NEWS AND NOTES

Scouting Canisius

The Golden Griffins enter Wednesday's matchup 0-1 having lost their season opener at Brown, 75-68. Since the 2016-17 season, Canisius has won 27 true road games, including nine last season, tied for 10th-most among Division I schools in that span. The Golden Griffins are led by senior guard Malik Johnson, who was named to the Preseason All-MAAC Second Team. Johnson has made 100 career starts for the Golden Griffins, and averaged 9.6 points, 4.2 rebounds, and 4.8 assists last season. As a team, Canisius was picked seventh in the Preseason MAAC poll.

Last Time vs. Canisius

Last season, the Great Danes secured their first victory of the season at Canisius, defeating the Golden Griffins 75-66. Ahmad Clark scored his career-high 30 points in that game on 8-16 shooting, including 10-11 from the free-throw line, while dishing seven assists. Devonte Campbell shot 5-6 from the floor and finished with 15 points, and Cameron Healy added 14. Adam Lulka finished with 10 rebounds. Canisius opened the game hitting just one of its first 14 three-pointers, and finished shooting just

6-30 from behind the arc.

Last Time Out

The Great Danes welcomed Lehigh to SEFCU Arena for the 2019-20 season opener, just the team's third opener at home in seven years. The Mountain Hawks trailed by five early before jumping out to a 17-point lead mid-way through the second half. UAlbany clawed back, behind a game-high 21 points from Cameron Healy, and 31 trips to the free-throw line, to bring the game within three, but Lehigh hit one of two free throws in the final five seconds to push their lead back to four and out of reach. Three players from each team scored in double-figures.

Around the America East

Last week, UMass Lowell senior Christian Lutete scored 51 points in victory at Long Island University, a Riverhawks program record. It was the highest-scoring performance in the conference since Vermont's Eddie Bendon scored 54 in a game in 1994. Three teams, Vermont, UMBC, and New Hampshire, remain undefeated through the early part of the season, while UAlbany and Binghamton still seek their first victories.

Streiking

Sophomore guard Cameron Healy started all 32 games for the Great Danes last season, and connected on a three-pointer in each of those 32 games. Through one game this season, Healy has extended his made three-pointer streak to 32 games, the seventh-longest active streak in the nation. The national leader is junior Mack Smith from Eastern Illinois, who has made a three-pointer in 51-consecutive games.

Preseason Recognition

Sophomore guard Cameron Healy earned a spot on the America East Preseason All-Conference team. After averaging 16.0 points per game last season and setting program records for three-point shooting, Healy earned a spot on the America East All-Conference Third and All-Rookie Teams a year ago, while finishing as runner-up for America East Rookie of the Year. Additionally, senior guard Ahmad Clark was one of 50 players named to the Lou Henson Award Preseason Watch List, which recognizes the top mid-major player in the country.

Picked Fourth

For the second-consecutive season, the UAlbany men's basketball team was picked fourth in the America East Preseason Coaches' Poll, drawing 47 points to fall just behind Stony Brook's 48 in third. Vermont was selected unanimously as the league favorite, marking the fourth-straight year the Catamounts have landed atop the preseason poll. UMBC received the lone remaining first-place vote in second place with 53 points.

Approaching 300

Following the team's 12-20 record, head coach Will Brown finished the 2018-19 season with 294 victories in his career at UAlbany, leaving him six away from hitting the 300-win milestone. Since taking over as the Great Danes' head coach during the 2001-02 season, Brown has won five America East titles, two America East regular-season titles, one NCAA Tournament victory, and guided his teams to seven 20-win seasons. Now entering his 19th season at the helm, Brown has averaged more than 16 wins per season, including high-water marks of 24 wins in three separate seasons.

Record-Setting

Great Danes players set a handful of program records during the 2018-19 season. Freshman Cameron Healy set or tied single-game and single-season marks for three-pointers made and attempted, and broke Jamar Wilson's freshman record for total points scored in a season with 512. Additionally, Ahmad Clark tied the program record for single game assists with 10 at Niagara, and set a Division-I era single-season program record with 63 total steals.

