LIONS AND TIGERS

- UAPB and Tennessee State meet for the fourth time with the Tigers posting a 2-1 mark in the series.
- The Golden Lions won (37-31) the last meeting back on Sept. 21, 2019. It was the closest game between both teams with the Tigers winning the previous two (2012: 40-13; 2016: 44-0).
- The UAPB's two game losing streak stretched from 2012 to 2016 before being broken in 2019.
- All three previous games have been played at Tennessee State, but this year both teams meet at a neutral site (Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium) in Memphis for the first time ... Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium is home to the Liberty Bowl game.
- This is UAPB third neutral site game since 2018 \dots The Golden Lions are 0-2 duing that time.
- The Tigers are coming off 56-3 loss at Notre Dame on opening week
- In the series, the Tigers are averaging 38.3 points per game against UAPB's 16.6 points per game.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- UAPB is on the road for a second week in a row ... The last time this happened was during the 2019 and 2020 seasons.
- In 2020, UAPB went 2-0 in its first two weeks while in 2019 it posted a 1-1 mark ... In 2019, the Golden Lions started off 0-1.

WEEK 1 FIRST QUARTER SCORING

- The Golden Lions are 3-3 when scoring in the first quarter of a game dating back to 2018 ... During that span they have only been shutout from scoring in the first quarter in 2018 (Morehouse) and 2019 (TCU).
- In those six games they have posted two field goals and seven touchdowns while averaging 6.8 first quarter points during the six games.

WEEK 2 COMPARISON

- UAPB generated 252 total yards to TSU who produced 156 total yards in Week 1.
- The Golden Lions hold the edge in first downs 18 to 12 after one game this season.
- Both teams gave up 26 first downs to their opponents to start the season.
- UAPB averages 5.77 yards per pass to TSU's 3.05 yards per pass ... The Golden Lions completed 15 passes to eight by the Tigers.

UNDER CENTER

- Starting Quarterback Mekhi Hagens in his first game as a starter for UAPB, he threw for 109 yards with a long of 23 while completing 10 of 21 passes against Tulsa.
- Jalen Macon posted a perfect day passing Week 1 going 5 of 5 for 41 yards with a long of 21.
- The UAPB passing matched Tulsa last week in first downs thrown with nine.

DOZIER PICKS UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Dozier picked up where he left off last year as he finished tied for a team-high in tackles with seven with five them being solo tackles ... This is the seventh time in his career where he has tallied seven or more tackles in a game.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- Kicker Dean Sarris tallied his first Division I point(s) last week when he tacked on a PAT against Tulsa.
- Sarris registered 130 yards on kickoffs averaging 65 yards per game while having a touchback on his two kickoff attempts.
- Punter Jeremy Baker in his first Division I game complied 345 yards on 10 punts with a long of 44 yards ... His punt break down was six fair catches and four inside the 20-yard line.

DEFENSE STRONG

- UAPB defense tallied 75 total tackles week one with 43 of them being solos ... The 43 solo tackles was nine more than its opponent(s).
- Three players finished with seven tackles (Timon Aikins, Kaleb Knox, and Dozier) total while three tallied five solo tackles (Kyre Williams, Knox, and Dozier) ... All three players rank in the Top 20 in the SWAC.
- The Golden Lions picked off two passes for 23 yards in Week 1 averaging 11.5 yards to rank second in the conference.
- UAPB is first in the conference in forced fumbles with two ... Laprel Boyd and Kierstan Rogers each recorded a forced fumble last week.
- Golden Lion Sam Anthony is tied for first in fumbles recovered with one while UAPB as a team is tied for second in fumbles recovered only one behind Flordia A&M's two recovered.

O-LINE SUCCESS

- The Golden Lions offensive line in Week 1 faced a defense that was only able to break through five times (four sacks and one QB hurry) in four quarters.

EXPERIENCE AT THE HELM

- Coach Hampton was on the staff when UAPB won the 2006 SWAC Western Div. under Moe Forte - losing to Alabama A&M in the SWAC Championship. While Offensive Coordinator Boby Acosta coached at IMG Academy and is the first coach to ever bring a national championship to the program.



MEET THE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Chris Robinson Vice Chancellor For Intercollegiate Athletics

One of the all-time greats in Golden Lion football history, Chris Robinson was named UAPB's Vice Chancellor for Intercollegiate Athletics in June 2021 after serving as the Executive Senior Associate Athletic Director.

