2004 Season Preview

Aggie Football Carries Longtime Tradition Into New Conference

Legendary musician Bob Dylan may have once sang, "The times they are a-changin' ", but that's a tune that could very well be the anthem for the UC Davis football team which continues to make strides to the world of NCAA Division I-AA. The Aggies, who begin the second of four years of reclassification to their new level, are surrounded by changes within the program.

For the first time since 1993, UC Davis finds itself a member of a conference. The Aggies are charter members of the Great West Football Conference, continuing or renewing rivalries with Cal Poly, Southern Utah and North Dakota State, while continuing to build one with Northern Colorado and looking to the future with South Dakota State.

The schedule - half of it occupied with conference foes - also continues to strengthen with 12th-year head coach Bob Biggs undoubtedly realizing this year's is the toughest in school history. Portland State and Weber State join fellow Big Sky Conference member Sacramento State on UC Davis' slate for the coming year, while nationally ranked Stephen F. Austin makes a visit to Toomey Field.

And speaking of Toomey Field, the venerable stadium is part of another change for UC Davis program which will find a new home being built across the campus with expected residency in 2006. Mix in a bevy of infrastructure and funding changes that will continue to take place during the next three seasons and it's easy to see why "the times they are a changin'."

One constant of the program, however, continues to be excellence. And while the times may indeed be changing, UC Davis continues to enjoy a legendary past, most noticeably in the form of 34 consecutive winning seasons. Without the possibility of postseason during the reclassification period, the winning streak sits atop team goals.

The Aggies, who return 15 starters overall including, six on offense, return experience on both sides of the ball as they look to continuing their winning ways in 2004. Biggs, meanwhile, is on pace for his 100th career winning, needing just four more to reach a plateau attained by only Jim Sochor (156 wins) in program history.

OFFENSE

Experience returns in the backfield, on the line and at the receiving positions for UC Davis, which last season averaged nearly 400 yards per game in total offense, including 252.5 through the air. Quarterback duties, however, be handled by someone new this season after the graduation of both Ryan Flanigan and Jon Barragan. Entering fall camp, no less than five players were competing for the signal-calling rights.

Sophomore Jon Grant is the only member of the quintet that has game experience at UC Davis, seeing action in four contests last year. The 2002 graduate of Pacific Grove HS threw his only touchdown pass to Ryan Smith in the Aggies' rout against Western Washington. However, practice experience with the Aggies' complicated offense will play to his favor this season.

Sophomore JC transfer Matt Engle, who threw for 2,500 yards and 21 TDs at El Camino College in Southern California last year, is one of two newcomers expected to also be in the hunt for the starting nod. Engle was a JC All-America in his only season at El Camino after throwing for 8,800 yards and 96 TDs in a standout career at El Segundo HS. Richard Schwartz, saw limited action in two seasons of playing time at UC Berkeley before transferring to UC Davis last spring. The junior from Huntington Beach threw for nearly 2,000 yards during his senior season at Edison HS.

Program returnees Bryan Lee-Lauduski and redshirt freshman Tim Plough also figure to make Biggs' decision a difficult one. Lee-Lauduski

enters his third season with the Aggies' program but has not seen any game time yet, while Plough redshirted last season after coming to UC Davis following a standout career at Ramona HS in Southern California where he tossed for 2,300 yards and 14 scores as a senior.

Whomever Biggs' tags for his starter will inherit an offensive line which graduated three players from last year, including two (Forest Vance and Brad Lekkerkerker) who eventually signed free-agent contracts in the NFL. Heading the list is senior captain Marc Manfreda (6-2, 302) who enters the 2004 campaign with 28 consecutive starts and is one of two members of this year's line that will garner looks from the pro scouts. The other is the other half of the Lekkerkerker tandem, Brad's brother, Cory. Cory (6-7, 324) might be younger but possesses similar size to his brother and from his left tackle spot, helped anchor a line that last season was regarded as one of the best in school history.

Sophomore Elliot Vallejo (6-8, 268) will likely open at the opposite tackle spot with guards Jeff Anderson (6-0, 288) and junior Kyle Skierski (6-4, 261) filling in beside Manfreda along with junior Josh Holloway (6-1, 275). David Gwara (6-5, 274) will add depth while senior Michael Wolfson (6-0, 296) will backup Manfreda at center.

The offensive line will be opening holes for a talented group of running backs, headlined by junior O.J. Swanigan (5-7, 162) who battled through injury last season to average 4.4 yards a carry while also hauling in 11 passes. Swanigan, from nearby Elk Grove, is nearing 1,000 career yards in UC Davis' one-back offense and highlighted last season with 136 rushing yards in the Aggies' 23-14 win at North Dakota State.

Sophomore Nelson Doris (6-1, 194) should see his rushing totals rise this season after gaining 181 yards on 37 carries last season. He also caught four passes for 80 yards, including a 26-yard strike against Western Washington. Redshirt freshman Marcus McCliman (5-9, 176) is also expected to carry some of the rushing load. McCliman prepped at Kaiser HS in Fontana, Calif., rushing for 1,940 yards during his junior and senior seasons.

Perhaps one of the Aggies' strongest positions will be tight end where starter junior Daniel Fells (6-3, 236) after appearing in only six games due to injury. However, he made his mark with his limited season, catching 14 passes for 279 yards and scoring a pair of touchdowns. He was named the team's outstanding sophomore and should get the starting nod this season. He'll get plenty of company in double tight-end sets

with junior Aaron Hines (6-5, 225) who saw action in all 10 games last year, catching a trio of passes. Devin Cook (6-3, 227) will also be in the mix at tight end.

UC Davis welcomes back starters at two of its three wide receiver positions, including leading receiver Kevin Freeman (5-8, 170). Freeman enjoyed a breakthrough year last season with a team-high 35 catches and 626 yards, almost twice as many catches and three times as many yards as his closest teammate. Freeman has also showed the propensity to run the ball, gaining 59 yards on eight carries last season.

Senior captain Jesse Oliva (5-10, 183) also had a standout year for the Aggies, starting all but one game. He led the team with three touchdown catches, enjoying his best game against Central Washington when he hauled in four passes for 78 yards and a score. Sophomore Tony Kays (6-0, 186) will start at slot receiver, while Nolan de Graaff (6-3, 202), who moves from tight end to wide receiver, will also see action there. The senior from nearby Granite Bay HS had 16 catches for 206 yards and a pair of touchdowns last season.

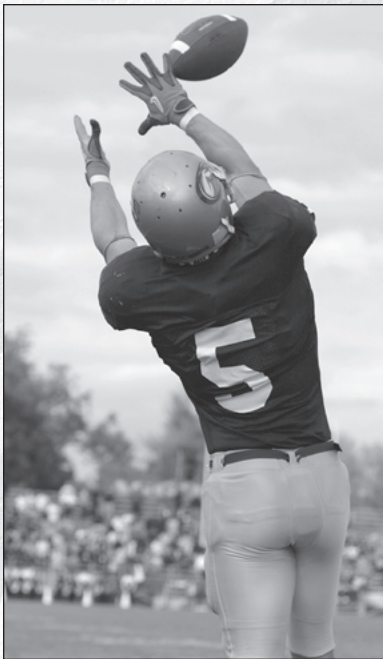
Juniors Ryan Smith (6-2, 184) and Jason Yáklích (6-4, 197), and senior Brandon Gilmore (6-1, 187) each bring game experience to the receiving corps and give UC Davis usual depth at position crucial to the offense's success and one which has spawned many outstanding careers.

