QUICK HITS

- The 2018 season is the 100th in UC Davis football's history
- The Aggies earned their inaugural in-season national ranking as a full-fledged Division I program when STATS FCS listed them at No. 23, as announced on Monday
- Saturday's game is the first against a ranked FBS opponent since Oct. 3, 2009, when the Aggies faced No. 5 Boise State
- Stanford enters Saturday's game, the last of three straight at home to open the season, ranked No. 9 in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' Poll
- UC Davis, a team averaging 49.0 points per game and ranked No. 2 among all FCS teams will face a Stanford defense that is ranked No. 3 in the FBS by allowing 6.5 points per game
- UC Davis is receiving votes in the FCS Coaches Poll and ended up three votes shy of matching No. 25 Colgate's total
- Saturday's 11 a.m. game is the earliest played by UC Davis during its Big Sky era, and the fourth since joining the conference

SERIES HISTORY

- Stanford leads the all-time series, 2-1
- UC Davis' inaugural victory over a FBS team took place during the 2005 season when it scored 20 unanswered to upset the Cardinal
- The game-winning drive that night covered 72 yards and ended with a three-yard TD pass to Blaise Smith with eight seconds left in the game
- With that result, the Aggies became the first non-Division I-A team to beat Stanford
- The Cardinal did not score an offensive touchdown and gained only 180 yards on the night
- Before that meeting, the only previously played game took place in 1932 when Pop Warner was Stanford's coach
- Current UC Davis offensive coordinator Tim Plough and offensive line coach Tim Keane were members of the 2005 squad

KEELAN'S CASE - WALTER PAYTON AWARD

In 2017, wide receiver Keelan Doss became the first UC Davis student-athlete named a national finalist for the Walter Payton Award — an honor bestowed to the most outstanding offensive player in the nation. This recognition was well-deserved since Doss:

- Is the program's inaugural consensus All-American
- Ended with 1,499 receiving yards, league-high averages of 136.3 receiving yards and 10.5 receptions per game, the No. 1 figures in the nation among all FCS and FBS players when the Aggies' season concluded
- Received Offensive Player of the Year and First Team All-Big Sky honors from league officials

After choosing to return to UC Davis for his senior season, the consensus preseason All-American earned a spot on the 2018 Walter Payton Award Watch List, in addition to Big Sky Preseason Offensive Player of the Year and Preseason All-Big Sky honors.

Doss, a 2018 team captain, set new program records in receptions, receiving yards, 100-yard games, and led all league players in receptions and receiving yards per game.

Doss at a Glance

- Senior wide receiver's major is sociology - organizational studies
- Hails from Alameda, Calif.
- Three-year varsity letterwinner at Alameda High School

- 2017 consensus All-American
- Walter Payton Award finalist
- Big Sky Conference's 2017 Offensive Player of the Year
- All-Big Sky First Team selection
- No player at the FBS or FCS levels held higher figures in receiving yards (1,499), receiving yards per game (136.3) and receptions per game (10.5), when the Aggies' season ended, than Doss
- In addition to averaging 13.0 yards per reception, Doss led all Big Sky players in receptions per game and receiving yards per game
- He is the first Aggie receiver in the program's Big Sky era and eighth in program history to collect 1,000 or more yards in a single season

- Earned All-America and All-Big Sky accolades as a sophomore
- Ranked No. 19 in receiving TDs (10), No. 21 in receptions per game (6.0), No. 30 in receiving yards per game (82.8), No. 33 in receiving yards (911), No. 55 in total touchdowns (10), No. 120 in scoring (5.5 points per game), No. 140 in all-purpose yards (82.82) and No. 146 in yards per reception (13.80) among all FCS players that season

- Started two of 10 games played as a freshman
- Received the Mike Wise Award as the program's top freshman

He took his family on vacation to Machu Picchu in Peru. He taught science, jumped out of airplanes, and coached football in 13 different countries. For Dan Hawkins, who was introduced on November 28, 2016, those aren't simply items to cross off a bucket list, they have been opportunities to learn. It's that thirst for learning and application of that knowledge that brought Hawkins, a 1984 UC Davis alumnus who played and coached with legendary head coach Jim Sochor, back to his alma mater.

By incorporating the program's core principles of uncommon engineering, quality balance of life and excellence with class, the Aggies thrived both on and off the field, and built the foundation for the program's #AGScension.

During Hawkins' first year at UC Davis, his team set 46 new Big Sky era records, faced more ranked teams (or teams receiving votes) since joining the league, won five games against Division I competition — matching the combined total from the previous three seasons — and collected five Big Sky Player of the Week awards, matching the total from the last four years combined.

For the first time in program history, UC Davis also ended the season as the league's No. 1 offense and, under Hawkins' tutelage, earned 10 All-Big Sky awards, including two of the league's top honors: Offensive Player of the Year (Keelan Doss) and Newcomer of the Year (Jake Maier).

By finishing the regular season as the best wide receiver in the nation — no player at the FBS or FCS levels held higher total receiving yards (1,499), receiving yards per game (136.3) or receptions per game (10.5) averages — Doss became the first Aggie national finalist for the Walter Payton Award, presented to the FCS' top offensive player in the country.

In addition to its on-field success, UC Davis football posted the highest APR — a team-based metric that holds institutions accountable for the academic progress of their student-athletes — of any Big Sky program for the fifth straight year when the NCAA released its annual report.

Football student-athletes also enjoy a unique opportunity as part of Hawkins' program, one rarely presented by any program, at any level across the nation. By shifting his off-season workouts to the winter quarter, student-athletes are now able to study abroad, participate in an internship, volunteer or organize community service projects during the spring quarter and summer months.

By enabling his players to enjoy the same opportunities provided to the student body, Hawkins has successfully created a culture focused on providing a well-rounded college experience at the sixth-ranked public school in the nation, while competing at the highest level of college athletics.

Hawkins, who also served as a college football studio analyst at ESPN in recent seasons, brings a unique depth of experience and innovative offensive approach back to his alma mater. During his career, Hawkins built Boise State to elite status on the college football landscape and coached in the Big XII at the University of Colorado.

