Scoring 21 unanswered points in the second half of last week's clash at No. 6 Richmond, the University at Albany football team looks to build off that growth when the Great Danes take on the University of Delaware on Saturday. Kickoff at Delaware Stadium is set for 12 p.m.

UALBANY, DELAWARE SERIES

Hoad Coach

This weekend's meeting marks the fifth in program history between UAlbany and Delaware with the Blue Hens owning a 3-1 series advantage. Delaware has won the last three meetings, including back-to-back three-point steals. Last season, the Blue Hens edged the Danes 31-28 on Nov. 8, and in 2013, Delaware captured a 33-30 triumph on a last second field goal. The then-No.17 Blue Hens also topped the Great Danes, 38-7, on Sept. 27, 2008. However, UAlbany's 17-10 upset victory over the then-No. 11 Blue Hens on Sept. 16, 2006 is still considered one of the best wins in program history. UAlbany's Rashad Barksdale intercepted Super Bowl MVP Joe Flacco's pass in the end zone with 39 seconds left to save the victory in front of Delaware's crowd of 22,016.

SCOUTING DELAWARE

Delaware enters the weekend with a 3-5 overall record and 2-3 mark in the CAA, and comes off a 19-0 loss at Towson. The Blue Hens have been shut out twice in the last three games, including a 20-0 setback to Rhode Island on Oct. 10. However, Delaware has come up with big wins over nationally ranked William & Mary (24-23) and CAA perennial power New Hampshire (31-14). On the season, a pair of redshirt freshmen lead the offense with quarterback Joe Walker throwing for 454 yards and a touchdown (51-120-6), while classmate Thomas Jefferson pilots the running game with 658 rushing yards and six touchdowns on 123 carries. Diante Cherry has been Walker's top target down field with 19 receptions for 188 yards. Defensively, sophomore linebacker Charles Bell has a team-high 68 tackles (26 solo).

LAST TIME VS. THE BLUE HENS (Nov. 8, 2014)

With 33 seconds remaining at Bob Ford Field, redshirt senior quarterback Will Fiacchi connected a 19-yard touchdown pass to true freshman Josh Gontarek, putting the Great Danes within three points, 31-28, in the final minute of play against Delaware. UAlbany's onside kick attempt appeared to be successful as redshirt sophomore Michael Nicastro recovered, but an illegal blocking penalty negated the play and the visiting Blue Hens held on for the win. Fiacchi led the team offensively with 335 passing yards and four touchdowns, completing 22of-35 attempts with no interceptions. Gontarek served as his primary receiver, as he accrued a career-high 118 receiving yards and two touchdowns on six catches. Redshirt senior tight end Brian Parker also had six receptions, totaling 77 yards, while classmate Cole King logged three catches for 35 yards, including a 16-yard touchdown grab. Making the most of his one reception on the night, redshirt sophomore tight end Nic Ketter recorded a 38-yard touchdown reception. On the ground, redshirt senior Omar Osbourne recorded 49 rushing yards on 11 carries. Defensively, redshirt senior linebacker Christian Dorsey led the squad with a career-high 18 tackles (3 solo), followed by senior T.J. Idowu's 13 (7 solo) and freshman Jamal Robinson's career-best 10 (5 solo). Junior Kyle Sakowski tacked on nine (6 solo), while redshirt sophomore Christian Harris added eight tackles (3 solo), including a sack for a loss of 19 yards.

LAST TIME AT DELAWARE (Oct. 12, 2013)

With just 3:18 remaining in the fourth quarter, Omar Osbourne's third rushing touchdown of the game gave UAlbany a 30-22 lead in the nationally televised CAA clash at Delaware Stadium. However, the hosting Blue Hens rallied in the closing minutes to score a game-tying touchdown with 1:42 left, and a game-winning 42-yard field goal with two ticks on the clock to steal a 33-30 victory over the Great Danes. Osbourne led the Great Danes with three touchdowns and 142 rushing yards on 34 carries. Quarterback Will Fiacchi threw for 212 yards and one touchdown, completing 17-of-26 passes. Fiacchi connected with Nic Ketter, marking the redshirt freshman's first touchdown catch of his career and his only reception of the game. Cole King led the receivers with four catches and 60 yards. Defensively, Christian Dorsey led the squad with 12 tackles, including seven solo, followed by Michael Nicastro's 10 tackles and a sack for a loss of three yards. Delaware's Trent Hurley finished with 240 passing yards, completing 20-of-34 attempts.

