

AGGIES OPEN DEFENSE OF TOURNAMENT TITLE AT HONDA CENTER

OPENING TIP: The four-time defending Big West Conference regular-season champion -- and reigning tournament champion -- UC Davis women's basketball team heads into the postseason as the top seed at the Honda Center in Anaheim, Calif. By virtue of their regular season finish, the Aggies earn a bye into the semifinals on Friday (March 13) at Noon against the lowest remaining seed, with sights set on Saturday's championship game (March 14) at 3 p.m.

HI, MOM!: All games at this week's Big West Tournament will be streamed live on ESPN3.com and the ESPN app, with Trent Rush, Dave Miller, and Courtney Sweet, on the call. Fans can also listen live locally in Davis on KDVS 90.3 FM, or online via the Tuneln app, with UC Davis alum Greg Wong handling play-by-play duties.

BE A FOLLOWER: Fans can get an inside look at UC Davis women's basketball by following them on their many social media accounts. Like or follow us on Twitter, Instagram, or Facebook, at @UCDavisWBB. In-game updates will also be available on the team's Twitter feed.

COACH OF THE YEAR: Now a four-time winner of the Big West's top coaching honor, Gross becomes the first coach in league history to earn the award in four straight seasons and trails only former UC Santa Barbara mentor Mark French, who was named coach of the year seven times in his career. Gross' win this season breaks a tie with UNLV's Jim Bolla and Hawai'i's Vince Goo, who each won the award three times.

LOCKDOWN DEFENDER: Versatile junior Cierra Hall was named the Big West Conference's Defensive Player of the Year and earned a spot on the league's all-defensive team, becoming the second Aggie to earn the league's top defensive honor along with former UC Davis great Haylee Donaghe in 2009-10. Now in its second year, Hall joins former teammate Morgan Bertsch as honorees on the All-Defensive Team.

HALL, TOOLE EARN ALL-BIG WEST HONORS: Hall and senior teammate Katie Toole were named to the All-Big West second team, picking up the first such honors of their

careers. Hall adds the award to her mantel, which includes an all-freshman team honor in 2017-18 and an All-Big West Tournament award in 2018-19.

SOMETHING'S MISSING: Despite clinching the conference's regular season title for the fourth consecutive year and the fifth time overall, this season marks the first time since joining the league in 2007-08 that an Aggie was not named to the All-Big West first team and the first time in conference history that a league champion was not represented by a player on the first team in non-divisional play.

THAT'S FRESH: Newcomer Evanne Turner rounded out the Aggies' representation on the league's postseason honor roll, earning a spot on the conference's all-freshman team. Turner becomes the eighth UC Davis player to earn a spot on the squad and the first since Hall in 2017-18. Other Aggie rookies to earn spots include: Lauren Juric, who was also named the league's Freshman of the Year in 2008-09, Alyson Doherty and Molly Greubel in 2012-13, Dani Nafekh (2014-15), Morgan Bertsch (2015-16), and Nina Bessolo (2016-17).

AGGIES IN THE TOURNEY: UC Davis has qualified for the Big West Conference Tournament in every season single becoming a full-fledged member of the conference in 2007-08. The Aggies have made the tournament championship six times in that span (2008, 2010, 2011, 2016, 2018, and 2019), winning the tournament title -- and the NCAA Tournament berth that goes along with it -- twice in 2011 and 2019. UC Davis is 13-10 all-time in the Big West Tournament, finishing 2-0 with wins over UC Irvine and Hawai'i en route to the title.

THE CHAMP IS HERE (AGAIN): With their win over UC Riverside on Feb. 29 (and thanks to Hawai'i's loss at Cal State Fullerton), the Aggies clinched their fourth consecutive Big West Conference title in outright fashion -- the first program to "four-peat" since UC Santa Barbara won 10 straight crowns from 1996-2005, and only the third program in league history to win four straight when you include Long Beach State's run from 1985-89.

"SEMI-SWEET": By virtue of locking down the tournament's top seed, the 2020 season marks the sixth straight season -- and the ninth time in 13 years overall (2008, 2010, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020) -- that the Aggies have gained the semifinal round of the Big West Tournament, winning six of their previous seven chances and posting a 6-2 record in the semifinals, advancing to the championship game three times in the last four seasons.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS: The Aggies' four straight Big West titles is the longest such run of league crowns in school history since the 1995-99 UC Davis squads won five straight California Collegiate Athletic Association titles, while also marking the 17th all-time conference title at all levels in program history.

