UALBANY STARTS 2014 CAMPAIGN AT SYRACUSE

The University at Albany men's lacrosse team is set to begin its 2014 season, taking on in-state rival Syracuse at the Carrier Dome on Sunday, February 16th at 4 p.m.

This game features the two top ranked teams in the state of New York. UAlbany comes in ranked #10 in the USILA poll and #11 in the Warrior Media Poll, while Syracuse stands at #1 in the USILA and #2 in the Media Poll. Each won its conference last season, UAlbany taking the America East and Syracuse taking the Big East.

UAlbany will play its first game of the season after going 13-5 overall last year. Syracuse opened against another Capital District opponent on Monday, a 19-4 home win over Siena, to enter the season at 1-0.

Syracuse leads the overall series 10-1, with all games being played at the Carrier Dome. UAlbany won its first-ever game against Syracuse on a Miles Thompson double overtime goal on February 17th, 2013 to win 16-15.

UALBANY PREDICTED TO FINISH FIRST IN AMERICA EAST

In the preseason poll, reigning America East champion UAlbany was predicted to finish first in the conference in 2014. The Great Danes earned five first-place votes for a maximum 25 possible points.

Stony Brook is predicted to finish second with 21 points, followed by UMBC, Binghamton, Hartford and Vermont.

LYLE THOMPSON- PRESEASON DI PLAYER OF THE YEAR

After scoring a DI-best 113 points last season to lead UAlbany's attack, **Lyle Thompson** was selected as the *Inside Lacrosse* and *Lacrosse Magazine* Division I Preseason Player of the Year.

Thompson was named the Lt. Col. J.L. (Jack) Turnbull Award for the top attackman in college lacrosse last season after earning 50 goals and 63 assists last season. He led the NCAA with 6.65 points per game.

With the honor, Thompson became the first-ever University at Albany athlete to earn a United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) yearly award for a top position player.

THOMPSON TRIO - PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

Lyle Thompson, Miles Thompson and Ty Thompson

all earned Preseason All-America status in the *Inside Lacrosse Face-Off Yearbook*.

In the yearbook, Lyle, who was the publication's DI Preseason Player of the Year, was placed on the Preseason First Team. Miles is on the Third Team while Ty is Honorable Mention.

All three were All-American attackman last season, with Lyle getting First Team and Miles and Ty getting Honorable Mention.

TOP SCORING OFFENSE IN 2013

UAlbany lit up the scoreboard against opponents in 2013, earning an NCAA DI-best 15.94 goals per game, almost one-and-a-half goals more than second place Cornell.

In addition, the Great Danes had the top shooting percentage in DI at 36% and was also #1 in assists and points per game, adding the 4th-ranked man up offense.

Led by the three Thompsons at attack, which combined for 147 goals and 107 assists, UAlbany scored 287 goals in 18 games last season. Nine of the top 10 point-scorers on the team return for the 2014 season.

BRINGING BACK THE DEFENSE

UAlbany returns the core of last season's defense, led by three All-America East players. The unit returns the starting goalkeeper and two long sticks and will look to replace a pair of starters and improve a defense that allowed 12.44 goals a game last year.

One of the top freshmen goalkeepers in the country last season, **Blaze Riorden** earned All-America East Second Team and All-Rookie Team honors after having a 49.1% save percentage in 18 starts, allowing 11.93 goals per game.

Helping protect the game includes all-conference first team member **Jon Newhouse**, who led the America East with 22 caused turnovers, adding 44 ground balls. Also in the unit is All-America East Second Team and All-Academic Team member **Cody Futia**, who started all 18 games last year, and senior **Doug Eich**, who had 31 ground balls and was named team captain of the defense for the 2014 season.

UALBANY RANKED #10 IN USILA COACHES POLL, HIGHEST PRESEASON RANKING SINCE 2008

After going 13-5 last season and winning the America East, UAlbany was placed 10th in the United States Intercollegiate Association Preseason Coaches Poll and 11th in the Warrior Media DI Poll. It is the highest preseason rankings that UAlbany has had since 2008.

In 2008, the Great Danes were ranked #11 in the USILA poll and #12 by *Inside Lacrosse* at the start of the season after going 15-3 the previous year.

