AGGIE COACHING STAFF

JON VOCHATZER

Head Coach • 25th Year

As is often the case in athletics, the UC Davis men's track and field program carries the stamp of its head coach - energetic, enthusiastic and competitive. After a quarter-century at the helm of the Aggies, Jon Vochatzer continues to translate those qualities into an outstanding rate of success.

In 1998, Vochatzer's talent and attributes brought him the respect of his peers nationally when he was named to the United States coaching staff for the 1999 IAAF World Outdoor Championships in Seville, Spain.

The assignment is one of the highlights of a 36-year career in coaching track and field at various levels, a span which includes directing the Aggies to 14 conference championships during his time at UC Davis.

In 2003, with UC Davis participating in the California Collegiate Athletic Association for its final season, Vochatzer earned CCAA Coach of the Year honors for the fourth time in five years. Before the program joined the CCAA, he also won Coach of the Year honors seven times in the now-defunct Northern California Athletic Conference.

Three seasons removed from Division II and the CCAA, Vochatzer's primary objective is to prepare the Aggie program for the Division I level. UC Davis, amidst a four-year transition from D-II to D-I status, will begin competition at the Big West Conference championships in 2008.

Vochatzer has also earned West Region Coach of the Year honors for indoor track six times and for outdoor track on seven occasions. In both 2000 and 2001, he won that honor in both

seasons. Furthermore, Vochatzer has coached 80 NCAA All-Americans, including nine national champions in his career.

A graduate of Stagg HS in Stockton, Calif., Vochatzer earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees in physical education from Cal State Hayward. He played football and ran track at San Joaquin Delta College from 1966-68, then played both sports at Hayward from 1968 to 1970.

Vochatzer taught and coached at two Bay Area high schools, James Logan in Union City (1970-72) and American HS in Fremont (1972-74) before accepting an overseas assignment at Bitburg American High School in Germany, where he was head coach for both track and football from 1974-78.

Vochatzer returned stateside in 1978, where he was head football and assistant track coach at Foothill HS in Pleasanton for two years.

He was named head track and assistant football coach at UC Davis in 1979, a position he held until 1985 when he returned to Germany for a two-year stint at Nurnberg American High School, directing both the football and track programs. He returned to Davis in 1987 and since then has overseen a decade of track excellence.

He played a pivotal role in the Atlanta Olympics effort as a member of the Olympic Development Committee for the U.S. sprint team. In 1995, he was an assistant coach at the Olympic Festival and was an assistant for the World University Games in 1997.

As an instructor at UC Davis, Vochatzer has developed an array of physical education programs for mentally and physically challenged athletes. Since 1990, he has served as track and field consultant for the California Special Olympics.

Administratively, Vochatzer has served UC Davis since 1991 as a member of the Executive Council, Academic Federation and the Committee on Committees. He was also on the Public Affairs subcommittee from 1994-96.

Jon and his wife, Deanne, the women's track coach at UC Davis, reside in Davis. Vochatzer served as Competition Manager for the 2000 Olympic Track & Field Trials in Sacramento.

DEANNE VOCHATZER

Head Coach • 15th Year

Few coaches in any sport achieve the ultimate accolade that befell UC Davis women's track and field coach Deanne Vochatzer in 1996. Long one of the outstanding leaders in track and field in the United States, Vochatzer's years of hard work culminated in her being named the head coach of the 1996 U.S. Team at the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

And the person least impressed with the honor was the same person who received it.

Then in the fall of 2002, the track and field community honored Vochatzer again, this time in the form of her induction to the U.S. Track Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Since the '96 Games, UC Davis has been the beneficiary of her talent, wisdom and enthusiasm. In addition to numerous All-Americans and all-conference performers who have achieved success with her guidance, three Aggie track standouts – middle distance runner Jamila Demby, hurdler Kameelah Elarms and sprinter Tanisha Silas – were named as finalists for the prestigious NCAA Woman of the Year award. Demby won that award in 1999 while Silas captured the honor in 2002. Elarms advanced to the top 10 in 2001.

