## STORYLINES

- Akron leads the all-time series, 11-8.
- The Bulls have won eight of the last 11 meetings with the Zips, including six straight at UB Stadium.
- Buffalo is ranked 24th in the latest AP Poll, marking the first time in program history UB is nationally ranked.
- The Bulls are looking to start 5-0 in MAC play for the third time in program history. They started 6-0 in 2018 and 5-0 in 2013.
- **Jaret Patterson** is 80 yards shy of 1,000 on the season. If he does it against Akron, he would tie the NCAA record for earliest game reaching 1,000 yards (5 games), joining the likes of Marcus Allen, Barry Sanders and Ricky Williams. He would be the 12th player in FBS history to accomplish the feat.
- **Jaret Patterson** rushed for 710 yards and 12 touchdowns over the last two games - both FBS records for consecutive games.
- The Bulls have not allowed a sack on the season and now haven't allowed a sack in eight straight games dating back to last year.
- The Bulls are averaging 50.8 points on the season to lead the nation in scoring average. They have scored 40+ points in eight of their last nine conference games dating back to last season.
- **Jaret Patterson's** next rushing touchdown will be the 50th of his career, making him just the seventh player in MAC history to rush for 50 touchdowns.

In 2016 and 2017, players were chosen by the coaching staff to wear "41" for the entire year. Cornerback Boise Ross wore it for the 2016 season, while linebacker Jarrett Franklin wore it in 2017.

This is the third season the coaching staff will rotate #41 on a weekly basis.

Solomon Jackson passed away unexpectedly following an offseason workout on February 29, 2016. Jackson, respected and beloved by his teammates, played both linebacker and defensive end over his career. The slogan ALL41 is a prominent fixture throughout the Murchie Family Football Center to honor his legacy.

### Bulls Close Regular Season Against Akron on Saturday

The University at Buffalo football team will host Akron on Saturday in their regular season finale. The Bulls are coming off a 70-41 win over Kent State on November 28. The Bulls were led by running back **Jaret Patterson** who rushed for a MAC-record 409 yards and eight touchdowns against the Flashes.

Akron is coming off a 31-3 win over Bowling Green last Saturday. The Zips are led by running back Teon Dollard who has rushed for 641 yards and six touchdowns on the season.

Akron leads the all-time series, 11-8. The Bulls won the last meeting, 21-0, at Akron last season.

### Running Down a Dream

The Bulls rushed for a school-record 515 yards in their win over Kent State. UB also set a school and MAC record with 10 rushing touchdowns, breaking the previous record of seven and nine, respectively.

**Jaret Patterson** (409) and **Kevin Marks** (97) combined to rush for 506 yards, the most ever by a duo in a FBS football game. It broke the record was 504 yards set by Ball State's McQuale Lewis and Cory Sykes in 2009.

### Jaret Patterson Appreciation Note

Running back **Jaret Patterson** is posting historic numbers this season. Here are a few of note.

- Rushed for 409 yards against Kent State - the second most in FBS history.
- Tied the FBS record with eight rushing touchdowns against Kent State
- Rushed for 710 yards over the last two games - the most ever in consecutive games in FBS history.
- Leads the nation in rushing average (230 ypg) and is fifth in total yardage (920) after four games.
- His 16 rushing touchdowns are second in the nation and are tied for second in school history for a single season. He holds the record with 19 set last year.
- Over the last 10 games, Patterson has rushed for 2,033 yards and 31 touchdowns.
- Four games into his junior season, Patterson already holds the school record for career rushing touchdowns (49) - 15 more than second place James Starks.

### This is 40

After scoring 70 points against Kent State (the most by a UB team in its FBS era), the Bulls are averaging 50.8 points per game - tops in the nation. UB has scored 40+ points in each of the first four games of the season for the

first time in program history. It is also the first time they have ever scored 40+ points in their first four MAC games. The Bulls have now scored 40 or more points in eight of their last nine conference games dating back to last season.

