Coming off the programs' first FBS victory, overcoming Buffalo 22-16, the Great Danes open CAA play at Rhode Island on Sept. 10 at Meade Stadium.

UALBANY-RHODE ISLAND SERIES

UAlbany owns a 2-1 lead in the all-time series with Rhode Island, including wins in the last two meetings. Last season, the Great Danes topped the Rams 35-7 in Albany. In their last meeting in Kingston, UAlbany captured the program's first CAA victory in program history on Sept. 20, 2014, winning 37-20.

GREAT DANES RECEIVE VOTES IN TOP 25

With the season-opening win over Buffalo, UAlbany is on the brink of breaking into the Top 25 in both the FCS Coaches Poll and the STATS FCS media poll. The Great Danes were the first team off the Coaches Top 25 list with 53 points, and fifth off the media's top 25 with 181 points. UAlbany was last ranked in the Top 25 in 2014.

Rhode Island (0-1, 0-0 CAA) comes off a 55-6 loss at Kansas. In 2015, the Rams finished the season with 1-10 overall mark and 1-7 record in the CAA. URI returns nine offensive starters and seven defensive starters from last year.

NICASTRO PICKS OFF WHERE HE LEFT OFF

Ending his season with a knee injury in UAlbany's first game of the year at Buffalo in 2015, redshirt junior linebacker Michael Nicastro picked up where he left off this year at UB. Nicastro picked off the first pass of the game and returned it 38 yards to the 7-yard line, setting up the Danes' first touchdown. Nicastro totaled 11 tackles (six solo) in the victorious opener.

SUSSMAN CONNECTS FOR TWO

Sophomore quarterback Neven Sussman totaled 113 passing yards and two touchdowns in UAlbany's win over Buffalo, completing 14-of-21 passes with no interceptions. Sussman connected a 5-yard TD pass to Anthony Manzo-Lewis just 2:03 into the game. He then threw a career-long 35-yard game-winning touchdown pass to Brad Harris with 9:37 left in the game and also hit Harris on the two-point conversion to give UAlbany a 22-16 lead.

BROWN'S BIG RETURN

At Buffalo, redshirt sophomore Kareem Brown recorded a 43-yard kickoff return with 2:24 remaining in the second quarter, putting UAlbany on the UA-47. The kickoff return set up UAlbany's second touchdown of the game that gave the Great Danes a 14-6 lead.

IBITOKUN-HANKS RUNS FOR 100

Sophomore running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks recorded his third career 100+ rushing game at Buffalo, logging 104 yards on 23 carries. He also hit the mark in back-to-back games at Richmond (202 yards, 25 carries) and Delaware (135 yards, 28 carries) in 2015.

2015 IN REVIEW

Under the direction of Head Coach Greg Gattuso, the UAlbany football team finished the 2015 season with a 3-8 overall record and 2-6 mark in the highly competitive CAA. The Great Danes played its first game against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent in program history and picked up a road win over perennial power Delaware with an extremely young roster. Redshirt freshman linebacker Julian Cox was named the CAA Co-Defensive Rookie of the Year, headlining UAlbany's cast of three who were honored by the CAA at the conclusion of the 2015 season. Cox and redshirt senior Samuel Gray were named to the defensive third team, while redshirt junior Kevin Malloy earned third-team all-conference honors for the second consecutive year on offense. In addition, 30 Great Danes were named to the conference's All-Academic Team. While the Great Danes were faced with devastating injuries on the defensive side of the ball and the growing pains of a youthful offense, 2016 looks bright as UAlbany returns all 11 starters on offense and eight defensive starters.

UALBANY RETURNS FOUR ALL-CAA PLAYERS

The Great Danes return three players who have earned All-CAA honors in their careers. Redshirt junior Kevin Malloy (OL) is a two-time selection, while redshirt sophomore Julian Cox (LB) earned third-team honors in 2015 and redshirt junior Michael Nicastro was a third-team selection in 2014. Nicastro suffered a season-ending knee injury in the first game of the season against Buffalo last fall.

• JULIAN COX, RSo, LB, New Castle, Pa.