In 2003, the Aggies won their fifth straight California Collegiate Athletic Association championship – the program's 11th straight league title including those won in the now-defunct Northern California Athletic Conference. Vochatzer was selected as CCAA Coach of the Year for the fifth time. That title proved to be the program's swan song in the CCAA as UC Davis began its reclassification process to NCAA Division I status the following year. The Aggies will compete in the Big West Conference beginning 2008.

In 2002, she earned USTCA West Region Indoor Coach of the Year for the fourth consecutive season. Vochatzer was also named West Region Outdoor Coach of the Year in 2001. In 1999, she won Region Coach of the Year honors in both indoor and outdoor, and culminated the feat by garnering NCAA Division II National Women's Coach of the Year honors, having guided UC Davis to a seventh-place finish indoors and a sixth-place showing outdoors.

Vochatzer's career résumé includes successful forays into coaching, administration and owning her own business.

She graduated in 1971 from Chico State with a bachelor's degree in physical education. She then served her alma mater from 1972-75 as women's track and cross country coach, where her teams in each sport won the conference championship each season.

In 1976, Vochatzer moved to Florida. She was owner/manager of One-Der-Wear, Inc., her own apparel company, and was women's head cross country and track coach at the University



of Florida from 1977-79. She completed work on her master's degree while in Gainesville.

The West Coast beckoned anew for her in 1980 as she took the reins of athletic director at Presentation High School in San Jose, Calif., a position she held through 1987. She also coached track and cross country at Presentation.

Her first UC Davis experience came from 1987-89, when she taught and was women's coach in 1988 and assistant to both the men's and women's programs in 1989-90. Vochatzer then moved to Cal Poly as head women's coach for both track and cross country from 1989-90, before her return to the Davis campus in 1990-91 as head women's track coach. While at Cal Poly, Vochatzer's squads were NCAA cross country champions in 1990 and 1991, and track champions in 1991.

Her national and international coaching experience goes back to 1979 when she was an aide to that year's Sports Festival team, a role she would reprise in 1981. From 1982-87, Vochatzer was assistant coordinator for women athletes with the U.S. Olympic Festival. She served as coordinator from 1987 to 1994.

In 1992, Vochatzer was alternate head Olympic coach for women and was head coach for two World University Games prior to receiving the prestigious honor of leading the U.S. women track and field athletes into the Olympic Stadium in Atlanta.

Vochatzer is regularly in demand as both a clinician and speaker on her sport and has also had media exposure as an expert commentator for ESPN. She is a consultant for Nike, the National High School Coaches Association and the U.S. Justice Department on Alcohol & Drug Education for Athletics.

Vochatzer was one of the lead presenters in Sacramento's successful bid to host the 2000 Olympic Trials, for which she served as Director of Competition. She earned USATF's prestigious Joe Robichaux Award in 2001 for her contributions as an organizer.



BYRON TALLEY

*Assistant Head Coach
Hurdles
2nd Year*

An outdoor All-American and owner of two UC Davis hurdles records, Byron Talley returned to his collegiate alma mater to serve as Jon and Deanne Vochatzer's top assistant in 2005. Talley assists both men's and women's squads, working primarily with the hurdlers. His responsibilities also include meet administration and recruiting.

In his two-year Aggie career, Talley set a school outdoor mark in the 110 hurdles and an indoor record in the 55 hurdles. As a senior in 2002, he captured the California Collegiate Athletic Association title, posting a 14.19 time in the preliminaries. Less than two weeks later, Talley placed eighth at the NCAA Div. II Championships, advancing to the finals with a UC Davis-record 14.02 in the prelims. That performance broke Daryl Hill's previous mark of 14.04, set nearly two decades prior.

Coincidentally, Hill and Talley remain as the program's last two All-Americans in the 110 hurdles.

In 2001, Talley's first year with the Aggies, he recorded a 7.67 in the 55-meter hurdles at Nevada's annual Wolf Pack Invitational. Entering the 2005 season, that mark still stands as the program's all-time best.

