### GREAT DANES BATTLE FOR THE ALBANY CUP TO TIP OFF 2013-14 SEASON

The UAlbany women's basketball team will tip off the new season with a battle against cross-town rival Siena at the Times Union Center in downtown Albany at 5 p.m. to determine the winner of the Albany Cup.

The Great Danes have won the past three Albany Cup games, including a 65-48 win last season, shooting 60% from the field. Megan Craig and Lindsey Lowrie each scored a team-best 12 points, adding six rebounds. Tehresa Coles led Siena with 13 points and four steals.

UAlbany will look to tie the all-time series on Friday as Siena currently leads 5-4.

### UALBANY PREDICTED TO FINISH FIRST IN AMERICA EAST

The two-time defending America East champion Great Danes have been picked to finish first in the America East this season.

Voted on by the league's head coaches, the Great Danes received eight out of nine first-place votes for a maximum 64 possible points. Last year's league runner-up Hartford is predicted to finish second with 54 points. The rest of the teams in order of predicted finish is Stony Brook, New Hampshire, Vermont, Maine, UMBC, Binghamton and UMass Lowell.

### LOOKING FOR THE THREE-PEAT

The UAlbany women's basketball team enters the 2013-14 season going for its third consecutive America East Championship.

Last season, the Great Danes went an unblemished 16-0 in conference play and finished 27-4, the best record in UAlbany's DI history. The past two years, the team has won 30 of its 32 league games, including winning all 16 road games.

UAlbany will look to be the first America East school to three-peat in the conference since Maine won four straight conference championships from 1994-95 to 1997-98.

### CRAIG, RICHARDS EARN PRESEASON ALL-AE

**Megan Craig** and **Shereesha Richards** were selected to the 2013-14 America East Preseason All-Conference Team. UAlbany stood alone with the most preseason all-conference members.

Craig earned Third Team all-conference honors last season, while Richards was an America East Co-Rookie of the Year last year.

The rest of the team includes Amber Bepko of Hartford, Kelsey Hogan of New Hampshire and Sabre Proctor of Stony Brook.

### DEPENDING ON THE YOUNG ONES

UAlbany will look to a class of six freshmen to fill in for a talented senior class that graduated last season. These freshman will look to replace the production of **Ebone Henry**, the program's all-time leading scorer, the 2012-13 America East Player of the Year and a three-time conference Defensive Player of the Year, **Julie Forster**, the all-time leading rebounder at UAlbany and three-time All-America East forward, **Lindsey Lowrie**, a 2012-13 all-conference player who ranks fifth all-time in three-point shooting at UAlbany, and **Keyana Williams**, a four-year 6-2 forward who shot 40% in her career. Together, this class made up of 54% of points, 45% of rebounds and 51% of assists last year.

The six UAlbany freshman hail from three different countries, including three from the United States, including a pair from the home state of New York, two from Canada and one from Nigeria.

### CRAIG TOWERS OVER THE COMPETITION

UAlbany junior forward Megan Craig, a Third Team All-America East player last season, is one of the tallest players in women's basketball at 6-foot-9. Last season, she was second in the league with a 54.9% shooting percentage, only behind teammate **Shereesha Richards** at 61.1%, making 139 of her 253 shots. She also finished sixth in the conference with 29 blocked shots, standing 10th in UAlbany history in blocked shots after just two years on the team.

Only Pittsburgh's Marvadene Anderson, a 6-foot-11 freshman, is listed as a taller women's basketball player.

### TWO BEST SHOOTERS IN THE LEAGUE

Last season, **Shereesha Richards** and **Megan Craig** were one and two in the America East in shooting percentage, earning the single season record for that category in UAlbany history.

As a freshman, Richards made 121 of 198 field goal attempts to shoot 61.1% from the field, while teammate Craig shot 54.9% with 139 made baskets in 253 attempts. They both surpassed Rainny Lesane's school record, who shot 54% percent for UAlbany in the 1985-85 season.

With these two leading the way, UAlbany shot a league-best 44%. Only one other player in the entire conference shot over 46% from the field.