UALBANY'S LAST TIME OUT

Trailing by 28 points in the third quarter Saturday night at Robins Stadium, UAlbany rallied for three straight touchdowns to make it a one-score game in the waning minutes. However, No. 6/8 Richmond held off the tenacious Great Danes, 38-31, to improve to 7-1 on the season and 5-0 in the CAA, while UAlbany fell to 2-6 overall and 1-4 in conference play. True freshman running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks broke away for a career-high 202 rushing yards on 25 carries, including two 40+ yard runs. The performance marked the most yards by a UAlbany player since 2013. Making his debut in the starting role, freshman quarterback Neven Sussman totaled 170 passing yards (14-34-4) and threw his first two career touchdown passes finding tight end Anthony Manzo-Lewis both times in the end zone. Freshman Zee Roberson caught a team-high four passes for 29 yards, followed by Brad Harris' three receptions for 64 yards. Defensively, the Great Danes were led by redshirt freshman Julian Cox's 14 tackles (11 solo), while DaSharnte Thompson (4 solo) and Samuel Gray (3 solo) each brought down eight. Forcing four turnovers, Jamal Robinson, Jamal Merritt, and Jojo McClary each logged an interception and Jack Forster picked up a fumble recovery.

IBITOKUN-HANKS EARNS SECOND CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOR

For the second time this season, freshman running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks was been named the CAA Rookie of the Week, announced Monday by the conference office.

Also, just the fourth CAA player to record a 200-yard rushing game this season.

TOOLE CLOSES IN ON 100th POINT

Senior placekicker Patrick Toole is just two points shy of the 100-point milestone. In his two-season career with the Great Danes, Toole has made 56-of-57 PAT attempts and 14-of-22 field goals with a career-long of 52-yards – a UAlbany FCS record. Toole would become the seventh kicker in program history to score 100 points.

ROBERSON CLIMBS SINGLE-SEASON RECEPTIONS LADDER

With 41 catches this season, freshman wide receiver Zee Roberson ranks 15th all-time in program history for single-season receptions. To break the top-10, Roberson needs eight more receptions to tie Chris Phillis' 49 (2000). The single-season record is 67 held by Tim Bush (2008).

PARKER MAKES NFL DEBUT IN LONDON

Former UAlbany tight end Brian Parker made his NFL debut with Kansas City on Sunday, helping the Chiefs to a 45-10 trouncing of Detroit. The game was played at Wembley Stadium in London. Parker made a key block on De'Anthony Thomas' 10-yard touchdown run that gave the Chiefs the lead for good in the first quarter.

ALSTON'S BIG RETURN

Freshman Dione Alston sparked UAlbany's second half rally at No. 6/8 Richmond with a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown – the first of three straight touchdowns for the Great Danes. Alston's 96-yarder was the second-longest return in program history, and first kickoff return for a TD since 2012. Alston totaled 179 yards on kickoff, returning every kickoff for at least 20 yards.

UALBANY MEETS 31st RANKED TEAM

The Halloween meeting with No. 6/8 Richmond marked the 31st time UAlbany has played against an FCS ranked opponent. The Great Danes have played at least one ranked opponent every season since 2002. UAlbany's last win over a ranked opponent was on Sept. 22, 2012. The Danes beat Maine, who ranked #23 in the Sports Network Top-25 Poll and #22 in the FCS Coaches Poll. UAlbany owns a 5-23 record against ranked foes.

