## STORYLINES

- The Bulls are kicking off their 108th season of football.
- The Bulls are looking for their first win against Northern Illinois since joining the Mid-American Conference in 1999 (0-11). NIU is the only MAC opponent the Bulls have not defeated since joining the conference.
- This is a rematch of the 2018 MAC Championship game in which the Huskies won, 30-29.
- **Jaret Patterson** is 188 yards shy of becoming the fifth running back in school history to rush for 3,000 career yards.
- **Jaret Patterson's** next rushing touchdown will tie James Starks (2006-08) for the school record for career touchdowns with 34.
- The Bulls return all three players that attempted a pass, six of seven players that had a carry and 12 of 14 players that recorded a reception in 2019.
- **Malcolm Koonce** (9) and **Taylor Riggins** (8.5) were the top two sackers in the MAC last season.
- Buffalo is predicted to finish first in the MAC East Division by the media and second by the coaches.
- UB quarterbacks coach/co-offensive coordinator Jim Zebrowski was the quarterbacks coach at NIU in 2010. Northern Illinois offensive line coach Daryl Agpalsa was the offensive line coach at UB from 2015-18 and NIU linebackers coach Robert Wimberly was the linebackers coach at UB in 2009.
- Seven starters return to one of the most dominant defenses in recent memory. The Bulls led the MAC in total defense and were especially stout against the run, allowing only 94.2 yards per game which ranked fourth in the country in 2019.

University at Buffalo football head coach Lance Leipold has announced the number 41 jersey will once again be worn by a different player each game to honor the legacy of former Bull Solomon Jackson who passed away in 2016.

In 2016 and 2017, players were chosen by the coaching staff to wear "41" for the entire year. Cornerback Boise Ross wore it for the 2016 season, while linebacker Jarrett Franklin wore it in 2017.

This is the third season the coaching staff will rotate #41 on a weekly basis.

Solomon Jackson passed away unexpectedly following an offseason workout on February 29, 2016. Jackson, respected and beloved by his teammates, played both linebacker and defensive end over his career. The slogan ALL41 is a prominent fixture throughout the Murchie Family Football Center to honor his legacy.

### Bulls Open 2020 Campaign at Northern Illinois

The University at Buffalo football team will kick off the 2020 season at Northern Illinois on Wednesday night. It will be the first of six straight games against Mid-American Conference opponents. The Bulls are coming off a season in which they went 8-5 and defeated Charlotte in the Bahamas Bowl for the program's first ever bowl win.

Buffalo returns 19 players who started two or more games in 2019. The Bulls were picked first in the MAC East Division preseason media poll and second in the MAC East Division preseason coaches poll.

Northern Illinois is coming off a 5-7 season. The Huskies were picked seventh in the MAC West Division preseason poll.

Northern Illinois leads the all-time series, 12-1. The Huskies won the last meeting, 30-29, in the 2018 MAC Championship game.

### Not Standing Patt

UB running back **Jaret Patterson** is coming off the finest season by a running back in school history and looks to build on it in his third year with the program. Patterson rushed for a school-record 1,799 yards in 2019, breaking the previous record of 1,535 yards set by Branden Oliver in 2013. In addition, Patterson's 19 rushing touchdowns were also a single-season school record, breaking the record of 16 held by James Starks (2008) and Lee Jones (1966).

Patterson posted eye-popping numbers to finish the 2019 campaign. He rushed for 663 yards and 12 touchdowns over the last three games of the season. He broke the MAC record for rushing touchdowns in a game when he scored six times to go along with 298 rushing yards against Bowling Green on Nov. 29.

A first-team All-MAC selection in 2019, Patterson was a preseason All-American and is on the preseason watchlists for the Maxwell Award and the Doak Walker Award.

### On Your Marks

While **Jaret Patterson** got most of the headlines last season, running back **Kevin Marks** also had a breakout season for the Bulls. As a sophomore, The Virginia native rushed for a career-best 1,035 yards and eight touchdowns last year. It marked the first time in school history the Bulls had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season. Marks had a rushing touchdown in each of the last six games of the regular season.

Marks rushed for over 100 yards five different times, including 118 yards on 16 carries against Toledo and 112 yards against Ohio.

Marks joins Patterson on the Doak Walker Award watch list. Buffalo is one of just nine schools in the country to have multiple candidates on the Doak Walker list.

