**SERIES HISTORY**

Albany leads, 13-6

**SERIES NOTES**

The Blue Devils and Great Danes are meeting for the first time since the 2014 season. Albany won at CCSU, 19-0. CCSU won the last meeting at Albany in 2013.

**Today's Game** • The Blue Devils advance to the FCS Playoffs for the second time in the last three seasons. CCSU also advanced to the playoffs in 2017, dropping a 14-0 decision on the road at New Hampshire. The Blue Devils won their sixth NEC title with a 7-0 conference record.

**7-0 in League Play** • The Blue Devils finished the season 7-0 in Northeast Conference play, their second undefeated league season in the last three years (6-0 in 2017). CCSU is the first team to win seven league games since both Wagner and Albany finished 7-1 in 2012.

**Eight Straight** • The Blue Devils have won eight straight games in a single season for the second time in three years. This marks the second time in three seasons that the Blue Devils enter the FCS Playoffs on an eight-game winning streak (2017). The eight game winning streak is the longest in-season winning streak in school history.

**Eight Straight, Another Note** • CCSU has won eight straight road games vs. FCS opponents, dating back to last season. CCSU is 6-0 on the road vs. FCS opponents in 2019. Their only road loss this season came at FBS opponent Eastern Michigan, 34-29.

**Six Road Wins** • The Blue Devils are 6-1 on the road this season. The six road wins are the most of any program in the country. The six road wins are the most in school history. CCSU joins one other NEC team in history with at least six road wins in a single season. Sacred Heart finished the 2001 season 7-0 on the road.

**11 Wins, School Record** • The 11 wins by the Blue Devils are a new school-record. The previous record of nine wins was accomplished twice (1973 and 2009).

**Nationally Ranked** • For the seventh straight week the Blue Devils are ranked in the national polls. CCSU is ranked #17 in the STATS FCS top-25 National Poll, the highest-ever ranking in the poll for the Blue Devils. Seven weeks ago marked the first time the Blue Devils have been ranked in the poll since Oct. 9, 2006. CCSU ranked as high as #19 in the poll that season. The Blue Devils are also #18 in the FCS Coaches Poll this week.

**Winchester Payton Award Finalist** • This week, senior quarterback Aaron Winchester was announced as a finalist of the 2019 STATS FCS Walter Payton Award, which is named for the legendary Hall of Fame running back and since 1987 has honored the offensive player of the year in college football's Division I subdivision. Winchester is the fourth Blue Devil to appear on the list, joining three former running backs (Justise Hairston, James Mallory and Rob Hollomon).

**McCarthy Honored as Coach of the Year** • Central Connecticut head football coach Ryan McCarthy was named the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston Division I Coach of the Year on Tuesday. The Gridiron Club presents the award to one Division I (FBS/FCS) and one Division II/III head coach each season. McCarthy is in his first season as the head coach of the Blue Devils.

**11 Wins** • Only one team in the country has more wins this season than the Blue Devils, #1 North Dakota State (12). CCSU is 11-1 overall. James Madison (11) and NDSU (12) are the only other teams in the country with at least 11 wins. The 11 wins for the Blue Devils is a new school record.

**No FCS Losses** • CCSU is one of just three teams in the country without a loss to an FCS team this season. CCSU is 11-0 vs. FCS teams, joining North Dakota State and James Madison as teams who have not lost to another FCS program.

**First Quarters** • The Blue Devils have allowed just 23 points in the first quarter this season, including just three points in the last eight games. Central hasn't allowed a first quarter touchdown during its eight game winning streak, and not since the Eastern Michigan game on Sept. 21.

**Second Half Scoring** • The Blue Devils have allowed just 98 points in the second half this season, outscoring their opponents 225-98 after halftime.

**Rushing Touchdowns, 33-3** • The Blue Devils have rushed for 33 touchdowns on the season and allowed just three rushing scores. Both numbers lead the NEC.

**McCarthy Gets the Call** • Six weeks ago, Ryan McCarthy was officially named Head Coach of the CCSU football team. McCarthy served under the interim title for the first six games of the season after replacing former head coach Pete Rossomando.

**Defense #2 in the Country** • The Blue Devils come into today's game sporting the #2 defensive unit in the country. CCSU's defense is 2nd in total yardage (273.3 ypg), 3rd in rushing defense (71.3 ypg), 1st in interceptions (20), 1st in defensive touchdowns (6) and 10th in scoring defense (18.3 ppg).

**Conference Play** • The Blue Devils finished 7-0 in Northeast Conference play in 2019. CCSU is a league-best 17-2 in the last three seasons in league play, posting a 6-0 mark two years ago and a 4-2 record last season.

**Interceptions** • The Blue Devils are first in the nation with 20 interceptions through 12 games this season. Eleven different players have posted an interception this season.

**Defensive Scores** • The Blue Devils are tied for first in the nation with six defensive touchdowns this season. CCSU has returned three interceptions for a score, and three fumbles.

