Coming off a pair of narrow conference losses, the No. 23/24 University at Albany football team (4-2, 1-2 CAA) looks to get back in the win column when the Great Danes travel to take on No. 16/17 Villanova (5-2, 3-1 CAA) Saturday at 3:30 p.m. at Villanova Stadium.

UALBANY REMAINS RANKED FOR SIXTH STRAIGHT WEEK

For a program record sixth straight week, UAlbany is ranked nationally, earning a No. 23 ranking in the STATS FCS Top 25 poll and a No. 24 ranking in the FCS Coaches Poll. Speaking to the strength of the CAA, the Great Danes are one of five CAA teams nationally ranked (Richmond, James Madison, Villanova, New Hampshire, and UAlbany) which leads all FCS conferences. Ranking as high as 16th this season, UAlbany has inched down after a triple overtime loss to No. 6 Richmond and most recently a tight 20-16 defeat at Maine.

UALBANY-VILLANOVA SERIES

Saturday's meeting will mark just the third between UAlbany and Villanova. The Wildcats own a 2-0 lead in the series, winning 2014's Nov. 15th meeting, 48-31, on their home field and 2015's Oct. 17th clash 37-0 in Albany.

SCOUTING VILLANOVA

With a 5-2 overall record and 3-1 mark in conference play, the Wildcats had their five-game winning streak snapped by No. 6 Richmond, 23-0, last Saturday. Villanova opened its season with a 28-7 loss at Pitt, but bounced back to top Lehigh (26-21), Towson (40-21), Lafayette (31-14), Elon (42-7), and Rhode Island (35-0). The Wildcats rank fifth in the nation for scoring defense (16.3 ppg) and sixth in total defense (273.9 ypg). Offensively, Villanova is led by running backs Aaron Forbes (449 yards, 5 TDs) and Javon White (412 yards, 6 TDs), while quarterback Zach Bednarczyk has thrown for eight touchdowns and 1,010 yards, completing 83-of-141 passes with five interceptions.

LAST TIME VS. VILLANOVA (OCT. 17, 2015)

UAlbany fell to No. 25 Villanova 37-0, on Oct. 17, 2015 at Casey Stadium. Villanova quarterback Zach Bednarczyk completed all 12 of his passes, totaling 152 passing yards and two touchdowns. With 421 yards of offense, including 269 rushing yards, Javon White led the ground game with 124 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries. Meanwhile, UAlbany accrued 232 yards of total offense led by quarterback D.J. Crook's 157 passing yards. Crook completed 13-of-24 passes with three interceptions. Brad Harris led the receivers with four receptions for 44 yards, followed by Zee Roberson's three catches for 43 yards. Defensively, Samuel Gray recorded a team-high 11 tackles, including five solo and a sack. Julian Cox also hit double-digits with 10 tackles (four solo) and a solo sack.

UALBANY MEETS 33rd RANKED TEAM

Taking on No. 16/17 Villanova, the Great Danes will play its 33rd game against a ranked opponent on Saturday. The Great Danes have played at least one ranked opponent every season since 2002. UAlbany's last win over a ranked opponent was on Sept. 22, 2012. The Danes beat Maine, who ranked #23 in the Sports Network Top-25 Poll and #22 in the FCS Coaches Poll. UAlbany's highest ranked victory was its' 17-10 triumph over #11 Delaware on Sept. 16, 2006. UAlbany has earned five wins over ranked foes:

LAST TIME OUT -- MAINE (OCT. 15)

- University of Maine quarterback Dan Collins threw three touchdowns for over 40 yards Saturday afternoon, leading the Black Bears to a 20-16 win over the No. 17/19 University at Albany football team.
- Sophomore quarterback Neven Sussman led UAlbany with 187 passing yards, completing 10-of-26 passes with one interception. He also led the squad with 75 rushing yards.
- Jordan Crockett served as the top receiver with four receptions totaling 36 yards. Tight end Anthony Manzo-Lewis logged three catches, recording 66 yards including a team-long 45-yard reception.
- In the ground game, running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks ran the ball 16 times, accruing 41 rushing yards and a touchdown.
- Kicker Ethan Stark made two of three field goal attempts in the contest from 27 and 39 yards out.
- Punter Jon Martin pinned the Black Bears inside the 20 four times, punting seven times with an average of 42.0 yards per punt.
- Defensively, Michael Nicastro and Josh Wynn each recorded 11 tackles (four solo), while Abner Logan added nine tackles with a fumble recovery.

