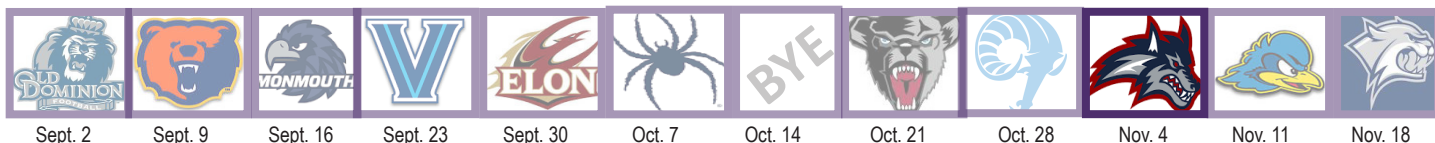

ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

UAlbany is a member of the America East Conference in 16 of 18 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), and football, a Division I FCS program, is an associate member of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). UAlbany has earned the Stuart P. Haskell Jr. Commissioner's Cup for five consecutive years and six times overall.

UAlbany has won 100 conference championships and has made 48 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes have won seven or more conference titles in each of the past seven years. UAlbany won its 100th conference title on May 14, 2017, with softball taking the America East Tournament. Going into the 2017-18 school year, UAlbany has won 93 America East Tournament championships, six Northeast Conference (NEC) season titles in football and one MAAC title in women's golf.

During the 2016-17 school year, UAlbany earned an America East-record nine championships: men's and women's soccer; women's basketball; men's and women's indoor track and field; men's lacrosse and softball. Men's soccer and men's lacrosse each won NCAA Tournament games to lead UAlbany to finish No. 40 nationally in the 2016-17 Capital One Cup. Women's basketball won a conference record sixth consecutive America East Tournament, the longest such streak for any basketball team in the league.

Throughout its Division I history, UAlbany has had 14 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft and nine players drafted by Major League Baseball. Thirteen football players have inked NFL contracts.

FOR STARTERS

The University at Albany will be looking to snap a four-game losing streak when it takes on No. 14/22 Stony Brook on the road Saturday.

- Before losing 31-14 to Rhode Island this past weekend, the Great Danes' previous three CAA losses had come by a combined 11 points.
- This will be UAlbany's fourth game this season against a team ranked in the FCS Top 25. Earlier, the Great Danes beat then-No. 7/8 Villanova for the program's first ever win over a Top 10 team. UAlbany also lost to then-No. 23 Elon and then-No. 14 Richmond.
- The teams are meeting for the fifth time in the "Empire Clash." The winner receives The Golden Apple trophy.

MOST RECENT MEETING (Nov. 19, 2016)

With a 13-6 victory, UAlbany won the fourth annual Empire Clash at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. With the win, the Great Danes finished the 2016 regular season with a 7-4 overall record and 4-4 mark in the CAA. Redshirt sophomore kicker Ethan Stark recorded a career-best 50-yard field goal -- the third longest in program history -- as well as a 21-yard field goal, accounting for six of UAlbany's 13 points. Defensively, redshirt senior cornerback Rayshan Clark tied UAlbany's DI single-game record with two interceptions in addition to returning a fumble recovery 2 yards for a touchdown.

UALBANY'S LAST TIME OUT

Eli Mencer scored on a 69-yard fumble return in the fourth quarter, but UAlbany couldn't complete a second-half comeback in a 31-14 loss to Rhode Island on Saturday at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. The redshirt sophomore linebacker scored his second touchdown of the season, and the Great Danes got a defensive touchdown for the second straight week. Freshman tailback Karl Mofor also scored his team-leading fifth touchdown for UAlbany on a 1-yard run, and senior linebacker Nate Hatalsky totaled 21 tackles (six solo), a school Division I Football Championship Subdivision record. But the Great Danes couldn't overcome a 21-0 halftime deficit.

FAMILIAR FOES

- UAlbany and Stony Brook have met 18 times, with the Great Danes leading the all-time series 11-7.
- The Great Danes have won two of the past three meetings.
- This marks the first time since 2012 that the two SUNY schools are not facing each other on the final week of the regular season.
- The teams faced each other as members of the Northeast Conference until 2007, when Stony Brook left the league to become an independent for one year, before joining the Big South in 2008. Both programs joined the CAA in 2013.

