OPENING TIP

Indiana University is in its 119th season of competition in men's basketball. The Hoosiers will host UC Davis as part of the of the Hardwood Showcase. The Hoosiers are coming off a 78-64 win over Texas Arlington, while the Aggies fell 58-55 against Sacramento State. UC Davis also lost at Arkansas 81-58 and UT Arlington, 68-59, two teams the Hoosiers have faced.

THE COACHES

Indiana Coach **Archie Miller** begins his second season of guiding the Cream and Crimson. Last year, the Hoosiers finished 16-15 and 9-9 in the Big Ten. He is 159-79 in seven-plus years as a head coach, which includes six years at the University of Dayton. His Flyer teams made NCAA Tournament appearances in each of his last four seasons, including a trip to the Elite Eight in 2014. UC Davis is led by **Jim Les,** who is in his eighth season. The Aggies have won 3 of the last 4 Big West titles, including last season. He also was the head coach at his alma mater, Bradley.

NEWS & NOTES

Senior forward Juwan Morgan and freshman guard Romeo Langford were selected to the 10-member Preseason All-Big Ten team. Both are among 50 players listed as candidates for the 2019 Naismith Trophy and Wooden Award and Langford is among 20 players on the NABC Player of the Year watch list. Langford was named third-team Preseason All-American by ESPN.com and CBSSports.com and earned fourth-team honors from WatchStadium.com. The New,Albany native was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after averaging 22.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.5 blocks in two games for the Hoosiers last week

HOOSIERS ARE THIRD IN THE COUNTRY IN SHOOTING

Coach Archie Miller's squad is the top shooting team in the Big Ten making 55.4% of its shots through the first two weeks of the season. That figure ranks 3rd in the country. IU's 63.6% shooting effort against Marquette was the best ever performance for an Archie Miller coached team in his eight seasons as a head coach. His team's previous best came when Dayton beat George Mason and shot 62.9% in 2016.

DEFENSE MAKING STRIDES

The Hoosiers are **9th in the country** in three-point field goal defense. Opponents are shooting 22.1% from long range. IU is holding opponents to 60.0 ppg., on 37.4% shooting. Last year at the time, opponents were averaging 74.8 points on 44.6% shooting. IU held Arkansas without a 3FGM in the final 15:06 on Sunday and limited them to 2-of-13 shooting from long range in the second half. They also held UTA to 1-of-12 shooting in the first half, before a hot Maverick team hit seven in the second half nearly erasing a 20-point deficit.

UP NEXT

The Hoosiers will visit #1 Duke on Tuesday, Nov. 27 as part of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. IU will open Big Ten play at home on Dec. 1 against Northwestern, will visit Penn State, Dec. 4, host Louisville Dec. 8, then play Butler in Indianapolis in the Crossroads Classic, Dec. 15.

POST GAME NOTES AGAINST TEXAS ARLINGTON

- IU's largest lead of the night was 20 points, at 48-28 with 18:06 to go.
- UTA cut the lead to 61-60 with 6:33 to go before IU closed the game out on a 17-4 run.
- The Hoosiers shot 55%, going 30-55 from the field. For the season, IU leads the Big Ten shooting 55.4%.
- Indiana outrebounded the Mavericks, 33-25. IU has won the battle of the boards in all five games this season.
- Three Hoosiers tallied double figures, Juwan Morgan (23), Romeo Langford (16), and Justin Smith (13).
- Senior forward **Juwan Morgan** recorded his 11th double of his career with 23 points and 10 rebounds. He now has nine 20-point efforts in his career. He scored 14 points in the second half. He played a season-high 36 minutes, including all 20 in the second half.
- Freshman guard **Romeo Langford** scored 13 points, grabbed five rebounds, and notched two assists. This the fifth straight game he has scored in double digits. He missed the final 4:23 after being hit in the nose.
- Sophomore forward **Justin Smith** had his third double-digit contest of the season with 13 points while grabbing five rebounds. Smith played a season-high 34 minutes.
- Freshman forward **Damezi Anderson** scored seven points, all in the second half, and assisted on two baskets. His three-pointer as the shot clock was running down with 3:39 gave IU a 72-62 advantage.
- Redshirt senior forward **Evan Fitzner** had a pair of free throws that helped Indiana secure the lead. He ended the night with five points and five rebounds. He played a season-high 29 minutes.
- Sophomore guard **Aljami Durham** contributed to the Indiana victory by scoring six points. He did not play the final 27:58 after falling on his back earlier on a hard foul.
- Freshman guard **Rob Phinisee** contributed eight points, four assists, and four rebounds. He played 39 minutes, including the entire second half.