TURNOVERS GALORE

In back-to-back weeks, the Danes forced six turnovers, which both tie a single-game program record -- At James Madison (9/19), UAlbany logged a program-record five interceptions and a fumble recovery; In the win over Rhode Island (9/12), the Great Danes recovered four fumbles and intercepted the ball twice. Prior to this season, the last time UAlbany forced the opposition to turn the ball over six times was against Towson on Sept. 1, 2001. UAlbany currently ranks fifth in the CAA for turnover margin (+0).

ATHLETICS RECEIVES \$10 MILLION GIFT

UAlbany President Robert J. Jones, Foundation President George R. Hearst III and Athletic Director Mark Benson announced Oct. 8th that the University received a \$10 million gift to support the football stadium and other facilities, expand scholarships for student-athletes, and address additional priorities in athletics. The gift was made by The Bernard and Millie Children's Foundation, which was established by the son of Bernard and Millie Duker, William Duker '75, of Westerlo and New York City, his wife Sharon (Casey) Duker, and their son William "West" Duker. The stadium is now named Tom & Mary Casey Stadium, in honor of Sharon (Casey) Duker's parents.

NOMINATE A VETERAN OR ACTIVE SERVICE MEMBER TO BE HONORED AT NOV. 14TH GAME

On November 14th, the University at Albany will be honoring the nation's veterans and active service members at the third annual Todd J. ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

UAlbany is a member of the America East Conference in 17 of 19 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, and football, a Division I FCS program, is an associate member of the Colonial Athletic Association.

UAlbany has won 83 conference championships and has made 37 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes have won eight or more conference titles in each of the last five years.

In 2014-15, UAlbany competed in a school-record six NCAA Tournaments, while winning nine conference championships, and was one of three universities in the country to have its men's basketball, women's basketball, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, field hockey, and women' golf teams make NCAA Division I Tournament appearances -- the others were Duke and North Carolina. In addition, field hockey's run to the Final Four was a first for any SUNY school, while Paula Heuser was named the National Player of the Year. UAlbany is also home to Lyle Thompson, the only back-to-back Tewaaraton Award winner -- an honor given to the best collegiate lacrosse player in the country.

Including Thompson, UAlbany has had 11 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft, eight players have been drafted by Major League Baseball, while 12 football players have inked NFL contracts.

1985 FOOTBALL TEAM, DMITRENKO INDUCTED INTO UALBANY ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

On Sept. 26, UAlbany inducted Blair Buchanan (Volleyball, 2003-06), Amber Maisonet (Softball, 2005-08), Scott Dmitrenko (Football, 1984-85), and the 1985 football team into the Athletics Hall of Fame.

Scott Dmitrenko (Football, 1984-85)

A two-year member of the UAlbany football team, Scott Dmitrenko led the 1985 Great Danes to the ECAC North Championship title. A product of Shenendehowa High School, Dmitrenko recorded 123 tackles (34 solo) in the 1985 season, which currently ranks 10th all-time in the program's record book. In the ECAC Championship game versus Plymouth State, Dmitrenko totaled 14 tackles and made a key 4th-and-1 stop that garnered the linebacker ECAC Defensive Player of the Week honors. After graduation, Dmitrenko went on to compete professionally in the Arena Football League. As a member of the Pittsburgh Gladiators, he played in the inaugural Arena Bowl in 1987.

1985 Football Team

Under the direction of head coach Bob Ford, the 1985 University at Albany football team rallied from a three-touchdown deficit to capture a 33-21 victory over Plymouth State in the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) North Championship. With a 9-2 overall record on the season, the Great Danes ended Plymouth's 28-game home win streak. The '85 team boasted offensive and defensive units that were nationally ranked, and featured five Pizza Hut and one Associated Press All-America players. UAlbany chalked up three shutouts on the season and held opponents scoreless in the second half in six of 11 games. Celebrating the feat's 30-year anniversary, the 1985 team marked the second football team to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, joining the undefeated 1974 squad.

