WEEVILS HOST RIVAL SOUTHERN ARKANSAS IN SEASON FINALE

The Boll Weevils close out the 2014 season this Saturday at home against fellow Great American Conference charter member Southern Arkansas. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. at Willis "Convoy" Leslie Cotton Boll Stadium. There will be live streaming video coverage, live audio and live statistics available at uamsports.com/coverage.aspx. For fans in Monticello, the game can be heard on KHBM-FM 93.7.

SENIOR DAY

Saturday's game marks the final collegiate contest for 19 Weevil seniors. The 2014 senior class features 10 student-athletes that have spent their entire collegiate career at the University of Arkansas at Monticello. The 2014 seniors are, in numerical order, Mike Early*, Anthony Hughes*, Deadrien Terry, Ivory Washington, Rod Smith, Louis Curry, Chris Roberts*, Austin Morgan, Ian Levine, Devonte Bess*, Steven Richmond, Keith Reynolds, Alex Black*, Reagan Wise*, Jeremiah Bradley*, Christian Dragna*, Chris Gladney*, Matt Pearce and Jalen Garmon*. Those marked with an asterisk are the four-year letterwinners on the team. There will be a special Senior Day Ceremony 30 minutes prior to kickoff of Saturday's game.

BATTLE OF THE TIMBERLANDS

Saturday's game marks the third annual Battle of the Timberlands, a name given to UAM's long-time rivalry with Southern Arkansas prior to the 2012 season. SAU has won the first two installments of the newly-named rivalry, including last year's 44-20 final score in Magnolia to keep control of the traveling trophy, also created prior to the 2012 season. Though the name for the rivalry is new, the series between UAM and SAU in football dates back to the 1913 season and has been played 89 times prior to this Saturday's contest. UAM and SAU have always been conference opponents, starting with competition in the old Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference, transitioning into the NCAA Division II with the Gulf South Conference and now competing as charter members of the Great American Conference. SAU won the initial Battle of the Timberlands 30-14 in the fourth week of the 2012 season. The last UAM win in the series came in the 2010 season, a 28-23 win over the Muleriders in the Boomtown Classic played in El Dorado.



SETTING THE SCENE

The Weevils enter Saturday's game with a 2-7 overall record with the same mark in Great American Conference games following a 47-10 loss to No. 9 Ouachita Baptist at home last weekend. The Weevils have wins over Southwestern Oklahoma State at home (33-14) and Southern Nazarene on the road (44-37). Much like UAM, SAU has multiple close losses to their credit this season. Of UAM's first four losses, the point difference was a combined 18 points. SAU has losses of seven points, three points and 10 points this year, including two weeks ago, a 38-28 loss to Ouachita Baptist on the road, a game where the Muleriders led going into the fourth quarter.

SCOUTING THE WEEVILS

UAM enters Saturday's game ranked seventh in the league in scoring and total offense, while ranking ninth in points allowed and total defense. The Weevils have had the most success this year in the passing game, ranking fourth in the league in pass offense and first in the league in pass defense. Offensively, UAM is led by junior quarterback Hunter Leppert, who is having a comeback player of the year caliber season, nearing 2,000 passing yards coming into Saturday's game. Leppert suffered season-ending knee injuries in the 2011 and 2012 seasons, then missed all of last year in rehab. So far this year, Leppert has completed 164 passes for 1,829 yards with 12 touchdowns and only two interceptions. He has also racked up 164 rushing yards, and ranks fourth in the Great American Conference in total offense at nearly 250 yards per game. Leppert has four targets to choose from this year that have at least 20 receptions. Senior Ivory Washington leads the squad in receptions with 34 for 359 yards, but senior Deadrien Terry leads the team in yardage with 33 catches for 452 yards. Junior Cody Bordelon has 32 catches for 428 yards and leads the team with four touchdown receptions. Senior Ian Levine has added 25 catches for 240 yards. Defensively, UAM has been led by a trio of seniors. Anthony Hughes leads the team in total tackles with 57, Keith Reynolds follows with 50, including 4.5 tackles for loss. Louis Curry has a total of 49 tackles, including nine for loss and 4.5 sacks. Senior Mike Early has also filled up the stat sheet this year with 32 tackles, four interceptions for 111 yards, seven pass breakups, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble to go along with a total of four touchdowns.

