#### **UALBANY OPENS 2014-15 SEASON IN PRESEASON WNIT**

The UAlbany women's basketball team will begin its 2014-15 campaign with one of the most prestigious in-season tournaments in the sport, tipping off against St. Francis Brooklyn to begin the Preseason WNIT on Friday, November 14th at 7 p.m. at the SEFCU Arena.

UAlbany, which received a vote in each the AP and USA Today Coaches Preseason Polls, is seeking its fourth consecutive America East title this season, going 28-5 last year with a 15-1 conference record in 2013-14. St. Francis Brooklyn finished fifth in the Northeast Conference last season, tallying a 19-11 overall record and a 10-8 league standing.

This is the eighth meeting all-time between the two schools, with UAlbany leading the all-time series 5-2. The Great Danes have won the last three games, including the last meeting in 2011 with a 50-31 win at the SEFCU Arena.

#### **UALBANY COMPETING IN THE PRESEASON WNIT**

For the first time, UAlbany will be competing in the Preseason WNIT, a 16-team regular season tournament featuring 14 teams with winning records, nine teams that went to the postseason in the 2013-14 season, including five NCAA and four Postseason WNIT teams, and five conference champions. All teams are guaranteed three games in the tournament.

#### **UALBANY - UNANIMOUS PICK TO FINISH FIRST** IN AMERICA EAST

For the third-consecutive year, UAlbany has been predicted to finish first in the America East in the preseason coaches poll. It is the second-straight year that UAlbany has been a unanimous selection to win the league, receiving all eight possible first place votes for a maximum 64 points.

Last season's runner-up Stony Brook placed second in the poll with 51 points. UNH, which received the other first-place vote, and Hartford tied for third with 46 points. Maine, UMBC, UMass Lowell, Vermont (tied with the previous in the poll) and Binghamton fill out the rest of the coaches poll.

#### **UALBANY RECEIVES VOTE IN NATIONAL PRE-SEASON POLLS**

The Great Danes have picked up a vote in each the AP Preseason Top 25 and the USA Today Preseason Coaches Poll. It is the first season that UAlbany has received votes in either poll to begin the year. UAlbany is the only America East team to have any votes in these polls.

#### SHEREESHA RICHARDS - PRESEASON ALL-AE

The reigning America East Player of the Year Shereesha Richards has been selected to the Preseason All-America East Team. It is her second-straight year earning preseason all-conference honors. Richards led the league in scoring and rebounding last year, averaging 20 points and 8.9 rebounds a contest.

#### **RICHARDS GOING FOR 1,000 POINTS**

Shereesha Richards is 26 points away from joining the 1,000 point club, standing with 974 after two seasons with UAlbany. She has averaged 15.2 points a game in her 64 games played, and, as of the season's start, has the highest scoring average in program history.

Richards currently ranks 11th all-time in UAlbany history, and fifth all time in UAlbany DI history, in scoring. Nine UAlbany players have earned over 1,000 points, led by Ebone Henry, who scored 1,642 from 2009-13.

Sarah Royals is also approaching the 1,000-point mark. The senior point guard stands with 701 points, averaging 7.2 a game in her career.

#### **UALBANY OPENS AT #6 IN MID-MAJOR POLL**

UAlbany opens the year at #6 in the College Insider Women's Mid-Major Top 25, marking its highest mid-major ranking at the start of the season. The team finished #4 in the mid-major poll last season, its highest ranking ever.

The Great Danes picked up 549 points in the poll. The team is the only ranked team from the America East, the highest ranked squad in the state of New York and third among mid-majors on the East Coast.

## UA DI ASSISTS LEADER ROYALS GOES FOR PROGRAM RECORD

**Sarah Royals** became UAlbany's Division I assists leader last year, tallying 157 assists, ranking #1 in the America East with that mark, to tally 315 in her collegiate career. To date, she stands 6th all-time in UAlbany women's basketball history in assists. She needs 60 assists to match the program record.

Currently the record is held by Samantha Ginsberg, who notched 375 assists from 1993 to 1997.

Royals is 17 assists away from tying for fifth all-time in UAlbany history with Kelly Paulino, who had 332 assists from 1995 to 1999.

#### RICHARDS ADDING TO UALBANY RECORDS

During her sophomore season, **Shereesha Richards** set a number of program records that she can add to in her future years.

Including 16 times last season, Richards set the UAlbany record for most 20+ point games with 18 total. She also earned the record for most double-doubles, combining for 13 in her career.

