STORYLINES

- Buffalo is playing in its fourth bowl game in program history (and second straight) and is in search of its first bowl win.
- This will be the first meeting between Buffalo and Charlotte.
- After winning 10 games a year ago, the Bulls have won seven or more games in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1958 and 1959.
- UB leads the MAC and ranks fourth in the nation in rush defense, allowing 95.3 yards per game.
- Jaret Patterson has rushed for 490 yards and 10 touchdowns in the last two games.
- With Jaret Patterson (1,626) and Kevin Marks (1,008), the Bulls have two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in school history.
- The Bulls rank second in the nation in sacks allowed (8).
- Buffalo has shattered its single-season rushing total with 3,241 yards. Its previous high was 2,648 yards set last season over 14 games.
- The UB defense has only allowed one 100-yard rusher on the season.
- With 38 sacks, Buffalo has tied the school record for sacks in a season. The Bulls also had 38 sacks in 2013.
- With 1,626 yards rushing, Jaret Patterson has set a new single-season school record and ranks fifth in the nation in rushing.
- The Bulls scored 43 or more points in four of their last five games of the regular season.
- This will be the third different country in which Buffalo will play a bowl game. The Bulls also played in the 2009 International Bowl in Toronto, Canada.

University at Buffalo football head coach Lance Leipold has announced the number 41 jersey will once again be worn by a different player each game to honor the legacy of former Bull Solomon Jackson who passed away in 2016.

In 2016 and 2017, players were chosen by the coaching staff to wear "41" for the entire year. Cornerback Boise Ross wore it for the 2016 season, while linebacker Jarrett Franklin wore it in 2017.

This is the second season the coaching staff with rotate #41 on a weekly basis.

Solomon Jackson passed away unexpectedly following an offseason workout on February 29, 2016. Jackson, respected and beloved by his teammates, played both linebacker and defensive end over his career. The slogan ALL41 is a prominent fixture throughout the Murchie Family Football Center to honor his legacy.

Bulls to Face Charlotte in 2019 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl

The University at Buffalo football team will face Charlotte in the 2019 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl on December 20.

The Bulls finished the regular season 7-5 overall and 5-3 in Mid-American Conference play. Running back **Jaret Patterson** leads the Bulls with 1,626 rushing yards and 17 touchdowns - both school records.

Charlotte finished the regular season 7-5 overall and 5-3 in Conference USA play. The 49ers are led by quarterback Chris Reynolds who has thrown for 2,366 yards and 21 touchdowns and rushed for 781 yards and six scores

This will be the first meeting between the schools.

Bowling in the Bahamas

Buffalo will face Charlotte in the 2019 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl. This will be UB's fourth bowl game in program history. The Bulls played in the Dollar General Bowl last season, the 2013 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl and the 2009 International Bowl (following their 2008 MAC title). Buffalo is in search of its first bowl game victory.

Buffalo vs. C-USA

The Bulls are 5-8 all-time against schools from Conference USA. The Bulls are 2-0 against Florida Atlantic (2015, 2017) and 2-0 against UTEP (2008, 2009). Buffalo is 1-8 against Marshall. However, those nine meetings were all before the Thundering Herd joined C-USA, with most coming as Mid-American Conference foes.

Patterson Finishes Regular Season in Historic Fashion

Jaret Patterson had the best game by a running back in school history against Bowling Green in the regular season finale. The sophomore running back had a school-record 298 rushing yards and a school and MAC-record six touchdowns in UB's win over Bowling Green.

His performance came on the heels of a 192-yard, four-touchdown performance a week earlier against Toledo. Patterson added a receiving score for a total of five touchdowns against the Rockets.

In the last two games, Patterson has rushed for 490 yards and 11 total touchdowns (10 rushing).

For his performance against Bowling Green, he became the first UB player ever named the Walter Camp Founda-

tion National Offensive Player of the Week.

Dynamic Duo

Jaret Patterson and **Kevin Marks** have been a dynamic duo in the Bulls' backfield. Patterson has rushed for 1,626 yards and 17 touchdowns while Marks has accounted for 1,008 yards and eight scores on the year. It marks the first time in school history the Bulls have had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season. It also marks the first time since 2012 a MAC team has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season (Kent State).

While splitting carries, one of the two have posted 100-yard games in eight of the last nine outings. Patterson has seven 100-yard games and Marks has four. They have both gone over 100 yards in the same game three times this season.

Both sophomores, Patterson and Marks are already in the top ten in school history in career rushing. Patterson ranks sixth with 2,447 yards and Marks is ninth with 1,853 yards.

Record 12 Bulls Named All-MAC

A school-record 12 Buffalo football players were named All-Mid-American Conference. The 12 All-MAC selections are a school record, eclipsing the 10 from a season ago.

Five Bulls were named to the All-MAC First Team, including running back **Jaret Patterson**, offensive tackle **Evin Ksiezarczyk**, safety **Joey Banks** and defensive ends **Taylor Riggins** and **Malcolm Koonce**.

Buffalo also placed five on the second team, including offensive linemen **Kayode Awosika** and **Paul Nosworthy** along with linebacker **Kadofi Wright**, defensive end **Ledarius Mack** and safety **Tyrone Hill**.

The third team included wide receiver **Antonio Nunn** and defensive tackle **Chibueze Onwuka**.

Sack Lunch

The Bulls have had 27 sacks over the last seven games, including a season-best five in their last three road games at Akron, Eastern Michigan and Kent State. On the year, Buffalo has 38 sacks to rank first in the Mid-American Conference and 12th in the nation. The Bulls have three players in the top two in the MAC in sacks. **Taylor Riggins** leads the MAC with 8.5 sacks, **Ledarius Mack** and **Malcolm Koonce** are tied for second with 7.0 sacks apiece.

