- 3- Texas State looks for its third straight winning season under head coach Brad Wright after the Bobcats posted back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1990-91.

THE GAME

The Texas State football team looks to improve its overall record to 4-1 when the Bobcats open their Southland Conference schedule at Southeastern Louisiana on Saturday, October 9 at 2:00 p.m. The game will be televised on the Southland Conference Television Network. Doug Anderson will serve as the play-by-play announcer and LaDarrin McLane will be the analyst. This is the first of two Texas State football games that will be televised by the SLC TV Network. The other is on Nov. 6 when the Bobcats play host to Central Arkansas.

The game will be shown on KBVO-TV (channel 51) and KCWX-TV (Channel 2) in San Antonio. The game also will be shown on Sunday at 5:00 p.m. on Fox College Sports Pacific.

Texas State is ranked 15th in the FCS Coaches Poll and 17th in the *The Sports Network/Fathead.com FCS Top 25* poll on October 4 after winning its third straight game. The Bobcats defeated Southern Utah 42-28 on Sept. 25 after upsetting then No. 17 Cal Poly on Sept. 18 and beating Southern Arkansas, 31-17, on Sept. 11.

Southeastern Louisiana enters the game with a 1-3 record following a 21-20 loss at Louisiana-Monroe on Sept. 25. The Lions also suffered a 29-28 setback against Lamar on Sept. 18 and a 27-21 loss at Tulane on Sept. 2. Southeastern Louisiana defeated Tennessee-Martin 24-10 in Hammond on Sept. 11.

SERIES HISTORY

This marks the 14th meeting between Texas State and Southeastern Louisiana. The Bobcats own a 12-1 record against the Lions with the lone loss being a 51-50 overtime loss in San Marcos in 2009. Texas State has a 5-0 record against Southeastern Louisiana in Hammond.

Texas State vs. Southeastern Louisiana Game Notes

THE OPENING DRIVE

- Texas State improved its record to 3-1 for the first time since 2005 when the Bobcats opened that year with a 6-1 mark.
- The Bobcats won their third straight game after opening the 2010 season with a loss at Houston. Texas State defeated Southern Utah after posting a 31-17 win against Southern Arkansas and a 21-12 victory over 17th-ranked Cal Poly this season.
- Texas State enters the Southeastern Louisiana game with a 9-15 record in Southland Conference openers. The Bobcats have split their last two SLC openers with a 45-42 victory at McNeese in 2008 and a 51-50 overtime loss versus Southeastern Louisiana in 2009.
- The Bobcats are ranked No. 15 in the latest FCS Coaches poll and No. 17 in *The Sports Network/Fathead.com* poll on October 4.
- Prestin Brown and Ben Follis were named the Southland Conference Defensive and Special Teams Players of the Week on September 20 after they helped lead Texas State to its win over Cal Poly. Brown led the Bobcats with 11 tackles and assisted on two tackles for losses and a quarterback sack. Follis averaged 45.3 yards on six punts and landed his last two inside the 20 at Cal Poly's four-yard line.
- Texas State has two preseason All-Americans in senior wide receiver Da'Marcus Griggs and junior offensive guard D.J. Hall.
- The Bobcats are looking for their third straight winning season for the first time since 1984. The Bobcats ended the 2009 campaign with a 7-4 record after finishing 8-5 in 2008.
- Texas State posted a 5-2 Southland Conference record in each of the last two seasons, and that marked the first time in school history that the Bobcats have won five SLC games in back-to-back seasons.

103 SEASONS OF BOBCAT FOOTBALL

Texas State is in its 103rd season of playing intercollegiate football in 2010 and enters the Southeastern Louisiana game with an all-time record of 483-397-26. The Bobcats began playing football in 1904 when they posted a 5-1 record. Texas State didn't play football in 1942, 1945 and 1946.

The Bobcats have won 13 conference championships during their history, including a 2005 Southland Conference co-championship and an outright SLC title in 2008.

