STORYLINES

- Since the Bulls joined the MAC in 1999, Buffalo and Kent State have played 20 times and have split the series, 10-10.
- This will be just the fourth home game of the season for the Bulls.
- A win would make the Bulls bowl eligible for the seventh time in program history and the fifth time in the last six seasons. UB played in bowl games in 2008, 2013, 2018, 2019 and 2020.
- Linebacker **Shaun Dolac** leads the nation in solo tackles with 77, eight more than any other player. He has the second-most single-season solo tackles in program history, trailing only Craig Guest who had 80 in 1996.
- Linebacker **James Patterson** is 11 tackles shy of becoming the fifth player in program history to amass 400 career tackles. He'll join Davonte Shannon (461), Craig Guest (455), Khalil Hodge (421) and Mike Laipple (402).
- Kicker **Alex McNulty's** next field goal will move him into a tie for second place in program history in career field goals. A.J. Principe (2007-10) currently holds the spot with 44.
- Nickelback **Keyshawn Cobb** has forced four turnovers over the last three games. He forced a fumble that was returned for a touchdown against Toledo; had a forced fumble and a pick six at Ohio and forced a fumble which led to a field goal at Central Michigan.
- Running back **Ron Cook** has rushed for 100 yards in two of the last three games.
- This will be a matchup of teams with different offensive play styles. The Bulls lead the MAC in time of possession (33:05), while the fast-paced Flashes rank last in the MAC in time of possession (26:28).

For the past seven seasons, the number 41 jersey has been worn by a different player each game to honor the legacy of former Bull Solomon Jackson who passed away in 2016.

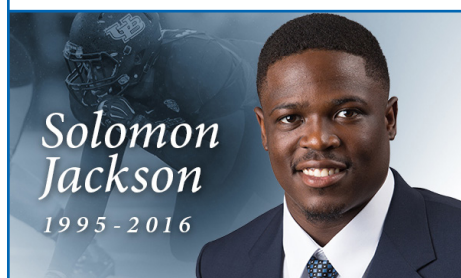
In 2016 and 2017, players were chosen by the coaching staff to wear "41" for the entire year. Cornerback Boise Ross wore it for the 2016 season, while linebacker Jarrett Franklin wore it in 2017.

This is the fifth season the coaching staff with rotate #41 on a weekly basis. It is announced the night before each game.

Solomon Jackson passed away unexpectedly following an offseason workout on February 29, 2016. Jackson, respected and beloved by his teammates, played both linebacker and defensive end over his career. The slogan ALL41 is a prominent fixture throughout the Murchie Family Football Center to honor his legacy.

Bulls Finally Back Home to Host Kent State on Saturday

After playing seven of their first 10 games on the road, and having last week's game postponed, the University at Buffalo football team will host Kent State on Saturday afternoon at UB Stadium.

Buffalo is 5-5 overall, 4-2 in the MAC and is coming off a 31-27 loss at Central Michigan last Wednesday. The Bulls were led by running back **Ron Cook** who rushed for 100 yards and a touchdown against the Chippewas.

Kent State is 4-7 overall, 3-4 in the MAC and is coming off a 31-24 loss to Eastern Michigan last Wednesday. The Golden Flashes are led by running back Marquez Cooper who has rushed for 1,186 yards and 11 touchdowns on the season.

Buffalo leads the all-time series, 14-13. The Flashes won the last meeting, 48-38, at Kent State last season.

Dolac Dominance

Junior linebacker **Shaun Dolac** has put on a tackling clinic in recent weeks. He has registered double-digit tackles in six of the last seven games.

Against Bowling Green, all of his 14 tackles were solo and in the previous game against Miami (OH), 12 of his 14 tackles were solo. He currently leads the nation in solo tackles with 77 and ranks second in the MAC in total tackles with 108.

He was named the MAC East Division Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 3.

Originally a walk-on, Dolac entered the starting lineup late last season. In his 11 total games as a starter, he has averaged 11 tackles per game and totaled 12 tackles for loss.

It was recently announced that Dolac is a semifinalist for the Burlsworth Trophy, an award given annually to the best player in the country who started his career as a walk-on.

McNulty Named Semifinalist for Lou Groza Award

Alex McNulty is having the finest season of any kicker in program history and recently became the first UB kicker named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award. His MAC-best 18 field goals are the most in program history for a single season.

Against Coastal Carolina, he was a

perfect 4-of-4 on field goal attempts, becoming the first UB kicker since A.J. Principe in 2007 to make four field goals in a game.