Robinson moves over to athletics from the Office of Recruitment, where he had spent the previous eight years in serving the university.

Multiple stints at UAPB is a common theme for Robinson, who came to Pine Bluff after a standout career at Mattie T. Blount High in Pritchard, Ala. After playing for the legendary Archie "The Gunslinger" Cooley at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff, Robinson transferred to Southern University, playing quarterback for one season under College Football Hall of Fame Coach Marino Casem.

As the Golden Lion football program returned to play in 1993, Robinson returned and led the revival of the program under UAPB alum and the coach with the most wins in school history, Coach Lee Hardman. UAPB went 6-5 before forfeiting a game in '93 before Robinson led the Golden Lions to the 1994 NAIA National Championship Game, highlighted by a seven-touchdown (six passing / one rushing) performance in a come-from-behind overtime semifinal win.

After one year away from playing working in management, Robinson returned to the sidelines at Mid-American Nazarene University. He coached quarterbacks and running backs while also serving as assistant softball coach, and as the school's Director of Minority Affairs.

Robinson then returned to UAPB, teaching marketing while also coaching the offensive skill players and special teams, football operations and was the program's NFL liaison. He then returned to the corporate sector for a decade before returning to The Pride in 2012.

A 2014 UAPB Sports Hall of Fame inductee, Robinson earned his bachelor's degree in management from UAPB, and a Master's degree in business administration from Mid-America Nazarene University.

In Robinson's first year as Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics, the Golden Lions football program captured their first Western Division title since 2012 and advanced to the spring 2021 SWAC Championship.

In July of 2022, Robinson was named to the FCS ADA Executive Committee. He currently serves on the Executive Board for the Jefferson County Habitat for Humanity and the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame.

The Golden Lions have since gone to the SWAC Championship Game with the women's basketball team for the first time in school history while the UAPB Men's Golf Team secured the SWAC Golf Title in 2023.

Robinson's administration made a monumental announcement in January and formally launched several campaign and renovation projects. The campaign will impact several key facilities throughout the athletics department, including the groundbreaking of the Track and Soccer Complex, renovation of the Thomas May Fieldhouse Fuel Station, football locker room, and UAPB Softball Complex.

Robinson married two-time All-American track runner and Golden Lion Alum Kim George and the couple has two sons – Christopher (UAPB Graduate), Kylan (UAPB Graduate), and one daughter, a freshman in high school, Kaylen (The BOSS).

HAMPTON AT THE HELM

The University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff Director of Athletics Chris Robinson announced Thursday afternoon that Alonzo Hampton has been named the Golden Lions 22nd head football coach, bringing him back to his home state. The Warren, Ark., native will return to one of his previous coaching stops, having been with the Golden Lions for five seasons from 2006 to 2010.

A name highly recognized throughout Arkansas and around the nation in college football, Hampton comes to UAPB after serving as the Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator under Terry Bowden at the University of

"I am extremely excited about this new era for the Golden Lion football program and Golden Lion nation and all that it will bring," said Robinson. I am excited for the student-athletes, student body, university, alumni and the community as we all come together to re-establish our brand. Coach Hampton has a heart for the student athletes and a strong drive to have his team succeed on the field and especially in the classroom. He will bring a positive contagious energy to the University."

Hampton, a four-year letterman as a defensive back at ULM 1993-96, returned to his alma mater to serve as assistant head coach on Bowden's staff. After working with the safeties in 2021, Hampton took over the responsibilities as special team's coordinator, heading into his second season.

Under Hampton's guidance in 2022, ULM special team (punting) was ranked 29th in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision and second in the Sun Belt Conference averaging 43.9 yards per punt (Devyn McCormick).

In 2021, three of his safeties ranked among ULM's Top 10 in tackles, including Jabari Johnson, who recorded a career-high 58 tackles while making seven starts.

"I'm excited to be named 22nd head football coach at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff. This institution gave me my first opportunity to coach college football in 2006," said Hampton. "This is a special day for my family and we are grateful as we look forward to pushing this program to new heights. Also, it means more to come back to your home state. I've already reached out to all my friends throughout the state and told them to go purchase their season tickets and come support the Golden Lions. Again, I can't wait to get there and start building something special that our administration, faculty, staff, alumni and former players will be proud of for years to come."

Hampton worked as a defensive analyst for Chad Morris at Arkansas in 2019.