From Deep

The Great Danes embraced the three-pointer last season, setting single-season program records for threes attempted (790) and made (274) in 32 games. Sophomore Cameron Healy led the charge, taking 251 threes and making 104, including 55 in conference play, all of which were individual single-season program records.

Freshmen become Sophomores

For four of the last five games last season, starting February 21 against Stony Brook and excluding Senior Night on February 27, the Great Danes started freshman at all five positions. The team started the season with freshmen at three starting spots, Cameron Healy, Adam Lukka, and Brent Hank, and moved to start four freshmen for the first time on December 20 against Manhattan when Antonio Rizzuto made his second career start. All five freshman who played starting roles at some point last season return to the squad this year, including Healy and Lukka who each started every game last season.

Returning Depth

The Great Danes return nine players from the 2018-19 squad, including all five players who started at the end of the year. The most prominent departure was Devonte Campbell, who averaged 7.8 points and 4.8 rebounds last year, while earning America East All-Defensive Team accolades for the third time in his career. UAlbany returns each of its top five scorers, as well as two of its three most prominent bench players.

The North

In August, UAlbany took a week-long trip to play exhibition games against five Canadian universities. The team played twice in Ottawa and three times in Montréal, ending the trip on a three-game winning streak against McGill University, Université du Québec à Montréal, and Concordia.

Fighting Fires

During the offseason, sophomore guard Antonio Rizzuto signed up to be a volunteer firefighter with the McKownville Fire Department. When he's not otherwise occupied with basketball or school work, Rizzuto answers calls when a situation requires respondents. Rizzuto is an exterior firefighter, where he retrieves items from the trucks and hooks up the hoses to fire hydrants.

In-House

A point of pride for head coach Will Brown, each of his staff members holds a degree from the University at Albany. Each of his assistant coaches, Jon Iati, Josh Pelletier, and Jerrad Knotts, hold UAlbany degrees, as do his director of basketball operations Greig Stire and video coordinator Shane Hammill. Brown's is the only

staff in the country that can boast holding degrees from their coaching institution across the board. Iati, Knotts, and Stire all played for Brown during their collegiate careers. Further, entering their eighth season together, the Great Danes staff is tied for the second-longest tenured staff in the country. West Virginia coach Bob Huggins' staff enters their eighth year together, while Tom Izzo's staff at Michigan State enters their 10th.

Captains

The Great Danes announced three players, Ahmad Clark, Adam Lulka, and Nick Fruscio, to serve as team captains for the 2019-20 season. Clark and Lulka each enter their second-straight season as team captains, while senior Nick Fruscio was selected by his teammates to serve in his final year.

Decade Recap

The Great Danes finished the 2010's with a record of 188-148, the second-highest decade wins total in program history behind the 190 victories during the 1980's. UAlbany also won 93 America East games in the 2010's, and averaged nearly 19 wins per season in the last decade.

Coach Brown: "You have to give credit to Lehigh. I thought they played well, and did a real good job being patient offensively. I was very surprised by our play. This was not the team we've seen the last two weeks on the court. I thought we played with great energy for eight to 10 minutes, and that's somewhat disappointing. But it is early in the year, and you learn an awful lot about your team at this point. You tweak, you adjust, and you hope you have some rhythm and flow come December and you're ready by conference play. But credit to Lehigh, and we just have to get back to work."

Recap

Hosting Lehigh University in their 2019-20 season opener, the University at Albany men's basketball team made a furious comeback from 17 points down to fall just shy at the end, succumbing to the Mountain Hawks 74-70.

Cameron Healy scored the first points for UAlbany on the young season, knocking down a jumper to go up 2-0 in the first minute of the game. With 13:35 to go, UAlbany capped off an 8-0 run to take a five-point lead, their largest of the night, up 12-7. From there, the teams traded baskets before Lehigh went on a 9-0 run mid-way through the first to take a 25-17 lead with 5:39 to go.