DEFENSE

Overshadowed by an explosive offense - but never under-appreciated by Aggie fans - has been UC Davis' defense, which has been consistent and stingy through the years. Last year's edition allowed just 97.2 yards per game on the ground, among the best marks in school history. Only four starters return for the Aggies in 2004, but the experience level is still high and the defense will once again be a strength.

Up front, the defensive end positions could be a troublesome spot for opponents with last year's sack leader returning alongside the tackles-for-losses leader from 2001. Senior Jake Mossawir (6-2, 247), one of two defensive captains along with senior linebacker Tom Parisi, has 9.5 career sacks including 4.0 last year, tops on the squad. Mossawir had 2.5 sacks against Central Washington last year, a week after posting a sack against Cal Poly and 7.0 TFLs each of the last two years.

Mossawir got his break into the starting lineup last season after an injury felled Pila Fatukala (6-3, 229), a junior whose explosiveness in 2001 resulted in 8.0 sacks (second best on the team) for 55 yards in losses and a team-best 17 TFLs. Fatukala has played just 17 games for the Aggies, including only four last season, but has 11.0 career sacks and 24 TFLs. Freshman John Amos (6-4, 232) was the team's defensive recipient for redshirt player of the year in 2003 and should also see considerable playing time. As a senior linebacker at Galt HS, he recorded 116 tackles. Tyler Birkley (6-2, 233) had a trio of TFLs in 2003 and will help make the defensive end spot one of the team's deepest positions along with

senior Kent Sheridan, who posted a pair of sacks last year.

The defensive line's interior lost a pair of starters in graduated players John Downs and Daniel Kim, but reserves Chris Jones (6-3, 266) and Ryan Sharp (6-0, 271) look ready to step in a lead a group of tackles that promise to put pressure on the opposition. Jones, an academic all-district selection as a junior last year, saw action in all 10 games last year while Sharp, a transfer from the College of the Redwoods where he was a first-team all-conference pick, is also showing the ability to make his presence felt along the front.

Matthew Ngwun saw solid playing time as a true freshman for UC Davis last year, appearing in six games and setting himself for a key role on the defensive line this season. Davis HS graduate Naveen Daftari (6-1, 260) will also add depth to the line. The flexibility of the front four will also allow the ends to play down in the middle in certain situations and maximizing the abilities of this talented group.

UC Davis said goodbye to middle linebacker Kelly Valaau (team-high 93 tackles in '03) after his graduation but the position will again be a strength for the Aggies who return his backup, junior Dan Elbanna (6-1, 220). Elbanna has seen considerable action behind Valaau, most noticeably in 2002 when he was named co-winner of the team's award as most outstanding freshman. Elbanna distinguished himself that year in the Causeway Classic against Sacramento State, earning national honors after recording a career-high 14 tackles.

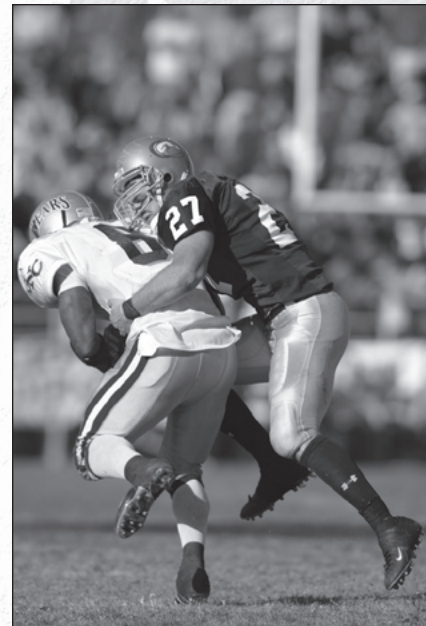
Parisi (6-0, 213) will open at strongside linebacker after starting all 10 games last season. Parisi had 35 total tackles while leading the linebacker corps with six pass breakups. He also had an interception, picking that up against Central Washington; the same game in which he recorded a career-high eight tackles. Parisi also proved key on special teams, blocking a pair of kicks.

Ben Reece (6-0, 209) missed a large portion of the season due to injury but is back healthy in 2004 and ready to assume weakside linebacker duties. Reece had 14 tackles as a freshman. The Aggie trio will be supported by a talented group of backers, including senior Lewis Burkhart (6-0, 238) who played in every game last year and 11 games in 2002. Sophomore Clayton O'Kane (6-1, 220), who last season finished

with nine tackles in limited action, is in his third year with the program after sharing top redshirt honors for the program in 2002.

Chris Buck (5-11, 203) and Michael Calhoun (6-3, 205), a pair of redshirt freshman, will bring depth to the linebacker spots.

Only one starter returns to the defensive backfield but UC Davis should still have plenty of firepower and speed at the safety and cornerback positions. Strong safety A.J. Avila and free safety Ejiro Evero both graduated but the Aggies feel good about the personnel returning. Senior Dan Reece (6-0, 202), one of the team's hardest hitters, played in just seven games last season but recorded 35 tackles as a sophomore two

seasons ago. He'll start at the strong safety position, while sophomore Jonathan Barsi (6-0, 206), who served a reserve role in nine games last year, will start at free safety. Barsi had 20 total tackles while picking up a pair of interceptions.

Luis Amaral (6-3, 192) played in all 10 games as a strong safety last year, recording 12 total tackles and an interception while serving as a key cog on the Aggies' special teams. Senior safety Nate Ramezane (5-11, 189) missed last season because of injury after transferring from Foothill College where he had eight interceptions as a sophomore. He will back up Barsi at free safety.

Senior Angelo Caffese (5-8, 164) is the only starter returning to the defensive backfield but is in the middle of a group of outstanding cornerbacks who should each see plenty of action. Caffese won the team's most improved player award last year after posting 28 total tackles and picking off a pass. He also scored a touchdown, recovering a blocked

punt in the end zone against Saint Mary's.

Andy Sullivan (6-0, 200) also succumbed to the injury bug and missed all of last season, but will be relied upon in 2004. Sullivan has been at UC Davis since 2000 but has only played in five games, all of them in 2002. Junior Derick Daniels (6-0, 193) started the first three games at left cornerback in 2004 before injury put him on the sidelines for the rest of the season. He came to the Aggies after transferring from Idaho State where he was an All-Big Sky honorable mention selection as a freshman in 2001.

Sophomore Nevan Bergan (5-10, 166) and freshman Adam Cook (5-11, 171) are among the other cornerbacks who look to see action this year. Bergan played sparingly in 2004 while Cook redshirted.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Senior Chris Shibel (6-4, 212) came to UC Davis as a linebacker but was asked to handle punting duties in a pinch. It's a move that has proved beneficial to the Aggies' program as Shibel is poised to become the best punter in school history.

