

ALL-TIME RECORD BOOK

Buffalo Softball Timeline (Division I, 2000-present)

November 3, 1998: The University at Buffalo announces the reinstatement of its intercollegiate softball and baseball programs, two of six sports that are mandated by the Mid-American Conference. The softball program at UB had been operating at the club level after competing at the Division III level from 1979 to 1987.

May 6, 1999: Marie Curran is announced as UB's first Division I softball head coach. A former collegiate All-American, Curran comes to Buffalo from Northern Illinois where she guided the Huskies in their transition into the Mid-American Conference as an assistant coach in 1998 and 1999.

August 19, 1999: UB's inaugural Division I signing class - consisting of Kelly Malone, Jessica Kensy and Jessica York - is announced in preparation for the Bulls' first season in 2000.

March 3, 2000: The Bulls begin their first season of Division I competition with a pair of victories over St. Michael's College (9-4 and 13-1) at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, FL. Freshman Kelly Malone homers in each game to lead Buffalo's offensive attack.

March 10, 2000: Freshman Kelly Malone hits her fourth career home run against Bowling Green to become UB's all-time single-season and career home run leader just one week into the 2000 season.

April 15, 2000: The Bulls make their home debut at the new UB Softball Stadium, hosting Niagara in a doubleheader. The Purple Eagles shut out the Bulls in each game, 8-0 and 11-0.

May 2, 2000: Buffalo's 2000 team award winners are announced at UB's Annual Athletic Awards Banquet. Freshman Jessica Kensy is named Most Valuable Player, junior Danielle Haynes is named Top Newcomer, freshman Lisa Cox is named Most Improved and the entire 2000 team shares the Coaches' Award.

May 6, 2000: Junior Danielle Haynes has four hits in the final three games of the 2000 season to end the year with a UB single-season record 41 hits. Haynes also led the Bulls with a .373 batting average in 2000.

May 6, 2000: The Bulls end their first Division I season with a 7-38 record after earning one win in a tripleheader against visiting Youngstown State in the season finale. Freshman Kelly Malone hits a first-inning grand slam to send Buffalo to a 4-2 win in game one and finish her freshman campaign with six home runs.

May 16, 2000: Freshman Jennifer Moore is named as the designated player on the NFCA's All-Northeast Region Second Team. Moore hit .322 during the season and led the Bulls with a school-record seven doubles.

March 21, 2001: Freshman Breanne Nasti is named MAC East Player of the Week for the second time in three weeks after setting UB single-season records for home runs (seven) and RBIs (28) at the Ohio State Buckeye Invitational. Nasti and sophomore Jennifer Moore were both named to the All-Tournament Team.

March 23, 2001: After competing as an independent in 2000, Buffalo begins its first season of Mid-American Conference competition with two games at Kent State. The Golden Flashes take both ends of the doubleheader, 1-0 and 4-1.

April 6, 2001: The Bulls hold off a late rally by Western Michigan to earn their first Mid-American Conference victory, 6-4. Senior Kim Lawrence and freshmen Breanne Nasti and Allison Round lead the Bulls with three hits apiece in the win.

April 11, 2001: Freshman Breanne Nasti has three hits, including a two-run home run, in Buffalo's doubleheader sweep of St. Bonaventure to give her a single-season school-record 42 hits. She goes on to finish the year with 59 hits.

April 14, 2001: Buffalo earns an impressive conference victory over defending MAC West Division Champion Northern Illinois, 6-2 at the UB Softball Stadium. Sophomore Andrea Sage allows just five hits for her third win of the year on the mound.

May 1, 2001: Buffalo's 2001 team award winners are announced at UB's Annual Athletic Awards Banquet. Senior Kim Lawrence is named Most Valuable Player, freshman Breanne Nasti is named Top Newcomer, freshman Jessica Labella is named Most Improved and sophomore Andrea Sage receives the Coaches' Award.

May 2, 2001: The Bulls record their first Division I shutout, 8-0, in the opener of a doubleheader at Niagara. Buffalo outthits the Purple Eagles by a 22-8 margin in the two games, led by freshman Allison Round who goes 6-for-8 with six RBIs on the afternoon.

