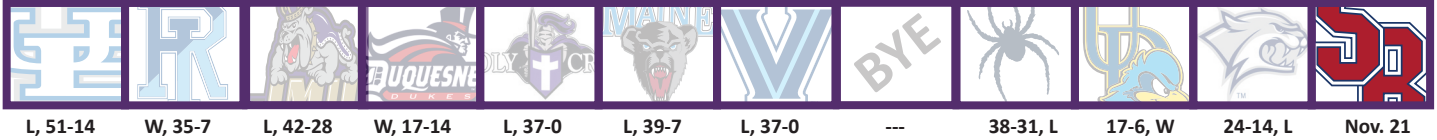

In the last five years, the senior class has led UAlbany to two Northeast Conference championships, the University's first FCS Playoff appearance (against Stony Brook in 2011), 28 wins, and successfully transitioned the team into the highly competitive CAA.

LAST TIME OUT

On a celebratory night honoring both the nation's veterans and the squad's 10 seniors, UAlbany suffered a 24-14 defeat to the University of New Hampshire after falling behind 10-0 in the first quarter. With the loss, the Great Danes fell to 3-7 overall and 2-5 in conference play, while the Wildcats improved to 6-4 on the season and 4-3 in the CAA. UAlbany totaled 360 yards of offense led by freshman quarterback Neven Sussman's 136 passing yards (9-23-1) and 75 rushing yards with a touchdown run. Freshman running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks led the ground game with 86 rushing yards on 13 carries, while redshirt freshman Elliot Croskey totaled 58 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries. Redshirt sophomore Brad Harris recorded a team-high three receptions for 63 yards. Defensively, redshirt freshman DaSharnte Thompson logged a career-high 12 tackles, including nine solo, and recovered a fumble. Jamal Robinson also topped his career-best with 11 tackles (10 solo), while Jamal Merritt brought down nine (8 solo), forced a fumble, and picked off a pass for 12 yards.

UALBANY, STONY BROOK SERIES

Saturday's meeting will mark the 17th in program history between Stony Brook and UAlbany. Playing each other for 13 consecutive years between 1995 and 2007, the Great Danes won six straight in the span (1996-2001). The rivals also met in the 2011 NCAA Division I FCS Playoffs after Stony Brook captured the Big South Conference title and UAlbany won the Northeast Conference automatic bid. Stony Brook stole a 31-28 win in the nail-biter, intercepting a tipped pass in the back of the end zone with 47.4 seconds remaining. Both joining the CAA for the 2013 season, Stony Brook won the first "Empire Clash," 24-3, at Kenneth P. LaValle Stadium, marking the last game in the Bob Ford coaching era. Last season, UAlbany topped the Seawolves 27-17 in the 2014 finale at home.

SCOUTING STONY BROOK

Stony Brook enters the weekend with a 5-4 overall record and 2-5 mark in the CAA. The Seawolves come off two straight wins over Howard (14-9) and Rhode Island (19-17). The win over the Rams marked the 100th of Head Coach Chuck Priore's career. Priore is a 1982 graduate from UAlbany and started his coaching career under Bob Ford's tutelage at his alma mater. The Seawolves are led offensively by senior Conor Bednarski who has totaled 701 passing yards and five touchdowns (64-128-1) and receiver Ray Bolden's four touchdown catches and 653 receiving yards on 57 receptions. In the ground game, Donald Liotine

pilots the squad with four touchdowns and 505 rushing yards on 126 carries. Defensively, the Seawolves lead the CAA, holding opponents to just 260.1 yards per game.

LAST TIME VS. THE SEAWOLVES (Nov. 22, 2014)

Capping his tenure with a career-long 68-yard touchdown run in the closing minutes of Nov. 22nd's in-state rivalry game versus Stony Brook, redshirt senior running back Omar Osbourne led UAlbany to a 27-17 victory over the visiting Seawolves. With the win, UAlbany finished its first season under Head Coach Greg Gattuso with a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA. Meanwhile, Stony Brook dropped to 5-7 on the season and 4-4 in conference play. Osbourne totaled 166 rushing yards and a touchdown in his final game donning purple and gold, carrying the ball 24 times. Redshirt senior Will Fiacchi totaled 135 passing yards and a touchdown, taking sole possession of first-place all-time and raising the record to 7,150 yards. Senior Cole King led the receiving corps with five catches and 72 receiving yards, ending his career ranked second all-time for receptions (148) receiving yards (2,217), and touchdown catches (18) at UAlbany. True freshman wide receiver Josh Gontarek recorded his first rushing touchdown of his career on a 13-yard run, while also snagging three receptions for a total of 14 yards. He finished his rookie campaign with a team-high nine touchdowns. Redshirt freshman Brad Harris also had three catches, accruing 33 yards. Defensively, junior Kyle Sakowski led the Great Danes with two interceptions and a fumble force and recovery. In addition, he added four tackles, including one for a loss. Redshirt sophomore Michael Nicastro recorded a game-high 10 tackles (4 solo) and also had an interception, while T.J. Idowu followed with eight tackles (4 solo).

