SERIES/LAST MEETING: Edward Waters (1-1) and Tuskegee (0-2) will meet on the gridiron for the third time in modern era series history. The Golden Tigers escaped Jacksonville with a 27-26 victory in their prior meeting back on September 18, 2019.

EWU LOOKING TO GET OFF OF THE MAT: Edward Waters will be looking to respond in a much better way on Saturday after a lackluster showing last Thursday in their SIAC opener. The Tigers fell 44-3 to Benedict in a nationally televised contest on ESPNU. EWU gave up an early season high 478 yards of total offense, while only mustering 175 yards of their own.

TIGERS RETURNING HOME TO SWEET HOME ALABAMA: Edward Waters boasts three players that will make their return home to their home state. Graduate transfer wide receiver Jimmie Stoudemire hails from Prattville, junior wide receiver Derrick Moore is from Phenix City, and junior defensive tackle & team co-captain Quintorio "Dray" Powell calls Hale County, Alabama home.

TUSKEGEE SEARCHING FOR FIRST WIN: It's been a rough start to the 2021 campaign for head coach Willie Slater and the Golden Tigers. Through their first two games, Tuskegee has been outscored 63-7, including a 30-0 loss in their season opener to Fort Valley State in the inaugural Red Tails Classic. TU lost their home opener to West Alabama, 33-7 last week at "The Shed".

SEASON #71 OF EWC FOOTBALL: 2021 marks the 71th year of football as a varsity sport at Edward Waters College and the 21st year since the rebirth of the program in 2001 after a 34-year hiatus. 2021 will also see for the first time in program history, the Purple & Orange have a permanent, on-campus home as the \$4.4 million Community Field & Stadium will be open and ready to welcome the team.

NEW NAME, NEW DIVISION, NEW CONFERENCE: Edward Waters University (Formerly Edward Waters College) will take to the field in 2021 as a provisional member of the NCAA Division II becoming the only HBCU at the Division II level in the State of Florida. Additionally, EWU will rejoin the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in 2012. The Tigers were member of the SIAC from 1930-1935.

40 NEWCOMERS ON THE 2021 TIGERS: Coach Morgan and staff have recruited 40 new players that will don the Purple & Orange for the first time in this 2021 season

12 STARTERS AND 32 LETTERMAN RETURN: The Tigers return 12 starters from the spring 2021 team that finished 1-2. Six return on offense, five on defense, and one on special teams. 32 letterwinners return to the EWC roster.

REVAMP. RESTORE. REIGNITE: New Head Coach Toriano Morgan is using this mantra to spearhead this year's edition of the Fighting Tigers. Edward Waters is looking to notch its first +.500 season since the 2004 season when the Purple & Orange went 8-3.

NEW LOOK OFFENSE: Head Coach Toriano Morgan brought over one of the most successful HBCU head coaches in history to be his second in command, hiring former Bethune-Cookman & Alabama State head coach Brian Jenkins, Sr. as Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach. Jenkins tenure at BCU saw the Wildcats win four MEAC championships, have three berths in the FCS Playoffs, and two HBCU National Championships. Jenkins' teams won at least eight games during his five seasons, including two 10 win campaigns in 2010 & 2013.

LOADED BACKFIELD FOR TIGERS IN '21: There were some standouts from the 2019 squad including returning sophomore RB De'Shaun Hugee who finished with 792 yards rushing on 143 carries, averaged 5.5 yards per carry, and scored six rushing touchdowns and added a receiving TD as well. The Palm Coast, Florida native turned in back-to-back 100+ yard rushing efforts in 2019 against Central State and Allen, including setting a program new single-game modern era freshman record with 183 yards and two TD against Central State. Also returning to the EWC backfield this season is 2019's 2nd leading rusher in returning senior and team co-captain Maliek Stephens (52 carries, 230 yards, 4.4 yards per carry avg., four TDs).

NEW LOOK DEFENSE: Defensively, the biggest change for the squad comes in the form of a new defensive coordinator. Former Tuskegee defensive coordinator Joseph Carter takes over an EWC defense that struggled in 2019, surrendering 367.3 yards per game (165.6 passing/201.7 rushing). EWC returns its leader in sacks and tackles for loss in returning sophomore Jaren Wilson. The Jacksonville native had a phenomenal freshman campaign with 44 total tackles, 12 tackles for loss, four sacks, and an interception. Junior DB Cameron McClain also returns this season after being second on the team in tackles with 51, with 8.5 tackles for loss, one sack, and one INT.

