TODAY'S MATCHUP

UAlbany

- Begins arguably the most challenging schedule in program history. The Great Danes open with a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent (Pitt of the Atlantic Coast Conference) and then face three schools ranked in the Football Championship Subvidivision Top 25.
- Will start Vincent Testaverde at quarterback. The son of longtime NFL quarterback and Heisman Trophy winner Vinny Testaverde, Vincent emerged as the starter after winning a three-way battle for the spot in training camp.
- Is coming off a 4-7 season that included a 2-6 mark in the CAA. However, the Great Danes lost four games by a touchdown or less and fell twice in overtime. UAlbany recorded its first-ever win over a Top 25 school when it defeated No. 7 Villanova, 19-10, in overtime on Sept. 23.
- Will welcome back Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks, the CAA's leading rusher in 2016. He ran for 1,401 yards and 16 TDS before injuring his knee in the season finale. Ibitokun-Hanks missed all but one game of 2017 while recovering.
- Has a number of Pitt connections on its coaching staff. Head coach Greg Gattuso was an assistant to Dave Wannsted from 2005-10, and three of the Great Danes' coaches played at Pitt: Jarred Holley (2009-12), Nate Byham (2006-09) and Jimy Sweeney (1980-83).

- Returns 14 starters from a 2017 team that finished 5-7. The Panthers closed the season with a 24-14 victory over No. 2 Miami at Heinz Field.
- Has lost only once in 16 games against FCS opponents 31-17 to Youngstown State in 2012.
- Returns sophomore quarterback Kenny Pickett, who ran for two touchdowns and threw for another in the victory over Miami — his first career start.

NOTES

ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

UAlbany is a member of the America East Conference in 16 of 18 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) and football, a Division I Football Championship Subdivision program, is an associate member of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). UAlbany has earned the Stuart P. Haskell Jr. Commissioner's Cup, which honors the America East's top performing athletics department, for six consecutive years and seven times overall.

UAlbany has won 107 conference championships and has made 52 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes have won seven or more conference titles in each of the past eight years. UAlbany claimed its 100th conference title on May 14, 2017, when softball won the America East Tournament. Entering the 2018-19 school year, UAlbany has 99 America East Tournament titles, six Northeast Conference (NEC) season titles in football and two MAAC titles in women's golf.

In 2017-2018, UAlbany earned seven conference championships and made four NCAA Tournament appearances. Men's lacrosse, ranked No. 1 nationally for six weeks during the regular season, reached the Final Four, and men's soccer advanced to the NCAA Tournament's second round. Softball, men's and women's outdoor track, women's indoor track and golf also won league titles. In the classroom, 11 teams carried a GPA of 3.2 or higher.

In its Division I history, UAlbany has had 18 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft, nine players drafted by Major League Baseball and 14 sign NFL contracts.

UAlbany's more than 400 student-athletes strive every day to be Great Leaders, Great Champions and Great Danes.

Team notes

Gattuso makes a homecoming

- A graduate of Seton-LaSalle High School who also was the head coach of his alma mater from 1989-91, UAlbany Head Coach Greg Gattuso has deep ties to Western Pennsylvania.
- Gattuso graduated from Penn State in 1984. A defensive lineman, he helped the Nittany Lions capture a national title in 1982.
- He served as the head coach at Duquesne from 1993-2004, compiling a 97-32 record over 12 seasons.
- Gattuso also worked under Dave Wannstedt at Pitt from 2005-10. He was the tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator from 2005-06 and then coached the defensive line from 2006-10.

Sweeney, Byham, Holley pay visit to alma mater

- The Great Danes have three Pitt graduates on the coaching staff: Jarred Holley (2009-12), Nate Byham (2006-09) and Jimy Sweeney (1980-83).
- Holley, UAlbany's safeties coach, was a two-time All-Big East player who finished his career with 11 interceptions. He attended mini-camps with the Pittsburgh Steelers after signing as an undrafted free agent.
- Byham was a three-year starter at Pitt who served as a team captain as a senior. He was an All-Big East honoree in his final two seasons, during which he caught 30 passes for 368 yards.
- Sweeney was a four-year starter (1980-83) at Pitt on the offensive line. He was a second-round pick in the 1984 draft who went on two play 11 seasons with the New York Jets, one with the Seattle Seahawks and four with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

UALBANY 15, NO. 14 NEW HAMPSHIRE 0 Nov. 18, 2017 Tom & Mary Casey Stadium

ALBANY, N.Y. — Behind a smothering defense, the University at Albany football team ended its 2017 season with a victory, beating No. 16/14 New Hampshire, 15-0, on Saturday at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium.

The Great Danes held the Wildcats, a potential Football Championship Subdivision playoff team, to just 122 yards of total offense and -11 yards rushing on Military Appreciation Day.