Healy led all scorers at the break with 12 points. UAlbany had shot just 32% from the floor, and just 27% from three. Lehigh shot 50% and outscored UAlbany by 14 points in the paint.

Early in the second half, Lehigh used a 12-2 run spurred by an 8-9 shooting stretch to take a 16-point lead over the Great Danes. Healy broke the Mountain Hawks' run with a three-pointer to cut the lead to 51-38 with just over 13 minutes remaining. Lehigh's largest lead grew to 17, up 56-39, with 11:25 left in the second.

With 4:01 remaining, Malachi de Sousa hit a three in the corner to cut the Great Danes' deficit to 10 as part of a 7-0 scoring run that ultimately cut the Lehigh's lead to six.

De Sousa hit another three to cut the lead to four with 36.0 remaining. The Danes' press forced a turnover in the backcourt on the ensuing possession. After drawing a foul, Hansen hit one of two free throws to cut the lead to 73-70 with 8.7 remaining.

Lehigh drew a foul on their next play, and hit one of two free throws with 4.2 remaining to bring the lead back to four, and would go on to win 74-70.

Healy finished with a game-high 21 points, while Antonio Rizzuto added 12 and Ahmad Clark scored 11. Lehigh outscored UAlbany 46-18 in the paint, and shot 50.8% from the floor. UAlbany shot just 8-29 from behind the arc, and 19-58 overall, but did draw 31 free throws, knocking down 24.

Recap

The University at Albany men's basketball team notched its first victory of the 2018-19 season, defeating Canisius on Saturday afternoon 75-66. It was the first game of a three-game, four-day stretch of the Great Danes' schedule.

UAlbany scored first, with Ahmad Clark hitting a jumper 45 seconds after the opening tip. The Danes led by three after two-plus minutes before Canisius brought the game back within one with 17:30 left in the first.

UAlbany pulled away briefly, leading 6-3 with 15:04 left in the first. Canisius tied the game at six one minute later. For the next six minutes of game time, the

Great Danes and Golden Griffins traded baskets, until Canisius pulled together some breathing room leading 18-13 with 6:04 remaining.

Devonte Campbell gave UAlbany back the lead with just over four minutes left in the first half with an off-balance three pointer. Campbell's three was part of a 13-0 UAlbany run that took up five minutes of game time.

UAlbany ended the sluggish first half on a 13-4 run, with Canisius going on a 4-0 mini-run in the final minute. Campbell and Clark led the Great Danes with seven points apiece, while Cameron Healy added six. Canisius shot just 1-14 from three in the first 20 minutes, and just 9-27 overall. The Danes led 26-22 at the half, after leading by as many as eight.

Campbell put UAlbany up 29-22 with a corner three immediately after the start of the second half. Soon after, Canisius finally hit a three-pointer, its second make in its first 17 attempts.

Canisius cut the lead to one with just under 14 minutes remaining after hitting one of two free throws. Campbell hit a jumper on the other end to put UAlbany back up three, but Canisius tied the game at 35 after a successful and-one conversion.

UAlbany responded with a quick 7-0 run to go up 42-35 with just over 12 minutes remaining. With nine minutes remaining, Canisius had pulled back within four, and then within to with 7:30 left. With 4:50 left, UAlbany led by nine, 58-49.

Clark scored five straight points to put UAlbany up 12, 63-51, with just under three minutes remaining. With under two minutes, Clark hit two free throws to put UAlbany up 67-55, just before Canisius hit a three on the ensuing possession. Canisius would come as close as eight, but ultimately fell 75-66.

Clark led all scorers with 30 points, and added seven assists. Campbell and Healy scored 15 and 14, respectively. Adam Lulka led UAlbany with 10 rebounds. Canisius continued to struggle from behind the arc in the second half, ending the game shooting just 6-30 from deep.

Next: The Great Danes will play back-to-back home games starting Monday, November 19 against Oneonta and Holy Cross.

WILL BROWN - 19TH SEASON AT UALBANY



Will Brown begins his 19th season overall as the University at Albany's men's basketball head coach, after spending one season in an interim capacity. Brown, the longest tenured coach in the America East Conference, has led the program to five conference championships, five NCAA Tournament appearances, two CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament appearances, one CBI Postseason appearance and an unparalleled success in the classroom.

