QUICK NOTABLES

- Texas State split the first two games of the four-game homestand. The Bobcats fell to Stephen F. Austin 3-2 in double overtime and held on for a 1-0 victory against Northwestern State.
- A goal by Rachel Grout at the 34:45 mark snapped Texas State's scoreless streak at just over four games and for a total of 438:21.
- This weekend marks the beginning of Sun Belt Conference play. For the second year in a row, the Bobcats play their first two conference games at home.
- All SBC teams will wear special warn-up jerseys this weekend in support of Ovarian Cancer Awareness and head coach Kat Conner. She was diagnosed with stage three ovarian cancer last year and underwent many surgical procedures and seven months of chemotherapry in order to eradicate any remnats of the disease. Thankfully, she is now in remisson.

GAME NOTES

SCOUTING THE COMPETITION - LITTLE ROCK

- Little Rock enters Sun Belt Conference play with a 5-3-0 record.
- The Trojans closed closed out non-conference play with a 2-0 victory over Mississippi State and a 2-1 win against Kansas State at home.
- In the past six games, Little Rock has won five of them. The lone exception was a 1-0 loss at then 14th-ranked Texas A&M on Sept. 2.
- The only opponent the Trojans have faced as Texas State was Northwestern State. Little Rock lost to the Lady Demons 2-0 in the season opener.
- Jaclyn Purvine leads the Trojans with three goals. She is tied for the team lead in assists with Quin Wilkes with two.
- Fali Garuba, Harrison Hayworth and Wilkes have all tallied two goals apiece this season.
- Pacing the squad with 25 shots and 11 shots on goals is Shannon Shields. However, she has yet to find the back of the net but has been credited with an assist.
- Sara Small, a second team All-SBC selection last year, has started six games. She sports a 0.83 GAA and has made 21 saves for an .808 save percentage.
- Both Sara Cavanagh and Shara Robbins have appeared in two game, started once and made two saves. Cavanagh has not allowed a goal this season while Robbins let in both scores of a 6-2 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff.
- In charge of the Trojans is Adrian Blewitt. He is in his fourth season and has a 28-32-6 record at Little Rock. His career coaching record with women's teams is 98-60-16 and he is 195-98-18 overall.

ALL-TIME SERIES - LITTLE ROCK

- Texas State is 3-0-0 all-time against Little Rock.
- Last year the Bobcats defeated the Trojans 2-1 in double overtime to open Sun Belt Conference action. The game winning-goal was an own goal off a IR defender
- Texas State has won both meetings played in San Marcos. The first was a 4-0 decision on Oct. 25, 2013.
- The lone match not played at the Bobcat Soccer Complex was a 2-1 contest on Sept. 28, 2014 in Little Rock.

SCOUTING THE COMPETITION - GEORGIA STATE

- Georgia State concluded non-conference play with a 3-2-2 record.
- The Panthers defeated Southeastern Louisiana on the road 2-0 on Sunday. Their other two victories this season have been against Alabama A&M (1-0) and Alabama State (3-0), both at home.
- GSU's two losses were to Charlotte (4-1) at home and Western Kentucky (4-0) on the road. The Panthers' two draws were both scoreless contests coming against Kennesaw State and Jacksonville State.
- Prior to playing Texas State on Sunday, GSU opends Sun Belt Conference action at UL Lafayette on Friday night.
- The Panthers have scored seven goals this season. All have been netted by a different player.
- Caitlin Ray has been credited with a team-high three assists.
- Kylie Ruffule and Alexis Thomas have one assist to their name apiece. They are also tied with Ray for the team lead in points with three.
- \bullet Both Callie O'Connor and Thomas have taken a team best 11 shots this year.
- Brie Haynes has played every minute this season in between the posts. She enters the weekend having made 32 saves for a .800 save percentage and has allowed eight goals for a 1.07 GAA.
- In his first year as the GSU head coach is Ed Joyce.