McNulty kicked a 54-yard field goal at Central Michigan. It was his fourth career 50-yarder. He also kicked a 52-yarder earlier this season against Holy Cross, a 50-yard field against Bowling Green last season, and a school-record 55-yarder against Northern Illinois last year as well.

He is the first Buffalo kicker in its FBS era (since 1999) to make four 50-yard field goals in a career. Gerald Carlson made four 50-yarders in the mid-90s when the Bulls were an FCS program.

McNulty currently ranks third in program history in career field goals (43), first in extra points (156) and career points scored by a kicker (285).

Let Ron Cook

Running back **Ron Cook** seems to be getting stronger as the season progresses. The senior back has enjoyed two of his best career games over the last three outings.

In the Bulls last game against Central Michigan, Cook rushed for 100 yards and a touchdown and added a 39-yard reception.

He was named to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll following his performance against Toledo. Cook touched the ball 25 times three different ways for 233 all-purpose yards and the winning score in the Bulls' 34-27 come-from-behind home win over conference foe Toledo. Cook carried the ball 18 times for 118 yards, including a 30-yard touchdown run mid-fourth quarter. He caught three passes for 40 yards, accounted for nine first downs from scrimmage and returned four kickoffs.

Cook has rushed for 600 yards on the season and has scored four touchdowns. He is also fourth on the team in receiving with 16 catches for 207 yards.

Moving the Chains

Buffalo has run more plays than its opponents in seven of the ten games this season. Against Central Michigan, the Bulls ran 89 plays to the Chippewas' 53 plays (+36). UB ran 40 more plays than Coastal Carolina (93-53) and against Eastern Michigan, UB ran 84 plays to the Eagles' 50 (+34).

Long Way Home

Buffalo has taken the long way to the endzone in each of their first ten games.

The Bulls offense has scored 32 touchdowns on the season and 22 drives have been 69 yards or longer. UB has had touchdown drives of 99, 92, 91, 90, 85, 84, 82, 81, 80, 80, 75, 75, 75, 75, 75, 74, 71, 71, 70, 70 and 69 yards.

Give Me That!

Buffalo forced six turnovers against Toledo - the most by a UB team in its FBS era. The previous record was five set against Central Michigan (2019), Western Michigan (2012), Bowling Green (2010) and Kent State (2006). The Bulls' four interceptions tied an FBS era record as well. UB previously had four interceptions against Central Michigan (2018), Ohio (2015) and Western Michigan (2012).

Buffalo has forced 20 turnovers on the year, eight more than they forced all of last season. The Bulls' lead the MAC with a +7 turnover margin. The program record for turnovers forced in a season is 32 back in the 2008 season.

TDefense

The defense has been taking matters into their own hands in recent weeks as the Bulls have scored a defensive touchdown in three of the last five games.

James Patterson had a 97-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown at Bowling Green, **Jahmin Muse** had a 72-yard fumble recovery against Toledo and **Keyshawn Cobb** had a 26-yard pick six at Ohio.

Big Play Bulls

The Bulls have had a number of different players make big plays on offense this season. Six different Bulls have registered a play of 40 yards or longer. Wide receiver **Jamari Gasset** leads the way with three such plays - a 65, 47 and 44-yard reception. Wide receiver **Justin Marshall** has a 69 and 49-yard TD catch and fellow wideout **Quian Williams** has a pair of 59-yard touchdown receptions. On the ground, **Mike Washington** has a 92-yard TD run, **Al-Jay Henderson** has an 84-yard touchdown run and **Ron Cook** has a 49-yard run.

Big Game James

Back for a fifth season, linebacker **James Patterson** continues to cement himself as one of the best linebackers in program history.

He had six tackles at Maryland in the opener to bring his career total to 303. He's the 12th player in program history to reach the 300 tackle mark and currently ranks 5th in school history in career tackles with 389. He moved past all-time great Khalil Mack on UB's career tackle

A team captain since his sophomore season, Patterson was named All-MAC First Team in 2020 and 2021. He made his 53rd career start against Central Michigan, the most starts by any player in program history. James O'Hagan (2015-18) and Peter Bittner (2007-10) are the only other players to start 50 games at UB.