Talley transferred to UC Davis in 2000 after an exemplary career at nearby Yuba College. He was the Northern California community college champion in the decathlon, setting a Yuba record with 6,535 points. Additionally, he won Scholar-Athlete honors for compiling his team's highest grade-point average.

Talley graduated from UC Davis in 2002, having double-majored in psychology and communication. This is his first foray into collegiate coaching.



JASON JAQUES

*Assistant Coach
Middle Distances
3rd Year*

Former Aggie team captain and all-conference honoree Jason Jaques returns for his third year on staff, working primarily with the middle distance squads. He also served his second season as head coach for the UC Davis cross country teams last fall, after one season as an assistant coach for former coach Sue Williams.

Jaques lettered four years as a hurdler, serving as team captain and thus the representative to the Captains' Council (now known as the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee) as a senior. As a junior, he finished third at the Northern California Athletic Conference meet in the 400 hurdles, helping his team claim the league title.

Jaques previously was an assistant coach and instructor at the University of Missouri-Rolla, where he mentored eight national qualifiers - including three All-Americans - in his three-year stay. In 2001-02, the student-athlete organization "M" Club selected him as the university's Coach of the Year. Jaques also taught physical education courses as part of his duties with UMR.

The Woodland, Calif. native earned his bachelor's degree in managerial economics from UC Davis in 1995, then stayed with the program as a volunteer assistant for two seasons. During that time, Jaques was a site manager and marketing assistant for A Change of Pace, which oversees numerous local races and triathlons.

Jaques later served as a graduate assistant coach at Cal Poly for two years, working mostly with fellow intermediate hurdlers. He completed his master's degree in kinesiology in 2003.



CHRIS PUPPIONE

After six years as a successful coach in boys' and girls' cross country, track and soccer, Chris Puppione enters his second season as an assistant coach with the Aggie track & field program. He also finished his third year as Jason Jaques' assistant with the UC Davis cross country team last fall.

Puppione most recently coached cross country at Amador Valley HS in Pleasanton, guiding the girls' team to a North Coast Section runner-up finish and a sixth-place showing at the state meet in 2004. Additionally, the AVHS boys' squad placed third in the East Bay Athletic League. Puppione also mentored several All-EBAL and CIF-NCS qualifiers for the track teams.

Previously, Puppione coached boys' soccer and both cross country and track programs at Paraclete, Cardinal Newman and Ursuline high schools from 1998 to 2003. He guided cross country teams to top-three section and top-10 state finishes three times. In the spring, Puppione coached numerous 800, mile and two-mile competitors to CIF-NCS championship berths.

Puppione was a two-time state qualifier as a prep athlete in his hometown of Castro Valley, Calif. He later ran cross country at Long Beach State before transferring to Sonoma State. Puppione earned his B.A. in creative writing from SSU in 1997.

A two-time NCAA All-American and USATF champion, Tim Fua joins the UC Davis track & field coaching staff as a throws coach, replacing longtime assistant Ken Norlen.

Fua has coached at both the two-year and four-year collegiate level since graduating with a bachelor's degree in public administration from Chico State in 1997. He capped his Wildcat career by earning NCAA Division II All-America status, placing sixth in both the shot put and discus at the 1996 national meet. Through the 2005 season, Fua continues to rank among Chico State's all-time top performers in both events.

Fua's coaching career began at Butte Community College in Oroville, where he served as a throws coach in 1997. He then spent two years in a similar role at Stockton's San Joaquin Delta College for the 1999 and 2000 seasons, before returning to Chico State. While earning his master's degree in exercise science, Fua served as a throws coach for the Wildcats and a faculty instructor in the department.

In addition to teaching and coaching, Fua remained active as an athlete. In 2002, he captured the USATF Submasters indoor national title in the shot put, then added outdoor championships in the shot, discus and hammer throw.