The Bulls have tied the school record for sacks in a season, originally set in 2013.

Run Stoppers

Buffalo leads the MAC in total defense, but they have been especially stout against the run. The Bulls lead the MAC and rank fourth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 95.3 yards per game. UB is the only team in the MAC to allow less than 100 yards per game on the ground. With 107 yards, Miami's Jaylon Bester is the only player to rush for 100 yards on the Bulls this season.

In Buffalo's win at Eastern Michigan, the Bulls didn't allow a single rushing first down in the game.

Serve and Protect

Buffalo's offensive line has done a great job protecting the quarterback. The Bulls have only allowed eight sacks on the season to rank second in the nation. UB has not allowed a sack in seven of its 12 games on the year and have only allowed one sack over the last seven games. A season ago, the Bulls allowed 15 sacks, the fewest in their FBS era (since 1999).

Ground and Pound

The Bulls have rolled up 3,051 yards on the ground this season, already a single-season school record for team rushing. The previous record of 2,648 was set last season over 14 games.

Buffalo is averaging 254.2 yards per

game to rank ninth in the nation. They rank seventh in the nation in rushing attempts with 613. UB has logged 50+ carries in seven different games, including a season-high 62 at Eastern Michigan. In the regular-season finale against Bowling Green, the Bulls rushed for 455 yards, the highest single-game total in their FBS era (since 1999).

Leading the way are running backs **Jaret Patterson** and **Kevin Marks**. Patterson is averaging 135.5 yards per game on the ground to lead the MAC and rank fifth in the nation. Marks is averaging 84.0 yards per game to rank seventh in the conference.

Taylor Made

Taylor Riggins has been making his presence known as of late. The Bulls' defensive end has had eight sacks over the last seven games. He leads the MAC in sacks with 8.5. Riggins' three fumble recoveries on the year are one shy of the single-season school record.

Banks Shot

The play of **Joey Banks** made him an easy choice for All-MAC First Team. The hard-hitting safety leads the team with 76 tackles, including 4.5 tackles for loss and a sack. He has added a team-best three interceptions and a forced fumble. The UB senior has been named MAC East Defensive Player of the Week three times this season. The only other UB player to ever win MAC East Player of the Week three times in

the same season was Khalil Mack in 2013.

Taking Matters into their own Hands

The UB defense has scored four touchdowns this season, including three in the last five games. The Bulls rank sixth in the nation in defensive touchdowns. **Joey Banks** had a pick six against Temple; **Ledarius Mack** returned a fumble for a touchdown at Akron; **Kadofi Wright** forced and recovered a fumble at Akron and had a pick six against Central Michigan.

Nunn Better

Antonio Nunn has been the favorite target of UB quarterbacks this season. The junior receiver leads the Bulls with 44 catches for 634 yards and five touchdowns. He has had at least two catches in the 10 games in which he has played. In addition, the Tampa native has five touchdown catches in the last eight games.

Back in the Saddle

Redshirt-sophomore **Kyle Vantrease** made his first start of the season at quarterback against Ohio and looked quite comfortable. Vantrease accounted for all three of UB's touchdowns, throwing for two and rushing for one. He finished 16-of-23 for 197 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 19 yards and another score. Before redshirting last season, the Stow, OH native made one start as a true freshman in 2017.

In his seven games as a starter this season, Vantrease has completed 90-of-150 passes for 1,086 yards, seven touchdowns and only one interception. After throwing for 208 yards and a touchdown and rushing for two other scores

at Eastern Michigan, he was named the MAC East Offensive Player of the Week.

Capitalizing on Turnovers

The Bulls have forced 20 turnovers on the season - 10 fumble recoveries and 10 interceptions. UB has been able to capitalize on takeaways, scoring points 14 times following a turnover, including 11 touchdowns.

Shout Out for a Shut Out

The Bulls blanked Akron on Oct. 19 for just their third shutout of a Mid-American Conference opponent since joining the league in 1999. It was just the second ever road shutout of a MAC opponent. The previous shutouts were a 33-0 win at Western Michigan in 2013 and a 44-0 victory over Ohio at UB Stadium in 2001.

No Passing Zone

The Bulls have not needed to throw the ball a lot to be successful this season. In fact, UB has thrown for less than 100 yards in two of its wins this season. Buffalo threw for 69 yards in its season-opening win against Robert Morris and 67 yards in a 21-0 victory over Akron. Only two other times in their FBS era (since 1999) did the Bulls throw for less than 100 yards and win a game. Buffalo threw for 97 yards in a 10-6 win over Kent State in 2005 and 83 yards in a 26-17 win over Ohio in 2003.

Time after Time

The Bulls lead the MAC and rank fourth in the nation in time of possession, averaging 34:12 per game.

The Bulls controlled the ball for 42:32 against Penn State. It was the team's highest time of possession in their mod-

ern FBS era (since 1999). The previous high was 42:30 against Bowling Green last season. The Bulls ran 90 plays, compared to just 46 plays for Penn State and outgained the Nittany Lions, 429-357 in total offense.

Shining Lee

Junior wide receiver **Daniel Lee** has turned into a nice complement to **Antonio Nunn** and has really come on as of late. Over the first six games, the JUCO transfer had only two catches for 26 yards. However, over the last six games Lee has had 20 catches for 251 yards and a touchdown. He has had at least two catches in each of the last six games, including a season-high six receptions at Akron on October 19.