Fuqua Named Bronko Nagurski National Player of the Week

Safety **Marcus Fuqua** was named the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week following his standout performance against Toledo. He's the first UB player to ever earn the honor. The junior had a career-high three interceptions against the Rockets to become just the fourth UB player to record three interceptions in a game. The last UB player with three picks was Cortney Lester against Western Michigan in 2012. Steven Nappo had three interceptions against Frostburg State in 1986 and Pete Rao had a school-record four interceptions in a game against Cortland State in 1953.

Fuqua leads the MAC and is tied for second in the nation with five interceptions. He was named the MAC East Defensive Player of the Week for the second time this season following his performance against Toledo.

Dynamic Duo

The Bulls feature two of the best wide receivers in the Mid-American Conference in **Quian Williams** and **Justin Marshall**. Williams has 50 receptions for 550 yards and four touchdowns.

Marshall has 45 receptions for 614 yards and six touchdowns.

Williams and Marshall each had eight catches against Coastal Carolina, marking the first time since 2015, two UB players had eight or more receptions in the same game. Matt Weiser, Marcus McGill and Ron Willoughby each had eight catches against Bowling Green on Oct. 3, 2015.

Against Holy Cross, both players (Williams 105/Marshall 116) went over 100 yards receiving in the same game for the first time since Antonio Nunn (182) and Trevor Wilson (118) each had 100-yard games against Ball State in the 2020 MAC Championship Game.

All Gassett, No Brakes

Slot receiver **Jamari Gassett** has emerged as a serious threat, complimenting outside receivers **Quian Williams** and **Justin Marshall**. He ranks third on the team in receiving with 27 catches for 348 yards and two touchdowns.

He has had the knack of making big plays lately with five receptions of 32 yards or more in the last six games, including a 32-yard TD catch against Toledo and a 65-yard touchdown reception at Eastern Michigan.

New Faces

Looking to bolster the roster, the Bulls welcomed 25 transfers this offseason, including 11 from power five programs.

UB's power five program transfers include WR **Justin Marshall** (Louisville), CB **Elijah Blades** (Florida), WR **Boobie Curry** (Arizona), CB **Caleb Offord** (Notre Dame), S **Solomon Brown**

(Minnesota), S **Jahmin Muse** (Boston College), QB **Cole Snyder** (Rutgers), DE **Ibrahim Kante** (NC State), DE **Damian Jackson** (Nebraska), S **James Ziglor** (Vanderbilt) and OL **Isaiah Wright** (Rutgers).

Of the 60 players on the depth chart, 24 are in their first year with the program.

Linebacker U

UB has had a number of standout linebackers in recent years, most notably Khalil Mack who was an All-American and now an NFL All-Pro.

The Bulls have at least one linebacker named All-MAC each of the last 11 seasons. **James Patterson** was named to the first team in 2020 and 2021.

Rounding out the list are Kadofi Wright (2019), Khalil Hodge (2018, 2017, 2016), Brandon Berry (2015), Okezie Alozie (2015), Lee Skinner (2014), Adam Redden (2014) and Khalil Mack (2013, 2012, 2011).

International Flavor

The Bulls have four international players on this year's roster.

Buffalo has two players who hail from Canada, including **Gabe Wallace** (BC) and **Anthony Venneri** (Ontario). In addition, the Bulls have two players from Europe, **Fabian Weitz** (Germany) and **Alain Schaerer** (Switzerland).

Last Meeting

Kent State 48, Buffalo 38
Oct. 9, 2021 • Dix Stadium • Kent, OH

KENT, OH – A valiant comeback attempt by the University at Buffalo football team came up short at Kent State on Saturday night. The Bulls trailed 31-10 at the half and battled all the way back to take a 38-34 lead after three quarters of play. However, the Golden Flashes scored 14-unanswered points to earn the 48-38 victory.

Early on it was clear Kent State was out for revenge on Buffalo after losing 70-41 last season at UB Stadium. Kent State looked in total control, scoring on nearly every possession of the first half. But, following some adjustments, the Bulls looked like a totally different team in the second half.

The Bulls came out of the locker room and scored on each of their first four drives. First, Kevin Marks, Jr. took it in from 16 yards out for his second rushing touchdown of the game. On the next drive, Kyle Vantrease connected with Jake Molinich on a 10-yard touchdown pass to quickly cut the Kent State lead to 31-24.

The Bulls tied the game on their next possession when Matt Myers went over the left end for a 4-yard touchdown run. Dylan McDuffie gave the Bulls their first lead of the game, 38-34, with a 10-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter.

Unfortunately, Kent State scored 14-unanswered points in the fourth quarter to pull away for the victory.

