

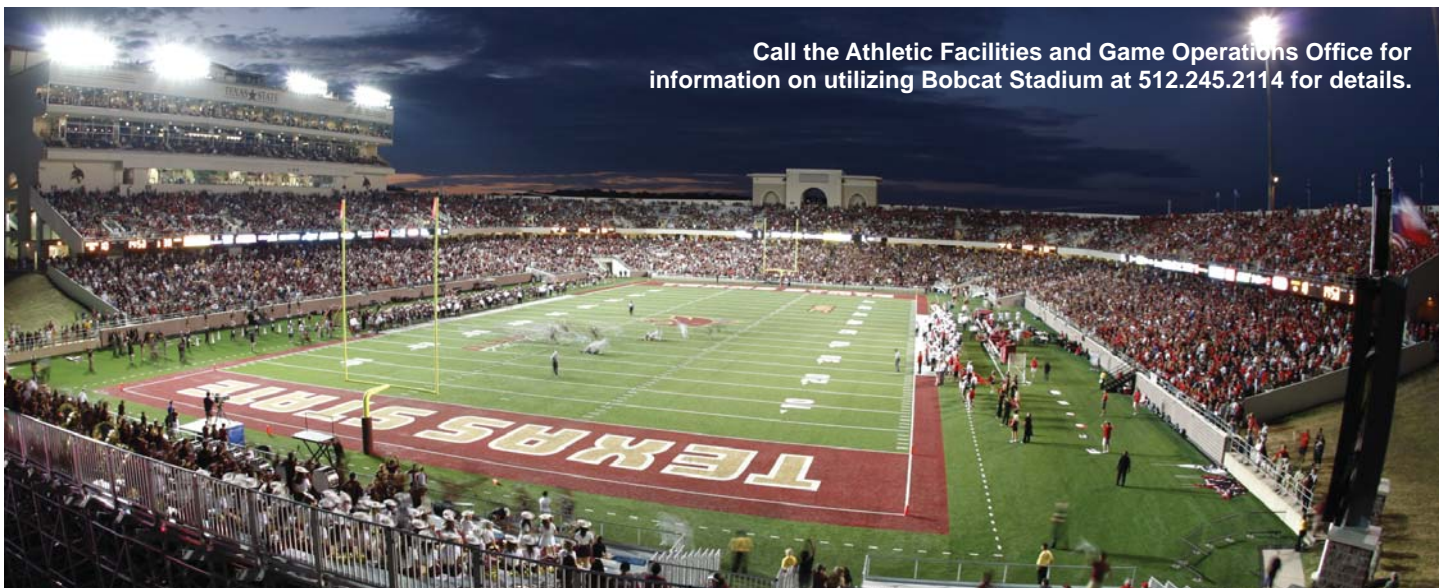

JIM WACKER FIELD AT BOBCAT STADIUM

The longtime home of Texas State football will be a fitting venue for the Bobcats when they kick off the 2012 season as a member of the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision and the Western Athletic Conference.

The latest expansion of Jim Wacker Field at Bobcat Stadium will open that season, with the addition of 13,500 seats and related amenities as part of the North Side Complex.

Capacity for the stadium in 2012 will be approximately 30,000, with upper and lower seating levels on three sides.

The North Side Complex will feature the Strutters Gallery, which will chronicle a half-century of performances by the university's precision dance team. The complex also will include a plaza to accommodate large events, a fan shop open throughout the week, visitor and officials lockers, and track & field offices.

The project is the culmination of a series of expansions at the facility, which opened as Bobcat Stadium in 1982 with seating for 15,000 fans.



The university added the name of former football coach and athletic director Jim Wacker to the field in 2002. That year also marked the opening of the End Zone Complex, with the offices for football and track and field, as well amenities sponsored by loyal fans:

FOOTBALL ROOMS

The J. Garland Warren Room, which along with the Wells Fargo Terrace overlooks the south end zone, is the home of hospitality activities for the TXST football game.

