## SOUTHERN 2010 SEASON OUTLOOK

### OFFENSIVE LINE

The Southern offensive line should once again be a solid force, as the Jags return all but one starter from last year's team that gave up the least amount of sacks (13). The offensive line also helped the Jags lead the SWAC in total offense (365.9 yds/gm), was second in passing offense (239.8 yds/gm) and was fourth in rushing offense (126.1 yds/gm). Ramon Chinyoung (6-1½, 295, R-Sr., Houston, TX/Westfield HS) returns as the "quarterback" of the offensive line, for 2010. Chinyoung was a first team all-SWAC selection last season and will be looked upon to once again take on the role of leader up front. Joining Chinyoung will be Lee Almanza (6-4, 300, Jr., Houston, TX/Madison HS). Almanza was a solid performer last season, making the jump to a full time starter. One player who saw considerable time as a backup and part-time starter last season, Roddrell Stewart (6-3, 315, R-Sr., Baton Rouge, LA/Scotlandville HS), caught the eye of head coach Stump Mitchell during and after spring drills. The coaching staff concentrated heavily on the offensive line during the recruiting period, as signed several junior college players for the upcoming season.

### QUARTERBACKS

With the loss of signal caller Bryant Lee, the SU Jags will have an inexperienced signal caller for the first time in recent history. Lee, was the Offensive Player of the Year on the 2009 all-SWAC team, & led the conference with 2,863 total yards. He was also the league's No. 1 passer for the third straight year, completing 207 of 345 passes for 2,565 yards and 24 touchdowns. He had 10 interceptions. Jeremiah McGinty (6-0, 200, So., Houston, TX/Southeast Prep) steps into role of the Jags starting quarterback, coming out of the spring drills. McGinty completed three of five passes for 34 yards in 2009. He also rushed eight times for 37 yards and one touchdown. But this is also a position that will see an immediate influx of newcomers, as Coach Mitchell and staff have recruited three quarterbacks to help with depth and for the future of SU football.

### RUNNING BACKS

Although the Jags do lose the top rusher from a year ago, the running back position is one of the more deep and talented positions on the offensive side of the ball. The top returning rusher is Gary Hollimon (6-1, 215, R-Sr., Gulfport, Ms/Gulfport HS), a former quarterback turned running back last season, who finished the 2009 season with 346 yards on 51 rushing attempts and a team high six rushing touchdowns. Hollimon also was a threat catching passes out of the backfield, with 14 receptions for 197 yards and two scores. Byron Williams (5-10, 185, Jr., Clinton, La/Clinton HS) returns in the SU backfield, after missing the second half of the season with a broken ankle. Williams rushed for 110 yards and a score, while also catching four passes for 36 yards. Also returning for his second season at SU is Brandon Rice. Rice rushed for 91 yards and two touchdowns on 18 carries as a freshman, as well as catching one pass for 19 yards.

### WIDE RECEIVERS

With the arrival of a new coaching staff, there is also a change in the offensive philosophy, as the four and five wideout sets will be substituted with a more tradition pro style offense. But with several returnees back in the fold for 2010, the Southern receiving corps will need to once again need to be a solid rock in the Southern foundation this season. The biggest hurdle with be replacing Juamorris Stewart. Stewart was named to the All-SWAC first team for the second consecutive season, and wrapped up one of the most successful stints in the history of Southern University football. He was named AFCA All-America. He finished his career as SU's All-Time leading pass catcher with 201 career receptions. He also had 2,668 career receiving yards and 25 touchdowns. In the 2009 season alone, Stewart led the SWAC with 81 catches for 1,028 yards and 11 touchdowns. He went on to sign a free agent deal with the Arizona Cardinals of the NFL. The leading returning receiver for the new regime, is Curry Allen (6-3, 205, R-Sr., St. Francisville, La/West Feliciana HS). Allen caught 26 passes a year ago, for 336 yards and three scores. He finished as the third leading receiver on the team in '09. Joining Allen will be LaQuinton Evans (6-2, 190, Jr., Mansfield, La/Mansfield HS) who came on to catch 15 passes for 166 yards (fourth on team) and one touchdown and Isaiah Nelson (5-9, 185, R-Sr., Baton Rouge, La/Southern Lab HS) both saw extended time in 2009 and each showed flashes of stepping their game up to the next level. Nelson accounted for 11 catches for 95 yards and one touchdown. Corey Cushingberry (5-9, 180, R-Sr., Baton Rouge, La/Istrouma HS/WV Tech) and Jeremy Paul (6-3, 190, Sr., Baton Rouge,

La/Belaire HS) should also look to be counted on for depth at the position. Cushingberry had nine catches for 112 yards, while Paul had five catches for 68 yards and one touchdown, respectively last season. Although talented, this group also drew the ire of first year coach Stump Mitchell during the spring.