FOUR FORMER NFL PLAYERS ON STAFF

The Great Danes have four former NFL players currently on the coaching staff -- associate head coach Bernard Clark, offensive line coach Jim Sweeney, defensive line coach Delbert Cowsette, and tight ends coach Nate Byham. Clark was a linebacker for the Cincinnati Bengals and Seattle Seahawks, playing three seasons in the NFL and two in the AFL. A 16-year veteran of the NFL, Sweeney was second round pick in the 1984 draft. He was named to the All-NFL Rookie Team after his first season with the New York Jets and played 11 seasons with the Jets with 158 consecutive starts. Cowsette was drafted by the Washington Redskins and played for the New York Giants, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Chicago Bears from 2000-06. Lastly, Byham was sixth round pick in the 2010 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. He battled in 29 NFL games, playing 14 games, including three starts, with the 49ers before signing with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for the 2012 and 2013 seasons.

MARTIN NAMED CAA SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt junior punter Jon Martin was named the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week, announced Oct. 5 by the conference office. The accolade marks the first Player of the Week honor in Martin's career and third CAA weekly award for the Great Danes this season.

WEEK 1 SUMMARY - AT BUFFALO

Taking on the program's first FBS opponent, UAlbany marched down the gridiron in its opening drive at UB Stadium, taking a quick 7-0 lead in front of 20,872 fans. However, the hosting University at Buffalo Bulls responded with 38 straight points, stealing a 51-14 win over the Great Danes in the season-opener. In the game, UAlbany totaled 269 yards of offense, led by DJ Crook's 11-for-22 passing effort for 104 yards and a touchdown. In the second half, freshman Neven Sussman connected 2-of-3 passes for 24 yards. Josh Gontarek piloted the receiving corps with five receptions for a total of 66 yards. In the ground game, Ibitokun-Hanks logged 74 rushing yards and a touchdown on 11 carries in the second half. Redshirt freshman Elliot Croskey rushed the ball 12 times for a total of 29 yards and also had a 10-yard reception. Defensively, Colin Cooper led the Great Danes with 11 tackles (5 solo) followed by Julian Cox's seven (4 solo).

WEEK 2 SUMMARY -- RHODE ISLAND

Racing to a 14-0 head start in the opening quarter, UAlbany led the entire way, overcoming the visiting University of Rhode Island Rams, 35-7, Saturday evening at Bob Ford Field. With the home-opener triumph, the Great Danes improved to 1-1 on the season and 1-0 in the CAA, while the Rams fell to 0-2 overall and 0-1 in conference play. The Danes totaled 354 yards of offense led by DJ Crook's 191 passing yards, completing 19-of-27 attempts, while also accounting for three touchdowns (one rushing, two passing). Elliot Croskey added 141 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 33 carries, while Gontarek led the receivers with five receptions, 51 yards and a touchdown. Defensively, redshirt freshman Julian Cox led the team with 10 tackles (seven solo), followed by Kyle Sakowski's six (four solo), and Jojo McClary's five (three solo).

WEEK 3 SUMMARY -- AT #12 JAMES MADISON

Forcing six turnovers for the second straight game, including a programrecord five interceptions, UAlbany startled No. 12 James Madison Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium, but in the end succumbed to a 42-28 defeat. After a wild first half that featured four picks by the Great Danes, including one on the first play of the game, the squads went into halftime with a 14-14 score. However, out of the break, the hosting Dukes notched three consecutive touchdowns to take the lead for good. Rayshan Clark followed with 13 tackles and a 19-yard interception, while Jamal Merritt, Neil Morrison, and Colin Cooper accounted for the Danes' other three picks. For the second straight game, redshirt freshman Elliot Croskey rushed for over 100 yards, totaling 102 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries. True freshman Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks carried the ball 12 times, logging 75 rushing yards and a touchdown. In the pocket, D.J. Crook threw for a TD and rushed for one, completing 18-of-36 passes, totaling 167 passing yards. Freshman Zee Roberson served as his top target, grabbing a career-best seven receptions for 90 yards. Sophomore Josh Gontarek followed with four catches for 25 yards, and Malachi Lawrence accounted for a 14-yard touchdown reception.