**Turnover Margin** • The Blue Devils have forced 29 turnovers on the season (and committed just 12) and are first in the country in turnover margin (+1.40 per game).

**Almost vs. the FBS** • The Blue Devils dropped a 34-29 road decision at FBS opponent Eastern Michigan on Sept. 21, narrowly missing the Northeast Conference's first win over an FBS opponent in league history. Down 28-15 in the fourth quarter, the Blue Devils used a pair of touchdowns in the final eight minutes to take a 29-28 lead with 2:05 left in the game. A late blocked punt for a score gave the home team the victory. Central held the Eagles to under 100 yards rushing in the game, and posted a pair of interceptions in the fourth quarter that helped give them the late lead.

**Winchester's Season** • Graduate transfer Aaron Winchester took over the quarterback duties as the Blue Devils had a new starter under center for the first time since the 2014 season. Winchester came to CCSU from Georgia State, where he was a captain as a back-up last season. He has completed 68 percent of his passes on the season, 160-of-245, for 2,422 yards, 19 touchdowns and just four interceptions. He is also the leading rusher on the team with 782 rushing yards on 148 carries, good for 5.3 yards per rush, and 8 touchdowns.

#### **CCSU WINS SIXTH ON THE ROAD, TOPS DUQUESNE**

The Central Connecticut football team moved to 11-1 overall and finished the season a perfect 7-0 in Northeast Conference play with a 43-10 road victory at Duquesne on Saturday. On Saturday, senior quarterback Aaron Winchester finished the game 9-of-20 for 188 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. He also rushed the ball 13 times for 57 yards in the win. Junior Tyshaun James caught two passes for 80 yards and a score. Junior Danley Exilhomme ran 13 times for 59 yards and two touchdowns. The Central defense intercepted two more passes, both leading to touchdowns, to push their total to 20 on the season.

#### **KEY MOMENTS**

- The Blue Devils took a 6-0 lead on their first offensive drive of the game. Danley Exilhomme ran it in from four-yards out for the score. James had a key 34-yard rush in the drive.
- Central scored on its second drive of the game, and led 12-0, after a 23-yard touchdown pass from Winchester to sophomore tight end Theo Zidor.
- Walker scored his fifth touchdown of the season to push the lead to 19-0 in the second quarter. His scoring run came from 31-yards out.
- Winchester hit James for a 73-yard touchdown strike, the longest pass play of the season for the Blue Devils, to up the lead to 29-10 in the third quarter.
- Junior DJ Exilhomme returned an interception 87-yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to make it 36-10.

## GAME NOTES

- The Blue Devils didn't allow a point in the first quarter, again. They allowed only three total points in the first quarter of the last eight games. They allowed only 23 first quarter points in 12 regular season games.
- The road win is the sixth of the season for CCSU, the most in school-history and in the country this season, and it's only the second time in league history that an NEC team has won six or more road games (Sacred Heart, 7 in 2001).
- Exilhomme's defensive touchdown was his third of the year and the defense's sixth of the season.
- Central is now 17-2 in its last 19 NEC games.

Lucas Earns NEFW Gold Helmet • Sophomore running back Keonte Lucas was named the New England Football Writer's Gold Helmet Award winner three weeks ago. Lucas rushed 10 times for 190 yards and two touchdowns in the road win over Valpo. Lucas had scoring runs of 75 and 85 yards in the victory. Lucas rushed for a career-high 190 yards on his 10 carries (19.0 ypc) and scored twice as the Blue Devils moved to 3-0. With a 14-13 lead in the third quarter, Lucas took a handoff up the middle and went 75 yards for a one play scoring drive to push the CCSU lead to 21-13. Later in the third quarter Lucas completed a two-play drive with an 85-yard scoring run to make it 35-13. His 75 yard score was the longest scoring run for CCSU since Drew Jean-Guillaume ran 76-yards for a touchdown vs. Bryant on 10/21/17. His 85-yard TD was the longest run from scrimmage for CCSU since Jean-Guillaume posted an 84-yard rush vs. Bryant last season, and was the longest scoring run for CCSU since Rob Hollomon rushed 94 yards for a touchdown vs. Salve Regina in 2013.

Cole Earns League and National Honor • Senior placekicker Francis Cole earned a pair of Player of the Week honors two weeks ago. Cole was named the Northeast Conference and STATS FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week for his game-winning kick against Merrimack on Sept. 7. Following his game-winning kick at Patriot League member Fordham on August 31, the senior connected on another clutch kick during the Blue Devils' home opener against NEC newcomer Merrimack. The Blue Devils won both games by three points. Two weeks ago, after the visiting Warriors evened the score at 37-37, Cole sent the crowd home happy by nailing the 44-yard attempt, his second game-winner in as many weeks.

TWO FROM 40+ • Cole became the first CCSU kicker to post two, 40+ yard field goals in the same game since Derek Pearson did so on the road at Colgate on Sept. 3, 2005. Pearson kicked four fields in the win over Colgate, including the game-winner from 32-yards out as time expired in a 24-22 win. He also had field goals of 48, 42 and 32.