The highest UAlbany has ever been ranked by the USILA is #2, earning the position in 2007 and holding that ranking for six weeks. The Great Danes won the America East this season and got to the NCAA Quarterfinals. That year, the team was ranked #20 by the USILA at the start of the season.

SCOUTING THE SYRACUSE ORANGE:

Syracuse finished as the NCAA runner-up last season and comes into this year ranked #1 in the USILA poll after going 16-4 last season. The Orange go into its first year as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

On the offensive end, the Orange finished 14th in DI last season with 11.5 goals a game, returning nearly 70% of its production from last year. Junior attackman Kevin Rice leads all returners with 55 points last season and had an eight-assist game against Siena. Many of those assists helped redshirt sophomore attackman Dylan Donohue earn eight goals plus an assist against Siena, finishing with 41 points in 2013.

The other end, senior goalie Dominic Lamolinara helped Syracuse finish 14th in DI in scoring defense, having a 52.6% save percentage and allowing 8.65 goals a game. Leading the defense is LSM Matt Harris, the 21st overall pick in the MLL Draft. Harris finished with 29 caused turnovers and 52 ground balls last year.

UALBANY SEASON OPENERS

In its Division I history, UAlbany is 5-9 in its season openers. Last season, the Great Danes defeated Syracuse 16-15 in double overtime for its first win in a season opener since the 2007 season, snapping a five-game losing streak in such season openers. This will be the third consecutive year that UAlbany opens at Syracuse.

GREAT DANES SELECT DOUG EICH, JIMMY HAUGEN TEAM CAPTAINS

UAlbany selected two of its veterans, **Doug Eich** and **Jimmy Haugen**, to be their team captains for the 2014 season.

A senior defenseman and LSM, Eich has played in 35 games in his UAlbany career. Last season he scooped up 31 ground balls and caused five turnovers, scoring three goals.

A fixture in UAlbany's midfield, Haugen enters his redshirt senior year after scoring five points and scooping seven ground balls last year.

MILES THOMPSON - 37-GAME POINT STREAK

Miles Thompson has been a scoring machine for the Great Danes, earning at least a point in each of his past 37 games, the third-longest active streak in the country. The streak started on March 26, 2011 against Bucknell. In the 37 games, Thompson has scored 167 points.

MILES, TY THOMPSON DRAFTED INTO MLL

On January 10, Miles Thompson and Ty Thompson were drafted by the Rochester Rattlers in the 2014 Major League Lacrosse Entry Draft. Miles was selected 20th overall in the third round, while Ty was picked 28th overall in the fourth round.

The two are the 12th and 13th Great Danes to be drafted into the MLL and first since Joe Resetarits was taken by the Hamilton Nationals in 2012.

LASDA BROTHERS TO PLAY FOR TEAM LATVIA

UAlbany newcomers **Riley Lasda** and **Eli Lasda** have joined the Latvian National Team, giving a five-year commitment to the squad.

Riley, who transferred to UAlbany after two years at Penn State, and Eli, who joins after playing high school lacrosse at nearby Ithaca, have Latvian roots through their father. The two will compete for Latvia in the 2014 World Championship in Denver this summer.

ERIC WOLF TO ASSIST TEAM ISRAEL

UAlbany assistant coach and offensive coordinator **Eric Wolf** will serve in the same capacity with the Israeli National Team for the upcoming 2014 World Championship. A former player for Team Israel, Wolf will be working under head coach Bill Beroza.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK

Home is where the heart is for UAlbany, drawing on the home state for most of its roster. Of its 45-man roster, 32 players hail from the state of New York.

From the USA, other states represented on UAlbany's roster include Connecticut, Florida, Massachusetts, New Jersey and Ohio. The team also has three players from Canada.

The team's diversity is represented on its helmet. Each UAlbany helmet has three flags on the back, representing the United States, Canada and the Iroquois Six Nations.



THOMPSONS APPROACHING RECORDS

After combining for 254 points in their first season as a starting attack unit last year, the Thompson trio has a chance to smash numerous UAlbany records in 2014.