Off to a Good Start

Buffalo's strong finish to the season can be equated to the strong starts they have had in games. The Bulls are averaging 28 first-half points over their last five games. They have scored at least 28 first-half points in four of their last five games. UB has held halftime leads in 11 of 12 games this season. The Bulls have scored points on their opening drive in four of their last six games.

Onwuka Name Burlsworth Nominee

Chibueze Onwuka has been announced as a nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy, given annually to top player who originally joined the team as a walk-on. The junior defensive tackle walked on to the team prior to the 2017 season after starting his collegiate career as a wrestler at Niagara County Community College. This season, Onwuka ranks fifth on the team in tackles with 42, including eight tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks.



Otwinowski Named Academic All-District

Linebacker **Matt Otwinowski** has been named to the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District team. The award recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.

An accounting major with a 3.89 grade point average, Otwinowski is enjoying his best season on the field for the Bulls. The team captain ranks second on the squad in tackles with 72, including 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

We The Match

The Bulls have had two different players donate stem cells to help save the life of a stranger. Both linebacker **Matt Otwinowski** and offensive lineman **Mike Kenefick** donated their stem cells through the Be The Match program. Otwinowski traveled to Washington, D.C. in April to donate. Kenefick missed last Thursday's game against Kent State to donate his stem cells in Rochester.

Experience on the Offensive Line

One of the strengths of the 2019 UB football team is the offensive line. The Bulls return four of their five starters from a season ago. Right guard **Tomas Jack-Kurdyla** has the most starts under his belt with 40. Left tackle **Evin Ksiezarczyk** is second with 38 starts. Right tackle **Kayode Awosika** has started 26 games for the Bulls and left guard **Paul Nosworthy** has 25 starts. In addition, **Jacob Gall** started the final five games at right guard last year.

Last season, UB's line blocked for an offense that ran for a school-record 2,648 yards and also allowed only 15 sacks, a program low since moving to the FBS level in 1999.

International Flavor

The Bulls have nine international players on this year's roster - by far the most in school history.

Buffalo has six players who hail from Canada, including **Dominic Johnson** (Ontario), **Dev Lamour** (Quebec), **Cole Burniston** (Ontario), **Tomas Jack-Kurdyla** (Quebec), **Gabe Wallace** (BC) and **Julien Bourassa** (Quebec). In addition, the Bulls have three players from Europe, **Fabian Weitz** (Germany), **Alain Schaerer** (Switzerland) and **Jordan Avissey** (France).

Pallotti Boys

The Bulls have five players from Maryland's Saint Vincent Pallotti High School on this year's team. Running back **Jaret Patterson**, linebackers **James Patterson** and **Justin Mulbah**, wide receiver **Jelani Foster** and cornerback **Dylan Powell** all played together for the Panthers.

Justin Winters, a former All-MAC linebacker for the Bulls, was a coach at Pallotti when the players were there.

Otwinowski Named Campbell Trophy Semifinalist

Senior linebacker **Matt Otwinowski** is a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy. Given annually to college football's top student-athlete, the Campbell Trophy is also known as the Academic Heisman.

Otwinowski is an accounting major with a 3.89 cumulative grade point average. He is a two-time Academic All-MAC selection and has been honored as a MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete.

A pillar of the community, Otwinowski helped save the life of a stranger by donating his stem cells through the Be The Match Program. For his work in the community, he has been placed on the watch list for the AFCA Allstate Good Works Team and the Weurffel Trophy.

Murchie Family Fieldhouse Opens

Thanks to a record gift by the Murchie family, the Murchie Family Fieldhouse opened in April. The 92,000-square-foot indoor practice facility is situated just beyond the north end zone of UB Stadium on the university's North Campus.

The multi-use facility not only houses a full-size football field, but also features 6,000 feet of rubber track for sprint practice as well as long/triple jump and pole vault pits. It will also have motorized suspended softball hitting tunnels.

BUFFALO, NY – The University at Buffalo football team used a steady dose of the run game to cruise to a 38-10 season-opening win over Robert Morris at UB Stadium on Thursday night. Of the Bulls' 57 plays in the game, 47 were run plays that resulted in 285 yards on the ground.

Redshirt-freshman quarterback Matt Myers looked quite comfortable in his first career start. The first freshman to start at quarterback for the Bulls since 1991, Myers finished 5-for-10 for 69 yards and two touchdowns and added 47 yards and another score on the ground.

"I thought he had good command," head coach Lance Leipold said of Myers. "He's a pretty even-keeled guy. He didn't get rattled."

Myers opened the scoring with a 1-yard rushing touchdown on UB's first possession. He also tossed a pair of touchdown passes to tight end Zac Lefebvre. He hit Lefebvre in stride for a 40-yard touchdown on the final play of the first quarter and later hit Lefebvre on a three-yard strike late in the first half.

Five different UB running backs had carries in the game led by returning Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year Jaret Patterson who finished with 90 yards and a touchdown on only 12 carries. Kevin Marks rushed for 75 yards on 13 carries. Dylan McDuffie added 27 yards on four carries and freshman Ron Cook, Jr. had 24 yards on seven carries and scored his first career touchdown on a 3-yard run.

Robert Morris scored all 10 of its points in the first 20 minutes of the game, before the Bulls shut them out for the remainder of the contest. Redshirt-freshman Cory Gross had a team-high seven tackles. James Patterson had five tackles, including 1.5 for loss.

Buffalo had seven tackles for loss in the game. Both Malcolm Koonce and Ledarius Mack each had two tackles for loss and a sack. Koonce forced a fumble on his sack resulting in a recovery by Taylor Riggins.

Overall, Leipold was pleased UB was able to convincingly win the game by playing a fairly one-dimensional offense.