POSTSEASON BOUND: While the team has its sights set a little higher, the Aggies -- at the very least -- have clinched a berth into the Women's National Invitation Tournament for the fourth consecutive season (and the fifth time overall), and the program's eighth postseason berth in 13 seasons at the Division I level. UC Davis has twice advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2011 and 2019, and has earned WNIT berths in 2008, 2020, 2012, 2017, and 2018 -- making a run to the "Sweet 16" in 2017 and the "Elite Eight" in 2018. The Aggies are 5-5 in the WNIT -- the most wins of any Big West school in that tournament, topping UC Santa Barbara and former member Pacific, which has each won three times in that tournament.

TRADITION: Seniors Nina Bessolo and Sophia Song have only known winning during their time in an Aggie uniform, becoming only the fourth and fifth players in school history to be a part of four straight conference titles along with Nicole Dubriel (1994-98), Elizabeth Doud (1994-98), and Karyn Castro (1995-98). It's also in the coaching DNA as Head Coach Jennifer Gross and Associate Head Coach Des Abeyta won three straight titles apiece when UC Davis won five straight titles from 1995-99, while Director of Operations Stephanie Shadwell was a part of five Big West titles (when you include a medical redshirt season) at UCSB when the Gauchos won their 10 straight crowns from 1995-05.

AGGIES AGAINST THE FIELD: Although its opponent won't be known until Wednesday night, UC Davis has faced seven of the eight other members of the league in the conference tournament, having skipped over only Cal State Fullerton since joining the Big West in 2007-08: UC Riverside (4-1), UC Santa Barbara (3-2), UC Irvine (3-1), Cal Poly (1-0), Long Beach State (1-0), Hawai'i (1-1), and CSUN (0-4), while posting an 0-1 record against former league member Pacific.

ALL SHE DOES IS WIN: Head Coach Jennifer Gross solidified her hold on third place in career coaching victories at UC Davis with her 173rd win at CSUN on March 5, and breaking a tie with Pam Gill-Fisher (1975-79, 1981-86, 1987-88) thanks to a Jan. 25 win at Cal Poly. Having won better than 61 percent of her games at the helm since taking over the progam in 2011-12, Gross now sets her sights on Jorja Hoehn, who won 205 games in nine seasons from 1988-97, and Sandy Simpson, who won 251 games in 14 years from 1996-97 and 1998-2011.

TOP 10: Gross ended the regular season just two conference victories shy of No. 100 for her career as her 98 Big West triumphs -- as well as her 173 overall wins -- stand seventh on the league's coaching list, which only includes games as members of the conference. Three more victories will put her into an overall tie for sixth with Cal State Fullerton's Dr. Maryalyce Jeremiah, while she stands just 27 wins back of becoming only the fifth coach in league history to reach 200 for a career.

If you've ever wondered how the Aggies are so good at beating the buzzer, the answer is very simple. Practice. In what has become a day before the game tradition, the Aggies — players, coaches, and staff — launch half-court heaves at the end of their final practice prior to gameday... celebrating often in what has been dubbed "Day Before Game Half Court Shots" — or as our fans on Twitter have come to know them, #DBGHCS. The number of makes from players (and coaches) are below...

WHEN YOU'RE HERE, YOU'RE FAMILY: Head

Coach Jennifer Gross has steadily built a winner at UC Davis during her time at the helm, thanks, in part, to a supporting cast of coaches that make up one of the longest-tenured staffs in the country. Entering its ninth season together, Gross, associate head coaches Joe Teramoto and Des Abeyta, and assistant coach Matt Klemin, make up the longest-tenured coaching staff in the country after Oklahoma welcomed a pair of new coaches into the fold for this season. The Aggies' staff is now one of only four in the country (Texas A&M, Tulane, and lowa State, are the others) that have been together for at least eight seasons.

CLOSING ON A MILESTONE: The Aggies are just two wins shy of 250 in the program's Division I history, entering the week with a 248-160 (.608) record.

FOUR MORE YEARS!: Entering this week's conference tournament, this year's senior class has accounted for 95 wins over the past four seasons -- a total that ranks fifth among any four-year span in school history and stands just two shy of the 97 wins from 2015-19. The record stands at 102 triumphs from 1994-98 and 1995-99, while the 1993-97 teams won 101 games.