ALSTON BREAKS KICKOFF RETURN RECORD

With 35 kickoff returns this season, freshman Dione Alston broke the UAlbany program record for returns in a season, previously held by Kevin Chillis (34) in 2013. Alston has averaged 22.7 yards per return, totaling 796 yards for a UAlbany FCS program record. Alston needs just 30 more yards on kickoff return to break

the all-time single-season record set by Ben Alston (825 on 31 returns) in 1990.

ALSTON NAMED TO CFPA KICKOFF RETURN WATCH LIST

Freshmen kickoff return Dione Alston has been named to the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) FCS Kickoff Return Team Watch List. In his rookie season, Alston has recorded 796 yards on kickoff, averaging 22.7 yards per carry, including a season-long 96-yard touchdown return against Richmond.

IBITOKUN-HANKS NAMED TO CFPA FRESHMAN PERFORMER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Freshman running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks has been named to the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) FCS National Freshman Performer of the Year Watch List. Ibitokun-Hanks leads UAlbany's rushing game with 585 rushing yards on 98 carries, and two touchdowns. The freshman from Newark, N.J. has been named the CAA Rookie of the Week twice this season.

ROBERSON CLIMBS SINGLE-SEASON RECEPTIONS LADDER

With 43 catches this season, freshman wide receiver Zee Roberson ranks 14th all-time in program history for single-season receptions. To break the top-10, Roberson needs six more receptions to tie Chris Phillis' 49 (2000). The single-season record is 67 held by Tim Bush (2008).

HOSKINS NAMED CAA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore defensive end Malachi Hoskins has been named the CAA Defensive Player of the Week, announced Monday by the conference office. Hoskins piloted UAlbany's dominant defense that led the Great Danes to a 17-6 win at Delaware. In addition, Hoskins earned the same honor from College Sports Madness.

HOSKINS NOTES: Led UAlbany's defense that held Delaware to just two field goals, and that forced six fumbles and allowed a season-low 224 yards of offense ... Hoskins recorded a career-best nine tackles (7 solo), including two sacks for a loss of 14 yards, and four tackles that set the Blue Hens back 20 total yards ... Also forced a fumble on a sack and broke up a pass.

CROOK RUSHES TO HELP DANES

After starter Neven Sussman was injured in the first quarter, redshirt sophomore quarterback D.J. Crook served as a major spark in UAlbany's win over Delaware. Crook rushed for a career-high 134 yards on 13 carries, including a career-long 63-yard scamper. He also threw for 27 yards and a touchdown, completing 4-of-11 passes, and averaged 10.3 yards per carry.

IBITOKUN-HANKS BOASTS BACK-TO-BACK BIG WEEKS

Freshman Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks rushed for over 100 yards for the second straight week, leading UAlbany to a win over Delaware with 135 rushing yards on a career-high 28 carries. He had a long run of 37 yards and averaged 4.8 yards per carry.

DOUBLE TROUBLE ON THE GROUND

With Ibitokun-Hanks' 135 rushing yards and D.J. Crook's 134 at Delaware, the performance marked the first time two UAlbany players have rushed for over 100 yards since Sept. 1, 2013 when running backs Drew Smith (174) and Omar Osbourne (113) did so in the 37-34 win over Colgate.

CORY PARKER SCORES FIRST TD

Redshirt sophomore fullback Cory Parker recovered a fumbled punt in the end zone that gave UAlbany the lead for good against Delaware. The touchdown marked the first in his career. Parker also downed a kickoff return in the victory. Parker's brother former UAlbany tight end Brian Parker made his NFL debut with the Kansas City Chiefs last Sunday and was in the stands at Delaware to support his brother.

ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

UAlbany is a member of the America East Conference in 17 of 19 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, and football, a Division I FCS program, is an associate member of the Colonial Athletic Association.

