



CENTENNIAL

Small town. Big school.

UC Davis is ranked 16th among public universities nationwide by the National Research Council, is listed 11th among public universities nationwide by U.S. News & World Report; and is 10th in research funding among all U.S. ranked public universities by the National Science Foundation. The campus is a member of the prestigious Association of American Universities, one of just 62 institutions of higher learning to be admitted to this distinguished group.

Founded in 1908 as the University Farm amid the fertile fields of the state's Central Valley, UC Davis embarks on a centennial celebration during the 2008-09 academic year. The campus encompasses the colleges of Letters and Science, Engineering, Biological Sciences, and Agricultural and Environmental Sciences; and professional schools in Law, Management, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, and Education. It also operates the UC Davis Medical Center in Sacramento, one of the leading teaching and research hospitals in the nation. In 2007, the campus announced a \$100 million in founding support from the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation to launch the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing.

This is a period of growth and change for UC Davis. The campus has seen growth in student, faculty and staff populations and is in the midst of more than \$1 billion in new construction. New facilities do or will include new laboratories, new classrooms and new student sports and recreation facilities. Thanks to the generosity of one of the world's most renowned winemakers,

groundbreaking took place in 2005 on the Robert Mondavi Institute for Wine and Food Science. The Robert and Margrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts opened in 2002 and is a showcase part of the campus.

UC Davis has enjoyed a distinguished history in athletics as it continues a new era in NCAA Division I. The Aggies are official members in most sports in the Big West Conference which includes fellow UC campuses Irvine, Riverside and Santa Barbara. The transition to Division I brought to an end a successful Division II era in which UC Davis captured six Directors' Cups in eight years, awarded annually to the most successful athletics program in the country. UC Davis also twice received recognition from Sports Illustrated for Women as the top Div. II school for women while Sports Illustrated has also previously honored the institution. In addition to 26 varsity sports (14 for women and 12 for men), the campus offers nearly 40 student-organized club sports. Women's field hockey will become the 27th varsity sport when it begins competition in 2009. And each year, more than 19,000 students participate in intramural sports.

All students can enjoy abundant on- and off-campus recreational facilities for tennis, softball, basketball, volleyball and golf. Given the area's Mediterranean climate, outdoor recreation continues year round. The program is also among the nation's leaders in NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship recipients and has had three winners of the prestigious NCAA Woman of the Year Award, tied for the most among all schools in the country.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Listed below are media policies and information to assist you in your coverage of the Aggies. Please let us know how we may serve you throughout upcoming football season.

Note: all policies are tentative. Please consult the weekly game notes for any changes in media policies.

INTERVIEWS

Media are requested to provide at least 24 hours notice to help ensure player/coach availability and to confirm practice times. Players will return phone calls (collect, if necessary) when requested. Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided at any time. Media are encouraged to conduct interviews after practice due to better player availability. Practices are open to the media and conducted primarily on Howard Field (next to Toomey Field).

CREDENTIALS

Media credentials must be requested by Thursdays at noon, either by email or phone call to Mike Robles. Credentials will be available on gameday at the West entrance to Aggie Stadium. Access to the sidelines is limited to teams, game personnel and working media. All media must have a game-specific sideline credential and remain outside the team areas (which are between the 25-yard lines) at all times.

PARKING

On practice days, park in any non-metered, general spot and place a media business card in the lower-left area of the dashboard. Parking is available in the parking structure adjacent to Toomey Field. On game days, Lot 53 (southwest of Aggie Stadium) will be available

to media on a first-come, first-served basis. Television stations wishing to set up for live broadcasts should contact Mike Robles during the week before the game for suitable locations.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

The press box at Aggie Stadium, while more spacious than the Toomey Field box, has limited seating and is available to media on a priority basis. High-speed internet access is available along with phone lines to transmit stories.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Head coach Bob Biggs and selected players will be available 15 minutes after the game in the media room on the north end of Aggie Stadium. Interviews with visiting coaches and players are at the discretion of the visiting team's sports information director but are generally available outside the entrance of the team's locker room or on the field. Locker rooms for both teams are closed to the media at all times.