WEEK 7 SUMMARY -- VILLANOVA

UAlbany dropped its third straight game, falling to No. 25 Villanova 37-0, on Saturday, Oct. 17 at Casey Stadium. Villanova quarterback Zach Bednarczyk completed all 12 of his passes, totaling 152 passing yards and two touchdowns. With 421 yards of offense, including 269 rushing yards, Javon White led the ground game with 124 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries. Meanwhile, UAlbany accrued 232 yards of total offense led by redshirt sophomore quarterback D.J. Crook's 157 passing yards. Crook completed 13-of-24 passes with three interceptions. Redshirt sophomore Brad Harris led the receivers with four receptions for 44 yards, followed by freshman Zee Roberson's three catches for 43 yards. At Buffalo, redshirt junior captain Mike Nicastro suffered a season-ending knee injury in the second quarter. The linebacker was a third-team All-CAA selection in 2014, totaling 120 tackles.

KETTER, MORRISON, NICASTRO, WIERBINSKI, & EIGHT-YEAR-OLD LUKE HOAG NAMED 2015 TEAM CAPTAINS

Head Coach Greg Gattuso and the UAlbany football program named Nic Ketter, Neil Morrison, Michael Nicastro, Adam Wierbinski, and eight-year-old Luke Hoag as team captains for the 2015 season. The captains were chosen based on votes by the Great Dane players and coaches.

NIC KETTER, RJR., TE, QUEENSBURY, N.Y. -- Ketter is sidelined this fall due to a torn ACL he suffered during spring season. In his sophomore campaign, the tight end from Queensbury, N.Y. native played in all 12 games, recording eight receptions for 131 yards and two touchdowns.

GATTUSO ON KETTER: "Nic Ketter has the emotion and the fire. Even though he's hurt the kids still voted him as a captain. They respect him a great deal. He's a hardnosed football player and brings a lot of emotion to the game." MICHAEL NICASTRO, RJR., LB, CLARKSVILLE, MD. -- Nicastro was named to the Third-Team All-CAA Defense in 2014, ranking third in the CAA with 120 tackles (54 solo), averaging 10.0 per game. He also totaled three sacks for a loss of eight total yards. Nicastro played in every contest the last two seasons, starting all 12 as a redshirt sophomore. GATTUSO ON NICASTRO: "Nicastro is the strong silent type. He doesn't talk a lot but plays really hard. He had a great year last year and is having a good camp. He's just a darn good football player and the kids respect that." ADAM WIERBINSKI, RJR., OL, CAMILLUS, N.Y. -- Starting every game for the past two seasons, Wierbinski helped UAlbany's offense to 26.8 points per game, good for fifth in the conference last season. At center, he protected quarterback Will Fiacchi, allowing him to break the single-season passing record (2,636 yards) and career passing

record (7,150 yards).
GATTUSO ON WIERBINSKI: "Adam Wierbinski has been a rock on the offensive line for the last two years. The kids really respond to him. He again is not a big "rah-rah" guy, but leads by example."

NEIL MORRISON, JR., LB, MIRAMAR, FLA. -- In 2014, Morrison had the play of the season, lighting the spark to the Great Danes' 4-0 start when he recovered a 79-yard fumble for the game-winning touchdown in the final minute of the season-opener vs. Holy Cross. Morrison totaled 31 tackles, including 17 solo on the season.

GATTUSO ON MORRISON: "Neil Morrison has blossomed in the last year. He made some big plays, obviously, last year but I think playing for Coach [Bernard] Clark at the linebacker spot he's really starting to become a good football player. He works really hard and our kids really respect him."

LUKE HOAG, 3RD GRADE, HOOSICK FALLS, N.Y. -- Luke connected with the UAlbany football team through the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation. Luke was diagnosed with a ganglioglioma of the brainstem and cerebellum when he was 16 months old. Meeting the Great Danes last spring, Luke hasn't let his inoperable brain tumor take away his giant smile that's served as an inspiration to the team this season.