Miles Thompson is currently seventh in UAlbany history in career points with 171, 73 behind the all-time leader Merrick Thomson (2004-07) with 244. Brother **Lyle Thompson** is 12th on the UAlbany career points list with 151.

Each are climbing the career assists list as well. Lyle is sixth at 79, earning a UAlbany single season record 63 last year, while Miles is tied for eighth at 67. The record is held by Luke Daquino (2002-05), who had 131 in his career.

Ty Thompson is going for career goals, standing fourth with 113 in his career. Miles is at eighth at 107. The leader in Thomson, who got 188.

LAST TIME OUT...

Denver Outlasts UAlbany, 19-14, In NCAA First Round Contest

DENVER – Despite a 14-point performance by the Thompson trio, the University at Albany fell to the No. 4 seed Denver, 19-14, on Saturday, May 11 at Peter Barton Stadium. The Great Danes finish the 2013 season 13-5, while the Pioneers improve to 13-4 and face No. 5 seed North Carolina in the NCAA Quarterfinals.

Albany (13-5) jumped out to an early 3-1 lead with 6:07 left in the first stanza. Lyle Thompson wasted very little time, scoring two minutes and 35 seconds in. Following Denver's Sean Cannizzaro goal, Miles Thompson set up both Mike Woods and Ty Thompson for back-to-back goals.

Denver (13-4) responded back with two goals to end the quarter and tie the game, 3-3. Wesley Berg and Eric Law each tallied their first goals of the game to equalize the contest. Tim Cox opened up the second with a top-shelf goal from eight yards out to grab the Great Danes second lead of the game, 4-3, with 12:13 left in the half. The Pioneers' Berg exploded with four of the team's six

second-quarter goals to grab a 9-5 lead with 1:29 remaining. Then the Great Danes' Thompsons Lyle connected with Miles before the half ended to stay within striking distance, 9-6.

Down three at the half, Cox started off the Great Dane offense in the third quarter the same way as the second with his second goal of the contest and cut the deficit.

Berg came back for the Pioneers, scoring two more goals within 30 seconds to extend the Denver lead to four, 12-8.

UAlbany's long-stick defender Jon Newhouse caught a pass from teammate Matt Garziano from half and took the rest of the way. Then Lyle, fromt five-yards out, scored 50 seconds later to close the gap to two, 12-10.

However, the Pioneers struck three more times in the final 1:55 of the half and pushed their lead to five, 15-10.

The Great Danes did not go away, tallying four of the next five goals and cut the deficit to three, 17-14, with 9:45 left. Derrick Eccles, Garziano and Thompsons' Lyle and Ty helped out in the scoring run. But the Pioneer defense was too much, holding the Great Dane offense scoreless for the final 9:45 to move forward.

UAlbany Men's Lacrosse Upsets #13 Syracuse, 16-15, in Double Overtime to Kick Off 2013

SYRACUSE, N.Y. -- It was a fitting Thompson-to-Thompson ending, as Lyle passed the ball to Miles, who found the back of the net with 3:03 to play in the second overtime, giving UAlbany men's lacrosse its first-ever win over Syracuse. The Great Danes defeated the 13th-ranked Orange, 16-15, in the 2013 season opener for both programs. It was just the second overtime game in 11 meetings between the two teams, and the first double-overtime contest. It was the first season-opening loss for the Orange since 1996.

Miles scored the Great Danes' first goal, while Lyle assisted Ty at 10:23 to give UAlbany a 2-0 lead over the Orange. UAlbany kept it going with a goal by Will Fuller before Ty Thompson connected on a behind-the-back shot to push the Great Dane lead to 4-0 with 6:56 to play in the first quarter. Syracuse ended the UAlbany rally at 5:13 on a goal by Derek Maltz, but UAlbany pushed the lead to 5-1 at 3:03,

UAlbany found the back of the net to start the third quar-

ter, as Ryan Feuerstein took an assist from Matt Garziano at 14:30. However, Syracuse responded two minutes later, as Marasco netted his second goal of the day to cut the UAlbany lead to 9-6, with 12:58 to play. The Orange cut the Great Dane lead to two, 9-7, with just over nine minutes to play in the third, and pulled within one, 9-8, less than a minute later, as Ward, then Kevin Rice scored for Syracuse.