STATISTICS

Statistics will be provided throughout the game. Full stat packets, including scoring summary, play-by-play, and team and individual stats, will be available following the game and distributed at the post-game press conference.

RADIO LINE

A courtesy phone line is available in the visiting radio booth. Dial "9" to access outside line. Please contact Mike Robles for any special telecommunication needs.

ON THE ROAD

Mike Robles travels with the Aggies and can help arrange player/coach interviews. Contact him via cell phone. No interviews will be granted on gameday prior to kickoff. Robles will assist in postgame interviews either on the field, at the locker room or in another designated location.



BIGGS**

Head Coach
17th year as head coach
32nd year overall

Ask anyone close to the UC Davis football program about its head coach and you'll tend to get the same response: "Not your typical football coach."

The compliment fits Bob Biggs. Despite running a program that played at the highest levels nationally at the NCAA Division II level and one that is quickly rising among the ranks of the Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), Biggs has remained an accessible and engaging leader of the Aggies.

Biggs' stamp on the football program at UC Davis is one of success, intensity and intelligence that carried his teams to eight playoff appearances and an average of nine wins per year during his first decade.

Now the second-winningest football coach in UC Davis history, Biggs trails only his mentor, Jim Sochor, on the all-time coaching victories list. His first win in the 1999 season was his 50th, making him one of the quickest coaches to reach that plateau in the nation regardless of division. With a win over former Great West Conference rival Northern Colorado in 2004, Biggs hit his 100th career win in just his 12th year.

In 1993 and 2000, he was named American Football Coaches Association's Region 5 College Division Coach of the Year. In 2002, he won Coach of the Year honors for the inaugural Independent Football Alliance.

Biggs has created an atmosphere in the Aggie football program that has maintained a level of relative continuity at UC Davis. Two assistants – offensive coordinator Mike Moroski and special teams/running backs coach Greg Chapla – are amidst their third decade on the Aggie coaching staff. A third assistant, defensive coordinator Mark Johnson, has returned to the program after a successful tenure at Utah State.

On the field, the offensive system developed by Biggs and Moroski has dumbfounded opponents and attracted top recruits who are seeking a balanced, intricate pro-style offense. Biggs, previously the quarterbacks coach, has seen four of his protégés enter the professional ranks. Khari Jones (1991-93) earned Canadian Football League MVP honors in 2001, Mark Grieb (1994-96) earned Arena Bowl MVP for the San Jose Sabercats in 2007, and Kevin Daft (1996-98) was a fifth-round draft choice of the Tennessee Titans in 1999.

Most recently, J.T. O'Sullivan (1999-2001) was selected in the sixth round by the New Orleans Saints in 2002 and was chosen as Co-Offensive MVP of NFL Europe in 2007. In 2008, he was named as starting quarterback for the San Francisco 49ers. Currently, O'Sullivan is a member of the Cincinnati Bengals.

Under Biggs' guidance, the Aggies consistently ranked among the top Division II teams in the nation in total offense. In 2000, UC Davis averaged almost 520 yards per game, ranking among the national leaders during the regular season.

Biggs had similar success as a UC Davis quarterback. His legend was sealed in 1971 when he was the quarterback for the Aggies' "Miracle Win" over Cal State Hayward. In that game, he directed a comeback that featured 16 points in the final 20 seconds and resulted in a 30-29

victory. That win paved the way for the first of UC Davis' national-record 20 straight league titles.

During his senior year in 1972, Biggs averaged 272.8 yards per game in total offense and was the leading passer in the nation at Division II (then known as the College Division). That year, he also became the Aggies' first 2,000-yard passer, while setting the school record for attempts with 387, a mark that stayed intact for 21 years. He had four 300-yard passing games that fall, including a 399-yard day at San Francisco State.

In his final game as a collegian, Biggs led UC Davis to Atlantic City, N.J., for the NCAA's Boardwalk Bowl and a clash with Massachusetts. Playing the entire game with a broken finger, he set two national records in the Aggies' 35-14 loss. His record 59 passes that day established a Division II postseason record.

