series came when the two teams met in the 2005 AutoZone Liberty Bowl, where Tulsa won 31-24.

#### **DEFENSE IS OPPORTUNISTIC...**

- Through three games this year, Tulsa's defense has forced six turnovers, including three fumbles recoveries and three interceptions.
- All but one of those takeaways has led to a Tulsa score.
- Tulsa has scored 35 points, including 21 against San Jose State (2 fumbles/1 INT) and 14 points vs. NC A&T (2 INTs), off of those takeaways.
- Among Tulsa's three interceptions two have been returned for TDs.
- In the last nine games, dating back to last year's SMU game on Oct. 31, 2015,
  Tulsa defenders have had six interception returns for touchdowns one at SMU,
  one vs. UCF, two at Tulane and one each this year agaisnt San Jose State and
  North Carolina A&T.

#### WHAT'S SO SPECIAL . . .

- The Tulsa special teams has been opportunistic this year, scoring a total of 34
  points through the first three games.
- In addition, McKinley Whitfield has blocked two punts, both against NC A&T, that led
  to the offense scoring touchdowns on both occasions.
- Redford Jones has accounted for 28 points on 13-of-13 PATs and 5-of-6 FGs
- Whitfield scored the remaining six points on a fumble recovery in the end zone on a punt against San Jose State.
- Eleven of the opponents 38 drives starting after a Tulsa kickoff or punt, began at the oppositions 20-yard line or inside the 20.
- Jones has kicked off 21 times for a 63.3 average with 11 touchbacks.
- Dalton Parks has punted 17 times for a 42.0 average with 5 landing inside the 20yard line and 3 touchbacks.

#### THE CONNECTION . . .

- The passing combination of senior quarterback Dane Evans to senior receiver Keevan Lucas connected for a touchdown against North Carolina A&T for the first time in nearly a year.
- Evans threw three TDs to Lucas against NC A&T on Sept. 17, 2016, while the last time the two hooked up on a TD was Sept. 19, 2015 at Oklahoma (Lucas missed the final nine games in 2015 with an injury).
- Lucas caught four passes in the NC A&T game for 119 yards and three went for touchdowns.
- All but one of Lucas' 20 career touchdowns have come from Evans . . . Lucas' first career TD, covering 24 yards, as a true freshman in 2013 came from Cody Green.

#### **MCKINLEY MAKING PLAYS...**

- Sophomore safety McKinley Whitfield has made some big defensive plays for the Hurricane through three games.
- In the season opener against San Jose State, Whitfield recovered a fumble on an attempted punt return in the end zone for a touchdown putting Tulsa ahead 38-7 in the second quarter.
- Against North Carolina A&T, Whitfield blocked two punts . . . the first gave Tulsa the ball at the NC A&T one-yard line, and the second put Tulsa at the NC A&T 27-yard line.
- In between those blocks, Whitfield also had an interception that put Tulsa on their own 49-yard line.
- His blocked punts and interception led to 21 Tulsa points against NC A&T.

## DANE EVANS NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM® . . .

- Senior QB Dane Evans was named one of 24 players to the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®, one of the most coveted off-the-field honors in college football.
- The Good Works Team® award is celebrating 25 years of recognizing college football players who dedicate their time to bettering their communities.
- Evans has volunteered for Feed My Starving Children, tornado Team Relief, Youth Day Camps, FCA events, St. Francis Children's Hospital visits and elementary school reading and activities.

#### **GRADUATES ON THE TULSA ROSTER...**

- Tulsa has 12 student-athletes on its roster that have already graduated with their bachelor's degrees from The University of Tulsa.
- The offensive players already with their bachelor's degree includes: Josh Atkinson (WR), Blake Belcher (OL), Dane Evans (QB), Rod Riederer (TE).
- Defensive players who have their degrees are: Jeremy Brady (DB), Hayden Carman (DT), Matt Hickman (LB), Matt Linscott (LB), Trent Martin (LB), Conner Sherwood (LB), Craig Suits (LB) and Jerry Uwaezuoke (DT).
- In addition, graduate transfer running back Raymond Taylor, earned his bachelor's degree from Oklahoma State before transferring this season to Tulsa.