UAlbany's streak of 20-win seasons came to an end in 2018-19, as the Great Danes finished 12-20 overall with a mark of 7-9 in the America East. UAlbany returned just one starter from the 2017-18 squad, two-time America East All-Defense selection Devonte Campbell, and began the season starting freshmen at three positions. Eventually, the Danes would start four, and then five freshmen, as the season continued. Following a 5-10 non-conference slate, UAlbany opened the America East schedule 0-5, before rebounding to win seven of their last 11 to clinch the six-seed in the 2019 America East Tournament. Redshirt-freshman Cameron Healy was named to the America East All-Rookie Team, and the All-Conference Third Team. Junior Ahmad Clark was also named to the All-Conference Third Team, and senior Devonte Campbell earned his third

All-Defensive selection. Cameron Healy finished the season holding both the freshman record for total points in a season, 512, and the overall program record for three-pointers made and attempted in a single season, with 104 and 251, respectively. Healy also led the America East in threes per game, 3.3, and free throw percentage, .884, while Clark finished with the conference lead in assists per game, 4.3.

Brown earned the program's first NCAA Division I Tournament win in 2013-14 when the Purple & Gold took down Mount St. Mary's in the First Four 71-64 in Dayton, Ohio. He led UAlbany to its second-straight America East title in 2013-14, as the No. 4 seed. The Great Danes repeated their feat as the lowest seed to ever win the tournament, once again knocking off the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds and taking the title on the road.

The 2012-13 Great Danes arguably ended their season as their most successful in league history with a 24-11 record, a NCAA Tournament Second Round appearance and won the America East Conference Tournament Championship. Following his third conference tournament championship, he became the fourth America East Conference head coach with at least three conference tournament titles. The 24 wins is a program-best for most wins in a season at UAlbany in Division I. The Great Danes set a record for most non-conference wins in school history with 12.

Brown guided the Great Danes to their second straight America East Conference championship after defeating top-seed Vermont in the 2007 tournament final. The Great Danes, who earned an automatic NCAA berth, were seeded No. 13 against Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season winner Virginia. Brown's team totaled 20 victories during the regular season for the first time at the Division I level. UAlbany tied the second-highest single-season win total (23) in school history and posted consecutive 20-win campaigns for the first time in 17 years. Jamar Wilson made his second appearance on the Associated Press All-America squad.

Brown led the Great Danes to their first-ever NCAA Division I Tournament berth in 2005-06 after winning both the America East Conference tournament and regular-season titles. UAlbany set the program's Division I record for single-season victories with a 21-11 record and produced its highest win total since 1993-94. His squad posted UAlbany's first postseason triumph in 11 years with three wins in America East tournament play. The Great Danes, who also established their top conference mark with 13 victories in the regular season, went on to put up a monumental fight against second-ranked Connecticut in a memorable NCAA first-round battle. Brown was named the New York State Coach of the Year.

Brown was appointed as UAlbany's head coach on March 13, 2002, and has worked on the collegiate level since 1995. He became the 15th head coach in the history of the program. At age 40, Brown is still one of the youngest Division I head coaches in the nation.

Coach Brown and his wife, Jamie, work closely with many charitable organizations in the Capital District and surrounding areas. Jamie currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Big Brothers, Big Sisters Organization of the Capital Region. She also serves as the Associate Board of Directors for St. Peter's Hospital and co-chairs Coaches vs. Cancer to benefit the American Cancer Society. The Browns are also involved with the upstate Northeastern New York chapter of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of America.

Brown, who joined the UAlbany staff as an assistant in Sept. 2001, was promoted to interim head coach on Dec. 20 of that year, and guided the Great Danes to a 7-13 record over the last 20 games. UAlbany was among the conference leaders in scoring defense. He coached the team to several impressive victories, including a win over Vermont, the America East Conference's regular-season champion.

