STORYLINES

- Buffalo is looking to win its third MAC road game of the season for the just the fourth time since joining the conference in 1999. The Bulls also won three MAC road games in 2018, 2013 and 2008.
- The Bulls are in search of their first win at Miami since 2015 when they defeated the RedHawks, 29-24.
- UB's defense is allowing 15 points and an average of 277 yards of total offense in MAC games this season.
- 13 different players have scored touchdowns for the Bulls this season.
- **Ron Cook** (1,670) is 30 yards shy of becoming the Bulls career leader in kick return yardage. Devin Campbell (2012-15) currently holds the record with 1,699 yards.
- **Cole Snyder** (4,884) is 64 yards shy of passing Chad Salisbury (1997-98) for seventh place in career passing yards at UB. He is 116 yards shy of becoming just the seventh quarterback in program history to throw for 5,000 yards.
- With four forced fumbles on the season, not only does **Max Michel** lead the Mid-American Conference, he is two shy of the single-season program record of six set by Anthony Scott in 1996.
- In MAC games, UB opponents are a combined 20-of-76 (.263) on third down.
- The Bulls have had only five flags thrown against them over the last two games (3 against Ohio and 2 against Toledo).

For the past eight seasons, the number 41 jersey has been worn by a different player each game to honor the legacy of former Bull Solomon Jackson who passed away in 2016.

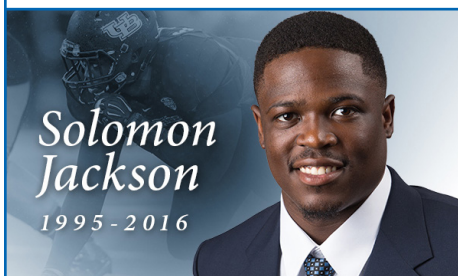
In 2016 and 2017, players were chosen by the coaching staff to wear "41" for the entire year. Cornerback Boise Ross wore it for the 2016 season, while linebacker Jarrett Franklin wore it in 2017.

This is the sixth season the coaching staff will rotate #41 on a weekly basis. It is announced the night before each game.

Solomon Jackson passed away unexpectedly following an offseason workout on February 29, 2016. Jackson, respected and beloved by his teammates, played both linebacker and defensive end over his career. The slogan ALL41 is a prominent fixture throughout the Murchie Family Football Center to honor his legacy.

Bulls Close out Road Slate at Miami (OH) on Wednesday Night

The University at Buffalo football team will play their final road game of the season at Miami (OH) on Wednesday night.

Buffalo is 3-7 overall, 3-3 in the MAC and is coming off a 20-10 loss to Ohio last Tuesday. The Bulls were led by quarterback **Cole Snyder** who threw for 171 yards in the game.

Miami (OH) is 8-2 overall, 5-1 in the MAC and is coming off a 19-0 win over Akron on Wednesday. The RedHawks are led by running back Rashad Amos who has rushed for 702 yards and seven touchdowns on the season.

Miami (OH) leads the all-time series, 16-9. The Bulls won the last meeting, 24-20, at UB Stadium last season.

Forcing the Issue

The Bulls have been very good about ripping the ball way from their opponents this season. Buffalo has forced 11 fumbles over the last seven games, led by **Max Michel** who has four and **Red Murdock** who has three. Michel and Murdock rank one and two in the MAC in forced fumbles.

Michel is two forced fumbles shy of UB's single-season record of six set by Anthony Scott in 1996. With eight career forced fumbles, Michel ranks third in program history in career forced fumbles behind James Patterson (9) and the NCAA's career leader in forced fumbles Khalil Mack (16).

Devin Almighty

Safety **Devin Grant** has been posting eye-popping numbers in MAC play this season. In MAC games, the Bulls safety had 44 tackles, four interceptions, two fumble recoveries, a blocked kick and a blocked punt.

He tied an FBS-era school record with three interceptions and became the first player in program history to return two picks for touchdowns against Central Michigan.

Against Akron in the MAC-opener, Grant had a career-high 10 tackles and blocked a potential game-tying field goal in overtime to secure the win for the Bulls.

Grant was named the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week following his performance against CMU.

It marked the second straight year a UB player won the award. Fellow safety Marcus Fuqua earned the distinction last year.

At conference-leading Toledo, Grant had five tackles, an interception, two fumble recoveries and a blocked punt.