#6/7 RICHMOND NOTES (OCT. 8)

- The No. 16 ranked University at Albany football team took sixth-ranked Richmond to triple overtime after tying the game with a 51-yard touchdown pass with just over a minute remaining in regulation Saturday night at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. However, the Spiders came away with a 36-30 triumph, spoiling UAlbany's perfect record in the Homecoming clash with 9,208 in attendance.
- Sophomore quarterback Neven Sussman led UAlbany's offense with a career-high 211 passing yards, completing 13-of-35 attempts with two interceptions. Sussman rushed for a 19-yard touchdown and threw a 51-yard game-tying touchdown pass to Jordan Crockett with 1:17 left in the fourth quarter.
- Sophomore Zee Roberson led the receiving corps with five receptions, totaling 98 yards. Austin Ellis and Anthony Manzo-Lewis each had two catches, accruing 26 and 20 yards, respectively.
- Sophomore Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks ran the ball 16 times in the ground attack, totaling 47 yards, including a 1-yard touchdown run in overtime.
- Redshirt sophomore kicker Ethan Stark connected on three field goals from 27, 45, and 24 yards out, while punter Jon Martin punted six time, pinning the Spiders inside the 20 twice and averaged 40.5 yards per punt.
- Defensively, junior Malachi Hoskins recorded a career-high 16 tackles (5 solo), including two sacks, three tackles for a loss, and forced a fumble.
- In addition, sophomore Josh Wynn brought down a career-best 14 tackles (5 solo), Julian Cox added 11 tackles (4 solo), and Michael Nicastro logged 10 while also recovering a fumble and intercepting his third pass of the season.

SAINT FRANCIS (PA.) NOTES (SEPT. 24)

- Sophomore running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks totaled 90 rushing yards on 22 carries and 17 receiving yards on a pair of receptions.
- Sophomore quarterback Neven Sussman completed 7-of-15 passes with an interception and a touchdown.

- Sophomore running back Dione Alston and redshirt sophomore wide receiver Jordan Crockett each recorded their first career touchdowns in the victory. Alston totaled 87 rushing yards on four carries, including a 54-yard touchdown run. Crockett's lone reception of the game was a 13-yard TD catch.
- Defensively, senior Michael Nicastro led the team with a career-high 16 tackles (three solo) and a fumble recovery. Sophomore Josh Wynn logged 10 tackles (seven solo), as well as forced and recovered a fumble. Redshirt senior Rayshan Clark also brought down 10 (two solo), while Abner Logan added nine tackles (two solo).
- As a team, the defense did not allow a touchdown, holding St. Francis to a trio of second quarter field goals. The Great Danes forced four turnovers in the victory two fumbles and two interceptions.
- With St. Francis threatening in the waning minutes, redshirt sophomore Kareem Brown had two key defensive plays, first intercepting SFU quarterback Zack Drayer's pass at the SFU-17 with 5:38 remaining. The Great Danes would then convert the turnover into a field goal. On Saint Francis' next possession, Brown stripped the ball in the end zone, which was recovered by Wynn for 16 yards with 2:47 remaining.

HOLY CROSS NOTES (SEPT. 17)

- Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks led the offense with four rushing touchdowns, tying the program's Division I record. He carried the ball 28 times, totaling 183 yards. Ibitokun-Hanks has rushed for over 100 yards in each game this season, accruing 465 yards and eight touchdowns in just three contests.
- Quarterback Neven Sussman completed 8-of-12 passes for 183 yards and two touchdowns.
- Roberson totaled four receptions for 108 yards and two touchdowns.
- Defensively, UAlbany forced four turnovers three fumbles and an interception.
- Abner Logan led the team with 13 tackles (four solo), including a sack and a fumble recovery. Michael Nicastro added 11 tackles (three solo) with a forced fumble.
- Brian Dolce finished with a career-high eight tackles with a sack and a fumble recovery.

RHODE ISLAND NOTES (SEPT. 10)

- Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks led the offense with three rushing touchdowns and 178 rushing yards on 27 carries.
- Wide receivers Jordan Crockett and Dione Alston each had two receptions, accruing 25 yards and 23 yards, respectively.
- In the run-heavy game, starting quarterback Neven Sussman went 2-for-9 with an interception, totaling seven passing yards. In the second half, D.J. Crook went 4-for-7 with 55 passing yards.