Biggs, a member of the Cal Aggie Athletics Hall of Fame, was an Associated Press Little All-American that season. He graduated in 1973 with a double major in political science and history.

Biggs played professionally with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League and the Portland Storm of the World Football League. He also spent time in the training camp of the NFL's Denver Broncos.

Biggs came back to his alma mater to join the coaching staff in 1978. He became the offensive coordinator in 1987 and was the assistant head coach in 1991 and 1992 before taking the head coaching position in 1993.

In his first year as head football coach, the Aggies went 10-2, were co-champions of the American West Conference and reached the second round of the NCAA Playoffs for the first time in 10 years. He was also named AFCA Region Coach of the Year.

Biggs also served as head men's tennis coach from 1979 through 1988. In that span, he guided the Aggies to five NCAA Championships appearances, including a third-place finish in 1986.

Bob and his wife Diane have two sons, Ryan and Kyle.



COACHING STAFF



MIKE MOROSKI

Offensive Coordinator
Offensive Line
22nd Year

In more than 20 years at the helm of the Aggie offense, Moroski has developed one of the most prodigious systems in college football. The 2000 squad averaged just shy of 520 yards and 47 points per game, finishing second among Division II teams in each category. The 2001 team again ranked among the top 10 in those departments, totalling 511 yards and 41 points per contest during the regular season.

Like head coach Bob Biggs, Moroski is among the most successful quarterbacks in the history of a program that has produced a seemingly endless line of great passers. In his career from 1975 to 1978, he set numerous school records and earned back-to-back Far West Conference Player of the Year honors in his final two seasons. Additionally, Moroski was one of the top pitchers on the Aggie baseball team. He was enshrined into the Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame in 1985.

Moroski was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons in the sixth round – 154th overall – of the 1979 draft, becoming the first UC Davis quarterback to achieve active status in the NFL. He played for Atlanta (1979-84), Houston (1985) and San Francisco (1986). Moroski has the honor of being one of a handful of quarterbacks who has thrown a touchdown pass to the legendary Jerry Rice. After his NFL career, he returned to his alma mater in 1988 to coach the junior varsity team. He has remained at UC Davis since then, moving up the ladder to his current role as offensive coordinator.

Originally from Novato, Calif., Moroski completed his bachelor's degree in managerial economics in 1979 then earned a teaching credential in mathematics and a master's degree in educational psychology. He and wife, Cathie, reside in Davis. They have four children, Nate, Will, Ben and Emilie.



MARK JOHNSON

Defensive Coordinator
10th Year

Coach Johnson returns to UC Davis with his fourth stint at his alma mater, this time as a defensive coordinator. He replaces his former mentor Steve "Lou" Bronzan in that role.

Johnson previously served four years in a different Aggie program – Utah State – as both D.C. and linebackers coach. In 2005, the first season under his tutelage, USU ranked among the Western Athletic Conference leaders in rushing defense, passing defense and total defense.

After his playing career at UC Davis, Johnson served as a linebackers coach and head coach for the freshman team in from 1990 to 1994. He then spent a year as a graduate assistant at Oregon in 1995, helping the Ducks advance to the Cotton Bowl. Johnson subsequently mentored San Jose State's running backs in 1996 before returning to UC Davis to assist Fred Arp and former Aggie coach Tony Franks on defensive line and linebackers, respectively.

The Vacaville, Calif. native then returned to the Division I ranks the following year, serving as defensive line coach at Boise State from 1998 to 1999, where he teamed up with another former Aggie, then-assistant Dan Hawkins. Johnson then joined the Nevada staff in 2000 and 2001 before making his third stop at UC Davis as a linebackers coach from 2002 to 2004.

Johnson played linebacker for UC Davis before graduating in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in sociology. He later earned his master's in recreation administration from Sacramento State in 1994. He and his wife Amy reside in Woodland with their son Cooper and daughter Olivia.