2015 CAA Co-Defensive Rookie of the Year, Third-Team All-CAA Defense, ECAC Defensive Rookie of the Year

Cox led the Great Danes' defense with 94 tackles, including 57 solo, as well as three sacks and two quarterback hurries. In addition, he logged six tackles for a loss of 25 total yards, forced and recovered a pair of fumbles, broke up three passes, and recorded a 22-yard interception. He was also named one of 20 finalists for STATS FCS Freshman of the Year.

• KEVIN MALLOY, RSr., OL, East Northport, N.Y.

2014 and 2015 Third-Team All-CAA Offense

Malloy started all 11 games at left tackle. A repeat all-conference selection, Malloy led the offensive line that held opponents to 20 sacks this season -- the lowest amount allowed since UAlbany has been a member of the CAA. Malloy has played in every game of his three-year career and has started every contest in each of the last two seasons.

• MICHAEL NICASTRO, RJr., LB, Clarksville, Md.

2014 Third-Team All-CAA Defense

Nicastro ranked third in the CAA in 2014 with 120 tackles (54 solo),

averaging 10.0 per game. He recorded a 40-yard fumble recovery at Villanova (Nov. 15) and had a key interception for 14-yards in UAlbany's win over Stony Brook (Nov. 22). Nicastro also picked off a pass for 24-yards against Richmond (Oct. 11).

BOB FORD TO BE INDUCTED INTO UALBANY HALL OF FAME

The University at Albany has announced that it will induct Bob Ford (FB), Michelle Simpson (FH), Casey Halloran (SB), Kevin Rae (MLAX), Luke Daquino (MLAX), and the 2003 men's lacrosse team into the Athletics Hall of Fame this coming fall. The Great Dane inductees will be honored at a dinner on Friday, Oct. 7 at SEFCU Arena. The inductees will also be recognized at UAlbany's Homecoming football game versus Richmond on Saturday, Oct. 8.

• BOB FORD (1970-2013) -- FOOTBALL HEAD COACH

Bob Ford served as UAlbany's head football coach from 1970 to 2013, transitioning the program from club to Division III to Division II to Division I. He was appointed on April 27, 1970 and coached his final game on November 23, 2013. In that time, he compiled a 12-9-1 record in three seasons at the club level and a 41-season varsity record of 256-170. Including nine wins from his time as St. Lawrence's head coach, Ford's 265 career victories ranked first among active NCAA Division I college football head coaches and fourth on the all-time FCS chart. In addition, his UAlbany teams owned a 98-69 mark as a Division I FCS program. He also won four Northeast Conference Coach of the Year honors and led the Great Danes to six NEC titles. Ford acted as a mentor to over a thousand student-athletes and over 100 assistant coaches, who are now working in the high school, college, and professional ranks.

FOUR FORMER NFL PLAYERS ON STAFF

The Great Danes have four former NFL players currently on the coaching staff -- associate head coach Bernard Clark, offensive line coach Jim Sweeney, defensive line coach Delbert Cowsette, and tight ends coach Nate Byham. Clark was a linebacker for the Cincinnati Bengals and Seattle Seahawks, playing three seasons in the NFL and two in the AFL. A 16-year veteran of the NFL, Sweeney was second round pick in the 1984 draft. He was named to the All-NFL Rookie Team after his first season with the New York Jets and played 11 seasons with the Jets with 158 consecutive starts. Cowsette was drafted by the Washington Redskins and played for the New York Giants, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Chicago Bears from 2000-06. Lastly, Byham was sixth round pick in the 2010 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. He battled in 29 NFL games, playing 14 games, including three starts, with the 49ers before signing with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for the 2012

and 2013 seasons.

For the third straight year, UAlbany Football Weekly will air on MY4 (WNYA). NBC13 (WNYT) sports director Rodger Wyland along with Chris Onorato and Ashley Miller will host the 30-minute show with Great Danes football coach Greg Gattuso every Saturday at 11:30 a.m.