Texas State vs. Southeastern Louisiana Game Notes

TEXAS STATE VS. FCS RANKED TEAMS

The Bobcats are 1-0 against a nationally-ranked FCS team this season after winning a 21-12 decision over 17th-ranked Cal Poly. Texas State has won four of its last five games against nationally-ranked teams dating back to the 2009 season.

Last year, Bobcats defeated then #11-ranked Stephen F. Austin 28-7 on Oct. 31 in San Marcos and #19-ranked Central Arkansas 27-24 on November 7 at Conway. Texas State was edged 30-27 against 10th-ranked McNeese State on November 14 in San Marcos.

BOBCATS PICKED THIRD IN SLC POLLS

Texas State tied for third place in the SLC Coaches preseason poll and was picked to finish fourth by SLC Sports Information Directors in the 2010 Southland Conference preseason polls.

The Bobcats finished third in the 2009 SLC standings with a 5-2 league record. Texas State tied Southeastern Louisiana for third place in the coaches poll with 29 points and was fourth in the SID poll with 31 points.

TEXAS STATE AT BOBCAT STADIUM

The Bobcats have a 103-70 all-time record in Bobcat Stadium after winning their first three home games against Southern Arkansas, Cal Poly and Southern Utah in 2010. The Bobcats had a 4-2 record in home games last season.

10 SLC WINS IN THE LAST TWO YEARS

Texas State won 10 Southland Conference games in the last two seasons, and that is the most conference wins for the Bobcats during a two-year period since they joined the league in 1987.

Texas State posted 5-2 record in each of the last two years. The Bobcats won their first outright conference championship since 1982 with the 5-2 mark in 2008. The five wins during each of the last two years also equal the highest single season victory total for a Bobcat team in the Southland Conference. Texas State also was 5-2 in 2000 and 5-1 in 2005.

BOBCATS ON THE ROAD

Texas State looks to win its eighth straight Southland Conference road game when the Bobcats travel to Southeastern Louisiana. Texas State finished its 2009 season with a 3-0 record in Southland Conference road games after winning at No. 19 Central Arkansas, (27-24), Northwestern State (20-17) and Nicholls (34-28).

The Bobcats won all four of their road contests in 2008. That season, Texas State won SLC road games at McNeese State, Stephen F. Austin, Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State.

The seven straight wins mark the second-

longest road winning streak in SLC road games by a current Southland Conference member. McNeese State won nine straight SLC road games from 2006-08.

NEW FACE ON THE COACHING STAFF

Texas State enters the 2010 season with a new coach on its staff this season as Slade Nagle is in his first season as a co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Nagle comes to Texas State from LSU, where he spent one season coaching special teams after serving as an offensive coordinator and assistant coach at Northwestern State. He also is a former standout quarterback at McNeese State and played two seasons at Clemson.

WELCOME BACK

Texas State has 37 lettermen returning from the 2009 season. The Bobcats have 16 lettermen returning on offense, while 19 players return on defense along with two kickers on special teams. Texas State returns 23 players who started games in 2009.

SECOND-BEST SCORING OFFENSE IN SLC

Texas State enters the Southeastern Louisiana game ranked second among Southland Conference leaders in scoring offense. The Bobcats are averaging 30.5 points per game after scoring 28 points at Houston, 31 points versus Southern Arkansas, 21 points versus Cal Poly and 42 points versus Southern Utah.

SLC'S THIRD-BEST TOTAL OFFENSE

The Bobcats rank third among Southland Conference Teams in total offense with an average of 369.5 yards per game. Texas State opened the season gaining 345 yards at Houston, 370 yards against Southern Arkansas and 318 versus Cal Poly.

BOBCATS ON THE GROUND

Texas State leads the Southland Conference in rushing offense with an average of 191.0 yards per game after running for 224 yards against Southern Utah and 195 yards against Cal Poly. In the first two games, the Bobcats ran for 180 yards at Houston and 165 yards against Southern Arkansas.

SECOND-BEST DEFENSE

Texas State enters the Southeastern Louisiana game ranked third among Southland Conference leaders in total defense after holding opponents to 381.2 yards per game.