In 1999, the national attention fell upon a soft-spoken reserve running back from La Cañada, Calif. Sam Paneno had appeared in eight



games as a redshirt freshman in 1998. The bulk of his action had come in a home game against Western Oregon, when he rushed for 107 yards on just 15 carries - more than half of his career numbers up to that point. On September 11, the second game of his junior year, Paneno earned his first career start at running back. Coincidentally, the opponent was Western Oregon. He responded to the call by rushing for a career-high 114 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

On the first play of overtime, Paneno dislocated his right knee. He received treatment at a Salem, Ore. hospital, and later, at the UC Davis Medical Center. But the injury had disrupted the blood flow to the lower leg and foot. Paneno underwent emergency surgery, and blood flow was restored. However, complications arose from the initial injury and after further procedures, a team of UCDCM orthopedic surgeons deemed it necessary to amputate the lower portion of his right leg. The amputation surgery was performed on September 20, nine days after the game at WOU.

Support for Paneno came from all parts of the country. The host of the NCAA D-II Championships in Montgomery, Ala., created a website for fans to offer prayers and words of encouragement. Hundreds of sentiments flooded the website, including those from fellow collegiate players who only knew the name UC Davis from national rankings and past playoff results.

Paneno paid his first visit to his teammates the following week after the surgery. Wrote Brandon Frink of the *Davis Enterprise*, he "delivered himself to practice wearing a wheelchair and a smile." His positive attitude despite his ordeal proved to be an inspiration for all. Paneno displayed strength where someone else may have shown despair. He felt gratitude to his family, faith and friends, but never felt self-pity. And while ESPN had arrived on campus on September 20 to report on an athlete's tragedy, CBS Sports, Sports Illustrated and even People Weekly later paid visits to UC Davis to report on an athlete's courage. Ever the active person, Paneno was later fitted with two different prosthetic legs - one for "everyday" use and the other allowing him to resume to such pastimes as running, surfing, even rock-climbing.

The UC Davis football team retired his No. 25 jersey the following year. Miami Dolphins' lineman Trace Armstrong was so touched by seeing Paneno's story as part of the CBS halftime report on Thanksgiving Day, that he invited him to attend the Raiders-Dolphins game as a guest of the team. In 2001, Paneno was formally honored by the NCAA when he was named co-winner of the inaugural Inspiration Award, bestowed upon a former student-athlete who has displayed "perseverance, dedication and determination" to overcome a life-altering event.

Paneno continued his ties with the UC Davis campus, later graduating from the King Hall School of Law. He now serves as an attorney for the Alliance for Children's Rights, a non-profit organization dedicated to protecting the rights of abused and impoverished youths throughout Los Angeles County.

Phil Swimley, although better known as the longtime UC Davis baseball coach, also served as a football assistant during the first half of his 36-year career with the Aggies.




A Warm Welcome







Kevin Jurovich caught a 17-yard touchdown pass from Kyle Reed with eight seconds remaining as San Jose State rallied for a 13-10 nonconference win over UC Davis, thwarting the Aggies' attempt to beat an NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision opponent for the second time in three years.

Bakari Grant had eight catches for a game-high 108 yards, including a 54-yard touchdown grab early in the first quarter, while quarterback Daniel Alfaro - making his first career start - played very well by completing 21 of 34 passes for 193 yards. He was intercepted twice. Cornerback Jeremy Scott had eight total tackles while defensive end Steven Wulff had two sacks, an interception and a fumble recovery.

UC Davis began its final drive at its own 27-yard line with 3 minutes, 30 seconds to go and San Jose State out of timeouts. The Aggies, though, were unable to get a first down and were forced to punt, giving the ball to the Spartans on their own 36 with 1:23 to go. A 37-yard completion to Jurovich set the ball at the UC Davis 14 with around 40 seconds to go.

Faced with a 3rd-and-10 at the 14, San Jose took a three-yard loss when Wulff sacked Reed with the clock winding down. Reed, though, threw into the middle of the field just past the goal line, hitting Jurovich for the go-ahead score with only eight ticks to go. UC Davis had one play following the kickoff but its final pass fell incomplete.

UC Davis receiver Chris Carter caught 13 passes for 189 yards – both career-highs – and scored two touchdowns, but No. 22 Central Arkansas held on to a 24-21 non-conference win before 10,188 fans at Estes Stadium after picking off a pass in the endzone in the final minute.