UALBANY TEAMS UP WITH ESPN RADIO

UAlbany agreed to a new broadcast partnership with ESPN Radio for all football and men's basketball games this year. Fans in the Capital District can tune their dials to 104.5 FM to listen in, or hear the broadcasts live online from anywhere in the world on 1045theteam.com. However, due to scheduling conflicts, UAlbany's first two football games at Buffalo and Rhode Island will be aired on Rewind 105.7 FM and rewind.1057.com.

CLASH WITH ELON TO AIR ON ASN

Announced by the CAA, UAlbany's matchup with Elon on Oct. 29 will air live on the American Sports Network. The first-time meeting will kickoff at 12 p.m. on Bob Ford Field at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. UAlbany's game is a part of CAA Football's extensive 30-game television package, which includes 18 conference matchups in conjunction with the league's broadcast partners, NBC Sports Regional Networks and the American Sports Network. ASN -- the collegiate sports initiative of the Sinclair Broadcast Group -- has affiliates that reach approximately 40 percent of U.S. households.

GREAT DANES TO OPEN 2017 AT OLD DOMINION, 2018 AT PITT

UAlbany will open the 2017 football season at Old Dominion University and the 2018 season at the University of Pittsburgh. The meetings will mark UAlbany's third and fourth Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) games. In the program's first FBS clash, the Great Danes took on Buffalo of the Mid-American Conference in the 2015 opener and again play the Bulls for the first game of 2016.

DANES PLACE 30 ON CAA ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM

UAlbany had 30 players named to the 2015 CAA Academic All-Conference Team. To be eligible for CAA Academic All-Conference honors, student-athletes must hold a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher. As a squad, the Great Danes boasted a 2.86 GPA in the spring 2016 semester and own a 2.80 cumulative team GPA.

MEDIA INFORMATION

OBTAINING CREDENTIALS

Media credentials are issued to accredited members of the media only. Requests for credentials should be made via phone, mail, or email to Lizzie Barlow in the University at Albany Athletics Media Relations office.

Space in the press box of Casey Stadium is limited, so requests should be made no later than 48 hours prior to game time. Should space become a problem, preference will be given to the primary media outlets of each school and then to media who make their requests earlier in the week.

Photographers must show their credentials in order to gain access to the photographer areas. All photographers are limited to the designated areas and may not enter the team bench areas at any time.

Local television stations shooting the game for highlight footage may do so from the sideline (except in team areas). Tripods are not permitted during the game for safety reasons.

Credentials may be picked up at the Will Call table at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium beginning two hours prior to game time. In addition, they may be picked up from the Athletics Media Relations office (PE 307) from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the day prior to the game.

RADIO INFORMATION

Broadcast positions for visiting radio stations are available in the Casey Stadium press box. Stations wishing to broadcast a game from Casey Stadium should contact the Athletics Media Relations office at least one week prior to game day. Credential and parking requests for radio staff should be submitted along with the request for phone lines.

MEDIA PARKING

Requests for parking passes should be made at the same time as credential requests. Media parking is located in the gravel lot adjacent to the PE Building/SEFCU Arena bus circle. Please note that space is limited and early arrival is recommended.

IN-GAME MEDIA SERVICES

Pre-game notes, flip cards and game programs will be distributed in the press box before each game. Box scores and scoring summaries will be provided at halftime and at the end of the game. Wireless internet is available for media to use.

POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game, a postgame press conference will be held in a designated area. Members of the Athletics Media Relations staff will help guide members of the media to the interview area. The head coach and selected players of the visiting team will be available for questions first, followed by the UAlbany Head Coach Greg Gattuso and selected players. Requests for specific UAlbany players should be made to the Athletics Media Relations staff. Interviews with opposing players should be coordinated through the visiting SID.

The locker rooms for both teams are closed at all times.

IN-SEASON INTERVIEW POLICY

All requests for in-season interviews with UAlbany players and coaches must be arranged through Lizzie Barlow at 518-852-8362 or ebarlow2@albany.edu. Media members should not contact players or coaches directly. Interview times will be arranged by the Athletics Media Relations staff based on availability of both the player and the media member. To ensure availability, please allow 24-hour notice prior to your need for an interview.