He has a career average of 40.6 yards, nearly a yard ahead of the school record currently held by Chris Humes (39.4 avg. from 1989-92). Shibel has two career-long punts of 63 yards and 22 career boots of at least 50. Last season, he pinned nine punts inside the 20 and finished with a 40.3 avg. Shibel has also shown the leg for deep kickoffs as well and may see action in that area.

Dusty Apocotos graduated after establishing himself among the program's all-time great placekickers. His duties will likely fall upon a true freshman in Emmanuel Benjamin (5-10, 190). Benjamin, from Beyer HS in Modesto, twice earned first-team All-Central California Conference honors after making 18 of 22 career field goal attempts and going a perfect 41 of 41 with extra points.

Oliva had four punt returns a year ago, while Gilmore and Freeman were among the kick returners. Ramey is among the team's fastest players and should also see time returning kicks. Ryan Payne (6-0, 202) returns as the long snapper.

GREAT WEST FOOTBALL CONFERENCE

Six institutions, including UC Davis, formed college football's newest league with the announcement of the Great West Football Conference on February 25, 2004.

The conference is composed of institutions currently at the NCAA Division I-AA level and others currently reclassifying to I-AA from II.

UC Davis and Northern Colorado are in their second year of a four-year reclassification process, North Dakota State and South Dakota State are in their first year, and Cal Poly and Southern Utah are currently I-AA.

The Aggies and South Dakota State play one of two games on Sept. 4 that open Great West Football Conference competition. Northern Colorado hosts North Dakota State in the other.

The conference membership marks the Aggies' first affiliation since the former American West Conference in 1993. UC Davis was also a member of the Northern California Athletic Conference (1981-92) and the Far Western Conference (1925-80).

Bob Biggs

Head Coach
Quarterbacks
12th Year



Ask anyone close to the UC Davis football program about its head coach and you'll get the same response: "Not your typical football coach."

The compliment fits Bob Biggs. Despite running a program that has played at the highest levels nationally at the NCAA Division II level, Biggs has remained an accessible and engaging leader of the Aggies.

Biggs' stamp on the football program at UC Davis is one of success, intensity and intelligence that has carried his teams to eight playoff appearances and an average of nine wins per year during his first decade.

Now the second-winningest football coach in UC Davis history, Biggs trails only his mentor, Jim Sochor, on the all-time coaching victories list. In only his 11th season at the Aggie helm, Biggs needs just four more wins to hit the century mark.

His first win in the 1999 season was his 50th, making him one of the quickest coaches to reach that plateau in the nation regardless of division.

In 1993 and 2000, he was named American Football Coaches Association's Region 5 College Division Coach of the Year. In 2002,

he won Coach of the Year honors for the inaugural Independent Football Alliance.

Biggs has created an atmosphere in the Aggie football program that has kept the bulk of the coaching staff intact at UC Davis. Five assistants this fall will begin at least their 10th year on the Aggie coaching staff. And two more – receivers coach Rich Scangarello and linebackers mentor Mark Johnson – have returned to Biggs' program after successful turns at Division I-A programs.

On the field, the offensive system developed by Biggs and coordinator Mike Moroski has dumbfounded opponents and attracted top recruits who are seeking a balanced, intricate pro-style offense. Biggs, also the quarterbacks coach, has seen four of his protégés enter the professional ranks. Khari Jones (1991-93) earned Canadian Football League MVP honors in 2001, Mark Grieb (1994-96) earned Arena Football League MVP honors for the San Jose Sabercats in 2002, Kevin Daft (1996-98) was a fifth-round draft choice of the Tennessee Titans in 1999, and J.T. O'Sullivan (1999-2001) was selected in the sixth round by the New Orleans Saints in 2002.

Under his guidance, the Aggies consistently ranked among the top Division II teams in the nation in total offense.

Biggs had similar success as a UC Davis quarterback. His legend was sealed in 1971 when he was the quarterback for the Aggies' "Miracle Win" over Cal St. Hayward. In that game, he directed a comeback that featured 16 points in the final 20 seconds and resulted in a 30-29 victory. That win paved the way for the first of UC Davis' national-record 20 straight league titles.

During his senior year in 1972, Biggs averaged 272.8 yards per game in total offense and was the leading passer in the nation at Division II (then known as the College Division). That year, he also became the Aggies' first 2,000-yard passer, while setting the school record for attempts with 387, a mark that stayed intact for 21 years. He had four 300-yard passing games that fall, including a 399-yard day at San Francisco State.

In his final game as a collegian, Biggs led UC Davis to Atlantic City, N.J., for the NCAA's Boardwalk Bowl and a clash with Massachusetts. Playing the entire game with a broken finger, he set two national records in the Aggies' 35-14 loss. His record 59 passes that day established a Division II postseason record.

Biggs, a member of the Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame, was an Associated Press Little All-American that season.

He graduated in 1973 with a double major in political science and history, later earning a master's in recreation administration. Biggs played professionally with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League and the Portland Storm of the World Football League. He also spent time in the training camp of the NFL's Denver Broncos.

Biggs came back to his alma mater to join the coaching staff in 1978. He became the offensive coordinator in 1987 and was the assistant head coach in 1991 and 1992 before taking the head coaching position in 1993.

In his first year as head football coach, the Aggies went 10-2, were co-champions of the American West Conference and reached the second round of the NCAA Playoffs for the first time in 10 years. He was also named AFCA Region Coach of the Year.

Biggs also served as head men's tennis coach from 1979 through 1988. In that span, he guided the Aggies to five NCAA Championships appearances, including a third-place finish in 1986.

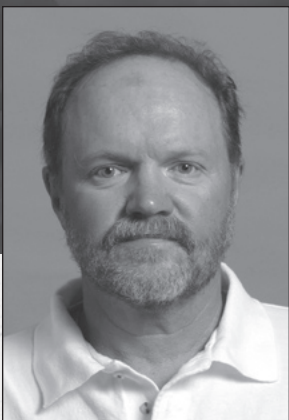

Assistant Head Coach

Entering his 38th year in the program, Arp has served on the Aggie staff throughout the program's 33 straight winning seasons, 20 consecutive league championships and 17 NCAA playoff appearances.

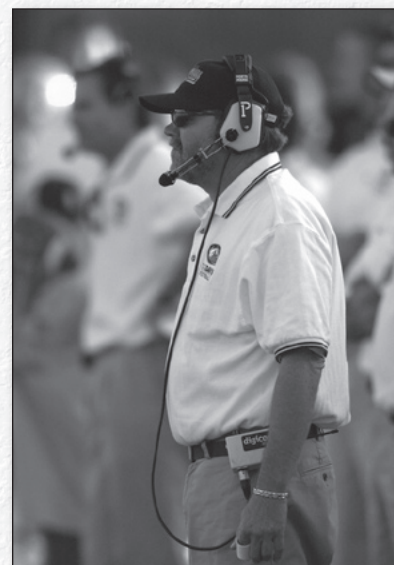
During that time, he has assisted four Aggie head coaches – Herb Schmalenberger, Jim Sochor, Bob Foster and Bob Biggs. Although Arp quietly toils behind the scenes, his contributions were recognized in 2003 when he won an AFLAC National Assistant Coach of the Year Award.