UAlbany has won 85 conference championships and has made 39 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes have won eight or more conference titles in each of the last five years. So far in 2015-16, UAlbany has won America East championships in field hockey and women's soccer.

In 2014-15, UAlbany competed in a school-record six NCAA Tournaments, while winning nine conference championships, and was one of three universities in the country to have its men's basketball, women's basketball, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, field hockey, and women's golf teams make NCAA Division I Tournament appearances -- the others were Duke and North Carolina. In addition, field hockey's run to the Final Four was a first for any SUNY school, while Paula Heuser was named the National Player of the Year. UAlbany is also home to Lyle Thompson, the only back-to-back Tewaaraton Award winner -- an honor given to the best collegiate lacrosse player in the country.

Including Thompson, UAlbany has had 11 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft, eight players have been drafted by Major League Baseball, while 12 football players have inked NFL contracts.

TOOLE GETS 100th CAREER POINT

With a 28-yard field goal and two PATs, senior placekicker Patrick Toole hit the 100-point milestone at Delaware. In his two-season career with the Great Danes, Toole has totaled 103 points, making 58-of-59 PAT attempts and 15-of-24 field goals with a career-long of 52-yards -- a UAlbany FCS record. Toole is the seventh kicker in program history to score 100 points.

PARKER MAKES NFL DEBUT IN LONDON

Former UAlbany tight end Brian Parker made his NFL debut with Kansas City on Sunday, helping the Chiefs to a 45-10 trouncing of Detroit. The game was played at Wembley Stadium in London. Parker made a key block on De'Anthony Thomas' 10-yard touchdown run that gave the Chiefs the lead for good in the first quarter.

ALSTON'S BIG RETURN

Freshman Dione Alston sparked UAlbany's second half rally at No. 6/8 Richmond with a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown -- the first of three straight touchdowns for the Great Danes. Alston's 96-yarder was the second-longest return in program history, and first kickoff return for a TD since 2012. Alston totaled 179 yards on kickoff, returning every kickoff for at least 20 yards.

UALBANY MEETS 31st RANKED TEAM

The Halloween meeting with No. 6/8 Richmond marked the 31st time UAlbany has played against an FCS ranked opponent. The Great Danes have played at least one ranked opponent every season since 2002. UAlbany's last win over a ranked opponent was on Sept. 22, 2012. The Danes beat Maine, who ranked #23 in the Sports Network Top-25 Poll and #22 in the FCS Coaches Poll. UAlbany owns a 5-23 record against ranked foes.

MILITARY APPRECIATION DAY

In conjunction with Military Appreciation Day and third annual Todd J. Clark Memorial Game, UAlbany honored those who have served our country with personal recognition on the squad's game-worn uniforms. Each player had the name of a veteran on the back of his jersey -- a mixture of servicemen and servicewomen, active, retired, and those killed in action.

TURNOVERS GALORE

In back-to-back weeks, the Danes forced six turnovers, which both tie a single-game program record -- At James Madison (9/19), UAlbany logged a program-record five interceptions and a fumble recovery; In the win over Rhode Island

(9/12), the Great Danes recovered four fumbles and intercepted the ball twice. Prior to this season, the last time UAlbany forced the opposition to turn the ball over six times was against Towson on Sept. 1, 2001. UAlbany currently ranks fifth in the CAA for turnover margin (+3).

ATHLETICS RECEIVES \$10 MILLION GIFT

UAlbany President Robert J. Jones, Foundation President George R. Hearst III and Athletic Director Mark Benson announced Oct. 8th that the University received a \$10 million gift to support the football stadium and other facilities, expand scholarships for student-athletes, and address additional priorities in athletics. The gift was made by The Bernard and Millie Children's Foundation, which was established by the son of Bernard and Millie Duker, William Duker '75, of Westerlo and New York City, his wife Sharon (Casey) Duker, and their son William "West" Duker. The stadium is now named Tom & Mary Casey Stadium, in honor of Sharon (Casey) Duker's parents.

1985 FOOTBALL TEAM, DMITRENKO INDUCTED INTO UALBANY ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

On Sept. 26, UAlbany inducted Blair Buchanan (Volleyball, 2003-06), Amber

Maisonet (Softball, 2005-08), Scott Dmitrenko (Football, 1984-85), and the 1985 football team into the Athletics Hall of Fame.