The Great Danes got a goal from Ty Thompson, with an assist from Fuller, to push the lead back to four, 14-10, at 13:51 of the fourth period. Ryan Barber scored an unassisted goal at 11:15 to pull back within two, and the Orange cut it back to one at 8:49 on a tally by Dylan Donahue. Stenberg netted his first of the season at 7:25 to push the lead back to 15-13, but Donahue struck again for the Orange at 4:21 to pull back within one, and then completed a trifecta off an assist from Marasco to tie the game at 15-15 with just under three minutes to play.

Syracuse dominated the first overtime period, taking five shots – three on goal, all stopped by Blaze Riorden – to UAlbany's zero. The Great Danes won the faceoff to start the second OT, and Lyle found Miles in front of the net for the sudden victory goal.

UAlbany Head Coach Scott Marr

14th Year at UAlbany

2002, 2007 and 2013 America East Coach of the Year



Scott Marr begins his 14th season as UAlbany's head coach. The only coach in the Division I era of the University at Albany, Marr, a three-time America East Coach of the Year, has coached the Great Danes to five America East championships and five appearances in the NCAA Tournament. He has a 108-95 career record at UAlbany and has coached 11 All-Americans, two Tewaaron finalists, a Lt. Col. J.L. Turnbull Award winner for the best Attackman in the nation and 69 all-conference players.

2013 saw the Great Danes have their best season since '07, going 13-5 with a perfect 5-0 conference record, winning the America East and a subsequent berth in the NCAA Tournament. The team earned victories over ranked opponents Syracuse, Johns Hopkins and UMass and finished with a #12 ranking. UAlbany had the best offense in the country with 15.94 goals a game, over a goal more than the second place school, and scored in double digits in 16 of their 18 games. Marr was honored as the America East Coach of the Year for the third time. Lyle Thompson led all of Division I with 6.65 points per game, finishing with 50 goals and 63 assists, earning a Tewaaron finalist honor, the Lt. Col. J.L. Turnbull Award for the best attackman in Division I lacrosse and America East Player of the Year. The three Thompson brothers were all honored as All-Americans. In total, nine players earned all-conference honors, including Lyle Thompson, Miles Thompson and Jon Newhouse earning America East All-Conference First Team, and three more on the conference's All-Rookie Team.

In the 2012 season, the Great Danes reached their second straight - ninth overall - America East Conference Championship game. Senior attackman Joe Resetarits was named the 2012 America East Conference Men's Lacrosse Player of the Year, and was joined on the all-conference first team by senior long stick defender Travis Lyons. Sophomore attackman Miles Thompson, sophomore midfielder Cody Futia and senior faceoff specialist Keith Olson were all-conference second team honorees. Freshmen Mike Miller, Will Stenberg and Lyle Thompson all garnered all-rookie team accolades, while senior Daley Baker earned a spot on the all-academic squad.

As an assistant on Dick Edell's Maryland staff for six years, Marr served as both assistant coach and offensive coordinator. Maryland made five NCAA Tournament appearances during that period and was the Division I national runner-up in 1995, 1997 and 1998. The Terrapins shattered the school's single-season scoring record with 236 goals when the program captured the '98 Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season and tournament titles. Maryland's attack averaged 12.5 goals under Marr's direction from 1995-2000. All-Americans Matt Hahn and Andrew Whipple became two of the most storied scorers in school history.

Marr began his coaching career as the University of Delaware's offensive coordinator, where he worked with the school's all-time leading scorer Anthony DiMarzo. From 1992-94, the Blue Hens captured three consecutive North Atlantic Conference championships and earned a top-20 national ranking in each season. Marr was also an assistant on the United States team that won the 1999 World Cup.

As a collegiate player at Johns Hopkins University, Marr was an attackman on the 1987 national championship squad and the '89 national runner-up team. The Blue Jays garnered four straight NCAA berths during his career. He received a B.S. in social and behavioral sciences in 1991.

A native of Yorktown, N.Y., Marr was a high school All-American who twice led his team to the state's semifinal round. He and his wife, Traci, a special education teacher, have three children, Kyle, Jordyn and Keeley.