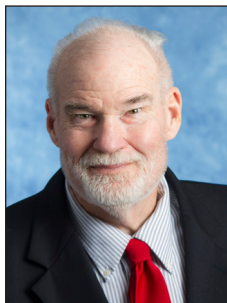

- Boise State led the country in scoring (45.6) and total offense (501.5) in 2002
- Hawkins coached 20 All-WAC first-team selections, three All-Americans, and 10 players that played in the NFL
- Coach Hawkins led the Broncos to four WAC titles, collected Coach of the Year honors in 2002 and '04, and ended the 2004 season as a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant College Football Coach of the Year Award
- Took over a rebuilding Colorado (2006-10) program and gained invaluable experience during his tenure with the Big XII Conference

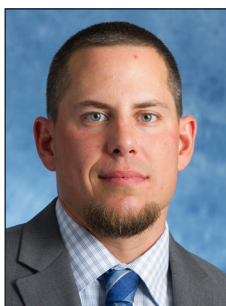

THE AGGIE EVO SYSTEM

UC Davis student-athletes will understand how the real world works and possess the skills to navigate it. They will launch into a great job or graduate school opportunity without unwanted delay.

“We are uncommonly committed to preparing student-athletes for successful lives after graduation. Our approach is based on the science of human development. You will not find another school more dedicated to helping you be positioned for a great job or grad school opportunity after sports end, whenever that may be.”

It is this uncommon commitment towards student-athletes that led to the creation of the Aggie EVO System, a multi-faceted student-athlete outcomes program focused on preparing young men and women for a successful launch after graduating from the sixth-ranked public school in the nation.

We define launch as moving beyond graduation into a meaningful professional path that builds on the college experience, sets a graduate on a path of financial and social well-being and effectively replaces the sport as the primary piece of their identity.

The Aggie EVO System (“EVO” is shorthand for a student-athlete’s “evolution” during college) is an important part of the student-athlete experience at UC Davis – just like weights and conditioning, attending class or getting athletic medicine treatment. This unprecedented program was designed to focus on four key elements to help UC Davis student-athletes prepare for future success by helping them better “know and navigate the World of Work”:

- **SKILLS** that employers want and will make student-athletes even more effective in their sports: self awareness, emotional intelligence, social/cultural competence and leadership.
- **KNOWLEDGE** of what careers and paths are out there (we call this the “World of Work”), what fits one’s interests and abilities, who in our gigantic network can advise and guide them and each individual can navigate a path to get there.
- **OPPORTUNITIES** to enjoy internships, jobs and other learning opportunities through a powerful network of Aggie alums. Student-athletes hear from and meet alums in a wide variety of fields, attend recruiting events and visit members of the EVO Pro network at companies in San Francisco, Silicon Valley, and Sacramento.
- **TOOLS** that student-athletes need to secure these opportunities. We require a few more basic tools or updates each year they are on campus. This includes resumes and cover letters, LinkedIn profiles, interviewing skills, business cards, professional headshots, and anything else that helps student-athletes prepare for a more successful launch.

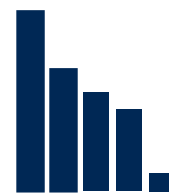

FRED ARP (1944-2018) - AN AGGIE FOR LIFE



Fred Arp, a member of the UC Davis football coaching staff for 41 seasons and the only assistant coach ever to earn induction into the Cal Aggie Athletics Hall of Fame, passed away on July 4, 2018, at the age of 73.

The Aggie football program champions three major feats from its history: 37 consecutive winning seasons, 20 straight conference titles and 18 NCAA postseason appearances. Arp is the only member of the program whose career spanned all three accomplishments. A former transfer from the University of Nevada, Arp lettered only the 1965 season at UC Davis before learning that a heart condition would sideline him for his senior year.

Arp transitioned to the coaching staff, first as the head freshman coach, then later as the defensive line coach, a position he held until his retirement in 2007. Arp only missed one season during that span, when he attended graduate school at the University of Northern Colorado. And in the other years, he missed only one game – for the birth of his son.

“He epitomized what Aggie Pride is all about, which is really about character and integrity. It’s one thing to give lip service to character and integrity, it’s another to live it, breathe it, preach it, learn by it. And I think that’s what he did. He believed in it, it was part of who he was, it’s in the fiber of who Fred Arp is. That’s what made him special, and that’s what made people who played for him special, because they were part of something bigger than themselves. And Fred was the person who would make sure that people understood what that really meant, and consequently, they just played their hearts out for him,” said former UC Davis head coach Bob Biggs, during Arp’s Hall of Fame induction.

Like many on the UC Davis football staff, Arp was relatively soft-spoken as a coach. Although he demanded the most of them, he did not yell nor berate his players. The combination of this demeanor, plus the soothing shade cast by the Howard Way trees on the team’s practice field, resulted in an enduring nickname for Arp’s defensive line corps: Club Fred.

That moniker became the perfect description for the culture and atmosphere Arp created. He treated his players well, and in turn, they treated him well – both with respect and in on-field results. Six of his defensive linemen earned first-team All-America honors, with three more earning Academic All-America or NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Awards. A total of 35 garnered first-team all-conference nods.

“The Aggie D-Line has always been a unique position on the field, and this is 100 percent because of Fred,” said Dr. Robby Flannery, who starred at defensive tackle for Arp from 1996 to 1999. “We were called Club Fred because everyone else on the team saw us doing ‘Shade Drills,’ and thought we had it easy. In reality, Fred knew we would perform on Saturday, so he figured he didn’t need to ‘toughen us up’. He always respected his players, and the feeling was mutual. We got the privilege of Club Fred and Shade Drills because the Aggie D-Line was going to leave it all out on the field come Saturday.”

Off the field, Arp stood as an unofficial historian for the Aggie football program. He continued the tradition of naming the “All-Decade” teams in the 1990s and 2000s. In the 1990s, he assumed the responsibility of producing the team’s annual highlight film. Even after his retirement, Arp remained with the program as an advisor, and became instrumental in scheduling high-profile opponents during UC Davis’ early ascension as an NCAA Division I member.