Scott Dmitrenko (Football, 1984-85)

A two-year member of the UAlbany football team, Scott Dmitrenko led the 1985 Great Danes to the ECAC North Championship title. A product of Shenendehowa High School, Dmitrenko recorded 123 tackles (34 solo) in the 1985 season, which currently ranks 10th all-time in the program's record book. In the ECAC Championship game versus Plymouth State, Dmitrenko totaled 14 tackles and made a key 4th-and-1 stop that garnered the linebacker ECAC Defensive Player of the Week honors. After graduation, Dmitrenko went on to compete professionally in the Arena Football League. As a member of the Pittsburgh Gladiators, he played in the inaugural Arena Bowl in 1987.

1985 Football Team

Under the direction of head coach Bob Ford, the 1985 University at Albany football team rallied from a three-touchdown deficit to capture a 33-21 victory over Plymouth State in the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) North Championship. With a 9-2 overall record on the season, the Great Danes ended Plymouth's 28-game home win streak. The '85 team boasted offensive and defensive units that were nationally ranked, and featured five Pizza Hut and one Associated Press All-America players. UAlbany chalked up three shutouts on the season and held opponents scoreless in the second half in six of 11 games. Celebrating the feat's 30-year anniversary, the 1985 team marked the second football team to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, joining the undefeated 1974 squad.

The Danes totaled 354 yards of offense led by DJ Crook's 191 passing yards, completing 19-of-27 attempts, while also accounting for three touchdowns (one rushing, two passing). Elliot Croskey added 141 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 33 carries, while Gontarek led the receivers with five receptions, 51 yards and a touchdown. WEEK 3 SUMMARY -- AT #12 JAMES MADISON

Forcing six turnovers for the second straight game, including a program-record five interceptions, UAlbany startled No. 12 James Madison Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium, but in the end succumbed to a 42-28 defeat. After a wild first half that featured four picks by the Great Danes, including one on the first play of the game, the squads went into halftime with a 14-14 score. True freshman running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks broke away for a career-high 202 rushing yards on 25 carries, including two 40+ yard runs. The performance marked the most yards by a UAlbany player since 2013. Making his debut in the starting role, freshman quarterback Neven Sussman totaled 170 passing yards (14-34-4) and threw his first two career touchdown passes finding tight end Anthony Manzo-Lewis both times in the end zone. Freshman Zee Roberson caught a team-high four passes for 29 yards, followed by Brad Harris' three receptions for 64 yards. Defensively, the Great Danes were led by redshirt freshman Julian Cox's 14 tackles (11 solo), while DaSharnte Thompson (4 solo) and Samuel Gray (3 solo) each brought down eight. Forcing four turnovers, Jamal Robinson, Jamal Merritt, and Jojo McClary each logged an interception and Jack Forster picked up a fumble recovery.

WEEK 10 SUMMARY -- AT DELAWARE

With 14 straight points to close the contest, UAlbany overcame Delaware 17-6 in front of a homecoming crowd of 15,318, last Saturday at Delaware Stadium. With the win, the Great Danes improved to 3-6 overall and 2-4 in CAA play, while the Blue Hens fell to have the same record. The victory marked the first over Delaware since 2006 when the Danes upset Joe Flacco's Blue Hens 17-10. UAlbany's defense had its best performance yet, holding Delaware to a season-low 224 yards of offense while recovering three fumbles and knocking six loose. In addition, the six points allowed marked the program's best effort since shutting out Central Connecticut on Sept. 6, 2014. Malachi Hoskins led the way with nine tackles (7 solo), including two sacks, a forced fumble, and four tackles for a loss of 20 total yards. Jack Forster followed with eight tackles (5 solo) with a sack and a blocked field goal. Offensively, the Great Danes accrued a season-high 262 rushing yards on 50 attempts, led by freshman running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks' 135 yards on 28 carries. After starter Neven Sussman was knocked out of the game from an injury on a late hit in the first quarter, redshirt sophomore quarterback D.J. Crook served as a major spark, rushing for a career-high 134 yards on 13 carries, including a career-long 63-yard scamper. Crook also threw for 27 yards and a touchdown, completing 4-of-11 passes.

UALBANY LOSES "HEART AND SOUL OF DEFENSE"

At Buffalo, redshirt junior captain Mike Nicastro suffered a season-ending knee injury in the second quarter. The linebacker was a third-team All-CAA selection in 2014, totaling 120 tackles.

KETTER, MORRISON, NICASTRO, WIERBINSKI, & EIGHT-YEAR-OLD LUKE HOAG NAMED 2015 TEAM CAPTAINS

Head Coach Greg Gattuso and the UAlbany football program named Nic Ketter, Neil Morrison, Michael Nicastro, Adam Wierbinski, and eight-year-old Luke Hoag as team captains for the 2015 season. The captains were chosen based on votes by the Great Dane players and coaches.