Fua completed his master's degree in 2002, then stayed on to assist with the Chico State program for two more seasons. He moved to the Sacramento area in 2004, assuming a dual role of an adjunct faculty member in physical education/health science and an assistant track & field coach at Sacramento City College. Fua spent one season with the Panthers under former Aggie assistant Rob Dewar before joining the UC Davis program in 2005-06.




TREVOR BOLER

A two-time outdoor All-American and the first male athlete to win an indoor national title at UC Davis, Trevor Boler is now in his fourth year as the Aggies' pole vault coach.

At the 2000 indoor national championships, Boler cleared the bar at 16-8.75 to capture the pole vault title. His winning mark set a school indoor record, which he still shares with teammate Tony Moore. Boler capped his Aggie career later during the subsequent outdoor season when he won the California Collegiate Athletic Association vault title, then went on to post a third-place All-America finish at the outdoor nationals. He had previously earned outdoor All-America honors as a junior, finishing fifth at the national meet.

Originally from nearby Dixon, Boler graduated from UC Davis in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in exercise science. He is currently working on his master's in education while coaching and teaching full-time. During the summer, Boler works as a licensed real estate agent, while running his own painting business.



HIDESHI OKAMOTO

*Assistant Coach
High Jump
4th Year*

Hideshi Okamoto, or "Coach H" as he is perhaps better known, brings to the UC Davis program both diverse experience in track and field, cultivated at both the collegiate and international levels.

As a coach, Okamoto has served on track & field staffs at the University of Colorado – where he became the first-ever Japanese coach in the NCAA Division I ranks – and for the Japanese national team. He served on the Buffaloes staff from 1986 to 1997, mentoring jumps and sprints. Among his pupils was Karol Damon, who placed third in the high jump at the 1992 NCAA Championships. In his first season at CU, his sprint squad went from eighth to fourth in points scored at the Big 8 Conference meet.

While at Colorado, Okamoto founded the Goldwin Track Club and served as marketing director for the Goldwin Corp. in Boulder. Furthermore, he worked as an assistant physical therapist for the Boulder-based Mapleton Rehabilitation Center.

During his tenure with the Japan Amateur Athletic Federation and national team, he guided more than 40 runners to success at the international level. Okamoto guided the careers of Kazuhiko Yamazaki, who finished seventh in the 400 hurdles at the 1995 World Championship; and Yoshito Konno, who captured the 800 at the 1994 Helsinki Grand Prix.

His knowledge of track & field was not limited to his team's training, either – Okamoto served as a television commentator for Japanese national broadcasts.

Okamoto graduated from Osaka Gakuin University in 1980 with a degree in English, then earned his graduate degree in physical education and kinesiology from Wyoming in 1984. He and his wife, Yasuko, have three sons: Kento, Yuto and Maito.

ACADEMICS

UC Davis comprises three colleges (Agricultural & Environmental Sciences, Engineering, Letters & Science), five professional schools (Education, Law, Management, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine) plus the Division of Biological Sciences.

With 103 undergraduate majors and 80 graduate programs, the university offers the most expansive and diverse range of academics among any of the University of California campuses. Additionally, students also have the opportunity to combine majors or customize their field of study by creating an individual major.

For those interested in graduate degrees – whether it be a master's degree or a doctorate – UC Davis offers advising services to help students craft their education toward those goals. An estimated 86 percent of UC Davis students applying to graduate schools earn acceptance to either their first or second choices.

RANKINGS

UC Davis ranks 11th among public universities, according to *U.S. News & World Report*, and 16th by the National Research Council. Furthermore, the National Science Foundation places the university 15th in the nation in research funding, and *Money* magazine considered UC Davis as one of the West's top "best buys".

Additionally, the Gourman Report rated the genetics department at No. 1, while *U.S. News & World Report* ranked the College of Engineering as No. 13 among its peers.

COMMUNITY

With a population of approximately 60 thousand, Davis is widely known for being a safe, active and socially innovative community.