“There have been many legends responsible for the legacy of Aggie football, but none greater than Fred Arp,” said current UC Davis head football coach Dan Hawkins. “A former athlete, and coach of over 40 years, Fred and his wife Jane have been life long contributors to Aggie Pride. We will miss Club Fred, the Shade Drill, and his presence at nearly every game in the last half century. We will continue to honor Coach Arp as we move forward with Aggie football.”

While all of his fellow UC Davis coaches and players heaped praise upon him throughout his career, Arp began earning accolades from outside the program near the end of his career. He won a National Football Foundation Contribution to Amateur Football award in 2000, the AFLAC National Assistant Coach of the Year nod in 2002, and an All-America Football Foundation Top Assistant Coach accolade in 2008.

Arp’s contributions to UC Davis intercollegiate athletics were not limited to football, either. He and his wife of 51 years, Jane, have a long history of philanthropic support to the university, with the Arp Family Foundation providing gifts for such projects as Aggie Stadium and the ICA weight room. During the Aggie Auctions of the late 1990s and 2000s, Arp donated countless pieces of sports memorabilia from his own personal collection, in an effort to support the popular fund- and friend-raising event.

Arp is survived by Jane and their only son. A celebration of Fred’s life is currently planned for the day of the Sept. 8 home game against San Diego, which coincidentally was the opponent during Arp’s final game as a coach.

100 SEASONS OF UC DAVIS FOOTBALL

A century in the making, coaches, student-athletes, fans, alumni and supporters of UC Davis football will celebrate the program's 100th season — football did not compete in 1918 (World War I) or from 1943-46 (World War II) — throughout the 2018 campaign. What started in 1915 when the Aggies took the field and faced Saint Mary's in the team's first-ever game continues this year with the team's #AGScension after enjoying a successful start to the Dan Hawkins era last season.

Memorable highlights that took place throughout the program's first century include:

Memorable games that took place throughout football's first century include:

- *The Miracle Game*: What is reflected as a 30-29 victory over Cal State Hayward on Nov. 14, 1970, was more exciting than the score may indicate with UC Davis scoring 16 points in the final 22 seconds to capture the victory over the small-college power. After scoring on a five-play drive that included a two-point conversion with 22 seconds remaining, UC Davis recovered an onside kick on Hayward's 44 with 16 ticks remaining. On the final play of the game, quarterback (and future UC Davis head coach) Bob Biggs found tight end Mike Bellotti for a 29-yard touchdown on the final play of the game. Instead of tying the score, head coach Jim Sochor decided to go for the win. After two false starts, Biggs connected with Mike Everly, whose one-handed snare lifted the Aggies to victory in this instant classic.

- *20-17*: If you mention that score to any UC Davis football fan, the Aggies' Sept. 18, 2005, Farm vs. Farm victory over Stanford will instantly come to mind. After trailing 17-0 midway through the second quarter, the Aggies scored 20 unanswered and became the first non-Division I-A/FBS team ever to defeat the Cardinal. Trailing by six with 2:37 left to play, Jon Grant threw a 12-yard pass to Brandon Rice and a 17-yarder to Smith to move the ball downfield on a drive that started on UC Davis' 28. Then on a third-and-4 from the Stanford 25, Grant hit a wide-open Tony Kays for 19 yards over the middle for a first down. After a 3-yard keeper and an incomplete pass, Grant found Smith open in the front corner of the end zone to cap the 11-play drive with a game-winning touchdown. This win was the Aggies' first over a Division I-A team since 1986 when they topped the Pacific Tigers; that game was the first against a Pac-10 (now Pac-12) team in 65 years, and the second-ever against Stanford. The first took place in 1932 when Pop Warner was Stanford's coach.

- *Hail Bakari*: On Oct. 4, 2008, Bakari Grant caught a 38-yard touchdown pass from Greg Denham on the game's final play to push the Aggies past Northern Colorado, 34-30. UC Davis picked up the improbable touchdown two plays after a false start erased a try for a potential game-winning 50-yard field goal attempt by Sean Kelley. An incomplete pass led to the final throw in which Grant hauled in Denham's pass in between four defenders just past the goal line. Denham drove the Aggies to the Northern Colorado 33 by completing three passes for 28 yards, two of them to Brandon Tucker for 20 yards. UC Davis spiked the ball with nine seconds to go in order to set up for a 50-yard field goal try. However, a crucial five-yard penalty resulted in the offense coming back onto the field. An incomplete pass left three seconds on the clock, which led to the game's exciting finish.

- *The Band-Uh! Victory*: Due to Hurricane Rita, the team found itself without its charter service to North Dakota for its Oct. 22, 2005, matchup. The plane was reassigned to evacuation duties. "We could not purchase enough commercial flights," said then-head coach Bob Biggs. "Fortunately, the band had procured seats the year before, and they gave us 50 seats." The Aggies arrived on time and promptly dispatched then-No. 17 North Dakota 20-14. And the Band-uh was there, too, after driving in a caravan halfway across the country. "Our team knew where the band was, and they were climbing over seats and the fence to get to them," Biggs said. "One of the great scenes forever in my mind is our team reaching out and high-fiving the band."

Any conversation involving UC Davis' football program will include one, or a combination of the following legends (in alphabetical order).

- *Fred Arp* - As written by Davis Enterprise columnist Bob Dunning following Fred Arp's passing on July 4, 2018: "We hear the term "legend" tossed around freely these days, but in the case of Fred Arp, it's a word that fits perfectly." Throughout his five decades with the program, Arp (and former assistant coach Lou Bronzan) were on staff for the Aggies' 20 straight conference championships and 18 NCAA postseason appearances — success that took place during a streak of 37 winning seasons in a row.

A former transfer from the University of Nevada, Arp lettered only the 1965 season at UC Davis before learning that a heart condition would sideline him for his senior year.

Arp transitioned to the coaching staff, first as the head freshman coach, then later as the defensive line coach, a position he held until his retirement in 2007. Arp only missed one season during that span, when he attended graduate school at the University of Northern Colorado. And in the other years, he missed only one game — for the birth of his son.