ALL-TIME SERIES - GEORGIA STATE

- \bullet Texas State holds a 3-2 edge in the all-time series over Georgia State.
- Last season saw the teams split the two meetings. The Bobcats walked away with a 4-1 during behind a Lauren Prater's second hat-trick of the year. The Panthers got even at home in the first round of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament by the score of 2-1.
- The teams also met two times in 2014. Both games were 1-0 decisions with GSU taking the regular season match and TXST winning in the conference tournament.
- On Oct. 4, 2013, the squads met for the first time. The Bobcats won the meeting 1-0 at home.
- When playing in San Marcos, TXST is 2-0 all-time against the Panthers.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS

- Texas State saw its scoreless streak come to an end in the first half against Stephen F. Austin on a goal from Rachel Grout. She knocked in a rebound off of a shot from Skylar Vanover-Hallamrk at the 34:45 mark of the game.
- The Bobcats had been held without a goal in their previous four games, one shy of tying the program record.
- In total, Texas State went has been 438:21 between Lauren Prater's goal at the 77:25 mark against Prairie View A&M and Grout's tally against the Lady Jacks.

PACKING HOME STANDS

- Texas State dropped to second in the Sun Belt Conference in average home attendance following the two home matches against Northwestern State and Stephen F. Austin.
- The Bobcats enter conference play averaging 680 fans over four matches at the Bobcat Soccer Complex.
- Leading the league is Troy with an average of 755.

SHUTOUTS

- $\bullet \ \, \text{Through eight games, Texas State has recorded a shutout in four games.}$
- In 2015 the Bobcats held opponents scoreless in five contests.
- The school record for shutouts in a season is 12 in 2008.

DOUBLE OVERTIME CONTESTS

- Texas State has played three double overtime games this season. All came within a four-game span.
- It is the most since playing five in the 2013 season.
- School record for double overtime contests in a season is six set in 1999.
- Only twice before has the Bobcats had three double overtime contests in a four-game span. The first was Oct. 22-31, 1999 and the second occurrance was Aug 31-Sept. 10, 2003.

CLIMBING CAREER RECORDS

- Seniors Maddie Nichols and Lauren Prater have been climbing career records list this season.
- Nichols recently moved into 10th place on the minutes played list (since 2007) with 5,008 career minutes of action.
- Prater moved up to eighth on the career shots on goal list with 64.
- With four shots against Stephen F. Austin, Prater moved into a tie for 10th in career shots with 110 and matching Taylor Person (2009-12).
- The Arlington, Texas native is two points and one goal away cracking the top 10 in each career list.

RARE HOME TIE

- Texas State and Houston played to a 0-0 tie at the Bobcat Soccer Complex on Aug. 28.
- It was just the fifth ever draw for the Bobcats on the field.
- Last tie at home was on Sept. 8, 2013 against Rice that was also a scoreless draw.
- Four of the five ties have ended with neither team scoring a goal. The first ever draw was Oct. 8, 2006 against Southeastern Louisiana and the second took place against Baylor on Sept. 26, 2008.
- The only draw that did not end 0-0 was on Nov. 4, 2011 in the semifinals of the Southland Conference Tournament. The Bobcats and Sam Houston State played to a 1-1 tie. Texas State advanced to the championship game on penalty kicks.

100TH BOBCAT SOCCER COMPLEX VICTORY

- Texas State earned its 100th victory at the Bobcat Soccer Complex Sunday afternoon against Prairie View A&M by a 2-0 score.
- Victory No. 1 on the field came on Sept. 8, 2000 against Nichols State by the score of 3-0.
- The Bobcats currently have and all-time record of 101-49-5 (.668) on their home turf following 1-0 victory over Northwestern State.

TEAM NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Texas State enters the weekend ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference and 25th in the nation with 18.38 shots per game.
- The Bobcats are also in the top 50 with 8.00 shots per game (46th) and a 50.0 shutout percentage (45th).

- Senior forward Lauren Prater was voted the Sun Belt Conference's Preseason Co-Offensive Player of the Year.
- She shared the award with South Alabama's Charde Hannah.
- Prater led the conference last season with 12 goals and five game-winning goals.
- $\bullet \hbox{ The Arlington, Texas native added four assists for 28 points, the most among all returners in the SBC. } \\$
- She was also the lone representative from Texas State on the league's preseason all-conference team.