The downtown area boasts a multitude of specialty shops, restaurants, theaters and art galleries; while the city's numerous parks offer recreational opportunities for active students.

ACTIVITIES

On campus, UC Davis students can rally around the highly successful athletics department by joining the Aggie Pack spirit organization, or enjoy a first-class performance at the Robert & Magrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts.

The university also offers hundreds of student clubs and organizations, including cultural clubs, fraternities and sororities, faith-based organizations and the Associated Students of UC Davis student government.

For the active Aggie, students may participate in the diverse intramural sports program or join one of the 30-plus sports clubs. In 2004, the Activities & Recreation Center (ARC) opened its doors, providing the campus with its own state-of-the-art fitness venue.

In April, UC Davis hosts Picnic Day, an annual student-run open house. The popular event showcases all that the campus has to offer, attracting students, staff, faculty, parents, alumni and members of the surrounding communities.

GETTING AROUND

Nestled just southwest of Sacramento, the city of Davis rests just 15 minutes from an international airport, and contains a downtown station serviced by Greyhound and Amtrak. Centrally located in the Sacramento Valley, the town sits equally close to both the finest ski resorts and the Pacific Ocean's top beaches.

Within Davis and its neighboring towns, both Yolo-bus and the student-operated Unitrans bus systems offer free transportation to registered undergraduates.

The town boasts more bicycles per capita than any other city in the nation. More than 50 miles of bike paths make the entire town conducive to both riders and pedestrians.

CAMPUS LEADERSHIP

LARRY VANDERHOEF

Larry N. Vanderhoef was appointed chancellor of the University of California, Davis, in April 1994. He joined the campus in 1984 as executive vice chancellor and provost.

During his 10-plus years as chancellor, the campus was invited to membership in the AAU; increased its extramural awards from \$169.1 million to \$420.7 million annually, earning a National Science Foundation (NSF) research funding ranking of 14th in the U.S.; expanded classroom, lab, clinical and office space by 2 million square feet, with 1 million more to be built over the next five years; completed the transformation of an ailing county hospital to an academically distinguished and financially sound regional medical center; and made distinctive strides in recruiting a diverse and accomplished faculty and student body.

Chancellor Vanderhoef was recently honored by the *Sacramento Business Journal* as one of the 20 people who have contributed most substantially to California's capital region over the past 20 years and by the Sacramento Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce as Sacramentoan of the Year.

In 2004 he led a UC Davis delegation to Iran in an effort to promote dialogue and scholar exchange, and to promote generally the notion of crossing boundaries to build greater understanding and good will - a continuing personal and professional effort.

His research interests lie in the general area of plant growth and development, and in the evolution of the land-grant universities. He has taught classes from freshman level to advanced graduate study.

Chancellor Vanderhoef has served on

various national commissions addressing graduate and international education, the role of a modern land-grant university and accrediting issues.



VIRGINIA HINSHAW

Virginia S. Hinshaw, Ph.D. serves as the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor of UC Davis. In that capacity, she is the campus's chief academic and financial officer and acts for the Chancellor in his absence. Hinshaw's responsibilities include oversight of the campus's \$2.2 billion budget and overall responsibility for the UC Davis Health System; campus operations, including resource management, planning and policy development; and strategic leadership in planning, coordinating and implementing academic direction and programs. Prior to joining UC Davis in 2001, she served as the Dean of the Graduate School and Vice Chancellor for Research at the University of Wisconsin Madison. Hinshaw's

University of Wisconsin, Madison.

In addition to her administrative duties, Hinshaw maintains a joint appointment in two academic departments as a Professor of Virology in the Department of Internal Medicine, School of Medicine, and in the Department of Pathology, Microbiology and Immunology, School of Veterinary Medicine at UC Davis. For over 25 years she has conducted research on viruses, primarily influenza, at different hospitals and universities, including Medical College of Virginia, University of California Berkeley, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Harvard Medical School, and the University of Wisconsin Madison. Hinshaw's

research has increased our understanding of various aspects of influenza viruses, such as important hosts in nature, transmission among humans, lower mammals and birds, genetic changes related to disease severity, the molecular basis of cell killing, and new approaches to vaccines. Her innovative and energetic teaching style, combined with her continual advocacy for research and education, has earned her national recognition and acclaim.