MEDIA INFORMATION

OBTAINING CREDENTIALS

Media credentials are issued to accredited members of the media only. Requests for credentials should be made via phone, mail, or email to Pete Iorizzo in the University at Albany Athletics Media Relations office.

Space in the press box of Bob Ford Field is limited, so requests should be made no later than 48 hours prior to game time. Should space become a problem, preference will be given to the primary media outlets of each school and then to media who make their requests earlier in the week.

Photographers must show their credentials in order to gain access to the photographer areas. All photographers are limited to the designated areas and may not enter the team bench areas at any time.

Local television stations shooting the game for highlight footage may do so from the sideline (except in team areas). Tripods are not permitted during the game for safety reasons.

Credentials may be picked up at the Will Call table at Bob Ford Field beginning two hours prior to game time. In addition, they may be picked up from the Athletics Media Relations office (PE 307) from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the day prior to the game.

RADIO INFORMATION

Broadcast positions for visiting radio stations are available in the Bob Ford Field press box. Stations wishing to broadcast a game from Bob Ford Field should contact the Athletics Media Relations office at least one week prior to game day. Credential and parking requests for radio staff should be submitted along with the request for phone lines.

MEDIA PARKING

Requests for parking passes should be made at the same time as credential requests. Media parking is located in the gravel lot adjacent to the PE Building/ SEFCU Arena bus circle. Please note that space is limited and early arrival is recommended.

IN-GAME MEDIA SERVICES

Pre-game notes, flip cards and game programs will be distributed in the press box before each game. Box scores and scoring summaries will be provided at halftime and at the end of the game. Wireless internet is available for media to use.

- UAlbany lost to Stony Brook, 31-28, on Nov. 26, 2011, in the Great Danes' only FCS playoff appearance.

STONY BROOK COACH HAS UALBANY TIES

- Stony Brook head coach Chuck Priore played four seasons at UAlbany under coach Bob Ford, starting at fullback for three seasons and serving as the team captain as a senior in 1982.
- Priore spent three seasons at his alma mater as the running backs coach from 1983 to 1986.

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE

Under defensive coordinator Bernard Clark, the UAlbany defense is allowing just 18.4 points per game, fourth-best in the CAA and 15th best nationally.

- Only two tailbacks have gained 100 yards against UAlbany this season. Maine's Josh Mack ran for 108 yards, and the other was Elon's Malcom Summers (171).
- UAlbany's defense includes the CAA leader in tackles (Nate Hatalsky, 89) and forced fumbles (Eli Mencer, 4).

HATALSKY SETS SINGLE-GAME TACKLES RECORD

Senior linebacker Nate Hatalsky set a UAlbany Division I record with 21 total tackles (6 solo, 15 assisted) Saturday against Rhode Island. The previous record was 18, accomplished four times. The all-time school record, at any level, is 24, set by Don Mion against Alfred on Sept. 28, 1974.

- A former basketball and football standout at Mechnicville High School, about half an hour outside Albany, Hatalsky was a walk-on with the program when he enrolled in 2013. He was awarded a full scholarship this past summer after winning the starting linebacker job during the preseason.
- He leads the CAA with 89 total tackles (40 solo, 49 assisted).
- Hatalsky leads the CAA and is 11th nationally with 11.1 tackles per game. He was named CAA Defensive Player of the Week after tying for a game-high with 15 tackles against Monmouth.

MENCER PROVIDES BIG PLAYS AT LINEBACKER

A standout running back in high school, redshirt sophomore Eli Mencer, a native of Altoona, Pa., has excelled at linebacker since changing positions before his redshirt season in 2015.

- Mencer recovered a fumble and returned it 69 yards for a touchdown against Rhode Island. It was his second fumble-return-for-touchdown of the season; the other was an 80-yard

score that finished off UAlbany's 19-10 overtime victory over Villanova.