The Pavillion, located in the southwest portion of the stadium is the home of athletic alumni functions and other pregame events. Built in 2014, the pavillion displays photos and athletic accomplishments of past Bobcats, and is open for all “T” Association members on game days.

In 2009, the stadium’s capacity increased to more than 16,000 with the addition of luxury suites and club seats in the Jerry D. and Linda Gregg Fields West Side Complex. The Legacy Suite Level includes 15 suites that each feature 12 permanent seats and four barstools. Suite ownership comes with season tickets to home games, use of full kitchenettes, refrigerators and cabinets, a flat-screen television, operable windows, and four VIP parking passes. The Champions Club Level has 450 club seats. The club level provides both covered outdoor seats and an indoor banquet-style area with tables and additional seating.

THE CHAMPIONS CLUB AMENITIES

- Individual chair back seats with extended leg room for greater comfort
- Fans and replay televisions in seating area
- Covered seating for protection from the sun and inclement weather
- Exclusive access to climate-controlled club lounge and open-air seating
- Access to lounge with flat screen TVs
- Complimentary buffet style food and drinks (non-alcoholic) and private access to limited concessions
- Alcoholic beverages for purchase during the game
- Private restroom access
- Two large buffet areas

STRAHAN COLISEUM

Texas State's volleyball program and men's basketball and women's basketball teams, call Strahan Coliseum home. The arena, which seats 7,200, was named for Oscar W. Strahan (pronounced "stran"), who was instrumental in the building of the university's first gym and was the university's first men's basketball coach. Texas State donors have helped with upgrades to facilities in Strahan Coliseum, including:

- The Navarrette Head Men's Basketball Coach's Office (Donated by John and Chloe Navarrette)
- The Navarrette Volleyball Locker Room (Donated by John and Chloe Navarrette)
- CenturyLink Women's Basketball Locker Room

The adjacent Jowers Center houses offices and locker rooms for baseball, softball, men's and women's golf, and tennis.

Strahan Coliseum is the home for commencement and ring ceremonies at Texas State. One of the first events at the arena was an NBA exhibition game between the San Antonio Spurs and Boston Celtics, teams with seven future hall of famers on their rosters: George Gervin, Artis Gilmore, Kevin McHale, Larry Bird, Robert Parish, Nate Archibald and Dennis Johnson. Current NBA player and Texas State alum Jeff Foster also played at Strahan Coliseum before being drafted by the Indiana Pacers.

STRAHAN COLISEUM AMENITIES

BOBCAT BASEBALL BALLPARK

The home of the Texas State baseball program is adjacent to the Bobcat Softball Stadium on Charles Austin Drive.

The ballpark provides the necessary intimate setting for baseball, along with comfortable seating for fans. Many of the 2,000 seats have individual chair backs and are covered with a distinctive cantilevered roof. Bleacher seats include a back.

Four luxury suites were added in 2009, and one of the more unusual facilities in college baseball was added in summer 2011 — an old railroad caboose, which was installed down the right-field line and retrofitted with reserved seating and decks.



Team amenities at the ballpark include covered cages for both hitting and pitching, as well as full-service dugouts for both teams. Bullpens were upgraded in 2008 as well as the outfield fence, batters eye and video board.

The ballpark's brick façade matches nearby university facilities, as well as the adjacent Bobcat Softball Stadium. The park includes a ticket office, restrooms, concession stands and merchandise sales areas.

BOBCAT SOFTBALL STADIUM

The home of the Texas State softball program is adjacent to the Bobcat Baseball Ballpark on Charles Austin Drive.

The softball stadium provides seating for 1,000 fans, with many of the seats equipped with individual chair backs and covered with a distinctive cantilevered roof. Bleacher seats include a back. Two luxury suites were added in 2009.

Like the neighboring ballpark, team amenities at the stadium include covered cages for both hitting and pitching, as well as full-service dugouts for both teams.