The late interception ended a final rally by UC Davis, which trailed 17-0 in the third quarter before twice battling back to within three points. The Aggies started their final drive at their own 20-yard line with 4 minutes, 39 seconds remaining and moved to the Bears' 29 with under a minute to play. However, defensive back Anthony Gambles intercepted UC Davis quarterback Greg Denham's pass near the goal-line, preserving the win.

GAME 3: UC Davis 38, Portland State 24

Joe Trombetta rushed for 156 yards and two touchdowns and Greg Denham threw for 361 yards – including 137 to receiver Brandon Rice – as UC Davis rolled up 588 yards of total offense in a 38-24 nonconference football win during the first-ever night game at Aggie Stadium.

The Aggies also picked up a key play on special teams when Patrick Shelton knocked the ball out the hands of the Vikings' Aaron Woods at the two-yard line after Woods had returned a kickoff 81 yards in the fourth quarter. The touchback gave UC Davis the ball at its own 20 and kept the score 38-24.

The Aggies led 21-7 at the end of the first quarter before Portland State answered with a pair of scores to tie the game. After leading 24-21 at halftime, UC Davis held the Vikings to a single field goal in the second half while picking up touchdown runs of two and 40 yards from Brandon Tucker to pull away for the win.

Trombetta picked up his fourth career 100-yard rushing effort, totaling his second-highest career yardage. He carried the ball 21 times, scoring on an 18-yard jaunt early in the first quarter to stake the Aggies to a 7-0 lead, and then adding a long 58-yarder late in the period to help put UC Davis in front 21-7.

UC Davis, which fell to 5-5, was led by 114 rushing yards from Joe Trombetta, 307 passing yards from quarterback Greg Denham and 139 all-purpose yards and a touchdown from receiver Chris Carter. Linebacker Mike Morales paced the defense with 10 tackles.

The Aggies got the ball back at their own 44 with just under two minutes to go but San Diego got an eight-yard sack on second down and Denham's fourth down pass to Conor Kirkpatrick fell incomplete to stall the comeback attempt.


Drafted in 1983, the "Year of the Quarterback," Ken O'Brien led the AFC in passing in 1985. He passed for 25,094 yards during his career, placing him just ahead of Bob Griese on the all-time NFL career list.



Rolf Benirschke set San Diego Charger records for career field goals (146) and scoring (766) and is a member of that team's Hall of Fame. He is also the author of Alive And Kicking, which chronicles his heroic battle with ulcerative colitis.



Kevin Daft continued the tradition of great Aggie quarterbacks moving up to the pro ranks in 1999. The following summer, Daft led NFL Europe in passing as a member of the Scottish Claymores.



Nine years after his outstanding career at UC Davis, Winnipeg Blue Bombers quarterback Khari Jones was named Most Valuable Player of the Canadian Football League.



In 2004 and 2007, J.T. O'Sullivan led the Frankfort Galaxy to NFL Europe's World Bowl. He was chosen as co-Offensive MVP in the league's final year, posting a 104.8 passer's rating in 2007.

CAL AGGIE ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

The Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 1980 to provide special recognition for outstanding accomplishment in intercollegiate athletics.

To be considered for the Hall of Fame, a participant must have competed with unusual distinction in an intercollegiate sport for at least two seasons, achieved recognition at the conference, regional or preferably national levels, and achieved this accomplishment in a manner that exemplifies the UC Davis concept of a student-athlete.


Furthermore, a five-year period must elapse from the most recent participation in athletics before a student-athlete becomes eligible for induction.

ACADEMICS

UC Davis comprises three colleges (Agricultural & Environmental Sciences, Engineering, Letters & Science), five professional schools (Education, Law, Management, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine) plus the Division of Biological Sciences.

With 103 undergraduate majors and 80 graduate programs, the university offers the most expansive and diverse range of academics among any of the University of California campuses. Additionally, students also have the opportunity to combine majors or customize their field of study by creating an individual major.