- Defensively, cornerback Rayshan Clark and linebacker Michael Nicastro each returned an interception for a touchdown. Clark's pick-six was a 25-yard return, while Nicastro had an 80-yard return and totaled four solo tackles in the contest. The last time a UAlbany player ran an interception back for a touchdown was in 2012 when Justinian Mason ran a 75-yard pick back at Bryant on Oct. 6, 2012.
- Abner Logan and Nicastro led the team with nine tackles each.

BUFFALO NOTES (SEPT. 2)

- Sophomore quarterback Neven Sussman totaled 113 passing yards and two touchdowns in UAlbany's FBS win over Buffalo, completing 14-of-21 passes with no interceptions.
- Sussman connected a 5-yard TD pass to Anthony Manzo-Lewis just 2:03 into the game.
- He then threw a career-long 35-yard game-winning touchdown pass to Brad Harris with 9:37 left in the game and also hit Harris on the two-point conversion to give UAlbany a 22-16 lead.
- Sophomore running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks recorded his third career 100+ rushing game at Buffalo, logging 104 yards on 23 carries.
- Ending his season with a knee injury in UAlbany's first game of the year at Buffalo in 2015, redshirt junior linebacker Michael Nicastro picked up where he left off this year at UB. Nicastro picked off the first pass of the game and returned it 38 yards to the 7-yard line, setting up the Danes' first touchdown. Nicastro totaled 11 tackles (six solo) in the victorious opener.

MARTIN BREAKS PUNTING RECORD

With 294 punting yards at Maine (10/15), redshirt senior Jon Martin broke UAlbany's all-time punting yards record, currently with 8,863 yards on 220 punts in his career, averaging 40.3 yards per punt. Martin broke Chris Lynch's (2004-08) record of 8,689 yards on 227 punts. This season, Martin has pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line 13 times, averaging 41.8 yards per punt.

NICASTRO LOOKS TO BREAK INTO TOP-10 FOR TACKLES

Senior linebacker Michael Nicastro has racked up 252 tackles in his career, including a team-high 68 this season. Nicastro now ranks 11th all-time in UAlbany's record book. Nicastro needs just one more tackle in order to move into the top-10 (253) and 46 tackles to be top-5 (298). The career tackles record is held by Colin Disch (2004-07) with 416.

OVERTIME GAMES

The Great Danes have fallen in each of their last four overtime games. UAlbany recorded the program's first ever overtime victory in a 22-16 decision against Hofstra on Sept. 13, 2008. TB David McCarty's 7-yard touchdown run decided the outcome. UAlbany suffered setbacks in its previous two OT decisions.

BOB FORD INDUCTED INTO UALBANY HALL OF FAME

The University at Albany inducted Bob Ford (FB), Michelle Simpson (FH), Casey Halloran (SB), Kevin Rae (MLAX), Luke Daquino (MLAX), and the 2003 men's lacrosse team into the Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 7th.

• BOB FORD (1970-2013) -- FOOTBALL HEAD COACH

Bob Ford served as UAlbany's head football coach from 1970 to 2013, transitioning the program from club to Division III to Division II to Division I. He was appointed on April 27, 1970 and coached his final game on November 23, 2013. In that time, he compiled a 12-9-1 record in three seasons at the club level and a 41-season varsity record of 256-170.

Including nine wins from his time as St. Lawrence's head coach, Ford's 265 career victories ranked first among active NCAA Division I college football head coaches and fourth on the all-time FCS chart. In addition, his UAlbany teams owned a 98-69 mark as a Division I FCS program. He also won four Northeast Conference Coach of the Year honors and led the Great Danes to six NEC titles. Ford acted as a mentor to over a thousand student-athletes and over 100 assistant coaches, who are now working in the high school, college, and professional ranks.

MILITARY APPRECIATION DAY SET FOR NOV. 5

UAlbany's football game versus Delaware on Nov. 5 will be Military Appreciation Day, marking the fourth consecutive year the game will be named the Todd J. Clark Memorial Game in honor of Lieutenant Colonel Todd Clark and the Tri-County Council of Vietnam Era Veterans. Todd's family will serve as honorary captains. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. Paying tribute to those who have fought for our freedom, all servicemen and servicewomen, active or retired, will receive FREE admission to the game. The Great Danes football team will also honor those who have served or are currently serving our country by wearing the rank and names of nominated servicemen and servicewomen on the back of their jerseys.

