- · Miami leads the all-time series, 15-7.
- The Bulls are looking to start 2-0 in MAC play for the third time in program history. They started 6-0 in 2018 and 5-0 in 2013.
- **Jaret Patterson** is 51 yards shy of becoming the fifth running back in school history to rush for 3,000 career yards. If he does it against Miami, he would be the fastest running back in school history to reach 3,000 yards.
- **Jaret Patterson** has rushed for 100 yards in seven straight games dating back to last season.
- The Bulls didn't allow a sack against Northern Illinois in the opener and now haven't allowed a sack in five straight games dating back to last season. UB will be facing a Miami squad that had six sacks against Ball State in the opener.
- Buffalo scored three defensive touchdowns against Northern Illinois with two fumble returns and a pick six. Overall, the Bulls forced five turnovers in the game.
- This is a match up of the MAC preseason media poll favorite (Buffalo) and the MAC preseason coaches poll favorite (Miami).
- The Bulls are coming off a game in which they scored 49 points at Northern Illinois, the most in a MAC road game since joining the conference in 1999.
- This is a matchup of the last two MAC East Division champions. The Bulls won the divison in 2018 and the RedHawks took the title last year.

Bulls Host Miami on Tuesday Night in Key Early Matchup

The University at Buffalo football team will host Miami (OH) on Tuesday night in a match up of two of the preseason favorites to win the MAC East Division. The Bulls are coming off a 49-30 win at Northern Illinois on Wednesday night. The UB defense scored three touchdowns and running back **Jaret Patterson** rushed for 137 yards and two scores to lead the way.

Miami (OH) is coming off a 38-31 win over Ball State on Wednesday night. The RedHawks are led by quarterback A.J. Mayer who threw for 212 yards and three touchdowns in the opener.

Miami (OH) leads the all-time series, 15-7. The RedHawks won the last meeting, 34-20, in Oxford, OH last season.

Taking Matters into their Own Hands

UB scored three defensive touchdowns in its 49-30 win at Northern Illinois on Wednesday. **Tim Terry** returned a fumble 46 yards for the first defensive score. On the Huskies very next possession, **Isaiah King** scooped up another fumble and dashed 42 yards for a touchdown. **Kadofi Wright** added a 65-yard pick six for the Bulls' third defensive score.

It was the first time the Bulls scored three defensive touchdowns in a game since 2015 when the defense also scored three times at FAU.

With three defensive touchdowns in the opener UB was already tied for first in the nation in defensive touchdowns.

Record-Breaking Night for Patterson

Jaret Patterson scored two rushing touchdowns in the opener at Northern Illinois. The junior running back now holds the school record for career rushing touchdowns with 35. He broke the record of former All-MAC running back James Starks who rushed for 34 scores from 2006-08.

What's more impressive about Patterson's record is how quickly he got there. Patterson scored his 35th touchdown in only his 28th career game. Starks rushed for his 34th career touchdown in his 36th career game and Branden Oliver, UB's all-time leader rusher, scored his 33rd touchdown in his 40th game.

Wright Place, Wright Time Senior linebacker Kadofi Wright

scored on a 65-yard interception return against Northern Illinois. It was his third career defensive score that have all come over the last eight games. Wright forced and recovered a fumble for a touchdown at Akron on Oct. 19, 2019 and then, a week later, scored on a 40-yard interception return against Central Michigan. Wright was an All-MAC Second Team selection last season.

Building a Consistent Winner

Head Coach Lance Leipold has been able to build a consistent winning program since being hired prior to the 2015 season. The Bulls have won 25 games since the start of the 2017 season - going 6-6 in 2017, 10-4 in 2018 and 8-5 last year. Buffalo has also been one of the most consistent programs across the MAC over that same span, tying Ohio and Toledo for the most wins since the start of 2017.

Nunn Better

Senior receiver **Antonio Nunn** continues to develop into one of the best targets in the Mid-American Conference. He is coming off his best season in 2019 when he had 49 catches for 687 yards and six touchdowns en route to earning All-MAC Third Team honors. His 49 catches were twice as many as any other UB player (**Daniel Lee** was second with 23). Nunn had 49 of the Bulls' 155 catches last season (32%) and nearly half of the team's touchdown receptions (6 of 14 - 43%).

Nunn had six catches for 102 yards and a touchdown against Northern Illinois in the opener.