A LOOK AT THE RETURNERS

- Texas State returns five seniors, nine juniors and four sophomores to the 2016 squad. Serving as this year's team captains are forward Lauren Prater and midfielder Maddie Nichols.
- Prater led both the Bobcats and the Sun Belt Conference with 12 goals and five game-winning scores in 2015 in a breakout campaign. She added four assists to share the team lead with 28 points that earned her All-Sun Belt Conference Second Team honors.
- Nichols leads an experience group of midfielders that includes juniors Rachel Grout, Brooke Ramsey and Kira Zapalac. Two goals last season were scored by Zapalac while Grout added a goal. Ramsey finished with two assists while taking a majority of the corner kicks.
- Anchoring the defensive line is junior Chandler Cooney, a 2015 second team All-SBC selection. Fellow classmate Elizabeth Havenhill returns after missing the second half of last season because of injury to team with Cooney in the center of the back line. They will be joined by seniors Taylor Allen and Ali Jones on the outside.
- Junior Maddi Nordstrom is the only Bobcat on the roster with experience between the posts. She has appeared in two career games with her first career start coming last season at Troy. Nordstrom is also the lone player on the team not hailing from the Lone Star state, claiming Orlando, Florida as her hometown.

CONFERENCE CONSISTENCY

- This year's senior class will be the first to have played their entire career in the Sun Belt Conference. The last time a senior class competed in one conference for their entire career was 2011, the last year that Texas State was a member of the Southland Conference.

Kat Conner has built quite opportunity to build a women's

soccer program at Texas State. Entering her 17th season as the leader of the Bobcats, Conner has won four reguar season conference championships, five conference tournaments and has led Texas State to the NCAA Tournament five times. She enters 2016 with a career record of 179-144-23.

The 2015 campaign saw Conner set out most of the year while battling ovarian cancer. In the Bobcats' second season as a member of the Sun Belt Conference, Conner guided Texas State to its second consecutive SBC semifinal match before ultimately falling to Troy. The 2014 Bobcats notched Conner's ninth, 10-win team at Texas State and had a pair of student-athletes earn all-conference accolades.

As a junior in 2014, Lynsey Curry became the first Texas State soccer player to be named First Team All-Sun Belt Conference after leading the Bobcats with seven goals including two game winners. Freshman defender Elizabeth Havenhill earned Second-Team All-SBC honors as a pivotal member of the Bobcat backline.

After earning Freshman of the Year honors in the WAC in 2012, Curry was named Second-Team All-SBC alongside Tori Hale, who finished her Texas State career as the program's all-time assists leader. In 2013, Hale tied the single season record in assists with nine.

Conner's latest appearance in the NCAA Tournament came in 2011 after the Bobcats defeated Stephen F. Austin in the Southland Conference Tournament, 1-0. Heading into the game, SFA was the leading goal scoring team in the country with over 3.4 goals per game.

Texas State finished that season 14-6-1, just one of 20 teams in the country to win at least 12 games. From 2008-11, the Bobcats won a combined 53 games, 30th most in the NCAA.

Individually, Texas State finished the 2011 season with a league-high six All-Southland Conference selections along with Newcomer of the Year, Andrea Mauk.

During her tenure in the Southland, Conner coached three Conference Players of the Year, four Newcomers of the Year, three Freshmen of the Year, one All-American and 55 All-Conference team members.

> In Texas State's inaugural season in 1999, Conner led the Bobcats to a 9-9-3 overall record and a 6-3-3 mark in the Southland Conference to finish third overall and advance to the league's postseason tournament.

Despite the inexperience, Texas State claimed its first-ever SLC Tournament title and played in the NCAA Tournament.

Two years later, the Bobcats returned to the NCAA Tournament after posting a 14-7-0 overall record and claiming the SLC title and sweeping through the SLC tournament. It was just the second time in league history a team had won both the conference and conference tournament championships.

Conner continued her winning ways in 2002 when Texas State shared the SLC championship with Southeastern Louisiana, and again in 2004

when the Bobcats won the SLC Tournament and made its third appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Texas State turned in the best season in school history during the 2008 season. The Bobcats posted a 13-4-4 overall record and went undefeated against SLC opponents with a 7-0-2 mark to claim the SLC championship. Duplicating the feat previously achieved in 2001, Texas State also won the Southland Tournament and advanced to the NCAA's.