For those interested in graduate degrees – whether it be a master's degree or a doctorate – UC Davis offers advising services to help students craft their education toward those goals. An estimated 86 percent of UC Davis students applying to graduate schools earn acceptance to either their first or second choices.

COMMUNITY

With a population of approximately 60 thousand, Davis is widely known for being a safe, active and socially innovative community.

The downtown area boasts a multitude of specialty shops, restaurants, theaters and art galleries; while the city's numerous parks offer recreational opportunities for active students.

ACTIVITIES

On campus, UC Davis students can rally around the highly successful athletics department by joining the Aggie Pack spirit organization, or enjoy a first-class performance at the Robert & Magrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts.

The university also offers hundreds of student clubs and organizations, including cultural clubs, fraternities and sororities, faith-based organizations and the Associated Students of UC Davis student government.

For the active Aggie, students may participate in the diverse intramural sports program or join one of the 30-plus sports clubs. In 2004, the Activities & Recreation Center (ARC) opened its doors, providing the campus with its own state-of-the-art fitness venue.

In April, UC Davis hosts Picnic Day, an annual student-run open house. The popular event showcases all that the campus has to offer, attracting students, staff, faculty, parents, alumni and members of the surrounding communities.

GETTING AROUND

Nestled just southwest of Sacramento, the city of Davis rests just 15 minutes from an international airport, and contains a downtown station serviced by Greyhound and Amtrak. Centrally located in the Sacramento Valley, the town sits equally close to both the finest ski resorts and the Pacific Ocean's top beaches.

Within Davis and its neighboring towns, both Yolo-bus and the student-operated Unitrans bus systems offer free transportation to registered undergraduates.

The town boasts more bicycles per capita than any other city in the nation. More than 50 miles of bike paths make the entire town conducive to both riders and pedestrians.

CAMPUS LEADERSHIP

LINDA KATEHI

Linda Katehi became the sixth chancellor of the University of California, Davis, on August 17, 2009. As chief executive officer, she oversees all aspects of the university's teaching, research and public service mission.

Chancellor Katehi (kah-TAY-hee) also holds UC Davis faculty appointments in electrical and computer engineering and in women and gender studies. A member of the National Academy of Engineering, she chairs the President's Committee for the National Medal of Science and is chair of the Secretary of Commerce's committee for the National Medal of Technology and Innovation. She is a fellow and board member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and a member of many other national boards and committees.

Previously, Chancellor Katehi served as provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign; the John A. Edwardson Dean of Engineering and professor of electrical and computer engineering at Purdue University; and associate dean for academic affairs and graduate education in the College of Engineering and professor of electrical engineering and

computer science at the University of Michigan.

Since her early years as a faculty member, Chancellor Katehi has focused on expanding research opportunities for undergraduates and improving the education and professional experience of graduate students, with an emphasis on underrepresented groups. She has mentored more than 70 postdoctoral fellows, doctoral and master's students in electrical and computer engineering. Twenty-one of the 42 doctoral students who graduated under her supervision have become faculty members in research universities in the United States and abroad.

Her work in electronic circuit design has led to numerous national and international awards both as a technical leader and educator, 16 U.S. patents, and an additional six U.S. patent applications. She is the author or co-author of 10 book chapters and about 600 refereed publications in journals and symposia proceedings.

She earned her bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from the National Technical University of Athens, Greece, in 1977, and her master's and doctoral degrees in electrical engineering from UCLA in 1981 and 1984, respectively.



FRED WOOD

Fred Wood assumed the role of Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs on August 1, 2007. Dr. Wood oversees programs and services that enhance the academic and personal development of students, including intercollegiate athletics. He also provides administrative leadership to a Division of over 50 student support programs and to a team of over 800 staff members. In addition, he manages a budget of over 30 million dollars. He advises the Chancellor on matters relating to students, enrollment, access, retention, and campus climate.