SOME EARLY MILLER ERA BESTS

IU eclipsed the century mark for the first time under Archie Miller when it scored 104 points against Chicago State. The team scored a season-high 87 points three times last year.

In addition, the 39 field goals in that game topped last season's best of 33.

The Hoosiers 12 steals versus the Cougars matched their best effort against Youngstown State a year ago.

IU's 33 free throws attempted in the opener tied last year's standard established against Indiana State.

The Hoosiers 35 points allowed against Montana State topped last year's lowest total points allowed (43, at Rutgers).

The 16 points allowed in the second half also matched last years fewest points allowed in a half (16, 1st half at Rutgers).

IU's shooting tally of 63.6% against Marquette also is a best for his teams while at Indiana.

BENCH PROVIDING CONTRIBUTIONS

The 51 points off the bench against Chicago State eclipsed last year's season-high of 39 against Howard. Junior **Devonte Green** had 15 and senior **Evan Fitzner** added 14 as reserves. Fitzner had 16 off the bench against Marquette. Since the 1996-97 season, IU had only scored 50 points off the bench twice before. The Hoosiers scored 53 against Drake on December 27, 1998 and 50 against Buffalo on December 10, 1999.

PROMISING SHOOTING NIGHT

In the Hoosiers first two games, despite the large margin of victories, the team needed to improve its shooting from outside and its output from the free throw line.

Against Marquette, IU shot 45.0% from three-point range making 9-of-20 from beyond the arc. Graduate transfer **Evan Fitzner** led the way by making all four of his long-distance attempts.

From the free throw line, IU shot 73.9% and was led by junior **DeRon Davis.** The Colorado native was a 75.5% shooter from the line as a freshman but dropped to 50.0% as a sophomore. After hitting 2 of 5 from the line to start the season, he hit 5 of 6 against the Golden Eagles.

IMPRESSIVE DEFENSIVE IMPACT

Coming into the game, Marquette All-American Markus Howard was averaging 26.5 points per game, including a 37 point effort against Bethune Cookman. Hoosier guards **Rob Phinisee** and **Aljami Durham** deserve a great deal of credit for never allowing Howard to become comfortable. they held Howard to just 7 first half points and forced 3 early turnovers as IU jumped out to a 19-4 lead. Howard finished with 18 points, but made just 1 of 5 three-point FG attempts.

HUNTER UNDERGOES SURGERY

Indiana University men's basketball coach Archie Miller announced that freshman Jerome Hunter underwent surgery Wednesday evening at the Cleveland Clinic to treat a lower body condition that first developed early in the semester.

His is recovering from the procedure and hopes to return to campus next week. Hunter, who has not seen any game action, will remain out indefinitely.

Due to HIPPA laws, the program is not allowed to comment on specifics of the condition.



PLAYER NOTES

Senior All-Big Ten forward Juwan Morgan averaged 16.5 points last season and needs 96 points to become the 52nd player in school history to join the 1,000 point club. This would continue the streak of at least one player from every recruiting class since 2008 eclipsing the mark.

Morgan has started 55 career games, the most of any current Hoosier. His 57.5% field goal percentage is ranked 4th all-time in school history. He had his 10th career doubledouble effort with 14 points and 11 rebounds against Montana State. He had 13 points and 8 boards against Marquette and 15 points and 7 rebounds at Arkansas. He is coming off his 11th double-double with 23 points and 10 rebounds against UTA. He also is shooting 50.0% from three-point range (4 of 8).

Senior guard **Zach McRoberts** has started 22 career games at IU, including 17 last season. He shot a team-best 39.4% from three-point range. Including his first year at Vermont, he is a career 39.1% shooter from long distance. He is shooting 40.4% from long range during his career at IU. He is in graduate school in the Kelley School of Business studying Business Analytics.