### Pick Your Poison

The Bulls feature two of the best defensive ends in the Mid-American Conference. **Malcolm Koonce** and **Taylor Riggins** were both All-MAC First Team selections in 2019 and both are on the watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy.

Koonce led the Mid-American Conference in sacks last season with nine. The senior defensive end added 34 tackles and 11 tackles for loss on the season. He was named the Defensive MVP of the 2019 Bahamas Bowl after recording five tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble against Charlotte. Koonce was also named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Top 250.

Riggins tallied 8.5 sacks in 2019, second only to Koonce in the MAC. He added 50 tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss and three fumble recoveries on the season. Riggins has also been named to the Bednarik Award Watch List.

### Building a Consistent Winner

Head Coach Lance Leipold has been able to build a consistent winning program since being hired prior to the 2015 season. The Bulls have won 24 games over the last three seasons - going 6-6 in 2017, 10-4 in 2018 and 8-5 last year. It is the most wins over a three-year span in the history of the program. Buffalo has also been one of the most consistent pro-

grams across the MAC over that same three-year span as only Ohio has more wins with 25 (Toledo also has 24).

### Movement on the Offensive Line

The Bulls will be replacing three starters on the offensive line, but fortunately they have experienced players ready to move into starting roles. The Bulls will be replacing LT Evin Ksiezarczyk, RG Tomas Jack-Kurdyla and LG Paul Nosworthy.

**Kayode Awosika** has been the starting right tackle for the past two seasons and will make the move to left tackle in 2020. An All-MAC Second Team selection in 2019, Awosika is on the Outland Trophy watch list.

**Mike Novitsky** started all 13 games at center last season and is on the 2020 Rimington Trophy watch list.

**Jake Fuzak** will likely start at right tackle after starting the final two games of the 2019 season.

**Jacob Gall** started the final five games at right guard in 2018 and had one start in 2019. He will likely start at left guard this season.

The other guard spot will be feature a new starter. Senior **Jack Klenk**, sophomore **Gabe Wallace** and graduate transfer **Ray Thomas-Ishman** have been battling it out in camp.

Last season, UB's line blocked for an

offense that rushed for a school-record 3,256 yards and allowed a program-low eight sacks, second fewest in the country.

### Opening Against the MAC

While this is a unique season consisting of only Mid-American Conference games, it isn't the first time the Bulls will open the year with a conference game since joining the MAC. The Bulls opened the 1999 season, their first in the MAC, by hosting Akron (L, 17-10) and opened the 2004 campaign at Eastern Michigan (L, 37-34).

### QB Battle

The Bulls return two quarterbacks who each spent time as the starter last season.

**Kyle Vantrease** started the final eight games of the 2019 campaign. He completed 101-of-172 passes for 1,193 yards and eight touchdowns, while throwing only two interceptions. He also rushed for 64 yards and six touchdowns. He went 6-2 as a starter.

**Matt Myers** was the Bulls' starting QB at the start of the 2019 campaign before suffering a season-ending injury in week five. He completed 49-of-105 passes for 602 yards and six touchdowns on the season. He also rushed for 94 yards and two touchdowns. The local product

threw for a season-best 245 yards and a touchdown at Penn State.

### Nunn Better

Senior receiver **Antonio Nunn** continues to develop into one of the best targets in the Mid-American Conference. He is coming off his best season in 2019 when he had 49 catches for 687 yards and six touchdowns en route to earning All-MAC Third Team honors. His 49 catches were twice as many as any other UB player (**Daniel Lee** was second with 23). Nunn had 49 of the Bulls' 155 catches last season (32%) and nearly half of the team's touchdown receptions (6 of 14 - 43%).

### Watch Out

The Bulls have eight different players on eight different NCAA award preseason watch lists. Running back **Jaret Patterson** and defensive end **Taylor Riggins** each appeared on two different watch lists.

### 11 Bulls Named to Athlon Preseason All-MAC Team

Athlon Sports released its preseason All-Mid-American Conference football team and 11 University at Buffalo players were named to the squad. The list was headlined by five first-team selections, running back **Jaret Patterson**, offensive tackle **Kayode Awosika**, defensive ends **Taylor Riggins** and **Malcolm Koonce** and safety **Tyrone Hill**.

Wide Receiver **Antonio Nunn** and linebacker **Kadofi Wright** were named to the second team.

The third team included running back **Kevin Marks**, center **Mike Novitsky** and defensive tackle **Eddie Wilson**.

Linebacker **James Patterson** was on the fourth team.