A QB for 100 • The 108 rushing yards by Winchester against Fordham marked the first 100 yard rushing game for a CCSU quarterback since Andrew Clements in 2012. Clements rushed 15 times for 103 yards and two touchdowns in a loss at Stony Brook to open the 2012 season.

Brown Earns Preseason All-America Honor • Senior offensive lineman J'Von Brown was named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Earlier this summer Brown was named to the Athlon FCS Preseason All-America Team. He was also honored with Preseason All-Northeast Conference honors. The senior is one of five lineman in the country to be named to the STATS First Team. He is one of two NEC players on the First Team. Brown was a Second Team STATS FCS All-America selection a season ago as a junior in 2018.

Dolegala and the Bengals • Former Blue Devil Jake Dolegala is now an official member of the Bengals 53-man roster. Dolegala, an undrafted free agent signed by the Bengals following the 2019 Draft, played in the final two preseason games with the Bengals. He was impressive in both. Against the Giants he finished 10-of-12 for 94 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He played every snap of the final preseason game against the Colts, finishing 27-of-41 for 253 yards. For the preseason Dolegala completed 37-of-53 for 347 yards and a pair of scores, without throwing an interception. Dolegala finished a stellar career with the Blue Devils as the school's all-time leader in passing yardage and touchdowns, becoming just the fifth quarterback in league history to throw for over 8,000 yards. He threw for 48 career touchdowns. As a senior he completed 61 percent of his passes for 2,221 yards and 16 touchdowns while throwing just six interceptions. Dolegala finished his CCSU career 654-of-1136 for 8,129 yards, 48 touchdowns and 29 interceptions. He set the school-record with 2,934 passing yards as a sophomore in 2016, completing 258-of-432 passes while throwing only nine interceptions. He also rushed for 452 yards in his career, including 18 touchdowns. Dolegala becomes the first CCSU player to make an NFL roster since former offensive lineman and arena league standout Rich Ranglin signed with the Chiefs during the 2012 season.

Mushaw WAS the Match! • For the past five years, the Blue Devil football program has teamed up with the Be The Match Program to add close to 1,000 CCSU students, faculty and staff to the national bone marrow registry. Last year they got word that one of the people they had signed up had been chosen as a match. Linebacker Mike Mushaw was selected as a match, and last summer he donated his marrow to help save the life of someone he has never met. CCSU football has joined the efforts of Villanova football head coach Andy Talley to raise awareness of the need for marrow donors and helping patients receive life-saving transplants. Talley and others have helped recruit thousands of potential donors to the registry by encouraging their football players, other students and their peers on other teams to sign up, along with friends, family and teachers. Last year alone, close to 10,000 people joined the Be The Match Registry through Get in the Game. Save A Life. donor registry drives.

Overtime, Again • The Blue Devils played one of the most memorable games in school history in 2017 topping Wagner 51-45 in 4OT on Staten Island. The game is the longest in school history and the ninth-ever overtime game for CCSU. The Blue Devils are now 7-3 all-time in overtime including a 38-31 won at home over Saint Francis on Nov. 9, 2019.

## **WINCHESTER, MCCARTHY EARN NEC MAJOR AWARDS**

Senior quarterback Aaron Winchester and first-year head coach Ryan McCarthy earned a pair of Northeast Conference major awards on Wednesday. Winchester was named the league's Offensive Player of the Year, while McCarthy was named the league's co-Coach of the Year. Winchester was also one of 12 Blue Devils honored with All-Conference selections on Wednesday.

The Blue Devils are one of just three FCS teams in the nation to remain undefeated vs. FCS teams this season. They are 11-1 overall and 11-0 against FCS opponents. The 11 wins is a school-record and the Blue Devils are making their second appearance in the FCS Playoffs in the last three years. They are one of just three teams in the country with 11 or more wins this season.

The Blue Devils have won eight straight games heading into Saturday's playoff game at the University at Albany. The Blue Devils and Great Danes will play in Albany on Saturday at 1 p.m. on ESPN3.

McCarthy was named head coach on Oct. 16, 2019 after serving as the interim head coach for the first six games of the season. The Blue Devils are ranked #17 in the country in the latest STATS FCS Poll, their highest-ranking in school history. They have also won six road games this season, more than any other team in the country. Their lone loss came vs. FBS opponent Eastern Michigan on Sept. 21.

Central finished a perfect 7-0 in Northeast Conference play this season and outscored its opponents 265-99 in league action. They boast the #2 defense in the country heading into the playoffs and lead the country in interceptions (20), turnover margin, defensive touchdowns (6).

Winchester is among the national leaders in completion percentage (12, 65.3%), passing efficiency (4th, 170.7), passing yards per completion (5th, 15.14) and passing yards per attempt (2nd, 9.89).