Not Standing Patt

UB running back **Jaret Patterson** is coming off the finest season by a running back in school history and looks to build on it in his third year with the program. Patterson rushed for a school-record 1,799 yards in 2019, breaking the previous record of 1,535 yards set by Branden Oliver in 2013. In addition, Patterson's 19 rushing touchdowns were also a single-season school record, breaking the record of 16 held by James Starks (2008) and Lee Jones (1966).

Patterson posted eye-popping numbers to finish the 2019 campaign. He rushed for 663 yards and 12 touchdowns over the last three games of the season.

He broke the MAC record for rushing touchdowns in a game when he scored six times to go along with 298 rushing yards against Bowling Green on Nov. 29.

A first-team All-MAC selection in 2019, Patterson was a preseason All-American and is on the preseason watchlists for the Maxwell Award and the Doak Walker Award.

On Your Marks

While **Jaret Patterson** got most of the headlines last season, running back **Kevin Marks** also had a breakout season for the Bulls. As a sophomore, The Virginia native rushed for a career-best 1,035 yards and eight touchdowns last year. It marked the first time in school history the Bulls had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season. Marks had a rushing touchdown in each of the last six games of the regular season.

Marks rushed for over 100 yards five different times, including 118 yards on 16 carries against Toledo and 112 yards against Ohio.

Marks joins Patterson on the Doak Walker Award watch list. Buffalo is one of just nine schools in the country to have multiple candidates on the Doak Walker list.

Pick Your Poison

The Bulls feature two of the best defensive ends in the Mid-American Conference. **Malcolm Koonce** and **Taylor Riggins** were both All-MAC First Team selections in 2019 and both are on the watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy.

Koonce led the Mid-American Conference in sacks last season with nine. The senior defensive end added 34 tackles and 11 tackles for loss on the season. He was named the Defensive MVP of the 2019 Bahamas Bowl after recording five tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble against Charlotte. Koonce was also named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Top 250.

Riggins tallied 8.5 sacks in 2019, second only to Koonce in the MAC. He added 50 tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss and three fumble recoveries on the season. Riggins has also been named to the Bednarik Award Watch List.

Movement on the Offensive Line

The Bulls will be replacing three starters on the offensive line, but fortunately they have experienced players ready to move into starting roles. The Bulls will be replacing LT Evin Ksiezarczyk, RG Tomas Jack-Kurdyla and LG Paul Nosworthy.

Kayode Awosika has been the starting right tackle for the past two seasons

and will make the move to left tackle in 2020. An All-MAC Second Team selection in 2019, Awosika is on the Outland Trophy watch list.

Mike Novitsky started all 13 games at center last season and is on the 2020 Rimington Trophy watch list.

Jake Fuzak will likely start at right tackle after starting the final two games of the 2019 season.

Jacob Gall started the final five games at right guard in 2018 and had one start in 2019. He will likely start at left guard this season.

Senior Jack Klenk made his first career start at the other guard spot against Northern Illinois. Sophomore Gabe Wallace and graduate transfer Ray Thomas-Ishman will also likely be in the rotation at guard.

Last season, UB's line blocked for an offense that rushed for a school-record 3,256 yards and allowed a program-low eight sacks, second fewest in the country.

Watch Out

The Bulls have eight different players on eight different NCFAA award preseason watch lists. Running back **Jaret Patterson** and defensive end **Taylor Riggins** each appeared on two different watch lists.

11 Bulls Named to Athlon Preseason All-MAC Team

Athlon Sports released its preseason All-Mid-American Conference football team and 11 University at Buffalo players were named to the squad. The list was headlined by five first-team selections, running back Jaret Patterson, offensive tackle Kayode Awosika, defensive ends Taylor Riggins and Malcolm Koonce and safety Tyrone Hill.

Wide Receiver **Antonio Nunn** and linebacker **Kadofi Wright** were named to the second team.

The third team included running back **Kevin Marks**, center **Mike Novitsky** and defensive tackle **Eddie Wilson**.

Linebacker **James Patterson** was on the fourth team.

5 Grad Transfers Join the Bulls

The Bulls added five graduate transfers ahead of the 2020 campaign - four on defense and one on offense.

Three linebackers have joined the team, including **Brendan Pyne** from Brown, **Tyree Thompson** from UCLA and **Keith Woetzel** from Lehigh. Former Vanderbilt defensive tackle **Eddie Zinn-Turner** also joined the team. On the offensive side of the ball, offensive lineman **Ray Thomas-Ishman** came to UB from UMass.