Improving Defense

After struggling on the defensive side of the ball in nonconference play, the Bulls seemed to have righted the ship through four conference games.

In four nonconference games, Buffalo allowed 44.5 points per game while give up 512 yards per game. However, through six conference games, the Bulls only allowed 15 points per game while allowing 277 yards per game.

Line Change

A recent adjustment made to the offensive line has helped UB's offense, especially the running game.

Beginning with the Central Michigan game, left tackle **Isaiah Wright** was moved to center, left guard **Gabe Wallace** kicked out to left tackle and **Trevor Brock** was inserted at left guard.

In the five games with the new offensive line, the Bulls have improved their yard-per-carry average from 3.5 yards per game to 4.0 yards per game and have scored seven rushing touchdowns.

The Kids Are Alright

The defensive turnaround could be attributed to young players being inserted into the lineup.

Sophomore safety **Devin Grant** has 60 tackles, five interceptions, three pass breakups, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

Redshirt-freshman linebacker **Red Murdock** has 43 tackles, seven tackles for loss, two sacks and three forced fumbles on the season.

True freshman cornerback **Charles McCartherens** has 27 tackles, three interceptions, four pass breakups and a forced fumble.

True freshman linebacker **Dion Crawford** has made two starts and has 25 tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup.

13 different players have scored touchdowns for the Bulls this season. **Ron Cook** leads the way with six touchdowns followed by **Marlyn Johnson** (4), **Cole Harrity** (3), **Darrell Harding** (2), **Mike Washington** (2), **Devin Grant** (2), **Jacquez Barksdale** (2), **CJ Ogbonna** (2), **Bobbie Curry** (1), **Nik McMillan** (1), and **Cole Snyder** (1), **Andrew Schnackenberg** (1) and **Al-Jay Henderson** (1).

Special Teams Honors

In recent weeks a member of UB's special teams has been honored by the Mid-American Conference.

Following UBs' win over Central Michigan, **Alex McNulty** was named MAC East Special Teams Player of the Week. He made three field goals and all four extra points against the Chippewas.

Punter **Anthony Venneri** was named MAC East Special Teams Player of the Week following the Bulls win over Akron. He averaged 49.8 yards on six punts with four of his six punts traveling at least 50 yards, including a game-long 63-yarder. Three of his punts were downed inside the 20-yard line.

Working Overtime

Buffalo's 13-10 overtime win over Akron was its first OT win since beating Army in overtime in 2016. It was the Bulls' first road overtime win since de-

feating Bowling Green in two overtimes at Doyt Perry Stadium in 2008. Before their win at Akron, the Bulls were just 2-5 in overtime games dating back to 2009.

PickCartherens

Freshman cornerback **Charles McCartherens** had the best game of his young career at Louisiana. He had two interceptions in the game, making him the first true freshman in the program's 25-year history as an FBS program to have multiple interceptions in a game. Mike Newton (2 vs. Kent State in 2006) and John Syty (2 vs. UTEP in 2008) had two picks as redshirt-freshmen.

McCartherens has started the last eight games and has totaled 27 tackles, three interceptions, four pass breakups and a forced fumble since being inserted into the starting lineup.

Sterling Marlyn

Wide receiver **Marlyn Johnson** is having breakout season for the Bulls. He has 35 receptions for 335 yards and four touchdowns on the season. Over his first four seasons combined, he totaled 23 catches for 234 yards and one touchdown.

He had the best game of his UB career against Fordham, finishing with seven receptions for 105 yards and two touchdowns - all career highs.

Johnson has had a touchdown catch

Cole Powered

In his second season as the Bulls' starter, quarterback **Cole Snyder** is off to a tremendous start. The graduate signal-caller ranks fourth in the MAC in passing yards per game (185.0) and is third in touchdown passes (13).

Snyder became the first quarterback in program history to complete 24 or more passes in each of the first three games of the season. In addition, he became the first UB quarterback since Tyree Jackson in 2018 to throw multiple touchdown passes in each of the first three games of the season.

He had a career-best four touchdown passes against Fordham.

With 4,884 career passing yards, Snyder is just the 10th quarterback in program history to throw for 4,000 yards.

Agent Zero

Cole Harry has become a favorite target of quarterback **Cole Snyder**. He ranks second on the team in receiving with 33 catches for 276 yards and three touchdowns. He made the most of his first career start at Wisconsin. The UB grad had five catches for 47 yards and two touchdowns against the Badgers.