Also like the adjacent ballpark, the stadium's brick façade ties in with nearby university facilities. The stadium includes a ticket office, new restrooms, concession stands and merchandise sales areas.



BOBCAT SPORTS COMPLEX

Located in West Campus, adjacent to the Student Recreation Center, the Bobcat Sports Complex is the home of the women's intercollegiate soccer team.

Facilities for the soccer team include a locker room, weight room, showers and a training facility. The new Athletic Academic Center also is part of the complex. It is housed in Harris Hall and has a state-of-the-art

computer lab, a learning lab, and areas for both individual and group study.

The complex has two full-sized soccer fields. The main field is the home of the soccer team, and it includes grandstands for approximately 300, restrooms, video board and a concession stand. Texas State sport clubs also use the two fields.



TENNIS COMPLEX

The Bobcat Tennis Complex, home of the women's intercollegiate program, features 10 lighted courts — eight outdoor and two indoor courts.

The centerpiece of the complex is a championship court with seating for 200. Recent renovations have upgraded the sound system, as well as a facility for the team that includes a locker room, showers, training equipment and a video room.

The complex is located on Sessom Drive, just north of campus.



TRACK AND FIELD STADIUM

The latest addition to Texas State Athletics is the Track and Field Stadium.

Located east of Bobcat Stadium, the stadium features an NCAA regulation track that can be set up for the steeplechase. It has a runway and pits for the long jump and triple jump, and areas for the high jump and pole vault. There also are safe zones for the shot put, discus, hammer throw and javelin.

Bleacher seating is available for 1,000, and the stadium has permanent restrooms and a concessions area. The field is solely used by the Texas State track and field programs year-round, and serve as the host facility for high school and college meets.

The façade of the stadium features red brick masonry used elsewhere on campus. It replaces the track and field facilities at Bobcat Stadium, which were removed to make way for the North Side Complex.



NORTH SIDE STADIUM EXPANSION

The latest expansion at Bobcat Stadium will open in the 2012 season, with the addition of 13,500 seats and related amenities as part of the North Side Complex.

Capacity for the stadium in 2012 will be approximately 30,000, with upper and lower seating levels on three sides.

The North Side Complex will feature the Strutters Gallery, which will chronicle a half-century of performances by the university's precision dance team. The complex also will include a plaza to accommodate large events, a fanshop and centralized ticketing operations for the department.

The complex will also be the future home to the department's track and field offices, locker room and weight room.