### TWO-TIME AE COACH OF THE YEAR

In her first three seasons, Coach **Katie Abrahamson-Henderson** has made her mark in the America East, earning the league's Coach of the Year award twice and coaching the team to its first-ever America East titles in 2012 and 2013.

In Coach Abrahamson-Henderson's tenure leading up to this season, the Great Danes have won 39 conference games, including a 30-2 league record the past two years.

### UALBANY TO HOST AE TOURNAMENT

For the second consecutive season, the University at Albany will host the America East Women's Basketball Tournament at SEFCU Arena.

The quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 7th, followed by the semifinals on Sunday, March 9th. Then on Monday, March 10th, the America East title game will be at SEFCU Arena and televised nationally on ESPNU.

In addition, the men's AE Tournament quarterfinals and semifinals will also be at SEFCU Arena this season.

### TEAM CAPTAINS CHOSEN

By a unanimous vote from the players, **Sarah Royals**, **Margarita Rosario** and **Shereesha Richards** have been elected as UAlbany Women's Basketball team captains. Royals, the starting point guard last year, Richards, the 2012-13 conference Co-Rookie of the Year, and Rosario, a primary reserve guard, will lead the Great Danes.

### RELIABLE COACHES

UAlbany returns its entire coaching staff from its 27-4 season last year, the best season in school history. Assistant Coach **Mary Grimes** returns for her fourth season, while **Kelly Komara** and **Tahnee Balerio** are in their second year as assistant coaches. In addition, Director of Basketball Operations **Brittany Hollingsworth** and Graduate Assistant Manager **Isoken Uzamere** also are back for their second season.

### SCOUTING THE OPPONENT:

Cross-town rival Siena is coming off a 13-18 year in the first season under Head Coach Ali Jaques. The Saints went 8-10 in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and made the semifinals of the MAAC Tournament, falling to Iona.

The Saints are looking to replace the production of Lily Greci, who nearly averaged a double double a game last season. The leading returning scorer from last year is junior guard Tehresa Coles, who averaged 9.1 points, 4.3 rebounds and 2.9 steals per game. The team's primary three-point shooter at 31.1%, senior Clara Sole Anglada, also is the leading returning rebounder at 4.6 boards a contest, scoring 8.8 points a game. At the point is junior Ida Krough, who concluded last season with 76 assists and 5.2 points a game.

### SCORING STREAKS

UAlbany's Preseason All-Conference players have scored in at least 27 consecutive games dating back to last season.

After not scoring in the season opener against Fordham, **Megan Craig** netted points in the final 30 games of the 2012-2013 season. **Shereesha Richards** was held without points in UAlbany's fourth contest of that season against Michigan State, since then she has scored in the last 27 games.

In addition, **Sarah Royals** has dished out an assist in each of the past 32 games dating back to her freshman season, including the entirety of the the 2012-13 season.



### FOUR UALBANY GAMES TO BE ON ESPN3

UAlbany will be featured four times on ESPN3 this season, including three home games at the SEFCU Arena. Each UAlbany-Hartford game, last season's America East title matchup, will be on ESPN3, scheduled for January 12th at Hartford and February 7th at UAlbany. ESPN3 will also broadcast the Purple Growl game against Vermont on February 1st plus Senior Day against Stony Brook on March 1st.

The America East quarterfinals and semifinals will also be on ESPN3 at the SEFCU Arena. The conference title game will be broadcast nationally on ESPNU on Monday, March 10th.

### ROYALS APPROACHING ASSISTANT ROYALTY

**Sarah Royals** comes into her junior season with 156 assists, just 34 away from being 20th all-time in University at Albany history. The record at UAlbany is 375, set by Samantha Ginsberg from 1993-97, while the D-I record is held by Kathryn Hemlock with 262 from 2000-03.

Last season, Royals led the team with 115 assists, the seventh-highest season total in UAlbany history. It was the best season mark since Sarah Sweetland dished out 125 assists in the 2003-04 season.

### GLOBETROTTING TEAM

The Great Danes women's basketball team feature players from three different continents, representing six different countries: the United States, Canada, Great Britain (British Virgin Islands in North America), Jamaica, Nigeria and New Zealand.