GATTUSO ON HOAG: "We are really enjoying our time with Luke and making him part of our football team. The big thing with athletes is they can bring such joy to kids like Luke who have challenges in their life. Ultimately our kids are learning what real struggle is by spending time with Luke and seeing what he's overcome with a big smile on his face. It's been a really good relationship back-and-forth."

BRIAN PARKER MAKES KANSAS CITY CHIEFS 53-MAN ROSTER

After signing with the San Diego Chargers as an undrafted free agent in the spring of 2015, former UAlbany tight end Brian Parker was picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs on Sunday, Sept. 6 off waivers and named to the 53-man roster. Parker caught one pass during the preseason with the Chargers for 14 yards. Parker, a native of Henrietta, N.Y., totaled 1,006 receiving yards and nine touchdowns in his career at UAlbany. The 6'4 tight end was named Third-Team All-CAA in his senior season, totaling 500 receiving yards and five touchdowns on 39 receptions. A member of UAlbany's

squad from 2010 to 2014, Parker helped UAlbany win back-to-back Northeast Conference championships (2011-12) and to the program's first NCAA Division I Playoff in 2011. Parker also played a key role in the Great Danes' jump to the Colonial Athletic Association in 2013 and to 2014's seven-win season.

UALBANY'S 2014 IN REVIEW

With a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA, Greg Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround in his inaugural season. Going undefeated in non-conference play while opening the season with four straight victories, the Great Danes received votes in the national polls for 10 consecutive weeks. UAlbany appeared in The Sports Network Top-25 for four weeks, ranking as high as No. 23. Enforcing discipline and care of the football, UAlbany led the nation in turnover margin (1.25) as well as fumble recoveries (20), while quarterback Will Fiacchi became UAlbany's all-time leading passer with 7,150 career yards and broke the program's single-season passing record with 2,636 yards. Marking the University's second season as an associate member of the CAA, Gattuso led the Danes to the program's first three CAA wins, overcoming Rhode Island, Maine, and Stony Brook. True freshman wide receiver Josh Gontarek was named the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year, headlining UAlbany's group of seven players who were honored by the CAA. Running back Omar Osbourne was named to the second team, while tight end Brian Parker, offensive lineman Kevin Malloy, place kicker Patrick Toole, and linebacker Michael Nicastro were all named to the CAA's third team. In addition, wide receiver Jake Meek was the recipient of the CAA's Chuck Boone Leadership Award.

GATTUSO NAMES CROOK AS STARTING QUARTERBACK

Greg Gattuso announced Friday, Aug. 28 that redshirt sophomore DJ Crook will be the Great Danes' starting quarterback for their season opener at Buffalo on Sept. 5. Crook, a 6-1, 215 pound native of West Barnstable, Mass., transferred to UAlbany last spring from Penn State. He served as the Nittany Lions' backup quarterback as a redshirt freshman in 2014. Playing in two games, Crook completed 6-of-9 passes for 57 yards and a touchdown in Penn State's win over Massachusetts. In UAlbany's 2015 Spring Game, Crook completed 6-of-8 attempts, totaling 38 passing yards. Freshman Neven Sussman will back up Crook, while redshirt junior Dan Harding, and freshman Will Brunson add depth to a solid regime.

GATTUSO ON CROOK: "He's not afraid of contact. He's kind of built like a linebacker out there and he's got a good arm. Right now he's just trying to absorb the offense. He can run and move to get out of trouble and has the arm strength to make the throws we need him to make."

ALBANY, N.Y. — With 33 seconds remaining on Military Appreciation Day at Bob Ford Field Saturday, redshirt senior quarterback Will Fiacchi connected a 19-yard touchdown pass to true freshman Josh Gontarek, putting the Great Danes within three points, 31-28, in the final minute of play against Delaware. UAlbany's onside kick attempt appeared to be successful as redshirt sophomore Michael Nicastro recovered, but an illegal blocking penalty negated the play and the visiting Blue Hens held on for the win. With the narrow victory, Delaware improved to 6-4 overall and 4-2 in the CAA, while UAlbany dropped to 6-4 on the season and 2-4 in conference play.