### Second Half Adjustments

The third quarter has been the best quarter for the Bulls this season. UB has outscored its opponents 70-7 in the third quarter so far this season. The Bulls scored at least 14 third-quarter points in each of their first four games. In fact, in Buffalo's win over Miami (OH), the Bulls scored on its first four possessions of the second half, with scoring drives of 81, 82, 62 and 84 yards.

### Koonce Invited to Senior Bowl

Senior defensive end **Malcolm Koonce** has accepted an invitation to the Reese's Senior Bowl. He will be the fourth player in school history to play in the prestigious all-star game, joining DT Gerry Philbin (1964), WR Anthony Johnson (2019) and QB Tyree Jackson (2019).

A first-team All-MAC selection in 2019 after leading the conference in sacks, Koonce has 22 tackles, five tackles for loss and four sacks through three games this season.

With 17 career sacks, Koonce currently ranks seventh in school history.

### National Team of the Week

Following their 70-41 win over Kent State, Buffalo was named the Reveal Suits National Team of the Week by the FWAA on Nov. 30. It was the first MAC school to win it since Sept. 16, 2017, when Northern Illinois won at Nebraska.

The 70 points scored were the most by a UB team since joining the FBS ranks in 1999. The Bulls rushed for a school-record 515 yards, and broke the MAC record with 10 rushing touchdowns against the Golden Flashes.

### Excelling in the Red Zone

The Bulls have been in the red zone 18 times this season and have scored 17 touchdowns. A turnover on downs against Bowling Green was the only time they didn't score once in the red zone. Of their 17 scores, 15 have been rushing touchdowns.

### Building a Consistent Winner

Head Coach Lance Leipold has been able to build a consistent winning program since being hired prior to the 2015 season. The Bulls have won 28 games since the start of the 2017 season - going 6-6 in 2017, 10-4 in 2018 and 8-5 last year. The 28 wins are the most by any MAC team since the start of the 2017 campaign.

### Big Play Bulls

The Bulls have used big plays to find the endzone so far this season. They have scored 10 touchdowns of 40 yards or more. Against Miami (OH), **Kyle Vantrease** had a 78-yard touchdown pass to **Trevor Wilson** and an 82-yard touchdown pass to **Antonio Nunn**. It marked the first time in UB's FBS era (since 1999) that it had two touchdown passes of 78 or more yards in the same game.

Running back **Jaret Patterson** has touchdown runs of 42, 49, 56, 57 and 58 yards this season.

Long touchdown plays aren't limited to the offense as the Bulls scored on a 42-yard and 46-yard fumble recovery and a 65-yard pick six in the opener at Northern Illinois.

### Mr. 3,000

Against Miami (OH) on Nov. 10, running back **Jaret Patterson** went over 3,000 yards for his career, becoming the fastest player in school history to reach the milestone (29 games). He is currently second in school history in career rushing yards. Patterson needed 138

### Breakout Game for Vantrease

**Kyle Vantrease** had the best game of his career against Miami (OH) on Nov. 10. The junior signal-caller threw for 353 yards and four touchdowns against the RedHawks - both career highs. He was perfect in the second half, going 9-for-9 for 229 yards and three touchdowns. He had touchdown passes of 82, 78, 25 and 5 yards. His previous longest career pass was a 61 yarder against Ohio last season.

Vantrease was the first UB quarterback to throw for 300 yards in a game since Tyree Jackson posted 358 yards passing against Miami (OH) in 2018.

Vantrease is 36 for 57 for 605 yards with five touchdowns and one interception on the season.

### Nunn Better

Senior wide receiver **Antonio Nunn** continues to develop into one of the best receivers in the Mid-American Conference. He is averaging 87 yards per game.

Nunn posted 100-yard performances in each of his first two games. He had six catches for 102 yards and a touchdown at Northern Illinois and five catch-

es for 137 yards and a score against Miami.

Nunn has recorded at least two catches in 14 straight games and has at least four grabs in six of the last seven games.

### Taking Matters into their Own Hands

UB scored three defensive touchdowns in its 49-30 win at Northern Illinois on Wednesday. **Tim Terry** returned a fumble 46 yards for the first defensive score. On the Huskies very next possession, **Isaiah King** scooped up another fumble and dashed 42 yards for a touchdown. **Kadofi Wright** added a 65-yard pick six for the Bulls' third defensive score.