**Megan Craig** is a member of the New Zealand National Team and competed in the FIBA World Championship Trials in August. From the USA's neighbor to the north comes freshmen **Jessica Féquière** from Montreal and **Cassandra Edwards** from Brampton, Ontario. **Shereesha Richards** grew up in Jamaica before playing high school basketball in New Jersey. From the British Virgin Islands, a principality of Great Britain, comes the team's only senior **Tammy Phillip**. **Bose Aiyalogbe** rounds out the class as a native of Lagos, Nigeria.

The players from the United States represent a number of states up and down the East Coast, with just two from the home state of New York, freshmen **Zakiya Saunders** from Fort Drum and **Imani Tate** from the Bronx. The other states represented on UAlbany include Connecticut, Florida, Massachusetts, New Jersey, South Carolina and Virginia.

### **CANNOT SCORE ON THE GREAT DANES**

The Great Danes sported the third-best scoring defense in Division I last season, allowing just 49.3 points per game. Opposing teams shot just 33.2% against UAlbany last year, fifth in DI. UAlbany held its opponents to 50 points or less in 19 of its 31 games last season.

### **ALUM JULIE FORSTER PLAYING IN DENMARK**

Julie Forster, the all-time leading rebounder in UAlbany women's basketball history and former three-time all-conference forward, is playing overseas in Denmark with Stevnsgade BBK for her first professional season. Through her first five games, Forster is averaging 20 points and 18 rebounds a game.

The former three-time All-America East player and three-time leader in rebounding in the conference set the single season UAlbany record with 339 boards in the 2011-12 season, concluding her stellar career with 1,149 rebounds.

### **DOMINANT DANE DEFENSE**

UAlbany sported one of the top defenses in the country last, ranking in the top ten in scoring defense, rebound margin and field-goal percentage defense.

The Great Danes were third in DI in scoring defense, allowing just 49.3 points per game, helping by the fifth best field goal % defense at 33.2%. UAlbany outrebounded its opponents by over 10 boards a contest, the eighth-best mark in DI. Of UAlbany's 31 games last year, the Great Danes held opponents to under 50 points in 19 of them.

### **ROAD WARRIORS**

The Great Danes have not lost a conference road game in two years, winning all 16 America East games away from SEFCU Arena in that span.

The last time UAlbany fell in a conference game on the road was on February 26th, 2011, when the Great Danes were defeated by UMBC 62-55 in Baltimore.

### **HOME SWEET HOME**

After UAlbany plays against Siena at the Times Union Center, the Great Danes will play four home games in a row, the first four of 14 regular season games at the SEFCU Arena this season, not including the America East Tournament.

The Great Danes will face three teams at home that played postseason ball in 2013. In non-conference play, UAlbany takes on MAAC champion Marist and NEC champion Quinnipiac, then later it takes on Hartford, which played in the NIT.

### **MEGAN'S BLOCK PARTY**

Megan Craig currently stands 10th all-time in blocked shots in UAlbany history with 56, earning 29 blocks last season. With 12 more she can tie Michele Davis for ninth on that list. The top mark of UAlbany all-time belongs to Gia Saunders, who blocked 151 shots in 116 games from 2004-2008.

### UAlbany Drops Heartbreaker to North Carolina 59-54 in NCAA First Round

**NEWARK, Del.** - Behind 30 points from Tierra Ruffin-Pratt, third-seeded North Carolina posted a 59-54 win over 14th-seeded UAlbany in the first round of the NCAA Women's Basketball tournament on Sunday afternoon at the Bob Carpenter Center on the campus of the University of Delaware. After a valiant effort by the America East Champion Great Danes against the Tarheels of the Atlantic Coast Conference, the team ends its season with a 27-4 record. UNC advances to the second round to face the host Blue Hens on Tuesday.

After another tying basket by UNC, Richards hit 1-of-2 from the free throw line to give the Great Danes a one-point, 45-44, advantage. UAlbany forced UNC into a shot-clock violation and Royals dished the ball to Henry under the basket, where she was fouled on a made layup and hit the free throw to put the Great Danes back on top, 48-44, with 9:40 to play.