### TIGHT ENDS

After a season that saw the Jags finally make good use out of the tight end position, SU is back in the hunt for a solid prospect. In 2009, Warren Matthews had 27 catches for 434 yards and six scores before being injured in the first half of the State Farm Bayou Classic. He was named first team All-SWAC. It was the first time in seven years the Jags had an All-SWAC tight end. The staff experimented with several players during the spring, including Javon Jordan (6-6, 230, R-Fr., Marrero, La/John Ehret HS). Jordan redshirted in his first season on the bluff.

### DEFENSIVE LINE

One area that will need to improve in the upcoming season with be the defensive front. Although individually some players produced good numbers, as a unit, the d-line failed to live up to expectations. Jordan Miller (6-3, 280, Sr., Upper Marlboro, Md/Largo HS) finished as the third leading tackler from the defensive line. Miller recorded 54 tackles, including 12 tackles for losses. He led the team in sacks with six (1-8th in SWAC) and had two fumbles recoveries and one forced fumble to go along with a team-high five quarterback sacks. Miller will be counted on heavily to provide senior leadership for the defensive front. Steven Williams (6-1, 260, Sr., Mobile, Al/WP Davidson HS) finished eighth on the team in tackles in '09, wrapping up the season with 42 tackles and team-high tying 12 tackles for losses. He tied for second on the team with four sacks and had two quarterback hurries. Casey Narcisse (5-10, 285, R-So., St. James, La/St. James HS/UL-Monroe) transferred in to Southern from UL-Monroe, and stepped in to a nice fit. Narcisse recorded 35 tackles, including five for losses. Dexter James (6-4, 270, Sr., Brusly, La/Brusly HS) will return for his senior season as he missed the majority of last season with a shoulder injury that required off-season surgery. Expectations were high for James, as he entered the 2009 season as a second team All-SWAC selection. Before being injured, he recorded eight tackles, two tackles for losses and one sack. The staff is hoping that James is 100% and ready to go come the fall. Look for several recruits along with holdovers Delwin Williams (6-3, 250, Jr., Napoleonville, La/Assumption HS) and Dion Palmer (6-3, 240, So., Houston, TX/Southeast Prep) to provided much needed depth.

### LINEBACKERS

One position on the defensive side of the ball that that is probably the deepest and most experienced is the linebackers. This group returns the team top tackler from a season ago in Andre' Coleman and the group returns all but one starter from last season's team. Andre' Coleman (6-1, 240, R-Sr., Baton Rouge, La/Scotlandville HS) stepped into the starting lineup last season and flourished, finishing the season as Southern's top tackler with 68 (12th in SWAC), including eight tackles for loss, one sack, two interceptions, one forced and one recovered fumble. He will be counted on to play at a high level throughout the season after having such a breakout year. Joining Coleman as a regular returning is Justin Fletcher (6-1, 220, Jr., Houston, TX/Thurgood Marshall HS). Fletcher is another talented linebacker who came on strong towards the end of 2009 and showed flashes of what could be from the fiery young. He finished last season as SU's seventh leading tackler with 45, including six tackles for loss, two sacks and one fumble recovery. Also look for the return of Marcus Clark (6-0, 240, R-Jr./Patterson, La/Patterson HS) to the fold on defense. Clark recorded 41 tackles including six tackles for losses, one forced and one recovered fumble and one blocked kick. Also returning after a season that saw him flip-flopping between safety and linebacker, will be Gary Chatman (6-3, 220, R-Sr., Houston, TX/Forest Brook HS). Chatman, a defensive captain in '09, recorded 29 tackles last season, one interception, one forced and one recovered fumble. Look for Chatman to really shine in 2010 and make a significant impact in his final season. Another solid linebacker returning will be Corey Ray (6-0, 235, R-Jr., Clinton, Ms/Clinton HS). Ray had 26 tackles, four for losses and two pass breakups in an injury riddled season. He is a solid player who plays all-out with wreckless disregard for his own body, but he suffered through should problems for the second time in his career at Southern. Another Coleman to look out for is the younger brother of Andre', Lynnnon Coleman. The younger Coleman was forced into action as a freshman

in the second half of the season and made an immediate impact, finishing the season with 15 tackles and one forced fumble. Coleman should provide depth and should press for increased playing in '10.