It was the first time the Bulls scored three defensive touchdowns in a game since 2015 when the defense also scored three times at FAU.

With three defensive touchdowns in the opener UB was already tied for first in the nation in defensive touchdowns.

### Record-Breaking Night for Patterson

**Jaret Patterson** scored two rushing touchdowns in the opener at Northern Illinois to bring his career total to 35, breaking the school record for career rushing touchdowns. He broke the record of former All-MAC running back James Starks who rushed for 34 scores from 2006-08.

What's more impressive about Patterson's record is how quickly he got there. Patterson scored his 35th touchdown in only his 28th career game. Starks rushed for his 34th career touchdown in his 36th career game and Branden Oliver, UB's all-time leader rusher, scored his 33rd touchdown in his 40th game.

Patterson leads the MAC with 16 rushing touchdowns to bring his career total to 49. He currently ranks eighth in MAC

history in career rushing touchdowns.

### Wright Place, Wright Time

Senior linebacker **Kadofi Wright** scored on a 65-yard interception return against Northern Illinois. It was his third career defensive score that have all come over the last two seasons. Wright forced and recovered a fumble for a touchdown at Akron on Oct. 19, 2019 and then, a week later, scored on a 40-yard interception return against Central Michigan. Wright was an All-MAC Second Team selection last season.

### On Your Marks

While **Jaret Patterson** got most of the headlines last season, running back **Kevin Marks** also had a breakout season for the Bulls in 2019. As a sophomore, The Virginia native rushed for a career-best 1,035 yards and eight touchdowns last year. It marked the first time in school history the Bulls had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season. Marks had a rushing touchdown in each of the last six games of the regular season.

Marks has eight career 100-yard rushing games, including a 109-yard performance against Miami on Nov. 10.

Marks joins Patterson on the Doak Walker Award watch list. Buffalo is one of just nine schools in the country to have multiple candidates on the Doak Walker list.

### Movement on the Offensive Line

The Bulls replaced three starters on the offensive line, but fortunately they have experienced players ready to move into starting roles. The Bulls replaced LT Evin Ksiezarczyk, RG Tomas Jack-Kurdyla and LG Paul Nosworthy. Ksiezarczyk and Nosworthy were All-MAC selections.

**Kayode Awosika** was the starting

right tackle for the past two seasons and has made the move to left tackle in 2020. An All-MAC Second Team selection in 2019, Awosika is on the Outland Trophy watch list.

**Mike Novitsky** started all 13 games at center last season and is on the 2020 Rimington Trophy watch list.

**Jake Fuzak** will start at right tackle. He started the final two games of the 2019 season as well.

**Jacob Gall** started the final five games at right guard in 2018 and had one start in 2019. He has been starting at left guard this season.

Senior **Jack Klenk** is a first-year starter at right guard. Sophomore **Gabe Wallace** and graduate transfer **Ray Thomas-Ishman** have also been in the rotation at guard.

Last season, UB's line blocked for an offense that rushed for a school-record 3,256 yards and allowed a program-low eight sacks, second fewest in the country.

This season the Bulls are averaging 328.5 yards rushing and have yet to allow a sack.

### International Flavor

The Bulls have five international players from three different countries on this year's roster.

Buffalo has three players who hail from Canada, including **Dominic Johnson** (Ontario), **Cole Burniston** (Ontario) and **Gabe Wallace** (BC). In addition, the Bulls have two players from Europe, **Alain Schaerer** (Switzerland) and **Jordan Avissey** (France).

## Last Meeting

Buffalo 21, Akron 0

Oct. 19, 2019 • InfoCision Stadium • Akron, OH

**AKRON, OH** – The University at Buffalo football team produced one of its finest defensive efforts in recent history, shutting out Akron, 21-0, at InfoCision Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It was just the Bulls' second ever road shutout against a Mid-American Conference opponent since joining the conference in 1999.

Buffalo scored two defensive touchdowns, forced four turnovers, had 11 tackles for loss, five sacks and held the Zips to just three yards rushing.