Brown previously served as the head coach at Sullivan County Community College in Loch Sheldrake, N.Y., from 1998-2001. He led the Generals to a 90-10 record over a three-year period with two regional and two district titles. Sullivan County C.C. posted a 30-2 record and reached the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship game in 2000-01. Brown's first SCCC squad appeared in the NJCAA "Final Four" and finished 32-3 overall. The Generals were ranked second nationally in scoring at 92.9 points per game, and ninth in team defense with a 67.1 average.

Previous to his appointment at Sullivan County C.C., Brown spent three years at The College of Saint Rose as an assistant coach on Brian Beaury's staff. The Golden Knights made two NCAA Division II "Elite Eight" appearances in that span, and captured three New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC) championships and two Northeast Regional crowns. Saint Rose compiled an 88-13 record from 1995-98.

As a collegiate player, Brown was a two-time NYCAC all-star and three-year starter at Dowling College, an NCAA Division II program on Long Island. He is the only player in school history to combine for more than 1,000 points and 500 assists. Brown completed his career as Dowling's all-time leader in assists (591), three-point field goals (181) and free throw percentage (.859). He also played second singles on the school's tennis team.

A native of Miller Place, N.Y., Brown earned first-team Class B all-state recognition as a high school senior, when he averaged more than 35 points per game. He was chosen All-Long Island and was a three-time All-Suffolk County selection. In May 2010, Brown was inducted into the Suffolk Sports Hall of Fame.

Brown resides in Latham with his wife, Jamie, and their two sons, Jackson and Landon. Brown has a master's degree in management and a B.A. in marketing from Dowling College. His father, William, Jr., has served as director of athletics at Miller Place High School, where he previously was head basketball coach for 17 years. His teams won three Suffolk County League VII scholastic titles.

Jon Iati - 8th Season (UAlbany '07, '09)

Jon Iati, with the team since 2012, was promoted to associate head coach for the 2017-18 season. He has since helped UAlbany to six consecutive national postseason appearances, including three consecutive America East Championships from 2013-15. Iati recruited freshmen Joe Cremo to America East Rookie of the Year and Sixth Man of the Year honors in 2015-16. He also coached and recruited arguably one of the most successful backcourts for the Great Danes.



Josh Pelletier - 9th Season (Saint Rose '09, UAlbany '12)

Pelletier begins his ninth season with the Great Danes in the 2019-20 season, entering his fifth year as an assistant coach. He recruits throughout the Northeast and nationally, specifically prep schools in New England. Pelletier has placed a heavy emphasis on recruiting in Australia and other international regions as well as portions of the Midwest, Texas and junior colleges. He previously served as the team's graduate assistant coach and volunteer video coordinator.



Jerrad Knotts - 9th Season (UAlbany '06)

Knotts enters his fifth season as an assistant coach in 2019-20 after serving four years as the director of operations under Will Brown. A four-year member of the Purple & Gold from 2003-06, Knotts assists Brown in all facets of the program, including recruiting, player development, scouting opponents and academic advising for men's basketball student-athletes. He previously served as the team's director of basketball operations.



Greig Stire - 2nd Season (UAlbany '18)

After using his final semester of eligibility playing for the UAlbany football team following the conclusion of his basketball career, Stire returned to UAlbany men's basketball on the sidelines to take over as video coordinator mid-way through the 2018-19 season. Stire played four years for UAlbany, averaging 6.2 points and 5.6 rebounds per game in 132 appearances for the Great Danes. At the time of his graduation, Stire holds the program record for single season total rebounds with 266 and rebounding average with 8.3, and a share of the single-game program record for rebounds with 15. Stire's 132 games played rank second in program history, one game behind Blake Metcalf, and his 99 career starts rank in a tie for third.



Shane Hammill - 1st Season (UAlbany '18)

Shane Hammill takes over as the Video Coordinator for the UAlbany men's basketball team ahead of the 2019-20 season, his third year with the program. Hammill, a native of East Greenbush, N.Y., holds a Bachelor's Degree from UAlbany in Cyber Security.