Arp began his coaching career while he was still an undergraduate at UC Davis and – save for a one-year stint as a graduate assistant at Northern Colorado in 1972 – has been a part of the successful Aggie football program ever since. His primary duties are with the defensive line, a unit that has produced four NFL draft picks over the years. Other D-line greats coached by Arp include Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Famers Glenn Fricker, Chuck Fomasi and Tim Lajcik.

Arp graduated from UC Davis in 1967, earning his bachelor's degree in physical education (now exercise science). He went on to earn his master's from Sacramento State in 1971.

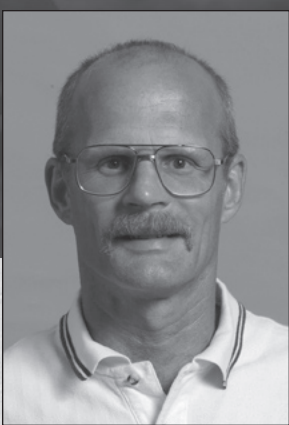
His philanthropic efforts have generously benefitted the entire UC Davis athletic department. Arp, who donates portions of his sports memorabilia collection to the annual Aggie Auction fundraiser, was instrumental in the completion of the ICA weight room campaign and was the first to establish a football endowment for athletic aid. He remains an integral part of the annual Holiday Drive, sponsored by UC Davis' Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.

Arp and his wife Jane reside in the foothills community of Weimar, not far from Arp's hometown of Colfax. Their son, Ben, maintains a comprehensive website chronicling the history of the UC Davis football program. Jane is an avid photographer who has shot more than three decades of Aggie football.



Steve "Lou" Bronzan

Defensive Coordinator
21st Year



The son of a renowned prep coach, Bronzan has established his own name as the Aggies' defensive coordinator for 15 of his 20 years at UC Davis. Although the program is better known for its offensive prowess, the defense has ranked among the best against the run during recent seasons. In 1994, his defensive corps yielded just 89.2 rushing yards per game, the

second-best average in school history.

Prior to returning to his alma mater to assume the role as defensive coordinator, Bronzan served as defensive backs coach at Chico State for then-head coach Mike Bellotti. He previously spent four years at Portland State as linebackers coach and later as defensive coordinator. During that time, Bronzan completed his master's degree in physical education from PSU.

Bronzan lettered from 1972 through 1974 as a linebacker at UC Davis. He won the Coaches' Award as a junior, then All-Far Western Conference and All-Coast honors as a senior. Bronzan earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1975. He later earned his teaching credential at UC Davis.

In addition to his coaching duties, Bronzan also teaches "noon-time fitness" classes as part of the campus' Staff Development program.

He and his wife Shelley reside in Davis with sons Mathew, Robbie and Patrick.

Mike Moroski

Offensive Coordinator
17th Year



In his 16 years at the helm of the Aggie offense, Moroski has developed one of the most prodigious systems in college football. The 2000 squad averaged more than 520 yards and 47 points per game, finishing second among Division II teams in each category. The 2001 team again ranked among the top 10 in those departments, totalling 511 yards and 41 points per contest during the regular season.

Like head coach Bob Biggs, Moroski is among the most successful quarterbacks in the history of a program that has produced a seemingly endless line of great passers. In his career from 1975 to 1978, he set numerous school records and earned back-to-back Far West Conference Player of the Year honors in his final

two seasons. Additionally, Moroski was one of the top pitchers on the Aggie baseball team. He was enshrined into the Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame in 1985.

Moroski was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons in the sixth round – 154th overall – of the 1979 draft, becoming the first UC Davis quarterback to achieve active status in the NFL. He played for Atlanta (1979-84), Houston (1985) and San Francisco (1986). Moroski has the honor of being one of a handful of quarterbacks who has thrown a touchdown pass to the legendary Jerry Rice. After his NFL career, “Mo” returned to his alma mater in 1988 to coach the junior varsity team. He has remained at UC Davis since then, moving up the ladder to his current role as offensive coordinator.

Originally from Novato, Calif., Moroski completed his bachelor’s degree in managerial economics in 1979 then earned a teaching credential in mathematics and a master’s degree in educational psychology. He and wife, Cathie, reside in Davis. They have four children, Nate, Will, Ben and Emilie. Nate is currently a member of the UC Davis cross country and track teams.

Coach Mo serves as faculty advisor for the Christian student group Grace Alive and remains an active member at the Grace Valley Christian Center, where he and fellow assistant coach Greg Chapla direct a successful youth football camp.

Greg Chapla

Running Backs/Special Teams
Strength & Conditioning
16th Year



Coach Chapla enters his 16th year in his multi-faceted role on the UC Davis coaching staff. In his tenure, he has served as a coach for running backs, special teams, tight ends, and as the program’s strength and conditioning specialist, as well as offensive line coach for the freshman team. Chapla also deftly handles the arduous task of coordinating use of the ICA

weight room for all 25 UC Davis athletics teams.

As running backs coach, he mentored three of the top six all-time Aggie rushers: Preston Jackson (1991-93), Jermaine Rucker (1995-96) and G.P. Muhammad (1995-98).

Like many of his colleagues on the Aggie staff, Chapla is an alumnus of UC Davis. He lettered two years as a running back, totalling 316 yards during the 1987 and 1988 seasons. Chapla also played two years at Butte College before transferring to the Aggie program.

A native of Orland, Calif., Chapla earned his bachelor’s degree in physical science from UC Davis in 1989, then completed his master’s degree in recreation administration from Sacramento State in 1997.

He and his wife Kathy reside in Davis with their daughters Hannah and Rebekah. Chapla is an active member of the Grace Valley Christian Center, where he and offensive coordinator Mike Moroski have run a successful youth football camp.

Mark Johnson

Linebackers
Recruiting Coordinator
8th Year



Coach Johnson begins the third year of his third stint on the coaching staff, having previously served at Nevada and Boise State. He first coached at Davis from 1990 to 1994, both as a linebackers coach and as the head JV coach (replacing Mike Moroski in the latter role in 1991).

Johnson spent a year as a graduate assistant at Oregon in 1995 when the Ducks advanced to the Cotton Bowl. Then he mentored San Jose State's running backs in 1996, before coming back to UC Davis to assist Fred Arp and former Aggie coach Tony Franks on defensive line and linebackers, respectively.

He returned to the D-I ranks the following year, serving as defensive line coach at Boise State from 1998 to 1999, where he teamed up with another former Aggie, then-assistant Dan Hawkins. Johnson was hired as linebackers coach at Nevada in 2000, where he has spent the past two years.

Originally from Vacaville, Calif., Johnson played linebacker for UC Davis before graduating in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in sociology. He later earned his master's in recreation administration from Sacramento State in 1994. He and his wife Amy live in Elk Grove with their son Cooper.

Dan Gazzaniga

Offensive Line
12th Year



A past winner of the program's Outstanding Lineman Award and a member of the 1980s "All-Decade Team", Gazzaniga begins his 12th season with his alma mater's coaching staff.