On their opening possession, the Bulls marched 75 yards on 14 plays and took a 7-0 lead on a two-yard touchdown run by Kevin Marks midway through the first quarter. It would be all the offense Buffalo would need as the defense took over from there.

UB's 7-0 lead would last until late in the third quarter when Taylor Riggins blitzed off the edge, sacked the Akron quarterback and jarred the ball free. Ledarius Mack scooped up the loose change and scampered 35 yards for the touchdown, giving the Bulls a 14-0 advantage.

Kadofi Wright scored the defense's second touchdown of the game midway through the fourth quarter. The junior linebacker sacked the Akron quarterback, forced a fumble and fell on the loose ball in the endzone for the score.

"I was really impressed with the way our defense flew around today," head coach Lance Leipold said. "We thought we had some good matchups up front and, with some pressure, we thought we could make some things happen and they did today."

The Bulls rushed for 189 yards in the game, led by Jaret Patterson's 88 yards on 17 carries. Marks finished with 71 yards on 19 carries and a touchdown.

Quarterback Kyle Vantrease, a native of Stow, OH, just eight miles from the Akron campus, had good command of the offense, finishing 14-of-23 for 65 yards. His favorite target was Daniel Lee who had a career-high six catches for 30 yards.

But this game was all about the UB defense. Wright finished with five tackles, two sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Mack had three tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Joey Banks had five tackles, including two tackles for loss. Wankeith Akin, Jr. sealed the win with his first career interception.

## HEAD COACH LANCE LEIPOLD

Now in his sixth season, head coach Lance Leipold continues to build the Buffalo football program into a consistent winner.

Leipold led Buffalo to its first ever bowl win in 2019, defeating Charlotte, 31-9, in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl. UB finished the 2019 campaign with a record of 8-5, its third straight season of bowl edibility and second straight bowl berth, both program firsts. Two of Buffalo's four bowl berths in school history have come with Leipold at the helm.

Buffalo had a school-record 12 players named All-MAC in 2019, including running back Jaret Patterson who rushed for a school-record 1,799 yards and 19 touchdowns. The UB offense was paced by a rushing attack that has rolled up a program-best 3,256 yards on the ground. Running back Kevin Marks also rushed for 1,035 yards on the year, giving the Bulls two 1,000-yard running backs in the same season for the first time in school history.

The defense in 2019 was one of the best in program history. The Bulls ranked seventh nationally in total defense, allowing 291.9 yards per game and fourth nationally against the run, allowing 94.2 yards per game.

Leipold led the Bulls to a school-record 10-win campaign in 2018. The 10 wins, included a program-best 7-1 record in the Mid-American Conference, a MAC East Division title and the school's second trip to the MAC Championship game. Among the Bulls non-conference victories in 2018, included a 42-13 win at Rutgers, for the school's first-ever win over a Power 5 opponent. The Bulls earned an invitation to the 2018 Dollar General Bowl for just their third bowl game berth in program history.

Leipold was named the 2018 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, presented yearly by the Maxwell Football Club.

Buffalo had the finest offensive campaign in school history in 2018. The Bulls scored 484 points, 64 touchdowns and rolled up 5,803 yards of total offense on the season - all school records. Quarterback Tyree Jackson was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year - the first UB player to ever win the award. Running back Jaret Patterson was named the MAC Freshman of the Year after becoming the first freshman in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. The Bulls had a school-record 10 players named to the All-MAC team, including six on the first team.

In 2017, he guided the Bulls to a 6-6 record and bowl eligibility for just the third time as an FBS program. The six wins were the fourth most in a season since the Bulls made the move to the FBS ranks in 1999.

The Bulls featured an explosive offense in 2017 that ranked second in the Mid-American Conference, averaging 432 yards per game and led the MAC with 291 passing yards per outing. UB's 5,183 yards of total offense were the third most in school history for a single season. The Bulls produced 20 plays of 45 yards or more and those 20 plays came from 10 different players.