• **Bob Biggs** - As the head football coach from 1993-2012, Bob Biggs compiled a career record of 144–85–1 and was named the 2009 Great West Conference Coach of the Year. In addition to his football duties, he also spent 10 years as the head men's tennis coach. The former UC Davis quarterback was involved in two of the most memorable games in school history: the Miracle Game (as a quarterback) and the team's victory over Stanford (as a head coach). He originally coached the freshman squad alongside fellow Aggie Mike Bellotti, then worked as an assistant coach under the great Jim Sochor — the winningest coach in program history with a 156-41-5 mark — and Bob Foster.

• **Bob Foster** - Former UC Davis head football coach Bob Foster — who was on the Aggies' staff for more than 20 years before moving on to coach at Oregon, Cal and Colorado — brought more than 40 years of playing and coaching experience to the program last season when he assisted current UC Davis head coach Dan Hawkins throughout his transition, and first year on the sidelines as his alma mater. Foster, who was inducted into the Cal Aggie Athletics Hall of Fame in 2002 and who later had the team center at Aggie Stadium named after him, was linebackers coach and defensive coordinator for the late Jim Sochor.

Foster retired from UC Davis following the 1992 season but found his way back to the game when he went on to serve as a consultant for former Aggie Dan Hawkins at Willamette University (Oregon). He later joined Hawkins as linebackers coach at Colorado in 2009.

Foster helped the Aggies enjoy unparalleled success during their run in the 1970s and '80s — a period that included 20 consecutive conference championships and a trip to the 1982 NCAA Division II Championship game.

The Aggies never had a losing season while Foster was on staff.

He assumed head coaching duties at UC Davis in 1989 following Sochor's retirement, capturing a trio of Northern California Athletic Conference titles with perfect 5-0 records, winning 30 games overall and earning a pair of postseason playoff berths. Foster's defenses were among the best in school history, including in 1983 when the Aggies gave up an average of just 7.8 points per game, while going 11-1.

Foster received both his undergraduate and graduate degrees from UC Davis after earning four varsity letters as a running back between 1958 and 1961. He joined the Aggies' staff as linebackers coach during Sochor's second season in 1971 before being elevated to defensive coordinator in 1977.

• **Ken O'Brien** - Originally from nearby Jesuit High School, O'Brien started three seasons for the Aggies after transferring from Sacramento State. In his senior year of 1982, he captured first-team All-America honors from the National Football Coaches Association while helping UC Davis reach the NCAA Division II title game for the first time in school history. O'Brien set school records by finishing the season with 2,976 passing yards and 23 touchdowns that year.

O'Brien won the 1982-83 Colby E. "Babe" Slater Award as the school's outstanding male athlete of the year. He also became the first Aggie to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft, going as the 24th overall pick to the New York Jets during the "Year of the Quarterback" draft.

O'Brien played 10 years in the NFL, mostly with the Jets. He amassed 25,094 yards and 128 touchdowns, made the Pro Bowl in 1985 and 1991, captured six AFC Offensive Player of the Week awards, and was selected as the 1985 AFC Player of the Year by the Washington D.C. Touchdown Club. During the peak of this career, O'Brien returned to his alma mater for one more major accolade — his 1990 induction into the Cal Aggie Athletics Hall of Fame.

In 1997, O'Brien entered the College Football Hall of Fame. He was the first of three individuals from UC Davis to earn enshrinement: head coach Jim Sochor followed O'Brien into the HOF in 1999, while alumnus Mike Bellotti was inducted for his Oregon coaching career in 2014.

• **J.T. O'Sullivan** - UC Davis finished 12-1 in 2000, just one game shy of earning a trip to the NCAA Division II national championship. A big reason was the play of quarterback J.T. O'Sullivan, who threw for 3,679 yards and 38 touchdowns, while posting a passing rating of 193.85. How big was his season? The future NFL player was the only Division II player that season to earn a vote for the Heisman Trophy.

O'Sullivan was drafted by the New Orleans Saints in the sixth round of the 2002 NFL Draft. He also spent time with 10 other NFL teams: the Green Bay Packers, Chicago Bears, Minnesota Vikings, New England Patriots, Carolina Panthers, Detroit Lions, San Francisco 49ers, Cincinnati Bengals, San Diego Chargers, and Oakland Raiders. He was a backup for the majority of his NFL career but began the 2008 season as the starter for the 49ers.

He also played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of NFL Europe in 2004 and 2007, and led the team to a World Bowl appearance each year. He earned All-NFL Europa and NFL Europa Co-Offensive MVP honors in 2007. O'Sullivan spent the final season of his professional career as a backup for the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the CFL.

• *Jim Sochor* - If there is one individual responsible for the football program's rise to national prominence, it is former head coach Jim Sochor. After finishing his career with a 156-41-5 record, which included 18 straight Division II league championships, Coach Sochor was named to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Not only was Sochor the football coach, he served as the university's athletic director from 1989-91 and enjoyed a brief stint as the head men's golf coach.

In addition to his legendary accomplishments as a head coach, Coach Sochor's influence continued through the success earned by numerous former players and coaches, a list that includes quarterbacks Ken O'Brien and Mike Moroski, defensive end Casey Merrill, safety Bo Eason and kicker Rolf Benirschke. Washington head coach Chris Petersen, former Boise State, Colorado and current UC Davis head coach Dan Hawkins, and current ESPN analyst Mike Bellotti (the winningest coach in Oregon history) are among the many former assistants who embraced the Aggie Way and had accomplished careers in the game.

Sochor recruited players to UC Davis without scholarships, and did not hold spring practices. When class conflicted with practice, the answer was an easy one for Coach Sochor: attend class. He mistrusted rules and instituted only one, meant to promote discipline and self-respect: A player's helmet could not touch the ground when he was not wearing it.

Said Sochor, "At Davis, we had a lot to overcome. We didn't have scholarships, or spring practice. We often played teams who gave 60 to 80 grants and had those spring workouts. We had to win on preparation, trust, togetherness and unity." His goal was to ensure that "no one would become as close as a football team as we did... we bonded and developed a chemistry that endured."