NIC KETTER, RJR., TE, QUEENSBURY, N.Y. -- Ketter is sidelined this fall due to a torn ACL he suffered during spring season. In his sophomore campaign, the tight end from Queensbury, N.Y. native played in all 12 games, recording eight receptions for 131 yards and two touchdowns.

GATTUSO ON KETTER: "Nic Ketter has the emotion and the fire. Even though he's hurt the kids still voted him as a captain. They respect him a great deal. He's a hardnosed football player and brings a lot of emotion to the game."

MICHAEL NICASTRO, RJR., LB, CLARKSVILLE, MD. -- Nicastro was named to the Third-Team All-CAA Defense in 2014, ranking third in the CAA with 120 tackles (54 solo), averaging 10.0 per game. He also totaled three sacks for a loss of eight total yards. Nicastro played in every contest the last two seasons, starting all 12 as a redshirt sophomore.

GATTUSO ON NICASTRO: "Nicastro is the strong silent type. He doesn't talk a lot but plays really hard. He had a great year last year and is having a good camp. He's just a darn good football player and the kids respect that."

ADAM WIERBINSKI, RJR., OL, CAMILLUS, N.Y. -- Starting every game for the past two seasons, Wierbinski helped UAlbany's offense to 26.8 points per game, good for fifth in the conference last season. At center, he protected quarterback Will Fiacchi, allowing him to break the single-season passing record (2,636 yards) and career passing record (7,150 yards).

GATTUSO ON WIERBINSKI: "Adam Wierbinski has been a rock on the offensive line for the last two years. The kids really respond to him. He again is not a big

"rah-rah" guy, but leads by example."

NEIL MORRISON, JR., LB, MIRAMAR, FLA. -- In 2014, Morrison had the play of the season, lighting the spark to the Great Danes' 4-0 start when he recovered a 79-yard fumble for the game-winning touchdown in the final minute of the season-opener vs. Holy Cross. Morrison totaled 31 tackles, including 17 solo on the season.

GATTUSO ON MORRISON: "Neil Morrison has blossomed in the last year. He made some big plays, obviously, last year but I think playing for Coach [Bernard] Clark at the linebacker spot he's really starting to become a good football player. He works really hard and our kids really respect him."

LUKE HOAG, 3RD GRADE, HOOSICK FALLS, N.Y. -- Luke connected with the UAlbany football team through the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation. Luke was diagnosed with a glioblastoma of the brainstem and cerebellum when he was 16 months old. Meeting the Great Danes last spring, Luke hasn't let his inoperable brain tumor take away his giant smile that's served as an inspiration to the team this season.

GATTUSO ON HOAG: "We are really enjoying our time with Luke and making him part of our football team. The big thing with athletes is they can bring such joy to kids like Luke who have challenges in their life. Ultimately our kids are learning what real struggle is by spending time with Luke and seeing what he's overcome with a big smile on his face. It's been a really good relationship back-and-forth."

BRIAN PARKER MAKES KANSAS CITY CHIEFS 53-MAN ROSTER

After signing with the San Diego Chargers as an undrafted free agent in the spring of 2015, former UAlbany tight end Brian Parker was picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs on Sunday, Sept. 6 off waivers and named to the 53-man roster. Parker caught one pass during the preseason with the Chargers for 14 yards. Parker, a native of Henrietta, N.Y., totaled 1,006 receiving yards and nine touchdowns in his career at UAlbany. The 6'4 tight end was named Third-Team All-CAA in his senior season, totaling 500 receiving yards and five touchdowns on 39 receptions. A member of UAlbany's squad from 2010 to 2014, Parker helped UAlbany win back-to-back Northeast Conference championships (2011-12) and to the program's first NCAA Division I Playoff in 2011. Parker also played a key role in the Great Danes' jump to the Colonial Athletic Association in 2013 and to 2014's seven-win season.