Buffalo rushed for 312 yards in the game, their best effort of the season. It was a balanced effort as McDuffie rushed for 87 yards, Marks rushed for 80 yards and Ron Cook, Jr. finished with 72 yards.

Vantrease threw for 229 yards in the game, connecting with 11 different receivers. Quian Williams again led the Bulls with eight catches for 86 yards. As a team, the Bulls finished with 549 yards of total offense, their most against an FBS opponent this season. UB ran a season-high 99 plays.

Defensively, the Bulls were led by Kadofi Wright and Ja'Marcus Ingram who each had 10 tackles in the game. James Patterson added nine stops.

Bulls to Honor Shooting Victims by Wearing Stronger Together Patches

BUFFALO, NY – The University at Buffalo will honor the victims of the tragic racially motivated mass shooting that occurred at a Tops market in Buffalo on May 14, 2022 by wearing "Stronger Together" patches on select uniforms and helmet stickers this season, UB Vice President and Director of Athletics Mark Alnutt announced on Thursday. The patch was originally created by UB's Stronger Together Task Force, in September 2020, as part of its mission to combat racism and shed light on the social injustices across the nation.

"I am honored to work with this group and want to thank them for their commitment to bettering our department, University and community," said Alnutt. "As one of our core values in our Athletic Department, we are committed to sustaining a culture of diversity and inclusion across all dimensions, and we proudly embrace and promote equality for all. Through sports, we have an amazing platform and will work together to discuss, educate, plan and implement action items while creating a more inclusive and tolerant community."

This group is representative of UB coaches, staff and student-athletes across all sports and departmental units. Its charge is to identify key areas of priority and help to perpetuate positive change for the UB athletics department, University campus and the Western New York community. The task force aligns its actions and programming to progress forward and implement changes that foster an environment of cultural awareness, social justice, and a sense of belonging.

We will always remember the names and salute the lives of: Ruth Whitfield, Roberta Drury, Aaron Salter, Heyward Patterson, Geraldine Talley, Celestine Chaney, Katherine Massey, Margus Morrison, Andre Mackneil and Pearl Young, who was an alumna of UB.



HEAD COACH MAURICE LINGUIST

Maurice Linguist is in his second season as head coach of the UB football program. Considered by many as one of the top young minds in all of college football, Linguist was named the University at Buffalo's 26th head coach on May 8, 2021. It is a homecoming of sorts for Linguist who was the Bulls' defensive backs coach in 2012 and 2013.

In his first season as the helm, Linguist led the Bulls to a 4-8 record with an injury-riddled squad.

Seven Bulls were named to the All-MAC team, including James Patterson who was a first-team selection at middle linebacker. A program-best 19 Bulls were named to the Academic All-MAC team, including offensive lineman Jack Klenk who was also an CoSIDA Academic All-District selection.

Linguist is regarded as one of the nation's top recruiters and has excelled in coaching at both the Power Five level and the NFL. He came to UB from Michigan where he served a brief stint as defensive backs coach/co-defensive coordinator since January. He joined the U-M coaching staff after spending the 2020 season as cornerbacks coach with the NFL's Dallas Cowboys.

In Dallas, Linguist directed a secondary that forced 10 interceptions while allowing the fifth-fewest passing first downs in the league (180). The Cowboys were also ranked in the top half of the league in pass yards allowed (11th), completion percentage against (10th), and takeaways (ninth). Linguist coached rookie cornerback Trevon Diggs (three interceptions) to a strong first season in the league. Three of Dallas' four leading tacklers in 2020 were starters in the secondary, including former Wolverine Jourdan Lewis who set a career-high with 59 stops.

Linguist has worked with college secondaries at nine programs. Prior to heading to the NFL, he coached cornerbacks at Texas A&M (2018-19), defensive backs at Minnesota (2017), safeties at Mississippi State (2016) and defensive backs at Iowa State (2014-15).

At A&M, Linguist's secondaries limited opportunities for opponents and played tight coverage in key situations. Teams converted just 31.2 percent of third down tries (102-of-326) over his two seasons and A&M ranked ninth nationally in that category in 2018. The Aggies intercepted their opponents 19 times in his two seasons and made a habit of getting off the field. During the 2018 season, the defense was top-15 nationally in first downs allowed (221) and faced the fewest snaps against among all SEC teams.

Linguist helped the Aggies produce back-to-back top-six recruiting classes nationally in 2019 and 2020. He was the lead recruiter for five-star safety Jaylon Jones, the first five-star defensive back to sign with Texas A&M.