On the year he is 160-245 for 2,422 yards, 19 touchdowns and four interceptions. He is also the leading rusher on the team with 782 rushing yards on 148 carries, good for 5.3 yards per rush, and eight touchdowns. The Blue Devils are averaging 35.5 points per game, the 15th highest total in the country.

In addition to Winchester, junior wide receiver Tyshaun James, junior offensive lineman Connor Mignone, senior offensive lineman Jake Schena, junior linebacker Tre Jones and senior defensive back Tajik Bagley were named to the All-Conference First Team.

Senior offensive lineman Cole Phelps, senior tight end Arthur Gilmore, Jr., sophomore linebacker Foday Jalloh, senior defensive lineman Brandon Puritt, sophomore defensive back Dexter Lawson, Jr. and junior defensive back DJ Exilhomme were all named to the All-Conference Second Team.

## Ryan McCarthy • Head Coach • First Season

---

Ryan McCarthy was named Head Coach of the CCSU football team on Oct. 16, 2019. Prior to the official announcement, McCarthy served as the interim head coach for the first six games of the season. He begins his first season as Central Connecticut head coach after serving as offensive coordinator for the previous four seasons on the Blue Devils' staff. Prior to CCSU, McCarthy spent 13 seasons on staff at the University at Albany.

In his four seasons overseeing the CCSU offense, McCarthy's squad became one of the top offensive units in the Northeast Conference. Central won the league for the first time since 2010 with a trip to the FCS Playoffs in 2017. In 2018, the Blue Devils led the league in scoring at 33.8 points per game and rolled up a league-high 432.3 games. McCarthy mentored Central's all-time leading passer, Jacob Dolegala, and featured a 1,000-yard rusher in Cam Nash in 2017. He helped Dolegala become an all-conference performer and sign with the Cincinnati Bengals as an undrafted free agent following the NFL Draft in 2019.

McCarthy served as quarterbacks coach and pass game coordinator for the Great Danes in 2014. It marked this 10th season as the quarterbacks coach. He was the offensive coordinator at Albany from 2008-13 under legendary coach Bob Ford.

During his time at UAlbany the Great Danes set several program marks on offense. Most recently, quarterback Will Fiacchi became UAlbany's all-time leader in completions (592) and yards (7,150) while also putting together his third season with 2,000 or more passing yards. In 2014 he matched his school-record for completions in a season with 207. He is second all-time with 44 scoring passes and put together the first, fourth and fifth-highest single season yardage numbers in school history.

In 2012, McCarthy directed the top scoring offense in the Northeast Conference, as the Danes averaged 34.1 points per game and shared the NEC title – one of six championships in his tenure. Wide receiver Ryan Kirchner finished his career as UAlbany's all-time leading receiver with 172 career catches, while tailback Drew Smith closed his career as the program's all-time leading point scorer (270), touchdown scorer (45), and tied for most rushing touchdowns scored (40).

Also during his time as offensive coordinator, McCarthy coached David McCarty, the program's all-time leading rusher (4,287 yards), quarterback Vinny Esposito, who finished his career as the program's No. 2 passer (now third) with 5,692 yards, and the program's No. 2 all-time receiver, Tim Bush (147).

In 2011, the Great Danes finished first in the Northeast Conference in total and scoring offense. Four offensive players earned all-conference honors, including quarterback Dan Di Lella who broke the program's season record with 2,859 total yards and 2,804 passing.

In 2008, the Great Danes won the Northeast Conference and Gridiron Classic, as Esposito put together the second-best season marks in passing yards and total offense in the program's history at the time. UAlbany's offense led the conference in total yards (363.2 ypg) and McCarty finished second in the nation in rushing among Division I FCS leaders with 1,852 yards.

McCarthy was the quarterback coach at Siena College prior to his time at Albany.

An honorable mention All-New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) quarterback at SUNY-Cortland, McCarthy passed for 2,266 yards and 13 touchdowns as a senior and established a school record with 223 completions. He received the ECAC Division III offensive player of the week award.

McCarthy, originally from Wilder, VT, earned a B.S. in physical education from Cortland. He received a master's from UAlbany in the spring of 2004. McCarthy was an all-state high school athlete in football, basketball and baseball. He has volunteered at the Lauren's First and Goal Camp, a one-day clinic that raises funds for pediatric brain tumor research.

McCarthy and his wife Jennifer reside in Simsbury with their three sons.

## CCSU 26, at Fordham 23 - Aug. 31, 2019

The Central Connecticut football team used a last second 31-yard field goal from senior placekicker Francis Cole to come away with a season-opening 26-23 road victory at Fordham on Saturday. The win is the second straight for the Blue Devils over the Rams, a member of the Patriot League. Central rushed the ball for 254 yards in the win, including 108 from senior quarterback Aaron Winchester. Winchester was making his first start as a member of the Blue Devils. A huge 48-yard interception return for a touchdown from sophomore Dexter Lawson in the third quarter helped propel the Blue Devils to the victory.