IBITOKUN-HANKS NAMED CAA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks was named the CAA Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 19. Ibitokun-Hanks rushed for 183 yards and a school-record tying four touchdowns on 28 carries as UAlbany improved to 3-0 with a 45-28 win over Holy Cross. It was the third consecutive 100+-yard effort for Ibitokun-Hanks, who leads FCS in rushing TD's (8) and ranks second in yards (465). He had scoring runs of 40, 4, 7 and 13 yards. The honor marks Ibitokun-Hanks' third CAA weekly honor of his career, earning Offensive Rookie of the Week honors twice in 2015.

TURN, TURN, TURN

Ranking first in the FCS for turnovers gained (21), second for turnover margin (+14) interceptions (11) and fumbles lost (1), and third for fumbles recovered (9), the Great Danes have scored 26 points off turnovers this season. Meanwhile, UAlbany has given up just seven points off turnovers (vs. Richmond) with just one fumble lost and five interceptions through six games.

RECORD-HIGHS AT CASEY STADIUM

Scoring 45 points in the win over Holy Cross on Sept. 17, the Great Danes broke the record for most points scored at Casey Stadium. The previous high was 42 set on Oct. 25, 2014 in UAlbany's 42-7 win over Columbia. In addition, the Danes had the program's largest home crowd to witness a UAlbany victory with 8,040 in attendance. The Great Danes have sold the stadium out (8,500) three times since opening in 2013, but did not earn victories in those games.

IBITOKUN-HANKS RUNS FOR 100+

With three straight 100+ rushing performances, sophomore running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks raised his total to five career 100+ rushing games. This season, he recorded his third career 100+ rushing game at Buffalo, logging 104 yards on 23 carries, his fourth at URI with 178 yards and three touchdowns on 27 carries, and his fifth vs. Holy Cross with 183 yards and four touchdowns on 28 carries. He also hit the mark in back-to-back games in 2015 at Richmond (202 yards, 25 carries) and Delaware (135 yards, 28 carries).

UALBANY RETURNS THREE ALL-CAA PLAYERS

The Great Danes return three players who have earned All-CAA honors in their careers. Redshirt junior Kevin Malloy (OL) is a two-time selection, while redshirt sophomore Julian Cox (LB) earned third-team honors in 2015 and redshirt junior Michael Nicastro was a third-team selection in 2014. Nicastro suffered a season-ending knee injury in the first game of the season against Buffalo last fall.

Cox led the Great Danes' defense with 94 tackles, including 57 solo, as well as three sacks and two quarterback hurries. In addition, he logged six tackles for a loss of 25 total yards, forced and recovered a pair of fumbles, broke up three passes, and recorded a 22-yard interception. He was also named one of 20 finalists for STATS FCS Freshman of the Year.

• KEVIN MALLOY, RSr., OL, East Northport, N.Y.

2014 and 2015 Third-Team All-CAA Offense

Malloy started all 11 games at left tackle. A repeat all-conference selection, Malloy led the offensive line that held opponents to 20 sacks this season -- the lowest amount allowed since UAlbany has been a member of the CAA. Malloy has played in every game of his three-year career and has started every contest in each of the last two seasons.

• MICHAEL NICASTRO, RJr., LB, Clarksville, Md.

2014 Third-Team All-CAA Defense

Nicastro ranked third in the CAA in 2014 with 120 tackles (54 solo), averaging 10.0 per game. He recorded a 40-yard fumble recovery at Villanova (Nov. 15) and had a key interception for 14-yards in UAlbany's win over Stony Brook (Nov. 22). Nicastro also picked off a pass for 24-yards against Richmond (Oct. 11).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY BLITZ!

Head Coach Greg Gattuso's Great Dane puppy, Blitz, celebrated his first birthday on Friday, Sept. 2, 2016 -- The same day UAlbany earned its first FBS win over Buffalo. Watch for Blitz, as he leads the team out onto the field before each home game.

UALBANY SELECTED 11TH IN PRESEASON POLL

UAlbany was selected 11th out of the conference's 12 teams in the 2016 CAA Football Preseason Predicted Order of Finish. Richmond was the league favorite, earning 19 first-place votes. A 16-year veteran of the NFL, Sweeney was second round pick in the 1984 draft. He was named to the All-NFL Rookie Team after his first season with the New York Jets and played 11 seasons with the Jets with 158 consecutive starts. Cowsette was drafted by the Washington Redskins and played for the New York Giants, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Chicago Bears from 2000-06. Lastly, Byham was sixth round pick in the 2010 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. He battled in 29 NFL games, playing 14 games, including three starts,

with the 49ers before signing with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for the 2012 and 2013 seasons.