Morgan and McRoberts will serve as team captains this season.

Junior center De'Ron Davis will look to come back from a torn Achilles heel which caused him to miss the last 16 games of the season. He was averaging 9.6 points and 4.3 rebounds at the time of his injury and was shooting a Big Ten best 61.5% from the field when he got hurt. He has started 19 career games, including all 15 he played in last season. This year, he has averaged 15.3 minutes per game and is averaging 7.3 points and 3.3 rebounds, while shooting 73.3% from the floor. He had his first double-figure scoring effort since coming back from the injury with 10 points at Arkansas.

Junior guard **Devonte Green** also has started 15 career games. He averaged 7.6 points and 2.5 assists last season. In his two-plus seasons with the Hoosiers, he has made 37.3% of his three-point field goal attempts. The Hoosiers were 5-1 in games last year when he shot 50% or better from the field. He helped the IU bench to a historic 51-point effort against Chicago State when he chipped in 15 points off the bench.

Sophomore forward Justin Smith started nine games and led the IU freshman class averaging 6.5 points. He shot 55.0% from the field. In the last six games of the season, he shot 61.2% from the field making 30 of his last 49 field goal attempts. He averaged 12.2 points in those games. He is averaging 10.0 points and shooting 57.6% from the floor.

Sophomore guard Aljami Durham started nine games and averaged 4.8 points. He averaged 18.8 minutes of playing time. He made all 10 of his free throws against Rutgers in the Big Ten Tournament had 39 assists on the season. He averaged 12.0 ppg., last week against Marquette and Arkansas while making 2 starts. He tied a career-high with 3 3FGM at Arkansas.

Sophomore **Clifton Moore** contributed six blocked shots in 43 minutes of action last season and has set career-highs in rebounding in each of his first two games of the season. Redshirt juniors Johnny Jager and Quentin **Taylor** return to the team as non-scholarship players. Redshirt sophomore Vijay Blackmon is another walk-on who is eligible to play after sitting out last season. He had five points against Chicago State. Redshirt freshman forward Race Thompson skipped his senior year of high school and spent last season as a redshirt for the Hoosiers. He was the 71st ranked recruit in the country at Armstrong High School in Plymouth, Minnesota after averaging 19.6 points and 8.9 rebounds during his junior season. He benefits from having a full year in Coach Archie Miller's system and has added 10 pounds of muscle to his frame. After missing most of the preseason with a groin injury, he scored his first career basket against Montana State. Graduate transfer Evan Fitzner joins the squad after playing three seasons at St. Mary's in California. The big man has a career shooting percentage of 41.4% from three-point range and averaged 42 triples per season. He averaged 6.4 points and 3.7 rebounds and is taking graduate courses in the school of public health. He had 14 points against Chicago State and had 16 points against Marquette hitting all 4 of 3FG.

THE FIVE INCOMING FRESHMAN SCORED A COMBINED 9,941 POINTS DURING THEIR HIGH SCHOOL CAREERS.

Freshman guard Romeo Langford, a Preseason All-American, was a McDonald's All-American and is the 27th Mr. Basketball in Indiana to suit up for the Hoosiers. He scored 3,002 points in his career at New Albany High School, including 35.5 points per game as a senior. He was rated the fifth best recruit in the country by 247 and ESPN. He earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors (11/19) after averaging 22 points and 7.5 rebounds against Marquette and Arkansas. He had his first career double-double against the Razorbacks when he added 10 boards. He scored 17 of his game-high 19 points against Chicago State in the first half. He is shooting 51.6% from the floor and averaging 6.0 rebounds. He had 16 against UTA and his 18.2 ppg., average is the highest for any B1G frosh.