SCOUTING THE MULDERIDERS

Southern Arkansas brings one of the most explosive offenses in the Great American Conference, and is one of only two teams in the league to average more than 500 yards per game. The Mulderiders rank second in the league in total offense with an average of 508.0 yards per game, trailing only Henderson State at 510.5. SAU's multi-dimensional offense is led by dual-threat quarterback Si Blackshire, who is tops in the GAC in total offense per game, averaging 331.7 yards per contest. Blackshire has totaled 2,682 passing yards and 303 rushing yards throughout nine games this year. He ranks second in the league in passing at 298.0 yards per game with a total of 26 passing touchdowns. The SAU quarterbacks have completed passes to 15 different receivers this year, led by Zikerious Ware with 44 receptions for 741 yards and seven touchdowns. SAU's rushing attack is led by Deandre Jenkins and Deion Williams with 624 and 480 yards, respectively. Defensively, SAU is led by A.J. Steele, who has 84 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, one interception, two pass breakups, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble. Steele ranks sixth in the GAC in tackles with an average of 9.3 per contest.

- UAM ranks 13th in nation with only five interceptions thrown this year.
- UAM ranks 18th in the nation in pass defense at 174.0 yards allowed per game.
- UAM leads the GAC in red zone offense, scoring 83.3 percent of time.
- UAM QB Hunter Leppert ranks 33rd nationally with 21 passes completed per game.
- UAM's Mike Early is one of only 10 players in the nation with two KO returns for TDs.
- UAM's Mike Early leads the GAC with an average of 25.7 yards per kickoff return.
- UAM's Mike Early averages 1.2 passes defended per game, ranking third in the GAC.
- UAM's Chris Roberts ranks sixth in the nation with three fumbles recovered this year.
- SAU ranks 11th in the nation in total offense at 508.0 yards per game.
- SAU ranks 19th in the nation in pass offense at 306.8 yards per game.
- SAU ranks 22nd in the nation in yards per completion at 14.53 per catch.
- SAU is one of 70 teams in the nation to not have allowed a blocked punt this year.
- SAU ranks 14th in the nation in time of possession, averaging just over 33 min. per game.
- SAU's Si Blackshire ranks seventh in the nation in points responsible for (20.9 per game).
- SAU's Si Blackshire ranks 10th in the nation in total offense (331.7 yards per game).

After nearly two decades of coaching, William "Hud" Jackson finally got his shot to become a head coach at the collegiate level with one of the best birthday presents he could imagine.

Jackson was named UAM's 25th head football coach on his 43rd birthday, December 14, 2010. He led the Boll Weevils to a 5-6 record during his first year in the green and white, including a stunning 23-9 victory over then ranked No. 4 Valdosta State in the fifth week of the season. He guided the Boll Weevils to a fourth place finish in the first year of the Great American Conference after the league's head coaches picked UAM to finish last.

Along the way, UAM ranked in the top half of 20 different GAC statistical categories, including the league's best numbers in total interceptions (17) and first downs (21.8 per game). His offense ranked third with an average of just under 400 yards per game, and his defense also ranked third with just 362.5 yards per game allowed.

Jackson and his staff produced nine all-conference selections during the 2011 campaign, including a trio of first team honorees in receiver D.J. Stephens, returning offensive lineman Seth Oxner and punter Derek Jambon. Jackson added another all-conference honoree in honorable mention wide receiver Jamal Nixon following the 1-10 2012 season. Last season, Jackson tutored the most decorated placekicker to ever wear a UAM uniform in true freshman Jamie McGee. McGee became the school's first ever All-America placekicker after setting a new school record with 17 made field goals throughout the season. Defensive tackle Calvin Ursin also joined McGee to earn All-America honors following the 2013 season.

