UALBANY STARTS 2018 SEASON WITH ANNUAL BATTLE AT SYRACUSE UAlbany is set to begin its 2018 campaign with a battle of the topranked teams in the state of New York as the Great Danes visit Syracuse on Saturday, February 17th at 2 p.m.

This game sees a pair of 2017 NCAA Quarterfinalists and conference regular season champions. UAlbany, the defending America East Tournament champion, is playing its first game of the year, coming off a 15-3 season in 2017. Syracuse, from the ACC, won its season opener last Saturday with a 21-4 victory vs. Binghamton, going 13-3 last year.

UAlbany earned its highest preseason rankings in program history, currently ranking #3 in the the USILA Coaches Poll and #4 in the Inside Lacrosse Maverik Media Poll. Syracuse comes in at #8 and #7 in the polls respectively. The two are the top-ranked programs in the Empire State.

The two teams met on February 18th in the Carrier Dome last season, with Syracuse winning 10-9 off a goal with 1.9 seconds left. Syracuse leads the all-time series 15-1 against UAlbany, including winning the last five. UAlbany's lone win came in 2013, a 16-15 double overtime victory. This is the sixth time in the last seven years that UAlbany opens the year at Syracuse.

UALBANY PREDICTED TO FINISH FIRST IN AMERICA EAST IN '18

For the sixth straight season, UAlbany has been predicted to finish first in the America East in the preseason coaches poll. It is the fifth consecutive season that UAlbany was a unanimous pick to finish first. UAlbany is undefeated in America East regular season play since the start of 2013. The rest of the poll is filled out by Stony Brook, Vermont, UMBC, Hartford, Binghamton and UMass Lowell.

FIELDS - 2017 TEWAARATON FINALIST

Connor Fields was one of five male collegiate players to be named to a 2017 Tewaaraton Trophy finalist on May 11th.

UAlbany has had at least one Tewaaraton finalist four of the past five years. Fields earned a spot in the final five for the first time.

The Tewaaraton Trophy is given to the top player in college lacrosse. On the men's side, UAlbany's Miles and Lyle Thompson shared the 2014 Tewaaraton Trophy, with Lyle winning it outright in 2015.

FIELDS - GOING FOR NCAA SCORING RECORDS

Connor Fields has a chance to set numerous NCAA scoring records this season.

He is currently 20th all-time in Division I with 278 career points off 165 goals and 113 assists. He is two away from 19th by Stan Cockerton, who had 280 with N.C. State from 1977-80. The record is 400 by UAlbany's Lyle Thompson from 2012-15.

He is also tied for 25th all-time in DI with 165 goals in his career. He is one goal away from 24th, held by Joseph Radin at Marist from 2013-16. The record is 206 by Duke's Zack Greer from 2005-08.

With 113 assists, he is 30 away from the top-25 all-time in DI. The record is 225 by Lyle Thompson from 2012-15.

UALBANY - LONGEST CONFERENCE WINNING STREAK IN DI

With five consecutive undefeated regular seasons, UAlbany has the longest active winning streak in conference games with 28, dating back to 2013.

UAlbany is the only DI team to go undefeated in league play in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017. Two schools, UAlbany and Denver, had undefeated conference regular seasons the past four years.

UAlbany formerly had a streak of 28 victories against America East opponents until May 5, 2016 after a 11-10 overtime defeat to Hartford in the America East Tournament semifinal round.

FIELDS RISING UP THE UALBANY RECORD BOOKS

Connor Fields is continuing to rise in the UAlbany record books in goals, assists and points.

On a season basis, his 66 goals in 2015 were second-most in UAlbany history and a freshman NCAA Division I record. His 117 points in 2017 is the fourth-highest single season scoring total in Division I history. The 2017 Tewaaraton finalist and three-time USILA All-American also has three of the top-15 point-scoring seasons in UAlbany history.

FIVE GREAT DANES NAMED IL MEDIA PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Five UAlbany players were named to the Inside Lacrosse Preseason Media All-America Team. This was the first year of this team selected by media members across the country.

Attack **Connor Fields** was named to the All-America First Team, faceoff specialist **TD Ierlan** was placed on the Second Team, midfielder **Kyle McClancy** is on the Third Team while goalkeeper **JD Colarusso** and attack **Tehoka Nanticoke** are Honorable Mention All-America.