The Bobcats held Southern Arkansas to 193 yards of total offense and that is the third-fewest yards surrendered by a Southland Conference team this season.

Texas State vs. Southeastern Louisiana Game Notes

FIVE BOBCATS NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE TEAMS

Five Texas State football players were named to 2010 Preseason All-Conference teams by SLC coaches. The coaches named offensive guard D.J. Hall and wide receiver Da'Marcus Griggs All-SLC First-Team selections.

They also chose Daren Dillard, defensive tackle Adley Eshraghipour and linebacker Marcus Clark as Second-Team selections. Eshraghipour will miss the 2010 season after suffering a knee injury in pre-season workouts.

BUSH AND 100-YARD GAMES

Senior running back Karrington Bush enters the Southeastern Louisiana game having rushed for 100 yards during 12 games throughout his career. This season, he recorded his first 100-yard rushing game against Southern Arkansas after he gained 102 yards on 14 carries. He scored the final touchdown of the game against Southern Arkansas on a 79-yard run, and that was the longest run since he recorded an 80-yard jaunt against Southeastern Louisiana on November 3, 2007. He has two 100-yard rushing games against the Lions with 129 yards and three touchdowns on 26 carries in 2009, and 179 yards on 20 carries in 2007.

BUSH MOVING UP THE CHARTS

After rushing for 354 yards this season, Karrington Bush is listed among the Top Five career rushing leaders at Texas State. He enters the Southeastern Louisiana game with 2,843 yards rushing in his career. He needs to gain 67 more yards to move into fourth place among Texas State's career rushing leaders.

BUSH AND CAREER RUSHING TD'S

Karrington Bush ran for a season-high three touchdowns against Southern Utah and that gives him five TD's this season. He enters the Southeastern Louisiana game with 23 career rushing touchdowns and that ranks seventh among Texas State's career leaders. He enters the Southeastern Louisiana game tied with teammate Tyler Arndt and Southeastern Louisiana's Zeke Jones for third place among the Southland Conference scoring leaders after rushing for three touchdowns against Southern Utah. It marks the second time in his career that he has run for three touchdowns in a game. The other game came against Southeastern Louisiana last season.

BUSH AMONG SLC RUSHING LEADERS

Karrington Bush is ranked third among Southland Conference rushing leaders with an average of 88.5 yards per game. Bush has gained 354 yards on 66 carries this season.

Last season, Bush sat out seven games with a knee injury after rushing 385 yards and four touchdowns on 59 carries.

In his first two seasons at Texas State, Bush gained a combined 2,104 yards and scored 14 touchdowns on 273 carries. He began his collegiate career running for 1,039 yards and three TD's on 137 carries. He also ran for 1,065 yards and scored 11 touchdowns on 136 carries as a sophomore.

He was the first Bobcat to run for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons since 1997 in 2008.

BUSH AMONG SLC LEADERS IN ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

Karrington Bush ranks third among Southland Conference leaders in all-purpose yards with an average 145.0 yards per game,

In addition to his 354 yards rushing, Bush has gained 13 receiving yards, 402 yards on kickoff returns and 48 yards on punt returns.

IMADE ON THE GROUND

Redshirt freshman Dexter Imade enters the Southeastern Louisiana game ranked fourth among SLC rushing leaders with an average of 84.3 yards per game. Imade has run for 253 yards and two touchdowns on 54 carries in three games this season. He gained 85 yards versus Southern Utah after leading the Bobcats with 95 yards on 16 carries against Cal Poly. He also led Texas State with 73 yards on 20 carries at Houston. Imade scored the first two touchdowns of his collegiate career against Cal Poly when he scored on a two-yard run in the third quarter and a 37-yard run in the fourth quarter. He sat out last season as a redshirt after gaining 1,515 yards and 14 touchdowns during his senior season at Rowlett.