UALBANY'S 2014 IN REVIEW

With a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA, Greg Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround in his inaugural season. Going undefeated in non-conference play while opening the season with four straight victories, the Great Danes received votes in the national polls for 10 consecutive weeks. UAlbany appeared in The Sports Network Top-25 for four weeks, ranking as high as No. 23. Enforcing discipline and care of the football, UAlbany led the nation in turnover margin (1.25) as well as fumble recoveries (20), while quarterback Will Fiacchi became UAlbany's all-time leading passer with 7,150 career yards and broke the program's single-season passing record with 2,636 yards. Marking the University's second season as an associate member of the CAA, Gattuso led the Danes to the program's first three CAA wins, overcoming Rhode Island, Maine, and Stony Brook. True freshman wide receiver Josh Gontarek was named the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year, headlining UAlbany's group of seven players who were honored by the CAA. Running back Omar Osbourne was named to the second team, while tight end Brian Parker, offensive lineman Kevin Malloy, place kicker Patrick Toole, and linebacker Michael Nicastro were all named to the CAA's third team. In addition, wide receiver Jake Meek was the recipient of the CAA's Chuck Boone Leadership Award.

GATTUSO NAMES CROOK AS STARTING QUARTERBACK

Greg Gattuso announced Friday, Aug. 28 that redshirt sophomore DJ Crook will be the Great Danes' starting quarterback for their season opener at Buffalo on Sept. 5. Crook, a 6-1, 215 pound native of West Barnstable, Mass., transferred to UAlbany last spring from Penn State. He served as the Nittany Lions' backup quarterback as a redshirt freshman in 2014. Playing in two games, Crook completed 6-of-9 passes for 57 yards and a touchdown in Penn State's win over Massachusetts. In UAlbany's 2015 Spring Game, Crook completed 6-of-8 attempts, totaling 38 passing yards. Freshman Neven Sussman will back up Crook, while redshirt junior Dan Harding, and freshman Will Brunson add depth to a solid regime.

GATTUSO ON CROOK: "He's not afraid of contact. He's kind of built like a linebacker out there and he's got a good arm. Right now he's just trying to absorb the offense. He can run and move to get out of trouble and has the arm strength to make the throws we need him to make."

ALBANY, N.Y. -- Capping his tenure with a career-long 68-yard touchdown run in the closing minutes of Saturday's in-state rivalry game versus Stony Brook, redshirt senior running back Omar Osbourne led the University at Albany football team to a 27-17 victory over the visiting Seawolves. With the win, UAlbany finished its first season under Head Coach Greg Gattuso with a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA. Meanwhile, Stony Brook dropped to 5-7 on the season and 4-4 in conference play.

Osbourne totaled 166 rushing yards and a touchdown in his final game donning purple and gold, carrying the ball 24 times. With 3,229 career rushing yards, Osbourne ends his tenure ranked third all-time in UAlbany's archives.

Entering Saturday's clash tied for the all-time passing yards record, redshirt senior Will Fiacchi totaled 135 passing yards and a touchdown, taking sole possession of first-place all-time and raising the record to 7,150 yards. In addition, he broke Dan Di Lella's single-season passing record, totalling 2,636 yards this fall. Fiacchi completed 12-of-27 passes against the Seawolves, including a 33-yard touchdown toss to fellow redshirt senior Cole King.

King led the receiving corps with five catches and 72 receiving yards, ending his career ranked second all-time for receptions (148) receiving yards (2,217), and touchdown catches (18) at UAlbany.

True freshman wide receiver Josh Gontarek recorded his first rushing touchdown of his career on a 13-yard run, while also snagging three receptions for a total of 14 yards. He finished his rookie campaign with a team-high nine touchdowns. Redshirt freshman Brad Harris also had three catches, accruing 33 yards.

Defensively, junior Kyle Sakowski led the Great Danes with two interceptions and a fumble force and recovery. In addition, he added four tackles, including one for a loss. Redshirt sophomore Michael Nicastro recorded a game-high 10 tackles (4 solo) and also had an interception, while T.J. Idowu followed with eight tackles (4 solo).

After celebrating the squad's 13 seniors prior to kickoff, UAlbany and Stony Brook went toe-to-toe in the opening stanza, as neither team was able to break on the board.

With a wintery mix falling from the sky, both teams had trouble hanging onto the ball throughout the game as each squad recovered two fumbles in the contest. Stony Brook fumbled the opening kickoff but was still able to recover.

UAlbany fumbled and lost the ball at midfield on their second drive with just over eight minutes left in the first quarter, but the Great Dane defense limited the Seawolves to a 32-yard field goal attempt that sailed wide right, leaving the game scoreless heading to the second quarter.

UAlbany broke the silence with 8:06 remaining in the second, when Fiacchi found King in the end zone with a 33-yard pass. King fought off his defender and won the jump ball, giving the Great

Danes a 7-0 head start following Patrick Toole's point-after.