Buffalo posted key wins against Conference USA Champion Florida Atlantic as well as a nine-win Ohio team. The Bulls finished the season with three straight wins for the first time as an FBS program. In addition, UB's six losses were by a total of 29 points, including two one-point losses and a three-point, seven-overtime loss.

In 2016, Leipold led a very young squad, featuring 42 new players. The Bulls were the fourth most inexperienced team in the nation. Buffalo earned impressive wins over Army (a bowl team) and Akron. Buffalo had four players named to the All-MAC team.

In 2015, his first with the Bulls, Leipold led UB to a 5-7 mark. He became the first UB head coach to win five games in his first season since Bob Deming went 6-3 in 1969.

Included in the Bulls five wins was a victory at Florida Atlantic - Buffalo's first non-conference road win since the 2009 season. The Bulls won three road games in 2015 - the most in UB's FBS era (since 1999).

The Bulls had five players named to the All-MAC football team in 2015, led by tight end Matt Weiser who was also named an Academic All-American - becoming the first UB football player in the modern era to earn the distinction. Leipold was named the 25th head coach in the history of the Buffalo football program on December 1, 2014.

Leipold came to UB from Wisconsin-Whitewater where he compiled an astounding 109-6 record and won six Division III National Championships over his eight seasons. A six-time National Coach of the Year, Leipold reached 100 career victories faster than any other coach in NCAA history - at any level.

Leipold has gathered multiple honors from as many as five football-related organizations. He earned his sixth American Football Coaches Association Division III Coach of the Year award in 2014. He has won the award more times than any active coach at any level. He passed the late Joe Paterno, who was a five-time recipient of the award.

In his first season as head coach at Whitewater, The Warhawks went 14-1 and won the national title. He led the Warhawks back to the national championship game in 2008, but they lost to Mount Union, 31-26. Wisconsin-Whitewater went 15-0, winning the national championship in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and won 46 straight games over that span. Following a 7-3 season in 2012, UWW went a perfect 15-0 and won the national championship in 2013 and followed with another perfect 15-0 season and a national title in 2014.

In Division III, where athletic scholarships aren't a part of the game, Leipold was able to recruit top-notch talent to the campus in southeastern Wisconsin. During his tenure, running back Justin Beaver earned the Gagliardi Trophy as the top player in Division III. Brent Allen earned the Division III Rimington Award as the top center. Jeff Schebler was the first recipient of the Fred Mitchell Award, given to the top placekicker in Division II or III. Tailback Levell Coppage earned D3football.com Offensive Player of the Year accolades, and Cole Klotz was selected D3football.com Defensive Player of the Year. Defensive back Jared Kiesow was named an NCAA Elite 88 Award winner. The Warhawks have piled up 56 All-America honors under Leipold's tutelage.

A native of Jefferson, WI, Leipold began his coaching career at Wisconsin-Whitewater in 1987 as a quarterbacks coach and then wide receivers coach. He moved to the University of Wisconsin from 1991-93 as a graduate assistant and helped the Badgers to a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl appearance in 1993.

As an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha from 1994-2000, Leipold helped turn the Mavericks from a 1-10 team in 1994 into three-time North Central Conference champions during his tenure. After being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2000, he moved on to the University of Nebraska, where he served for three seasons under current Ohio head coach Frank Solich. He was on the same staff as former UB head coach Turner Gill. The Cornhuskers competed in the national championship game in 2001 and earned bowl bids in 2002 and 2003.

He returned to Nebraska-Omaha to serve as associate head coach and offensive coordinator from 2004-06. The Mavericks finished 8-3 and won the conference championship each of his three seasons.

Leipold is a 1987 graduate of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he was a standout quarterback for the Warhawks. He ranks second in school history in career pass attempts (647), fourth in yards (4,277), sixth in completions (303) and tied for 10th with 27 touchdowns. He was inducted into the Whitewater Hall of Fame in 2003. He was inducted into the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2018.

He is a member of the AFCA Ethics Committee as well as the AFCA Board of Trustees.

Leipold and his wife, Kelly, have a daughter, Lindsey, and a son, Landon. His daughter, Lindsey plays volleyball at Stetson University.