#### **BELCHER & LUCAS RETURN...**

- The season opener saw the return of two Tulsa players who missed most of the 2015 season due to injuries after starting the year before.
- Offensive guard Blake Belcher suffered an ACL injury early in the 2015 season opener against FAU, and missed the remainder of the 2015 campaign.
- In the fourth game against Houston, receiver Keevan Lucas suffered a torn patella tendon which ended his season.
- Belcher, who was the starting right tackle in 2014 and in the 2015 season opener, moved to right guard this season, and played 77 snaps in the season opener.
- Lucas was back in the starting lineup in the season opener and caught six passes for 112 yards against San Jose State.

# WHAT??? A DEFENSIVE LINEMAN SCORING TOUCHDOWNS . . .

Kolton Shindelar was projected to be a tight end at Tulsa from high school . . . he began his collegiate career at tight end, but was moved to the defensive line in the spring of 2015 . . . he has played in a reserve role last year and this year, but has helped make a difference on the Tulsa defensive front . . . in the regular season finale a year ago against Tulane, and Tulsa fighting for its sixth win and bowl eligibility, Shindelar intercepted a Tulane pass and went 89 yards for a touchdown to put Tulsa ahead 45-34 with 1:12 remaining in the game . . . this year, Shindelar had his second career INT return for a touchdown when he took an interception against North Carolina A&T 65 yards for a touchdown.

#### TULSA JUMPS ON NORTH CAROLINA A&T EARLY . . .

- Tulsa had a 10-0 lead in the first six minutes of the game against the FCS' 19thranked North Carolina A&T Aggies.
- After the first quarter Tulsa was ahead 24-0, and within the first 20 minutes of the game led 31-), and at halftime held a 48-0 lead.
- 28 of Tulsa's first 31 points came off of either an interception or blocked punt . . .
   Tulsa intercepted two passes and two blocked punts that led to touchdowns . . .
   one of the INTs was returned 65 yards for a score.
- Tulsa built its lead to 58-0 with 2:46 left in the third quarter.

#### **TOUGH ONE AT #4 OHIO STATE...**

- Six turnovers (two fumbles and four interceptions) minimized any chance Tulsa had to come out with a win at No. 4-ranked Ohio State.
- The Hurricane went late into the second quarter trailing only 6-3, but in the final 3:02 Ohio State defenders intercepted two Tulsa passes and took them back for touchdowns to take a 20-3 lead into halftime.
- In the first half, Tulsa's defense held Ohio State to 158 total yards.
- Tulsa out-gained OSU in the first period, 103 to 40, but the Buckeyes out-gained Tulsa in the second quarter 118 to 21.
- Seventeen of Ohio State's 20 first-half points came off of turnovers.
- In the second half, Ohio State started its final two touchdown drives in Tulsa territory at the Tulsa 28 and 46-yard lines.
- For the game, Tulsa's defense held Ohio State to 417 total yards, 359 yards less than what the Buckeyes gained the week before in a 77-10 win over Bowling Green.

#### **RUN GAME GUIDES OFFENSE IN SEASON OPENER...**

- Tulsa's offense totaled 512 yards against San Jose State making it the eighth time in the 14 games with Philip Montgomery as head coach that the Hurricane has gone over 500 yards of total offense.
- Tulsa's 38 first-half points was the most since the Hurricane scored 42 first-half points against Nicholls State on Sept. 15, 2012.
- D'Angelo Brewer rushed for career-highs of 164 yards and three touchdowns.
- Tulsa scored 40 points or more for the 8th time in the Montgomery era.
- For the second consecutive season, Tulsa scored 45 or more points in the season opener . . . last year, Tulsa scored 47 points against FAU.
- Tulsa's 305 rushing yards was the most for a Hurricane team since the 2012 AutoZone Liberty Bowl when Tulsa rushed for 317 yards against lowa State.