In his season at Minnesota, Linguist's secondary helped anchor a defense that finished No. 11 nationally with 174.5 yards allowed per game after listing 73rd in the NCAA a year earlier. The unit surrendered 16 touchdowns, a top-25 figure nationally and also ranked among the nation's best in first downs allowed (11th) and total defense (30th). Linguist was the lead recruiter for Rashod Bateman, the Big Ten's Wide Receiver of the Year. Linguist was promoted to assistant head coach following the 2017 season before accepting a position at Texas A&M.

At Mississippi State, Linguist led the safeties group which was responsible for seven of the team's 14 interceptions. Three safeties eclipsed the 50-tackle mark for the Bulldogs: Brandon Bryant (62, three PBUs), Kivon Coman (58, four PBUs), and Mark McLaurin (51, seven PBUs) were among the team's leading tacklers. The defense scored four touchdowns (No. 8, NCAA) and totaled 14 interceptions (No. 35, NCAA) during the 2016 season.

Prior to his time in Starkville, Linguist coached defensive backs at Iowa State (2014-15). He coached players to three All-Big 12 honors in his two seasons at Iowa State, including safety Kamari Cotton-Moya, a first-team All-American freshman team selection by the Football Writers' Association of America (FWAA). Cotton-Moya led the team in tackles and was named the conference's Freshman of the Year on defense. Linguist would help direct cornerback Brian Peavy to be a finalist for the award the following year.

In his time at UB, Linguist helped the Bulls finish second in the MAC East and reach the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in 2013, at the time, the program's second bowl appearance. The unit ranked second in the league in interceptions (15), points per game allowed (24.4), and yards per game allowed (382.2). Linguist coached Najja Johnson to first-team all-conference honors and a career total of 38 pass breakups, second in program history. Johnson led the MAC in interceptions the year earlier as part of a Bulls unit that was tops in the conference in pass completion percentage allowed while ranking second in pass defense.

Linguist spent three years at James Madison, helping the program pull in the top FCS recruiting class during the 2012 cycle while the team reached the second round of the NCAA Football Championship Series Playoffs. Linguist's first full-time position was at Valdosta State, working with defensive backs and special teams. The Blazers went 9-3 and earned a No. 12 national ranking in Division II.

Linguist began as a graduate assistant at Baylor, his alma mater, working as a graduate assistant with the strong safeties and rover backs. During his career at Baylor, he was a defensive MVP and honorable mention All-Big 12 selection. He made 24 starts in 42 appearances as a strong safety from 2003-06. A native of Dallas, Texas, Linguist graduated from Baylor with degrees in communications (2006) and a master's in health, human performance and recreation (2007). He was an Academic All-Big 12 honoree.

Linguist and his wife, Stacie, have one daughter, Maura, and one son, Lance.

The defense was led by cornerback Logic Hudgens and nickelback Keyshawn Cobb who each had a game-high eight tackles. Safety Marcus Fuqua had an interception in the third quarter for the game's lone turnover.

Linebacker James Patterson, a native of Maryland, had six tackles in the game, including a tackle for loss. He became the 12th player in program history to surpass 300 career tackles.

CONWAY, SC – The University at Buffalo football team dropped a 38-26 decision to Coastal Carolina on Saturday afternoon at Brooks Stadium. The UB defense forced four turnovers, but it wasn't enough to overcome some of their own miscues.

On Coastal Carolina's first play from scrimmage, Shaun Dolac forced a fumble that was recovered by James Patterson. The Bulls were able to convert the turnover into points as Alex McNulty drilled a 36-yard field goal to give the Bulls a 3-0 lead.

McNulty was automatic on the day. The senior kicker made all four of his attempts on the day, also connecting from 47, 42 and 26 yards. He became the first UB kicker to make four field goals in a game since A.J. Principe made four at Syracuse in 2007.

The Bulls were able to take the lead into the locker room when Cole Snyder found Justin Marshall for a 15-yard touchdown with just 36 seconds left in the second quarter.

After McNulty's fourth field goal gave the Bulls a 19-14 lead late in the third quarter, the Chanticleers rattled off 17 straight points, including a touchdown on a fumble return to take a 31-19 lead.

Snyder found Quian Williams over the middle for a 10-yard touchdown catch with 5:36 left to cut the Coastal lead to 31-26. However, the Bulls were unable to get the stop they needed as the Chanticleers scored on a long touchdown play on their next possession to ice the game.