Gazzaniga lettered for UC Davis from 1981 to 1984, starting on the 1982 squad that reached the NCAA D-II Championships. As a senior, he earned honorable mention Little All-America honors from the Associated Press and signed a free-agent contract with the (then) Los Angeles Raiders.

A native of Loomis, Calif., Gazzaniga earned his bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering in 1986. His first coaching foray came at Menlo-Atherton HS as offensive and defensive line coach. Gazzaniga returned to UC Davis in 1993. While coaching the Aggie offensive line, he also earned his master's degree in exercise physiology from Sacramento State in 1996.

Gazzaniga has been instrumental in the development of some of UC Davis' finest offensive linemen, including All-Americans Troy Larkin and Forest Vance.

Preston Jackson

Defensive Backs
7th Year



A Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame enshrinee and one of the most successful backs ever to don an Aggie uniform, Jackson enters his seventh year with the program and his second on the defensive side of the ball.

Jackson rejoined the Aggies in 1998 as a running backs coach. In fact, one of the first players under his tutelage – G.P. Muhammad – would eventually supplant Jackson as the all-time leading rusher at UC Davis.

In essentially a two-year Aggie career, Jackson rushed for 3,325 yards and 40 TDs. He continues to hold a number of school records, mostly notably for season rushing yards (1,826) and TDs (24). As a junior in 1992, Jackson earned All-America honors and was the Player of the Year in the Northern California Athletic Conference. One year later, he ranked third nationally in rushing and helped lead the team to the American West Conference title and a berth in the NCAA postseason.

In 2003, Jackson earned an intern coaching position with the Chicago Bears preseason camp, working with running backs and defensive backs.

Rich Scangarello

Wide Receivers
3rd Year



Formerly an offensive assistant and quarterbacks coach at UC Davis, Rich Scangarello returns to the program to mentor the receiving corps. He brings an astute command of the West Coast offense, sharpened by his experience at all levels of collegiate football.

Scangarello previously coached with the Aggie program in

1998 and 1999, during which time he worked with two Harlon Hill Trophy finalists and eventual NFL draft picks, Kevin Daft and J.T. O'Sullivan.

Scangarello subsequently served a year as an offensive graduate assistant at Idaho, where he coached both quarterbacks and receivers, as well as all scout teams. He left Moscow to take a post as offensive coordinator and strength & conditioning coach at Carleton College in Northfield, Minn.,

Scangarello then returned to Idaho in 2002 to reprise his role as quarterbacks coach. In each of the last two seasons, Scangarello's protégé, Brian Lindgren, ranked among the top passers in Division I-A.

A native of Roseville, Calif. and a 1990 graduate of Oakmont HS, Scangarello graduated from Sacramento State in 1996 with a degree in business administration. He is currently working on his master's in education, with an emphasis on cross-cultural education.

John Shin-Lee

Tight Ends
5th Year



After five years of coaching quarterbacks at the high school and collegiate level, Shin-Lee switched to the receiving end by assuming the duties of tight ends

coach at UC Davis last year. He enters his fifth year with the Aggie program.

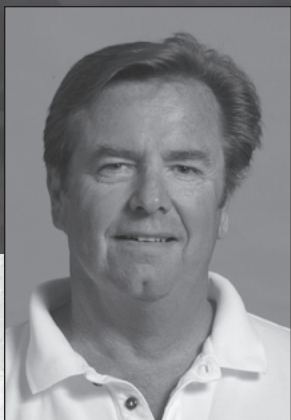

Lusiani played baseball and football at Stanford for two seasons, then transferred to Nevada, where he graduated in 1972 with degrees in psychology and political science. He went on to earn his juris doctor from McGeorge School of Law in 1978, then returned to add an L.L.M. degree in international business in 1991.

Currently, Lusiani practices law with the Sacramento-based firm of Hanna & Brophy.

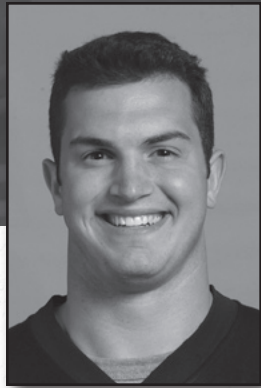
Blood Ties

Defense was the name of the game as defending NCAA Division II champion and No. 1-ranked Grand Valley State (Mich.) edged the Aggies in overtime. David Hendrix kicked his third field goal of the game as his 28-yarder in the first overtime gave the Lakers their 27th straight regular-season win.

UC Davis rallied to tie the game in the fourth quarter, driving 65 yards in 16 plays to set up a 33-yard field goal from Dusty Apocotos with just over three minutes remaining in regulation. Apocotos had a career-best 49 yarder in the first quarter, but missed from that distance in overtime.

The Aggies managed just 214 yards in total offense against Grand Valley State, getting into the red zone just once in regulation. WR Kevin Freeman had a big day for UC Davis, posting career highs of nine catches and 122 yards.

Defensively, SS A.J. Avila helped the Aggies keep the Lakers out of the end zone for the first time since 1993, and twice stopped Grand Valley inside the 5-yard line. UC Davis didn't score a touchdown for the first time since losing 14-2 at North Dakota in the NCAA semifinals.

RB Michael Tennessee had 59 yards rushing to lead the Lakers.

Behind O.J. Swanigan's second career 100-yard rushing day, and a trio of field goals from Dusty Apocotos, the 14th-ranked Aggies won their first-ever game in the state of North Dakota, beating the Bison before nearly 15,000 fans at the Fargodome.

UC Davis led the entire way but the Bison cut the lead to just 17-13 in the third quarter before Apocotos drilled a 41-yard field goal early in the final period. He later added a 19-yard chip shot to seal the win. The final score came after the Aggies drove 55 yards on 15 plays, chewing up nearly seven minutes of clock.

Swanigan gained 136 yards on 22 carries, scoring from four yards midway through the first quarter. He averaged 6.2 yards a carry and had a long run of 29 yards. QB Ryan Flanigan completed 18 of 32 passes for 204 yards, hitting TE Daniel Fells for a 24-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter.

The defense played its second straight outstanding game, holding the Bison to just 75 yards rushing and only 187 through the air. The Aggies had three sacks, including 1.5 by DE Pila Fatukala. For the second straight week, LB Tom Parisi blocked a kick - this one a punt in the second quarter that led to a 39-yard field goal by Apocotos.

North Dakota State entered the game coming off a stunning 25-24 at Div. I-AA power Montana the week earlier.

The 50th annual Causeway Classic proved to be just that – a classic. RB Antar Mahasin's 1-yard plunge with 14 seconds left delivered the Aggies their fourth straight win in the rivalry. Mahasin's dive off the left side of the line capped an 8-play, 76-yard drive – engineered by backup QB Jon Barragan – that began after the Hornets took a 27-24 with 1:40 left on a 2-yard touchdown reception by Jason Girley.

UC Davis trailed 14-0 in the first quarter after Sacramento State RB Tyrone Gross scored on a pair of touchdown runs. However, Gross – who had 240 yards the previous weekend against Idaho State – was bottled up by a tenacious Aggie defense from that point on, finishing with just 62 yards.