After UAlbany honored 14 seniors in a pregame ceremony, Austin Ellis caught a 54-yard touchdown pass from Will Brunson, Ethan Stark kicked two field goals and the Great Danes got a safety on an errant long snap to back up a defense that was dominant.

UAlbany piled up eight sacks, including a pair by senior defensive end Malachi Hoskins, and forced two turnovers on fumbles.

The Great Danes led 3-0 at halftime after Stark kicked a 27-yard field goal early in the second quarter.

Then, on New Hampshire's first drive after halftime, the Wildcats were kicking from their own 31-yard line when the snap sailed over the head of punter Max Pedinoff, leading to the safety and a 5-0 lead.

Brunson and Ellis connected on the ensuing possession. On 1st and 10 from the UAlbany 46, Brunson launched a long throw to Ellis, who was wide open deep in the New Hampshire secondary. He ran untouched to the end zone for his first collegiate touchdown.

Brunson completed 14-of-24 passes for 184 yards on a chilly, blustery afternoon. And he got support in the run game from Kendall Rodgers Jr., who carried 23 times for 50 yards and made several key catches out of the backfield on third down.

Stark closed the scoring with 6:21 to play with his second field goal, this one from 38 yards away.

Coaching staff gets new look

- UAlbany will debut two new coordinators: Joe Davis, who joins the staff as the
 offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach after having served in the same role at
 Fordham the past two years, and Keith Dudzinski, now in his third season with the
 Great Danes. Dudzinski had coached the safeties each of the past two years.
- Davis takes over the offense from Joe Bernard, who this year will be UAlbany's co-defensive coordinator, special teams coordinator and cornerbacks coach.
- Dudzinski replaces Bernard Clark, who left to become the head coach at Robert Morris.

Welcome back Will and Michael

- UAlbany alums Michael Nicastro (defensive assistant) and Will Fiacchi (wide receivers coach and recruiting coordiantor) both are on the coaching staff this season.
- Fiacchi, a 2014 graduate, is the Great Danes' all-time leading passer, having thrown for 7,150 yards. He made 35 consecutive starts at quarterback and holds team records in most completions in a game (28), season (207) and career (602). He's in his second year on the coaching staff after serving as the offensive assistant last season.
- Nicastro, a 2016 graduate, finished his career fifth on the Great Danes' all-time tackles list with 310. He was an All-CAA First-Team member in 2016, when he also received the program's Todd J. Clark Memorial Award, given annually to a student-athlete who embodies leadership, courage and selflessness. He's in his first season on the coaching staff.

Challenging schedule awaits Great Danes

- For the fourth-straight season, UAlbany will open the season against an FBS opponent. The Great Danes are 1-2 in those games, with the victory coming 22-16 at Buffalo in 2016. UAlbany lost at Buffalo (51-14) in 2015 and Old Dominion (31-17) last season.
- UAlbany is entering its sixth season in the CAA, arguably the top FCS conference in the nation. As part of its CAA Schedule, UAlbany will face three teams ranked in the STATS FCS preseason Top 25: New Hampshire (No. 7), Delaware (No. 15) and Stony Brook (No. 20).

Offense notes

Testaverde earns starting nod

- Vince Testaverde, a fifth-year senior, won a three-way battle for the starting job during training camp.
- Testaverde, the son of longtime NFL quarterback and former Heisman Trophy winner Vinny Testaverde, will be backed up by redshirt junior Will Brunson, who started all 11 games in 2017, and redshirt sophomore Nyc Burns, who comes from Northeast Oklahoma A&M after redshirting at Oklahoma State.
- Testaverde joined the Great Danes as a mid-year transfer in 2017. He arrived on campus in the fall but sat out the season under NCAA transfer rules. He practiced with the Great Danes in the spring.
- Testaverde last appeared in a college game in 2014, when as a true freshman at Texas Tech he completed 15-of-26 passes for 116 yards against Texas. He then transferred to Miami, his father's alma mater, where he redshirted in 2015.
- This season Testaverde will wear No. 14 as a nod to his father. He had worn No. 17 when he first arrived at UAlbany.

Ibitokun-Hanks makes his return

- The Great Danes' offense gets a boost from redshirt junior Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks, who missed all but one game of 2017 while rehabbing a knee injury he had suffered in the 2016 season finale.
- Ibitokun-Hanks was a STATS FCS Third-Team All-American and member of the All-CAA First Team in 2016 after rushing for 1,401 yards and 16 touchdowns.
- He also had led the team in rushing in 2015 as a true freshman, when he ran for 609 yards and two touchdowns.
- In Ibitokun-Hanks' one appearance in 2017, in Week 3 against Monmouth, he ran for 63 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries.
- The Great Danes expect to have a dynamic backfield this season. UAlbany also returns sophomore Karl Mofor, who stepped in for Ibitokun-Hanks last season as a true freshman and ran for 555 yards and six touchdowns.