Snyder threw for 264 yards and two touchdowns in the game. His favorite targets were Marshall and Williams who each had eight catches. Marshall finished with 88 receiving yards and Williams had 62. Jamari Gassett and Marlyn Johnson had five and four catches, respectively, career high for both.

Patterson led the defense with nine tackles and added a tackle for loss and a fumble recovery. Cornerback Caleb Offord had his best game as a Bull, finishing with eight tackles and a fumble recovery. Safety Jahmin Muse sparked the Bulls early with three tackles, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a pass breakup.

The four forced turnovers by the Bulls were the most they had in a game since forcing five at Northern Illinois in the opener of the 2020 campaign.

BUFFALO 50, EASTERN MICHIGAN 31

YPSILANTI, MI – The University at Buffalo football team put together a dominant offensive effort to beat Eastern Michigan, 51-30, in the Mid-American Conference opener for both teams at Rynearson Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The 50 points were the most points ever scored by a UB team in a MAC road contest.

The Bulls offense couldn't be stopped. They scored the first nine times they had the ball. However, early on, Eastern Michigan was matching UB's scores with points of its own. Early in the third quarter, the Eagles scored a touchdown to take a 31-30 lead. From there on, it was all Bulls, as the Blue and White scored 20 unanswered points to pull away for the victory.

UB signal-caller Cole Snyder led the way for the Bulls. He went 20-for-29 for 297 yards and two touchdowns and added two more scores on the ground. His favorite target was Quian Williams who had six catches for 99 yards and a touchdown against the school from which he transferred prior to the 2021 season.

Buffalo had its best rushing performance of the season. The Bulls rushed for 201 yards, led by Ron Cook who had 92 yards on 19 carries. Mike Washington ran for a career-high 71 yards and scored two touchdowns for his first career multi-touchdown game.

The Bulls were able to capitalize on big plays all afternoon. On their first drive of the game, Snyder hit Williams for a 59-yard pass play that set up UB at the EMU 1-yard line. Snyder later punched it in. Late in the half, Williams returned a kickoff 75 yards to set up an Alex McNulty field goal as time expired. Snyder connected with Jamari Gassett for a 65-yard touchdown early in the third quarter that gave the Bulls the lead for good.

The Bulls defensive effort got much stronger in the second half. After giving up the lead, 31-30, with 10:38 left in the third quarter, Buffalo allowed zero points and only 50 yards the rest of the game. Shaun Dolac led Buffalo with 13 tackles. James Patterson had seven tackles and an interception. The senior linebacker passed all-time great Khalil Mack on UB's career tackle list with 333.

McNulty made all three of his field goal attempts and now has made seven field goals over the last two games. He did, however, see his school-record streak of 111 straight extra points snapped when he had an attempt blocked in the first quarter. Ironically, the streak began on the same Eastern Michigan field in 2019.

BUFFALO, NY – Late heroics helped the University at Buffalo football team improve to 2-0 in Mid-American Conference play with a 24-20 win over Miami (OH) at UB Stadium on Saturday. Cole Snyder found Justin Marshall for a 15-yard touchdown with just 31 seconds left for the game-winning score.

The Bulls led 14-10 at the half and extended their lead to 17-10 on an Alex McNulty 43-yard field goal midway through the third quarter. After Miami tied the game on its next possession, miscues almost cost UB as a fumble led to a Miami field goal that put the RedHawks in front, 20-17, in the final minute of the third quarter.

Facing arguably the best defense in the MAC, the Bulls kept chipping away in the fourth quarter. Buffalo's winning drive started at its own 18 with 4:22 left. The first big play of the drive was a swing pass from Snyder to Mike Washington that went for 23 yards. Snyder followed with a 21-yard completion to Quian Williams and suddenly the Bulls were across midfield.

The Bulls were stopped at the Miami 22-yard line and settled for a McNulty field goal to tie the game, 20-20. However, Miami was offside on the play to give Buffalo a first down. The drive continued and three plays later UB scored the game-winning touchdown.

It was Marshall's sixth catch of game and team-best fourth receiving touchdown of the season. Williams led all receivers with seven catches in the game for 77 yards.

Washington got the Bulls on the board with a 1-yard touchdown run on the Buffalo's first drive.

Shaun Dolac had the best game of his career to lead the defense. The junior linebacker had 14 tackles, including a career-best 12 solo stops, and added a career-high three tackles for loss. Jahmin Muse had his first interception as a Bull and returned it 51 yards to the Miami 1-yard line, setting up a short TD run by Snyder in the second quarter.