#### **DEFENSE TURNS IN SOLID START TO THE SEASON...**

- The 10 points allowed by the Tulsa defense is the fewest allowed since a 41-7 road win over Houston on November 10, 2012.
- San Jose State's 53 yards rushing was the fewest for a Tulsa opponent since holding UTEP to 31 rushing yards on Oct. 11, 2012.
- For the fifth time in the last seven games, Tulsa had an interception for a TD when Jesse Brubaker took a pick-off 24 yards for a touchdown against San Jose State.
- Tulsa held San Jose State to 287 total yards, whereas last year, only two opponents gained under 400 yards in 13 games.

#### LOOK WHAT HE'S DONE IN SEASON OPENERS . . .

- Keevan Lucas had his third straight season opener of over 100 yards receiving.
- He had all of his six receptions for 112 yards in the first half against San Jose State
- In the first half of the last three season openers, Lucas totaled 14 catches for 359 yards and four TDs...he had four receptions for 142 yards and 2 TDs in 2014, and four catches for 105 yards and 2 TDs in 2015.
- Overall, Lucas combined to catch 29 passes for 538 yards, five TDs and an 18.6-yard average per catch in the last three season openers.



#### **HE'S BAAAAAACK...**

- Senior receiver Keevan Lucas, who missed all but the first four games in 2015 with an injury, is back this year to the Tulsa roster.
- In his first game back, Lucas had his seventh 100-yard receiving game in the season opener with 112 yards on six catches vs. San Jose State. He also had 4 receptions for 119 yards and 3 TDs vs. NC A&T. In both of those games all of his receiving yards came in the first half.
- In three games this year, Lucas has 284 yards, three TDs and a 17.8-yard average per catch on 16 receptions.
- He had 101 catches for 1,219 yards and 11 TDs as a sophomore in 2014.
- Lucas now has career numbers of 174 receptions for 2,354 yards and 20 TDs.
- In less than 4 full games in 2015, Lucas had 409 yards and five TDs on 26 catches.
- Lucas now has eight career 100-yard receiving games, including two this year, five in 2014 and one in 2015.

#### A LOOK AT QB DANE EVANS' CAREER . . .

- Dane Evans became only the third quarterback in school history to surpass 4,000 passing yards in a single season last year – Paul Smith is the leader at 5,065 yards in 2007 and David Johnson threw for 4,059 yards in 2008.
- Evans had the second-most passing yards last year with 4,332 yards and 25 TDs.
- He is only the second quarterback in school history to go over 3,000 yards in sepa rate seasons . . . the first was G.J. Kinne in 2010 and 2011 . . . only five Tulsa QBs have ever thrown for more than 3,000 yards, while it has happened seven times.
- Evans has four 400+ passing games in his career, tying Billy Guy Anderson (1965) for the most in school history.
- Evans' first 400+ game came in the 2014 season opener with 438 yards vs. Tulane...
  he had three 400+ passing games in 2015, coming against FAU (424), #16
  Oklahoma (427) and #17 Memphis (421).
- Billy Guy Anderson quarterbacked Tulsa in 1965 and had 400+ passing games of 502, 477, 477 and 451 yards in just that one season.
- Evans has 13 career 300+ passing games, including nine in 2015, to rank third for the most 300-yard passing games in school history behind Paul Smith (15) and G.J. Kinne (14).
- He has moved into the top-4 on the school's all-time charts for passing, TD passes and total offense.
- Evans has thrown for 8,939 career passing yards, has 8,995 yards in total offense and 56 passing TDs, all putting him in 4th place on Tulsa's career charts.