### KEY MOMENTS

- Cole's 31-yard field goal, after missing a pair earlier in the game, gave the Blue Devils the win on the road.
- The Blue Devils put together a six-play, 61-yard drive in the final 1:53 of the game to answer a Fordham touchdown and come away with the victory. Lawson's first career interception for CCSU came in the third quarter and gave the Blue Devils a 23-16 lead.
- CCSU was 2-for-2 on 2-point conversion attempts in the win. The also converted on one fourth down attempt.
- Cole had three attempts at the final field goal. Fordham called timeouts on the first attempt (miss) and the second attempt (make), and then made the third for the win.

48 – The interception return by sophomore Dexter Lawson was the first of his career and went 48 yards for the score to give CCSU a 23-16 lead in the fourth quarter.

## CCSU 42, at Valparaiso 13 - Sept. 14, 2019

The Central Connecticut football team won its third straight game to open the 2019 season, winning on the road at Valparaiso on Saturday, 42-13. Sophomore Keonte Lucas had a huge day on offense for the Blue Devils, rushing 10 times for 190 yards and a pair of touchdowns. His two scores came from 75 and 85-yard out, and were the longest scoring runs for the Blue Devils since last season's huge game from Aaron Dawson vs. Wagner on Arute Field. The defense posted five interceptions in the victory, including one for a touchdown in the third quarter. The win gives the Blue Devils a 3-0 start to the season for the first time since the 2006 season (Marist, Georgia Southern, Southern Connecticut) and just the second time since 1973. Central finished with 315 rushing yards in the game on 38 carries, good for an average of 8.3 yards per carry. Senior quarterback Aaron Winchester was 11-of-15 for 147 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed seven times for 52 yards and a touchdown.

### KEY MOMENTS

- Kendall Coles returned an interception 30 yards for a score in the third quarter to give CCSU a 28-13 lead. It marked the third defensive touchdown in as many games for CCSU. It was one of five interceptions on the day for CCSU.
- After falling behind 6-0, the Blue Devils scored 42 of the final 49 points in the game, including 28 straight in the second half. The 42 points are a season-high.
- Central was 3-of-3 in the red zone on offense and allowed only one red zone touchdown on defense.
- The Blue Devil posted five interceptions in the game, one each from Coles, redshirt freshman Marlon Brown, Jr., senior Tajik Bagley, Dexter Lawson, Jr. and sophomore Jahill Brown.

### NUMBER TO KNOW

- 3 - The Blue Devils scored a defensive touchdown for the third straight game to open the 2019 season.

## CCSU 29, at Eastern Mich. 34 - Sept. 21, 2019

The Central Connecticut football team posted two fourth quarter touchdowns but a late punt block for a score helped Eastern Michigan claim a 34-29 victory over the Blue Devils on Saturday afternoon. Junior Tyshaun James had 118 yards receiving, all coming in the fourth quarter on just two catches, including the go-ahead score with just over two minutes to play. Central scored on their first two drives of the game and led 15-7 in the second quarter before Eastern Michigan scored the final two touchdowns of the half to lead 21-15 at the half. Neither team scored in the third quarter but the Eagles used the fourth touchdown pass of the game from Mike Glass to push the lead to 28-15 with 11:36 left in the fourth quarter. The game then went into a 50 minute lightning delay after the Eagles took the 28-15 lead in the fourth quarter. Following the delay, the Blue Devils went 75 yards on seven plays and sophomore Keonte Lucas scored from one-yard out to cut the Eagle lead to 28-22. A big 50-yard completion from senior Aaron Winchester to James keyed the drive. Winchester and James hooked up again, this time on a 68-yard touchdown pass, to give the Blue Devils the 29-28 lead with just over two minutes to play in the game. Eastern Michigan blocked a punt with 10 seconds on the clock and returned it for a touchdown to claim the 34-29 win.

### KEY MOMENTS

- The Blue Devils went 75 yards on 11 plays on their first possession of the game to take an 8-0 lead. Senior Eynce Walker rushed the ball in from one-yard out and had 40 total yards on the drive.

## CCSU 28, at Sacred Heart 3 - Oct. 5, 2019

The Central Connecticut football team moved to 4-1 on the season and 1-0 in Northeast Conference play with a 28-3 road victory at Sacred Heart on Saturday. Juniors Tyshaun James and Danley Exilhomme each scored twice and the Blue Devil defense held the high-powered SHU offense in check to give the Blue Devils their third road win of the season. The Pioneers had just 238 yards of total offense, and three points, their lowest point total of the season. They came in averaging 33.5 points per game. Central's defense allowed a season-low three points in the game, not allowing a touchdown for the first time since Sept. 7, 2018 in a win over Lincoln. SHU's offense came in averaging 443.5 total yards per game, they were held to almost half that total. Central's offense scored four times, twice on drives after SHU turnovers, and put up 464 yards of total offense in the victory. Senior quarterback Aaron Winchester finished the game 19-of-25 for 275 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed for 62 yards in the victory. The win is the third straight for CCSU on the road at SHU.