UALBANY #3 IN COACHES POLL, #4 IN MEDIA POLL

With UAlbany not playing in the first weekend of the year, UAlbany stands at #3 in the USILA Coaches Poll and went to #4 and the *Inside Lacrosse* Maverik Media Poll.

The Great Danes have been ranked in the top-16 of both polls each week since May 2, 2014.

In the preseason, UAlbany was #3 in the coaches poll and #3 in the media poll. It is the fifth consecutive year that UAlbany has ranked in the top-13 in the preseason.

Tehoka Nanticoke comes to UAlbany, being ranked the #1 recruit by Inside Lacrosse in the Class of 2017. He was the team MVP of the U19 Iroquois Nationals in the 2016 World Games.

He is the second #1 overall recruit ever to play for the Great Danes, the other being Lyle Thompson of the Class of 2011.

UALBANY ALUMNI RETURN TO COACH THE TEAM

UAlbany head coach Scott Marr has brought back three of his former players to assist the team this season.

Liam Gleason '07 returns for his seventh season as the associate head coach and defensive coordinator for UAlbany. Merrick Thomson '07, who stands fourth in UAlbany history with 244 points, will serve as an assistant coach and offensive coordinator for the third season.

The team's volunteer assistant coach in his second season is **Derrick Eccles** '16, a former twotime team captain in the UAlbany midfield.

NATIVE AMERICANS WITH UALBANY

Seven Native Americans will compete with UAIbany this season, including some that have competed internationally with the Iroquois Nationals.

8-Seed UAlbany Season Ends vs. 1-Seed Maryland in NCAA Quarters

NEWARK, Del. - The 8-seed UAlbany men's lacrosse team saw its great season come to close on Sunday afternoon in Delaware after an 18-9 defeat vs. 1-seed Maryland in the NCAA Quarterfinal round.

UAlbany (15-3) recovered from an early two-goal deficit against Maryland (14-3), but was victim to a proceeding 8-0 run. UAlbany could not get closer and fell in front of 9,711 at Delaware Stadium.

"It was a special year for us, starting in September all the way through today," said UAlbany head coach Scott Marr. "Unfortunately, today just wasn't our day, we were just missing something, but a lot of that had to do with Maryland, they are a very good team."

This ends the career of the eight-member UAlbany senior class, the winningest class in program history. The class combined for three America East Tournament titles, four NCAA Tournament appearances, three NCAA quarterfinal appearances, the program's first-ever at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament and a combined 55-16 record.

"I've talked all year about my seniors," said Marr. "We had one bad practice the entire year. That comes from senior leadership. They had our guys prepared for practice every day, prepared for every game that we played. Their enthusiasm, their positive attitude. I cannot say enough about how good they were. For a class that maybe did not have a [superstar] name. With Connor [Fields] being a year behind them, they were an in-between class. Sometimes the classes without a superstar are your best classes, and it's a collective superstar. And that's what they gave us this year. They were very powerful in how they motivated the team every week."

mountain, defeating Binghamton 20-8 in the conference title game. UAlbany earned the right to host an NCAA Tournament First Round game in 10 years, knocking off defending national champion North Carolina 15-12.

Six different players scored goals for UAlbany, led by Connor Fields, who had three goals and one assist. Fields finished the year with 117 points, fourth all-time in NCAA single season points. He stands only behind UAlbany greats Lyle Thompson (128 in 2014, 121 in 2015) and Miles Thompson (119 in 2014).

Adam Osika scored on both of his shots on the cage. TD Ierlan won 14-of-30 faceoffs with eight ground balls. JD Colarusso got the loss in goal with five saves and 13 goals allowed in 28:56, while Nate Siekierski had five saves and five allowed in 31:04 of play.

For Maryland, Matt Rambo had eight points off four goals and four assists, while Connor Kelly netted five goals. Dan Morris picked up the victory in goal with 10 saves and nine goals allowed in the opening 56:58.

Maryland scored the first two goals after stopping UAlbany on offense, with Rambo scoring on a turnaround shot and Bryce Young hitting a shot in transition. UAlbany got those goals back quickly with a charge to the cage and score from Osika and then Fields hitting a narrow shot close range inside the right post to make it 2-2 five minutes in.

Maryland hit another transition goal from a defender, then after a won faceoff, Rambo scored a second off a spin move. Maryland got the next possession and scored again with Rambo heading to the cage. UAlbany held off a couple more Maryland possessions in the quarter, but the Terrapins added another goal on a Tim Rotanz bounce shot. Maryland led 6-2 after one.