## OFFENSE FACED TOP 2015 PASSING DEFENSES IN FIRST TWO GAMES . . .

- Tulsa's passing game averaged just 167.0 yards and one touchdown combined in the first two games of the season, but that came against two of the top-16 defenses for fewest passing yards allowed last year.
- San Jose State gave up an average of 157.8 yards and Ohio State 184.5 yards passing a year ago.
- In the first two games, Tulsa passed for 207 yards vs. SJSU and 127 yards vs. #4
   Ohio State.

#### PRETTY CLOSE . . .

- A statistical comparison of Tulsa and its opponents after three games is pretty close.
- Tulsa has gained 1,193 total yards for a 397.7 average per game, while the opposition has gained 1,072 yards for a 357.3 average.
- Tulsa has a slight edge running the ball 501 yards for a 167.0 average to 446 for a 148.7-yard average for the opponent.
- In the passing department, Tulsa has thrown for 692 yards (230.7 ypg), while the opposition has thrown for 626 yards (208.7 ypg).
- Tulsa has scored 35 points off of five turnovers, while the opposition, all by Ohio State, has scored 17 points off of three Tulsa turnovers.

#### **TULSA PLAYERS NAMED TO WATCH LISTS...**

- Tulsa has six student-athletes named to five different preseason watch lists this season
- Senior QB Dane Evans was named to the Davey O'Brien Award and the Manning Award Watch Lists, honors that go to the nation's top quarterback

   he was also named to the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List, which recognizes exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement.
- Evans is also one of three Tulsa players named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List the others are receivers Josh Atkinson and Keevan Lucas . . . the award is presented to the nation's best offensive player who was either born in Texas, went to high school in Texas, or attends college in Texas . . . all three Tulsa athletes played high school football in Texas, while Atkinson and Lucas were also born in Texas . . . although spending most of his life in Texas, Evans was born in Oklahoma.
- Atkinson was also named to the Biletnikoff Watch List, an award that honors the nation's top receiver.
- Sophomore Chandler Miller was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List, an honor given to the nation's top center.
- Senior punter Dalton Parks was named to the Ray Guy Watch Preseason List for the second straight year.
- Junior defensive tackle Kolton Shindelar was named to SBNation's Piesman Award Watch List, which honors the best play in which a lineman throws, catches or runs with the ball . . . he was named to the preseason list for his 89-yard interception return for a TD last year in the regular season finale against Tulane.

# LINSCOTT GETS NEW LEASE ON FOOTBALL AT THE LINEBACKER POSITION . . .

- Matt Linscott came to Tulsa in 2012 as a walk-on from nearby prep powerhouse Jenks High School.
- In 2013, he played in 11 games on special teams and in 2014 was a back-up safety and special teams performer.
- Linscott was put on scholarship prior to the 2014 season . . . during that year, he had 13 tackles, forced one fumble and had one fumble recovery in 12 games.
- With the arrival of the new coaching staff in the spring of 2015, Linscott was switched from safety to linebacker.
- Linscott earned the starting position heading into the 2015 campaign, and has held it ever since.
- He totaled 107 tackles to rank second on the team in 2015, and led Tulsa with 16 TFLs and five QB sacks.
- With his 16 TFLs, Linscott was six shy from tying the single-season school record of 22 TFLs, set by Alain Karatepeyan (2007).
- He had double-digit tackles in five games last year with 10 against FAU, 11 vs. New Mexico, 13 at Oklahoma, 12 at Cincinnati and 11 vs. Virginia Tech.
- Linscott now has 147 career tackles and is second on the team this year with 20 tackles.

# MARTIN HAS DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK PERFORMANCE IN THE OPENER . . .

- Trent Martin was Tulsa's leading tackler in the season opener against San Jose State with 11 tackles, while adding 1.5 TFLs for -6 yards and one pass break-up that led to an interception for a touchdown, thus earning The American Defensive Player of the Week award.
- Until last year, linebacker Trent Martin had not played an entire season due to injuries plaguing his career.
- Martin played in all 13 games in 2015 . . . the most he had played before that
  was nine in both 2012 and 2014 . . . he received a medical hardship in 2013,
  playing in only four games.
- After three games this year, Martin now has 257 career tackles to lead any current Hurricane defender.
- Martin had a career-high 14 tackles against #16 Navy in 2015.