In addition to his attention to on-field production, Jackson's staff has also revamped the UAM football roster, striving to secure as much local talent as possible. In his first recruiting class prior to the 2011 season, Jackson unveiled a list of 34 high school seniors, 22 of which coming from within a 90-mile radius of the UAM campus. More of the same for the 2012, 2013 and 2014 classes with nearly 50 young men locked up from within that area.

Since Jackson's UAM tenure began, the Weevils football program has seen new team records in overall team GPA and community service hours.

Prior to taking over at UAM, Jackson served as an assistant head coach at the University of Central Arkansas for six years. He joined UCA's staff following a successful 14-year high school coaching career in the state of Louisiana.

The Thibodaux, Louisiana native entered the coaching ranks as an assistant football coach and head baseball coach at Rayne High School from 1992-93 and moved on to Assumption High School in Napoleonville from 1993-95 as offensive coordinator for the football team and assistant baseball coach.

In 1995, Jackson took his first high school head coaching job at Oberlin High School, where he was head football coach, head baseball coach and athletic director from for two years.

His last stop in the high school ranks was arguably his best. From 1997-2004, Jackson led Central Catholic High School in Morgan City to three district football championships as well as three state championships for the baseball team.

Jackson graduated from E.D. White High School in Thibodaux, La. in 1987, where he was an all-state baseball player. He continued his education at McNeese State University in Lake Charles, La., where he earned a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1992.

Jackson was a three-year starter at quarterback for the Cowboys. He also lettered in baseball, earning the team's most valuable player and outstanding pitcher awards in 1991.

Jackson's father, Sonny, was the head football coach at Nicholls State University in Thibodaux from 1981-1986, and is still the program's most successful coach. During his tenure, Sonny Jackson led the Colonels to a 39-28-1 record, winning the Gulf Star Conference in 1984 and taking NSU to its first ever NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearance in 1986. He was also the head coach at McNeese State for three seasons from 1987-89.

Hud Jackson and his wife, Patricia, were married in 1989. They have one son, William, Jr. (20), and two daughters, Alexis (24) and Baleigh (16). William, III. William is currently a redshirt freshman quarterback for the Boll Weevils.

@WEEVILFOOTBALL DROPS HEARTBREAKER IN OPENER

MONTICELLO – The University of Arkansas at Monticello football team led by 10 points heading into the fourth quarter, but East Central fought back with a pair of touchdowns to record the come-from-behind victory over the Boll Weevils in the 2014 season opener, a 38-34 decision on September 6 at Willis "Convoy" Leslie Cotton Boll Stadium.

After East Central (1-0, 1-0 Great American Conference) took the lead with 1:42 remaining, the Weevils (0-1, 0-1 GAC) set up following the kickoff return at their own 33-yard line. UAM went 32 yards in six plays, featuring a 17-yard pitch-and-catch from junior Colton Morrison to junior Ivory Washington and a pass interference call against the Tigers. On the ensuing second down, Colton Morrison's pass into the end zone seemed to have been caught by senior Ivory Washington to put UAM back on top, but the officials ruled the pass had been intercepted, thus giving ECU the ball back at its own 20-yard line with 57 seconds remaining. That spot moved to the 35 after a penalty was assessed to the UAM sideline following the call.

With no UAM timeouts remaining, the Tigers took two knees and sealed the win.

Senior Mike Early put a positive note on a disappointing end result by breaking the UAM single-game record for kickoff return yards with 183. The Denham Springs, Louisiana native became the first player in school history to return two kickoff returns for touchdowns in the same game. He had two 89-yard touchdown returns in Saturday's loss to ECU.