May 4, 2001: Freshman Breanne Nasti hits a sacrifice fly in the third inning against Miami (OH) to score sophomore Laura Gilchrist. The RBI is Nasti's 41st of the season, giving her sole possession of Buffalo's career record. Nasti goes on to finish the season with 43 RBIs in 51 games.

May 16, 2001: Freshman Breanne Nasti is named as the utility player on the NFCA's

All-Mideast Region Second Team. Nasti finished the year with UB single-season and career records for hits (59), doubles (18), home runs (10) and RBIs (43).

February 22, 2002: Kim Ring (1983-85) becomes the first softball player to be inducted into the UB Athletic Hall of Fame. Ring's name appears in numerous UB pitching records, and she is the Division III record holder for single-season pitching wins (13 in 1985) and career pitching wins (26).

March 8, 2002: Freshman Stacey Evans throws a five-hitter against No. 7 Arizona State, a 2002 Women's College World Series participant, at the National Invitational Softball Tournament in San Jose, CA. The Bulls drop a 2-0 decision to the Sun Devils.

April 7, 2002: The Bulls earn their first MAC win of the season in the 12th inning of the opening game of a doubleheader against Western Michigan. Junior Missy Switzer scores the game-tying run in the seventh inning on an illegal pitch and the game-winning run in the 12th inning on a wild pitch by WMU's Wendy Cannon.

April 8, 2002: Sophomore Breanne Nasti is named MAC East Player of the Week after going 6-for-8, including a perfect 5-for-5 in the doubleheader, of Buffalo's three-game series with Western Michigan. Nasti had two doubles and two home runs in the three games.

April 20, 2002: Freshman Stacey Evans throws a one-hit, 5-0 shutout of Kent State in the opening game of a doubleheader at the UB Softball Stadium. The only hit she allows is a one-out blooming single to center field by Tammy Stires in the fifth inning. The win is Buffalo's first-ever shutout of a conference opponent.

April 23, 2002: Junior Jessica Kensy drives in the game-winning run in the bottom of the 10th inning to send the Bulls to a 2-1 win over local rival Canisius College. Freshman Stacey Evans strikes out a UB single-game record 12 batters while going the distance for her third win of the year on the mound.

April 28, 2002: Buffalo's 2002 team award winners are announced at UB's Annual Athletic Awards Banquet. Sophomore Breanne Nasti is named Most Valuable Player, freshman Stacey Evans is named Top Newcomer, freshman Ann Magur is named Most Improved and freshman Melissa Pace receives the Coaches' Award.

April 30, 2002: Freshman Ann Magur hits two doubles and a home run and drives in four runs to key Buffalo's 9-0 shutout at MAC East Division Champion Akron in the nightcap of a doubleheader.

May 5, 2002: The Bulls end the 2002 season with a 13-25 overall record and an 8-16 MAC mark after sweeping the final three-game series of the season from visiting Miami (OH).

May 6, 2002: The Bulls sweep the MAC's final weekly awards with freshman Stacey Evans earning MAC East Pitcher of the Week honors and sophomore Breanne Nasti earning MAC East Co-Player of the Week honors. In the season finale against Miami (OH), Evans struck out five batters to finish the year with a UB single-season record 101 strikeouts, and Nasti went 3-for-4 to finish the season with a UB and MAC record .451 batting average.

May 8, 2002: Sophomore Breanne Nasti is named to the All-MAC First Team and freshman Ann Magur is named to the All-MAC Second Team, as announced by the league office prior to the start of the 2002 MAC Softball Championship.

May 15, 2002: Sophomore Breanne Nasti becomes Buffalo's first Division I All-Region First Team selection as she is chosen as an outfielder on the 12-player All-Mideast Region team. Nasti is the lone member of the MAC to be named to the All-Mideast Region First Team. She ended the year ranked seventh in the nation in batting average (.451).

March 6, 2003: The Bulls earned their first-ever win over a nationally-ranked opponent, knocking off No. 25 Baylor by a 1-0 score at Hawaii's Malihini Tournament.

March 27, 2003: The Bulls set a school record for runs in an inning with an eight-hit, eight-run explosion in the third inning of their 10-2 win over local rival Niagara. The eight runs are the most the Bulls have scored in one inning in their Division I era. Seven of the eight hits in the inning are singles, with the only extra-base hit being a triple by sophomore Melissa Pace that drives in two runs.