FINDING THEIR (HONDA) CENTER: UC Davis will be playing at the Honda Center for the seventh time as part of the Big West Tournament posting a combined 5-5 mark in 10 tournament games at the arena. In that span, the Aggies are shooting a combined .411 (216-for-525) from the floor overall, .267 (44-for-159) from beyond the arc, and .761 (124-for-163) from the line, while holding opponents to .380 (216-for-569) from the floor, .299 (52-for-174) from deep, and .713 (97-for-136) at the line.

LET IT FLY: Out of nearly 350 Division I programs, there are only 16 other schools more accurate that the Aggies from beyond the arc, and only nine schools that make more three's per game, entering the Big West Tournament. Leading the league with a .365 three-point percentage and 259 makes overall at the start of the week, UC Davis has led the Big West in four of the last five season -- including each of the last three -- while ranking either first or second in three-pointers made during that span.

GOTTA SHOOT THE THREE: UC Davis enters the week with 259 three-pointers this season -- extending a run that has seen the Aggies hit at least 200 three-pointers in every season since the 2008-09 campaign. The total ranks third in a single season in the

program's Division I history (four makes behind the No. 2 spot set in 2018-19), while rapidly closing in on the record of 289 triples sunk during 2017-18.

BOMBS AWAY: The Aggies let it fly from deep in their win at CSUN last Thursday, draining 10 three-pointers against the Matadors for their 15th double-digit performance of the year. UC Davis is a combined 9-6 in those 15 contests.

ROLLIN' IN THE DEEP: The Aggies' 259 makes from beyond the arc (32 better than second-place Hawai'i) and 8.93 per game enter the week as the Big West's best, while ranking among the top 20 in the nation in both categories at No. 15 and No. 10, respectively, entering the week.

DEEP FROM DEEP: Entering this week's regular season finales, the Aggies feature five of the Big West Conference's top 10 sharpshooters — and three of the top five overall. Freshman Evanne Turner ranks second in the league at .436 for the year, senior Katie Toole ranks third at .417 for the season, sophomore Makaila Sanders is fourth at .400, junior Mackenzie Trpcic is sixth at .368, and senior Sophia Song is 10th at .352 for the year. Overall, UC Davis ranks No. 17 in the country in three-point percentage as a team (.365) following last week.

DIALED IN: UC Davis has made a three-pointer in 523 consecutive games dating back to Feb. 15, 2003, at Cal State San Bernardino. Since then, the Aggies have shot .351 (3,652-for-10,419) from beyond the arc.

CAROM QUEEN: Thanks to her 11 rebounds during the final week of the regular season, junior Cierra Hall stands sixth on the school's Division I career list with 560, while her 207 rebounds this year now rank second on the program's Division I single-season list -- just one behind Celia Marfone's record of 208 set during the 2014-15 campaign. Hall, who is one of only three different Aggies in the program's Division I era to grab 200 rebounds in a season, enters the week ranked No. 5 in the Big West in rebounding at 7.1 rpg.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: Should Hall best Marfone's mark by even a single rebound, it would be the most boards by an Aggie since Colleen Turnbull finished with 278 rebounds during the 2002-03 season.

NOT TO BE OUTDONE: Sophomore Sage Stobbart has also quietly been making her way up the program's Division I single-season list, as her 198 rebounds

AGGIES SIGN TALENTED HIGH SCHOOL TRIO TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT FOR 2020-21 CAMPAIGN

AGGIES INK THREE: Head Coach Jennifer Gross announced the addition of three standout high school student-athletes who have signed National Letters of Intent to continue their academic and athletic careers with the Aggies: Bria Shine, a 6-foot-1 guard out of Christian Brothers HS in Sacramento, Calif., Allie Carreon, a 5-foot-10 wing from San Diego Christian HS in San Diego, Calif., and Mazatlan Harris, a 6-foot-2 forward from Cathedral Catholic HS in San Diego, Calif.

"We are very excited to add Allie, Bria and Mazzie to our Aggie family," Gross said. "These three players are skilled, athletic, and versatile. They each bring something unique to the court and will continue to enhance our program's strong culture. They are also all driven academically which makes them a perfect fit here at UC Davis."

this year are tied for fifth on that list -- just two shy of becoming the fourth Aggie to post at least 200 rebounds in a season in the program's Division I era.

CHAIRWOMEN OF THE BOARDS: Should Stobbart reach the 200-rebound plateau this year, she and Cierra Hall would give the Aggies a pair of players with 200 rebounds in a single season for the first time since Marfone (202) and Alyson Doherty (200) did so in 2015-16. It would be only the sixth duo in school history to accomplish the feat -- a group that includes a trio of UC Davis players who did so in the same season in 2001-02: Sarah Allen (209), Colleen Turnbull (206), and Janae Henning (204).