OBTAINING CREDENTIALS

Media credentials are issued to accredited members of the media only. Requests for credentials should be made via phone, mail, or email to Lizzie Barlow in the University at Albany Athletics Media Relations office.

Space in the press box of Casey Stadium is limited, so requests should be made no later than 48 hours prior to game time. Should space become a problem, preference will be given to the primary media outlets of each school and then to media who make their requests earlier in the week.

Photographers must show their credentials in order to gain access to the photographer areas. All photographers are limited to the designated areas and may not enter the team bench areas at any time.

Local television stations shooting the game for highlight footage may do so from the sideline (except in team areas). Tripods are not permitted during the game for safety reasons.

Credentials may be picked up at the Will Call table at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium beginning two hours prior to game time. In addition, they may be picked up from the Athletics Media Relations office (PE 307) from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the day prior to the game.

RADIO INFORMATION

Broadcast positions for visiting radio stations are available in the Casey Stadium press box. Stations wishing to broadcast a game from Casey Stadium should contact the Athletics Media Relations office at least one week prior to game day. Credential and parking requests for radio staff should be submitted along with the request for phone lines.

MEDIA PARKING

Requests for parking passes should be made at the same time as credential requests. Media parking is located in the gravel lot adjacent to the PE Building/SEFCU Arena bus circle. Please note that space is limited and early arrival is recommended.

IN-GAME MEDIA SERVICES

Pre-game notes, flip cards and game programs will be distributed in the press box before each game. Box scores and scoring summaries will be provided at halftime and at the end of the game. Wireless internet is available for media to use.

POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game, a postgame press conference will be held in a designated area. Members of the Athletics Media Relations staff will help guide members of the media to the interview area. The head coach and selected players of the visiting team will be available for questions first, followed by the **UAlbany Head Coach Greg Gattuso** and selected players. Requests for specific UAlbany players should be made to the Athletics Media Relations staff. Interviews with opposing players should be coordinated through the visiting

The locker rooms for both teams are closed at all times.

IN-SEASON INTERVIEW POLICY

All requests for in-season interviews with UAlbany players and coaches must be arranged through Lizzie Barlow at 518-852-8362 or ebarlow2@albany. edu. Media members should not contact players or coaches directly. Interview times will be arranged by the Athletics Media Relations staff based on availability of both the player and the media member. To ensure availability, please allow 24-hour notice prior to your need for an interview.

Media representatives are welcome to speak with players and coaches after practice sessions but should call in advance to confirm practice times and to arrange for parking on campus.

ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

UAlbany's intercollegiate athletics program excels at the NCAA Division I level, producing competitive teams, successful coaches, and outstanding student-athletes recognized for their accomplishments both on the field and in the classroom. The University sponsors 18 varsity sports for men and women. Club sports, an intramural program, and recreational opportunities are also offered.

UAlbany is a member of the America East Conference in 16 of 18 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, and football, a Division I FCS program, is an associate member of the Colonial Athletic Association.

UAlbany has won 91 conference championships and has made 42 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes have won eight or more conference titles in each of the last six years.

The Great Danes won eight conference championships in 2015-16 and made five NCAA Tournament appearances in field hockey, women's soccer, women's basketball, women's tennis, and men's lacrosse.

In 2014-15, UAlbany competed in a school-record six NCAA Tournaments, while winning nine conference championships, and was one of three universities in the country to have its men's basketball, women's basketball, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, field hockey, and women' golf teams make NCAA Division I Tournament appearances -- the others were Duke and North Carolina. In addition, field hockey's run to the Final Four was a first for any SUNY school, and UAlbany boasted two National Players of the Year in Paula Heuser (field hockey) and Lyle Thompson (men's lacrosse).

UAlbany has had 13 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft, eight players have been drafted by Major League Baseball, while 12 football players have inked NFL contracts.

UAlbany's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are among the most comprehensive in the Northeast. In 2012-2013, the University constructed a state-of-the-art 8,500 seat multi-sport complex for football and soccer; a brand new track and field venue; and a synthetic turf field designed for year-round recreational, intramural and club sport activities. Also in recent years, UAlbany built two all-weather athletic fields. John Fallon Field is home to the men's and women's lacrosse teams, and an adjacent surface known as Alumni Turf Field is home to field hockey, in addition to serving as a multi-use recreational field for UAlbany students.