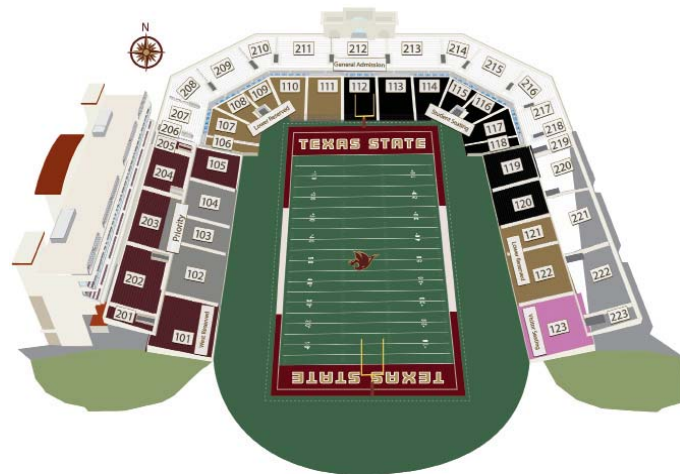


FACILITIES MAP



SEATING CHARTS

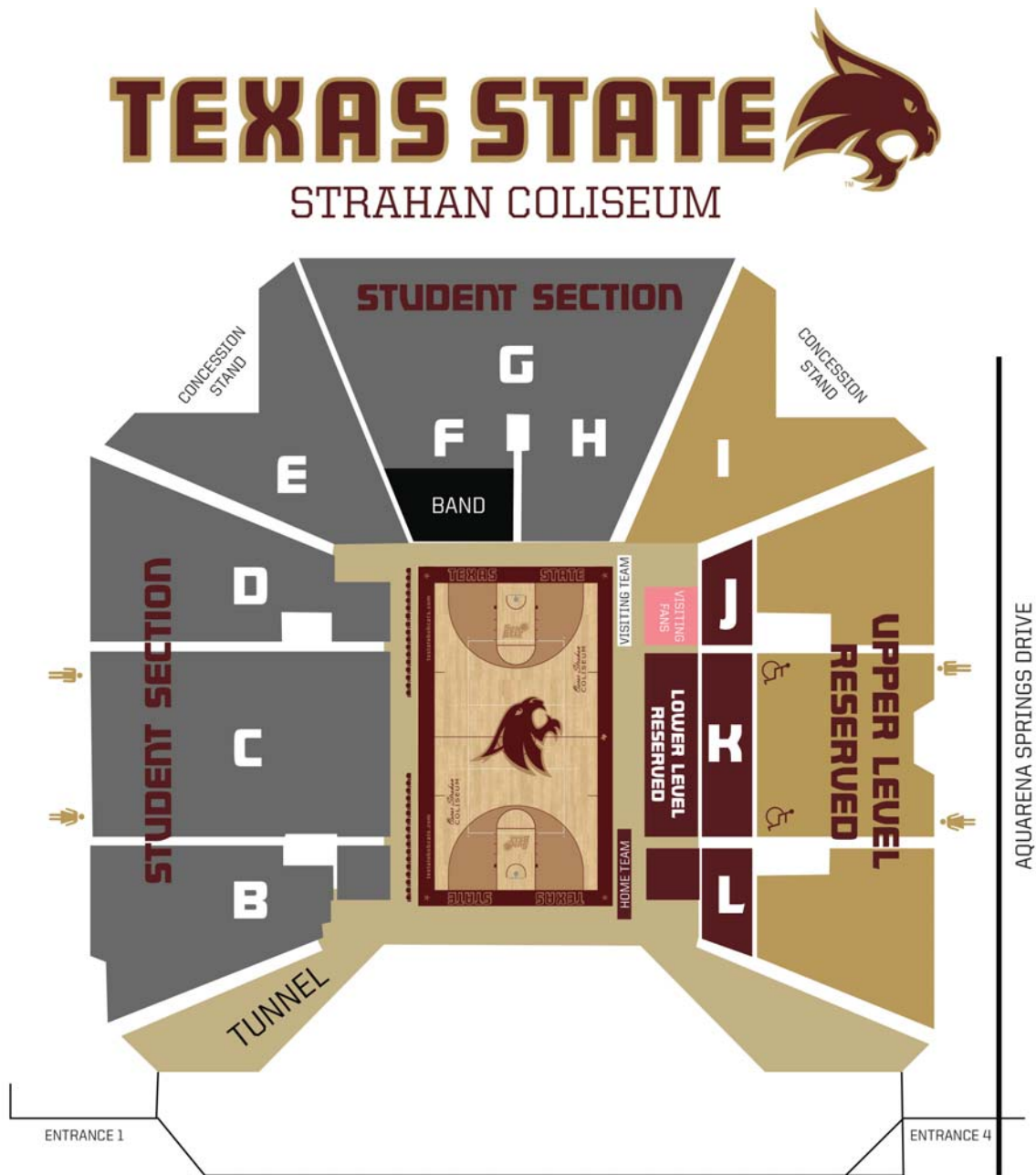
BOBCCAT STADIUM



SEATING CHARTS

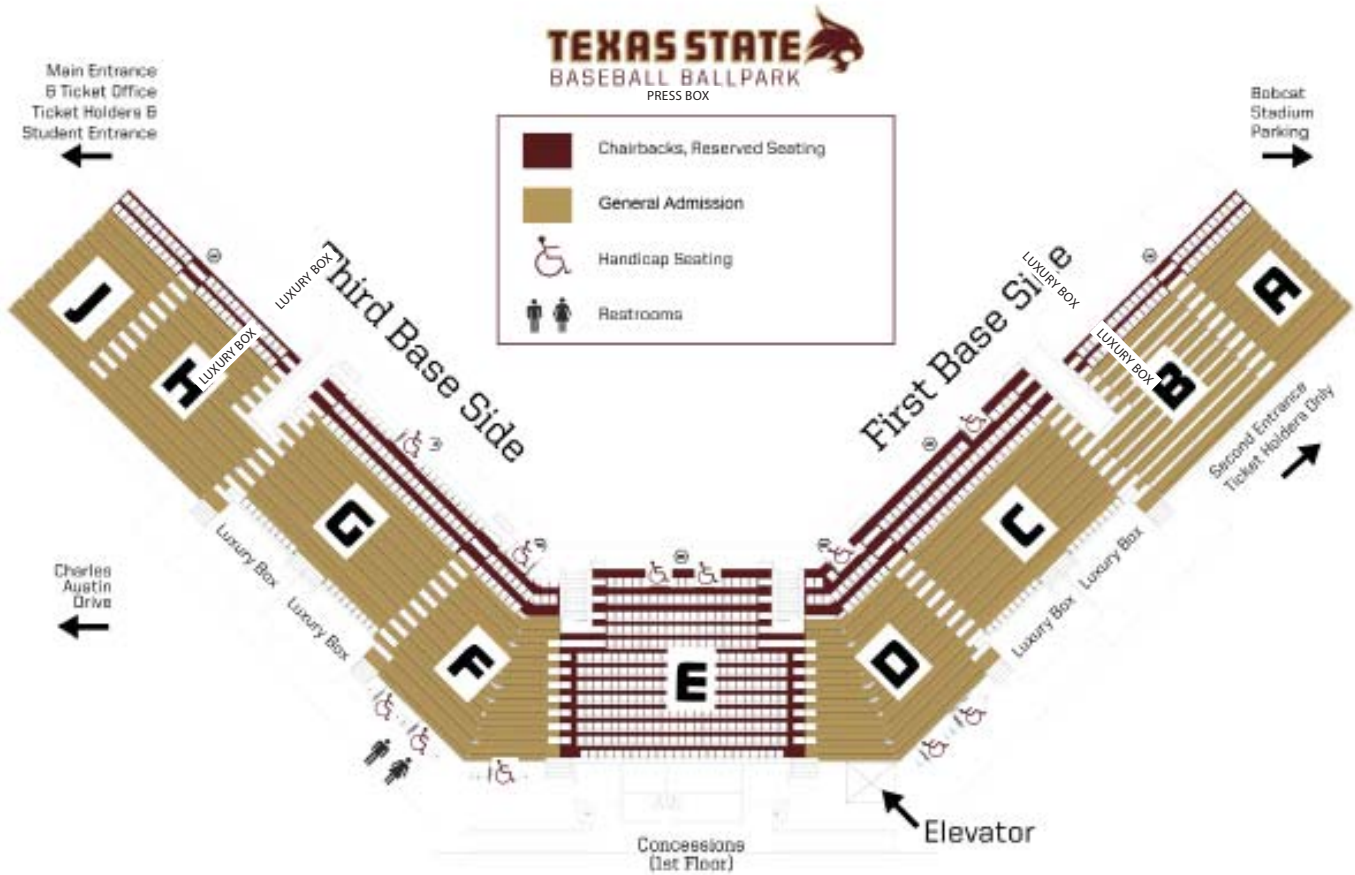