#### FORMER WALK-ONS ARE STARTERS . . .

- There are four former walk-on athletes who are in starting positions for the Golden Hurricane — OT Evan Plagg, DT Hayden Carman, LB Matt Linscott and placekicker Redford Jones.
- Plagg was put on scholarship during the 2015 preseason camp and has started all 16 games at left tackle since.
- Carman was put on scholarship during preseason camp in 2014 . . . he has
  played in 37 career games and has started the first three games this year.
- Linscott was also put on scholarship prior to the 2014 season . . . he now has 140 tackles since being put on scholarship and led Tulsa in TFLs and QB sacks as a starter in 2015.
- Jones handles the placements and kickoffs for Tulsa this season . . . he was
  put on scholarship during preseason camp this year . . . he is 5-of-6 for field
  goals and 13-13 for PATs this year, while averaging 63.3 yards on 21 kickoffs.

#### **BREWER LEADS GROUND GAME...**

- Junior D'Angelo Brewer led the Tulsa ground game with 164 yards and three
   TDs as the offense totaled 305 rushing yards in the opener vs. San Jose State.
- Brewer came into 2016 needing 35 yards to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Brewer now has four 100+ rushing games in his career.
- He has a team-leading 282 yards and three TDs this year for a 5.5 average per carry and 94.0 average per game.
- Brewer now has 1,189 career yards on 237 carries for a 5.0 average per carry.
- Last year, Brewer gained a team-high 837 yards for a 5.2 average per carry, and added six TDs.
- Brewer had a total of three 100+ rushing games in 2015 New Mexico (133, SMU (119) and Virginia Tech (105).

#### **DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLERS...**

- Tulsa has a total of seven defensive players who have had at least one career game with double-digit tackles.
- Linebacker Trent Martin has seven double-digit tackle games in his career, including the season-opening game this year.
- All five of linebacker Matt Linscott's double-figure tackle games came in 2015.
- Cornerback Kerwin Thomas had an 11-tackle game against Cincinnati last year for his first double-digit game.
- Linebacker Craig Suits did not have a double-digit tackle game in 2015, but had two in 2014 with 10 tackles each against FAU and Houston.
- Defensive end Jeremy Smith had a 10-tackle game against Navy last season.
- Cornerback WIII Barrow's one career double-digit tackle game came against East Carolina in the 2013 season as a true freshman.

#### **A LOOK BACK TO 2015...**

- Tulsa finished the 2015 season with an overall 6-7 record and 3-5 league mark.
- Tulsa began the season with wins over FAU at home and a road win at New Mexico for the first 2-0 record to start a season since 2009.
- Four of Tulsa's six regular season losses came against teams ranked among the nation's top 25 — Oklahoma, Houston, Memphis and Navy — OU was ranked #16 when Tulsa faced the Sooners, Houston was unranked, Memphis was #17 and Navy was #16.
- Tulsa became bowl eligible on the final week of the regular season with a 45-34 road win over Tulane, coming back from a 34-24 deficit with less than eight minutes remaining in the game.
- The victory put Tulsa in the school's 20th bowl game.
- Tulsa battled Virginia Tech of the ACC in the Camping World Independence Bowl down to the wire, falling 55-52.
- The combined record of those opponents that defeated Tulsa was 63-28 (.692).