Media representatives are welcome to speak with players and coaches after practice sessions but should call in advance to confirm practice times and to arrange for parking on campus.

ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

UAlbany's intercollegiate athletics program excels at the NCAA Division I level, producing competitive teams, successful coaches, and outstanding student-athletes recognized for their accomplishments both on the field and in the classroom. The University sponsors 18 varsity sports for men and women. Club sports, an intramural program, and recreational opportunities are also offered.

UAlbany is a member of the America East Conference in 16 of 18 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, and football, a Division I FCS program, is an associate member of the Colonial Athletic Association.

UAlbany has won 91 conference championships and has made 42 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes have won eight or more conference titles in each of the last six years.

The Great Danes won eight conference championships in 2015-16 and made five NCAA Tournament appearances in field hockey, women's soccer, women's basketball, women's tennis, and men's lacrosse.

In 2014-15, UAlbany competed in a school-record six NCAA Tournaments, while winning nine conference championships, and was one of three universities in the country to have its men's basketball, women's basketball, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, field hockey, and women's golf teams make NCAA Division I Tournament appearances -- the others were Duke and North Carolina. In addition, field hockey's run to the Final Four was a first for any SUNY school, and UAlbany boasted two National Players of the Year in Paula Heuser (field hockey) and Lyle Thompson (men's lacrosse).

UAlbany has had 13 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft, eight players have been drafted by Major League Baseball, while 12 football players have inked NFL contracts.

UAlbany's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are among the most comprehensive in the Northeast. In 2012-2013, the University constructed a state-of-the-art 8,500 seat multi-sport complex for football and soccer; a brand new track and field venue; and a synthetic turf field designed for year-round recreational, intramural and club sport activities. Also in recent years, UAlbany built two all-weather athletic fields. John Fallon Field is home to the men's and women's lacrosse teams, and an adjacent surface known as Alumni Turf Field is home to field hockey, in addition to serving as a multi-use recreational field for UAlbany students.

The Great Danes' indoor facilities are also top-notch. SEFCU Arena, the Physical Education Building, and an air-supported bubble are utilized for sporting and cultural activities. In addition, there are lighted tennis courts, racquetball/squash/handball courts, a swimming pool, a dance studio, and a fitness and weight training center. The Department of Athletics & Recreation is located in both the SEFCU Arena and the Physical Education Building, (518-442-DANE).

HEAD COACH GREG GATTUSO

With a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround in his inaugural season in 2014. Going undefeated in non-conference play while opening the season with four straight victories, the Great Danes received votes in the national polls for 10 consecutive weeks. UAlbany appeared in The Sports Network Top-25 for four weeks, ranking as high as No. 23.

Enforcing discipline and care of the football, UAlbany led the nation in turnover margin (1.25) as well as fumble recoveries (20), while quarterback Will Fiacchi became UAlbany's all-time leading passer with 7,150 career yards and broke the program's single-season passing record with 2,636 yards.

Marking the University's second season as an associate member of the CAA, Gattuso led the Danes to the program's first three CAA wins, overcoming

Rhode Island, Maine, and Stony Brook.

Under Gattuso's direction, UAlbany had a group of seven players who were honored by the CAA. Running back Omar Osbourne was named to the second team, while tight end Brian Parker, offensive lineman Kevin Malloy, place kicker Patrick Toole, and linebacker Michael Nicastro were all named to the CAA's third team. In addition, wide receiver Jake Meek was the recipient of the Chuck Boone Leadership Award.

In 2015, the Danes earned CAA victories over Rhode Island and perennial power Delaware, and had three earn all-conference accolades. As a redshirt freshman, Julian Cox was named the Defensive Rookie of the Year and was named to the third team along with Kevin Malloy and Samuel Gray.

Greg Gattuso, a former head coach at Duquesne University and assistant head coach at both Pittsburgh and Maryland, was named the University at Albany's head football coach in December of 2013. Gattuso became the second football coach in the program's 41-varsity season history, taking the reins from program architect Bob Ford.