Freshman Jerome Hunter comes to IU from Pickerington North (Ohio) High School and was rated as high as 46th among members of the Class of 2018. First-team All-State selection he scored 1,314 points in his career and averaged 20.2 points and 10.2 rebounds. He was the Ohio Central District Co-Player of the Year. He has not played yet due to a leg injury. Freshman forward Damezi Anderson was the 92nd ranked player in the country. The South Bend native set a St. Joseph County and South Bend record by scoring 2,210 points. He was an All-State pick after averaging 19.1 points as a senior. He is the first South Bend scholarship recruit since IU Hall of Famer Tom Abernethy came to Bloomington in the fall of 1972. He is averaging 4.0 points and 2.4 rebounds off the bench. Freshman guard Rob Phinisee played at McCutcheon in Lafayette and was the 99th ranked recruit in the country. He scored 2,023 points in his career for the Mavericks and earned multiple All-State accolades. As a senior, he averaged 29.4 points, 6.8 rebounds, 5.8 assists, and 3.7 steals. He is the first Lafayette native to earn a scholarship from IU since 1948. Played for the same AAU program (Indiana Elite) that produced Jordan Hulls, Cody Zeller and Yogi Ferrell. Phinisee has started all 5 games. He had 12 points and 8 assists with just 1 turnover against Marquette. Phinisee is shooting 58.3% from the floor and 45.5% from threepoint range. He has a team-high 19 assists with just 6 turnovers in 133 minutes.

Freshman forward Jake Forrester hails from Westtown High School in Pennsylvania and was the 127th ranked recruit in the Class of 2018. He scored 1,392 career points and helped his team to a state title as a junior. Will get a chance to play against his former prep teammate Cam Reddish when the Hoosiers visit Duke for the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. He played for the same AAU program (PSA Cardinals) as former Hoosier and current Washington Wizard Thomas Bryant. Forrester had 4 points and 4 boards against Chicago State.

FRANKLIN SIGNS NLI

Indiana University men's basketball coach **Archie Miller** has announced that **Armaan Franklin**, a 6-4 185-lb., All-State guard from Indianapolis Cathedral High School has signed a national letter of intent to attend IU and play basketball for the Hoosiers.

Franklin is ranked #133 in the country by 247 Sports and #137 in the nation by Rivals.com.

He will be a three-year starter for the Irish, who are coached by Jason Delaney, and led them to a 19-5 record as a junior. He averaged 23.0 points, 7.8 rebounds and 3.8 assists per game last season, and 10.0 points and 3.0 rebounds as a sophomore. After last season, he was part of the core team of Indiana Junior All-Stars and was part of the Supreme 15 All-State underclass team as chosen by the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association.

He also averaged 10.9 points and 4.5 rebounds per game for Meanstreets and Coach Tyrone Slaughter. His team played in the Nike EYBL circuit.

He is the son of India Franklin.

HOOSIER INJURY NOTES

The Hoosiers have been without key members of their rotation for the bulk of the first two weeks of the season.

Senior **Zach McRoberts** came out of the game against Montana with tightness in his back and has not been in the lineup since.

Junior **Devonte Green** missed the preseason games with a thigh bruise, played against Chicago State and Montana State but had a setback and has not played since.

Both Green and McRoberts were projected preseason starters.

Redshirt freshman **Race Thompson** missed preseason games and the opener with an injured groin. After playing against Montana State, he suffered a concussion in practice two days later and has not returned to the court. He was expected to add depth to the Hoosiers inside attack.

Freshman **Jerome Hunter** underwent surgery to repair a lower body condition and will be out indefinitely as he recovers. He was a top-50 recruit out of Pickerington, Ohio. He also figured to be in the Hoosiers rotation.

Junior **DeRon Davis** missed the UTA game with soreness in his left achilles. He had surgery to repair his right achilles a season ago.



CHICAGO STATE POST GAME NOTES

The Hoosiers are 4-0 against Chicago State. Their last meeting was November 8th, 2013 where IU won 110-72.

Freshmen Romeo Langford and Rob Phinisee received the start in tonight's season opener. This is the first time since James Blackmon Jr. and Robert Johnson in the 2014-15 season that two freshmen have been in the opening night starting lineup. This was the second time in three years that the Hoosiers have scored 100 points or more in the season opener. Last time was against Kansas in 2016, when the Hoosiers defeated the Jayhawk, 103-99 in overtime in Hawaii. The Indiana bench made their contribution to the victory on Tuesday night with 51 points. Indiana shot 57% in the paint. The Hoosiers out rebounded the Cougars 52-33.