### BUFFALO 49 , NORTHERN ILLINOIS 30

NOV. 4, 2020 • Huskie Stadium • DeKalb, IL

DEKALB, IL - The University at Buffalo football team scored three defensive touchdowns and forced five turnovers in a 49-30 win at Northern Illinois on Wednesday night in the season opener for both programs. It was the Bulls' first win against Northern Illinois since joining the Mid-American Conference in 1999, snapping an 11-game losing streak to the Huskies.

Early on, it looked like it was going to be an easy win as UB marched right down the field on its first possession and scored the game's first touchdown on a 5-yard run by Jaret Patterson less than three minutes into the game. A 17-yard touchdown pass from Kyle Vantrease to Antonio Nunn put the Bulls ahead, 14-3, after the first quarter.

Taking advantage of a short field, Northern Illinois was able to cut the lead to 14-10 early in the second quarter. However, Patterson struck again, this time on a 56-yard TD run, to put the Bulls up 21-10 with just over two minutes left in the half. The Huskies were able to score a touchdown late in the second quarter to cut the UB advantage to 21-16 at the break.

The UB defense was able to put the game away in the third quarter. First, linebacker Tim Terry scooped up a fumble by NIU quarterback Ross Bowers and dashed 46 yards for the score. On the Huskies' very next possession, James Patterson laid a big hit on NIU running back Erin Collins. He jarred the ball loose and it bounced right into the hands of Isaiah King who darted 42 yards for another UB touchdown. Suddenly, UB led 35-16 midway through the third quarter.

After Vantrease scored on a 4-yard run, less than two minutes later, to put the Bulls ahead, 42-16, Kadofi Wright cemented the victory with a 65-yard pick six early in the fourth quarter.

"It's always good to get a win on the road," head coach Lance Leipold said. "I thought we created some big plays when we needed them. The play of the defense in the third quarter really turned the tide for us. I'm really proud of them for making those plays."

The three defensive scores were the most by a UB team since having three defensive touchdowns at FAU in 2015.

It was a record-breaking night for Patterson who finished the game with 137 yards on 20 carries. His second touchdown of the game was the 35th rushing TD of his career, breaking the school record of 34 previously held by James Starks.

Antonio Nunn also had a big game for the Bulls, finishing with 102 yards and a touchdown on six receptions.

Malcolm Koonce led the defense with eight tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack. James Patterson also had eight tackles and a forced fumble. Cory Gross, Jr. and Tyree Thompson each had seven tackles for the Bulls.

The 49 points scored by the Bulls were the most by a UB team in a MAC road game since joining the conference in 1999.

### BUFFALO 42, MIAMI (OH) 10

BUFFALO, NY - Kyle Vantrease threw for a career-high 353 yards and four touchdowns to lead the University at Buffalo football team to a 42-10 win over Miami (OH) on Tuesday night. The junior quarterback led an offensive attack that rolled up 558 yards of total offense against the defending MAC champions.

It was a defensive struggle early on as neither team scored in the first quarter. The RedHawks defense blinked first as Kevin Marks ripped off a 30-yard run early in the second quarter that gave the Bulls a first down at the Miami 12-yard line. Jaret Patterson capped the drive with a 2-yard touchdown run to give UB a 7-0 lead.

Less than two minutes later, UB struck again when Vantrease hit Trevor Wilson in stride for a 78-yard touchdown pass to put the Bulls ahead 14-0. Wilson had the best game of his young career, finishing with 103 yards receiving and a score.

Miami scored late in the second quarter to cut the UB lead to 14-7 at the break.

The second half was all UB as the Bulls scored on each of their first four possessions of the second half to put the game on ice. Patterson started the scoring on a 1-yard touchdown run in to make the score 21-7.

The Bulls mounted a seven-play, 82-yard drive on their next possession and took a 28-7 lead when Vantrease connected with Zac Lefebvre on a 25-yard touchdown pass.

Jovany Ruiz caught his first career touchdown late in the third quarter on a 5-yard pass from Vantrease. Ruiz, seeing the most playing time of his career, finished the game with three catches for 27 yards.