"I don't think it's any secret where our experience lies. We were trying to establish a run game and I thought we ran the ball extremely well in the first quarter," head coach Lance Leipold said. "Until they could really slow you down, there wasn't a need to throw it."

UNIVERSITY PARK, PA – The University at Buffalo football team led 15th-ranked Penn State at the half, but couldn't hold on as the Nittany Lions rallied for a 45-13 win at Beaver Stadium on Saturday night.

Matt Myers connected with Julien Bourassa on a six-yard touchdown pass late in the second quarter to give the Bulls a 10-7 lead at halftime, silencing the 104,136 in attendance. The touchdown capped a dominant first-half performance by the Bulls. UB outgained the Nittany Lions, 270-82 in total offense in the first half.

A week after only attempting 10 passes in the opener against Robert Morris, the coaching staff took the training wheels off the Bulls' redshirt-freshman quarterback, letting him throw the ball. Myers responded by completing 11-of-17 passes for 184 yards and a score in the first half, looking poised beyond his years.

Penn State came out of the locker room in the second half with a sense of urgency. However, on its opening drive, a big hit by Joey Banks forced a fumble that was recovered by Aapri Washington and the Bulls were back in business. But on the ensuing possession, Penn State's defense came up with a play that turned the tide and the momentum of the entire game. John Reid stepped in front of a Myers' pass and returned it 36 yards for a touchdown to give the Nittany Lions a 14-10 lead.

After a three-and-out for the Bulls, Penn State's first play from scrimmage was a 23-yard touchdown pass to extend its lead to 21-10.

Alex McNulty connected on a 25-yard field goal, midway through the third quarter, to cut the Penn State lead to 21-13. It was McNulty's second field goal of the night. The redshirt-freshman also made good on a 32-yard attempt earlier in the game.

Penn State was able to capitalize on big plays down the stretch to pull away late.

"I'm really proud of our football team," head coach Lance Leipold said. "They competed really hard and played extremely well for 30 minutes. We came out in the second half and obviously a big switch in momentum, but give credit to Coach Franklin and his staff for their adjustments at halftime and you can see why they are a Top 25 team. They are explosive, but at the same time this group of young men battled and we took a huge step as a football team tonight."

The Bulls rushed for 184 yards in the game, led by Jaret Patterson who finished with 71. Kevin Marks added 64 yards and Dylan McDuffie had 43 yards on only six carries.

Myers finished 16-for-31 for 245 yards. His favorite target was wide receiver Antonio Nunn who had five catches for 113 yards, both career highs. Dominic Johnson, who recently moved from quarterback to wide receiver, had three grabs for 27 yards.

The Bulls ran 90 offensive plays, compared to just 46 for Penn State. Third down was also a big discrepancy as UB converted on third down 10 times while Penn State was just 2-of-9 on third down.

Banks had the best game of his career to lead the defense. The senior safety had a career-high 11 tackles, a sack and a forced fumble. Chibueze Onwuka added a sack and two tackles for loss to lead a stout defensive line.

Myers connected with Cole Burniston on a five-yard touchdown pass with 6:09 left in the game. It was Myers' second touchdown pass of the game and Burniston's first career touchdown reception.

BUFFALO, NY – Behind four forced turnovers, the University at Buffalo football team toppled Temple, 38-22, at UB Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The Bulls improved to 2-2 on the year, closing out the non-conference portion of their schedule.

A week after struggling at Liberty, and with a number of players out with injuries, the Bulls' defense stepped up and played its best game of the season. Buffalo had three interceptions and a forced fumble and were able to turn those turnovers into 21 points.

Temple, who entered the game 2-0 and coming off an upset win of 21st-ranked Maryland, jumped out to a 7-0 lead following its first possession. However, sparked by a 52-yard field goal by freshman Jackson Baltar – the second longest in school history, the Bulls scored 24 unanswered points in the second quarter to take total control of the game.

Jaret Patterson scored the first of his two touchdowns, following a botched punt snap by Temple that gave the Bulls the ball at the Temple seven-yard line. He scored on a four-yard run to give UB the lead for good, 10-7. Patterson finished with a season-best 133 yards and two touchdowns in the game.

Midway through the second quarter, Ledarius Mack sacked Temple quarterback Anthony Russo and jarred the ball loose. Eric Black pounced on fumble and the Bulls were set up with a first down at the Temple 19-yard line. Three plays later, Matt Myers kept it himself on a seven-yard touchdown run to put the Bulls ahead, 17-7.

Kevin Marks scored on a two-yard touchdown run with just 22 seconds left in the half to extend the UB lead to 24-7 at the break. His touchdown capped a 14-play, 84-yard drive that ate up nearly six minutes off the clock.

The Owls took the opening kickoff of the second half and were driving deep into UB territory. However, sophomore cornerback Aapri Washington came up with a huge interception at the goal line to thwart a Temple score.

Devon Russell notched the Bulls' second interception of the game midway through the third quarter to once again give UB a short field. Four plays later, Patterson barreled into the endzone for his second score of the game to put Buffalo ahead, 31-10.

Fittingly, the defense put the cap on the win when senior safety Joey Banks returned an interception 46 yards for a touchdown to extend the UB lead to 38-10 in the fourth quarter.

This game was won in the trenches as the Bulls dominated both the offensive and defensive line of scrimmage. The offensive line blocked for a rushing attack that gained 217 yards on the ground. Conversely, the defense held the Owls to just 31 yards rushing.

OXFORD, OH – One week after capitalizing on turnovers to defeat Temple, the tables were turned on the University at Buffalo football team as four turnovers were too much to overcome in a 34-20 loss to Miami (OH) at Yager Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It was the Mid-American Conference opener for both schools.