April 16, 2003: Sophomore pitcher Stacey Evans strikes out eight batters in a 9-1 win over local rival Canisius College to break her own school record for strikeouts in a season. Evans goes on to finish the 2003 season with 137 strikeouts. She also becomes UB's career leader in strikeouts with 238 at the conclusion of her sophomore season.

April 23, 2003: The Bulls steal a single-game record six bases in a 5-1 win at Niagara, including three by junior Marce Ross. Ross' three stolen bases are also a UB single-game record.

April 26, 2003: Senior Andrea Sage pitches her first career shutout in a complete-game 1-0 win over Miami (OH). The win snaps a nine-game winning streak for the RedHawks. Sage allows just six hits and strikes out six in the complete-game shutout victory.

ALL-TIME RECORD BOOK

April 29, 2003: The Bulls overcome a 4-0 deficit with three runs in the sixth inning and four runs in the seventh to earn a 7-4 win at MAC West Division leader Western Michigan. The loss for the Broncos is just their sixth conference loss of the season and drops them out of first place in the MAC's West Division for the first time in three weeks. The win is Buffalo head coach Marie Curran's 50th career victory, and it gives the Bulls 18 wins in 2003, marking the most wins yet in their four-year Division I history.

April 29, 2003: Buffalo's 2003 team award winners are announced at UB's Annual Athletic Awards Banquet. Sophomore Stacey Evans is named Most Valuable Player, freshman Lauren Picciano is named Top Newcomer, junior Marce Ross is named Most Improved and junior Breanne Nasti receives the Coaches' Award.

May 3, 2003: The University at Buffalo softball field, originally referred to as the UB Softball Stadium, is renamed Nan Harvey Field in a special ceremony following game one of a doubleheader between Buffalo and Akron. The field is renamed in recognition of a monetary gift from Nan Harvey, former UB Associate Athletic Director, Senior Woman Administrator and softball coach.

May 4, 2003: The Bulls commit no errors in their final game of the 2003 season, a 6-3 loss to Akron. Buffalo finishes the season first in the MAC with a school-record .966 team fielding percentage for the year.

May 7, 2003: Junior Breanne Nasti is named to the All-MAC First Team for the second straight season. She is just one of three players to repeat as a first-team honoree in 2003.

March 27, 2004: Freshman Shannon Prochaska doubles to drive in senior Breanne Nasti with the game-winning run in the top of the sixth to give the Bulls a 2-1 victory over Miami (OH) in their MAC opener on March 27. The victory marks the first time in their four years in the league that the Bulls open the MAC season with a win.

May 8, 2004: Junior Stacey Evans pitches her first career no-hitter, a complete-game 1-0 win at Toledo. She also ties her career high with 12 strikeouts. Evans goes on to finish the year with 178 strikeouts, breaking her own school single-season record.

May 8, 2004: The Bulls end the 2004 season with a doubleheader sweep of Toledo, giving them a 25-23 overall record and an 11-10 mark in the MAC. The 25 wins mark the most ever recorded in a season in UB softball history, and the Bulls also finish over .500 for the first time in their Division I tenure.

May 2004: Buffalo's 2004 team award winners are announced by head coach Marie Curran. Junior Stacey Evans is named Most Valuable Player, freshman Mary Russell is named Top Newcomer, freshman Colleen Greene is named Most Improved and senior Breanne Nasti receives the Coaches' Award.

May 13, 2004: Junior Stacey Evans is named to the All-MAC First Team and senior Breanne Nasti is named to the All-MAC Second Team.

May 19, 2004: Senior Breanne Nasti is named to the NFCA All-Mideast Region First Team, marking the third time in her four-year career that she is named to an All-Region squad. Nasti goes down as the best hitter in UB softball history with a .387 career batting average, 27 career home runs and 113 career RBIs.

April 21, 2005: Freshman Laura Kor hits three home runs in the doubleheader and senior Stacey Evans records her 500th career strikeout in a sweep of Youngstown State.