She has a chance to match another record for most 30+ point performances. She currently has two, with the record being three, set by Megan Buchanan from 1996 to 2000.

#### **RICHARDS - AE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

Leading the league in scoring, field goal percentage and rebounding, **Shereesha Richards** was honored as the 2013-14 America East Player of the Year. She averaged 20 points and 8.9 rebounds a game, shooting 62.4% from the field.

Richards earned numerous accolades during the season, including America East Championship Most Valuable Player, All-Conference First Team, All-Defensive Team and nine league Player of the Week honors.

#### **STREAKS**

**Shereesha Richards** was held without points in UAlbany's contest against Michigan State on November 21st, 2012 as a freshman, since then she has scored in the last 60 games.

**Sarah Royals** has dished out an assist in each of the past 65 games dating back to her freshman year, including the entirety of the the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons. Also, she has scored in her last 43 games dating back to February 2, 2013.

**Margarita Rosario** has notched an assist in her last 34 games, getting at least one in all 33 games of the 2013-14 season.

#### SCOUTING ST. FRANCIS BROOKLYN:

St. Francis Brooklyn, led by third-year head coach John Thurston, is coming off its winningest season in program history, going 19-11 last year, and was predicted to finish third in the Northeast Conference. The Terriers had the top ranked scoring defense in the NEC last year, allowing 62.1 points per game.

The team's leading scorer last season, 2nd-Team All-NEC senior guard Eilidh Simpson shoots 44% from the field, averaging 14 points a game. Senior forward Jaymee Veney led the Terriers in rebounding, earning 6.9 boards and 10.7 points a contest.

#### **GLOBETROTTING DANES**

The Great Danes sport players from four different countries: seven from the United States, two from Canada, and one each from Jamaica and Nigeria.

Of the USA players, five states, New York, Connecticut, Florida, Maine and Massachusetts are represented.

#### **ROAD WARRIORS**

The Great Danes have not lost a league road game in over three calendar years, winning all 24 America East games away from SEFCU in that span. The last time UAlbany fell in an AE road game was on February 26th, 2011, when the Great Danes were defeated by UMBC 62-55.

#### **UALBANY NAMES TEAM CAPTAINS**

Four players will serve as team captains for UAlbany this season. Margarita Rosario, Shereesha Richards and Sarah Royals, captains last season, will serve in the same capacity this season. Joining the ranks with the trio is Erin Coughlin, who will serve as a team captain for the first time.

#### THREE UALBANY WBB GAMES ON ESPN3

UAlbany is scheduled to play three America East games on ESPN3 this season.

--Jan. 3, 12 p.m.: UAlbany @ Maine --Feb. 18, 7 p.m.: UAlbany vs. UMBC --Feb. 22, 4 p.m.: UAlbany @ Stony Brook

In addition, the entire America East Tournament will be broadcast on the ESPN family of networks. There will be a possibility of more televised games. The America East will choose an "intriguing matchup" to put on ESPN3 on February 26th and March 1st; UAlbany has games on both days.

#### WELCOME HOME, BRIDGET

Former Bethlehem Central standout **Bridget Murphy** has returned to the Capital District to play for UAlbany. She spent the last year at Saint Francis (Pa.) University and will sit out the 2014-15 season due to NCAA transfer rules.

Murphy played in 31 games for the Red Flash, scoring 229 points and 95 assists and earning 11 double-digit scoring games that season.

She is the first player to be a Great Dane from the Capital District since Sarah Hayes from Rensselaer, who went to Columbia High, playing at UAlbany from 2005 to 2007.

#### EDWARDS, AIYALOGBE EARN SPELLMAN AWARD

**Cassandra Edwards** and **Bose Aiyalogbe** were honored in the spring with the Spellman Award for academic achievement.

The Spellman Awards honor high-achieving African, Latino, Asian and Native American heritage undergraduates in areas of academic achievement, community service and leadership.

#### **GOING FOR HISTORY**

The UAlbany women's basketball team will attempt to do something in the 2014-15 season that has only been done once in America East history, win the conference for the fourth consecutive time.

UAlbany has won the America East Tournament the past three seasons, becoming the first team to achieve that feat since Maine did.

Maine won four consecutive conference titles from 1995-98. The Black Bears were coached by Joanne Mc-Callie, who was assisted at Maine by Coach Abrahamson-Henderson from 1992-94.