The loss spoiled an impressive rushing day for the Bulls as they piled up a season-high 309 yards on the ground. Jaret Patterson rushed for 183 yards and a touchdown and Kevin Marks added 101 yards and a score.

Buffalo got on the board first when it took its second possession of the game, drove 61 yards on only three plays and scored a touchdown on a beautiful 20-yard touch pass from Matt Myers to Antonio Nunn to take a 7-0 lead.

After Miami answered with a 53-yard field goal, the Bulls struck again early in the second quarter when Patterson ripped off a career-long 82-yard touchdown run to put the Bulls ahead 14-3. It was the longest touchdown run by a UB player since James Starks had a 91-yard TD run at Miami (OH) in 2007.

After Miami scored to cut the Buffalo lead to 14-10, Buffalo committed its first costly turnover. Late in the first half, Miami forced and recovered a fumble at the UB three-yard line. The UB defense stiffened and held the RedHawks to a field goal and the Bulls led 14-13 at the half.

The game turned early in the second half when Miami's Mike Brown intercepted a UB pass and returned it for a touchdown to give the home team its first lead of the game, 20-14. It was the first of three third-quarter touchdowns for the RedHawks.

Trailing, 34-14, early in the fourth quarter, Marks hit pay dirt from 39 yards out to cut the Miami lead to 34-20. However, the Bulls would get no closer and dropped their third straight road game.

Besides turnovers, field position played a huge factor in the game. Miami started seven drives on Buffalo's side of the field.

"I can't fault the defensive effort," head coach Lance Leipold said. "There are plenty of things in all three areas that we have to be better at. Do I think our defense had a solid effort today? Yes, for as many times as they played on short fields."

The defense was led by Tim Terry, Jr. who had a career-high 10 tackles, including a tackle for loss. Joey Banks and Matt Otwinowski added eight and seven tackles, respectively.

The Bulls outgained the RedHawks, 398-265, in total offense, including over twice as many rushing yards.

AKRON, OH – The University at Buffalo football team produced one of its finest defensive efforts in recent history, shutting out Akron, 21-0, at InfoCision Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It was just the Bulls' second ever road shutout against a Mid-American Conference opponent since joining the conference in 1999.

Buffalo scored two defensive touchdowns, forced four turnovers, had 11 tackles for loss, five sacks and held the Zips to just three yards rushing.

On their opening possession, the Bulls marched 75 yards on 14 plays and took a 7-0 lead on a two-yard touchdown run by Kevin Marks midway through the first quarter. It would be all the offense Buffalo would need as the defense took over from there.

UB's 7-0 lead would last until late in the third quarter when Taylor Riggins blitzed off the edge, sacked the Akron quarterback and jarred the ball free. Ledarius Mack scooped up the loose change and scampered 35 yards for the touchdown, giving the Bulls a 14-0 advantage.

Kadofi Wright scored the defense's second touchdown of the game midway through the fourth quarter. The junior linebacker sacked the Akron quarterback, forced a fumble and fell on the loose ball in the endzone for the score.

"I was really impressed with the way our defense flew around today," head coach Lance Leipold said. "We thought we had some good matchups up front and, with some pressure, we thought we could make some things happen and they did today."

The Bulls rushed for 189 yards in the game, led by Jaret Patterson's 88 yards on 17 carries. Marks finished with 71 yards on 19 carries and a touchdown.

Quarterback Kyle Vantrease, a native of Stow, OH, just eight miles from the Akron campus, had good command of the offense, finishing 14-of-23 for 65 yards. His favorite target was Daniel Lee who had a career-high six catches for 30 yards.

But this game was all about the UB defense. Wright finished with five tackles, two sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Mack had three tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Joey Banks had five tackles, including two tackles for loss. Wankeith Akin, Jr. sealed the win with his first career interception.

BUFFALO, NY – Behind the strength of five defensive takeaways, the University at Buffalo football team defeated Central Michigan, 43-20, at UB Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It was the Bulls' second straight win to level their record at 4-4 overall and 2-2 in Mid-American Conference play.

The game turned quickly in the Bulls' favor early in the second half when UB scored off takeaways on consecutive Central Michigan possessions to turn a 7-3 deficit into a 17-7 lead. The first touchdown was set up by a strip sack by James Patterson that led to an eight-yard touchdown pass from Kyle Vantrease to Antonio Nunn to give UB a 10-7 lead.

On the very first play of the Chippewas' next possession, Joey Banks ripped the ball free from the CMU running back and it was recovered by Kadofi Wright at the Central Michigan 15-yard line. It took only one play for Buffalo to find the endzone as Jaret Patterson ran it in from 15 yards out to extend the UB lead to 10 points.

Buffalo took a 24-7 lead with 3:39 left in the half when Vantrease and Nunn connected for their second touchdown of the game, this time on a 14-yard fade pattern. After CMU scored with just 1:35 left in the half to cut the UB lead to 24-14, the Bulls marched 75 yards on only five plays and scored on a three-yard Kevin Marks touchdown to take a 30-14 lead at the half. The big play on the drive was a 54-yard pass completion from Vantrease to Patterson.

Central Michigan never threatened in the second half. Alex McNulty made two of this three field goals in the second half to help the cause. On the day, the redshirt-freshman made kicks of 29, 29 and 39 yards.

Wright sealed the victory by returning an interception 40 yards for a touchdown late in the contest. It was the second straight game Wright scored a defensive touchdown.