April 25, 2005: Sophomore Sophie Barstad is named MAC Pitcher of the Week for the first time in her career.

May 7, 2005: The Bulls earned their first ever trip to the Mid-American Conference Tournament after a doubleheader sweep of Ohio.

May 9, 2005: Melissa Pace and Stacey Evans sweep the MAC weekly awards after the team earned its first ever trip to the MAC Tournament.

May 9, 2005: Freshman Marcy Hansen is named to the All-MAC second team.

May 12, 2005: Bulls win their first ever MAC Tournament game, a 2-0 victory over Kent State.

May 2005: Buffalo's 2005 team award winners are announced by head coach Marie Curran. Junior Sophie Barstad is named Most Valuable Player, freshman Marcy Hansen is named Top Newcomer, freshman Laura Kor is named Most Improved and senior Julie Hibner receives the Coaches' Award.

May 19, 2005: Seniors Stacey Evans, Ann Magur and Melissa Pace are all named to the Academic All-MAC Team.

March 11, 2006: With a win over Boston University, head coach Marie Curran becomes the first UB skipper to win 100 games.

March 20, 2006: Junior Sophie Barstad is named MAC East Player of the Week for the first time in her career following a 10-game stretch in which the pitcher batted 393 with 12 RBIs.

May 6, 2006: The Bulls begin the final weekend of their 2006 season with a dramatic come-from-behind 6-5 victory over Miami (OH), scoring two runs in the bottom of the seventh on back-to-back home runs by juniors Colleen Greene and Mary Russell.

May 8, 2006: Buffalo's 2006 award winners are announced by head coach Marie Curran. Senior Lauren Picciano is named Most Outstanding Player, freshman Erin Zilka is named Top Newcomer, freshman Jennifer Biernacki received the Coaches' Award and Dana Carter is named Most Improved Player.

May 10, 2006: Freshman Erin Zilka caps off an impressive first season for the Bulls, as she is one of 10 players named to the 2006 MAC All-Freshman team.

April 2, 2007: Lacy Schneider named MAC East Player of the week for the first time in her career after batting .500 (6-for-12) in the opening weekend of league play against Toledo and Bowling Green.

March 4, 2008: Mary Russell named MAC East Player of the week for the first time in her career after an excellent weekend at the 2008 Frost Classic, leading the Bulls offensively while playing a huge role in Buffalo's first win of the season, an 11-6 victory over Marshall. Russell finished the weekend with a .429 batting average (6-for-14) with six RBIs and two homeruns. Russell would go on to earn the MAC East Player of the week again for the week of May 6, 2008.

March 13, 2008: Sharon Barr named MAC East Player of the week for the first time in her career after exceptional play at the 2008 Kansas Invitational. Barr finished the weekend with a .875 batting average (7-for-8) with two RBIs and two doubles. Additionally, Barr finished the weekend with a slugging percentage of 1.125%, an on base percentage of .875% and one stolen base.

April 22, 2008: Kristen Galliapani named MAC East player of the week for the first time in her career after batting .412 (7-for-17) with seven RBIs, four homeruns and a 1.118 slugging percentage, in the Bulls' 6-0 win over St. Bonaventure, Buffalo's 4-3 extra-inning victory over Ball State on Saturday, stroking a first-pitch walk-off homerun.

May 15, 2008: Mary Russell named to 2008 Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I All-Mideast Region Second Team, the first time that she has been named to an All-Region squad in her career at UB. She was also named to the Academic All-MAC team, as well as the All-MAC second team at the conclusion of her senior season.

July 15, 2008: Jennifer Teague named the seventh head softball coach in school history and just the second in the Division I era, after spending the previous three seasons at MAC rival Eastern Michigan as the top assistant.

March 24, 2009: Kristin Waldron named MAC East player of the week for the first time in her career after impressive play at the 2009 Lady Pirates Classic, leading the Bulls offensively, with a .467 batting average and a .733 slugging percentage. The freshman went 7 for 15 with two triples and eight RBIs.

May 15, 2009: After tying a single season record for most wins, the UB softball team announced its team awards, with Kristin Waldron and Erin Zilka earning Most Valuable offensive and defensive players, respectively. Jamie Sheffler was selected as the Most Improved, Terese Diaz was awarded the Ace in the Circle Award, and the True Blue Award went to Dominique Carcone.