Mahasin finished with a career-high 163 yards and three touchdowns, while tight end Daniel Fells had a 3-yard touchdown reception from Barragan in the fourth quarter. That period featured four lead changes.

Both teams were led by backup quarterbacks after their starters left with injury. Reserve Blake Mori led the Hornets to their go-ahead touchdown, while Barragan played the entire second half for Ryan Flanigan.

Cal Poly later scored a safety after a snap on a punt attempt rolled out of the back of the endzone later in the third quarter. The Aggies' defense put together another standout effort, holding Cal Poly to just 16 net rushing yards and only 284 overall. MLB Kelly Valaau continued his outstanding season, collecting 12 tackles, including a sack.

UC Davis took a 14-0 lead, getting its first score after driving 99 yards on 11 plays. Flanigan found WR Jesse Oliva in the end zone to cap the drive, which began after the Aggies' defense stopped the Mustangs four times inside the fouryard line.

UC Davis clinched its 34th straight winning season by scoring 21 points in the second quarter on its way to a 31-7 halftime lead against the Wildcats. Senior QB Ryan Flanigan enjoyed perhaps the best game of his career, completing 24 of 27 passes for 359 yards and three touchdowns. He completed an amazing 17 of 18 passes for 249 yards and two scores in the first half alone. UC Davis scored on all five of its possessions in the first half.

RB O.J. Swanigan scored twice for the Aggies, the first on an 8-yard run in the first quarter and the second on a 31-yard catch just before halftime. He finished with 68 yards rushing, averaging 5.6 yards a carry. Thirteen different receivers caught passes for the Aggies, who had 562 yards of total offense. Billy Zeier had five receptions for 39 yards and Jesse Oliva had four. 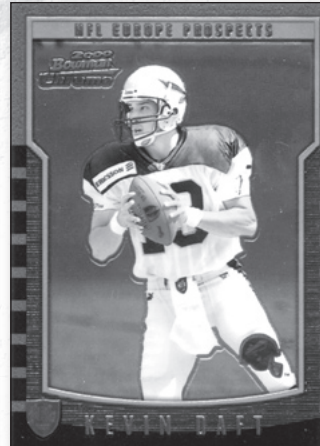
Aggies In The Pros

Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame

The Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 1980 to provide special recognition for outstanding accomplishment in intercollegiate athletics.

To be considered for the Hall of Fame, a participant must have competed with unusual distinction in an intercollegiate sport for at least two seasons, achieved recognition at the conference, regional or preferably national levels, and achieved this accomplishment in a manner that exemplifies the UC Davis concept of a student-athlete.

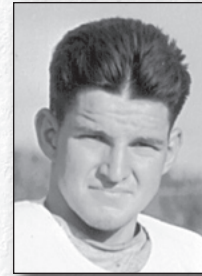
Furthermore, a five-year period must elapse from the most recent participation in athletics before a student-athlete becomes eligible for induction.

Through 2001-02 there are 44 former Aggie football players enshrined in the Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame.

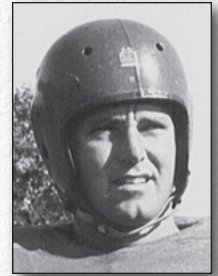

In 1999, the national attention fell upon a soft-spoken reserve running back from La Cañada, Calif. Sam Paneno had appeared in eight games as a redshirt freshman in 1998.

The bulk of his action had come in a home game against Western Oregon, when he rushed for 107 yards on just 15 carries — more than half of his career numbers up to that point. On September 11, the second game of his junior year, Paneno earned his first career start at running back. Coincidentally, the opponent was Western Oregon. He responded to the call by rushing for a career-high 114 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

On the first play of overtime, Paneno dislocated his right knee. He received treatment at a Salem, Ore. hospital, and later, at the UC Davis Medical Center. But the injury had disrupted the blood flow to the lower leg and foot. Paneno underwent emergency surgery,

and blood flow was restored. However, complications arose from the initial injury and after further procedures, a team of UCDMC orthopedic surgeons deemed it necessary to amputate the lower portion of his right leg. The amputation surgery was performed on September 20, nine days after the game at WOU.

Support for Paneno came from all parts of the country. The host of the NCAA D-II Championships in Montgomery, Ala., created a website for fans to offer prayers and words of encouragement. Hundreds of sentiments flooded the website, including those from fellow collegiate players who only the name UC Davis from national rankings and past playoff results.

Paneno paid his first visit to his teammates the following week after the surgery. Wrote Brandon Frink of the *Davis Enterprise*, he "delivered himself to practice wearing a wheelchair and a smile." His positive attitude despite his ordeal proved to be an inspiration for all. Paneno displayed strength where someone else may have shown despair. He felt gratitude to his family,

faith and friends, but never felt self-pity. And while ESPN had arrived on campus on September 20 to report on an athlete's tragedy, CBS Sports, *Sports Illustrated* and even *People Weekly* later paid visits to UC Davis to report on an athlete's courage. Ever the active person, Paneno was later fitted with two different prosthetic legs — one for "everyday" use and the other allowing him to resume to such pastimes as running, surfing, even rock-climbing.

The UC Davis football team retired his No. 25 jersey the following year. Miami Dolphins' lineman Trace Armstrong was so touched by seeing Paneno's story as part of the CBS halftime report on Thanksgiving Day, that he invited him to attend the Raiders-Dolphins game as a guest of the team. In 2001, Paneno was formally honored by the NCAA when he was named co-winner of the inaugural Inspiration Award, bestowed upon a former student-athlete who has displayed "perseverance, dedication and determination" to overcome a life-altering event.

ACADEMICS

UC Davis comprises three colleges (Agricultural & Environmental Sciences, Engineering, Letters & Science), five professional schools (Education, Law, Management, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine) plus the Division of Biological Sciences.

With 103 undergraduate majors and 80 graduate programs, the university offers the most expansive and diverse range of academics among any of the University of California campuses. Additionally, students also have the opportunity to combine majors or customize their field of study by creating an individual major.

For those interested in graduate degrees – whether it be a master's degree or a doctorate – UC Davis offers advising services to help students craft their education toward those goals. An estimated 86 percent of UC Davis students applying to graduate schools earn acceptance to either their first or second choices.

RANKINGS

UC Davis ranks 11th among public universities, according to *U.S. News & World Report*, and 16th by the National Research Council. Furthermore, the National Science Foundation places the university 15th in the nation in research funding, and *Money* magazine considered UC Davis as one of the West's top "best buys".

Additionally, the Gourman Report rated the genetics department at No. 1, while *U.S. News & World Report* ranked the College of Engineering as No. 13 among its peers.

COMMUNITY

With a population of approximately 60 thousand, Davis is widely known for being a safe, active and socially innovative community.

The downtown area boasts a multitude of specialty shops, restaurants, theaters and art galleries; while the city's numerous parks offer recreational opportunities for active students.

ACTIVITIES

On campus, UC Davis students can rally around the highly successful athletics department by joining the Aggie Pack spirit organization, or enjoy a first-class performance at the Robert & Magrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts.