UAM senior Jalen Garmon recovered an ECU fumble on the UAM five-yard line with the Tigers looking to take a lead with 4:02 remaining in the game. However, the Weevils were unable to get anything going on their ensuing drive. After UAM was forced to punt from the back of its own end zone, the Tigers needed only 39 seconds to go 35 yards on two plays to take the lead and finalize the scoring.

Senior running back Rod Smith scored from nine yards out with 9:22 remaining in the game to put UAM on top 34-24. ECU responded with a six-play, 71-yard drive capped with a 20-yard touchdown pass from Spencer Bond to Juwan Dotson to pull the Tigers to within three points with just under eight minutes remaining.

Early's second kickoff return for a touchdown erased ECU's first lead of the game and put the Weevils back on top 27-24 with less than a minute remaining in the third quarter. His first gave UAM a 14-3 lead with just over 10 minutes remaining in the second quarter.

UAM led 14-10 at halftime. The Weevils were outscored 28-20 in the final 30 minutes.

The Tigers outgained UAM 498-311. ECU balanced its attack with 286 passing yards and 212 rushing yards. Nearly all of UAM's yards came through the air. Colton Morrison finished the game 23-for-47 with 289 yards and two interceptions. The Weevils were held to a net of 22 rushing yards in the contest, and were looking at negative rushing yardage at halftime.

Morrison's favorite target in the loss was senior Deadrien Terry with seven catches for 91 yards in his UAM debut. Senior Ian Levine finished with seven catches for 84 yards and Trey Taylor turned in 48 yards on three receptions.

Sophomore kicker Jamie McGee nailed his 18th and 19th career field goals in Saturday's loss, one from 25 yards and the other from 33 yards. Sophomore Brett Courville opened the game's scoring with a four-yard rushing touchdown to cap an 11-play, 76-yard drive at the 9:03 mark of the opening period.

The Weevils begin a two-game road swing next Saturday with a trip to Durant, Oklahoma to face Southeastern Oklahoma State. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. at Paul Laird Field.

SOUTHEASTERN BEATS UAM IN A SHOOTOUT

DURANT, Oklahoma – In a high-scoring offensive showdown, it usually comes down to which team has the ball last. That proved true Saturday night (9/13/14) at Paul Laird Field as Southeastern Oklahoma State's Jake Walters made a 19-yard field goal as time expired to defeat the University of Arkansas at Monticello football team by a final score of 52-49.

Saturday's game finished with nearly 1,200 yards of total offense combined between the two squads. Southeastern (1-1) outscored UAM (0-2) 28-14 in the first half, but it was the Weevils that held the scoring advantage in the second half 35-24. The third quarter alone featured 35 points combined. In that third period, UAM scored on all but one possession and also scored on defense on a 15-yard scoop-and-score by senior Mike Early.

Hunter Leppert made his return to the gridiron on Saturday. The 2011 and 2012 early-season starting quarterback for UAM missed the entire 2013 season due to his third knee injury. On Saturday, the Minden, Louisiana native went 23-for-32 through the air for 345 yards and three touchdowns. Two of his touchdown tosses went to junior Cody Bordelon in the second half, the first an 18-yard score to pull UAM to within seven points, and the second a 10-yard out pattern to tie the game at 42-42 early in the fourth quarter. Leppert also added 64 rushing yards on just seven carries.

Bordelon finished the night with nine catches for 122 yards. Freshman Jalen Tolliver added five catches for 74 yards, senior Deadrien Terry had four for 96 and senior Rod Smith had four for 48. Smith added 90 yards on the ground on 19 carries with two rushing touchdowns.

Smith's first rushing touchdown will make the highlight reel of the game, scampering 33 yards and breaking several tackles along the way to once again pull UAM to within one touchdown. His second score, a two-yard plunge to cap a nine-play, 75-yard drive tied the game at 49-49 with 5:48 remaining in regulation.

UAM's first score came on a five-yard sweep from senior Ivory Washington early in the second quarter to cut Southeastern's lead to 14-7. Washington found the end zone again in the final minute of the first half on an eight-yard pass from Leppert to cap an eight-play, 62-yard drive. That finalized the first half scoring and put Southeastern up 28-14 at halftime.