March 2, 2010: Kristin Waldron earned the Mid-American Conference East Division Player of the Week Award for her performance at the McNeese State University Cowgirl Classic Tournament last weekend. Waldron led the team with a batting average of .636 and a slugging percentage of .909. Waldron finished the weekend with seven hits, one double, one single and three RBIs, including one in Buffalo's win over Louisiana Tech.

April 14, 2010: Terese Diaz pitched a no-hitter in UB's 7-0 win over St. Bonaventure. Diaz pitched the complete game, earning her first career no-hitter, striking out 16 batters in seven innings of work. The 16 strikeouts marks a new school record for most strikeouts in a game, with the previous record being 12.

April 20, 2010: Kristin Waldron earned the Mid-American Conference East Division Player of the Week Award after an outstanding week of play against St. Bonaventure and MAC rivals Ball State and Miami. Waldron led the team in most aspects of play, as she finished the week with a .476 batting average and a .810 slugging percentage. Waldron went 10 for 21 at the plate, including six RBIs, two doubles, a triple and a home run.

May 9, 2010: The Bulls swept Toledo in the final regular season weekend, earning just their second ever trip to the Mid-American Conference Tournament. The Bulls went 0-2 in the tournament.

May 12, 2010: Ashley Bertot was named to the Mid-American Conference All-Freshman team. Bertot set the school record for single season stolen bases and started in all 36 games she appeared in for Buffalo.

May 25, 2010: The Bulls announced their 2010 team awards. Kristin Waldron was named Offensive MVP, while Alyssa Ward was named Defensive MVP. Kate Kraus was selected as Most Improved Player, while Terese Diaz was named as the Ace In The Circle. Senior Sharon Barr was given the True Blue Award.

April 5, 2011: Freshman Tori Speckman was named the MAC East Pitcher of the Week after the Bulls went 3-1 in a weekend against Toledo and Bowling Green. She went 3-0 on the weekend, with an ERA of just 1.50 and 15 strikeouts.

ALL-TIME RECORD BOOK

May 11, 2011: The Bulls had two players honored by the Mid-American Conference when the league announced its postseason awards. Junior Kristin Waldron was named to the All-MAC Second Team, while outfielder Holly Luciano was named to the All-MAC Freshman Team.

May 23, 2011: Following the season, the Bulls announced their 2011 Team Awards. Alyssa Ward was selected as the team's Top Offensive Player, while Alex Bejarano was named the Top Defensive Player. Freshman Holly Luciano was named Most Improved and Tori Speckman was named the Ace In The Circle. Finally, Danielle Fields was honored with the True Blue Award.

March 17, 2012: The Bulls knocked off #15 Baylor, 1-0, on a two-hit shutout from senior Holly Johnson. It was UB's third ever victory over a ranked team and the first time since defeating Baylor in 2003.

April 10, 2012: Freshman Alexis Curtiss was named the MAC East Player of the Week following a six-game set where she hit .500 including two four-hit games in the stretch, tying a school record for hits in a game. She added four doubles and a home run during the week, slugging .818 in the process.

April 11, 2012: Junior Alyssa Ward hit the first cycle in UB's Division I history during a 10-2 victory over Canisius. Ward drove in six runs in the victory.

April 15, 2012: The Bulls turned a crucial seventh-inning double play to defeat the MAC West-leading Western Michigan Broncos. With a one-run lead and a runner at third, freshman Karly Nevez caught a fly ball in left field and threw out the Western Michigan runner at home to preserve the victory.

April 17, 2012: Buffalo picked up its second straight MAC East Player of the Week honor as junior Alyssa Ward was honored by the conference office. She batted .625 overall, helping Buffalo to victories over Canisius, Northern Illinois and Western Michigan.

April 29, 2012: Buffalo announced its end of the year awards at its annual banquet held the evening of its last home game. Freshman Alexis Curtiss was named the team's Most Valuable Player on both offensive and defense and fellow freshman Karly Nevez was named the Most Improved Player. Sophomore Tori Speckman was named the Ace In The Circle and freshman Nora McGuire was honored with the True Blue Award.