# THE AMERICAN'S SECOND-BEST OFFENSE RETURNED SIX STARTERS . . .

- In 2015, Tulsa averaged 507.4 yards of total offense to rank second in the American Athletic Conference and second in passing offense with 333.2 yards per game.
- Tulsa ranked behind Cincinnati's 559.9 yards per game of total offense.
- Six starters and 22 lettermen return from that offense, including 4,000-yard passer Dane Evans, 1,000-yard receiver Josh Atkinson and running back D'Angelo Brewer, who gained 837 yards and six TDs on the ground.
- Two players, who started in 2014, returned to the offense after having missed most of 2015 with injuries, including receiver Keevan Lucas and lineman Blake Belcher.
- Lucas was off to a great start to the season with 409 yards, five TDs and a 102.2 average in four games before suffering a knee injury against Houston.
- Belcher suffered an ACL injury in the first game of the season.

#### THE DEFENSE RETURNED SEVEN STARTERS . . .

- This year, Tulsa's defense returned 23 lettermen, including seven returning starters and another five players who have started at least one game in their careers.
- Four of Tulsa's top-5 tacklers from 2015 returned to the roster.
- The linebacker corps of Matt Linscott, Trent Martin and Craig Suits returned as starters from last season.
- Defensive line starters Jeremy Smith and Jesse Brubaker returned as did secondary starters Kerwin Thomas as corner and safety Jeremy Brady . . . Brubaker moved from tackle to end this season.

#### A LOOK AT TULSA'S OFFENSE IN 2015 . . .

- Tulsa's offense in 2015 ranked 11th for passing, 13th for total offense and 21st for scoring.
- The Hurricane averaged 33.2 yards passing, 507.4 yards of total offense and 37.2 points last season.
- The 2015 Tulsa offense surpassed the 500-yard plateau in seven games and scored more than 30 points 10 times, 40+ points seven times and over 50 once.
- Tulsa gained 600+ yards in each of its first three games with 618 yards vs. FAU, 600 yards at New Mexico and 603 yards at #16 Oklahoma, marking the first time in school history that Tulsa had three consecutive games with 600 yards of total offense.

# TULSA OFFENSE TWO-DEEP QUARTERBACKS

**9 — DANE EVANS (6-1, 210, SR)** — has played in 36 career games and has 33 starts . . . named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® this year . . . has completed 691-of-1226 passes for 8,939 career yards and 56 TDs . . . ranks 4th on the school's all-time passing and TD passes charts . . . has 8,995 career total offense yards to rank 4th on school's career chart . . . completed 19-of-29 passes for 282 yards and 3 TDs vs. NC A&T . . . in 2015, completed 62.9-percent of his passes for 4,332 yards and 25 TDs to rank 2nd on the school's single-season passing list . . . threw for 300+ yards in 9 games in 2015 and has 13 for his career . . . has 4 career 400+ passing games, which ties Billy Guy Anderson (1965) for the career record . . . three of those 400+ games came in 2015 . . . had a career-best 438 yards and 4 TDs in the 2014 opener vs. Tulane . . . threw for a career-high 5 TDs vs. SMU in 2014 . . . has the school's 9th (438), 11th (427), 13th (424) and 14th (421) most passing yard games in Tulsa football history . . . his 2004 Pop Warner FB team won the national championship, and that same year his 12-year-oild baseball team won the USSSA World Series and he won the Texas State Wrestling championship at 92 pounds.

12 – RYAN RUBLEY (6-3, 220, JR) — saw his first collegiate action against NC A&T, where he played all but one series in the second half . . . completed 6-of-10 passes for 76 yards and one TD vs. NC A&T . . . red-shirted in 2013 . . . was a two-year starter at Mountain Vista (Colo.) High School and threw for 1,681 yards and 14 TDs as a prep senior . . . his father T.J. Rubley (1987-91) ranks 3rd on Tulsa's all-time passing list with 9,324 yards.