Southeastern finished with a 616-557 edge in total offense. UAM won the passing battle 400-304, and Southeastern dominated the rushing category 312-157. Southeastern's Ryan Polite had 304 passing yards and three touchdowns.

The Savage Storm posted a pair of 100-yard rushers, led by Ronnie Green at 141 yards off 25 carries.

RANGERS HOLD OFF WEEVILS

ALVA, Oklahoma – The University of Arkansas at Monticello football team suffered its third straight loss to start the season by less than seven points in a 34-28 setback to Northwestern Oklahoma State on Saturday (9/20/14) at Ranger Field.

The Weevils (0-3) rallied to take a 28-27 lead with just under two minutes remaining in regulation on a fourth-down touchdown pass from junior Hunter Leppert to junior Cody Bordenon to cap an eight-play, 62-yard drive that used 2:32.

The Rangers (1-2) answered in 1:24 on a six-play, 75-yard drive capped by five-yard touchdown run from Jarion Tudman. With 32 seconds left in the game, the Weevils went 36 yards on six plays, but a last-second pass into the endzone intended for senior Deadrien Terry was batted down to seal the win.

Both teams scored a pair of touchdowns in the second half after NWSU took a 20-14 lead into the locker room at halftime.

NWSU's Malcolm Robinson opened the scoring at the 6:03 mark of the first quarter on a seven-yard touchdown run to cap a 12-play, 64-yard drive that used 5:20. The point-after attempt went left, which eventually led to UAM taking a one-point lead in the fourth quarter.

UAM answered late in the first quarter to take the lead on an eight-yard touchdown run by senior Rod Smith on an eight-play, 67-yard drive that used 3:14.

The Rangers finalized the first quarter scoring on a 33-yard touchdown pass from Ty Hooper to Dashawn Gordon with 34 seconds remaining in the period.

UAM regained the lead on a 15-play, 93-yard drive capped by a 26-yard touchdown pass from Leppert to senior Steven Richmond with 6:04 remaining until halftime. NWSU answered with a six-play, 80-yard drive and a seven-yard touchdown run by Tudman to finalize the first half scoring.

The Rangers were the only team to get on the scoreboard in the third quarter. NWSU dialed up a trick-play, double pass from Alex DeLaCruz to a wide-open Reggie Harris for a 27-yard touchdown. That put Northwestern up 27-14 with just under six minutes remaining in the third quarter.

UAM rattled off two straight touchdowns to regain the lead, the first a 14-yard quarterback keeper into the end zone by Leppert at the 5:32 mark of the fourth quarter. After forcing NWSU to punt on its next drive, the Weevils set up its go ahead drive, featuring Leppert's pass to Bordenon at the goal line on fourth down.

The Weevils edged the Rangers in total offense 393-379. Northwestern won the rushing battle 203-99, while UAM posted a 294-176 edge in passing. Leppert finished the game 22-for-38 through the air with exactly 300 yards and two touchdowns. He was sacked four times in the loss. Bordenon finished with six catches for 62 yards and senior Ivory Washington had five catches for 81 yards. Senior Deadrien Terry ended with four catches for 71 yards.

Cornerback Demarcus Robinson paced the UAM defense with nine total tackles. Andrew Jackson and Louis Curry had five and four tackles, respectively, and one quarterback sack each.

TAKEAWAYS LEAD TO UAM FOOTBALL WIN OVER SWOSU

MONTICELLO – The University of Arkansas at Monticello football team forced five turnovers and scored in every quarter leading to a 33-14 victory over Southwestern Oklahoma State on Saturday night (9/27/14) at home.

The victory snaps a six-game losing streak for the Weevils (1-3, 1-3 Great American Conference) dating back to the final three weeks of the 2013 season, and comes on a day in which the University unveiled and dedicated a life-size bust of all-time winningest coach Tommy Barnes inside the lobby of the Indoor Practice Facility.