May 8, 2012: Freshman Alexis Curtiss and sophomore Sammi Gallardo were honored by the conference office as Curtiss was named to the All-MAC First Team and Freshman Team, while Gallardo was named to the All-MAC Second Team. Curtiss became just the third UB player in school history named to the First Team.

May 7, 2013: Junior Tori Speckman was named second-team All-MAC just the second pitcher honored by the conference and the first since 2004.

May 13, 2013: Buffalo announced its end of the year awards at its annual banquet held the evening of its last home game. Junior Tori Speckman was named the Ace in the Circle, while classmate Sammi Gallardo was named the team's most valuable offensive player. Senior Alyssa Ward was named the team's defensive MVP, while Kenzie Koch and Ryleigh Fitzgerald split top newcomer honors. For the second straight year, Nora McGuire was honored with the True Blue Award.

July 12, 2013: Trena Peel was named the eighth head coach in the history of the Buffalo softball program and the third at the Division I level. Peel was most recently at Hampton University and played her college ball at LSU.

February 7, 2014: The Bulls set single-game records for runs scored and runs batted in during a 19-5 victory over Southern on the first day of the season. The Bulls scored 29 runs in the doubleheader sweep of Southern, outscoring the Jaguars 29-6 in the two games.

February 9, 2014: The Bulls opened the season with a 6-0 record, its best start in school history. UB swept the conference players of the week awards following the weekend.

February 10, 2014: UB sweeps the season-opening MAC East Division Player of the Week awards as senior Tori Speckman was named pitcher of the week and senior outfielder Holly Luciano was named Player of the Week after recording nine runs batted in during the opening weekend of play.

March 17, 2014: Senior Tori Speckman was named the MAC East Pitcher of the Week after not allowing an earned run over 21.0 innings.

April 5, 2014: Senior Tori Speckman threw just the third no-hitter in school history as the Bulls opened Mid-American Conference play with a 4-0 win at Ohio.

April 7, 2014: Senior Tori Speckman was named the MAC East Pitcher of the Week for the third time during the season, splitting the award during the week. She pitched her first career no-hitter in the MAC opening win over Ohio.

April 15, 2014: Senior shortstop Sammi Gallardo was named the MAC East Player of the Week after hitting .421 in six games, hitting six home runs, all at home.

April 18, 2014: Senior Sammi Gallardo hit her 11th home run of the season in the second game of a double header against Bowling Green to set the single-season home runs record. Also set the single-season record for runs scored with her 28th of the year in the game.

April 25, 2014: Senior Tori Speckman picked up the victory in a 6-2 win over Western Michigan, winning her 15th game of the season, setting a new single-season record. The win began a stretch of seven straight victories, finishing the year with 22.

April 25, 2014: Senior Sammi Gallardo hit two home runs in a 6-5 win at Western Michigan, setting the new UB career record for home runs.

April 27, 2014: Senior Tori Speckman defeated Northern Illinois 6-2, winning her 43rd game of her career, setting a new career record. Speckman finished her career with 48 victories, six more than second place.

April 28, 2014: Seniors Tori Speckman and Sammi Gallardo swept the MAC East Weekly Awards as Speckman led the Bulls to three victories during the week, capped off with an 11-strikeout performance against Northern Illinois. Gallardo hit .500 during the weekend as the Bulls picked up their first ever four-game road MAC Sweep against NIU and Western Michigan.

May 3, 2014: Tori Speckman throws her second no-hitter of the season as the Bulls shut out Kent State 9-0 in a five inning game. Speckman became the first player in school history with two no hitters thrown in the same season.

May 4, 2014: The Bulls defeated Kent State 2-1 to clinch their first ever Mid-American Conference East Division title.

May 6, 2014: The Bulls sweep the MAC East Player of the Week awards for one final time in 2014 as senior Tori Speckman and junior Hayley Barrow are honored. Speckman picked up a pair of wins in leading UB to the Division title, as well as becoming the first player in school history to throw two no hitters in the same season. Barrow went 4-for-6 from the plate and hit the go-ahead home run in UB's division-clinching victory.

May 6, 2014: UB placed three seniors on the All-MAC First Team in Tori Speckman, Holly Luciano and Sammi Gallardo. It was the first time that UB had ever put three on the All-MAC First Team.