The university also offers hundreds of student clubs and organizations, including cultural clubs, fraternities and sororities, faith-based organizations and the Associated Students of UC Davis student government.

For the active Aggie, students may participate in the diverse intramural sports program or join one of the 30-plus sports clubs. In 2004, the Activities & Recreation Center (ARC) opened its doors, providing the campus with its own state-of-the-art fitness venue.

In April, UC Davis hosts Picnic Day, an annual student-run open house. The popular event showcases all that the campus has to offer, attracting students, staff, faculty, parents, alumni and members of the surrounding communities.

GETTING AROUND

Nestled just southwest of Sacramento, the city of Davis rests just 15 minutes from an international airport, and contains a downtown station serviced by Greyhound and Amtrak. Centrally located in the Sacramento Valley, the town sits equally close to both the finest ski resorts and the Pacific Ocean's top beaches.

Within Davis and its neighboring towns, both Yolo-bus and the student-operated Unitrans bus systems offer free transportation to registered undergraduates.

The town boasts more bicycles per capita than any other city in the nation. More than 50 miles of bike paths make the entire town conducive to both riders and pedestrians.

UC Davis ranks among the leaders in NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Awards and Academic All-District/America honorees. Student-Athlete Guidance Services deserves much of the credit for these accomplishments.

The SAGS office started in 1988 with a single staff member serving as a centralized resource for academic advising, eligibility information and campus referrals. The office has since expanded to include additional academic advisors, an athletic aid coordinator, an assistant eligibility coordinator and an administrative assistant. It is headed by Pam Gill-Fisher, senior associate director of athletics.

The SAGS office provides a range of services to student-athletes on all 26 intercollegiate athletics teams, including assistance with course and major selection as well as interpretation and clarification of eligibility rules and issues.

UC Davis student-athletes typically have a minimum of three academic advisors: an athletic academic advisor assigned by sport, a college advisor, and a major

advisor (if the student has a declared major). Although appointments with the athletic academic advisors are not mandatory at UC Davis, student-athletes might choose to see their athletic academic advisor for issues including:

- Balancing academic and athletic expectations
- General education (GE) requirements
- Dropping/adding courses
- Time management/study skills
- Assistance completing the mandatory Academic Plan Form
- Study hall for student-athletes
- Personal issues that affect academic performance
- Choosing a major/career
- Declaring or changing a major
- Campus resources
- Exploration of opportunities beyond athletics
- Preparation for graduate programs
- Preparation and application for NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships and other national awards

Known collectively as “The Healer of Champions”, the UC Davis athletic training staff comprises four full-time certified athletic trainers, a full-time physical therapist/certified athletic trainer and approximately 24 student athletic trainers. Together, they are responsible for providing medical care to the 800-plus student-athletes that compose UC Davis’ 26 varsity teams.

The student athletic trainers serve two to three years with the program, logging in more than 1,500

hours and gaining valuable clinical education in a hands-on environment. The internship is ideal for any student interested in a graduate program in athletic training, as well as any medical or allied medical profession.

The ARC Pavilion training room contains extensive resources and equipment for the rehabilitation of injured athletes. The staff physical therapist is headquartered there as well.