GIMME A (SECOND) CHANCE: Four of Hall's 11 rebounds last week came on the offensive end, giving her 79 offensive rebounds for the year and breaking her own program single-season Division I record in that category. Her total represents the most since Sarah Allen grabbed 85 on the offensive end in 2002-03. Meanwhile, Hall's 190 career offensive rebounds are just nine shy of the program's Division I career record held by Doherty, who gathered 199 from 2012-16.

SECOND-HALF SAGE: The sophomore from North Vancouver, B.C., has really found her stride during the second half of Big West play, finishing in double figures in six of her final eight games, averaging 13.3 ppg and 9.5 rpg while shooting .568 (42-for-74) from the field overall — including a .591 (13-for-22) clip from beyond the arc — and averaging 2.5 blocks per game, swatting just over half (20) of her 39 blocks this year in that span.

BIG WEST BOOST: Since the start of conference play, Stobbart has been a beast on the boards, grabbing two-thirds (132) of her 198 toal rebounds in Big West play and averaging 8.3 rpg in 16 games -- the former leading the team since the start of conference play. Stobbart has raised her season average by nearly two full rebounds since the start of Big West play, up from 5.1 rpg to 6.8 rpg entering the week.

SAGE STO-BLOCK: Stobbart's 39 blocks this season have the sophomore ranked 10th on the program's all-time single-season top 10 list and sixth on the program's Division I single-season list. Meanwhile, her 50 career swats rank seventh on the program's Division I list, just six shy of Celia Marfone (2012-16).

TURNER IS TOPS: There was no denying freshman Evanne Turner during the team's most recent trip to Southern California as the Fontana, Calif., native posted a career-high 21 points in the win over CSUN, setting new career highs in steals (three), field goals made (six), and free throws made (four), while matching her career high with five three-pointers in the process. It was the first 20-point performance by an Aggie since teammate Katie Toole finished with 20 against UC Santa Barbara back on Feb. 1.

HERE'S A QUARTER: Turner's 11 points in the third quarter against CSUN marked the 14th time this season that an Aggie has finished with double-digit points in a single period this season, the ninth time it has happened in the sec-

ond half, and the fourth time in the third quarter alone.

SEE THE BALL, BE THE BALL: Junior Mackenzie Trpcic saw the ball -- and her teammates -- really well against CSUN, tying her UC Davis career high with 10 assists against the Matadors. It marked only the fourth time in the program's Division I history that an Aggie has collected double-digit assists in a game, joining her 10-assist performance against Sacramento State earlier this year, Molly Greubel's record 14-assist night at UC Irvine in 2014, and Kourtney Eaton's 11 assists at SeattleU in 2017. Half of those 10 helpers came in the third quarter against the Matadors -- the highest single-period total by a UC Davis player and the fifth time she has had at least four assists in a quarter this year.

PASSING FANCY: A total of 13 assists last week has Trpcic moving up the Aggie charts as her 133 helpers this season rank her fourth on the program's Division I single-season list — just four behind Kourtney Eaton's total of 137 in 2018-19 for third and 21 back of Eaton's record of 154 in 2017-18. The Hamilton, Ontario, native collected only the eighth 100-assist season in the program's Division I history and is only the fifth different player on that 100-assist list joining Kourtney (four times) and her sister Karley (102 in 2018-19), Dani Nafekh (130 in 2015-16), and Molly Greubel (103 in 2013-14).

SEASON OF GIVING...: Trpcic is a giver. Her 133 assists and 4.59 assists per game entering the week both rank among the top two in the Big West, and among the top 100 in the NCAA in those categories (No. 71 and No. 72, respectively). It's not uncharted territory for Trpcic, who finished her sophomore year at Albany ranked No. 14 in the nation in assists per game (6.47) following a school sophomore season record 207 helpers in 2017-18 — which also ranked No. 15 in the country at the end of the year.

TOOLE-D: Enjoying her finest season statistically, senior Katie Toole has moved into the program's Division I single-season top 10 list for scoring with 402 points, matching Alyson Doherty's 2014-15 total for 10th place. The Farmington, Utah, native now stands 18 points shy of Sydnee Fipps' 2014-15 total (420) for ninth and 44 points back of Morgan Bertsch's 2015-16 total for eighth.