Langford made his Indiana debut scoring a team high 19 points while grabbing four rebounds and three assists. Senior forward **Juwan Morgan** led the team in rebounds with eight while scoring nine points. Freshman guard **Rob Phinisee** scored his first points for Indiana as he led the Hoosiers in assists and steals with five each. Junior guard Devonte **Green** scored 15 points and had three assists. Sophomore forward Justin Smith tallied 13 points with five rebounds. Redshirt senior forward **Evan Fitzner** scored 14 points in his first game with the Hoosiers. Redshirt senior guard **Zach McRoberts** had seven rebounds on the night with six points and three assists. Freshman forward Damezi Anderson scored his first points in the Cream and Crimson as he ended the night with five points and three rebounds. Redshirt sophomore guard Vijay Blackmon five points were his first in the Indiana uniform. Sophomore forward Clifton Moore had a career high four points while also having a career high three rebounds. Freshman forward **Jake Forrester** saw his first points at Indiana as he ended the contest with four. Junior forward De'Ron Davis recorded four points and two rebounds.

MONTANA STATE POST GAME NOTES

Indiana allowed 35 points, its fewest allowed in a game since allowing 29 to Notre Dame on Dec. 18, 1971. IU improved to 3-0 all-time against the Montana State Bobcats. The Hoosiers held the Bobcats to shooting 25 percent from the field, the lowest mark for an opposing team since Rutgers shot 24.1 percent on Feb. 5, 2018. Montana State shot 12 percent from three-point range, the lowest IU has allowed since Youngstown State shot 8 percent on Dec. 29, 2017.

Senior forward Juwan Morgan recorded his 10th career double-double (14 points, 11 rebounds). Morgan had a perfect day from the

field (6-for-6), marking the second time he's shot 100 percent with six or more attempts. The previous time was when he went 8-for-8 against SIU-Edwardsville on Dec. 2, 2016. Freshman guard Romeo Langford scored in doubles digits (12) for the second straight game including hitting on his first career three pointer. Neither played in the final 14:41 of the game. Freshman guard Rob Phinisee played the most minutes (26) of any Hoosier and recorded 12 points. From long distance, Phinisee went 3-for-4. Junior guard **Devonte** Green led the Hoosiers with five assists and dropped in two points. Junior forward De'Ron Davis notched eight points, four rebounds and a team-high three blocks. Sophomore forward Justin Smith made his mark with 13 points and tied his career-high with two assists while adding two steals and a block. Sophomore forward **Clifton Moore** had a career-high five rebounds. Redshirt senior forward Evan **Fitzner** went 3-for-4 from the field on his way to scoring six points on top of three rebounds and an assist. Redshirt senior guard Zach McRoberts hit on his only shot attempt and added two assists and a steal in eight minutes. McRoberts didn't play in the second half due to tightness in his back. Freshman forward Damezi Anderson knocked down a three pointer for the second straight game. Redshirt sophomore guard Vijay Blackmon made his second appearance and played two minutes. Freshman forward Jake Forrester added two rebounds in the effort. Redshirt senior guard Quentin Taylor tallied a rebound for the sixth time in his career. Sophomore guard Aljami **Durham** scored five points and tacked on two assists and two rebounds. Redshirt junior guard Johnny Jager played in his second straight game. Redshirt freshman forward Race Thompson made his first basket as a Hoosier.

MARQUETTE POST GAME NOTES

Indiana improved to 2-1 in the Gavitt Tipoff Games. Its other win in the event came against Creighton in 2015. The Hoosiers now leads the series with Marquette, 8-2. Head coach Archie Miller beat the second ranked team of his IU tenure, the previous being an 80-77 OT win over No. 18 Notre Dame on Dec. 16, 2017. It is Indiana's first ranked win at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall since knocking off No. 3 North Carolina on Nov. 30, 2016. The 63.6 percent shooting is the most for IU in the Archie Miller era. The previous high was 59.1 percent against Illinois on Feb. 14, 2018. Indiana had five players in double figures (Langford, Durham, Phinisee, Morgan, Fitzner) for the first time since Feb. 14, 2018 against Illinois. After trailing 2-0 to open the game, the Hoosiers responded with 19-2 run lasting 4:31. On the run. Durham led the way with seven points and two rebounds. When IU took the 4-2 lead. it held it for the remaining 38:42 of the game. The 23-point victory is the largest margin of victory over a ranked team since Indiana beat No. 13 North Carolina by 24 points on Nov. 27, 2012. Freshman guard Romeo Langford led the Hoosiers in scoring with a seasonhigh 22 points and eight field goals made. The New Albany native added a season-high five rebounds, three steals, and two blocks. Redshirt senior forward Evan Fitzner scored 16 points shooting 6-for-7 and tied his career high with four three pointers made. Freshman guard **Rob Phinisee** shot 5-for-7 from the field on his way to tying his season-high with 12 points and a team-high eight assists. Junior forward **De'Ron Davis** played 15 minutes, scored seven points, and went 5-for-6 from the free throw line. Sophomore forward Justin Smith potted eight points and pulled in six rebounds. Senior forward Juwan Morgan grabbed a team-high eight rebounds and scored 13 points. Sophomore guard Aljami **Durham** made his 10th career start (first of the season) and scored 13 points while tying his career-high with five assists. Durham also four rebounds. Freshman forward **Damezi Anderson** had three points and two rebounds.