- Mencer leads UAlbany with 7.5 tackles for loss.
- As a senior running back at Altoona High School, Mencer rushed for 1,280 yards and 23 touchdowns.

ROBINSON SHINES AT CORNER

UAlbany's Jamal Robinson, a senior from Mitchellville, Md., is enjoying a standout season.

- Robinson has been credited with 10 passes defended, the fourth-most in the CAA.
- Against Maine, Robinson recorded his first interception of the season and fifth of his career. He also was UAlbany's co-leader (Eli Mencer) with 12 tackles, including six solo.
- Robinson has appeared in every game during his career and was a member of the CAA All-Academic team in each of his

first three seasons.

- Robinson expects to graduate in December with his undergraduate degree in sociology. He plans to pursue a career in law enforcement or coaching.

HOSKINS MAKES IMPACT ON D-LINE

Malachi Hoskins, a member of the All-CAA Preseason Team, has been an impact player at defensive end during his senior season.

- The Windsor, Conn., native leads the team with three sacks.
- He's second on the team with 7.0 tackles for loss and two forced fumbles.

MOFOR LEADS WAY AT TAILBACK

The Great Danes will play the remainder of the season without STATS Preseason All-American tailback Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks, who's out with a lower-body injury. Ibitokun-Hanks, who will

apply for a medical hardship waiver after the season, appeared in only one game, rushing for 64 yards in a Week 3 victory over Monmouth. Freshman Karl Mofor has handled the carries in his absence.

- The 5-foot-8, 219-pound Mofor, from Greenbelt, Md., ranks fifth in the CAA with 58.5 yards per game. He's averaging 4.1 yards per carry.
- Mofor rushed for 100 yards for the first time in his career against Maine, gaining 105 yards. It was UAlbany's first 100-yard rushing performance this season.
- Previously, Mofor nearly had rushed for 100 yards in Weeks 1, 3 and 5. He posted 99 yards and scored a TD at Old Dominion and ran for 98 yards and two more scores against Morgan State. Against Elon, he rushed 19 times for 95 yards.
- Mofor leads UAlbany with five touchdowns scored.
- Mofor made his first career start against Villanova. He gained 43 yards on 19 carries while also catching five passes for 49 yards. He scored on a 4-yard touchdown run, too.

BRUNSON'S CAREER DAY AT QB

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Will Brunson threw for a career-high 339 yards in the Great Danes' 41-38 double-overtime loss against Richmond.

- Brunson's 339 yards were the most by a Great Danes quarterback since Will Fiacchi, now an offensive assistant coach, threw for 335 against Delaware on Nov. 8, 2014.
- Brunson's passing yards also were the fourth most in program history, just behind Fiacchi's 341 on Oct. 11, 2014, against Richmond.
- Brunson appeared in four games in 2016, starting the final two, before emerging as the starting quarterback entering this season.

HARRIS EYES "SECRET" FUTURE

Senior wide receiver Brad Harris, who already earned his bachelor's degree in sociology this past summer, now is enrolled UAlbany's College of Emergency Preparedness, Homeland Security and Cyber Security. He hopes to pursue a career with the Secret Service or Drug Enforcement Administration. Harris has 13 catches for 118 yards this season.

SUSSMAN A DOUBLE THREAT AT QB AND PUNTER

Junior Neven Sussman is serving as the Great Danes backup quarterback and punter this season. At quarterback, he sees spot duty in place of starter Will Brunson because of his ability to both run and throw.

- Sussman is UAlbany's third-leading rusher, having carried the ball 38 times for 108 yards and scored two touchdowns.
- Sussman has completed 11-of-25 passes for 157 yards.
- As a punter, Sussman is averaging 37.4 yards per kick, including a long of 59 yards against Rhode Island. He has

four punts of 50 yards or more and has placed 11 punts inside the 20-yard line.

MCDONALD SHINES ON RETURNS

Sophomore wide receiver Donovan McDonald has been a special-teams standout both on punt and kickoff returns.

- The transfer from Nebraska, where he both played football and ran middle-distances for the track team, leads the CAA and ranks No. 17 nationally with an average of 25.5 yards per kickoff return.
- McDonald is second in the CAA and 12th nationally with an average of 11.3 yards per punt return.
- On Sept. 21, the coaching staff surprised McDonald by announcing before practice that he was being granted a full scholarship.