NATIVE FLORIDIANS: Edward Waters has 66 players from the state of Florida with 12 calling Jacksonville home.

FIRST SEASON AT EWU (1-0) TENNESSEE STATE '00

Toriano Morgan was announced as the 15th head coach in the storied history of Edward Waters College Football on April 15, 2021.

Morgan brings over 17 years of coaching experience to his new role at Edward Waters, spread amongst high school and collegiate institutions. Under his purview, Morgan has coached 35 all-conference players and has been a part of sending 13 players to play in the National Football League. Morgan has been a perennial winner at every stop in his coaching career, bringing with him a streak of seven consecutive seasons with at least seven wins or more.

A native of Fort Lauderdale, Morgan returns to his home state after spending two seasons as Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach at Virginia State University. In his first season at VSU in 2019, Morgan was an instrumental figure in the Trojans' 8-2 overall record and 6-1 mark in the CIAA, en route to a second place finish in the CIAA's Northern Division. Morgan's offense was ranked 4th in the CIAA in scoring, averaging 31.4 points per game, third in the league in total offense with a 382.2 yards per game average, and second in rushing yards with 228.4 yards per game.

Prior to joining the staff at Virginia State University, Morgan was a highly decorated Head Coach at Dillard High School in Fort Lauderdale, where he restored the perennial prep power to prominence, guiding them to a regional playoff appearance in his first season. Morgan compiled a 9-3 record which was his Alma Mater's best record in 15 years. Morgan was selected as the Head Coach of the Broward County Athletic Association All-Star Game and the Head Coach for the Public vs Private All-Star Game. Morgan was also selected as a finalist for the Tournament of Champions Coach of the Year.

Morgan served as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Virginia Union University for four seasons, from 2014-2017. Morgan is credited with directing a prolific offense at Virginia Union, which averaged over 400 yards and 34 pts per game during his stint. In 2014, the team finished 1st in total offense and 3rd in scoring offense in the CIAA, Morgan improved the Panthers' passing average from 69.9ypg in 2013 to 409.3ypg in 2014, which help propel the Panthers to a seven win season (7-3). Quarterback Kenny Graham finished 1st nationally in yards per completion averaging and 4th nationally in passing efficiency.

2015 was another record breaking season for Morgan and the Panther's Offense Averaging 36 points per game and 439 yards per game, both 1st in the CIAA. The Panthers became the first CIAA program to amass over 2,000 yards rushing and 2,000 yards passing in the same season. Offsetting that production with 22 Rushing TDS and 22 Passing TDs and an NCAA Playoff appearance for the first time in 25 years. Quarterback Shaheem Dowdy was awarded the Willie Lanier Award which goes to the best College Football Player (Non-FCS) in the Commonwealth of Virginia. This was the first time this award had ever been awarded to a Div-2 player.

2016 Morgan's Offense produced William Stanback who finished 1st in the CIAA in rushing with 1,299 yards, while being selected First Team All-CIAA.

Morgan's Offense at VUU produced 11 All-CIAA Players and 4 All-Americans. Under Morgan's direction the offense set six program records during his tenure.

Morgan's offensive success over the past half a decade has awarded some national exposure. On two occasions, Morgan was selected as the Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator for the HBCU Spirit of America Bowl All-Star Game, A nationally televised game for HBCU student athletes to be evaluated for the NFL Draft.

Morgan began his career as a coach in 2002 as a graduate assistant at his Alma Mater, Tennessee State University, earning both a Bachelor's (Criminal Justice, 2000) and Master's (Administration and Leadership, 2002) degrees.

Morgan was also a standout player at TSU, where he was a three year letterwinner for the Big Blue Tigers. He was a pivotal part of back-to-back Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) Championship teams in 1998 and 1999. Morgan led TSU to a #1 national ranking, becoming the first HBCU to be ranked #1 and also helped lead TSU to two consecutive FCS playoff appearances. In his final season in 2000, Morgan was also voted team captain.

Morgan is married to his wife Adeline and has a son, Zaiden.

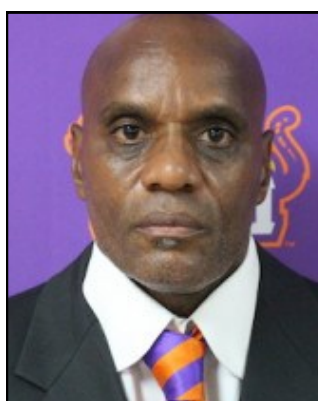