Ruffin-Pratt gave UNC its first lead since the first half with a 3-pointer at 6:35, putting the Tarheels ahead, 49-48.

She then hit two free throws to push the lead to 51-48, but two free throws by Henry cut the lead back to one with just over five minutes to play. As the time ticked down to the under-four minute media timeout, UNC held a one-point, 53-52, lead, and had possession coming out of the TO. The Tarheels extended their lead to four, 56-52, but an offensive rebound and put-back by Craig kept it a two-point game with just over a minute to play. Ruffin-Pratt iced the game for the Tarheels at the line, hitting two from the charity stripe with 11 seconds to go to set the final score.

"That was pretty amazing, huh?" said UAlbany head coach Katie Abrahamson-Henderson, who guided her team to 19 straight wins, including just the seventh undefeated league slate in conference history. "We came. There is no way I would let these women be scared of anything. I am proud of them."

UAlbany shot 27.9-percent (17-61) from the field – its second-lowest shooting percentage of the season – while still holding UNC to 34.5-percent (19-55) shooting. However, the Great Danes held a slight, 44-43, rebounding advantage, and assisted 14-of-17 baskets, while the Tarheels managed just eight assists on 19 made shots.

## UAlbany Women's Basketball Wins Third Straight Albany Cup with 65-48 Win Over Siena

**ALBANY, N.Y.** - Lindsey Lowrie and Megan Craig each scored 12 points to lead UAlbany to a 65-48 win over Siena in the 2012 Albany Cup game on Saturday evening at the Times Union Center. The Great Danes, who have now won three straight games in the crosstown-rivalry game, improve to 5-2 on the season, while Siena falls to 2-5.

UAlbany scored the game's first six points, getting back-to-back 3-pointers from Lindsey Lowrie and Ebone Henry. The Great Danes extended their lead to 12-6 on a lay-in by Megan Craig at 13:51, with an assist from Henry. UAlbany continued to build an advantage, scoring the next four points to hold a 10-point, 16-6, lead, with just over 11 minutes to play in the first half. The Great Danes continued to use a strong defensive pressure, getting their fifth steal of the game and turning it into two points at the other end, holding a 22-8 advantage with 7:22 to play.

Siena attempted to rally late in the half, getting baskets from Tehresa Coles and Kate Zarotney, to pull within 29-12, with just under four minutes to play. The Saints

scored four straight points to further cut the UAlbany advantage to 29-16, but UAlbany would not fold as time wound down. With under a minute to play, Lowrie nailed her third 3-pointer of the game, while freshman Erin Coughlin also hit a long-range basket to set the halftime score at 35-19.

Siena came out of halftime aggressive, cutting the lead to 39-24 on back-to-back baskets by Clara Anglada and Ciara Stewart. Anglada nailed her second straight 3-pointer at 15:21, but UAlbany's Margarita Rosario responded with a trey of her own to end the Saints rally at 14:58. Craig then scored consecutive buckets for the Great Danes, pushing the UAlbany lead to 46-29 with just over 12 minutes to play.

With 9:33 on the clock, Henry was unable to connect on an and-one opportunity, but UAlbany got the rebound and Julie Forster laid the ball in to keep the Great Danes on top. UAlbany continued to build its lead from there, pushing the advantage to 27 points, 59-32, with just over five minutes to play on a layup by Shereesha Richards. A 3-pointer by Coles with 1:17 to play brought Siena back to within 19, 65-44, but Taylor McVey netted UAlbany's final points of the game at the minute marker. Coles scored the final points of the game, all from the free throw line, to set the final 65-48 score.

# Coach Katie Abrahamson-Henderson

## 4th Year at UAlbany

### 2011-12, 2012-13 America East Coach of the Year



Katie Abrahamson-Henderson enters her fourth season at the helm of the Great Dane program after coaching the University at Albany to its best season in DI history, going 27-4 with a perfect 16-0 conference record and winning a second-straight America East championship.