The Weevil defense picked off three SWOSU passes, two coming from senior Mike Early, including a 23-yard interception return for a touchdown to put UAM on top 16-7 late in the second quarter. UAM's defense also forced three SWOSU fumbles, recovering two, including one recovered on a punt that hit a SWOSU player inside the 10-yard line. That fumble set up an eventual one-yard touchdown sweep from senior Ivory Washington to finalize the scoring with 3:54 remaining in the contest.

UAM's third interception of the night came from senior Alex Black early in the fourth quarter to negate 13-play, 47-yard drive by the Bulldogs.

Also making headlines in the victory was sophomore kicker Jamie McGee, who made his 20th and 21st career field goals, including a 51-yarder with seven seconds remaining in the first half to put UAM on top 19-7 heading into the locker room. That 51-yarder is tied for the third longest field goal in UAM history, and breaks his previous individual record of 43. He made a 26-yard field goal to give UAM's its first lead, 9-7 at the 12:44 mark of the second quarter.

Southwestern (2-2, 2-2 GAC) opened the scoring on a seven-yard touchdown run from Karl Hodge to cap a 10-play, 88-yard drive that used the first 3:49 of the contest. UAM answered with the first of senior Rod Smith's two rushing touchdowns in the game, this one coming from four yards out to cap a 13-play, 88-yard drive that used 4:56.

McGee's 26-yard field goal, Early's pick-six and McGee's 51-yard field goal were the next three scores, as UAM held SWOSU to only one score in the first half.

Smith opened the second-half scoring by busting loose up the middle for a 48-yard touchdown run on a three-play, 58-yard drive that used just 58 seconds. The Dumas, Arkansas native ended the game with a career-high 131 rushing yards on 21 carries for an average of 6.2 yards per carry.

SWOSU got back on the scoreboard with 4:22 remaining in the third quarter on a three-yard touchdown run by Matt Farris that capped an eight-play, 82-yard drive that used 2:57. That score cut UAM's lead to 26-14.

The Weevils forced and recovered fumbles on SWOSU's next two drives that eventually sealed the victory. The first of those fumbles came on a UAM punt that deflected off of SWOSU's Ja'Vaughn Mitchell and recovered by UAM's Byron Miller at the SWOSU three-yard line, setting up Ivory Washington's lead-cushioning score.

Senior defensive end Louis Curry was responsible for the second fumble by punching the ball loose on a quarterback sack of SWOSU's Klark Ashmore. Senior Chris Roberts recovered that fumble, and UAM ran out all but 14 seconds of the clock, leaving SWOSU no time to mount a comeback.

UAM finished the game with 347 yards of total offense to SWOSU's 325. The Weevils balanced their offensive attack with 198 yards passing and 153 yards rushing. SWOSU ended the night with 230 rushing yards and just 95 yards through the air.

The Weevils (1-4, 1-4 Great American Conference) were held to just two scores on a total of 14 drives. The first score came on a three-yard touchdown run from senior Rod Smith with 2:49 remaining in the second quarter to cap an eight-play, 71-yard drive that used just 1:54. The extra point UAM on top 7-6.

ATU's Randy Velazquez missed the extra point attempt. Smith's three-yard score followed to give UAM its only lead of the contest.

Tech (3-2, 3-1 GAC) outscored UAM 12-0 in the third quarter on a 31-yard field goal by Velazquez, a safety off a bad snap on a UAM punt and Kelton Smith's second rushing touchdown of the game, this one from two yards out to put the Wonder Boys up 18-7.

Leppert's touchdown pass to Tolliver ended the game's scoring.

Leppert finished the contest 18-for-39 through the air for 142 yards. Senior Ivory Washington was Leppert's favorite target in the loss with eight receptions for 68 yards. WEEVILS GET FIRST ROAD WIN IN GAC ERA

BETHANY, Oklahoma – The University of Arkansas at Monticello football team secured its first Great American Conference road victory since joining the league in 2011 with a 44-37 win over Southern Nazarene (10/25/14) on Saturday.