Wood earned his bachelor's and Ph.D. from UC Davis in Chemistry in 1980 and 1984. Soon after graduating, he began his faculty appointment in Chemistry and also served the College of Letters and Science as the Associate Dean, a position he held for 13 years. Most recently he served as the Associate Vice Provost of Undergraduate Studies and Interim Vice Provost of Undergraduate Studies. He is a 2003 graduate of the Harvard University Executive Leadership and Management Institute, and also a graduate of the University of California Management Institute.

Dr. Wood is a member of several professional organizations including American College Personnel Association, National Association of Student Personnel Administrators, and the National Association of College and University Busi-

ness Officers. He also serves on the Council of Deans and Vice Chancellors at UC Davis, as well as over twenty different committees and councils on and off campus.

Several priorities he is focusing on in Student Affairs include building bridges within Student Affairs and with academic affairs; increasing the diversity of our student population by reaching out to students who are disadvantaged and underrepresented; recruitment and admissions; increasing the number of students transferring to UC Davis from community colleges and helping with their transition; develop an inclusive community for all of our students; work to help new students effectively navigate the university; improve retention and graduation; improve accountability and transparency; improve student health; increase fundraising efforts to help support our units and their needs; maintaining affordability for students to attend college; and keeping up with the latest technology to provide our staff, faculty and students with the most up to date and accurate information.

Dr. Wood continues to teach undergraduate students while serving in his administrative role and maintaining a focus on continually improving the services available to undergraduate and graduate students.



UC DAVIS ATHLETICS



GREG WARZECKA

Director of Athletics

On August 1, 1995, Greg Warzecka became the 11th director of athletics at UC Davis. In the decade-plus since, the Aggie athletics program has enjoyed unprecedented success under his guidance.

Warzecka's penchant for progress began from his first year as director when he was charged with the task of fully engaging the campus in discussions regarding whether or not UC Davis would offer athletics-related financial aid. One year later, the campus announced the launch of its first-ever grant-in-aid program.

Warzecka has also overseen UC Davis' transition into two conferences in his short tenure. In 1998, the Aggies moved from the now-defunct Northern California Athletic Conference to the powerful California Collegiate Athletic Association.

Then in 2003, the UC Davis program announced that it would join the Big West Conference and thus reclassify from NCAA Division II to Division I status. Under Warzecka's guidance, the Aggie athletics program increased its grant-in-aid allocation nearly tenfold to approximately \$5 million. During this period, he also engineered a substantial upgrade in athletics facilities, most notably the Schaal Aquatics Center (2004), the Marya Welch Tennis Center (2005) and the multi-use Aggie Stadium (2007).

During Warzecka's tenure, UC Davis captured six NACDA Division II Directors' Cups as the most outstanding overall program in the country. For his part, NACDA selected Warzecka as its A.D. of the year for the D-II West Region in 2001-02.

Furthermore, the editors of *Sports Illustrated* magazine lauded the Aggie program on three different occasions. In 1999 and 2000, *Sports Illustrated For Women* named UC Davis as the top Division II school for women athletics. One year later, *SI* selected UC Davis as its top D-II school for the 2001-02 year.

Before turning to administration, Warzecka had been a successful baseball coach, first as an assistant at his alma mater, UC Berkeley. He then served as head coach at San Francisco State, then at the University of Chicago, where he also served his first post as men's athletics director. Warzecka returned to California in 1989 to become the A.D. at the University of Redlands, where he remained until he joined the Aggie athletics staff.

He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in physical education from Cal in 1975 and his Master of Science with an emphasis in athletic administration from Cal State Hayward in 1983.



NONA RICHARDSON

Senior Associate Director of Athletics/Senior Woman Administrator

Nona Richardson was named Senior Associate Athletics Director at UC Davis in March 2007. She brings extensive experience to her role at UC Davis which includes overseeing compliance, student services and sports medicine programs, as well as sport supervision.

Richardson has experienced intercollegiate athletics from a variety of roles, most recently during her tenure at Ball State, where she served as the senior woman administrator. There she oversaw daily operations for sports medicine, and strength and conditioning while also supervising seven sports, including women's basketball and women's volleyball. Her contributions at Ball State also included student-athlete services, community outreach programming, career development education, student-athlete awards, and other related areas while also serving as a Title IX and gender equity resource.