UAlbany's defense stepped up on the next drive, forcing a three-and-out with back-to-back sacks, setting the Seawolves back 16-yards. However on the punt, Stony Brook recovered a fumble on the catch and took over on the UAlbany-16 yard line. Again, though, the Danes' defense limited the damage stalling the offense and forcing a 33-yard field goal. Przemyslaw Popek's successful kick made the score 7-3 with 4:50 left in the half.

That's where the score stayed at the break after a pair of turnovers amounted to nothing on the board. With 1:15 on the clock Sakowski ripped the ball out of the hands of Stony Brook running back Stacey Bedell on the first play of the drive, and recovered it on the SBU-38. However, the Seawolves held UAlbany off, picking off Fiacchi's pass at the 13-yard line with 30 seconds left in the half.

While UAlbany was forced to punt in its first possession out of the break, the Danes forced back-to-back turnovers that led to six straight points for the hosts. On Stony Brook's first possession, Sakowski again put the ball back into the hands of the Great Danes' offense as he intercepted Conor Bednarski's pass at the UAlbany-42.

UAlbany turned the miscue into points, driving 48-yards on 10 plays to set up Toole's 28-yard field goal that gave the Danes a 10-3 lead at the 6:29 mark.

Two plays later, the Great Dane defense stripped the ball away from the Seawolves again, as Samuel Gray hit quarterback John Kinder knocking the ball loose and into the hands of Neil Morrison at the SBU-26.

Toole's 39-yard field from the resulting possession gave UAlbany a 13-3 advantage with 4:41 remaining in the third quarter.

To start the fourth quarter, the Seawolves barked first, driving 95-yards after Jon Martin's season-long 72-yard punt pined the Seawolves on the five. Using just three plays to cover the distance, Kinder connected a 79-yard touchdown pass to Adrian Coxson, cutting the margin to three, 13-10, with 14:13 to go.

However, the Great Danes answered immediately, using a steady running attack to cover 76-yard on 11 plays. Osbourne wore down the defense with six straight carries for a gain of 35 yards and Gontarek capped the drive with a 13-yard scamper into the end zone, giving UAlbany a 20-10 lead with 8:11 remaining.

Stony Brook battled back, scoring a touchdown of their own on Marcus Coker's 2-yard run, cutting the deficit to three points again, 20-17, with 5:00 minutes remaining.

That's when Osbourne took the game into his own hands. Getting the ball three straight times, the Syracuse, N.Y. native broke free for a career-long 68-yard touchdown run, giving the Danes some breathing room. Toole's point-after made the score 27-17.

Beginning to march down the field, Stony Brook made it to the UAlbany-26 yard line before Nicastro picked off Kinder's pass at the 31-yard line.

While the Danes were forced to punt with 28 seconds remaining, Sakowski sealed the victory, picking off Stony Brook's Hail Mary pass in the closing seconds.

Stony Brook entered the game as the top-ranked defense in the conference, allowing an average of just 14.3 points and 104.7 rushing yards per game. In the win, UAlbany almost doubled those numbers with 27 points and 215 rushing yards, totaling 350 yards of offense.

The win snapped UAlbany's two-game skid to the Seawolves including last year's 24-3 loss on Long Island and 2011's 31-28 FCS playoff slip.

HEAD COACH GREG GATTUSO



Greg Gattuso enters his second season at the helm of the UAlbany football program in 2015.

With a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround in his inaugural season. Going undefeated in non-conference play while opening the season with four straight victories, the Great Danes received votes in the national polls for 10 consecutive weeks. UAlbany appeared in The Sports Network Top-25 for four weeks, ranking as high as No. 23.

Enforcing discipline and care of the football, UAlbany led the nation in turnover margin (1.25) as well as fumble recoveries (20), while quarterback Will Fiacchi became UAlbany's all-time leading passer with 7,150 career yards and broke the program's single-season passing record with 2,636 yards.

Marking the University's second season as an associate member of the CAA, Gattuso led the Danes to the program's first three CAA wins, overcoming Rhode Island, Maine, and Stony Brook.

Under Gattuso's direction, true freshman wide receiver Josh Gontarek was named the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year, headlining UAlbany's group of seven players who were honored by the CAA. Running back Omar Osbourne was named to the second team, while tight end Brian Parker, offensive lineman Kevin Malloy, place kicker Patrick Toole, and linebacker Michael Nicastrò were all named to the CAA's third team. In addition, wide receiver Jake Meek was the recipient of the Chuck Boone Leadership Award.