International Flavor

The Bulls have five international players from three different countries on this year's roster.

Buffalo has three players who hail from Canada, including **Dominic Johnson** (Ontario), **Cole Burniston** (Ontario) and **Gabe Wallace** (BC). In addition, the Bulls have two players from Europe, **Alain Schaerer** (Switzerland) and **Jordan Avissey** (France).

Lefebvre Named Campbell Trophy Semifinalist

Senior tight end **Zac Lefebvre** has been named a William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist. Given annually to college football's top student-athlete, the Campbell Trophy is also known as the Academic Heisman.

Lefebvre is a health and human services major with a 3.37 cumulative grade point average and is a three-time Academic All-MAC selection.

A native of Victor, NY, Lefebvre has started 14 games at tight end. He has 36 catches for 370 yards and three touchdowns over his career.

Pallotti Boys

The Bulls have five players from Maryland's Saint Vincent Pallotti High School on this year's team. Running back Jaret Patterson, linebackers James Patterson and Justin Mulbah, wide receiver Jelani Foster and cornerback Dylan Powell all played together for the Panthers.

Justin Winters, a former All-MAC linebacker for the Bulls, was a coach at Pallotti when the players were there.

Last Meeting

Miami 34, Buffalo 20 Sept. 28, 2019 • Yager Stadium • Oxford, OH

OXFORD, OH – One week after capitalizing on turnovers to defeat Temple, the tables were turned on the University at Buffalo football team as four turnovers were too much to overcome in a 34-20 loss to Miami (OH) at Yager Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It was the Mid-American Conference opener for both schools.

The loss spoiled an impressive rushing day for the Bulls as they piled up a season-high 309 yards on the ground. Jaret Patterson rushed for 183 yards and a touchdown and Kevin Marks added 101 yards and a score.

Buffalo got on the board first when it took its second possession of the game, drove 61 yards on only three plays and scored a touchdown on a beautiful 20-yard touch pass from Matt Myers to Antonio Nunn to take a 7-0 lead.

After Miami answered with a 53-yard field goal, the Bulls struck again early in the second quarter when Patterson ripped off a career-long 82-yard touchdown run to put the Bulls ahead 14-3. It was the longest touchdown run by a UB player since James Starks had a 91-yard TD run at Miami (OH) in 2007.

After Miami scored to cut the Buffalo lead to 14-10, Buffalo committed its first costly turnover. Late in the first half, Miami forced and recovered a fumble at the UB three-yard line. The UB defense stiffened and held the RedHawks to a field goal and the Bulls led 14-13 at the half.

The game turned early in the second half when Miami's Mike Brown intercepted a UB pass and returned it for a touchdown to give the home team its first lead of the game, 20-14. It was the first of three third-quarter touchdowns for the RedHawks.

Trailing, 34-14, early in the fourth quarter, Marks hit pay dirt from 39 yards out to cut the Miami lead to 34-20. However, the Bulls would get no closer and dropped their third straight road game.

Besides turnovers, field position played a huge factor in the game. Miami started seven drives on Buffalo's side of the field.

"I can't fault the defensive effort," head coach Lance Leipold said. "There are plenty of things in all three areas that we have to be better at. Do I think our defense had a solid effort today? Yes, for as many times as they played on short fields."

The defense was led by Tim Terry, Jr. who had a career-high 10 tackles, including a tackle for loss. Joey Banks and Matt Otwinowski added eight and seven tackles, respectively.

The Bulls outgained the RedHawks, 398-265, in total offense, including over twice as many rushing yards.

HEAD COACH LANCE LEIPOLD

Now in his sixth season, head coach Lance Leipold continues to build the Buffalo football program into a consistent winner.

Leipold led Buffalo to its first ever bowl win in 2019, defeating Charlotte, 31-9, in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl. UB finished the 2019 campaign with a record of 8-5, its third straight season of bowl edibility and second straight bowl berth, both program firsts. Two of Buffalo's four bowl berths in school history have come with Leipold at the helm.

Buffalo had a school-record 12 players named All-MAC in 2019, including running back Jaret Patterson who rushed for a school-record 1,799 yards and 19 touchdowns. The UB offense was paced by a rushing attack that has rolled up a program-best 3,256 yards on the ground. Running back Kevin Marks also rushed for 1,035 yards on the year, giving the Bulls two 1,000-yard running backs in the same season for the first time in school history.