With a long line of top-notch quarterbacks at the helm, Sochor's Division II teams built the foundation of the program, which included an unprecedented run of 37 consecutive winning seasons. That string was carried on by protégés Bob Foster and Bob Biggs after Sochor's retirement.

- STATS LLC will reveal this year's award winner, presented to the most outstanding offensive player in the nation, as part of the festivities leading up to the national championship game, which will take place in Frisco, Texas, on Jan. 5
- This is the second time in as many seasons that Doss and Maier were named to the Walter Payton Watch List
- Doss attended last year's award banquet as the first Aggie in program history named national finalist for this top honor, which is the FCS' version of the Heisman Trophy
- Doss, a 2017 consensus All-American, ended his junior season with 1,499 receiving yards, league-high averages of 136.3 receiving yards and 10.5 receptions per game

- For the first time in program history, UC Davis earned a top 25 ranking in STATS FCS' national poll when the outlet released its latest listing on Sept. 10
- This ranking is well deserved since the Aggies started the season 2-0 for the first time since 2004 thanks to wins collected against a FBS program and 2007 NCAA FCS postseason participant
- UC Davis is receiving votes in the coaches poll and was three votes shy of tying No. 25 Colgate

- Stanford also opened the season with two victories, both at home: 31-10 vs. San Diego State (8/31) and 17-3 vs. USC (9/8)
- Both teams are nationally ranked in their respective subdivisions; Stanford in No. 9 in the media and coaches poll, UC Davis is No. 23/RV in its respective polls
- By allowing a collective 13 points to its opponents, Stanford's defense is ranked No. 3 by allowing an average of 6.5 ppg

ALL THREE UNITS SHINED VS. SAN DIEGO

- UC Davis defeated San Diego in its Sept. 8 home opener by dominating all three facets of the game
- The Aggies' defense did not allow the Toreros to cross its 37-yard line in any point of the first half, and held them scoreless for the final 19:06 of the game
- Led by his game-high kick of 58 yards, including three that landed inside the 20, sophomore punter Daniel Whelan averaged 40.7 yards per punt
- Five of junior kicker Matt Blair's kickoffs ended with a touchback
- Junior kicker Max O'Rourke nailed both attempts, include a career-long kick from 45 yards with no time remaining in the first half

- This is his first career Player of the Week award
- Whelan amassed 285 yards on seven punt attempts, including three that landed inside the 20, with the longest kick traveling 58 yards
- In the first half, San Diego never crossed its 37-yard line since it was pinned deep in its own territory; one Torero drive started on the one-yard line, another started on USD's seven

THANK YOU, FRED

- After more than 40 years on the sideline, longtime assistant head coach Fred Arp retired

at the conclusion of the 2007 season

- Arp remained a vital part of the program, even though he retired from coaching, for the rest of his life

• "All I ever wanted to be was an Aggie," Arp said. "I had job offers in the past that I didn't take. This is a special place. We've finally got to being on the brink of what it always should've been. We've got the new stadium, we've got the (Marya Welch) tennis facility, we've got the ARC (Athletic and Recreation Center), we're Division I. We're just on the cusp of doing what I always envisioned this place could do."

- Arp's career spanned the streak of 37 consecutive winning seasons, then run of 20 straight conference championships, and 17 NCAA Division II postseason appearances

• He coached in four different conferences and for four head coaches, amassing a career record of 307-115-5

- In 2003, Arp's contributions on and off the field resulted in an AFLAC National Assistant Coach of the Year Award

• "I think when everybody looks back at Fred's career, it's not going to be about 'x's' and 'o's'. I don't think people are going to talk about Fred and how he made them a greater football player" said Bob Biggs. "What they're going to talk about is Fred made them a greater person. What makes him so unique is it's done so subtly. He's not a man of a lot of words. He's got great human instincts. He's got a quiet way of being able to talk to people and let people know what's the right way and wrong way of doing things."

- Added Biggs, "He's always, always had the players' best interests in mind and I think that's what everybody respects about him."

• Arp graduated from UC Davis in 1967 with a degree in physical education

- His wife, Jane, served as a team photographer for decades, while son Ben maintains a UC Davis football website

- Although most teams hand out awards at the conclusion of a season or career, the Aggie jersey number 88 was considered an honor won in advance

Casey Merrill (1976-78) - Hall of Famer, 1978 All-American, played eight years in NFL for Green Bay, N.Y. Giants and New Orleans

Glenn Fricker (1981-83) - Hall of Famer, program's all-time sacks leader

Brian Anderson (1990-92) - Three-time all-conference pick, CoSIDA Academic All-District selection and Outstanding Lineman in 1992

Josh Anstey (1995-98) - Three-year All-American (Note: two of these All-America awards were preseason nods)

B.J. Brust (1999-2002) - 2002 team captain, two-time Outstanding Lineman

- Pila Fatukala, a solid but injury-plagued lineman, had the jersey after Brust; Andy Rice was the last to wear No. 88

- That's five out of the six DEs on those teams from the 1970s, 1980s and 1990s
- The sixth DE in that span was Mike Wise, whose career overlapped with Fricker by two years

- Former Merced High football coach, and current UC Davis assistant head coach Mark Speckman is one of 12 inductees into this year's Sac-Joaquin Section Hall of Fame

- "It's a great honor," said Speckman. "Obviously that was a long time ago and it means I'm old. It's nice to be recognized."