Antonio Nunn capped the scoring with an 82-yard pass from Vantrease early in the fourth quarter. It was another standout performance for Nunn who finished with a career-high 137 receiving yards on five catches. It was the senior wide out's second straight 100-yard receiving game.

Vantrease finished the game 17-of-27 for 353 yards and four touchdowns. The junior signal-caller was a perfect 9-for-9 for 229 yards and three touchdowns in the second half alone.

Marks led the rushing attack with 109 yards on 16 carries. Patterson added 73 yards and two scores on the ground.

Defensively, the Bulls held Miami (OH) to 258 yards of total offense. Roy Baker had his first career interception in the game. Logic Hudgens and Malcolm Koonce led the Bulls with five tackles, apiece. Kadofi Wright had two tackles, a tackle for loss and two pass breakups in the game.

"Tonight we were able to create a lot of big plays in the passing game," head coach Lance Leipold said. "The job of our offensive line was outstanding. I thought Kyle played great in the second half. Kevin Marks was another guys that made a difference with his running, especially in the second quarter."

BOWLING GREEN, OH – Jaret Patterson rushed for a school-record 301 yards and scored four touchdowns to help lead the University at Buffalo football team to a 42-17 win at Bowling Green on Tuesday night. Patterson broke his own record of 298 yards on the ground set against the Falcons last season.

A week after airing it out for a win over Miami (OH), the Bulls went back to their lethal run game to get the job done tonight. The Bulls rushed for a season-high 396 yards which was 12 yards more than their first two games combined. Kevin Marks also had a strong performance on the ground, rushing for 90 yards and a scored on 15 carries.

It didn't take long for the Bulls to get on the board as they took their opening possession and marched 74 yards on seven plays and took a 7-0 lead on Patterson's first touchdown of the game, a 17-yard run up the middle.

Bowling Green responded with a 40-yard field goal on their first possession to cut the lead to 7-3. But four straight rushing touchdowns by the Bulls extended their lead to 35-3 late in the third quarter.

Marks scored on a three-yard run, early in the second quarter, to make the score 14-3. Patterson punched it in from four yards out, late in the second quarter, to extend the UB advantage to 21-3 at the half.

Patterson's third touchdown came on a 15-yard run with six minutes to go in the third quarter to put the Bulls ahead, 28-3. On the Bulls next possession, quarterback Kyle Vantrease called his own number and scored on a six-yard run to up the advantage to 35-3.

Patterson but an explanation point on the win and broke the single-game school rushing record with a 57-yard run with just over two minutes left in the game.

The Bulls didn't need to pass the ball much as Vantrease finished 7-of-12 for 74 yards. Once again Antonio Nunn was his favorite target as the senior wide out finished with six catches for 70 yards.

Defensively the Bulls were led by James Patterson who finished with a career-high 13 tackles and added a pass breakup. Cory Gross also had a career high in tackles with 10. Malcolm Koonce had two of the Bulls' four sacks in the game. Marcus Fuqua recorded his first career interception in the third quarter.

"It's always good to get a road win," head coach Lance Leipold said. "I was really pleased with our offensive performance, especially running the football. Jaret and Kevin played well as did the guys up front. It's good to be 3-0. But, our guys have a standard that they expect to play at and I don't they reached that tonight. But when you can win when you didn't play your best, that's a good sign."

Patterson's 301 rushing yards tied for 12th in Mid-American Conference history for a single game. He also moved into second place in school history in career rushing, passing James Starks with 3,323 yards.

BUFFALO, NY – Jaret Patterson rushed for a record 409 yards and eight touchdowns to help lead the University at Buffalo football team to a 70-41 win over Kent State at UB Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The 409 yards were a Mid-American Conference record and his eight rushing touchdowns tied an NCAA record for single game.

Patterson's game came on the heels of his 301-yard, four touchdown performance at Bowling Green in UB's last outing. Through four games, the junior running back has rushed for 920 yards and 16 touchdowns.