### 5 Grad Transfers Join the Bulls

The Bulls added five graduate transfers ahead of the 2020 campaign - four on defense and one on offense.

Three linebackers have joined the team, including **Brendan Pyne** from Brown, **Tyree Thompson** from UCLA and **Keith Woetzel** from Lehigh. Former Vanderbilt defensive tackle **Eddie Zinn-Turner** also joined the team. On the offensive side of the ball, offensive lineman **Ray Thomas-Ishman** came to UB from UMass.

### International Flavor

The Bulls have six international players from four different countries on this year's roster.

Buffalo has three players who hail

from Canada, including **Dominic Johnson** (Ontario), **Cole Burniston** (Ontario) and **Gabe Wallace** (BC). In addition, the Bulls have three players from Europe, **Fabian Weitz** (Germany), **Alain Schaerer** (Switzerland) and **Jordan Avissey** (France).

### Lefebvre Named Campbell Trophy Semifinalist

Senior tight end **Zac Lefebvre** has been named a William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist. Given annually to college football's top student-athlete, the Campbell Trophy is also known as the Academic Heisman.

Lefebvre is a health and human services major with a 3.37 cumulative grade point average and is a three-time Academic All-MAC selection.

A native of Victor, NY, Lefebvre has started 14 games at tight end. He has 36 catches for 370 yards and three touchdowns over his career.

### Pallotti Boys

The Bulls have five players from Maryland's Saint Vincent Pallotti High School on this year's team. Running back **Jaret Patterson**, linebackers **James Patterson** and **Justin Mulbah**, wide receiver **Jelani Foster** and cornerback **Dylan Powell** all played together for the Panthers.

Justin Winters, a former All-MAC linebacker for the Bulls, was a coach at Pallotti when the players were there.

### Last Meeting

Northern Illinois 30, Buffalo 29  
Nov. 30, 2018 • Ford Field • Detroit, MI

DETROIT, MI – Northern Illinois struck on a 35-yard touchdown pass with 1:09 remaining in the game to defeat the University Buffalo football team, 30-29, in the Mid-American Conference Championship game at Ford Field on Friday night. The final touchdown gave the Huskies their first lead of the game.

The Buffalo offense was rolling early, scoring on each of its first five possessions of the game. Each of the Bulls' first two scoring drives were 94 yards. Kevin Marks got the Bulls on the board first with a three-yard touchdown run to give UB a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

The Bulls took a 13-0 lead on the first play of the second quarter when Tyree Jackson connected with Anthony Johnson on a 13-yard fade in the corner of the endzone. The Huskies responded with a touchdown pass on their next possession to cut the UB lead to 13-7.

Jackson and Johnson connected again on a 26-yard touchdown pass on Buffalo's next drive to extend the Buffalo lead to 19-7 with 5:41 left in the half. Following a Northern Illinois field goal to cut the lead to 19-10, the Bulls marched down the field in the closing minute of the second quarter and Adam Mitcheson made a 24-yard field goal to give the Bulls a 22-10 lead at the break.

The Bulls took the opening kickoff of the second half and marched 75 yards on eight plays. Jaret Patterson ran up the middle for a 9-yard touchdown to extend the lead to 29-10. However, those would be the final points of the game for the Bulls.

Northern Illinois scored 20 points in the final 15:17 of the contest, all on passing touchdowns to pull out the one-point victory. Huskie quarterback Marcus Childers threw for a career-high 300 yards and four touchdowns to lead the comeback.

A big turning point in the game came with just under six minutes to play when, with the Bulls leading 29-24 and the ball near midfield, Jackson called his own number and ran for 19 yards to the NIU 29. However, a holding call brought the ball back to Buffalo's own 42-yard line. The Bulls would end up having to punt, setting up the Huskies' game-winning drive.

Buffalo worked the ball to the Northern Illinois 41-yard-line in the closing minute, but turned the ball over on downs to end the game.

The Bulls were successful running the ball against a stout NIU defense, ranked first in the MAC. Marks and Patterson each rushed for 72 yards and a touchdown in the game.

Jackson finished with 252 yards and two touchdowns through the air. Johnson was his favorite target as the senior wideout finished with seven catches for 124 yards and two scores. K.J. Osborn added three catches for 66 yards in the game.

As he's done all season, Khalil Hodge led the Buffalo defense with nine tackles and a sack. James Patterson had seven tackles and another of the Bulls' four sacks in the game. Tatum Slack had his second interception in as many games.