ARKANSAS POST GAME NOTES

Indiana finished with a 40-32 advantage in rebounds. The Hoosiers have out-rebounded all four opponents so far this season. The Hoosiers outscored the Razorbacks 13-3 in second chance points. IU held Arkansas to 6-of-23 shooting from the 3-point line. IU trailed 51-41 with 14:16 left in the game, before going on a 13-2 run over the next 4+ minutes to take its first lead of the second half, 54-53 on a Morgan lavup with 10:52 to go. The Hoosiers did not allow a three-point field goal over the final 15:06 of the game. The Hoosiers held Arkansas to 2 of 13 from behind the arc (15.4%) in the second half.

Freshman Romeo Langford recorded his first career double-double with 22 points and 10 rebounds. Langford also added a team-high five assists. After picking up two fouls in the first three minutes of the game, senior Juwan Morgan finished with 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the floor and seven rebounds. Sophomore Aljami Durham made a careerbest 3 three-point field goals on his way to 11 points to go with three rebounds and three assists. Junior De'Ron Davis was the fourth IU player to reach double figures in the scoring column, talling 10 points on 5-of-6 shooting. He also added five rebounds in 23 minutes. The last time he scored in double figures was Dec. 9. 2017 at Louisville.

 Freshman Rob Phinisee finished with seven points - including a 3-point field goal in the final 90 seconds to tie the game. Sophomore Justin Smith chipped in three points and freshman Damezi Anderson scored four points and grabbed three rebounds.

ARCHIE MILLER

SECOND YEAR AT INDIANA • EIGHTH YEAR AS COLLEGE HEAD COACH

Career Record: 159-79 Overall • 77-36 Conference Record at Indiana: 20-16 Overall • 9-9 Big Ten

- · Named the 29th head coach of the Indiana Men's Basketball program on March 25, 2017, by Indiana University Vice President and Director of Athletics Fred Glass.Care
- He won his 150th game as a head coach, January 14, 2018, when the Hoosiers beat Northwestern, 66-46.
- · Miller saw the Hoosiers improve dramatically during the season. After seeing IU allow 76 points per game on 45.9 percent shooting and 41.7 percent accuracy from 3-point range in the month of November, IU limited teams to 65.4 points on 41.3 percent shooting from the floor and 33.1 percent from long distance in the month of February.
- IU posted a two-win improvement in the Big Ten from 2016-17 to 2017-18.
- · He saw junior forward Juwan Morgan emerge as the most improved player in the Big Ten adding more than 10 points per game scoring in Big Ten play during the 2017-18 season. Morgan earned secondteam All-Big Ten honors and was named All-District by the USBWA and NABC in 2018. Senior Rob Johnson averaged a career-best 14.0 points per game earned honorable mention All-Big-Ten honors his senior year.
- · Regarded as one of the top young coaches in the country, Miller is a tireless recruiter, noted developer of talent, and a gifted tactician whose teams are known for their stout defense and efficient offense. His 2018 recruiting class at IU was ranked 7th in the nation after a successful haul of players from the Big Ten footprint. Joining IU in 2018 will be Indiana Mr. Basketball and McDonald's All-American guard Romeo Langford from New Albany, point guard Rob Phinisse from Lafayette and wing Damezi Anderson from South Bend. In addition, Ohio native and forward Jerome Hunter and Pennsylvania native and forward Jake Forrester, make up his first full recruiting class.
- The 40-year old native of Beaver Falls, Pennsylvania, came to IU after serving six seasons as head coach at the University of Dayton, where he won Atlantic 10 Conference regular season championships in 2016 and 2017.