A straight away goal from Kelly minutes into the second quarter continued the run for Maryland. Maryland added to the run with three more goals, one in transition, one off a ground ball out of a scrum and a third on a long range fire from Rotanz, making it 10-2 Maryland.

Coach Marr called a timeout while UAlbany was on offense; the Great Danes responded with Fields rushing to the cage and scoring while pushed into the crease.

After Maryland scored two more goals, Fields got one back just before the end of the half, firing from a three-quarters motion and scoring low. UAlbany trailed 12-4 at the break.

Maryland scored the first two goals in the third quarter to build the lead up to 10. On a second chance, Sean Eccles got the pass from Fields in front of the net for the shot and score. Despite a couple of saves from UAlbany keepers, Maryland added another trio of goals, leading 17-5 after three.

UAlbany struck first in the opening of the fourth as Troy Reh buried his high shot in transition from Kyle McClancy. After Maryland got the goal back, Jack Burgmaster scored quickly off the faceoff, then John Glancy nailed a laser on the run in the top corner.

UAlbany's defense held on Maryland's long possessions the rest of the way, adding a transition goal as Osika scored close range from Connor Filipowski. But UAlbany could not bridge the gap and fell 18-9.

#12/12 UAlbany Edged in Final Seconds at #6/6 Syracuse 10-9

SYRACUSE, **N.Y.** – In an absolute thriller in the Carrier Dome, the #12/12 UAlbany men's lacrosse team fell in its season opener to #6/6 Syracuse 10-9 after the gamewinner was scored with 1.9 seconds left to play.

UAlbany (0-1), up three at the half to Syracuse (2-0), was down 7-6 going into the final quarter. Goals by Sean Eccles and Bennett Drake pushed UAlbany ahead, then Syracuse went back up. Eccles again tied it up with 3:43 left, but a Nick Mariano goal in the closing seconds gave Syracuse the win.

"It was a heck of a game, I am really proud of our team and our effort today," said UAlbany head coach Scott Marr. "You can't ask for a better opening game with the heart that we showed."

"We are losing are trainer, Anthony Benyarko, who is taking a job at the University of Maryland," added Marr. "I can't tell you how much he has meant for our program; he has been our trainer for 11 years, and it is sad to see him go, I know our guys appreciated him and he is a wonderful human being."

In his first-ever start between the pipes, JD Colarusso had 13 saves, including five in the first quarter, and four ground balls. Eli Lasda forced three turnovers on the defense and the ride, plus scored a goal.

Eccles finished with two goals and an assist while Drake had two goals. Connor Fields earned four assists on the day.

Colarusso got a shot on him three minutes in, knocking it down with his shoulder. UAlbany sprinted down as Kyle McClancy took it across and buried a shot into the top right corner. Colarusso saved a third chance shot on SU's next possession at the shoulder, leading to a UAlbany clear. After a hard shot by Eccles drew iron, Jack Burgmaster stutter stepped around his defender and scored the line drive shot inside the left post for a 2-0 UAlbany lead with 8:16 in the 1st.

Syracuse got a goal back quickly after a clear on a catch and shoot by Tyson Bomberry. Colarusso kept stopping Syracuse shots high and low, the fifth save leading to a clear. In the closing seconds of the first quarter, Fields passed across the fan to Lasda, who threw a shot inside the right post from 10 meters out, giving UAlbany a 3-1 lead after one quarter.

Troy Reh quickly scored in the start of the second, grabbing the faceoff, racing to the cage and scoring on a highlow shot. After getting a turnover the other way, UAlbany drew a man-up situation. Fields found Drake next to the goal circle for the catch and shoot goal. Less than a minute later, Eccles found Jakob Patterson for a ground ball shot and score from the lefty to make it 6-1 UAlbany with 10:40 left in the 2nd.

Syracuse added a pair of quick goals, one on man-up and the other on a run to the cage from Pat Carlin. UAlbany held off Syracuse for the rest of the half, including Stone Sims holding off a couple of Orange cutters towards the cage. UAlbany went into the locker room leading 6-3.

UAlbany picked up an early man-up chance shortly into the third quarter, ending with a shot by Justin Reh hitting the post. Syracuse got a goal back from Matt Lane, with Colarusso saving the next pair of shots on goal, including one just after a man-down situation, then assisting on the ride by grabbing a pass well in front of the goal circle.

Late in the 3rd, Syracuse scored three goals in a span of 85 seconds, capped by defender Austin Fusco scoring on a fast break after a won faceoff. Syracuse had a 7-6 lead after three quarters.