Fiacchi led the team offensively with 335 passing yards and four touchdowns, completing 22-of-35 attempts with no interceptions. Gontarek served as his primary receiver, as he accrued a career-high 118 receiving yards and two touchdowns on six catches. Redshirt senior tight end Brian Parker also had six receptions, totaling 77 yards, while classmate Cole King logged three catches for 35 yards, including a 16-yard touchdown grab. Making the most of his one reception on the night, redshirt sophomore tight end Nic Ketter recorded a 38-yard touchdown reception.

On the ground, redshirt senior Omar Osbourne recorded 49 rushing yards on 11 carries.

Defensively, redshirt senior linebacker Christian Dorsey led the squad with a career-high 18 tackles (3 solo), followed by senior T.J. Idowu's 13 (7 solo) and freshman Jamal Robinson's career-best 10 (5 solo). Junior Kyle Sakowski tacked on nine (6 solo), while redshirt sophomore Christian Harris added eight tackles (3 solo), including a sack for a loss of 19 vards.

A back-and-forth first half, neither team scored in the opening stanza. Delaware made the first mark on the board with 11:33 remaining in the second quarter when the Blue Hens used 12 plays to drive 73 yards. UD running back Jalen Randolph capped the drive with a 1-yard rush to give the Blue Hens a 7-0 lead.

UAlbany answered immediately, as Fiacchi sparked the drive with a 44-yard pass to Parker. Completing 3-of-4 passes in the sequence, Fiacchi also hit Brad Harris for a 16-yarder and then King for another 16-yarder, resulting in a touchdown. Patrick Toole's point-after tied the score, 7-7, with 9:57 left in the first half.

Halting the Delaware defense with Christian Harris' 19yard sack on third down, the Great Danes turned their next possession into another touchdown. Fiacchi again went 3-for-4, connecting a 27-yard pass to Gontarek, a nine yard pass to King, and capped the drive with a 38-yarder that led Ketter down the middle of the field and into the end zone. With 4:32 remaining in the second quarter, UAlbany led,

Forcing a three-and-out, UAlbany looked to a take a two-score lead into the break, but Toole's 50-yard field goal attempt landed short of the uprights with eight seconds on the clock.

Out of the break, Delaware turned its first possession into a touchdown, tying the score, 14-14, with the use of some trickery. Facing fourth-and-goal on the 2-yard line, the Blue Hens lined up for a field goal. However on the snap, holder Eric Enderson reversed and ran the ball into the end zone, as the Danes blitzed hard towards the fake kick.

On UAlbany's next possession, the Great Danes looked to punt, facing 4th-and-1 on the UAlbany-45. However, the snap to Jon Martin sailed high, landing at the UAlbany-16, forcing Martin to chase down the ball. The Blue Hens needed just one play to add a touchdown, as quarterback Trent Hurley connected with Jerel Harrison, giving Delaware the lead for good, 21-14, with 9:11 left in the third quarter.

Starting their next drive at the UAlbany-47, Delaware took a 28-14 advantage with 2:57 left in the third. The Blue Hens used nine plays to travel 47-yards, capping the drive with Wes Hills' 4-yard run.

However, the Great Danes battled back, marching 79-yards down the field on seven plays, including a 26-yard pass to Harris followed by a drive-ending 29-yard touchdown toss to Gontarek in the back of the end zone. With Toole's extra point, the Danes trailed 28-21 with 14:55 remaining.

Trying to preserve its lead, Delaware slowed down the pace of the game, chewing up nearly five minutes in the next drive before being forced to punt. The Blue Hens made their next stop on defense and then slowly worked their way down the gridiron again. With 1:34 remaining, Garrett Greenway hit a 31-yard field goal, giving Delaware a 31-21 advantage.