## HEAD COACH LANCE LEIPOLD

Now in his sixth season, head coach Lance Leipold continues to build the Buffalo football program into a consistent winner.

Leipold led Buffalo to its first ever bowl win in 2019, defeating Charlotte, 31-9, in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl. UB finished the 2019 campaign with a record of 8-5, its third straight season of bowl edibility and second straight bowl berth, both program firsts. Two of Buffalo's four bowl berths in school history have come with Leipold at the helm.

Buffalo had a school-record 12 players named All-MAC in 2019, including running back Jaret Patterson who rushed for a school-record 1,799 yards and 19 touchdowns. The UB offense was paced by a rushing attack that has rolled up a program-best 3,256 yards on the ground. Running back Kevin Marks also rushed for 1,035 yards on the year, giving the Bulls two 1,000-yard running backs in the same season for the first time in school history.

The defense in 2019 was one of the best in program history. The Bulls ranked seventh nationally in total defense, allowing 291.9 yards per game and fourth nationally against the run, allowing 94.2 yards per game.

Leipold led the Bulls to a school-record 10-win campaign in 2018. The 10 wins, included a program-best 7-1 record in the Mid-American Conference, a MAC East Division title and the school's second trip to the MAC Championship game. Among the Bulls non-conference victories in 2018, included a 42-13 win at Rutgers, for the school's first-ever win over a Power 5 opponent. The Bulls earned an invitation to the 2018 Dollar General Bowl for just their third bowl game berth in program history.

Leipold was named the 2018 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, presented yearly by the Maxwell Football Club.

Buffalo had the finest offensive campaign in school history in 2018. The Bulls scored 484 points, 64 touchdowns and rolled up 5,803 yards of total offense on the season - all school records. Quarterback Tyree Jackson was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year - the first UB player to ever win the award. Running back Jaret Patterson was named the MAC Freshman of the Year after becoming the first freshman in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. The Bulls had a school-record 10 players named to the All-MAC team, including six on the first team.

In 2017, he guided the Bulls to a 6-6 record and bowl eligibility for just the third time as an FBS program. The six wins were the fourth most in a season since the Bulls made the move to the FBS ranks in 1999.

The Bulls featured an explosive offense in 2017 that ranked second in the Mid-American Conference, averaging 432 yards per game and led the MAC with 291 passing yards per outing. UB's 5,183 yards of total offense were the third most in school history for a single season. The Bulls produced 20 plays of 45 yards or more and those 20 plays came from 10 different players.

Buffalo posted key wins against Conference USA Champion Florida Atlantic as well as a nine-win Ohio team. The Bulls finished the season with three straight wins for the first time as an FBS program. In addition, UB's six losses were by a total of 29 points, including two one-point losses and a three-point, seven-overtime loss.

In 2016, Leipold led a very young squad, featuring 42 new players. The Bulls were the fourth most inexperienced team in the nation. Buffalo earned impressive wins over Army (a bowl team) and Akron. Buffalo had four players named to the All-MAC team.

In 2015, his first with the Bulls, Leipold led UB to a 5-7 mark. He became the first UB head coach to win five games in his first season since Bob Deming went 6-3 in 1969.

Included in the Bulls five wins was a victory at Florida Atlantic - Buffalo's first non-conference road win since the 2009 season. The Bulls won three road games in 2015 - the most in UB's FBS era (since 1999).

The Bulls had five players named to the All-MAC football team in 2015, led by tight end Matt Weiser who was also named an Academic All-American - becoming the first UB football player in the modern era to earn the distinction. Leipold was named the 25th head coach in the history of the Buffalo football program on December 1, 2014.

Leipold came to UB from Wisconsin-Whitewater where he compiled an astounding 109-6 record and won six Division III National Championships over his eight seasons. A six-time National Coach of the Year, Leipold reached 100 career victories faster than any other coach in NCAA history - at any level.

Leipold has gathered multiple honors from as many as five football-related organizations. He earned his sixth American Football Coaches Association Division III Coach of the Year award in 2014. He has won the award more times than any active coach at any level. He passed the late Joe Paterno, who was a five-time recipient of the award.

In his first season as head coach at Whitewater, The Warhawks went 14-1 and won the national title. He led the Warhawks back to the national championship game in 2008, but they lost to Mount Union, 31-26. Wisconsin-Whitewater went 15-0, winning the national championship in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and won 46 straight games over that span. Following a 7-3 season in 2012, UWW went a perfect 15-0 and won the national championship in 2013 and followed with another perfect 15-0 season and a national title in 2014.