The defense in 2019 was one of the best in program history. The Bulls ranked seventh nationally in total defense, allowing 291.9 yards per games and fourth nationally against the run, allowing 94.2 yards per game.

Leipold led the Bulls to a school-record 10-win campaign in 2018. The 10 wins, included a program-best 7-1 record in the Mid-American Conference, a MAC East Division title and the school's second trip to the MAC Championship game. Among the Bulls non-conference victories in 2018, included a 42-13 win at Rutgers, for the school's first-ever win over a Power 5 opponent. The Bulls earned an invitation to the 2018 Dollar General Bowl for just their third bowl game berth in program history.

Leipold was named the 2018 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, presented yearly by the Maxwell Football Club.

Buffalo had the finest offensive campaign in school history in 2018. The Bulls scored 484 points, 64 touchdowns and rolled up 5,803 yards of total offense on the season - all school records. Quarterback Tyree Jackson was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year - the first UB player to ever win the award. Running back Jaret Patterson was named the MAC Freshman of the Year after becoming the first freshman in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. The Bulls had a school-record 10 players named to the All-MAC team, including six on the first team.

In 2017, he guided the Bulls to a 6-6 record and bowl eligibility for just the third time as an FBS program. The six wins were the fourth most in a season since the Bulls made the move to the FBS ranks in 1999.

The Bulls featured an explosive offense in 2017 that ranked second in the Mid-American Conference, averaging 432 yards per game and led the MAC with 291 passing yards per outing. UB's 5,183 yards of total offense were the third most in school history for a single season. The Bulls produced 20 plays of 45 yards or more and those 20 plays came from 10 different players.

Buffalo posted key wins against Conference USA Champion Florida Atlantic as well as a nine-win Ohio team. The Bulls finished the season with three straight wins for the first time as an FBS program. In addition, UB's six losses were by a total of 29 points, including two one-point losses and a three-point, seven-overtime loss.

In 2016, Leipold led a very young squad, featuring 42 new players. The Bulls were the fourth most inexperienced team in the nation. Buffalo earned impressive wins over Army (a bowl team) and Akron. Buffalo had four players named to the All-MAC team.

In 2015, his first with the Bulls, Leipold led UB to a 5-7 mark. He became the first UB head coach to win five games in his first season since Bob Deming went 6-3 in 1969.

Included in the Bulls five wins was a victory at Florida Atlantic - Buffalo's first non-conference road win since the 2009 season. The Bulls won three road games in 2015 - the most in UB's FBS era (since 1999).

The Bulls had five players named to the All-MAC football team in 2015, led by tight end Matt Weiser who was also named an Academic All-American – becoming the first UB football player in the modern era to earn the distinction. Leipold was named the 25th head coach in the history of the Buffalo football program on December 1, 2014.

Leipold came to UB from Wisconsin-Whitewater where he compiled an astounding 109-6 record and won six Division III National Championships over his eight seasons. A six-time National Coach of the Year, Leipold reached 100 career victories faster than any other coach in NCAA history – at any level.

Leipold has gathered multiple honors from as many as five football-related organizations. He earned his sixth American Football Coaches Association Division III Coach of the Year award in 2014. He has won the award more times than any active coach at any level. He passed the late Joe Paterno, who was a five-time recipient of the award.

In his first season as head coach at Whitewater, The Warhawks went 14-1 and won the national title. He led the Warhawks back to the national championship game in 2008, but they lost to Mount Union, 31-26. Wisconsin-Whitewater went 15-0, winning the national championship in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and won 46 straight games over that span. Following a 7-3 season in 2012, UWW went a perfect 15-0 and won the national championship in 2013 and followed with another perfect 15-0 season and a national title in 2014.

In Division III, where athletic scholarships aren't a part of the game, Leipold was able to recruit top-notch talent to the campus in southeastern Wisconsin. During his tenure, running back Justin Beaver earned the Gagliardi Trophy as the top player in Division III. Brent Allen earned the Division III Rimington Award as the top center. Jeff Schebler was the first recipient of the Fred Mitchell Award, given to the top placekicker in Division II or III. Tailback Levell Coppage earned D3football.com Offensive Player of the Year accolades, and Cole Klotz was selected D3football.com Defensive Player of the Year. Defensive back Jared Kiesow was named an NCAA Elite 88 Award winner. The Warhawks have piled up 56 All-America honors under Leipold's tutelage.