Patterson broke off a 62-yard run on the first play from scrimmage to set the tone. He scored the first of his eight touchdowns on a three-yard just one play later. He scored on a 31-yard run on UB's next possession and added a 42-yard TD scamper with 21 seconds left in the first quarter. He had a 49-yard TD run early in the second quarter and scored his fifth TD of the game on a 1-yard plunge with just over two minutes left in the half. Patterson rushed for 267 yards and five touchdowns in the first half alone.

Patterson added a 7-yard touchdown early in the third quarter and scored on a 58-yard dash in the fourth quarter to tie Illinois' Howard Griffith for the NCAA record set in 1990.

Aside from Patterson's heroics, the Bulls needed a full team effort to defeat the 3-0 Golden Flashes. The Bulls never trailed in the game, but Kent State's high-powered offense kept them in the contest for much of the afternoon. In fact, the Golden Flashes scored on their first possession of the second half to cut the UB lead to 35-31. However, the Bulls had an answer for every Kent State threat and the UB defense stepped up when it needed to.

After Kevin Marks scored on a 7-yard run to put the Bulls ahead, 49-31, Cory Gross Jr. picked off Dustin Crum to give the ball right back to the Bulls. Patterson scored six plays later to extend the UB advantage to 56-31 early in the fourth quarter and deflate the Flashes.

Buffalo rushed for a program-record 515 yards in the game. Marks added 97 yards and two rushing touchdowns. The 10 total rushing touchdowns were also a school record.

Quarterback Kyle Vantrease was efficient, throwing for 148 yards. Jovany Ruiz had a career-high four catches for 49 yards. Dominic Johnson added three grabs.

Defensively, James Patterson had a game-high 13 tackles. Tyrone Hill added 10 tackles and two pass breakups. Malcolm Koonce recorded his fourth sack of the season.

The 70 points were the most scored by a UB team in its FBS era (since 1999), topping its previous best of 68 points scored in a seven-overtime game against Western Michigan in 2017.

Every sport is represented on the task force and staff includes members from a wide variety of subsets that make up the department. The group is charged with identifying areas of priority and helping to perpetuate positive change for the UB athletics department, University campus and the Western New York community. The task force will aim to align its actions and programming with that of the department's existing mission statement to promote and embrace the diversity of student-athletes, coaches and administrators.

"I am grateful to be chosen to be a part of this special task force," said women's basketball redshirt-senior forward Summer Hemphill. "I look forward to learning from others in the group and hearing their stories and outlook on current events. I want to lay the foundation for the underclassmen and future Bulls to continue to take a stand for what is right and use their voice to affect change."

The group realizes the issues affecting communities nationwide are in a constant state of flux and while the vision of the task force is still evolving, several areas have been identified as starting points, including social injustice, systemic racism, racial inequality, voter education and community involvement.



# University History

## Here is how the years add up to something big.

Through a steady succession of big ideas, big ventures and big achievements, UB has advanced dramatically over the past century and a half. Starting in 1846 as a small, private medical school, we've grown to become the largest institution in the State University of New York system, and we're charging toward world renown as a top-rated public research university. Our history is proud and prodigious—just like UB itself.

### Through continual growth

**1** First was medicine, then pharmacy, followed by law and dentistry: UB in its earliest days was a series of professional schools. The creation of the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) in 1913 made the university all the richer with its focus on the arts and humanities, natural sciences and social sciences. Students today can choose from 13 schools and colleges, of which CAS is the largest, with 27 departments.

### By breaking new ground

**2** As UB has evolved through the decades, so has our physical presence. The original downtown medical school moved north in 1953 to join the largely E.B. Green-designed Main Street Campus (now the South Campus). Land for the North Campus in suburban Amherst was purchased in 1964. Our newest campus, in downtown Buffalo, has brought the medical school full circle, this time to anchor the city's first academic medical center.

2013: Ground is broken in downtown Buffalo for the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences

### DID YOU KNOW?

UB has presidential connections! Millard Fillmore, a lawyer and congressman, was named UB's first chancellor in 1846. Still acting in that capacity, he was sworn in as 13th president of the United States on July 10, 1850.

The University at Buffalo has been a member of the prestigious Association of American Universities since 1989.

**3** Major discoveries are nothing new to UB.