Throughout both his playing and coaching career, Gattuso boasts a long history of exceptional success. As a defensive lineman at Penn State, Gattuso helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach and hauled in a top-10 recruiting class.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's University of Maryland coaching staff. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was

promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

During his tenure with the Terrapins, Gattuso developed current New England Patriot Joe Vellano into an NFL-ready defensive lineman, as Vellano earned All-America and All-ACC honors. In addition, Gattuso tutored All-ACC defensive lineman A.J. Francis, who signed with the Miami Dolphins at the conclusion of his collegiate career.

Prior to Maryland, Gattuso spent six seasons at Pittsburgh (2005-10) where he turned the Panthers' defensive line into one of the team's major strengths. The line was one of the top sack producers in the nation, as Brandon Lindsey (10.0) and Jabaal Sheard (9.0) both ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks during the 2010 regular season and Pittsburgh led the nation in that category in 2009 (3.6 per game). Gattuso developed three Big East Defensive Player of the Year winners, as Sheard received the honor in 2010, and defensive linemen Greg Romeus and Mick Williams shared the award in 2009.

Gattuso initially joined the Pitt staff as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator in 2005. In his first season, he helped the Panthers sign a recruiting class rated 10th in the nation by Scout.com, 16th by ESPN.com and 21st by Rivals.com. He began coaching the defensive line in 2006 and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2008. Scout.com named Gattuso the Big East Recruiter of the Year in 2007. During his tenure, The Panthers logged a 26-12 overall record, a 15-6 mark in the Big East, and appeared in three bowl games.

Before Pitt, Gattuso had a successful 12-year stint (1993-2004) as head coach at Duquesne University where he built the Dukes into one of the most elite I-AA football programs in the nation. The winningest coach in school history, the Dukes went 97-32 (.752) under his direction, won eight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) titles, made five bowl appearances, and captured the 2003 Mid-Major Division I-AA national championship.

The Western Pennsylvania native was twice named the national Mid-Major I-AA Coach of the Year and was a seven-time MAAC Coach of the Year. The Dukes dominated the conference during his tenure, going 66-7 (.904) in league play, including a 33-game winning streak.

Gattuso was an assistant coach at Duquesne in 1992 before taking over the head coaching post the following year.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.

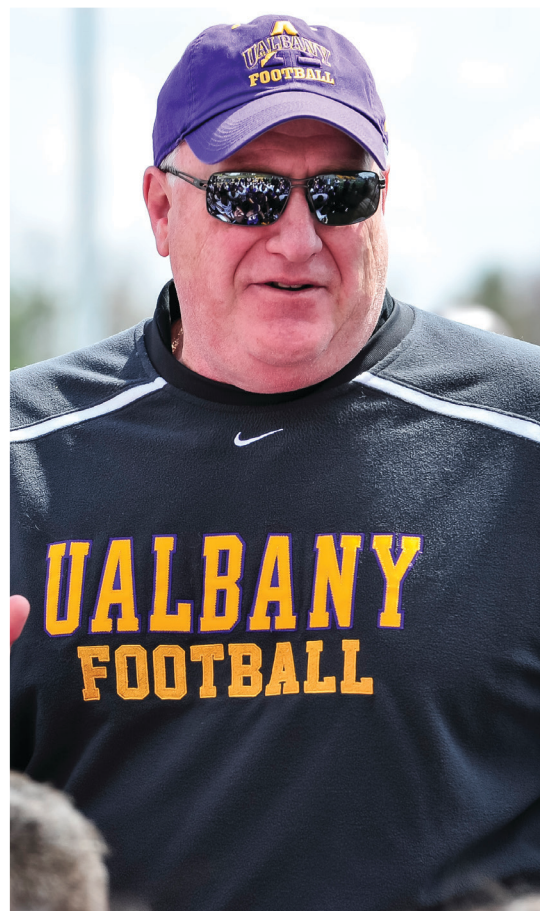
During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle and was a two-time All-East defensive lineman at Penn State. He was a member of the Lions' 1982 national title team and graduated in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in administration and criminal justice.

Gattuso and his wife Colleen have two daughters, Jacqueline (28) and Kaitlin (23).