May 7, 2014: Senior Tori Speckman set the UB record for single-season strikeouts as she recorded seven in UB's victory over Northern Illinois to open the MAC Tournament. Speckman finished the year with 228 punchouts, 23 more than second on the list.

May 8, 2014: Senior Holly Luciano scored her 94th career run in a 12-1 win over Central Michigan in the MAC Tournament, becoming UB's all-time leader in runs scored.

May 15, 2014: Senior Holly Luciano was named to the NFCA All-Region Third Team, the first UB player named to that team since 2008.

February 10, 2015: Senior Alexis Curtiss was named MAC East Player of the Week after she batted .562 with five doubles during the opening weekend of play.

March 31, 2015: UB signed 12-year old Maddie Nadrich to an NLI, making her the youngest member of the UB softball team. Nadrich was paired up with the softball program through a program called Team IMPACT.

April 18, 2015: Senior Alexis Curtiss recorded her 20th double of the season, setting a new single-season doubles record.

May 1, 2015: Senior Hayley Barrow hit a walk-off home run in extra innings as the Bulls defeated Northern Illinois, 5-4.

May 3, 2015: Senior Alexis Curtiss record her 198th hit in her final at bat of the season, setting a new school record for career hits, surpassing Breanne Nasti.

May 5, 2015: Senior Alexis Curtiss became just the second UB player ever named to the All-MAC First Team twice in her career, while Leandra Jew became the first player named to the MAC's All-Freshman Team since Curtiss in 2012.

May 6, 2015: Senior Alexis Curtiss was named first-team Academic All-District.

May 14, 2015: Senior Alexis Curtiss was named to the NFCA All-Region First Team, becoming just the second player in school history named to the first team and the first since 2004.

March 15, 2016: Freshman Katie Weimer is named the MAC East player of the week after batting .706 over five games played with three home runs.

April 10, 2017: Junior pitcher Charlotte Miller was named MAC East Pitcher of the Week after earning a 2-1 record while posting a 0.30 ERA and striking out 21 batters.

May 9, 2017: Sophomore Ally Power was named to the All-MAC Second Team, while Jenelle Martinez and Jessica Goldyn were named to the All-MAC Freshman Team.

July 25, 2017: Former Buffalo standout Tori Speckman (Schmidt) returns to UB as the Bulls pitching coach.

August 17, 2017: Mike Roberts named fourth head coach in UB softball division I history. Roberts comes to Buffalo after spending two successful seasons at the University of Washington as the Huskies pitching coach.

February 10, 2018: Bulls collect first win under Mike Roberts, defeating Appalachian State 5-2.

March 27, 2018: Junior pitcher Ally Power was named MAC East Pitcher of the Week as she went 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA as she went 10 innings of scoreless ball. The junior opened the weekend with her first career no-hitter as she notched a total of 10 strikeouts through a pair of five-inning victories for the Bulls.

May 5, 2018: Leandra Jew ties the program record for career runs scored (95) in the season finale against Miami (OH).

May 8, 2018: Freshman Anna Aguon was named to the All-MAC First Team and All-Freshman team, while Jenelle Martinez earned All-MAC second team honors.

August 31, 2018: Courtney Radke hired as assistant coach. Radke came to Buffalo after spending two seasons as pitching coach at division II West Virginia Wesleyan College in Buckhannon, WV.

February 15, 2019: Bulls collect first win under Ruechel, defeating Nebraska-Omaha 4-1.

May 2, 2019: Buffalo removes Interim Tag from Head Coach Mike Ruechel.

May 3, 2018: Alexis Matheney sets the single-season program record for walks (30) in the final series of the regular season against Ohio.

May 8, 2019: Sophomore Anna Aguon and junior Jenelle Martinez were named to the All-MAC First Team, while Alexis Matheney was named to the All-Freshman team.

March 12, 2020: After 13 games, the 2020 season was cancelled due to health concerns surrounding COVID-19.

April 25, 2021: The Bulls set the single-season program home run record in a win over Central Michigan.

April 28, 2021: Anna Aguon sets the program runs scored record in a win over Kent State.