The America East three-peat by UAlbany was the first time since Maine from 1996-98. The feat was previously done by Vermont from 1992-94 and Northeastern from 1984-86.

#### COACH ABE APPROACHING 100 UA WINS.....

UAlbany head coach **Katie Abrahamson-Henderson**, who has a 74.6% winning percentage at the helm of UAlbany, is just six victories away from 100 wins with the Great Danes, standing with 94. With UAlbany joining the Division I ranks in 1999, Coach Abe is the all-time leader in wins in the program's DI history.

#### ...200 WINS AS A HEAD COACH.....

Along with her five years at Missouri State, Coach Abe has amassed a 189-94 record as a head coach, just 11 wins away from 200. As a head coach, she has led her teams to six conference titles, including three America East and three Missouri Valley titles, and eight winning seasons in nine years.

#### ...AND UALBANY'S 200TH DI WIN

UAlbany has 197 wins since joining the Division I ranks, needing just three more to hit 200. The DI total record in total is 197-246. Since beginning the program for the 1964-65 season, UAlbany is just one win under .500 with a 551-552 record.

#### **COACH ABE - 84.6 CONFERENCE WIN %**

Coach Abe has led UAlbany to a 55-10 America East league record for a 84.6% conference winning percentage. That mark is second all-time in America East history, only behind Trish Roberts, who had an 89.8% winning percentage at Maine from 1988 to 1992.

In addition, with a 94-33 record, Coach Abe has a 74% winning percentage overall at UAlbany, ranking her second among America East coaches all-time. Only Maine's Peter Gavett is higher, who had a 81.3% winning percentage at Maine from 1984-88.

## COACH ABE - LONGEST CURRENT SUNY DI WBB COACH

Into her fifth season, Coach Abe is the current longesttenured women's basketball head coach among the DI State of New York (SUNY) system schools.

Second is Felisha Legette-Jack of Buffalo, going into her third season. Each Binghamton (Linda Cimino) and Stony Brook (Caroline McCombs) have first season coaches going into the 2013-14 season.

#### TOP DOGS OF THE EMPIRE STATE

Last season, the Great Danes went 8-2 against in-state opponents, earning victories over Siena, Marist, Colgate, Binghamton (three times) and Stony Brook (twice). All eight wins were by double digits.

This year, UAlbany will battle eight different New York teams up and down the state. Starting the year against St. Francis Brooklyn to open the Preseason WNIT, opponents include Marist on the road in a match of mid-major powers, Siena for the Albany Cup at the Times Union Center and two games each against the two conference rivals, Binghamton and Stony Brook.

#### Women's Basketball Nearly Knocks Off No. 2 West Virginia With Late Run, But Falls 76-61 In NCAA First Round

**BATON ROUGE** – The No. 15 seeded University at Albany women's basketball team scrapped and battled throughout Sunday's NCAA Tournament First Round game, nearly battling back from a 22-point deficit. However, in the end, the No. 2 West Virginia Mountaineers held off the Great Danes, winning by a score of 76-61.

"Well, obviously I'm very proud of them. I thought they competed completely until the end," said Head Coach Katie Abrahamson-Henderson. "They came out fighters, and finished as fighters, and I thought they represented the America East very proudly.

"I think West Virginia is a great team, but what it did for our team was prove to each and every one of them that they can play against anybody at any time, as long as you just fight and you play hard, and stick to our system. I think we did a great job," added Coach Abe.

In the game, junior Megan Craig scored a team-best 23 points with six rebounds, while classmate Sarah Royals also reached double figures with 14 points, two assists, and two steals. Facing early foul trouble, Shereesha Richards finished with nine points and six boards, while Margarita Rosario logged a game-high six assists and

three steals to go along with six points and four rebounds.

West Virginia had three players reach double figures, as Christal Caldwell notched 26 points, Bria Holmes scored 20, and Averee Fields totaled 10. Asya Bussie pulled down a game-high 12 boards.

Winning the tip, UAlbany took a 2-0 lead on the first play of the game, as Craig laid it in after a lob pass from Richards. Craig scored the Danes' first five points of the game, but the Mountaineers answered, taking a 10-5 lead at the 15:59 mark on a pair of free throws by Holmes.

After West Virginia stretched the margin to eight, Richards cut it back to six with a put-back, making the score 17-11 with 11:56 remaining in the first half. However, that is when the Mountaineers caught fire, exploding for a 15-0 run to take a 33-11 lead on Caldwell's three at the 6:57 mark.