2016 SEASON IN REVIEW

The Great Danes narrowly missed an FCS playoff berth in their most successful season yet as a member of the CAA. UAlbany opened the season with the program's first FBS victory, beating Buffalo, 22-16. The Great Danes started the season 4-0 and were ranked a program-record six consecutive weeks, reaching as high as No. 16 in the STATS Poll. UAlbany closed the season with consecutive CAA wins, beating No. 21 New Hampshire on the road, 36-25, and then ending with a 13-6 home win over Stony Brook. It was a standout season for running back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks, who finished with a CAA-best 1,401 yards. UAlbany also was strong defensively, allowing just 18.8 points per game, second-best in the CAA. The Danes also were No. 2 in the league in turnover margin at plus-16.

NFL COACHING CONNECTIONS

The Great Danes have four former NFL players currently on the coaching staff associate head coach Bernard Clark, offensive line coach Jim Sweeney, defensive line coach Delbert Cowsette, and tight ends coach Nate Byham.

- Clark was a linebacker for the Cincinnati Bengals and Seattle Seahawks, playing three seasons in the NFL and two in the AFL. A 16-year veteran of the NFL,
- Sweeney was second round pick in the 1984 draft. He was named to the All-NFL Rookie Team after his first season with the New York Jets; he played 11 seasons with the Jets, with 158 consecutive starts.
- Cowsette was drafted by the Washington Redskins and played for the New York Giants, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Chicago Bears from 2000-2006.
- Byham was a sixth-round pick in the 2010 Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. He played in 29 NFL games, playing 14 games, including three starts, with the 49ers before signing with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for 2012 and 2013.

HEAD COACH GREG GATTUSO



Greg Gattuso enters his fourth season at the helm of the UAlbany football program in 2017.

UAlbany had its best season as a CAA member in 2016, finishing 7-4 with a 4-4 conference tally and was ranked for five weeks, including as high as #16. UAlbany earned its first-ever victory over an FBS opponent with a 22-16 road win over Buffalo plus earned wins over NCAA Tournament participants New Hampshire and Saint Francis. The Great Danes earned a program record six All-CAA players, including three on the First Team with Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks, an All-American with 1,401 rushing yards for fourth in all of FCS, Anthony Manzo-Lewis and Michael Nicastro.

With a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 mark in the CAA, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround in his inaugural season in 2014. Going undefeated in non-conference play while opening the season with four straight victories, the Great Danes received votes in the national polls for 10 consecutive weeks. UAlbany

appeared in The Sports Network Top-25 for four weeks, ranking as high as No. 23.

Enforcing discipline and care of the football, UAlbany led the nation in turnover margin (1.25) as well as fumble recoveries (20), while quarterback Will Fiacchi became UAlbany's all-time leading passer with 7,150 career yards and broke the program's single-season passing record with 2,636 yards.

Marking the University's second season as an associate member of the CAA, Gattuso led the Danes to the program's first three CAA wins, overcoming Rhode Island, Maine, and Stony Brook.

Under Gattuso's direction, UAlbany had a group of seven players who were honored by the CAA. Running back Omar Osbourne was named to the second team, while tight end Brian Parker, offensive lineman Kevin Malloy, place kicker Patrick Toole, and linebacker Michael Nicastro were all named to the CAA's third team. In addition, wide receiver Jake Meek was the recipient of the Chuck Boone Leadership Award.

In 2015, the Danes earned CAA victories over Rhode Island and perennial power Delaware, and had three earn all-conference accolades. As a redshirt freshman, Julian Cox was named the Defensive Rookie of the Year and was named to the third team along with Kevin Malloy and Samuel Gray.

Gattuso, a former head coach at Duquesne University and assistant head coach at both Pittsburgh and Maryland, was named the University at Albany's head football coach in December of 2013. Gattuso became the second football coach in the program's 41-varsity season history, taking the reins from program architect Bob Ford.