JUDY SAKAKI

Judy Sakaki assumed her position as Vice Chancellor of the Division of Student Affairs in July 2002. Dr. Sakaki oversees programs and services that enhance the academic and personal development of students, including intercollegiate athletics.

Sakaki received her bachelor's and master's degrees from California State University, Hayward, in 1975 and 1977, respectively, and a Ph.D. from UC Berkeley in 1991. In 1994-95 she was an Executive Fellow in the

forge links between student services and academic programs. UC Davis students, and the campus community, benefit significantly from her expertise, insights, and passion for providing an optimal learning environment.



UC DAVIS ATHLETICS



GREG WARZECKA

On August 1, 1995, Greg Warzecka became the 11th director of athletics at UC Davis. In the decade-plus since, the Aggie athletics program has enjoyed unprecedented success under his guidance.

Warzecka's penchant for progress began from his first year as director when he was charged with the task of fully engaging the campus in discussions regarding whether or not UC Davis would offer athletics-related financial aid. One year later, the campus announced the launch of its first-ever grant-in-aid program.

Warzecka has also overseen UC Davis' transition into two conferences in his short tenure. In 1998, the Aggies moved from the now-defunct Northern California Athletic Conference to the powerful California Collegiate Athletic Association. Then in 2003, the UC Davis program announced that it would join the Big West Conference and thus reclassify from NCAA Division II to Division I status.

During Warzecka tenure, UC Davis captured six

NACDA Division II Directors' Cups as the most outstanding overall program in the country. For his part, NACDA selected Warzecka as its A.D. of the year for the D-II West Region in 2001-02.

Furthermore, the editors of *Sports Illustrated* magazine lauded the Aggie program on three different occasions. In 1999 and 2000, *Sports Illustrated For Women* named UC Davis as the top Division II school for women athletics. One year later, *SI* selected UC Davis as its top D-II school for the 2001-02 year.

Before turning to administration, Warzecka had been a successful baseball coach, first as an assistant at his alma mater, UC Berkeley. He then served as head coach at San Francisco State, then at the University of Chicago, where he also served his first post as men's athletics director. Warzecka returned to California in 1989 to become the A.D. at the University of Redlands, where he remained until he joined the Aggie athletics staff.

UC Davis ranks among the leaders in NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Awards and Academic All-District/America honorees, and has claimed a record three winners of the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. Student-Athlete Guidance Services deserves much of the credit for these accomplishments.

The SAGS office started in 1988 with a single staff member serving as a centralized resource for academic advising, eligibility information and campus referrals. The office has since expanded to include additional academic advisors, an athletic aid coordinator, an assistant eligibility coordinator and an administrative assistant. It is headed by Pam Gill-Fisher, senior associate director of athletics.

The SAGS office provides a range of services to student-athletes on all 26 intercollegiate athletics teams, including assistance with course and major selection as well as interpretation and clarification of eligibility rules and issues.

UC Davis student-athletes typically have a minimum of three academic advisors: an athletic academic

advisor assigned by sport, a college advisor, and a major advisor (if the student has a declared major). Although appointments with the athletic academic advisors are not mandatory at UC Davis, student-athletes might choose to see their athletic academic advisor for issues including:

- Balancing academic and athletic expectations
- General education (GE) requirements
- Dropping/adding courses
- Time management/study skills
- Assistance completing the mandatory Academic Plan Form
- Study hall for student-athletes
- Personal issues that affect academic performance
- Choosing a major/career
- Declaring or changing a major
- Campus resources
- Exploration of opportunities beyond athletics
- Preparation for graduate programs
- Preparation and application for NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships and other national awards

Known collectively as "The Healer of Champions", the UC Davis athletic training staff comprises five full-time certified athletic trainers, a full-time physical therapist/certified athletic trainer and approximately 24 student athletic trainers. Together, they are responsible for providing medical care to the 800-plus student-athletes that compose UC Davis' 26 varsity teams.