Royals ended UAlbany's over five minute scoring drought with a jumper with 6:15 remaining. The Great Danes cut the deficit to 17 on Tammy Phillip's jumper from the left wing, but Holmes answered on the other end, completing a three-point play at the charity stripe. Phillip countered in the final minute, sinking a free throw before hitting a jumper on the break to send the Great Danes into the locker room trailing by 17, 42-25.

UAlbany began chipping away at the margin, as Craig and freshman Imani Tate both made a pair of baskets, Royals made two free throws, and Richards made a low post move, cutting WVU's lead down to single digits, 46-37, with 13:36 to go.

The Mountaineers built their advantage up to as much as 14 points, 56-42, with 9:04 on the clock, before the Great Danes went on a tear.

Rosario knocked down a three on a kick-out from Richards, and then stole the inbound pass, tossed the ball ahead to Royals who made the layup and got fouled for a three-point play with 7:53 remaining.

In West Virginia's next possession, Richards logged a steal, Rosario pulled down an offensive board and fed Craig in the post, cutting the margin to five, 56-51, with 6:58 on the clock.

Caldwell answered with a layup and a jumper, but the Danes hung around, as Richards powered to the hoop to stay within seven. However, she was charged with her fifth and final foul on the next play with four minutes left.

UAlbany got within eight, 65-57, on Craig's pair of free throws with 1:29 remaining, but when the Danes were forced to foul in an attempt to gain possession, West Virginia went 9-for-9 at the free throw line, putting the game out of reach.

## UAlbany Overhauls Saint Francis in Second Half for 50-34 Non-League Win at SEFCU Arena

**ALBANY, N.Y. –** Ebone Henry had 11 points and nine rebounds as UAlbany overcame a second-half deficit en route to a 50-34 non-conference victory over Saint Francis, N.Y. on Sunday, Nov. 27 at SEFCU Arena. The Great Danes snapped a three-game skid.

Saint Francis (1-4) took a 34-32 when Jessica Kaufman, who had 10 points, made a jumper in the lane with 8:45 remaining.

But the Great Danes held the visitors scoreless the rest of the way and in the process ran off 18 consecutive points. Henry connected on a three-point play that put her team ahead for good after she was fouled making a steal and a layup. The junior guard finished with a career-best eight steals.

The Great Danes' decisive run was fueled by the first appearance of the season by Megan Craig, a 6-foot-8 freshman from New Zealand. Craig canned a turnaround bank shot from left of the lane, before Cassandra Callaway made an elbow jumper and Julie Forster sank a 14-footer from the right. Adrienne Jones' free throw pushed the lead to double figures at 44-34 with 2:25 to play.

"It was an overall team effort," said UAlbany coach Katie Abrahamson-Henderson, whose team improved to 3-3. "We played a lot of people, we knew we had to keep everyone fresh. Megan (Craig) is such a presence defensively. Once they got inside, she is there to block the shot, so that forced them to the outside."

Saint Francis took a 23-21 lead to the intermission despite missing their opening nine field goal attempts. The Great Danes ran off nine straight points during the drought. Keyana Williams made two free throws and hit a jumper in the lane.

Jasmin Robinson, who had all 11 of her points in the first half, led the comeback. Her conventional three-point play sliced the deficit to 13-12, before Kaufman made a fadeaway from right of the lane to put her team ahead.

UAlbany later drew even at 21 apiece on Jones' two foul shots. Kim Snauwaert connected on a jump hook while moving across the lane to give her team a halftime lead.

"We knew we had to go hard, and that we had Megan to help in the back,' Henry offered. "She made us go harder defensively on the outside. We wanted to break our losing streak, so we were ready to do whatever it took."

Callaway scored nine points for the Great Danes, who held Saint Francis to 4-of-18 from the floor in the final period. The Terriers shot 30.8 percent overall. Forster, a 6-foot junior, added six points and nine rebounds, while Craig tallied six points in 10 minutes of action.

#### **UALBANY - THREE-TIME AMERICA EAST CHAMPION**



The University at Albany Great Danes women's basketball team has been the America East champion the past three years, combining to go 78-18 and winning 53 out of 56 games against conference opponents, including going 8-0 in the league tournament. UAlbany won its first three America East championships in those seasons.