### KEY MOMENTS

- The Blue Devils' first two drives took 22 plays, 11 minutes and 54 seconds and 130 total yards. They were stopped on a 4th down on their first drive, and scored a TD on their second one. CCSU outgained SHU 164-3 in the first quarter.
- A pair of rushing touchdowns by the Blue Devils in the first half gave them a 14-0 lead with 5:00 left in the second quarter. The first came from Exilhomme and the second from James.
- Central scored twice in the third quarter to pull away. James scored on a 10-yard pass from Winchester. Exilhomme scored on a one-yard run.
- The Blue Devils held the ball for 42 minutes in the game, keeping the SHU offense off the field. The Pioneers had just 18 minutes of possession time in the game.

### NOTES

- The game marked the 22nd all-time meeting between CCSU and SHU. CCSU now leads the all-time series 13-9.
- The two touchdowns for James give him nine on the season.
- The two interceptions in the game, one from junior Kendall Coles, and one from sophomore Aiden Rosa.
- Exilhomme finished the game with 64 rushing yards and a pair of touchdowns.
- James finished the game with five catches for 74 yards and four rushes for 12 yards, while scoring twice.

## CCSU 24, at Columbia 14 - Oct. 12, 2019

The Central Connecticut football team moved to 5-1 overall on the season with a 24-14 road victory at Columbia on Saturday afternoon. The win is the fourth road win of the season for the Blue Devils, the most of any team in the country at the FCS level. The Blue Devils put up 511 yards of total offense against one of the country's best defensive teams in the win. Senior quarterback Aaron Winchester passed for a career-high 299 yards and a touchdown, and rushed for 94 yards and a second score as CCSU put up 212 yards of rushing yards in the game. The Central defense held Columbia to 214 total yards of offense in the game, including just 46 yards rushing on 27 carries. Columbia quarterbacks finished the game just 13-of-28 for 168 yards, and the Blue Devils held the Lions to 3-of-13 on third down conversions. The Blue Devils haven't allowed a rushing touchdown since the third quarter of the Valparaiso game on Sept. 14.

### KEY MOMENTS

- The Blue Devils got on the board with a 71-yard touchdown pass from Winchester to Lucas in the first quarter. It was the longest passing play of the season for the Blue Devils and Lucas' third touchdown of 70+ yards this season.
  - Senior kicker Francis Cole kicked a season-long 45-yard field goal in the 2nd quarter to up the lead to 10-0.
  - The Blue Devils put together a 95-yard drive just before halftime to take a 17-7 lead. The drive took just over a minute and include 65-yards of catches from junior Tyshaun James.
  - Up 17-14 late in the fourth quarter, Winchester rushed for a career-long 62-yard touchdown run with 2:25 to play to push the lead to 10.

### NOTES

- The Blue Devils outgained Columbia 234-30 in the first quarter. In the last two weeks CCSU has outgained its opponents 398-33 in the 1st quarter.
- Central outgained Columbia 378-101 in the first half, and held the ball for 20:19. Central posted over 500 yards of total offense (511) for the first time this season and the first time since last season at Bryant (Oct. 13) when they had 667.
- Winchester finished the game with a career-high 299 yards passing and added 94 yards on the ground. He accounted for two touchdowns.
- CCSU had two players post 100+ receiving yards. Tyshaun James had 126 on four catches, and Keonte Lucas had 114 on four catches. Lucas added 84 yards rushing on 17 carries.
- Central held the ball for 38:40 in the game, their second straight week with over 38 minutes of possession time.

## at CCSU 52, Bryant 14 - Oct. 19, 2019

The No. 25 Central Connecticut football team returned home for the first time in six weeks and put up a convincing 52-14 victory over visiting Bryant University on Saturday afternoon. The Blue Devils, playing in front of a Homecoming crowd of over 5,000, put up 555 total yards of offense and scored their fourth defensive touchdown of the season as they moved to 6-1 overall and 2-0 in Northeast Conference play with the victory. Senior quarterback Aaron Winchester ran for 161 yards and two touchdowns, and threw for 228 yards and two more scores as Central rolled to its third straight win. The Blue Devils allowed 14 or fewer points in a game for the fourth time this season. The Central defense was solid once again, allowing just 279 yards of total offense, marking the third straight game of allowing less than 300 total yards. They also scored their nation-leading fourth defensive touchdown of the season. Junior DJ Exilhomme scooped a Bryant fumble and ran 40 yards for the score. It is his second fumble return for a touchdown this season. The Central defense had four sacks in the game and allowed only 73 yards rushing by Bryant. It was the fifth time this season the Blue Devils have allowed under 100 rushing yards in a game.