YPSILANTI, MI – The University at Buffalo football team put together a dominant offensive effort to beat Eastern Michigan, 38-7, in the Mid-American Conference opener for both teams at Rynearson Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The 50 points were the most points ever scored by a UB team in a MAC road contest.

The Bulls offense couldn't be stopped. They scored the first nine times they had the ball. However, early on, Eastern Michigan was matching UB's scores with points of its own. Early in the third quarter, the Eagles scored a touchdown to take a 31-30 lead. From there on, it was all Bulls, as the Blue and White scored 20 unanswered points to pull away for the victory.

UB signal-caller Cole Snyder led the way for the Bulls. He went 20-for-29 for 297 yards and two touchdowns and added two more scores on the ground. His favorite target was Quian Williams who had six catches for 99 yards and a touchdown against the school from which he transferred prior to the 2021 season.

Buffalo had its best rushing performance of the season. The Bulls rushed for 201 yards, led by Ron Cook who had 92 yards on 19 carries. Mike Washington ran for a career-high 71 yards and scored two touchdowns for his first career multi-touchdown game.

The Bulls were able to capitalize on big plays all afternoon. On their first drive of the game, Snyder hit Williams for a 59-yard pass play that set up UB at the EMU 1-yard line. Snyder later punched it in. Late in the half, Williams returned a kickoff 75 yards to set up an Alex McNulty field goal as time expired. Snyder connected with Jamari Gassett for a 65-yard touchdown early in the third quarter that gave the Bulls the lead for good.

The Bulls defensive effort got much stronger in the second half. After giving up the lead, 31-30, with 10:38 left in the third quarter, Buffalo allowed zero points and only 50 yards the rest of the game.

Shaun Dolac led Buffalo with 13 tackles. James Patterson had seven tackles and an interception. The senior linebacker passed all-time great Khalil Mack on UB's career tackle list with 333.

McNulty made all three of his field goal attempts and now has made seven field goals over the last two games. He did, however, see his school-record streak of 111 straight extra points snapped when he had an attempt blocked in the first quarter. Ironically, the streak began on the same Eastern Michigan field in 2019.

AMHERST, MA – The University at Buffalo football team won its fourth straight game on Saturday afternoon, defeating Massachusetts, 34-7, at McGuirk Stadium. It was a dominant defensive performance as the Bulls held the Minutemen to only 220 yards of total offense.

The offense was keyed by big plays enroute to rolling up 480 yards of total offense.

The Bulls jumped out to a 10-0 lead thanks to an Alex McNulty 39-yard field goal and a four-yard pass from Cole Snyder to Quian Williams.

Buffalo extended its lead to 17-0 early in the second quarter when Al-Jay Henderson ripped off a career-long 84-yard touchdown run.

After the Minutemen scored to cut the lead to 17-7, Justin Marshall quieted the UMass threat by hauling in a 49-yard touchdown catch with 5:07 left in the second quarter to put the Bulls back up by 17.

All the scoring in the second half went the way of UB. McNulty drilled his second 39-yard field goal of the game in the third quarter and Cole Harrity capped the scoring with his first career touchdown catch as a Bull – a 27-yard reception from Snyder in the fourth.

UB's defensive line was the difference in the game. The Bulls registered 15 tackles for loss and four sacks on the afternoon. Defensive end Ibrahim Kante had five tackles, two sacks and three tackles for loss. Defensive tackle Jaylon Bass had six tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss and fellow defensive tackle Daymond Williams had three tackles, a sack and two tackles for loss.

Snyder had his second three-touchdown passing performance of the season. He finished 20-31 for 277 yards and three touchdowns. He connected with 10 different receivers, led by Jamari Gassett who had four catches for 85 yards.

BUFFALO, NY – The University at Buffalo football team rallied from a 17-point fourth-quarter deficit to stun Toledo, 34-27, in a battle of the Mid-American Conference's first place teams at UB Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The Bulls scored 24 points in the fourth quarter to win their fifth straight game and improve to a perfect 4-0 in the MAC.

The Bulls trailed 27-10 early in the fourth quarter. Quarterback Cole Snyder sparked the comeback with a five-yard touchdown run with 13:13 left to cut the lead to 27-17. UB got the ball right back, marched 80 yards down the field and cut the lead to three points on a 32-yard connection from Snyder to Jamari Gassett with 9:35 left.