"Causing five turnovers is outstanding and it builds confidence for everyone" head coach Lance Leipold said. "[CMU has] been an explosive offense all year and for us to do a good job ourselves, it's a good day when you can be plus-four in the turnover margin."

Patterson led the Bulls offensively with 149 yards rushing and a touchdown as well as 59 receiving yards to account for 208 yards of total offense. Vantrease threw for 179 and two touchdowns. Nunn was his favorite target with five catches for 77 yards and two scores.

Defensively, it was another standout performance for Banks. The senior safety had a game-high 10 tackles, a forced fumble and an interception. Tyrone Hill added eight tackles. Riggins had five stops, 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery.

YPSILANTI, MI – The University at Buffalo football team won its third straight game in convincing fashion, defeating Eastern Michigan, 43-14, at Rynearson Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It was Buffalo's first-ever win at Eastern Michigan in five tries.

Saturday's win was arguably the Bulls' most complete performance of the season, dominating on both offense and defense.

Starting with the defense, the Bulls held Eastern Michigan to only 25 rushing yards in the game and 210 total yards with most coming late in the contest. The Bulls had five sacks and limited the Eagles to only six first downs in the game, tying the fewest by an opponent in UB's FBS era.

Offensively, UB doubled the Eagles in yardage, rolling up 460 yards of total offense. It was a balanced attack with 252 rushing yards and 208 yards passing.

Quarterback Kyle Vantrease had his best game as a Bull. The redshirt-sophomore threw for a career-high 208 yards and a touchdown and rushed for two other scores. Jaret Patterson rushed for 160 yards and two touchdowns on the day. The sophomore running back went over 2,000 yards for his career.

Antonio Nunn had a career-high seven catches for 87 yards and a touchdown. Kevin Marks also found the endzone to go along with 90 rushing yards.

Eastern Michigan, the top passing offense in the MAC, struck first in the game by connecting on an 80-yard touchdown pass to take a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter. However, it was all UB from there.

The UB defense made another statement play late in the first quarter, when Chibueze Onwuka sacked the EMU quarterback in the endzone for a safety to cut the lead to 7-2. On the ensuing possession, the Bulls marched 61 yards on 11 plays and took the lead when Marks, with the help of the entire offensive line, willed his way into the endzone, from nine yards out, to give the Bulls a 9-7 lead.

Marks' touchdown sparked a 27-point second quarter for the Bulls. On a fourth down play at the Eastern Michigan 16-yard line, Vantrease called his own number on a bootleg and fooled everyone, waltzing into the endzone untouched. Vantrease added his second score of the game on a quarterback sneak to extend the UB lead to 22-7. The Bulls capped off their tremendous second quarter, with just nine seconds left on the clock, when Vantrease found Nunn on a fade in the corner of the endzone to give Buffalo a 29-7 lead at the half.

The second half was the Jaret Patterson show as the elusive running back ran for 91 yards and two touchdowns to help seal the win for the Bulls.

Onwuka led the UB defense with five tackles and a sack. He had one of UB's five sacks on the day. Tyrece Woods, Taylor Riggins, Frendy Dare-lus and Max Michel also added sacks for the Bulls. Aapri Washington secured his second interception of the season in the fourth quarter.

"I think this team is playing with a lot of confidence right now and that's exciting," head coach Lance Leipold said. "I'm proud of them. I'm proud of the job our assistant coaches have done to this point and we've got to keep building on it."

OXFORD, OH – One week after capitalizing on turnovers to defeat Temple, the tables were turned on the University at Buffalo football team as four turnovers were too much to overcome in a 34-20 loss to Miami (OH) at Yager Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It was the Mid-American Conference opener for both schools.

The loss spoiled an impressive rushing day for the Bulls as they piled up a season-high 309 yards on the ground. Jaret Patterson rushed for 183 yards and a touchdown and Kevin Marks added 101 yards and a score.

Buffalo got on the board first when it took its second possession of the game, drove 61 yards on only three plays and scored a touchdown on a beautiful 20-yard touch pass from Matt Myers to Antonio Nunn to take a 7-0 lead.

After Miami answered with a 53-yard field goal, the Bulls struck again early in the second quarter when Patterson ripped off a career-long 82-yard touchdown run to put the Bulls ahead 14-3. It was the longest touchdown run by a UB player since James Starks had a 91-yard TD run at Miami (OH) in 2007.

After Miami scored to cut the Buffalo lead to 14-10, Buffalo committed its first costly turnover. Late in the first half, Miami forced and recovered a fumble at the UB three-yard line. The UB defense stiffened and held the RedHawks to a field goal and the Bulls led 14-13 at the half.

The game turned early in the second half when Miami's Mike Brown intercepted a UB pass and returned it for a touchdown to give the home team its first lead of the game, 20-14. It was the first of three third-quarter touchdowns for the RedHawks.

Trailing, 34-14, early in the fourth quarter, Marks hit pay dirt from 39 yards out to cut the Miami lead to 34-20. However, the Bulls would get no closer and dropped their third straight road game.

Besides turnovers, field position played a huge factor in the game. Miami started seven drives on Buffalo's side of the field.

"I can't fault the defensive effort," head coach Lance Leipold said. "There are plenty of things in all three areas that we have to be better at. Do I think our defense had a solid effort today? Yes, for as many times as they played on short fields."

The defense was led by Tim Terry, Jr. who had a career-high 10 tackles, including a tackle for loss. Joey Banks and Matt Otwinowski added eight and seven tackles, respectively.

The Bulls outgained the RedHawks, 398-265, in total offense, including over twice as many rushing yards.

BUFFALO, NY – Behind five touchdowns by running back Jaret Patterson, the University at Buffalo football team defeated Toledo, 49-30, at UB Stadium on Wednesday night. It was the sixth win for the Bulls, securing bowl eligibility for the third straight season.