### KEY MOMENTS

- Freshman wide receiver Kyren Petteway, who had one carry this season, caught a pair of first quarter touchdowns to give CCSU a 14-0 lead. He had scoring catches of 41 and 34 yards and finished the day with 75 receiving yards.
- Winchester rushed for a career-high 161 yards and two touchdowns in the game. He had scoring runs of 42 and 56 yards.
- DJ Exilhomme picked up a fumble and ran 40 yards for his second fumble return for a touchdown this season.
- Both Exilhomme brothers scored in the game. DJ had a fumble return and junior Danley Exilhomme rushed for a two yard touchdown in the third quarter.

- CCSU has now won three straight in the series vs. Bryant.
- The Blue Devils are now 12-2 in their last 14 NEC games.

## at CCSU 28, LIU 0 - Oct. 26, 2019

The 23rd-ranked Central Connecticut football team posted its first shutout of the season, defeating LIU, 28-0 on Saturday afternoon. The Blue Devils improved to 7-1 overall and 3-0 in Northeast Conference play with the victory. Senior quarterback Aaron Winchester threw for a pair of scores and senior Enyce Walker ran for two more. The Blue Devils have allowed 14 or fewer points in a game five times this season. The Central defense held an opponent below 300 total yards for the fourth straight game, surrendering just 84 yards. The Sharks were limited to just nine yards on the ground, the sixth time the Blue Devils have allowed under 100 rushing yards in a game this season.

### KEY MOMENTS

- Sophomore Dexter Lawson, Jr. picked off an LIU pass on the first play of the second quarter. It was Lawson's third interception of the season and the 12th by the Blue Devils defense.
- Senior Aaron Winchester connected with freshman Kyren Petteway for 32 yards on third down to set up CCSU's opening score. Senior Enyce Walker scored from one-yard out to make it 7-0 midway through the second quarter.
- Central stopped the LIU offense on a 4th-and-one with 6:00 left in the opening half. The Blue Devils would cover 56 yards in 4:18 and go ahead 14-0 after Winchester connected with senior Arthur Gilmore, Jr., for four yards.
- CCSU scored on the opening drive of the second half to go ahead, 21-0. Winchester hit a wide-open sophomore Theo Zidor for 51 yards.
- A 23-yard punt return by sophomore Dexter Lawson into LIU territory was followed by a 31-yard catch by junior Tyshaun James and a one-yard score by Walker.

### GAME NOTES

- The teams were meeting for the first time since 1995, LIU played as C.W. Post.
- The Blue Devils are now 13-2 in their last 15 NEC games.
- It was the first CCSU shutout since a 55-0 win over Lincoln on Sept. 7, 2018. The Blue Devils' last shutout against a Division I opponent was Oct. 31, 2015 (Robert Morris, 34-0).
- Winchester finished the game 13-of-20 for 213 yards and two touchdowns. He added 57 yards on 10 carries.

## CCSU 27, at Wagner 13 - Nov. 2, 2019

The 19th-ranked Central Connecticut football team used 14 second half points to move to 8-1 overall on the season with a 27-13 victory on the road at Wagner on Saturday. The game was tied 13-13 at the half but a pair of second half scoring passes from senior Aaron Winchester paced the Blue Devils to the win. CCSU is 4-0 in Northeast Conference play with this victory. The win is the fifth road victory of the season for the Blue Devils, the most in the country. Central is 8-1 for the first time since the 1973 season. Senior defensive lineman Brandon Puritt led the defense with a career-high three sacks in the win.

### KEY MOMENTS

- Winchester hit classmate Arthur Gilmore, Jr. with a 13-yard scoring pass in the 1st quarter to give CCSU a 6-3 lead with 10:25 on the clock.
- The Blue Devils scored their fifth defensive touchdown of the season to begin the second quarter. Junior DJ Exilhomme blocked a punt and sophomore Alonzo Mitchell recovered it in the end zone for the score.
- Wagner scored the final 10 points of the second quarter and tied the game 13-13 before the break.
- Central broke a 13-13 tie with a 39-yard pass from Winchester to freshman Kyren Petteway, his third TD catch in the last three weeks.
- Winchester's third touchdown pass of the game came from 35 yards out and gave CCSU a 27-13 lead on the first play of the fourth quarter.

### GAME NOTES

- The team's were meeting for the 32nd time in the history of the two programs. The series is now tied 16-16.
- The road win is the fifth of the season for the Blue Devils, the most in the country.
- Central is 8-1 for the first time since the 1973 season.
- The Blue Devils held the Seahawks to -26 rushing yards.
- The Blue Devils outgained Wagner 125 to -1 in the first quarter, but the Seahawks outgained CCSU 129-0 in the second quarter.
- Central recorded three more interceptions in the game, one from sophomore Foday Jalloh, one from senior Tajik Bagley, and one from sophomore Dexter Lawson, to up their number of interceptions to 15 on the season.
- Lawson's interception upped his team-lead to four interceptions on the year.