- Speckman compiled a 113-48-3 career record at Livingston, Merced and Golden Valley High School

- Under Speckman, Merced HS played in five Sac-Joaquin Section Division I championship game, winning two titles

- Merced was ranked No. 1 in the state in 1990 by CalHiSports

- Speckman coached at Livingston HS from 1981-83, then coached at Gilroy HS for three years before spending 1986-1993 at Merced HS

- He moved over to Golden Valley HS when the school opened in 1994 and coached the Cougars for one season before he joined Willamette's (Salem, Oregon) football staff

- The Aggies ended the year with a combined 46 new program records during their Big Sky era, Division I era or all-time
- Football faced more ranked teams, or teams receiving votes in 2017 since joining the conference
- The team's five wins against Division I opponents equaled the total from the previous three years combined
- Its five Big Sky Player of the Week awards match the total from the previous four seasons

UC DAVIS EARNS FCS' FIRST VICTORY OF '18 OVER A FBS TEAM

- In addition to securing the team's second victory versus SJSU in the last three head-to-head games on Aug. 30, UC Davis' result in its 2018 season opener marked the third Aggie victory over a FBS-level opponent in program history
- UC Davis is responsible for the first FCS victory over a FBS program this season
- The team's first win versus a FBS program took place at Stanford during the 2005 season, the next was earned at San José State five years later

THAT'S WHY THEY RULED THE BIG SKY IN '17

- For the first time in school history, UC Davis finished as the No. 1 offense among all Big Sky schools
- San José State witnessed this efficient unit firsthand throughout each team's 2018 opener since four of the Aggies' scoring drives took 90 seconds or less
- That evening in San Jose, UC Davis scored touchdowns on drives that lasted :34, :47, 1:29 and 1:30

THE AGGIES' #AGSCENSION CONTINUES

- UC Davis' result at SJSU marked the team's first victory in a season opener since it topped Azusa Pacific at home (41-3) in 2012
- The Aggies are now in a position to start the season with a 2-0 record for the first time since 2004 when they opened the year with a home win against South Dakota State and a road win at Weber State (team won its first five games in '04)
- If victorious on Saturday, UC Davis will hold a 2-0 record for the first time in its Big Sky era

GILLIAM'S FIRST IMPRESSION WAS AN OUTSTANDING ONE

- In his first game as an Aggie, redshirt freshman running back Ulonzo Gilliam ran for 132 yards, scored two touchdowns on the ground, caught

another and was responsible for 18 of his team's 44 points to lift UC Davis to a 44-38 victory over San José State on Aug. 30

- The Merced native's performance that evening led to Big Sky officials bestowing ROOT SPORTS Offensive Player of the Week honors
- Gilliam's effort was the best in the nation that week, literally, since STATS FCS also selected him as its National Freshman Player of the Week
- This is the first time an Aggie earned National Player of the Week accolades from STATS

MAIER COLLECTS A PAIR OF AWARDS AS WELL

- UC Davis' third victory over a FBS school also led to a pair of awards for junior quarterback Jake Maier
- By throwing for 446 yards — the third 400-yard game of his career, which spans 12 games as an Aggie — and three touchdowns, the La Habra native received, for the week ending on Sept. 3, College Sports Madness' Big Sky Player of the Week award and FCS National Performer of the Week Honorable Mention from the College Football Performance Awards
- This is the second accolade earned from the CFPA this year; it named Maier to its Performer of the Year Watch List in late August.

AGGIES FEATURED IN PRESEASON POLLS

- Thanks to last season's success, and the talent featured on this year's roster, HERO Sports included UC Davis when it revealed its Preseason Top 25 Poll
- The outlet ranked the Aggies No. 22, its highest national preseason ranking since they joined the Big West Conference
- STATS FCS voters are keenly aware of UC Davis' #AGScension since they received votes in this national preseason poll
- Of the nine teams featured by STATS FCS in this preseason poll, the Aggies will face five throughout the upcoming season: Eastern Washington (#9), Montana (#24), Northern Arizona, Idaho and Sacramento State (RV)

TALENTED INCOMING NLI CLASS PREPS FOR DEBUT SEASON

- UC Davis will look to build off a successful 2017 season with its incoming class of 18 NLI signees. All are incoming freshmen, unless otherwise noted

John Aloma - So, LS: Originally signed with Utah after graduating from Simi Valley High School in 2016. He competed at Moorpark

College last season and earned junior college All-Star accolades. His snap-to-kick times are consistently clocked at 1.0 seconds; the average D-I time is 2.1.

Lance Babb II - WR: Babb, a three-star recruit as ranked by Scout, earned All-Area Player of the Year, All-Area first team, Almont League Offensive Player of the Year and All-League first team honors as a senior. That year, he finished with 1,393 receiving yards, 14 solo and 18 total tackles to lead Schurr High School to its first Almont League title since 2010.

Malik Banks - OL: Named Crestview League Offensive Lineman of the Year and competed in the 2017 Orange County All-Star Football Game as a member of the North team as a senior. With Banks shining on his team's offensive line, the Spartans won consecutive league titles in his final two years at Villa Park High School.

Nick Eaton - LB: The *Sacramento Bee* All-Metro 2017 selection was an All-Capital Valley Conference selection and team captain as a senior. In addition to catching 34 passes for 394 yards as a senior, he recorded 143 total tackles, including 44 solo, 16.5 sacks for a combined 107 yards lost, 57 hurries, forced or caused three fumbles throughout his three-year career at Whitney High School.

Jordan Ford - OL: *Sacramento Bee* All-Metro 2017 selection earned All-Capitol Valley Conference first team, CVC Lineman of the Year and MVP awards as a senior. Led Del Campo High School to the Sac-Joaquin Section semifinals last season after his team won a Capital Valley Conference championship, thanks to its undefeated 7-0 league and 12-1 overall record.

Da'Von Frazier - DB: The *Sacramento Bee* All-Metro 2017 selection intercepted seven passes and collected 47 tackles throughout his junior season, one that saw the Thundering Herd win a championships. Played three positions for Elk Grove High School in his final year with the program: defensive back, wide receiver and running back. Ended his senior season with all-conference honors for the second consecutive year.

Matthew Hyman - Jr., TE: Played two seasons at Santa Rosa Junior College; the Bear Cubs finished 9-2 and advanced to the Gridiron Classic Bowl in 2016, the program's fourth bowl game in as many seasons.

Justin Kraft - WR: The *Sacramento Bee* All-Metro 2017 selection collected All-Capital Valley Conference first team, All-Section and All-Metro accolades during his sophomore through senior seasons. The two-time Cal-Hi Sports All-State Nominee and CVC Offensive Player of the Year's awards haul also includes Whitney High School Offensive Rookie of the Year, Outstanding Athlete and Offensive Playmaker.