- He guided the Flyers to a 139-63 record (69.8) and a 68-34 mark (66.7) in the Atlantic 10. He took Dayton to the NCAA Tournament each of the last four years with the Flyers advancing to the Elite Eight in the 2014 Tournament. UD was nationally ranked in three of Miller's six seasons (2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16).
- · During their elite eight run, UD topped Ohio State (60-59), Syracuse (55-53) and Stanford (82-72) before falling to Florida (62-52) in the regional finals. In 2015, they defeated Boise State (56-55) and Providence (66-53) and were eliminated by Oklahoma (72-66) in the Sweet Sixteen. In 2016, they were defeated by Final Four participant Syracuse (70-51) in the second round and by Wichita State (64-58) in their first tournament game this season.
- · Miller is one of five active coaches who had at least five NCAA wins in his first four seasons. The others are Mark Few, Thad Matta, Shaka Smart and Roy Williams. With three NCAA wins in 2014 and another two in 2015, Dayton was one of just six teams to have at least five NCAA tournament wins in those two years. The others were Arizona, UConn, Kentucky, Michigan State and Wisconsin.
- · For his efforts during the 2016-17 season, he was named Atlantic 10 and NABC District Coach of the Year. He led UD to perform at a championship level despite playing a 2016-17 campaign where the team's top six scorers missed a total of 32 games during the year due to injury. He also was a finalist for the 2015 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.
- · He comes from a family of coaches with his father, John, having guided Archie and his brother Sean at Blackhawk High School in Beaver Falls. His brother Sean has been the head coach at the University of Arizona and also was the head coach at Xavier University. John was one of the country's top high school coaches when he retired in 2005, with 657 wins in a 35year coaching career. Archie, Sean and their sister Lisa all played Division I college basketball.

- Miller is regarded as a top recruiter Arizona's 2011 recruits were a Top 10 class – and game strategist – he was the architect of the Wildcats upset of eighthranked Texas to get them to the Sweet 16. He was reunited with his brother during the summer of 2015 on the coaching staff of USA Basketball's U19 World Championship. When Sean was elevated to the team's head coach, he turned to his brother to help USA basketball win the gold at the 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship that was held June 27-July 5 in Heraklion, Crete, Greece.
- He was a four-year letterwinner at North Carolina State from 1998-2002. A point guard, he is currently third at NC State in career FT% (.846, 165-195), sixth in career 3-pt. FG% (.429, 218-509), and fourth in career threes (218). As a senior, he helped lead the Wolfpack to the finals of the ACC championship game and was named to the all-tournament team. That season was coach Herb Sendek's first NCAA team at NC State.
- As an assistant, Miller coached in the Big Ten. Pac-12 and ACC, where he honed his craft under some of the most respected coaches in the country. He began his coaching career at NC State, serving as a coaching intern under Sendek in 2002-03. Miller then went to Western Kentucky as a full-time member of Darrin Horn's staff for one season. He returned to NC State, first as Director of Basketball Operations (2004-05), and then as a fulltime assistant coach (2005-06). When Sendek went to Arizona State in 2006-07, Miller remained on his coaching staff before joining Thad Matta at Ohio State for two seasons (2007-09). As a coach, he has been part of 20-plus win and NCAA seasons at NC State (2005-06), Ohio State (2008-09), Arizona (2010-11), and Dayton (2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17).
- In April, 2015, he joined his father and brother in the Beaver County Sports Hall of Fame. Other greats in the Beaver County Hall include Mike Ditka, Tony Dorsett, Terry Francona, Pete and Press Maravich, Joe Namath, Babe Parilli and Norm Van Lier.
- · Miller earned his bachelor's degree in Parks. Recreation and Tourism from NC State in 2002. He was born October 30, 1978. He is married to the former Morgan Nicole Cruse and they have a 14-year old daughter, Leah.