In his second year with the program, the New Mexico State transfer appeared in all 13 games last season and finished with 13 catches for 170 yards and a touchdown.

Max Michel Earns 1-MAC Award

University at Buffalo defensive end **Max Michel** earned The Mid-American Conference (MAC) 1-MAC Award - given annually to the student-athlete who has a tremendous impact and excellence in inclusion efforts.

A native of New Jersey, Michel quickly embraced the Queen City. Last December, he held his second annual coat drive. Through his efforts, he was able to collect numerous coats, jackets, gloves and hats and donate them to the Buffalo City Mission.

He also donates his time volunteering at the Buffalo City Mission's kitchen, helping prepare and serve food, emptying the garbage and whatever else he can do to help.

In addition, Michel volunteers his time with Harrison's Playmakers, a non-profit organization that promotes social inclusion and kindness with year-round sports programs and activities for kids with developmental differences and special needs.

Among his numerous other volunteer ventures, Michel organized a group of teammates to work with WNY Peacemakers to distribute free groceries in East Buffalo.

In addition, Michel is on the watch list for the Wuerffel Trophy.

Linebacker U

UB has had a number of standout linebackers in recent years, most notably Khalil Mack who was an All-American and now an NFL All-Pro.

The Bulls have at least one linebacker named All-MAC each of the last 12 seasons. Shaun Dolac was named to the first team in 2022.

Rounding out the list are James Patterson (2022, 2021, 2020), Kadofi Wright (2019), Khalil Hodge (2018, 2017, 2016), Brandon Berry (2015), Okezie Alozie (2015), Lee Skinner (2014), Adam Redden (2014) and Khalil Mack (2013, 2012, 2011).

McNulty Named Campbell Trophy Semifinalist

Graduate kicker **Alex McNulty** is a nominee for the William V. Campbell Trophy. Given annually to college football's top student-athlete, the Campbell Trophy is also known as the Academic Heisman.

McNulty graduated with degrees in biology for pre-veterinary science and physics. He carries a 3.7 grade point average and is a four-time Academic All-MAC selection.

McNulty is a two-time All-MAC selection and was the 2022 MAC Special Teams Player of the Year. He is the program record holder in career field goals (58), extra points (188) and points scored (357).

He has made six 50+ yard field goals over his career and is the first kicker in program history to make 100 consecutive extra points.



Last Meeting

Buffalo 24, Miami (OH) 20

BUFFALO, NY – Late heroics helped the University at Buffalo football team improve to 2-0 in Mid-American Conference play with a 24-20 win over Miami (OH) at UB Stadium on Saturday. Cole Snyder found Justin Marshall for a 15-yard touchdown with just 31 seconds left for the game-winning score.

The Bulls led 14-10 at the half and extended their lead to 17-10 on an Alex McNulty 43-yard field goal midway through the third quarter. After Miami tied the game on its next possession, miscues almost cost UB as a fumble led to a Miami field goal that put the RedHawks in front, 20-17, in the final minute of the third quarter.

Facing arguably the best defense in the MAC, the Bulls kept chipping away in the fourth quarter. Buffalo's winning drive started at its own 18 with 4:22 left. The first big play of the drive was a swing pass from Snyder to Mike Washington that went for 23 yards. Snyder followed with a 21-yard completion to Quian Williams and suddenly the Bulls were across midfield.

The Bulls were stopped at the Miami 22-yard line and settled for a McNulty field goal to tie the game, 20-20. However, Miami was offside on the play to give Buffalo a first down. The drive continued and three plays later UB scored the game-winning touchdown.

It was Marshall's sixth catch of game and team-best fourth receiving touchdown of the season. Williams led all receivers with seven catches in the game for 77 yards.

Washington got the Bulls on the board with a 1-yard touchdown run on the Buffalo's first drive.

Shaun Dolac had the best game of his career to lead the defense. The junior linebacker had 14 tackles, including a career-best 12 solo stops, and added a career-high three tackles for loss. Jahmin Muse had his first interception as a Bull and returned it 51 yards to the Miami 1-yard line, setting up a short TD run by Snyder in the second quarter.

HEAD COACH MAURICE LINGUIST

Maurice Linguist is in his third season as head coach of the UB football program. Considered by many as one of the top young minds in all of college football, Linguist was named the University at Buffalo's 26th head coach on May 8, 2021. It was a homecoming of sorts for Linguist who was the Bulls' defensive backs coach in 2012 and 2013.