Prior to Ball State, Richardson was Associate Director of Athletics and SWA at Valparaiso University for seven years, where she served in similar capacities while also serving as Compliance Coordinator for the 18-sport athletics program. Her duties also involved student-athlete eligibility, event management and other key administrative responsibilities.

Richardson has served on numerous committees throughout her distinguished career, including the NCAA

Division I Volleyball Committee (2000-02) and Volleyball Officials Sub-Committee (2001-02). She has also been a member of committees for the Mid-Continent Conference and the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators (NACWAA), the latter for which she also served as a board member.

Richardson has presented at several national conferences, is a member of NACWAA and the National Association of Girls and Women in Sports, and has won several awards including NACWAA's Dr. Nell Jackson Award (2000).

Her athletics administrative tenure was preceded by a volleyball coaching career that was highlighted by head coaching positions at Eastern Michigan (1987-95) and Valparaiso (1996-99) and an assistant coaching assignment at Kentucky (1984-87). Richardson was also an assistant coach at the U.S. Olympic Sports Festival in 1991.

Richardson was a standout volleyball player at Michigan State (1978-81) where she was a team co-captain, MVP and a member of the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (IAIW) All-State team.

She received her Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education from Michigan State in 1983 and her Master of Arts and Liberal Studies in Human Behavior and Society from Valparaiso University in 1999.


LA RUE FIELD

Recognized in 1999 as "Softball Field of the Year" by the Sports Turf Managers Association, La Rue Field hosted five NCAA West Region Softball Championships in the past decade. Recent additions include batting cages, covered dugouts and improved press areas.

The Ted & Rand Schaal Aquatics Center hosted its first event in January of 2004. The complex features an Olympic-sized pool, locker rooms, team rooms, office space and permanent seating for approximately 500 spectators. The aquatics center will allow UC Davis to host championship events, including the 2006 NCAA Women's Water Polo Championships.

WOODY WILSON TRACK






DOBBINS BASEBALL COMPLEX

The initial design has seating for 11,000 to 15,000 spectators, with an eventual build-out to as many as 30,000.

UC Davis ranks among the leaders in NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Awards and Academic All-District/America honorees, and has claimed a record three winners of the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. Student-Athlete Academic Services deserves much of the credit for these accomplishments.

The office started in 1988 with a single staff member serving as a centralized resource for academic advising, eligibility information and campus referrals. The office has since expanded to include additional academic advisors, an athletic aid coordinator, an assistant eligibility coordinator and an administrative assistant. It is headed by Nona Richardson, senior associate director of athletics.

The Student-Athlete Academic Services office provides a range of services to student-athletes on all 26 intercollegiate athletics teams, including assistance with course and major selection as well as interpretation and clarification of eligibility rules and issues.

UC Davis student-athletes typically have a minimum of three academic advisors: an athletic academic advisor assigned by sport, a college advisor, and a major advisor (if the student has a declared major). Although appointments with the athletic academic advisors are not mandatory at UC Davis, student-athletes might choose to see their athletic academic advisor for issues including:

- General education (GE) requirements
- Dropping/adding courses
- Time management/study skills
- Assistance completing the mandatory Academic Plan Form
- Study hall for student-athletes
- Personal issues that affect academic performance
- Choosing a major/career
- Declaring or changing a major
- Exploration of opportunities beyond athletics
- Preparation for graduate programs
- Preparation and application for NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships and other national awards

Known collectively as “The Healer of Champions”, the UC Davis athletic training staff comprises five full-time certified athletic trainers, a full-time physical therapist/certified athletic trainer and approximately 24 student athletic trainers. Together, they are responsible for providing medical care to the 800-plus student-athletes that compose UC Davis’ 26 varsity teams.

The student athletic trainers serve two to three years with the program, logging in more than 1,500

hours and gaining valuable clinical education in a hands-on environment. The internship is ideal for any student interested in a graduate program in athletic training, as well as any medical or allied medical profession.

The ARC Pavilion training room contains extensive resources and equipment for the rehabilitation of injured athletes. The staff physical therapist is headquartered there as well.