STAY ON TARGET: If the season ended today, Toole would be able to celebrate one of the finest shooting seasons in the program's Division I history. Her 51 percent from the field would rank fifth on that single-season list, while her 42 percent from beyond the arc would rank as the ninth-best.

AWW, SHOOT!: The Aggies have shot better than 40 percent from the field in 10 of their last 11 games, shooting .430 (263-for-611) -- including a best of .481 against Cal Poly -- in that stretch.

MAKING THE ADJUSTMENT: UC Davis has outscored the opposition by a combined 44 points over the first two quarters this season, but the third period has been where the Aggies have really done their damage this year, holding a plus-92 (495-403) advantage coming out of the locker room after the break.

HELPING ME HELP YOU: UC Davis collected 22 assists on 26 made baskets in its win over CSUN last week, the fourth time that the Aggies have finished with at least 20 assists in a game and tying a season high set against William Jessup on Jan. 1. It was the most against a Division I opponent since UC Davis posted 23 helpers against Southern Utah last season on Nov. 23 and the third-highest percentage of assists on made baskets this season behind only the 21 assists on 23 makes against Portland State and 19 assists on 21 makes against Hawai'i.

SWIPER, NO SWIPING: The 12 steals by the Aggies against the Matadors marked the sixth time this season that UC Davis has posted double digits and the most since swiping the same number against William Jessup on Jan. 1.

BEAT US ONCE...: Shame on you. Beat us twice? Well, that rarely happens. Courtesy of Aggie play-by-play voice Greg Wong, UC Davis has not lost back-to-back Big West contests since the Aggies lost at Hawai'i (70-50) and at home against UC Riverside (90-76) on Feb. 18-20, 2016.

MINUTE WOMEN: UC Davis has six players averaging better than 20 minutes per game this season -- led by Katie Toole's 27.9 minutes per contest -- showcasing depth that hasn't been seen since the 2015-16 season when the Aggies finished the year with seven players averaging better than 20 minutes per.

HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE: Eleven of the Aggies' 16 victories this season have come at The Pavilion, averaging 69.9 ppg and shooting .437 from the floor, while holding opponents to just 59.8 ppg and .344 from the field. Compare that to the road, where UC Davis is averaging 64.3 ppg to the opposition's 64.7 ppg, shooting .404 to the opposition's .402. Standing 11-3 at home this season, the Aggies are a combined 49-7 at The Pavilion over the last three-plus years and have posted a winning home mark in each of the last seven seasons -- including double-digit wins in each of the last four.

SWAT TEAM: Opponents have found little room inside against the Aggies as of late as the UC Davis defense is averaging 4.00 blocks per game over its last eight contests, entering the week third in the Big West with 90 blocks overall and averaging 3.10 blocks per game this season.

RECYCLED NOTES

GUESS WHO'S BACK: The second time is, hopefully, the charm for former UC Davis women's basketball standout Morgan Bertsch, who signed a contract with the WNBA's Dallas Wings and will join them for training camp prior to the 2020 season. She returns to the franchise that selected her in the third round (29th overall) of the 2019 WNBA Draft -- the first Aggie to be drafted and the first from a Big West school since 2011. ALL HALL: In averaging a double-double during a 2-0 week, UC Davis junior cell biology major Cierra Hall was named the Big West Player of the Week for the first time in her career on Feb. 17, averaging 15.5 ppg and 10.0 rpg while shooting 65 percent (13-for-20) from the field. Also picking up honors from College Sports Madness, Hall became the first Aggie honored by the league since Morgan Bertsch on March 4 of last season. INEES: UC Davis women's basketball signees Mazatlan Harris and Bria Shine earned nominations for the 2020 McDonald's All-American Games on Tuesday, two of 31 players from the state of California to make the list of girls high school standouts from across the country. This year's event will be hosted at the Toyota Center in Houston, Texas, on April 1. It will be the 19th annual girls game, which was first held at Madison Square Garden in New York in 2002. Harris, a 6-foot-2 forward, is currently averaging 11.9 points and 10.0 rebounds per game through the first 14 games of her senior season, shooting 48 percent from the floor and adding 31 blocked shots for the Dons of Cathedral Catholic HS in San Diego. Shine, a 6-foot-1 guard, is averaging 12.0 ppg and 7.6 rpg, to go along with 2.3 assists and 3.4 steals per game for the Falcons of Christian Brothers HS in Sacramento through 12 games thus far this year.