Greg Gattuso, a former head coach at Duquesne University and assistant head coach at both Pittsburgh and Maryland, was named the University at Albany's head football coach in December of 2013. Gattuso became the second football coach in the program's 41-varsity season history, taking the reins from program architect Bob Ford.

Throughout both his playing and coaching career, Gattuso boasts a long history of exceptional success. As a defensive lineman at Penn State, Gattuso helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach and hauled in a top-10 recruiting class.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's University of Maryland coaching staff. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

During his tenure with the Terrapins, Gattuso developed current New England Patriot Joe Vellano into an NFL-ready defensive lineman, as Vellano earned All-America and All-ACC honors. In addition, Gattuso tutored All-ACC defensive lineman A.J. Francis, who signed with the Miami Dolphins at the conclusion of his collegiate career.

Prior to Maryland, Gattuso spent six seasons at Pittsburgh (2005-10) where he turned the Panthers' defensive line into one of the team's major strengths. The line was one of the top sack producers in the nation, as Brandon Lindsey (10.0) and Jabaal Sheard (9.0) both ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks during the 2010 regular season and Pittsburgh led the nation in that category in 2009 (3.6 per game). Gattuso developed three Big East Defensive Player of the Year winners, as Sheard received the honor in 2010, and defensive linemen Greg Romeus and Mick Williams shared the award in 2009.

Gattuso initially joined the Pitt staff as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator in 2005. In his first season, he helped the Panthers sign a recruiting class rated 10th in the nation by Scout.com, 16th by ESPN.com and 21st by Rivals.com. He began coaching the defensive line in 2006 and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2008. Scout.com named Gattuso the Big East Recruiter of the Year in 2007. During his tenure, The Panthers logged a 26-12 overall record, a 15-6 mark in the Big East, and appeared in three bowl games.

Before Pitt, Gattuso had a successful 12-year stint (1993-2004) as head coach at Duquesne University where he built the Dukes into one of the most elite I-AA football programs in the nation. The winningest coach in school history, the Dukes went 97-32 (.752) under his direction, won eight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) titles, made five bowl appearances, and captured the 2003 Mid-Major Division I-AA national championship.

The Western Pennsylvania native was twice named the national Mid-Major I-AA Coach of the Year and was a seven-time MAAC Coach of the Year. The Dukes dominated the conference during his tenure, going 66-7 (.904) in league play, including a 33-game winning streak.

Gattuso was an assistant coach at Duquesne in 1992 before taking over the head coaching post the following year.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.

During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle and was a two-time All-East defensive lineman at Penn State. He was a member of the Lions' 1982 national title team and graduated in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in administration and criminal justice.

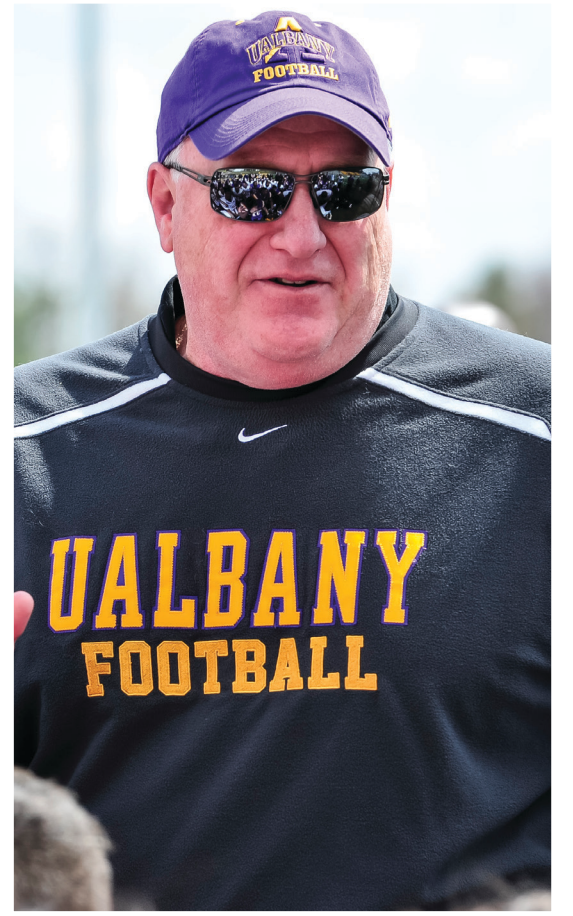