The Great Danes' indoor facilities are also top-notch. SEFCU Arena, the Physical Education Building, and an air-supported bubble are utilized for sporting and cultural activities. In addition, there are lighted tennis courts, racquetball/squash/handball courts, a swimming pool, a dance studio, and a fitness and weight training center. The Department of Athletics & Recreation is located in both the SEFCU Arena and the Physical Education Building, (518-442-DANE).

HEAD COACH GREG GATTUSO



Greg Gattuso enters his third season at the helm of the UAlbany football program in 2016.

With a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround in his inaugural season in 2014. Going undefeated in non-conference play while opening the season with four straight victories, the Great Danes received votes in the national polls for 10 consecutive weeks. UAlbany appeared in The Sports Network Top-25 for four weeks, ranking as high as No. 23.

Enforcing discipline and care of the football, UAlbany led the nation in turnover margin (1.25) as well as fumble recoveries (20), while quarterback Will Fiacchi became UAlbany's all-time leading passer with 7,150 career yards and broke the program's single-season passing record with 2,636 yards.

Marking the University's second season as an associate member of the CAA, Gattuso led the Danes to the program's first three CAA wins, overcoming

Rhode Island, Maine, and Stony Brook.

Under Gattuso's direction, UAlbany had a group of seven players who were honored by the CAA. Running back Omar Osbourne was named to the second team, while tight end Brian Parker, offensive lineman Kevin Malloy, place kicker Patrick Toole, and linebacker Michael Nicastro were all named to the CAA's third team. In addition, wide receiver Jake Meek was the recipient of the Chuck Boone Leadership Award.

In 2015, the Danes earned CAA victories over Rhode Island and perennial power Delaware, and had three earn all-conference accolades. As a redshirt freshman, Julian Cox was named the Defensive Rookie of the Year and was named to the third team along with Kevin Malloy and Samuel Gray.

Greg Gattuso, a former head coach at Duquesne University and assistant head coach at both Pittsburgh and Maryland, was named the University at Albany's head football coach in December of 2013. Gattuso became the second football coach in the program's 41-varsity season history, taking the reins from program architect Bob Ford.

Throughout both his playing and coaching career, Gattuso boasts a long history of exceptional success. As a defensive lineman at Penn State, Gattuso helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach and hauled in a top-10 recruiting class.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's University of Maryland coaching staff. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was

promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

During his tenure with the Terrapins, Gattuso developed current New England Patriot Joe Vellano into an NFL-ready defensive lineman, as Vellano earned All-America and All-ACC honors. In addition, Gattuso tutored All-ACC defensive lineman A.J. Francis, who signed with the Miami Dolphins at the conclusion of his collegiate career.

Prior to Maryland, Gattuso spent six seasons at Pittsburgh (2005-10) where he turned the Panthers' defensive line into one of the team's major strengths. The line was one of the top sack producers in the nation, as Brandon Lindsey (10.0) and Jabaal Sheard (9.0) both ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks during the 2010 regular season and Pittsburgh led the nation in that category in 2009 (3.6 per game). Gattuso developed three Big East Defensive Player of the Year winners, as Sheard received the honor in 2010, and defensive linemen Greg Romeus and Mick Williams shared the award in 2009.

Gattuso initially joined the Pitt staff as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator in 2005. In his first season, he helped the Panthers sign a recruiting class rated 10th in the nation by Scout.com, 16th by ESPN.com and 21st by Rivals.com. He began coaching the defensive line in 2006 and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2008. Scout.com named Gattuso the Big East Recruiter of the Year in 2007. During his tenure, The Panthers logged a 26-12 overall record, a 15-6 mark in the Big East, and appeared in three bowl games.

Before Pitt, Gattuso had a successful 12-year stint (1993-2004) as head coach at Duquesne University where he built the Dukes into one of the most elite I-AA football programs in the nation. The winningest coach in school history, the Dukes went 97-32 (.752) under his direction, won eight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) titles, made five bowl appearances, and captured the 2003 Mid-Major Division I-AA national championship.

The Western Pennsylvania native was twice named the national Mid-Major I-AA Coach of the Year and was a seven-time MAAC Coach of the Year. The Dukes dominated the conference during his tenure, going 66-7 (.904) in league play, including a 33-game winning streak.

Gattuso was an assistant coach at Duquesne in 1992 before taking over the head coaching post the following year.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.


During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle and was a two-time All-East defensive lineman at Penn State. He was a member of the Lions' 1982 national title team and graduated in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in administration and criminal justice.

Gattuso and his wife Colleen have two daughters, Jacqueline (28) and Kaitlin (23).