He served as special team's coordinator for Willie Taggart at Florida State in 2018. It marked the fourth different time in Hampton's career that he had joined one of Taggart's coaching staffs, including previous stops at Oregon, South Florida and Western Kentucky.

Under Hampton's guidance, FSU's D.J. Matthews emerged as one of the nation's most dangerous punt returners in 2018, finishing sixth in the NCAA FBS with his 13.5-yard average (19 returns for 257 yards). Matthews returned five punts for a career-high 145 yards at No. 17 Miami, including a 74-yard return for a touchdown. His 145 punt return yards were the most amassed by an NCAA FBS player in 2018 as well as the third-highest single-game total in Seminole history. His 74-yard punt return marked the longest of his career and also tied for the second-longest punt return in an ACC game during the 2018 season.

During the 2017 season, he served as a defensive analyst at Oregon after spending two years (2015-16) as defensive backs coach at South Florida, where he also oversaw special teams in 2016. USF won a school-record 11 games and finished No. 19 in the final Associated Press Poll, thanks in large part to a defensive unit that forced 26 turnovers, the 18th-highest total in the NCAA FBS, and scored three defensive touchdowns.

During his two-year tenure at USF, Hampton coached two-time All-American Athletic Conference cornerback Deatrick Nichols, who recorded four interceptions each in 2015 and '16 and finished with 11 career picks (tied for third on the school's all-time list). The Bulls were ranked 14th in the NCAA FBS with 17 interceptions in 2015, including 13 by the defensive backs.

He also helped mentor D'Ernest Johnson, who earned second-team all-conference honors as a return specialist in 2016 including an 83-yard punt return for a touchdown – the second longest in USF history.

A 19-year coaching veteran, Hampton also experienced successful stints as a high school coach in Arkansas and Georgia. Prior to reuniting with Taggart in Tampa, he spent two years (2013-14) as defensive backs coach at Tift County High School, where he helped lead the Blue Devils to a 7-4 record in 2014 and secured a spot in the Class 6A playoff bracket. Hampton first connected with Taggart at Western Kentucky, serving as defensive backs

coach for two years (2011-12) and helping the Hilltoppers post back-to-back 7-win seasons, including the program's first postseason bowl appearance in the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl (against Central Michigan). WKU ranked among the NCAA FBS leaders in total defense (No. 26 at 348.2 yards per game) and pass defense (No. 34 at 209.8 ypg.) in 2012. In addition, the Hilltoppers led the Sun Belt Conference in rushing defense (138.4 ypg.), pass efficiency defense (131.0 rating) and total defense. WKU's secondary was anchored by future NFL Draft selection Jonathan Dowling (2014: seventh round by the Oakland Raiders).

A native of Warren, Ark., Hampton previously spent five seasons (2006-10) at Arkansas-Pine Bluff where he was part of the 2006 SWAC Western Division title and served in a variety of roles, including defensive backs coach and eventually defensive coordinator in 2009-10. In 2008, the Golden Lions ranked among the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision leaders in pass efficiency defense (eighth with 99.6 rating), pass defense (17th at 160.9 ypg.) and interceptions (79th with 15).

Hampton began his coaching career in the high school ranks in Arkansas, first as defensive coordinator at Warren High School for four years (2000-03) then as head coach at Dumas High School for two seasons (2004-05). During his tenure at Warren, he helped the Lumberjacks to a combined record of 48-12, including back-to-back Class AAA state championships in 2001-02, while also serving as the head track and field coach. While leading the Dumas program, Hampton also completed a minority internship with the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles.

The former ULM cornerback played his first year (1993) for Dave Roberts and the next three seasons (1994-96) for Ed Zaunbrecher. A two-time All-Louisiana Second-Team selection by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association, Hampton finished his career with 201 tackles, three interceptions and 16 pass break-ups. He served as a team captain as a senior in 1996. Hampton also competed in track and field for the Warhawks in 1993.

He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from ULM in May 1996 and a Master of Arts in teaching from the University of Arkansas at Monticello in August 2002.

Following his collegiate career, Hampton played professionally for the Seattle Seahawks and Jacksonville Jaguars as well as NFL Europe's Frankfurt Galaxy. He started for Frankfurt in backto-back World Bowls, including the 1999 championship team.

Hampton and his wife Yolanda have five children, including four sons: Aaron, Rashad, A.J., a fifth-year defensive back at Northwestern, and Ashton; and one daughter, Kenya.