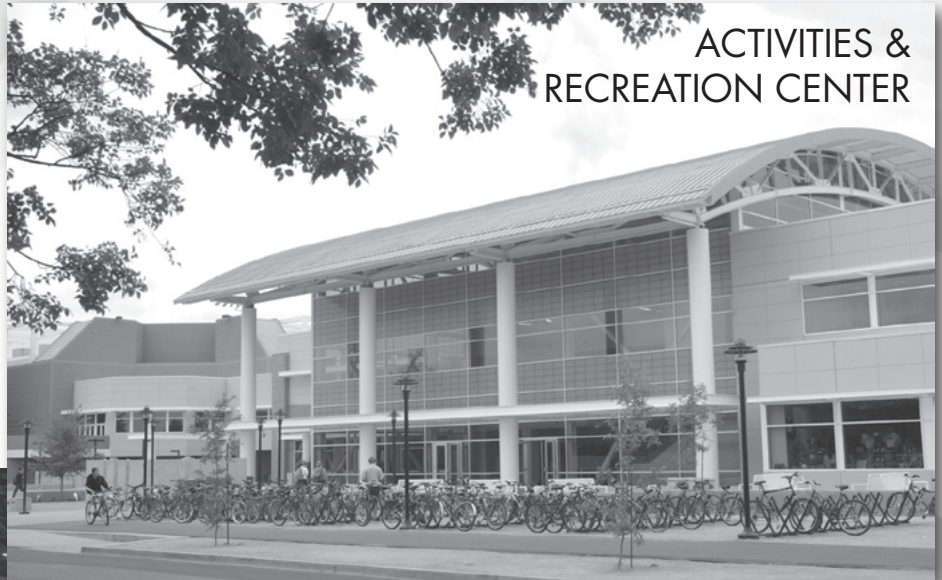

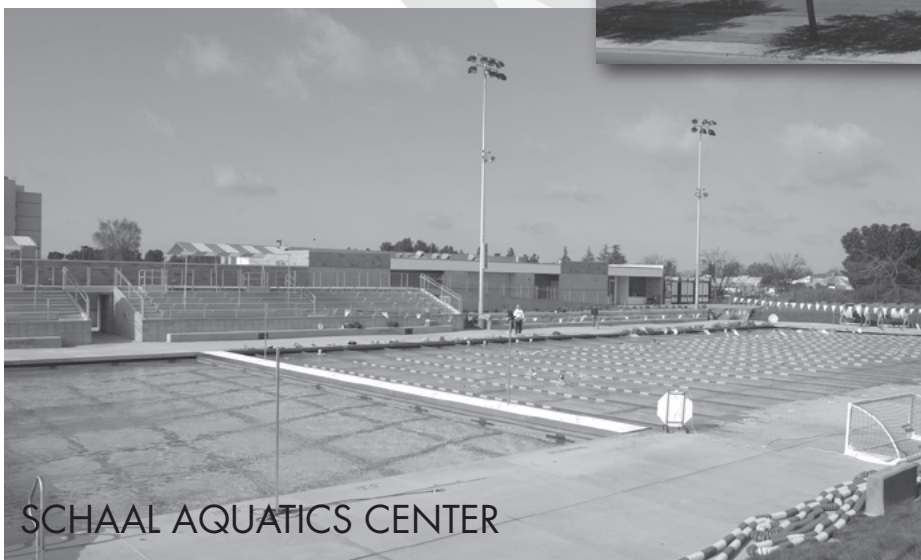


THE PAVILION

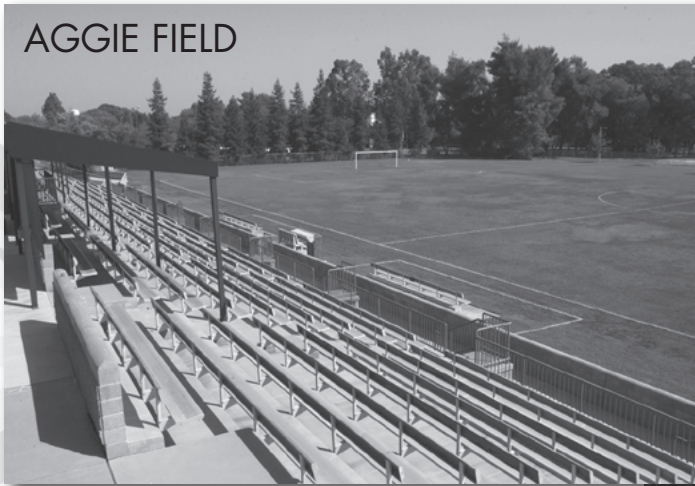

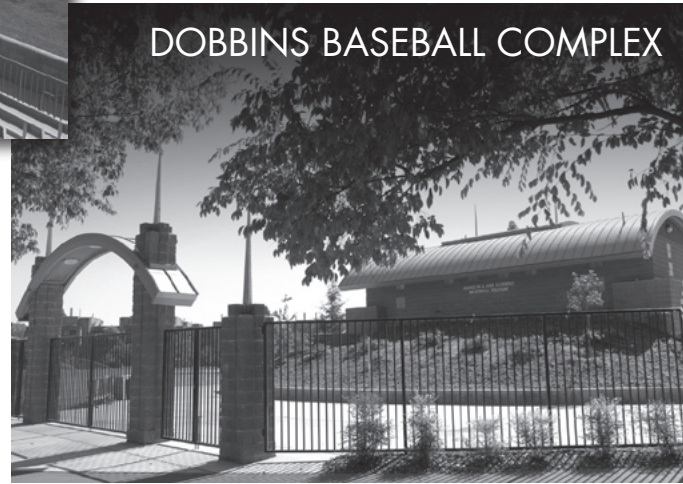
AGGIE FIELD

DOBBINS BASEBALL COMPLEX

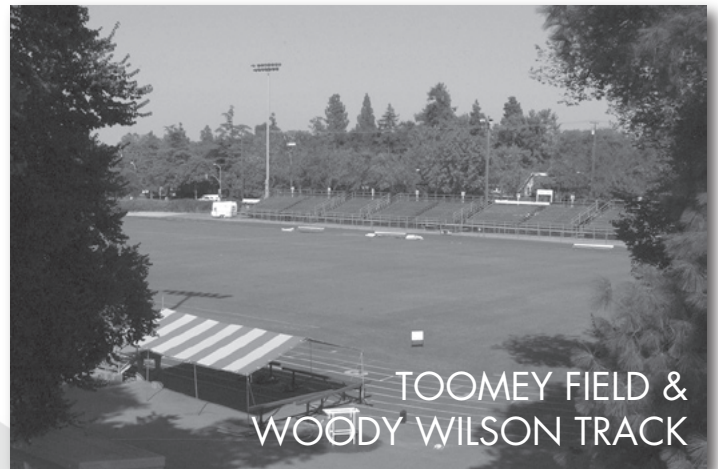


TOOMEY WEIGHT ROOM

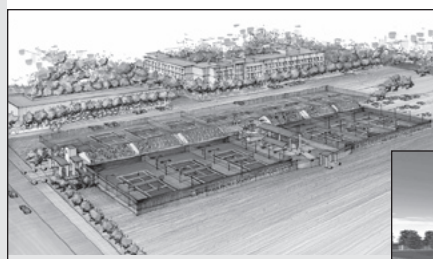

FUTURE GAMES

In the upcoming years, UC Davis Athletics will see the opening of two first-class athletics facilities. The Marya Welch Tennis Center (left), an upgrade of the existing Hickey Tennis Courts, began construction in 2004. Long-term plans for the tennis venue include grandstand seating with restrooms and concessions.

Aggie football and women's lacrosse will move to a multi-purpose stadium, located adjacent to the Schaal Aquatics Center, as early as the 2006-07 academic year. Initial concept designs call for seating of 10 to 15 thousand spectators, which an eventual build-out to as many as 30,000.

TRANSITION TO DIVISION I

On March 11, 2003, UC Davis made a historic move in its storied intercollegiate athletics history when Chancellor Larry Vanderhoef announced that the university would reclassify from NCAA Division II to NCAA Division I status and join the Big West Conference. The announcement came after much discussion by campus administrators, faculty, staff and students, as well as alumni and the local community.

Additionally, UC Davis undergraduate students passed the Campus Expansion Initiative, which will help fund the Aggies' growing athletics grant-in-aid program. UC Davis, which began its four-year transition to Division I last fall, will start some competition in the Big West in 2004-05 and is scheduled for full Division I membership in 2007-08.

UC Davis will compete in the Big West Conference in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track & field and women's volleyball.

Football is a charter member of the Great West Football Conference, women's rowing is a member of the Western Independent Rowing Association, men's and women's water polo will remain in the Western Water Polo Association and women's lacrosse will continue play in the Mountain Pacific Lacrosse League.

Women's gymnastics and men's wrestling – already classified as Division I programs – will continue their participation in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation and Pacific-10 Conference, respectively.

DIVISION I TIMELINE

Good News

The light at the end of the tunnel brightened when the NCAA Division I Board of Directors approved legislation which will make Aggies eligible to win automatic berths to NCAA Championships beginning their first active year of Division I membership in 2007-08. The Big West Conference-sponsored NCAA 2003-13 passed in August of 2004.

Under previous legislation, the Aggies would have been ineligible to win any automatic berth awarded to the Big West Conference until 2009-10. For men's basketball, the wait was eight years, meaning the Aggies would not be able to win an automatic berth until 2015-16.

- Compliance with all minimum contests and participation requirements for sports sponsorship set forth in Bylaw 20.9.3.3 (contests and number of participants).

- Considered Division I for scheduling against opponents.
- Total athletics grant-in-aid increases to approximately \$2.5 million.
- The portion of the CEI fees designated for athletics increases to generate an estimated total of \$2.03 million in grants-in-aid.

2005-06

Provisional Third Year

- Attendance at the NCAA Convention.
- Attendance at a meeting to be conducted at the NCAA convention to discuss issues impacting Division I members. Institutional representatives required to attend the meeting are the CEO, AD, SWA, FAR, and Compliance Coordinator.
- Completion of an NCAA athletics certification orientation visit.
- Completion of a compliance review conducted by the national office and submission of a report with an institutional response of findings.
- Submit an annual report and updated strategic plan by June 30 based on feedback received from the previous year's annual report.
- The portion of the CEI fees designated for athletics increases to contribute an estimated total of \$3.17 million for athletics grants-in-aid.

2006-07

Provisional Fourth Year

- Successfully complete an NCAA athletics certification self-study and evaluation visit.
- Attendance at the NCAA Convention.
- Attendance at a meeting conducted at the NCAA Convention to discuss issues impacting Division I members.
- Submit an annual report and updated strategic plan by June 30, 2007 based on feedback received from the previous years review.
- The CEI reaches its full implementation. The athletics-designated portion increases to generate an estimated total of \$4.26 million in grants-in-aid.

2007-08

First Year of Division I

- All teams become eligible for conference and NCAA championships.
- Teams become eligible to win Big West automatic berths to NCAA championships.