In 2012, 2-seed UAlbany defeated UMBC 69-61 for its first-ever America East title. The next season, the Great Danes went undefeated in conference play, earning a 61-52 win over 2-seed Hartford for a second conference title. Then in 2014, 1-seed UAlbany avenged an earlier loss to 2-seed Stony Brook to win 70-46 and take a third-straight America East title.

In the 2012-13 season, UAlbany went a perfect 16-0 in the conference and won the tournament. The Great Danes were the first team to go undefeated in league play and win the tournament since Maine did in the 1995-96 season.

After graduating the top senior class in program history, UAlbany did not lose a beat as the Great Danes went 15-1 in the America East in the 2013-14 season and won its third-consecutive title. America East Player of the Year Shereesha Richards set a program record for single-season record for scoring, averaging 20 points a game. UAlbany became the first program to win three-straight America East titles since Maine did it from 1995-97.

In those three seasons, UAlbany has had some of its best players in program history. Ebone Henry graduated as the school's leading scorer and three-time America East Defensive Player of the Year. Julie Forster, a three-time all-conference player, finished as the program's all-time rebounder, and Lindsay Lowrie, who finished fifth all-time in program history in three-point shooting. Shereesha Richards may join that list with two years of eligibility remaining. Henry, Forster and Lowrie all graduated in 2013.

Taking the program reins, Shereesha Richards set a new season-scoring record in 2014, helped by Sarah Royals, who set a new single-season assists record the same year. Royals, Megan Craig and Margarita Rosario have been part of all three championships.

Katie Abrahamson-Henderson, a three-time America East Coach of the Year, enters her fifth season at the helm of the Great Dane program after leading UAlbany to three-consecutive America East titles with a combined 74-18 overall tally and 45-3 conference record in those three years.

Under Coach Abe's tenure, UAlbany won 38-consecutive America East regular season contests from Feb. 1, 2012 through Feb. 26, 2014, setting a new league record and holding the then-longest conference winning streak in all of Division I. The new streak surpassed the old record of 37-straight set by Maine from 1995-97 under coach Joanne P. McCallie, the mentor of Coach Abe at Maine and Michigan State.

Since the start of the 2010-11 season, UAlbany has had two America East Players of the Year, three AE Defensive Players of the Year, an AE Scholar-Athlete of the Year, an AE Rookie of the Year, six All-America East First Team selections, 11 total All-America East players, nine AE All-Defensive Team players and four AE All-Academic Team players.

Abrahamson-Henderson, the 10th head coach in the UAlbany program's history, was previously the associate head coach at Indiana University. She also served as Missouri State University's head coach from 2002-07, leading that program to three NCAA Tournament appearances. In her coaching career, she has helped four different teams reach the NCAA Tournament and six reach postseason play.

After losing its stellar four-person senior class the previous year, the 2013-14 Great Danes did not lose a beat, earning a three-peat as America East champion, going 28-5 with a 15-1 conference record. The team earned the 1-seed in the America East Tournament after winning its first 15 league games, defeating Binghamton, Hartford and Stony Brook in succession for the conference title. UAlbany got a 15-seed in the NCAAs and pushed 2-seed West Virginia to the brink before falling 76-61 in the NCAA First Round.

The Great Danes dominated all conference opposition in the 2012-13 season with a 27-4 overall record, winning all games against America East opponents including 16 regular season games and all league championship contests. UAlbany became the first team to go undefeated in the America East and win the conference since the 1995-96 season.

After posting a record turnaround in her first season with the Great Danes, Abrahamson-Henderson led UAlbany to its then-best record in Division I history in the 2011-12, going 23-10 overall. The Great Danes brought home their first-ever America East Conference title, and represented the league in the NCAA Tournament. UAlbany visited defending National Champions Texas A&M, and held with the Aggies for most of the game, showing how far the program has come in a short period of time.

At Missouri State, she guided that program to three Missouri Valley Conference tournament championships, two MVC regular-season titles and three NCAA berths. The Bears, who also won the 2005 WNIT championship, posted a 95-61 record during her five seasons. In addition, she coached a pair of MVC players of the year, 11 all-conference honorees, two of the program's all-time leading scorers and 13 MVC scholar-athletes.

Abrahamson-Henderson and her husband, Michael, have two daughters, Savannah and Brooklyn. Michael also had a celebrated college basketball career and played for the Harlem Globetrotters. He led Long Island-C.W. Post to a pair of NCAA Tournaments and scored 1,173 career points from 1981-84.


