Head Coach

First Season

Angie Nelp is in her first season at The University of Tulsa after being appointed as the head women's basketball coach on April 12, 2021.

Nelp (formerly Angie Gorton) has coached 13 seasons in Division I college basketball and has helped teams reach postseason competition eight times. She has coached 33 all-conference players, eight conference players of the year, three conference freshman of the year honorees, 43 academic all-conference selections and 18 professional players.

Nelp comes to Tulsa following four seasons on the coaching staff at Arizona State. She spent her first three years as an assistant coach and was promoted to associate head coach in April 2020. During her tenure, the Sun Devils posted a .617 winning percentage with an overall 76-47 record and advanced to the postseason three times. ASU played in the NCAA Tournament twice, moving to the "Sweet Sixteen" in the 2018-19 campaign. This past season, the Sun Devils participated in the WNIT.

Nelp also had stints at Rice (2015-17) and Mercer (2011-15) as an assistant coach, Marquette (2008-10) as an assistant director of operations and at Arkansas (2007-08) as a graduate assistant.

Nelp played collegiately at Colorado State, accumulating 1,397 points, 629 rebounds, 356 assists and 261 steals in four seasons, and leading the Rams to three NCAA Tournament appearances. She earned Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year honors, was a first-team All-MWC selection, a Kodak All-America Honorable Mention honoree and was named an academic all-conference performer all four seasons. Nelp was inducted into the Colorado State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019.

From Eufaula, Okla., Nelp starred at Canadian High School in Oklahoma, and led her team to the 1998 Oklahoma State Championship while earning state tournament MVP honors and was tabbed as the 1998 Oklahoma Gatorade Player of the Year.

After graduating from Colorado State in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in health and exercise science, she went on to spend two seasons with the NWBL Colorado Chill and one season with 08 Stockholm in Sweden. As a professional, she helped lead the Chill to the 2005 NWBL title and 08 Stockholm to the 2003 Swedish national crown.

Following her professional career, Nelp returned to the United States to serve as the head girls' basketball coach at Yorktown High in Yorktown, Ind.

Nelp and her husband Jake have four children: JJ, Louis, Ellie Kaye and Harrison.

Facing Duquesne

- Duquesne began the season at UCF on Tuesday, dropping a 68-39 decision in Orlando
- The Dukes return all eight top scorers from a year ago, including Amanda Kalin who had a team-best 15.5 points per game last season
- DU has won both previous meetings with TU, including a 68-54 decision in Philadelphia and a 63-50 win in Tulsa

On the Roster

- TU returns eight letterwinners from last season, including four starters, and welcomed four newcomers
- The Golden Hurricane has one super senior (Rebecca Lescay), four seniors (Maddie Bittle, Elin Hrafnkelsdottir, Maya Mayberry and Madi Washington), three sophomores (Olivia Clayton, Jessika Evans and Wyvette Mayberry), and four freshmen (Delanie Crawford, Lexie Foutch, Alyssa Parmer and Temira Poindexter).

An Accurate Shot

- Maya Mayberry ranks second (.405 = 47-116) in program history for three-point field goal percentage.

- Rebecca Lescay ranks fifth on Tulsa's all-time steals list with 179

A College Graduate

- Tulsa senior Rebecca Lescay earned her bachelor's degree in marketing in 2020 and is working towards her master's degree in business analytics

The Mayberry Connection

- Sisters Maya and Wyvette Mayberry have both played one season at TU
- Their older sister, Taleya, also played at Tulsa (2009-13) and was an assistant coach for three seasons (2018-21)
- The sisters were Tulsa's top two scorers during the 2020-21 season as Maya averaged a team-high 14.3 points and Wyvette scored at a 12.3 clip.
- The pair scored 46.1 percent (493 of 1,068) of Tulsa's total points a year ago

Maddie Bittle

- According to an NCAA Division I women's basketball survey, Maddie Bittle is just one of 18 Native Americans playing collegiate basketball at the D1 level. Bittle is a member of the Muscogee Creek Nation.

Tulsa Picked Ninth in The American Preseason Coaches' Poll

- In the American Athletic Conference coaches' poll, Tulsa was picked to finish ninth by the league's coaches
- The 2021-22 predicted order of finish was South Florida, UCF, Houston, Tulane, Temple, Cincinnati, East Carolina, Wichita State, Tulsa, SMU and Memphis

Tulsa in The American Championship

- Tulsa has a 4-7 mark in The American Championship
- TU earned wins in the first round in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019
- The Golden Hurricane lost matches in the quarterfinals in 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, and lost in the first round in 2020 and 2021

Tulsa in Postseason

- Tulsa has made five postseason appearances
- TU earned WNIT bids in 2004, 2005 and 2015
- The Hurricane played in the NCAA Tournament in 2006 and 2013
- Tulsa lost in the first round in 2004 (Memphis), 2005 (Texas A&M) and 2013 (Stanford), but went 1-1 in 2006 (W, North Carolina State; L, DePaul) and 2015 (W, Missouri State; L, Eastern Michigan)
- The Hurricane has a 2-5 overall mark in postseason play

A Hurricane in Tulsa?

The Origination of The University of Tulsa nickname - Golden Hurricane - was created in 1922. A new football coach, Howard Archer came to town and inherited a slew of nicknames dating back to 1895. In the past, Tulsa had been named "Kendallites," "Presbyterians," "Tigers," "Orange and Black," "Tulsans," and of course, "Yellow Jackets." The team started working out in the fall with a new nickname "Yellow Jackets" which was apparently due to the fact that the team was wearing new black and yellow uniforms. The team opened the season and it was apparent that Tulsa was going to have a great year, and trying to seize some publicity for his team, Archer wanted to find a new nickname quickly. After a remark was made in practice one day about "roaring through opponents," and because of their new jersey colors, he thought of "Golden Tornadoes." But a check showed that Georgia Tech already had chosen that tag in 1917. From the tornado, he evolved meteorologically to the hurricane. A few days before the team left for a game against Texas A&M, Archer asked the squad to vote on the name, and thus "Golden Hurricane" was born.