In Division III, where athletic scholarships aren't a part of the game, Leipold was able to recruit top-notch talent to the campus in southeastern Wisconsin. During his tenure, running back Justin Beaver earned the Gagliardi Trophy as the top player in Division III. Brent Allen earned the Division III Rimington Award as the top center. Jeff Schebler was the first recipient of the Fred Mitchell Award, given to the top placekicker in Division II or III. Tailback Levell Coppage earned D3football.com Offensive Player of the Year accolades, and Cole Klotz was selected D3football.com Defensive Player of the Year. Defensive back Jared Kiesow was named an NCAA Elite 88 Award winner. The Warhawks have piled up 56 All-America honors under Leipold's tutelage.

A native of Jefferson, WI, Leipold began his coaching career at Wisconsin-Whitewater in 1987 as a quarterbacks coach and then wide receivers coach. He moved to the University of Wisconsin from 1991-93 as a graduate assistant and helped the Badgers to a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl appearance in 1993.

As an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha from 1994-2000, Leipold helped turn the Mavericks from a 1-10 team in 1994 into three-time North Central Conference champions during his tenure. After being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2000, he moved on to the University of Nebraska, where he served for three seasons under current Ohio head coach Frank Solich. He was on the same staff as former UB head coach Turner Gill. The Cornhuskers competed in the national championship game in 2001 and earned bowl bids in 2002 and 2003.

He returned to Nebraska-Omaha to serve as associate head coach and offensive coordinator from 2004-06. The Mavericks finished 8-3 and won the conference championship each of his three seasons.

Leipold is a 1987 graduate of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he was a standout quarterback for the Warhawks. He ranks second in school history in career pass attempts (647), fourth in yards (4,277), sixth in completions (303) and tied for 10th with 27 touchdowns. He was inducted into the Whitewater Hall of Fame in 2003. He was inducted into the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2018.

He is a member of the AFCA Ethics Committee as well as the AFCA Board of Trustees.

Leipold and his wife, Kelly, have a daughter, Lindsey, and a son, Landon. His daughter, Lindsey plays volleyball at Stetson University.

# University History

## Here is how the years add up to something big.

Through a steady succession of big ideas, big ventures and big achievements, UB has advanced dramatically over the past century and a half. Starting in 1846 as a small, private medical school, we've grown to become the largest institution in the State University of New York system, and we're charging toward world renown as a top-rated public research university. Our history is proud and prodigious—just like UB itself.

### Through continual growth

**1** First was medicine, then pharmacy, followed by law and dentistry: UB in its earliest days was a series of professional schools. The creation of the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) in 1913 made the university all the richer with its focus on the arts and humanities, natural sciences and social sciences. Students today can choose from 13 schools and colleges, of which CAS is the largest, with 27 departments.

### By breaking new ground

**2** As UB has evolved through the decades, so has our physical presence. The original downtown medical school moved north in 1953 to join the largely E.B. Green-designed Main Street Campus (now the South Campus). Land for the North Campus in suburban Amherst was purchased in 1964. Our newest campus, in downtown Buffalo, has brought the medical school full circle, this time to anchor the city's first academic medical center.

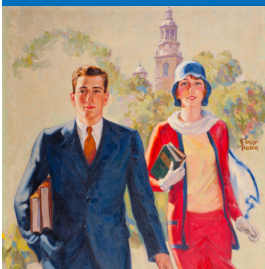

**3** Major discoveries are nothing new to UB. From the invention of the implantable cardiac pacemaker to the sequencing of the genome of a common coffee plant, our history is one of continual breakthroughs and innovations by big thinkers in relentless pursuit of answers. Over the years, UB faculty have won the Nobel Prize, the Pulitzer Prize, the National Book Award, the National Medal of Science and the National Medal of Technology.

### With an ever-expanding vista

**4** UB has always been international in outlook and reach. In 1980, we were the first U.S. university to partner with a Chinese university following the normalization of relations between the two countries, and have since founded ongoing partnerships in Singapore, India, Poland, Latvia, Japan and Canada. Meanwhile, UB is consistently among the top 20 universities in the country for international student enrollment.

### With an eye on the future

**5** Throughout the years, leadership has maintained an ever-evolving and ambitious vision for UB. "UB 2020" was launched in 2004 to increase our economic impact, invest in student growth, foster innovative partnerships and advance research that improves life for people across the globe.