The student athletic trainers serve two to three years with the program, logging in more than 1,500

hours and gaining valuable clinical education in a hands-on environment. The internship is ideal for any student interested in a graduate program in athletic training, as well as any medical or allied medical profession.

The ARC Pavilion training room contains extensive resources and equipment for the rehabilitation of injured athletes. The staff physical therapist is headquartered there as well.



SCHAAL AQUATICS CENTER

In January of 2004, the Ted & Rand Schaal Aquatics Center hosted its first event. The complex features an Olympic-sized pool, locker rooms, team rooms, office space and permanent seating for approximately 500 spectators. The aquatics center will allow UC Davis to host championship events, such as this year's Western Water Polo Association championships.

TOOMEY WEIGHT ROOM





FUTURE GAMES

In the upcoming years, UC Davis Athletics will see the opening of two first-class athletics facilities. The Marya Welch Tennis Center (left), an upgrade of the existing Hickey Tennis Courts, began construction in 2004. Long-term plans for the tennis venue include grandstand seating with restroom/concessions. Its first phase was dedicated in April 2005.

Aggie football and women's lacrosse will move to a multi-purpose stadium, located adjacent to the Schaal Aquatics Center, as early as the 2006-07 academic year. Initial concept designs call for seating of 10,000 to 15,000 spectators, with an eventual build-out to as many as 30,000.

TRANSITION TO DIVISION I

On March 11, 2003, UC Davis made a landmark move in its storied intercollegiate athletics history when Chancellor Larry Vanderhoef announced that the university would reclassify from NCAA Division II to NCAA Division I status and join the Big West Conference. The announcement came after much discussion by campus administrators, faculty, staff, students, alumni and local community.

Additionally, UC Davis undergraduate students passed the Campus Expansion Initiative, which will help fund the Aggies' growing athletics grant-in-aid program.

UC Davis, which began its four-year transition to Division I in the fall of 2003, will start some competition in the Big West in 2004-05 and is scheduled for full Division I

membership in 2007-08.

UC Davis will compete in the Big West Conference in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track & field and women's volleyball.

Football is a charter member of the Great West Football Conference, women's rowing is a member of the Western Independent Rowing Association, men's and women's water polo will remain in the Western Water Polo Association and women's lacrosse will continue play in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation.

Women's gymnastics and men's wrestling – already classified as Division I programs – will continue their participation in the MPSF and Pacific-10 Conference, respectively.

DIVISION I TIMELINE

Good News

The light at the end of the tunnel brightened when the NCAA Division I Board of Directors approved legislation which will make Aggies eligible to win automatic berths to NCAA Championships beginning their first active year of Division I membership in 2007-08. The Big West Conference-sponsored NCAA 2003-13 passed in August of 2004.

Under previous legislation, the Aggies would have been ineligible to win any automatic berth awarded to the Big West Conference until 2009-10. For men's basketball, the wait was eight years, meaning the Aggies would not be able to win an automatic berth until 2015-16.

- Completion of a compliance review conducted by the national office and submission of a report with an institutional response of findings.
- Submit an annual report and updated strategic plan by June 30 based on feedback received from the previous year's annual report.

- Successfully complete an NCAA athletics certification self-study and evaluation visit.
- Attendance at the NCAA Convention.
- Attendance at a meeting conducted at the NCAA Convention to discuss issues impacting Division I members.
- Submit an annual report and updated strategic plan by June 30, 2007 based on feedback received from the previous years review.
- The CEI reaches its full implementation. The athletics-designated portion increases to generate an estimated total of \$4.26 million in grants-in-aid.

2007-08

First Year of Division I

- All teams become eligible for conference and NCAA championships.
- Teams become eligible to win Big West automatic berths to NCAA championships.