Abrahamson-Henderson, the 10th head coach in the UAlbany program's history, was previously the associate head coach at Indiana University. She also served as Missouri State University's head coach from 2002-07, leading that program to three NCAA Tournament appearances. In her coaching career, she has helped four different teams reach the NCAA Tournament and six reach postseason play.

The Great Danes dominated all conference opposition in the 2012-13 season with a 27-4 overall record, winning all games against America East opponents including 16 regular season games and all league championship contests. UAlbany became the first team to go undefeated in the America East and win the conference since the 1995-96 season. Abrahamson-Henderson earned America East Coach of the Year honors for her efforts. Ebone Henry was named the America East Co-Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year with 13.8 points, 5.1 rebounds and 2.8 steals per game, while Shereesha Richards was selected as the league's Co-Rookie of the Year with 10.2 points and 5.9 rebounds a game, shooting 61.1% off the bench. In addition, Julie Forster joined Henry on the All-Conference First Team, while Megan Craig and Lindsay Lowrie earned All-America East Third Team.

After posting a record turnaround in her first season with the Great Danes, Abrahamson-Henderson led UAlbany to its then-best record in Division I history in the 2011-12, going 23-10 overall. The Great Danes brought home their first-ever America East Conference title, and represented the league in the NCAA Tournament. UAlbany visited defending National Champions Texas A&M, and held with the Aggies for most of the game, showing how far the program has come in a short period of time.

Abrahamson-Henderson coached Ebone Henry to back-to-back America East Defensive Player of the Year honors. Henry was joined by Julie Forster on the All-Defensive Team, and both were All-Conference selections. Both Henry and Forster were named to the 2012-13 All-Conference Preseason Team, and the Great Danes were chosen to repeat as league champions, the first time UAlbany has been picked first in the preseason poll. Abrahamson-Henderson is also continuing a tradition of developing strong student-athletes, as Forster has earned a spot on two straight All-Academic Teams, and was named to the Capital One District I Academic All-America Team last season.

At Missouri State, she guided that program to three Missouri Valley Conference tournament championships, two MVC regular-season titles and three NCAA berths. The Bears, who also won the 2005 WNIT championship, posted a 95-61 record during her five seasons. In addition, she coached a pair of MVC players of the year, 11 all-conference honorees, two of the program's all-time leading scorers, three players who went on to professional careers, and 13 MVC scholar-athletes.

Abrahamson-Henderson and her husband, Michael, have two daughters, Savannah and Brooklyn. Michael also had a celebrated college basketball career and eventually played for the Harlem Globetrotters. He led Long Island-C.W. Post to a pair of NCAA Tournaments and scored 1,173 career points from 1981-84.

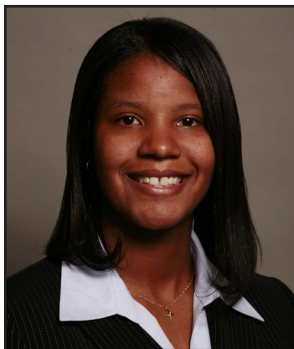

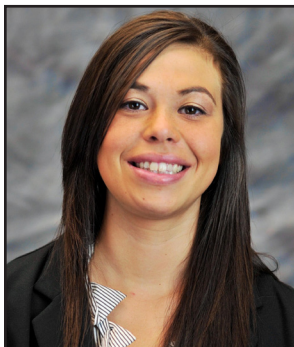
**Mary Grimes - 4th Season (Siena '03)**

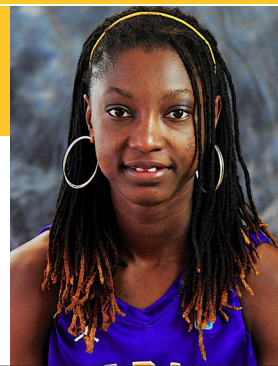

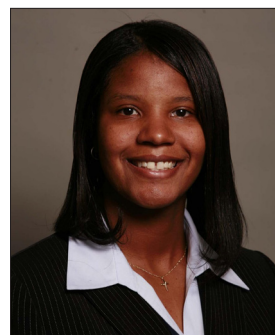