### DEFENSIVE BACKS

One of the most solid factions of the Jags defense in 2009, was the defensive secondary. The defensive backs had to make for too many tackles last season, with defensive breakdowns, but they also led the SWAC interceptions (23) and turnover margin (+18). Leading the way will be safety, Jason House (6-0, 190, R-Sr., Laurel, Ms/Laurel HS). House led the SWAC and NCAA (FCS) with 10 interceptions and 230 yards in returns, and the wide receiver turned defensive back, had one return for a touchdown. He was named first team All-SWAC, as well as first team All-America. House finished the season as the Jags sixth leading tackler with 47 tackles and one forced fumble. Two young cornerbacks that saw playing time out the box, and were quickly thrown into the fire were, Tim Berry and Pierre Warford. Both performed admirably all season and a lot will be counted from them heading into 2010. Berry (5-10, 185, So., St. Francisville, La/West Feliciana HS) first freshman to start in the majority of games, and played every game since Lenny Williams (2000-2003). Berry had a successful freshman season finishing the season sixth in tackles with 46. He was second on the team in interceptions with three, while also recovering a fumble. Warford (5-11, 180, So., Amite, La/Amite HS) saw considerable playing time, in fact Warford broke into the starting lineup and played significant minutes before he experienced a series of injuries. Warford finished with 23 tackles, one interception & one forced and recovered fumble. He is another one of the young defensive backs who should be ready to except the challenges of the secondary and the new strict discipline brought in by the new coaching staff. Safety Demetric Rogers also returns for his second season on the bluff. Rogers (5-10, 185, Jr., Zachary, La/Northeast HS) was fourth on the team in tackles with 51, including tying for a team-high 12 tackles for loss yards. He also had two interceptions, a blocked kick and a fumble recovery. Another safety returning after a successful season is Jeremy Ivory. Ivory finished with 19 tackles one interception for 35 yards and a forced fumble. Ivory is physical and should fit right into the new defensive schemes smoothly. A big shot in the arm for the secondary should come in the form of the return of safety, Anthony Wells (6-1, 205, R-Sr., Baton Rouge, La/Capitol HS). Wells was a force in the Jags defensive secondary two seasons ago before tearing his ACL. He sat out all of last season rehabbing.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

A big sore spot for the Jags in 2009 was special teams play, as the Jags connected on only three of 10 field goals and missed nine extra points and averaged a SWAC low 4.1 yards per punt return. Joshua Duran (5-10, 185, Jr./Eunice, La/Eunice HS) returns to handle the punting and kicking duties. Duran was a second team all-SWAC selection last season as a punter, as he averaged 41.3 yards per punt. His longest kick went for 64 yards. At Times his leg kept the Jags in close games, as he dropped 15 punts inside the opponents 20 yard line and connected on 10 50+ yard punts. But the double duties of both punting and kicking played a toll on Duran, and to help alleviate that problem coach Mitchell made to sure address the problem in recruiting. The Jags signed kicker William Griswold (6-0, 160, Tampa Bay, Fl/Countryside HS) to htake some of the kicking pressure off of Duran and sure up the kicking game. Griswold was rated the No. 1 kicker in the state by prokicker.com, was 49 of 53 on PATs and 8 of 11 on field goals and made the Class 5A all-state football second team. Charles Hawkins (6-8, 175, R-So., New Orleans, La/St. Augustine HS) took over punt return duties midway thru the season and should get the nod heading into fall camp. Hawkins returned 15 punts for 81 yards. Look for this position to open up for competition in camp, and should produce better results with the influx of playmakers coming to the bluff in the form of some new recruits. Corey Cushingberry along with the return of Byron Williams should give the Jags a solid 1-2 punch in the kickoff return game. Cushingberry had 19 returns for 375 yards (19.7 avg). Williams averaged 24.2 yards per return on 10 returns before his injury. He had a 91 yard return for a score versus Alcorn State. This is another position that could see changes heading into the 2010 season.