In 2022, only his second season with the program, Linguist led the Bulls to a 7-6 record, capped by a 23-21 victory over Georgia Southern in the Camellia Bowl. It was just the third bowl win in program history. He led Buffalo to

a 5-3 record in Mid-American Conference play, the seventh time, since the joining the league in 1999, the Bulls had a winning record in MAC play.

A coach with extensive experience on the defensive side of the ball, it was of little surprise several of UB's defensive players had standout seasons. Safety Marcus Fuqua led the nation with seven interceptions and became just the third UB player to be named an Associated Press All-American. Linebacker Shaun Dolac ranked second in the nation with 147 tackles, including a school-record 97 solo stops which were more than any player in the FBS.

The Bulls had seven players named All-MAC, including kicker Alex McNulty who became the first player in program history to be named MAC Special Teams Player of the Year.

In his first season as the helm, Linguist led the Bulls to a 4-8 record with an injury-riddled squad.

Seven Bulls were named to the All-MAC team, including James Patterson who was a first-team selection at middle linebacker. A program-best 19 Bulls were named to the Academic All-MAC team, including offensive lineman Jack Klenk who was also an CoSIDA Academic All-District selection.

Linguist is regarded as one of the nation's top recruiters and has excelled in coaching at both the Power Five level and the NFL. He came to UB from Michigan where he served a brief stint as defensive backs coach/co-defensive coordinator since January. He joined the U-M coaching staff after spending the 2020 season as cornerbacks coach with the NFL's Dallas Cowboys.

In Dallas, Linguist directed a secondary that forced 10 interceptions while allowing the fifth-fewest passing first downs in the league (180). The Cowboys were also ranked in the top half of the league in pass yards allowed (11th), completion percentage against (10th), and takeaways (ninth). Linguist coached rookie cornerback Trevon Diggs (three interceptions) to a strong first season in the league. Three of Dallas' four leading tacklers in 2020 were starters in the secondary, including former Wolverine Jourdan Lewis who set a career-high with 59 stops.

Linguist has worked with college secondaries at nine programs. Prior to heading to the NFL, he coached cornerbacks at Texas A&M (2018-19), defensive backs at Minnesota (2017), safeties at Mississippi State (2016) and defensive backs at Iowa State (2014-15).

At A&M, Linguist's secondaries limited opportunities for opponents and played tight coverage in key situations. Teams converted just 31.2 percent of third down tries (102-of-326) over his two seasons and A&M ranked ninth nationally in that category in 2018. The Aggies intercepted their opponents 19 times in his two seasons and made a habit of getting off the field. During the 2018 season, the defense was top-15 nationally in first downs allowed (221) and faced the fewest snaps against among all SEC teams.

Linguist helped the Aggies produce back-to-back top-six recruiting classes nationally in 2019 and 2020. He was the lead recruiter for five-star safety Jaylon Jones, the first five-star defensive back to sign with Texas A&M.

In his season at Minnesota, Linguist's secondary helped anchor a defense that finished No. 11 nationally with 174.5 yards allowed per game after listing 73rd in the NCAA a year earlier. The unit surrendered 16 touchdowns, a top-25 figure nationally and also ranked among the nation's best in first downs allowed (11th) and total defense (30th). Linguist was the lead recruiter for Rashod Bateman, the Big Ten's Wide Receiver of the Year. Linguist was promoted to assistant head coach following the 2017 season before accepting a position at Texas A&M.

At Mississippi State, Linguist led the safeties group which was responsible for seven of the team's 14 interceptions. Three safeties eclipsed the 50-tackle mark for the Bulldogs: Brandon Bryant (62, three PBUs), Kivon Coman (58, four PBUs), and Mark McLaurin (51, seven PBUs) were among the team's leading tacklers. The defense scored four touchdowns (No. 8, NCAA) and totaled 14 interceptions (No. 35, NCAA) during the 2016 season.

Prior to his time in Starkville, Linguist coached defensive backs at Iowa State (2014-15). He coached players to three All-Big 12 honors in his two seasons at Iowa State, including safety Kamari Cotton-Moya, a first-team All-American freshman team selection by the Football Writers' Association of America (FWAA). Cotton-Moya led the team in tackles and was named the conference's Freshman of the Year on defense. Linguist would help direct cornerback Brian Peavy to be a finalist for the award the following year.