ARNDT AMONG SLC SCORING LEADERS

Freshman quarterback Tyler Arndt is tied with teammate Karrington Bush and Zeke Jones of Southeastern Louisiana for third place among Southland Conference scoring leaders with an average of 7.5 points per game. Arndt has run for five touchdowns this season after he ran for two touchdowns against Southern Utah to equal his career high. He also ran for two touchdowns at Houston and rushed for one against Southern Arkansas. Barrick Neely holds the Texas State record for most rushing touchdowns scored by a quarterback with 13 in 2005.

Texas State vs. Southeastern Louisiana Game Notes

ARNDT AMONG SLC PASSING LEADERS

Tyler Arndt ranks third among Southland Conference passing leaders with a passing efficiency rating of 139.5 after completing 53 of his 84 passes for 702 yards and four touchdowns.

Arndt also ranks fifth among Southland Conference leaders in passing yards per game with an average of 160.3 yards per contest in his first four collegiate games. He connected on 15 of his 19 passes against Southern Utah for 221 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception.

He also completed nine of his 14 passes for 123 yards against Cal Poly after connecting on 15 of 29 passes for 205 yards and two touchdowns against Southern Arkansas. Arndt completed 14 of his 22 passes for 153 yards and one touchdown at Houston.

ARNDT AND TOTAL OFFENSE

Freshman quarterback Tyler Arndt ranks fourth among Southland Conference leaders in total offense with 194.0 yards per game. He gained 260 yards of total offense against Southern Utah, 233 yards versus Southern Arkansas and 166 yards at Houston. He also gained 117 yards versus Cal Poly.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

After catching a school-record 80 receptions, senior wide receiver Da'Marcus Griggs leads Texas State and ranks fourth among Southland Conference leaders with 5.2 receptions per game. Griggs has caught 21 passes for 297 yards and two touchdowns this season. He is second among league leaders in receiving yards per game with an average of 74.2.

Griggs caught seven passes for 96 yards against Southern Utah, six passes for 85 yards at Houston and five passes for 64 yards and two touchdowns against Southern Arkansas. He also three receptions for 52 yards against Cal Poly.

GRIGGS CAN RETURN PUNTS TOO

Despite the fact that this is the first season in his entire playing career in which he has returned punts, Da'Marcus Griggs enters conference play leading the Southland Conference in punt returns with an average of 15.5 yards per game. He has returned eight punts for 124 yards, including a 50-yard return at Houston.

His 50-yard return is the second-longest punt return by a Southland Conference player this season.

GRIGGS IN THE ALL-PURPOSE COLUMN

Da'Marcus Griggs is ranked sixth among Southland Conference leaders with 113.8 all-purpose yards. In addition to his 297 receiving yards, Griggs also has returned seven punts for 124 yards and a kickoff for 24 yards. He had not returned a punt in his career before this season.

DILLARD AND RECEIVING YARDS

Daren Dillard is tied for second among team leaders with 38.5 receiving yards per game. Dillard enters the Southeastern Louisiana game with 11 receptions for 154 yards.

BOLDEN AND RECEIVING YARDS

Darius Bolden is tied with Dillard among team leaders with 38.5 receiving yards per game after he caught five passes for a career-best 108 yards and a touchdown.

HOLMES IN THE INTERCEPTION COLUMN

Sophomore linebacker Charles Holmes became the third Bobcat to intercept a pass this season when he recorded an interception against Southern Utah.

MILLER IN THE INTERCEPTION COLUMN

Senior safety T. P. Miller intercepted a pass in the second quarter at Houston. It was Miller's second career interception.

His other interception came at TCU last season.

BROWN NAMED SLC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt freshman Prestin Brown was named the Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Year on Monday, September 20 after leading Texas State with 11 tackles in the Bobcats' 21-12 victory over No. 17 Cal Poly.

BROWN AMONG SLC LEADERS

In his first season as a starting nose tackle, redshirt freshman Prestin Brown leads Texas State and ranks 12th among Southland Conference leaders with 6.2 tackles per game. Brown recorded 11 of his season total of 25 tackles against Cal Poly.

HAMPTON AMONG SLC LEADERS

Senior safety Kenneth Hampton ranks 10th among Southland Conference leaders with 6.7 tackles per game. Hampton has recorded 20 tackles in three games this season. He collected eight tackles against Southern Utah after making a season-best 10 stops against Cal Poly.