A native of Jefferson, WI, Leipold began his coaching career at Wisconsin-Whitewater in 1987 as a quarterbacks coach and then wide receivers coach. He moved to the University of Wisconsin from 1991-93 as a graduate assistant and helped the Badgers to a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl appearance in 1993.

As an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha from 1994-2000, Leipold helped turn the Mavericks from a 1-10 team in 1994 into three-time North Central Conference champions during his tenure. After being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2000, he moved on to the University of Nebraska, where he served for three seasons under current Ohio head coach Frank Solich. He was on the same staff as former UB head coach Turner Gill. The Cornhuskers competed in the national championship game in 2001 and earned bowl bids in 2002 and 2003.

He returned to Nebraska-Omaha to serve as associate head coach and offensive coordinator from 2004-06. The Mavericks finished 8-3 and won the conference championship each of his three seasons.

Leipold is a 1987 graduate of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he was a standout quarterback for the Warhawks. He ranks second in school history in career pass attempts (647), fourth in yards (4,277), sixth in completions (303) and tied for 10th with 27 touchdowns. He was inducted into the Whitewater Hall of Fame in 2003. He was inducted into the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2018.

He is a member of the AFCA Ethics Committee as well as the AFCA Board of Trustees.

Leipold and his wife, Kelly, have a daughter, Lindsey, and a son, Landon. His daughter, Lindsey plays volleyball at Stetson University.

In response to the social justice issues across the nation, University at Buffalo Director of Athletics Mark Alnutt announced the formation of the task force, devoted to creating synergies amongst the department in a collaborative effort with UB student-athletes and staff.

"I am honored to work with this group and want to thank them for their commitment to bettering our department, University and community," said Alnutt. "As one of our core values in our Athletic Department, we are committed to sustaining a culture of diversity and inclusion across all dimensions, and we proudly

embrace and promote equality for all. Through sports, we have an amazing platform and will work together to discuss, educate, plan and implement action items while creating a more inclusive and tolerant community."

Every sport is represented on the task force and staff includes members from a wide variety of subsets that make up the department. The group is charged with identifying areas of priority and helping to perpetuate positive change for the UB athletics department, University campus and the Western New York community. The task force will aim to align its actions and programming with that of the department's existing mission statement to promote and embrace the diversity of student-athletes, coaches and administrators.

"I am grateful to be chosen to be a part of this special task force," said women's basketball redshirtsenior forward Summer Hemphill. "I look forward to learning from others in the group and hearing their stories and outlook on current events. I want to lay the foundation for the underclassmen and future Bulls to continue to take a stand for what is right and use their voice to affect change."

The group realizes the issues affecting communities nationwide are in a constant state of flux and while the vision of the task force is still evolving, several areas have been identified as starting points, including social injustice, systemic racism, racial inequality, voter education and community involvement.



University History

Here is how the years add up to something big.

Through a steady succession of big ideas, big ventures and big achievements, UB has advanced dramatically over the past century and a half. Starting in 1846 as a small, private medical school, we've grown to become the largest institution in the State University of New York system, and we're charging toward world renown as a top-rated public research university. Our history is proud and prodigious—just like UB itself.

Through continual growth

First was medicine, then pharmacy, followed by law and dentistry: UB in its earliest days was a series of professional schools. The creation of the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) in 1913 made the university all the richer with its focus on the arts and humanities, natural sciences and social sciences. Students today can choose from 13 schools and colleges, of which CAS is the largest, with 27 departments.

By breaking new ground

As UB has evolved through the decades, so has our physical presence. The original downtown medical school moved north in 1953 to join the largely E.B. Green-designed Main Street Campus (now the South Campus). Land for the North Campus in suburban Amherst was purchased in 1964. Our newest campus, in downtown Buffalo, has brought the medical school full circle, this time to anchor the city's first academic medical center.

UB has presidential connections! Millard Fillmore, a lawyer and congressman, was named UB's first chancellor in 1846. Still acting in that capacity, he was sworn in as 13th president of the United States on July 10, 1850.

Through pioneering progress

Major discoveries are nothing new to UB. From the invention of the implantable cardiac pacemaker to the sequencing of the genome of a common coffee plant, our history is one of continual breakthroughs and innovations by big thinkers in relentless pursuit of answers. Over the years, UB faculty have won the Nobel Prize, the Pulitzer Prize, the National Book Award, the National Medal of Science and the National Medal of Technology.