HEAD COACH GREG GATTUSO



Greg Gattuso enters his second season at the helm of the UAlbany football program in 2015.

With a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround in his inaugural season. Going undefeated in non-conference play while opening the season with four straight victories, the Great Danes received votes in the national polls for 10 consecutive weeks. UAlbany appeared in The Sports Network Top-25 for four weeks, ranking as high as No. 23.

Enforcing discipline and care of the football, UAlbany led the nation in turnover margin (1.25) as well as fumble recoveries (20), while quarterback Will Fiacchi became UAlbany's all-time leading passer with 7,150 career yards and broke the program's single-season passing record with 2,636 yards.

Marking the University's second season as an associate member of the CAA, Gattuso led the Danes to the program's first three CAA wins, overcoming Rhode Island, Maine, and Stony Brook.

Under Gattuso's direction, true freshman wide receiver Josh Gontarek was named the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year, headlining UAlbany's group of seven players who were honored by the CAA. Running back Omar Osbourne was named to the second team, while tight end Brian Parker, offensive lineman Kevin Malloy, place kicker Patrick Toole, and linebacker Michael Nicastro were all named to the CAA's third team. In addition, wide receiver Jake Meek was the recipient of the Chuck Boone Leadership Award.

Greg Gattuso, a former head coach at Duquesne University and assistant head coach at both Pittsburgh and Maryland, was named the University at Albany's head football coach in December of 2013. Gattuso became the second football coach in the program's 41-varsity season history, taking the reins from program architect Bob Ford.

Throughout both his playing and coaching career, Gattuso boasts a long history of exceptional success. As a defensive lineman at Penn State, Gattuso helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach and hauled in a top-10 recruiting class.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's University of Maryland coaching staff. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

During his tenure with the Terrapins, Gattuso developed current New England Patriot Joe Vellano into an NFL-ready defensive lineman, as Vellano earned All-America and All-ACC honors. In addition, Gattuso tutored All-ACC defensive lineman A.J. Francis, who signed with the Miami Dolphins at the conclusion of his collegiate career.

Prior to Maryland, Gattuso spent six seasons at Pittsburgh (2005-10) where he turned the Panthers' defensive line into one of the team's major strengths. The line was one of the top sack producers in the nation, as Brandon Lindsey (10.0) and Jabaal Sheard (9.0) both ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks during the 2010 regular season and Pittsburgh led the nation in that category in 2009 (3.6 per game). Gattuso developed three Big East Defensive Player of the Year winners, as Sheard received the honor in 2010, and defensive linemen Greg Romeus and Mick Williams shared the award in 2009.

Gattuso initially joined the Pitt staff as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator in 2005. In his first season, he helped the Panthers sign a recruiting class rated 10th in the nation by Scout.com, 16th by ESPN.com and 21st by Rivals.com. He began coaching the defensive line in 2006 and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2008. Scout.com named Gattuso the Big East Recruiter of the Year in 2007. During his tenure, The Panthers logged a 26-12 overall record, a 15-6 mark in the Big East, and appeared in three bowl games.

Before Pitt, Gattuso had a successful 12-year stint (1993-2004) as head coach at Duquesne University where he built the Dukes into one of the most elite I-AA football programs in the nation. The winningest coach in school history, the Dukes went 97-32 (.752) under his direction, won eight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) titles, made five bowl appearances, and captured the 2003 Mid-Major Division I-AA national championship.

The Western Pennsylvania native was twice named the national Mid-Major I-AA Coach of the Year and was a seven-time MAAC Coach of the Year. The Dukes dominated the conference during his tenure, going 66-7 (.904) in league play, including a 33-game winning streak.

Gattuso was an assistant coach at Duquesne in 1992 before taking over the head coaching post the following year.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.


During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle and was a two-time All-East defensive lineman at Penn State. He was a member of the Lions' 1982 national title team and graduated in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in administration and criminal justice.

Gattuso and his wife Colleen have two daughters, Jacqueline (27) and Kaitlin (22).