LILLY AMONG SLC TACKLING LEADERS

In his first season as a starting middle linebacker, Brian Lilly ranks 24th among Southland Conference leaders with 5.2 tackles per game. Lilly led the Bobcats with eight tackles against Central Arkansas and six stops at Houston. He recorded five tackles against Cal Poly, and one stop versus Southern Utah.

LILLY IN THE INTERCEPTIONS COLUMN

Brian Lilly also leads the Bobcats and is tied for third among Southland Conference leaders with two interceptions this season. He recorded an in-

Head Coach
Fourth Season as Head Coach
Seventh Season at Texas State
Texas State, 1981

Throughout his playing and coaching career at Texas State, it seems that Brad Wright has helped change the course of the school's football history.

As a player, he capped off his collegiate career in 1980 helping Texas State win its first outright conference championship in 17 years.

As an associate head coach, he helped lead the Bobcats to a Southland Conference co-championship and Texas State's first NCAA Division I FCS playoff berth in 2005.

Then, in his first three seasons as head coach, he guided Texas State to its first outright conference championship since 1982, first back-to-back winning seasons since 1991-92 and now looks to lead his team to a third straight winning season for the first time since 1984 in 2010.

That record is even more remarkable when you consider that before the Pearsall native joined Texas State's coaching staff, the school had enjoyed just four winning seasons during the previous 19 years.

Wright took over as head coach at Texas State in 2007, and the Bobcats featured a high-powered offensive attack that ranked 18th nationally in total offense and produced a 2,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver in the same season for the first time in school history. Senior punter Chris MacDonald earned All-America First-Team honors, while Cameron Luke earned All-Southland Conference First-Team honors after catching 60 passes for 1,035 yards. Karrington Bush was named the SLC Freshman of the Year and an All-SLC Second-Team selection as a running back. In addition, Crawford May was an All-SLC Second-Team choice.

Nick Clark was named Texas State's first-ever Draddy Award Finalist, National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athlete and a CoSIDA/ESPN *The Magazine* Academic All-American Second-Team selection.

After the 2007 season ended, Wright put his troops through a rigorous conditioning program and spring practice to help develop more consistent and physical play.

Those efforts paid off in 2008 when the Bobcats posted an 8-5 overall record and won the Southland Conference championship. The season also featured the school's first non-conference road win since 2001 and the Bobcats clinched the league title with their first overtime win since 2005 with a 48-45 victory at Sam Houston State in the final regular season game. The victory at Sam Houston State also set a school record for most road wins as a NCAA Division I FCS school with five.

Texas State's offense was even more powerful in its second year under Wright's direction as the Bobcats boasted the nation's seventh-best scoring offense and eighth best overall total offense with averages of 36.4 points and 453.23 yards per game. Texas State also tied for 10th in red-zone offensive efficiency and featured a 2,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard runner and a 1,000-yard receiver for the second straight year.

Junior quarterback Bradley George became the first Texas State quarterback in school history to throw for 2,000 yards in two consecutive seasons as he threw for 2,660 yards and 26 touchdowns in 2008. His favorite target was Luke, who broke his

own school records with 73 receptions for 1,268 yards. Luke also tied a school record for the most touchdowns scored in a season with 17 and became the only receiver in the history of the Southland Conference to catch 10 TD passes in back-to-back seasons. Not to be outdone, Bush also ran for 1,065 yards in a three-man rotation and ranked second nationally averaging 7.8 yards per carry.

A key to Texas State's championship run was the improved play on defense and special teams. The Bobcats ranked 17th in red-zone defense and ranked second among Southland Conference teams in forcing 24 turnovers. Texas State also led the league with 15 interceptions.

Individually, Luke was named a Third-Team All-American and one of the Top 50 FCS players in the nation by *CollegeSportingNews.com*. In addition, senior center Jeff Bowen, senior kicker Andrew Ireland and Bush received Honorable Mention All-America honors.