Jake Parks - OL: Veteran starter was an All-Trinity League first team and All-County second team selection as a senior. Three-star talent recorded 18 sacks throughout his senior season competing in one of the toughest leagues in California.

Cade Peacock - DL: Earned a top-35 ranking by 247SportsComposite in its list of Washington's top 2018 players. He ended the '17 season with 59 tackles (31 solo), 11 tackles for loss, seven sacks, two hurries and fumble recoveries, which led to All-Metro Mountain Division first team honors.

Hunter Rodrigues - So., QB: In his first season leading American River College as its quarterback, Rodrigues posted 2,191 passing yards, threw 23 touchdowns and rushed for another 14. Rodrigues played a key role in the team's successful 2017 season, one that saw them record a 10-2 overall and perfect 5-0 conference record, win a title and finish their year as runner-ups in Northern California Football Conference championship game.

Tyler Saikhon - DB: Recorded 1,683 yards on 215 carries, averaged 7.8 yards per carry and 112.2 rushing yards per game last year. Ran for 100 or more yards in 10 of his team's 15 games; 25 of his 38 touchdowns were earned on the ground. Also caught 37 passes for 713 yards, 10 TDs, 3,131 all-purpose yards and 52 tackles (32 solo). Saikhon intercepted three passes, broke up another three and returned 10 punts for a total of 368 yards.

Ari Sallus - OL: Named Western League Offensive Lineman of the Year, All-City Offensive Lineman of the Year and Team Offensive MVP as a senior. He recorded 46 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss and three sacks throughout his junior and senior seasons and led Palisades Charter High School to consecutive Western League titles.

Nico Sarale - OL: The MaxPreps All Sac-Joaquin Section First Team Offense and Modesto Bee All-District honoree as a junior and senior received

nine offers, the most in Oakdale High School's history. In addition to anchoring an offensive line that produced two 1,000-yard running backs last year, Sarale helped his team finish 12-2 overall, 7-0 in league play and win a Valley Oak League crown. He was the No. 1-rated offensive lineman on the *Sacramento Bee*'s list of top returning football players before the start of the 2017 season.

Jack Shippy - DB: Seventy-eight of 126 tackles recorded throughout his last two seasons were solo. Shippy also intercepted nine passes and forced two fumbles throughout that same timespan. Two weeks after San Clemente High School won its first Southern Section championship, a Shippy-led defense defeated Del Oro to capture a state title in 2016. He averaged 5.3 tackles per game as a junior, and increased that mark to 6.6 tackles per game as a senior.

Robert Simkins - WR: Led Terra Linda High School to a Marin County Athletic League title and North Coast Section playoff run throughout his three years with the program. Earned MVP, Most Valuable Offensive Player, and three all-league awards, and played three positions: quarterback, wide receiver and defensive back.

Josiah Suani - DL: All-Bay Area News Group, All-West Alameda County Conference-Shoreline and Defensive Player of the Year selection as a senior. Of his 79 tackles recorded throughout the 2017 season, 56 were solo and a team-high 32 were for a loss. Also led his team in sacks (14.0), sacks per game (6.5), yards lost (61) and hurries (5)... Averaged 7.9 tackles per game, forced one fumble and blocked one field goal last season.

Chris Venable - DB: Earned Big VIII first team honors after leading Corona Centennial to an 11-2 overall record and conference championship after posting an undefeated league record. As one of his team's defensive backs and wide receivers, Venable finished the '17 season with 12 touchdowns, five interceptions, and 86 tackles. He also played both positions throughout his junior year, and finished with 13 TDs, five interceptions and 165 tackles, which led to MVP, all-league, All-CIF and all-area first team awards.

THERE CAN ONLY BE ONE #1, AND ORNELAS IS IT

- Saturday's game is Director of Video Services and Technical Operations Tim Ornelas' first in the home video booth as the reigning FCS Video Coordinator of the Year
- The 2018 season is Ornelas' sixth in his current position
- Unlike a vast majority of schools that compete at the FCS and Football Bowl Subdivision levels, Ornelas' responsibilities are not solely focused on the sport
- In addition to handling typical sport-related tasks such as organizing and editing practice film, game film, coaches film, weekly film exchanges, creating social media highlights and videos, he is responsible for executing UC Davis' video streams (and coaches film) for its men's water polo, volleyball, field hockey, men's and women's soccer, gymnastics, men's and women's basketball, lacrosse and baseball teams

- It was he who collaborated with head men's water polo coach Daniel Leyson to create the infrastructure needed to live stream events at Schaal Aquatics Center for the first time in the facility's history

- Known by his colleagues as one of the most dedicated and hardest-working individuals in the department, Ornelas also serves as the primary contact for third-party broadcasting companies that televise UC Davis football and men's basketball games

- The technical operations portion of his title also allows him to expand his skill set in ways his peers at the FBS and FCS levels are not afforded. Whenever there is an issue with a scoreboard or electronic display at any UC Davis athletic facility, he is the individual responsible for finding solutions
- His expertise is not limited to video and maintaining electronic equipment since he also sets everything up for play-by-play commentators and analysts when they broadcast home events

NEW NCAA RULES FOR THE 2018 SEASON

- The NCAA is adopting a number of rules changes for the 2018 season, a list that includes:

Fair catch on kickoffs

Any kickoff fair caught inside the 25 will be placed at the 25. The rules committee had moved kickoffs from the 30 to 35 in 2012 and have fair catches on kickoffs go to the 25 to reduce the number of returned kickoffs to try to reduce injuries.

Blocking below the waist

Only players on the line of scrimmage within the tackle box may block low from the side. This means running backs may no longer block low if the force of the contact is from the side. Previously this was a legal block when the ball crossed the neutral zone. All blocks below the waist are illegal more than five yards down field from the line of scrimmage

Penalties on field goals

Under the old rule if the defense committed a foul on a field goal attempt the offense could decline the penalty and accept the outcome of the play or accept the penalty with ball moved the appropriate distance. Under the new rule the kicking team can accept the penalty and have the ball moved the appropriate distance (and maybe have a first down based on the distance or the first down could be part of the penalty) OR the kicking team can take the result of the play AND accept the penalty.