After leading 16-9 at halftime, UAM (2-5, 2-5 GAC) won a second-half shootout with the Crimson Storm (0-8, 0-8 GAC) 28-21 in the second half to come away with the one-touchdown victory. With the win, the Weevils snapped a 22-game losing streak in games not played at Willis "Conroy" Leslie Cotton Ball Stadium.

Junior Trey Taylor was responsible for two touchdowns in the win, the second giving UAM its final advantage. Taylor hauled in a 40-yard touchdown pass from junior quarterback Hunter Leppert with 7:27 remaining in regulation, the final score in the contest.

SNU fought back from a two-touchdown deficit with two quick scores early in the fourth quarter. The first came on a seven-yard touchdown run from Lorenzo Alexander to cut UAM's lead to 37-30. Then, the Crimson Storm tied the game with 10:07 remaining on an eight-yard touchdown rush by quarterback Alec Laffoon after SNU picked off a Leppert pass inside the UAM 10-yard line. It was Leppert's first interception of the season.

The Weevils opened the game's scoring with a 10-play, 71-yard opening drive capped off by a three-yard touchdown run by sophomore quarterback Brett Courville at the 11:45 mark of the opening period. Sophomore Jamie McGee's extra point attempt missed right.

SNU answered later in the first quarter and took a 7-6 lead on a two-yard touchdown rush by Lorenzo Alexander to cap a nine-play, 29-yard drive that was set up by a blocked punt.

Leppert was sacked in the end zone by SNU's Jonathan Archie at the 11:28 mark of the second quarter to put the Crimson Storm up 9-6. UAM took a 13-9 lead with 3:30 remaining in the half on an 18-yard touchdown pass from Leppert to Ivory Washington to cap a seven-play, 71-yard drive.

Senior cornerback Mike Early hauled in his second interception of the game with just over two minutes remaining in the first half and returned it 34 yards to the SNU 11-yard line, but UAM's offense stalled resulting in a 28-yard field goal by McGee to close the first half's scoring.

SNU opened the second-half with a 90-yard scoring drive on eight plays, capped by a six-yard scoring rush by Lorenzo Alexander. That score tied the game 16-16 at the 10:13 mark of the third period.

Junior Cody Bordelon put the Weevils back on top 23-16 with a 74-yard catch-and-run for a touchdown from the pass of Leppert, capping a three-play, 77-yard drive.

Trey Taylor helped UAM take a two-score lead on the Weevils' next drive, catching a backward pass from Leppert and then throwing 34-yards downfield into the end zone to senior Deadrien Terry to cap a quick two-play, 53-yard drive.

SNU responded with a 17-yard touchdown run by Alec Laffoon to cap a four-play, 52-yard drive. The Weevils got back on top by two scores on the ensuing possession, posting an 11-play, 65-yard drive capped by a one-yard score by senior Steven Richmond. That score finalized the third-quarter scoring, putting UAM up 37-23.

UAM finished the game with a 477-346 advantage in total offense. Leppert finished the game 20-for-37 for 323 yards with three touchdowns. UAM totaled 120 rushing yards in the win, led by Richmond's 13 carries for 52 yards. Leppert finished with 10 carries for 31 yards, and freshman Jeremy Jackson added seven carries for 25 yards.

Leppert's favorite target in the win was senior Ivory Washington, who hauled in six passes for 82 yards. Bordelon finished with three receptions for 103 yards. Taylor had three for 71, Terry had three for 65, and freshman Jalen Tolliver had three for 31.

Junior Andrew Jackson paced UAM's defense with eight total tackles, including one quarterback sack. Seniors Alex Black and Keith Reynolds each added six tackles.