Patterson's five touchdowns tied the single-game Mid-American Conference record. The sophomore back had four rushing touchdowns, tying the FBS-era school record, and added his first career receiving touchdown.

The Bulls had their most successful game of the season rushing the ball, rolling up 331 yards on the ground. Patterson finished with 192 yards on 32 carries and Kevin Marks added 118 yards and a score on 16 touches. Quarterback Kyle Vantrease added a rushing score for six rushing touchdowns in the game, the most by a UB team in its FBS era and one shy of the all-time school record.

The Bulls opened the scoring late in the first quarter when Marks found the end zone on a four-yard run. On the ensuing possession, Matt Otwinowski came up with his first career interception to set up the Bulls at the Toledo 24-yard line. On the first play from scrimmage, Patterson took a screen pass from Vantrease and barreled 24 yards to the end zone to give the Bulls a 14-0 lead.

Toledo struck back quickly, scoring two touchdowns in less than two minutes to tie the game at 14. The Bulls responded with a 10-play, 75-yard drive, capped off by a 1-yard Patterson touchdown run, to take the lead for good, 21-14. Patterson's third touchdown, a 1-yard run, gave the Bulls a 28-17 advantage late in the first half. Buffalo took a 28-20 lead to the locker room at halftime.

After Toledo opened the second half with a field goal to cut the UB lead to 28-23, it was all UB. Patterson capped two long scoring drives with a two and seven-yard touchdown run, respectively, to extend the lead to 42-23 early in the fourth quarter.

"When our team is playing fast and doing some things, we're a pretty good football team," head coach Lance Leipold said. "I thought they embraced that all week and they had a great focus in the last 24 hours approaching kickoff, and I think they went out and executed that way."

While the offense moved the ball efficiently all night, the defense also had another solid game, holding the MAC's top rushing team to 154 yards on the ground. Otwinowski tied a career high with 10 tackles to go along with his interception. The Bulls had four more sacks in the game, led by Ledarius Mack's two, to bring their total to 27 over the last six games.

Buffalo improved to 6-5 overall and 4-3 in the MAC and will close out the regular season at home next Friday against Bowling Green.

BUFFALO, NY – Jaret Patterson rushed for a school-best 298 yards and scored a Mid-American Conference-record six touchdowns to lead the University at Buffalo football team to a 49-7 win over Bowling Green on Friday afternoon at UB Stadium. Patterson led a rushing attack that rolled up 455 yards on the ground, the most ever in a game in UB's FBS era.

Patterson wasted little time on his assault on the record book as, on the first play from scrimmage, he ripped off an 81-yard touchdown run to quickly give the Bulls a 7-0 lead. The sophomore running back scored on a 35-yard run on the Bulls' third possession and added a 30-yard touchdown run the following possession to give Buffalo a 21-0 lead at the end of the first quarter.

Patterson added a nine-yard and a one-yard TD run in the second quarter and by halftime, he had rushed for 272 yards and five touchdowns. The Bulls led the Falcons, 35-7, at the break.

Patterson scored his MAC-record sixth touchdown on a one-yard run early in the fourth quarter. He finished the game with 298 yards on 26 carries to break the single-game school record of 282 yards previously held by Jordan Johnson.

Kevin Marks tallied UB's final rushing touchdown on a three-yard run midway through the fourth quarter. He broke off a 70-yard run a play earlier to set up the score. Marks finished with 107 yards in the game to go over 1,000 on the season, joining Patterson as the first duo in school history to each rush for 1,000 yards in the same season.

"Getting those type of yards is awesome, but it's even more impressive to me when everyone knows that's what you're going to do," head coach Lance Leipold said. "We're not fooling anyone that we're running the football and that it's coming. For us to start off the game the way we did and to play at that level says a lot."

Quarterback Kyle Vantrease had a solid afternoon, finishing 10-of-14 for 131 yards in the game. Antonio Nunn had four catches for 67 yards and Daniel Lee and Zac Lefebvre each added two grabs.

The defense, led by Joey Banks' eight tackles, limited the Falcons to 187 yards of total offense. Matt Otwinowski added seven tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup.

The Bulls finished the regular season 7-5, marking the first time since 1958 and 1959 UB has won seven or more games in back-to-back seasons. Buffalo will now await a likely bowl invitation.

HEAD COACH LANCE LEIPOLD

Lance Leipold is in his fifth season as head coach of the Buffalo football team.

Leipold led the Bulls to a school-record 10-win campaign in 2018. The 10 wins, included a program-best 7-1 record in the Mid-American Conference, a MAC East Division title and the school's second trip to the MAC Championship game. Among the Bulls non-conference victories in 2018, included a 42-13 win at Rutgers, for the school's first-ever win over a Power 5 opponent. The Bulls earned an invitation

to the 2018 Dollar General Bowl for just their third bowl game berth in program history.

Leipold was named the 2018 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, presented yearly by the Maxwell Football Club.

Buffalo had the finest offensive campaign in school history in 2018. The Bulls scored 484 points, 64 touchdowns and rolled up 5,803 yards of total offense on the season - all school records. Quarterback Tyree Jackson was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year - the first UB player to ever win the award. Running back Jaret Patterson was named the MAC Freshman of the Year after becoming the first freshman in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. The Bulls had a school-record 10 players named to the All-MAC team, including six on the first team.

In 2017, he guided the Bulls to a 6-6 record and bowl eligibility for just the third time as an FBS program. The six wins were the fourth most in a season since the Bulls made the move to the FBS ranks in 1999.