McDonald earns Preseason All-CAA honors

- Junior wide receiver Donovan McDonald was named to the CAA Preseason All-Conference Team as a punt returner.
- McDonald ranked third in the league last season with an average of 10.1 yards per punt return.
- He led the Great Danes with 1,015 all-purpose yards and became UAlbany's second-leading receiver with 29 catches for 339 yards and three touchdowns.
- McDonald joined the Great Danes prior to the 2017 season as a transfer from Nebraska, where he was a member of both the football and track programs.
- McDonald was a walk-on when he came to the program, but he earned a full scholarship after Week 3 of the 2017 season.

Stire goes from the court to the gridiron

- Graduate student Greig Stire has joined the football program as a tight end after having played four seasons with the UAlbany men's basketball team.
- Stire was a two-year starter at power forward. He led the team with 6.0 rebounds per game as a senior and also averaged 7.1 points while shooting 56.3 percent from the field.
- Stire began working with the football team during Spring Practice. He's expected to provide depth at tight end.

Mencer returns as key playmaker

- A standout running back in high school, redshirt sophomore Eli Mencer, a native of Altoona, Pa., has excelled at linebacker since changing positions before his redshirt season in 2015.
- Last season, Mencer recovered a fumble and returned it 69 yards for a touchdown against Rhode Island. It was his second fumble-return-for-touchdown of the season; the other was an 80-yard score that finished off UAlbany's 19-10 overtime victory over Villanova.
- Mencer led UAlbany in forced fumbles with five and was tied for second on the team with eight tackles for a loss.
- As a senior running back at Altoona High School, Mencer rushed for 1,280 yards and 23 touchdowns.

Sussman moves to linebacker

- Senior linebacker Neven Sussman will be playing his third position since joining the program.
- Last season, Sussman served as both the backup quarterback and punter. In his
 first season punting, he averaged 37.3 yards per kick, with a long of 59 yards. At
 quarterback, he completed 12-of-26 passes for 163 yards with one interception; he
 also carried the ball 43 times for 132 yards.
- Sussman had started 13 career games at quarterback, including nine as a sophomore in 2016, when he threw for 1.017 yards and seven touchdowns.

Did you know?

UAlbany and the NFL

- The Great Danes have seen 14 players sign NFL contracts. This year, there
 are two former UAlbany players in NFL training camps: Anthony Manzo-Lewis
 (Chargers) and Brian Parker (Broncos).
- UAlbany also has several NFL connections on its coaching staff:
- Offensive line coach Jim Sweeney was second round pick in the 1984 draft. He was named to the All-NFL Rookie Team after his first season with the New York Jets; he played 11 seasons with the Jets, with 158 consecutive starts.
- Defensive line coach Delbert Cowsette was drafted by the Washington Redskins and played for the New York Giants, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Chicago Bears from 2000-2006.
- Tight ends coach and run-game coordinator Nate Byham was a sixth-round pick in the 2010 Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. He played in 29 NFL games, playing 14 games, including three starts, with the 49ers before signing with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for 2012 and 2013.

HEAD COACH GREG GATTUSO



reg Gattuso enters his fifth season at the helm of the UAlbany football program in 2018. A former standout defensive lineman at Penn State who's worked at Duquesne, Pittsburgh and Maryland, Gattuso has helped the Great Danes steadily rise in the Colonial Athletic Association, one of the top Football Championship Subdivision conferences in the nation.

In 2017, he led the Great Danes to their first win over a Top 10 program -- a 19-10 overtime victory over No. 7 Villanova at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. UAlbany also shut out New Hampshire, an FCS playoff qualifier, 15-0 in the season finale. It was one of several superlative efforts from a defense that finished the season ranked No. 9 nationally. The Great Danes were 4-7 overall and 2-6 in the CAA against a rigorous schedule that featured games against an FBS opponent (Old Dominion) and five matchups with Top 25 teams.

Under Gattuso's leadership, UAlbany had its best season as a CAA member in 2016, finishing 7-4 overall and 4-4 in the league. The Great Danes were ranked for five weeks, including as high as No. 16. UAlbany also earned its first victory over an FBS opponent with a 22-16 road win over Buffalo.

Hallmarks of Gattuso's teams have included discipline and taking care of the football. In 2016, the Great Danes were second in the CAA with a plus-16 turnover margin.

In his first season, in 2014, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround from the previous year. The Great Danes picked up votes in the national polls for 10 straight weeks and appeared in The Sports Network Top 25 four times on their way to a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 CAA mark.

A year later, the Danes earned CAA victories over Rhode Island and perennial power Delaware.

Gattuso was a defensive lineman at Penn State, where he helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982.

In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's staff at Maryland. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.

During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle.

Gattuso and his wife Colleen have two daughters, Jacqueline and Kaitlin.