Luke, Bowen, Bush and fullback Blake

Burton were chosen All-Southland Conference First-Team, while offensive lineman D.J. Hall, Ireland, defensive end Donovan King and defensive back Morris Crosby attained All-SLC Second-Team honors. Bush was named an All-SLC Second-Team return specialist as well. Defensive end Travis Houston was named to the FCS Athletic Directors Association's Academic All-Star Team and joined Burton, quarterback Bradley George and defensive back Will Thompson on the SLC All-Academic Team.

In his third season as head coach, Wright led his troops to a second straight winning season with a 7-4 record and had the Bobcats in contention for another SLC championship until the final game of the regular season. Texas State posted a 5-2 conference record for the second straight year, giving the Bobcats their best back to back conference finish and most conference wins in a two-year period since joining the SLC in 1987.

Texas State ended the 2009 season ranked 24th by the FCS Coaches and 25th by the *Sports Network*, marking the first time in school history that the Bobcats finished two consecutive seasons ranked by FCS national polls.

Individually, George capped off his record-setting career being named the Southland Conference Offensive Player of the Year and Student-Athlete of the Year. George ended the season completing 258 of his 409 passes for 3,121 yards and 23 touchdowns. He ended his career as Texas State's all-time career leader as he completed 753 of his 1277 passes for 9556 yards and 76 touchdowns.

Junior guard D.J. Hall and receiver Mishak Rivas earned All-Southland Conference First-Team honors as an offensive lineman and return specialist respectively. Da'Marcus Griggs and Travis Houston earned All-SLC Second-Team honors as a wide receiver and defensive lineman. Griggs set a new school record for the most receptions in a season with 80.

George along with running back Alvin Canady, offensive tackles Calvin Gore and Alex Luna, defensive lineman Adley Eshraghipour, linebacker Marcus Clark and defensive back Will Thompson were named Honorable Mention selections.

Houston also was named to the FCS Athletic Directors Association's Academic All-Star Team for a second straight year, and joined George, fullback Jeff McVaney and Thompson on the SLC All-Academic team.

In addition to their successes on the field and in the classroom, the Bobcats have been active in the community by taking part in campus projects such as Bobcat Build and serving mentorships at area elementary schools.

After signing a new three-year contract, Wright enters the 2010 season looking to lead the Bobcats to their third straight winning campaign and contending for their third Southland Conference championship since 2005.

Wright's association with winning at Texas State dates back to the late 1970s when he originally walked on to the Bobcat football program as a wide receiver before starting one season at running back and then moving to the defensive side of the ball under Bobcat coaches Bill Miller and Jim Wacker. He was a two-year starter at free safety for Texas State and was a defensive leader on the 1980 Lone Star Conference championship team. His coaching career began as a student assistant coach for Wacker's 1981 NCAA Division II national championship team. After working two seasons at Louisiana-Lafayette, Wright enjoyed a highly successful tenure as a high school coach in Texas.

Prior to joining the Texas State staff, Wright spent the previous four seasons as the director of athletics and head football coach at Canyon High School in New Braunfels. There, he helped turn around a struggling Cougar football program. After a pair of one-win seasons, Canyon went 7-2 in 2002 and advanced to the state quarterfinals with an 11-2 record in 2003.

Wright also was the head coach at East Bernard, where his squad was an area finalist in 1999, and at Karnes City where the team posted back-to-back third-place district finishes. He was named head coach at Karnes City after serving as an assistant coach at El Campo for five years, helping lead the program to three district titles. His high school coaching career also includes stops as an assistant coach at Klein Oak and Pearland.

Wright returned to Texas State as an assistant head coach, running back coach and special teams coordinator in 2004. In the next three seasons, Wright helped lead the Bobcats to a 21-15 record in the next three years, including the 2005 campaign when Texas State won 11 games, a SLC co-championship and was a semifinalist in the NCAA Division I FCS Playoffs.

Wright earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Texas State in 1981. He is married to the former Kim Pesek, a 1996 Texas State alum, and they have a daughter, Paige.