An interception by safety Marcus Fuqua gave the ball right back to the Bulls and, four plays later, Ron Cook scampered in from 30 yards out to give UB its first lead of the game, 31-27, with 8:06 remaining.

Fuqua intercepted his third pass of the day with a little over three minutes left to give the ball back to the Bulls and set up an Alex McNulty 42-yard field goal with just 47 seconds left to extend the UB lead to 34-27.

On the Toledo's last drive of the game, Caleb Offord sealed the win with the Bulls' fourth interception of the game. All told, Buffalo forced six Toledo turnovers, including a 72-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Jahmin Muse.

Cook finished the day with a career-high 118 yards rushing and a touchdown and added three receptions for 40 yards. Snyder, who struggled in the first half, found his groove in the second half and finished with 245 passing yards and a TD.

Linebacker Shaun Dolac had another stellar game for the Bulls, finishing with 12 tackles, three tackles for loss and two pass breakups. Cornerback Isaiah King, who was wearing no. 41 in memory of Solomon Jackson, had a career-high 11 tackles and an incredible sequence where he forced and recovered a fumble in the third quarter.

It was a tale of two halves as the Bulls scored 27 points on 299 yards of offense in the second half, while holding Toledo to just seven points on 186 yards of offense in the second half.

ATHENS, OH – The University at Buffalo football team had its five-game winning streak snapped at Ohio, 45-24, on Tuesday night at Peden Stadium. It was the Bulls' first Mid-American Conference loss of the season.

UB rallied from a 24-3 second-quarter deficit to make it a one-score game on two different occasions in the third quarter, but in the end Ohio's high-octane offense proved to be too much.

Trailing 24-3 late in the second quarter, Cole Snyder found Justin Marshall in the corner of the endzone for a 12-yard touchdown to cut the lead to 24-10 at the half. On Ohio's first possession of the third quarter, Keyshawn Cobb picked off Ohio quarterback Kurtis Rourke and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown and just like that it was 24-17.

After Ohio answered with a touchdown to go up by 14 points, Snyder hit Mike Washington on a short pass for a touchdown to again bring the Bulls to within seven, 31-24, with 1:46 left in the third quarter. The touchdown was set up by a fumble forced by Cobb and recovered by Marcus Fuqua near midfield.

Unfortunately, turnovers hurt the Bulls in the fourth quarter as they fumbled twice, thwarting their comeback effort.

Snyder finished with 234 yards passing and two scores. Marshall and Quian Williams each had six catches in the game. Robbie Mangas added a career-high four grabs for 41 yards.

Defensively, Buffalo was led by the linebacker duo of James Patterson and Shaun Dolac. Patterson had a career-high 16 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss. Dolac had 10 tackles in the game.

MOUNT PLEASANT, MI – The University at Buffalo football team lost to Central Michigan, 31-27, at Kelly/Shorts Stadium on Wednesday night. It was the second straight loss for the Bulls who saw their good first half spoiled by a Chippewa comeback.

It was all Buffalo early on as the Bulls built a 24-7 halftime lead. UB controlled the line of scrimmage and got three rushing touchdowns in the first half. The first was a short run by Mike Washington, followed by a 25-yard run by Ron Cook, Jr. and a 30-yard run by Al-Jay Henderson.

Alex McNulty tacked on a 42-yard field goal with just 20 seconds left in the first half.

The second half turned when quarterback Bert Emmanuel, Jr. was inserted in the lineup for Central Michigan. The CMU signal-caller rushed for 293 yards in the game, 274 coming in the second half alone. His second rushing touchdown of the game tied the game at 27-27 late in the third quarter.

McNulty drilled a 54-yard field goal with 9:42 left in the fourth quarter to give the Bulls the lead, 27-24. It was McNulty's second field goal of the game and 18th of the season, setting a school record for single-season made field goals.

Unfortunately for the Bulls, Central Michigan responded with a touchdown with 7:29 remaining to take the lead for good.

The Bulls rushed for 240 yards in the game, led by Cook's 100. His second 100-yard game in the last three games. Henderson added 72 yards on the ground.

Cole Snyder threw for 191 yards. Justin Marshall was the Bulls' leading receiver with four catches for 45 yards. Quian Williams, Marlyn Johnson and Trevor Borland each added three receptions.

Defensively, Buffalo was led by Shaun Dolac who had 13 tackles, a tackle for loss and a forced fumble. James Patterson added nine stops.