Colarusso saved another couple of shots to begin the fourth quarter, including a high one from Nick Mariano. UAlbany broke its drought just under five minutes into the 4th, as Eccles lasered a shot from the hip into the top right corner. Next possession, started by a Colarusso save again, led to Patterson drawing a double team to free Drake for the shot and score, putting UAlbany ahead 8-7 with 7:35 to play.

Syracuse got the lead back with two goals in a row from Salcido, going up 9-8 with 4:14 in the 4th. UAlbany struck back quickly after a timeout as Eccles threw another rocket into the game, tying the game at 9-9 with 3:43 left.

UAlbany got the ball back in the closing minute, having a shot clock called on them. Adam Osika sent a shot high, then another chance was blocked. Syracuse cleared with 1:19 left. UAlbany held against two high shots, but a third chance by Mariano was a goal with 1.6 seconds left, giving Syracuse the win 10-9.

Scott Marr begins his 18th season as UAlbany's head coach. The only coach hired in the Division I era at the University at Albany, Marr, a five-time America East Coach of the Year, has coached the Great Danes to eight America East Tournament titles, nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and four NCAA Tournament victories. He has a 163-111 career record at UAlbany and has coached Tewaaraton winners in 2014 and 2015, 29 All-Americans, six Tewaaraton finalists, two Lt. Raymond J. Enners Award winners for Most Outstanding DI Player, three Lt. Col. J.L. Turnbull Award winners for the best Attackman in the nation, eight America East Players of the Year and 102 all-conference players.

In 2017, UAlbany was ranked as high as #4 in the nation for the second straight year, running the table in the America East regular season and tournament to finish 15-3 overall, defeating defending NCAA champion North Carolina in front of 6,472 at Casey Stadium to earn a spot in the NCAA Quarterfinals for the third time in four seasons. UAlbany earned victories over North Carolina, Yale, Binghamton and UMass, all top-20 in the RPI. 10 Great Danes earned America East All-Conference honors, led by Connor Fields, a 2017 Tewaaraton Trophy finalist and Turnbull Award winner for top attackman in Division I, earning 117 points on the year, the fourth-highest single scoring season in Division I history. Marr's squad was the top scoring team in the country with 277 goals, adding 171 assists for 448 points, averaging 15.39 goals per game as nine Great Danes scored double digit goals. Fields, TD Ierlan, Stone Sims, Troy Reh, Adam Osika and Kyle McClancy all earned All-America honors from the USILA or Inside Lacrosse. Fields was on the first team for each while Ierlan was second team by IL and third team in the USILA.

As an assistant on Dick Edell's Maryland staff for six years, Marr served as both assistant coach and offensive coordinator. Maryland made five NCAA Tournament appearances during that period and was the Division I national runner-up in 1995, 1997 and 1998. The Terrapins shattered the school's single-season scoring record with 236 goals when the program captured the '98 Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season and tournament titles. Maryland's attack averaged 12.5 goals under Marr's direction from 1995-2000. All-Americans Matt Hahn and Andrew Whipple became two of the most storied scorers in school history.

Marr served as one of three assistants for the 2006 U.S. Men's Lacrosse Team that won the silver medal. Syracuse's John Desko was the U.S. team's head coach. The 2006 International Lacrosse Federation World Championship was held in London, Ontario from July 13-22.

Marr began his coaching career as the University of Delaware's offensive coordinator, where he worked with the school's all-time leading scorer Anthony DiMarzo. From 1992-94, the Blue Hens captured three consecutive North Atlantic Conference championships and earned a top-20 national ranking in each season. Marr was also an assistant on the United States team that won the 1999 World Cup.

As a collegiate player at Johns Hopkins University, Marr was an attackman on the 1987 national championship squad and the '89 national runner-up team. The Blue Jays garnered four straight NCAA berths during his career. He received a B.S. in social and behavorial sciences in 1991.

A native of Yorktown, N.Y., Marr was a high school All-American who twice led his team to the state's semifinal round. He and his wife, Traci, a special education teacher, have three children, Kyle, Jordyn and Keeley.

Former two-time UAlbany team captain Derrick Eccles enters his second season as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2017 season. The 2013 America East All-Rookie Team midfielder was a team captain in the 2015 and 2016 seasons, earning 45 points, off 29 goals and 16 assists, 62 ground balls and 10 caused turnovers in 61 career games.