If the field goal is made, the kicking team can leave the points on the board and have the penalty yardage enforced on the kickoff.

Pace of play

After touchdowns and field goals a forty second clock will start. The old rule provided for a 25 second clock starting on the referee's ready signal.

Ten-second run-off on replay

If there is less than one minute left in a half and the officials make a ruling that stops the clock when the clock should have continued running, if the ruling is over-turned by replay there will be a 10 second run-off.

- After first signing with the San Francisco 49ers in 2013, and enjoying a brief stint with the Cleveland Browns, former Aggie punter Colton Schmidt now punts for the Buffalo Bills
- Schmidt first competed for the Bills in 2014 and has remained with the organization since
- In 2015, Schmidt set the Bills all-time single season record for net punting average with an outstanding 41.3 net yards per punt

HELLO AMERICA

- Starting with Saturday's matchup at Stanford, broadcasted on the Pac-12 Networks, five

televised games will feature UC Davis

- Both ELEVEN SPORTS broadcasts will originate from Aggie Stadium when Idaho (Sept. 22) and Sacramento State (Nov. 17) visit campus

- SWX, a regional channel that provides content throughout Eastern Washington state, the Idaho Panhandle and Montana will televise Aggie road games at Montana (Oct. 27) and Eastern Washington (Nov. 10)

UC DAVIS FOOTBALL IS BACK ON KHTK

- As has been the case for more than two decades, Sports 1140 KHTK will continue to air Aggie football broadcasts through the 2020 season as the team's flagship station thanks to a new three-year agreement

- Calling all football games this season are Scott Marsh (PBP) and Doug Kelly (Analyst); their pregame show will begin 30 minutes before kickoff

TUNEIN TO UC DAVIS FOOTBALL ON THE UC DAVIS AGGIES SPORTS NETWORK

- In addition to their broadcast on 1140AM, fans can listen to every UC Davis football game online on TuneIn radio by searching the phrase "UC Davis Sports Network"

THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- With an official capacity of 10,849, Aggie Stadium opened in 2007 as one of the three major facilities funded by the Facilities and Campus Enhancement, for F.A.C.E., Initiative of 1999

- The UC Davis women's lacrosse team was the first to compete on its Shaw Sports (formerly Sportex) turf, defeating Saint Mary's on April 1, 2007

- The football team began competing at Aggie Stadium that fall, after more than a half century at Toomey Field

- UC Davis field hockey team also played at Aggie Stadium before moving to its own facility in 2014

- Aggie Stadium was designed by industry leader Ellerbe Beckett, built by local firm Brown Construction, features fixed seating on each of the east and west sides, with grass berm seating – now known as the UC Davis Children's Hospital Family Zone – adjacent to each end zone

- Beneath the press box resides the Bruce Edwards Club Room, a popular venue for receptions, meetings and other gatherings

- Before the start of the 2017 football season, a new video board — measuring 28x50 and 1,400 square feet, was added

9-15 at Stanford >> Stanford Stadium >> Stanford, Calif.

- Starting in the spring of 2018, Aggie Stadium became the home of FC Davis, a semi-professional soccer club that competes in the National Premier Soccer League
- Aggie Stadium's first football game took place on Sept. 1, 2007, vs. Western Washington
- The Tavernetti Bell, also known as the "Victory Bell", greets fans entering Aggie Stadium
- The bell is named after Thomas Tavernetti (1889–1934) and is rung once for every point scored after an Aggie victory
- With the construction of Aggie Stadium, the bell followed from its previous location at the old site on Toomey Field
- In 2016, a statue of football coaching legend Jim Sochor was unveiled before that year's Causeway Classic - UC Davis' annual rivalry game vs. Sacramento State (a match-up that saw Sochor's team win 18 of 19 played)
- The bronze statue sits just outside the stadium's main gate; Sochor's likeness gazes toward the stadium's Jim Sochor Field, named in his honor when the stadium first opened in 2007

SAM PANINO - FOREVER AN AGGIE

- There is only one number UC Davis football retired, and that is #25 in honor of Sam Panino
- On September 11, 1999, the second game of his junior year, Paneno earned his first career start at running back vs. Western Oregon and responded to the call by rushing for a career-high 114 yards and a pair of touchdowns.
- On the first play of overtime, Paneno dislocated his right knee; he received treatment at a Salem, Ore. hospital, and later, at the UC Davis Medical Center
- His injury disrupted the blood flow to the lower leg and foot; Paneno underwent emergency surgery, and blood flow was restored
- However, complications arose from the initial injury and after further procedures, a team of UCDMC orthopedic surgeons deemed it necessary to amputate the lower portion of his right leg
- The amputation surgery was performed on September 20, nine days after the game at WOU
- Support for Paneno came from all parts of the country; the host of the NCAA D-II Championships in Montgomery, Ala., created a website for fans to offer prayers and words of encouragement
- Hundreds of sentiments flooded the website, including those from fellow collegiate players who only the name UC Davis from national rankings and past playoff results
- Paneno paid his first visit to his teammates the following week after the surgery

- His positive attitude despite his ordeal proved to be an inspiration for all, he felt gratitude to his family, faith and friends, but never felt self-pity
- While ESPN had arrived on campus on September 20 to report on the athlete's tragedy, CBS Sports, Sports Illustrated and even People Weekly later paid visits to UC Davis to report on his courage
- Paneno was later fitted with two different prosthetic legs - one for "everyday" use and the other allowing him to resume to such pastimes as running, surfing, even rock-climbing
- UC Davis football retired his No. 25 jersey the following year (2000)
- Miami Dolphins' lineman Trace Armstrong was so touched by seeing Paneno's story as part of the CBS halftime report on Thanksgiving Day, that he invited him to attend the Raiders-Dolphins game as a guest of the team
- In 2001, Paneno was formally honored by the NCAA when he was named co-winner of the inaugural Inspiration Award, bestowed upon a former student-athlete who has displayed "perseverance, dedication and determination" to overcome a life-altering event
- Paneno went on to earn his undergraduate degree in psychology from UC Davis in 2001 and later his juris doctorate from UC Davis School of Law in 2005