The Bulls featured an explosive offense in 2017 that ranked second in the Mid-American Conference, averaging 432 yards per game and led the MAC with 291 passing yards per outing. UB's 5,183 yards of total offense were the third most in school history for a single season. The Bulls produced 20 plays of 45 yards or more and those 20 plays came from 10 different players.

Buffalo posted key wins against Conference USA Champion Florida Atlantic as well as a nine-win Ohio team. The Bulls finished the season with three straight wins for the first time as an FBS program. In addition, UB's six losses were by a total of 29 points, including two one-point losses and a three-point, seven-overtime loss.

In 2016, Leipold led a very young squad, featuring 42 new players. The Bulls were the fourth most inexperienced team in the nation. Buffalo earned impressive wins over Army (a bowl team) and Akron. Buffalo had four players named to the All-MAC team.

In 2015, his first with the Bulls, Leipold led UB to a 5-7 mark. He became the first UB head coach to win five games in his first season since Bob Deming went 6-3 in 1969.

Included in the Bulls five wins was a victory at Florida Atlantic - Buffalo's first non-conference road win since the 2009 season. The Bulls won three road games in 2015 - the most in UB's FBS era (since 1999).

The Bulls had five players named to the All-MAC football team in 2015, led by tight end Matt Weiser who was also named an Academic All-American - becoming the first UB football player in the modern era to earn the distinction.

Leipold was named the 25th head coach in the history of the Buffalo football program on December 1, 2014.

Leipold came to UB from Wisconsin-Whitewater where he compiled an astounding 109-6 record and won six Division III National Championships over his eight seasons. A six-time National Coach of the Year, Leipold reached 100 career victories faster than any other coach in NCAA history - at any level.

Leipold has gathered multiple honors from as many as five football-related or-

ganizations. He earned his sixth American Football Coaches Association Division III Coach of the Year award in 2014. He has won the award more times than any active coach at any level. He passed the late Joe Paterno, who was a five-time recipient of the award.

In his first season as head coach at Whitewater, The Warhawks went 14-1 and won the national title. He led the Warhawks back to the national championship game in 2008, but they lost to Mount Union, 31-26. Wisconsin-Whitewater went 15-0, winning the national championship in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and won 46 straight games over that span. Following a 7-3 season in 2012, UWW went a perfect 15-0 and won the national championship in 2013 and followed with another perfect 15-0 season and a national title in 2014.

In Division III, where athletic scholarships aren't a part of the game, Leipold was able to recruit top-notch talent to the campus in southeastern Wisconsin. During his tenure, running back Justin Beaver earned the Gagliardi Trophy as the top player in Division III. Brent Allen earned the Division III Rimington Award as the top center. Jeff Schebler was the first recipient of the Fred Mitchell Award, given to the top placekicker in Division II or III. Tailback Levell Coppage earned D3football.com Offensive Player of the Year accolades, and Cole Klotz was selected D3football.com Defensive Player of the Year. Defensive back Jared Kiesow was named an NCAA Elite 88 Award winner. The Warhawks have piled up 56 All-America honors under Leipold's tutelage.

A native of Jefferson, WI, Leipold began his coaching career at Wisconsin-Whitewater in 1987 as a quarterbacks coach and then wide receivers coach. He moved to the University of Wisconsin from 1991-93 as a graduate assistant and helped the Badgers to a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl appearance in 1993.

As an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha from 1994-2000, Leipold helped turn the Mavericks from a 1-10 team in 1994 into three-time North Central Conference champions during his tenure. After being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2000, he moved on to the University of Nebraska, where he served for three seasons under current Ohio head coach Frank Solich. He was on the same staff as former UB head coach Turner Gill. The Cornhuskers competed in the national championship game in 2001 and earned bowl bids in 2002 and 2003.

He returned to Nebraska-Omaha to serve as associate head coach and offensive coordinator from 2004-06. The Mavericks finished 8-3 and won the conference championship each of his three seasons.

Leipold is a 1987 graduate of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he was a standout quarterback for the Warhawks. He ranks second in school history in career pass attempts (647), fourth in yards (4,277), sixth in completions (303) and tied for 10th with 27 touchdowns. He was inducted into the Whitewater Hall of Fame in 2003. He was inducted into the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2018.

He is a member of the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Leipold and his wife, Kelly, have a daughter, Lindsey, and a son, Landon. His daughter, Lindsey plays volleyball at Stetson University.

University History

Here is how the years add up to something big.

Through a steady succession of big ideas, big ventures and big achievements, UB has advanced dramatically over the past century and a half. Starting in 1846 as a small, private medical school, we've grown to become the largest institution in the State University of New York system, and we're charging toward world renown as a top-rated public research university. Our history is proud and prodigious—just like UB itself.

Through continual growth

1 First was medicine, then pharmacy, followed by law and dentistry: UB in its earliest days was a series of professional schools. The creation of the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) in 1913 made the university all the richer with its focus on the arts and humanities, natural sciences and social sciences. Students today can choose from 13 schools and colleges, of which CAS is the largest, with 27 departments.

By breaking new ground

2 As UB has evolved through the decades, so has our physical presence. The original downtown medical school moved north in 1953 to join the largely E.B. Green-designed Main Street Campus (now the South Campus). Land for the North Campus in suburban Amherst was purchased in 1964. Our newest campus, in downtown Buffalo, has brought the medical school full circle, this time to anchor the city's first academic medical center.

UB has presidential connections! Millard Fillmore, a lawyer and congressman, was named UB's first chancellor in 1846. Still acting in that capacity, he was sworn in as 13th president of the United States on July 10, 1850.