Throughout both his playing and coaching career, Gattuso boasts a long history of exceptional success. As a defensive lineman at Penn State, Gattuso helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title

in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach and hauled in a top-10 recruiting class.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's University of Maryland coaching staff. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

During his tenure with the Terrapins, Gattuso developed current NFL player Joe Vellano into an NFL-ready defensive lineman, as Vellano earned All-America and All-ACC honors. In addition, Gattuso tutored All-ACC defensive lineman A.J. Francis, who signed with the Miami Dolphins at the conclusion of his collegiate career.

Prior to Maryland, Gattuso spent six seasons at Pittsburgh (2005-10) where he turned the Panthers' defensive line into one of the team's major strengths. The line was one of the top sack producers in the nation, as Brandon Lindsey (10.0) and Jabaal Sheard (9.0) both ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks during the 2010 regular season and Pittsburgh led the nation in that category in 2009 (3.6 per game). Gattuso developed three Big East Defensive Player of the Year winners, as Sheard received the honor in 2010, and defensive linemen Greg Romeus and Mick Williams shared the award in 2009.

Gattuso initially joined the Pitt staff as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator in 2005. In his first season, he helped the Panthers sign a recruiting class rated 10th in the nation by Scout.com, 16th by ESPN.com and 21st by Rivals.com. He began coaching the defensive line in 2006 and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2008. Scout.com named Gattuso the Big East Recruiter of the Year in 2007. During his tenure, The Panthers logged a 26-12 overall record, a 15-6 mark in the Big East, and appeared in three bowl games.

Before Pitt, Gattuso had a successful 12-year stint (1993-2004) as head coach at Duquesne University where he built the Dukes into one of the most elite I-AA football programs in the nation. The winningest coach in school history, the Dukes went 97-32 (.752) under his direction, won eight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) titles, made five bowl appearances, and captured the 2003 Mid-Major Division I-AA national championship.

The Western Pennsylvania native was twice named the national Mid-Major I-AA Coach of the Year and was a seven-time MAAC Coach of the Year. The Dukes dominated the conference during his tenure, going 66-7 (.904) in league play, including a 33-game winning streak.

Gattuso was an assistant coach at Duquesne in 1992 before taking over the head coaching post the following year.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.

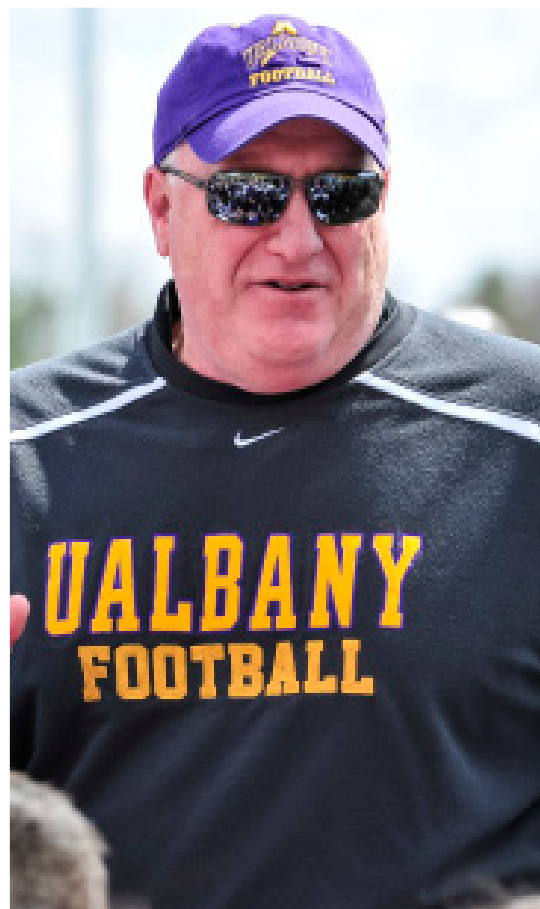
During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle and was a two-time All-East defensive lineman at Penn State. He was a member of the Lions' 1982 national title team and graduated in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in administration and criminal justice.

Gattuso and his wife Colleen have two daughters, Jacqueline and Kaitlin.