10 – CHAD PRESIDENT (6-3, 222, SO) — has played in 7 career games . . . played in 6 games as a true freshman last year . . . has rushed for 76 yards on 20 carries in those 7 games . . . quarterbacked the entire 4th quarter in the season opener vs. SJSU, and rushed 3 times for 33 yards and completed 1-of-2 passes for 9 yards for his first career pass completion . . . saw his first collegiate action in the 4th quarter against East Carolina in 2015 . . . his first play was a 12-yard run to the ECU one-yard line . . . had 5 carries for 49 yards vs. ECU, and a long of 29 yards . . . came to Tulsa in the spring 2015 from Temple High School . . . was a Rivals.com four-star prospect.

#### **RUNNING BACKS**

**4 – D'ANGELO BREWER (5-9, 185, JR)** — has played in 26 of 28 games since coming to Tulsa . . . has started 13 career games, including 9 in 2015 . . . went over the career 1,000-yard mark with a career-best 164 yards and 3 TDs vs. San Jose State in the season opener . . . now has 1,247 yards and 10 rushing TDs in his career . . . came into the season with 965 career rushing yards . . . has 282 rushing yards, a 5.5 average and 3 TDs this year . . . gained a team-high 837 rushing yards for a 5.2 average and 6 TDs in 11 games in 2015, while catching 15 passes for 107 yards and one TD . . . totaled 105 yards and 2 TDs on 14 carries vs. Virginia Tech in the Camping World Independence Bowl and his TD runs covered 48 and 10 yards . . . had his first 100+ rushing game with 133 yards on 20 carries vs. UNM in 2015 . . . was a four-year starter and played QB as a junior and senior at Tulsa's Central High School.

20 – JAMES FLANDERS (5-10, 203, SR) — has played in 32 career games with four starts . . . has 705 career rushing yards and 3 TDs on 161 carries for a 4.4 average . . . had his first multi-TD game with 2 touchdowns vs. NC A&T, while rushing for 32 yards . . . tallied 82 yards on 14 carries in the season opener vs. San Jose State . . . the 82-yard game was his third-highest career total behind 112 yards vs. Texas State and 97 yards vs. East Carolina, both in 2014 . . . played in only 6 games in 2015 and gained 87 yards . . . rushed for 456 yards for a 4.5 average in 11 games in 2014 . . . had his only career 100-yard game with 112 yards vs. Texas State in 2014 . . . spent the summer working an internship with the U.S. Marshals Office.

## WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games
   Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting
   quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium before the 2013 spring game.
- Former TU players Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay Buccaneers).
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).



**30 – RAYMOND TAYLOR (5-8, 195, GR-TR) —** Transferred to Tulsa from Oklahoma State prior to the 2016 season as a graduate transfer . . . was immediately eligible for the 2016 season . . . has played in all 3 games . . . has 71 yards on 16 carries this year . . . had 12 carries for 49 yards vs. San Jose State in his first game in a Tulsa uniform . . . was a walk-on athlete at Oklahoma State . . . moved from No. 4 on the depth chart to being a starter and a key performer in important Big 12 games in 2015 . . . played in 11 games in 2015 . . . was OSU's third-leading rusher with 297 yards on 47 caries, had a 6.3-yard average per carry and scored 4 TDs . . . his first practice was Aug. 17.

#### **TIGHT ENDS**

**6 – CHRIS MINTER (6-3, 247, SO)** — has played in 15 career games with 4 starts . . . started the SJSU and NC A&T games . . . played in 12 games as a true freshman in 2015 . . . made his first career start vs. UCF and had 2 starts in 2015 . . . caught 21 passes for 332 yards and 6 TDs as a senior at Temple (Texas) HS.

**33 – ROB REIDERER (6-0, 230, JR)** — has played in 21 career games . . . began his career as a linebacker . . . played in 2 games this year, missing the Ohio State game . . had his first career reception for a 9-yard touchdown against NC A&T . . . played in all 13 games last year, seeing time on offense and special teams . . . his father, Russ, is a retired college and NFL strength coach, having worked for the Green Bay Packers and Chicago Bears.

# WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.