WEEVILS FALL TO NO. 14 HENDERSON STATE

ARKADELPHIA, Arkansas – Nationally 14th-ranked Henderson State scored seven touchdowns on 12 drives and limited the University of Arkansas at Monticello football team to 261 yards of total offense to defeat the Boll Weevils 49-7 on Saturday (11/1/14) at Carpenter-Haygood Stadium.

UAM's offense was backed against the wall throughout the ball game with an average starting field position spot of its own 19-yard line. UAM had six of its 13 drives begin inside its own 15-yard line, two coming at the one-yard line. UAM rushed for 112 yards on 39 carries and passed for 149 on 18 completions.

The Reddies posted 563 yards of total offense, 174 on the ground and 389 through the air. It was the second highest total offense yardage allowed by UAM this season and the most passing yards allowed this year for a team that led the Great American Conference in pass defense coming into Saturday's game.

HSU scored 14 points in each of the first two quarters, added seven in the third and another 14 in the fourth and final period.

UAM's lone touchdown of the game came on a 17-yard pass and catch from junior quarterback Hunter Leppert to true freshman receiver Jalen Tolliver with 36 seconds remaining in the first half to cap a nine-play, 67-yard drive that used 3:49. That was the longest drive for the Weevil offense of the game in terms of plays and yards.

Leppert finished the contest 17-for-28 through the air for 132 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Leppert was sacked seven times in the loss and hurried on five different plays. UAM running back Steven Richmond led the team in receiving yards with five catches out of the backfield for 25 yards. Senior Ian Levine had four catches for 39 yards and Tolliver finished with two for 28.

Freshman Jeremy Jackson led the Weevil rushing attack with nine carries for 61 yards, including a 33-yard run late in the fourth quarter. Leppert added 34 yards on 14 carries.

HSU quarterback Kevin Rodgers finished the game 28-for-36 through the air for 346 yard and three touchdowns. He and backup quarterback Dallas Hardison completed passes to 12 different receivers during Saturday's game.

The Reddies were forced to punt only once on Saturday, with their other three non-scoring offensive drives ending on failed fourth-down conversions and a missed field goal attempt.

MONTICELLO – Ninth-ranked Ouachita Baptist scored 44 points in the first half to set up a comfortable 47-10 victory over the University of Arkansas at Monticello football team on Saturday (11-8-14) at Convoy Leslie Cotton Boll Stadium.

The Tigers (9-0, 9-0 Great American Conference) scored 14 points in the first quarter and added 30 in the second quarter, including a 99-yard interception return for a touchdown by Ricardy Joseph as time expired in the first half to give OBU a 44-0 lead at the break.

OBU's Brandon Marks scored three touchdowns in the first half, two rushing and one receiving. Ouachita scored its final points of the game at the 7:59 mark of the third quarter on a 22-yard field goal from Shelton Wooley.

The Weevils (2-7, 2-7 GAC) scored 10 fourth-quarter points to avoid the shutout. Junior quarterback Hunter Leppert linked up with senior Deadrien Terry for a nine-yard touchdown pass at the 13:11 mark of the fourth quarter to cap a nine-play, 46-yard drive that used 4:26. Sophomore kicker Jamie McGee finalized the game's scoring with a 33-yard field goal with 2:18 remaining in the game to cap a 14-play, 74-yard drive.

Ouachita outgained UAM 345-282. The Tigers racked up 260 rushing yards on 49 carries and 85 passing yards on four completions. UAM totaled 194 passing yards on 17 completions and 88 rushing yards on 32 attempts.

UAM was led in rushing by sophomore quarterback Brett Courville with 56 yards on seven carries. Freshman Jeremy Jackson added 46 yards on 10 carries. Junior Cody Bordon led UAM's receivers with five receptions for 58 yards. Senior Ivory Washington added 33 yards on three catches, Terry finished with 31 yards on three catches and senior Steven Richmond had 29 yards on two receptions.

Senior Keith Reynolds paced the UAM defense with seven tackles, five of which were unassisted. Seniors Anthony Hughes and Louis Curry each had six tackles in the loss.