"Stump Mitchell's 21 years in the NFL, 10 as a player and 11 years as an assistant coach, combined with his head coaching experience, will bring a wealth of diverse knowledge to our football program", says Greg LaFleur, Southern's Director of Athletics.

Stump Mitchell joined the Redskins' coaching staff in 2008, adding a fresh perspective to the Redskins' talented group of running backs. He arrived at Redskins Park from the Seattle Seahawks, where he had spent the previous nine seasons coaching the running backs. From 2001-07, he coached alongside former Redskins head coach Jim Zorn, who was quarterbacks coach there at the time.

"I am very excited to have Lyvonia "Stump" Mitchell joining the Jaguar Nation as our 17th head football coach. I am confident that he will help us bring the fans back to A.W. Mumford Stadium and that he will help us achieve our goal of strengthening the relationship between SUBR and the community surrounding the campus", says Dr. Kofi Lomotey, Chancellor of Southern University-Baton Rouge.

"Importantly, at the collegiate and professional levels, Coach Mitchell has demonstrated dedication, hard work and success. Moreover, he has effectively instilled those values in players in his charge on both levels. He has an excellent attitude and positive educational and athletic philosophies. While serving as head football coach at Morgan State University, his focus on academic discipline led to a substantial increase in the overall GPA of the team", added Lomotey.

"We are excited about Coach Mitchell joining the Jaguar Nation and we have the utmost confidence in his ability to lead our football program. Being a former student athlete, Coach Mitchell understands that our goal is to develop our team to their greatest potential on and off the field," said Southern University System Interim President Dr. Kassie Freeman. "We are also very proud of the hard work and dedication of our Board Chairman, Chancellor, and Athletic Director during the search process. This is indicative of their commitment to ensuring the success of our athletic programs, along with working collaboratively to make the best decision for our great institution."

Under Mitchell's tutelage, running back Clinton Portis had his second-best season as a Redskin, rushing for 1,487 yards and nine touchdowns, and catching 28 passes for an additional 218 yards. His rushing yards and total yards both ranked fourth in the NFL for the year, and when Portis rushed for more than 100 yards, as he did six times, the Redskins lost only one game. Mitchell coached a 1,000-yard rusher in each of his first seven seasons in Seattle (Ricky Watters for two years, Shaun Alexander for five years). Mitchell joined the Seahawks following three years as head coach at Morgan State University. He originally joined the MSU staff in 1995 as offensive coordinator, earning a promotion to head coach the following year. Under Mitchell's tutelage, the Bears boasted a strong rushing attack that averaged 148.9 yards per game in 1997.

Mitchell's coaching career began in 1991, when he served as an assistant coach on the World League of American Football's San Antonio Riders' staff. He then accepted a position as the head coach at Casa Grande (Ariz.) High School (1991-94), where he led the team to a playoff berth in his second year. Mitchell played nine years in the NFL as a standout running back with the St. Louis/Phoenix Cardinals. He was a ninth-round draft choice by the Cardinals in 1981 and would go on to become one of the great running backs and kick returners in Cardinals history. Mitchell is the Cardinals' all-time leader in combined yardage with 11,988 yards and ranks second with 4,649 yards rushing on 986 attempts and 32 touchdowns. His 177 kickoff returns for 4,007 yards are both franchise records. He posted 14 100-yard games and finished with a 4.7-yard rushing average, second-best in the franchise history. With a 5.6-yard rushing average as a rookie in 1981, Mitchell earned All-Rookie honors from Pro Football Weekly. In 1984, he earned All-NFC honors as a kickoff returner by Pro Football Weekly. On Nov. 17, 1985, he set a career high with 179 rushing yards against the Philadelphia Eagles.

Mitchell was honored with the Chuck Drulis Award for community service in 1982 and the Byron "Whizzer" White Humanitarian Award for charity work in 1984. He was born on March 15, 1959, in Kingsland, Ga.