In his time at UB, Linguist helped the Bulls finish second in the MAC East and reach the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in 2013, at the time, the program's second bowl appearance. The unit ranked second in the league in interceptions (15), points per game allowed (24.4), and yards per game allowed (382.2). Linguist coached Najja Johnson to first-team all-conference honors and a career total of 38 pass breakups, second in program history. Johnson led the MAC in interceptions the year earlier as part of a Bulls unit that was tops in the conference in pass completion percentage allowed while ranking second in pass defense.

Linguist spent three years at James Madison, helping the program pull in the top FCS recruiting class during the 2012 cycle while the team reached the second round of the NCAA Football Championship Series Playoffs. Linguist's first full-time position was at Valdosta State, working with defensive backs and special teams. The Blazers went 9-3 and earned a No. 12 national ranking in Division II.

Linguist began as a graduate assistant at Baylor, his alma mater, working as a graduate assistant with the strong safeties and rover backs. During his career at Baylor, he was a defensive MVP and honorable mention All-Big 12 selection. He made 24 starts in 42 appearances as a strong safety from 2003-06. A native of Dallas, Texas, Linguist graduated from Baylor with degrees in communications (2006) and a master's in health, human performance and recreation (2007). He was an Academic All-Big 12 honoree.

Linguist and his wife, Stacie, have one daughter, Maura, and two sons, Lance and Leon.

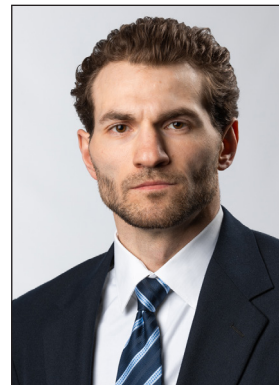

MADISON, WI – The University at Buffalo football team battled valiantly against Wisconsin, but ultimately lost to the 19th-ranked Badgers, 38-17, at Camp Randall Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The Bulls only trailed 14-10 at the half, but Wisconsin was able to pull away in the second half for the victory.

For the first half, the Bulls gave the Badgers all they could handle. Wisconsin scored first to take a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter. However, the Bulls answered right back, driving 65 yards on only five plays and tied the game on a 7-yard pass from Cole Snyder to Cole Harrity. A key play on the drive was a 51-yard completion from Snyder to Darrell Harding, Jr.

The game remained tied, 7-7, for much of the first half until the Badgers scored on a 29-yard TD pass with just one minute left in the in the second quarter to regain a 14-7 advantage. However, the Bulls were able to drive down the field and, with just seven seconds left, Alex McNulty drilled a 53-yard field goal to cut the Wisconsin lead to 14-10 at the break.

Wisconsin used big plays to pull away in the second half. The Badgers scored two third-quarter touchdowns, including an 89-yard TD run, and led, 28-10, heading to the fourth.

Trailing 31-10 in the fourth quarter, the Bulls got the ball back on a Shaun Dolac interception that the senior linebacker returned 32 yards to the Wisconsin 11-yard line. Three plays later, Snyder connected with Harrity again, this time from 3-yards out, to cut the Badger lead to 31-17.

Snyder had good command of the offense and finished 26-of-41 for 194 yards and two touchdowns. He completed passes to 12 different receivers, with his favorite target being Harrity who had five grabs for 47 yards and two scores. Marlyn Johnson and Ron Cook, Jr. each had four receptions.

The Bulls offensive line held up against a massive Badger defensive front. The Bulls didn't allow a sack in the game. UB also didn't commit a turnover, while forcing two Badger miscues. Along with Dolac's pick, Devin Grant had his first career interception in the second quarter.

Mike Washington, Jr and Cook led the Bulls rushing attack. Both backs carried the ball 12 times with Washington finishing with 52 yards and Cook tallying 51.

Marcus Fuqua led the defense with 11 tackles followed by Dolac with eight stops, including a tackle for loss. Max Michel had the game's only sack in the first quarter.

BUFFALO, NY – The University at Buffalo football team dropped their home opener to Fordham, 40-37, at UB Stadium on Saturday night.

The Bulls jumped out to a 21-3 lead, scoring on their first three drives of the game. Mike Washington, Jr. opened the scoring with a 1-yard touchdown plunge on UB's opening possession. It was the first of two touchdowns for Washington who added a 5-yard score in the third quarter.