## at CCSU 38, Saint Francis 31 (ot) - Nov. 9, 2019

The 20th-ranked Central Connecticut football team scored the final 10 points of the game, including the game-winning touchdown in overtime, to match a school-record with its ninth victory of the season. The Blue Devils are now 9-1 overall and 5-0 in Northeast Conference play after a 38-31 overtime victory at home over Saint Francis U. Junior Tyshaun James scored twice, one rushing and another receiving, to lead the offense. Senior quarterback Aaron Winchester finished the game 18-of-24 for 205 yards and two touchdowns in the game. Central's win is its sixth straight. The win moves them to 5-0 in league action, and 15-2 in league games over the last three seasons. The Blue Devil defense caused a big turnover when CCSU was down 24-21 in the third quarter. The Blue Devils scored on their next drive to take the lead 28-24 with 7:17 left in the fourth quarter.

- Junior Danley Exilhomme scored the first touchdown of the game, giving CCSU a 7-0 lead in the 1st quarter.

- Junior Mike Mushaw sealed the game with a sack on the final play of overtime.

## at CCSU 49, Robert Morris 28 - Nov. 16, 2019

The Central Connecticut football team won its school-record 10th game of the season, topping Robert Morris 49-28 in New Britain on Saturday afternoon. The win, along with a Duquesne loss at Bryant, gives the Blue Devils the 2019 Northeast Conference Championship. Central is now 10-1 overall on the season and 6-0 in NEC play. The finish the regular season at Duquesne next Saturday at 12 noon. Senior quarterback Aaron Winchester rushed for four touchdowns and threw for another as the Blue Devils won their seventh straight game and reached 10 wins for the first time in school history. The previous record of nine wins had been accomplished in 1973 and 2009. The Blue Devils rushed for 389 yards in the game led by 185 yards from junior Danley Exilhomme. Winchester added 91 yards on the ground to go with his four touchdowns. The Blue Devil defense forced four more turnovers, including three interceptions, to give them 18 interceptions on the season. Junior Dexter Lawson, Jr., had two to up his team-lead to six on the season.

### KEY MOMENTS

- With the game tied 14-14 at the half, the Blue Devils scored 28 unanswered points to build a 42-14 lead with 10:55 left in the fourth quarter.
- The fifth defensive touchdown of the season for the Blue Devils came at the end of the third quarter when Jahill Brown recovered a RMU fumble and took it 25-yards for the touchdown.
- Winchester scored on touchdown runs of 2, 10, 2 and 1 yard in the game. He also threw a 20-yard touchdown pass to junior Tyshaun James in the third quarter.
- The Blue Devil offense, which racked up 500 yards of total offense, held the ball for 41 of a possible 60 minutes in the win.
- Brown's interception in the third quarter helped change the tide in the game, leading to a CCSU touchdown on the following drive and a lead they would not relinquish for the remainder of the afternoon.

### GAME NOTES

- The 10th win is a new school-record for the Blue Devils, topping the previous record of 9 wins (1973, 2009).
- The trip to the NCAA FCS Playoffs is the second in the last three seasons for the Blue Devils. They also qualified in 2017.
- The four defensive turnovers give the Blue Devils 26 take-aways on the season. They are in the top-5 in the country in defensive turnovers and in turnover margin.
- Central had 29 first downs and their defense held RMU to nine first downs.

## CCSU 43, at DUQUESNE 10 - Nov. 23, 2019

The Central Connecticut football team moved to 11-1 overall and finished the season a perfect 7-0 in Northeast Conference play with a 43-10 road victory at Duquesne on Saturday. On Saturday, senior quarterback Aaron Winchester finished the game 9-of-20 for 188 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. He also rushed the ball 13 times for 57 yards in the win. Junior Tyshaun James caught two passes for 80 yards and a score. Junior Danley Exilhomme ran 13 times for 59 yards and two touchdowns. The Central defense intercepted two more passes, both leading to touchdowns, to push their total to 20 on the season.

### KEY MOMENTS

- The Blue Devils took a 6-0 lead on their first offensive drive of the game. Danley Exilhomme ran it in from four-yards out for the score. James had a key 34-yard rush in the drive.
- Central scored on its second drive of the game, and led 12-0, after a 23-yard touchdown pass from Winchester to sophomore tight end Theo Zidor.
- Walker scored his fifth touchdown of the season to push the lead to 19-0 in the second quarter. His scoring run came from 31-yards out.
- Winchester hit James for a 73-yard touchdown strike, the longest pass play of the season for the Blue Devils, to up the lead to 29-10 in the third quarter.
- Junior DJ Exilhomme returned an interception 87-yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to make it 36-10.

### GAME NOTES

- The Blue Devils didn't allow a point in the first quarter, again. They allowed only three total points in the first quarter of the last eight games. They allowed only 23 first quarter points in 12 regular season games.
- The road win is the sixth of the season for CCSU, the most in school-history and in the country this season, and it's only the second time in league history that an NEC team has won six or more road games (Sacred Heart, 7 in 2001).
- Exilhomme's defensive touchdown was his third of the year and the defense's sixth of the season.
- Central is now 17-2 in its last 19 NEC games.