STRAHAN COLISEUM

Men's and women's basketball configuration shown



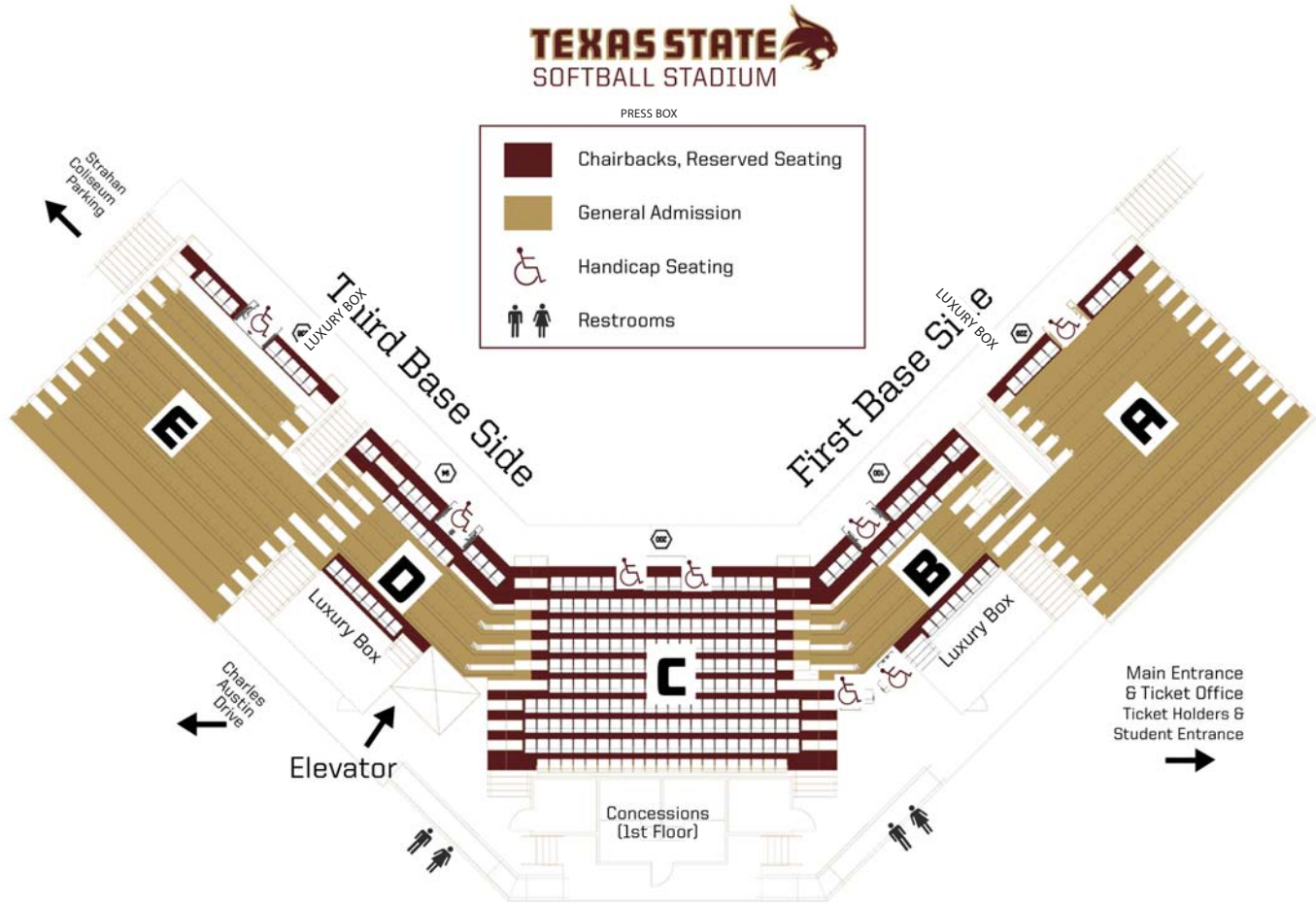

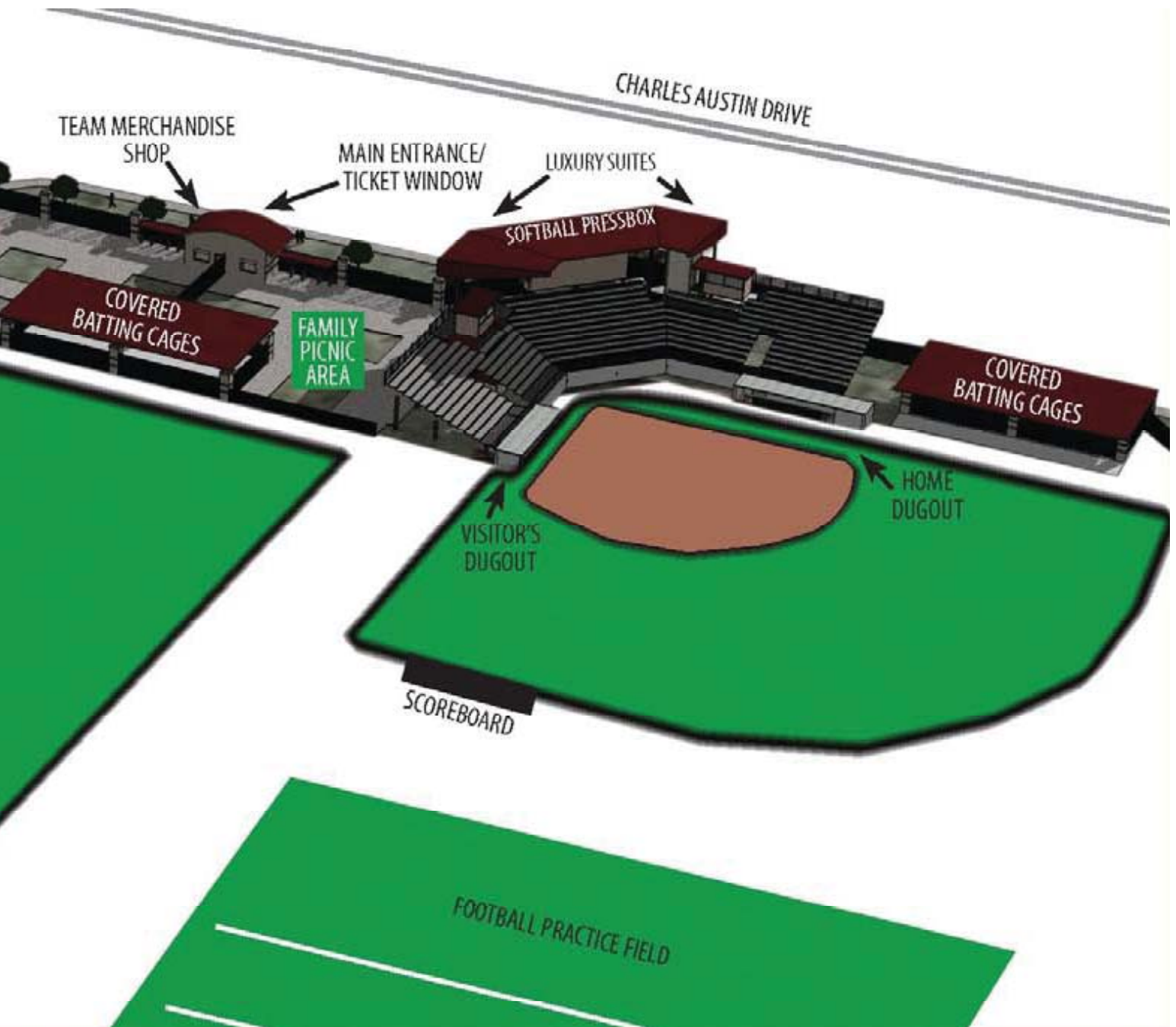