Texas State met Texas A&M in the first round of the NCAA postseason for the third time in program history. The Aggies held a 2-0 lead by halftime, and despite scoring its first two goals ever against the Aggies, Texas State fell by a score of 5-2.



After losing four members from the spectacular 2008 squad, the next season seemed to fall right into place. The Bobcats enjoyed another undefeated conference season,

going 8-0-1 and with a 14-6-1 overall mark.

Conner was named Southland Coach of the Year and junior Britney Curry was named the 2009 Player of the Year. Curry ranked seventh nationally averaging .842 goals per game and eighth with an average of two points per game. The honor marked the third-straight season Curry was named to a postseason team, a feat a number of athletes have enjoyed under Conner's leadership.

Conner has coached quite a few stars during her time in San Marcos as Curry finished her career as Texas State's all-time career scoring leader with 123 points (53 goals, 17 assists). In 2010, she was the leading scorer in the conference, with 33 points (14 goals, five assists). Nationally, she ranked 13th in both total goals (14) and goals per game (0.667) and 18th in points per

game with 1.57. For her career, she finished just four points shy of the all-time Southland Conference record of 127 points by Kim McNally (Southeastern Louisiana, 2002-04).

Marva Bailey (1999-2002) earned First-Team All-SLC honors each year of her career at Texas State and Kendra Kade repeated the achievement from 2001-2004. In 2002, Sarah Buchrucker became Texas State's first soccer All-American after being named to the Verizon Wireless All-American Team. In 2004, Danielle Holloway became the SLC's first player in history to be named Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year in the same season.

In addition to the success on the field, Conner prides herself on student-athletes performing well in the classroom. Along with a championship caliber program on the field, she demands the same for her player's education.

In 2015, the soccer team earned its second Emmett Sheldon Award, an honor given to the Texas State's highest female team GPA. The first time that women's soccer earned the award was after the 2004-05 school year.

Jayne Sherman, a two-time All-SLC Academic winner, became the first Texas State soccer player to be named SLC Student-Athlete of the Year in 2005.

The 2013 school year also marked a first academically for the Bobcats when Tori Hale was named a Capital One Academic All-District First-Team selection. Hale matched that honor in 2014 alongside fellow senior Jourdan Brown.

Prior to taking the reins at Texas State, Conner was an assistant coach at Texas A&M. There, she was responsible for recruiting and coaching all phases of the game, scheduling, travel, budget, summer camps, as well as monitoring academics for the team.

During her five seasons in College Station, the Aggies made four NCAA tournament appearances, won a Big 12 Championship and a Big 12 Tournament championship.

Conner began her coaching career at Pacific Lutheran after completing a successful playing career for the Lutes in 1990.

She earned a B.A. in physical education before serving as the Lutes' defensive coordinator, handling recruiting and travel. As a coach, Conner helped lead the team to a national championship in 1991 and a national runner-up finish in 1992. The Lutes ahd a combined record of 57-8-7 as a player and coach, during which the team reached the NAIA Championship game all three years.

The 1991 championship team has been inducted into the Pacific Lutheran Hall of Fame. It marked the last time the Lutes won a NAIA national championship.

Prior to finishing her playing career at Pacific Lutheran, Conner played three years at Hardin Simmons. There, she led her team to the NAIA Championship game in 1988. She also was named to the NAIA All-Tournament team in 1988.

In addition to coaching at Texas State, Conner has been involved with developing Texas youth soccer. She has been a member of the coaching staff for the Region III Olympic Development Program and served as the coach for the South Texas U16 team.

Collegiately, Conner was a member of the 2011 NCAA Central Ranking Committee during the season. She was the chairman of the NSCAA Central Ranking Committee in 2011 after serving on it since 2009.

From 2004-07, Conner was appointed to the NCAA soccer rules committee by both the Southland Conference and the NCAA. Conner holds a USSF "A" license as well as a U.S. Soccer Goalkeeping license and NSCAA Premier License.

A native of Irving, Texas, Conner graduated from Nimitz High School.