DEFENDING CHAMPS AT THE TOP OF PRESEASON BIG WEST POLLS: The

Aggies were picked to repeat as conference champions for the fourth consecutive season by members of the media, while the coaches picked UC Davis to finish second according to a pair of polls released on Oct. 23. Receiving eight first-place votes and 113 points overall, the Aggies stood atop the media poll, shading second-place UC Irvine (four first-place votes and 104 points) and third-

place UC Riverside (one first-place vote, 94 points). The Anteaters were picked first in the coaches poll, receiving six of the nine first-place nods and 77 points to edge UC Davis, which finished with two first-place votes and 70 points.

PRESEASON LOVE FOR NINA: Senior American studies major Nina Bessolo was one of six players selected to the preseason All-Big West Team by the coaches, coming off a junior year that saw the Hayward, Calif., native earn All-Big West honorable mention honors. She averaged a career-high 9.0 ppg to rank second on the team, adding 3.9 rpg, shooting just over 40 percent from the field, and 35 percent from beyond the arc.

SO, HOW 'BOUT THOSE AGGIES?: Bessolo is one of three seniors for the Aggies in 2019-20, along with psychology major Sophia Song (5.7 ppg, .427 FG%) and communication major Katie Toole (2.2 ppg, .586 FG%), as UC Davis returns eight letter winners and a pair of starters off of last season's squad that finished 25-7 overall, a school-record 15-1 in the Big West, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the program's history. Three-time Big West Coach of the Year Jennifer Gross also returns junior cell biology major Cierra Hall, who led the Aggies in rebounding at 6.3 rpg, as well as sophomore center Sage Stobbart, who will anchor the Aggies' inside game after averaging 3.3 ppg and 4.2 rpg as a freshman in 2018-19.

ALL THEY DO IS WIN, TOO: Seniors Nina Bessolo and Sophia Song have only known winning, playing key roles as part of the Aggies' three consecutive Big West Conference titles, a Big West Tournament crown, two trips to the WNIT, and an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2019. With 78 wins over the last three years, the duo would match Head Coach Jennifer Gross' record for most wins (101) from 1993-97 if the Aggies were to win 23 games this season.

KOM SÅ DANMARK!: Junior Lena Svanholm returned to Northern California from her native Denmark with some valuable international experience, seeing time with the Danish Women's National Team in games against Romania and Italy for the 2021 FIBA Women's Women's Eurobasket Qualifiers.

20-20-20 VISION: UC Davis goes in search of its fourth consecutive 20-win season in 2019-20 -- something that hasn't happened in the program's Division I history and a feat that would be the longest such run in the program's all-time history since a streak of six consecutive 20-win seasons from 1993-99, accumulating 149 victories against only 29 losses (.837) in that stretch. According to records that date back to the 1974-75 season, UC Davis has won 20-or-more games 17 times.

AGGIES PUTTING THE "W" IN BIG WEST: No Big West Conference school has won more games than UC Davis since the Aggies officially joined the league in 2007-08, as their 231 combined victories entering the year are 41 more than the next-highest school (Cal Poly with 190) entering 2019-20.

AGGIES BY THE NUMBERS: UC Davis returns 43 percent (989 of 2,278) of its points, 58 percent (721 of 1,236) of its rebounds, 37 percent (185 of 504) of its assists, 45 percent of its field goals (362 of 811), 43 percent of its three-pointers (112 of 263), and 39 percent of its free throws (153 of 393), from a season ago. What does it all mean? We don't know, but numbers are fun.

TRANSFER ORDERS: Although she has to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules, junior Lena Svanholm becomes only the eighth player to transfer into the program from another Division I school in UC Davis' Division I history, following fellow transfers Katie Toole (Utah State) and Mackenzie Trpcic (Albany).

WE'RE GONNA NEED MORE FLAGS: Internationally known in the classroom and, now, on the basketball court. The now-eligible Mackenzie Trpcic (Hamilton, Ontario), Svanholm, and Megan Jones (Ayr, Scotland), will eventually be the fourth, fifth, and sixth, international players to suit up for UC Davis in the program's Division I history, joining Idit Oryon (Jerusalem, Israel), Dani Nafekh (Oakville, Ontario), and Sage Stobbart (North Vancouver, British Columbia).

#AGGIESINTHEPROS: Morgan Bertsch has begun her professional career with Sparta&k Vidnoe in Russia, currently averaging 12.6 ppg, 5.1 rpg, 1.0 bpg, and shooting .538 from the field through 16 games (as of Feb. 17) in the Russian League. In EuroCup action, Bertsch is averaging 14.5 ppg, 4.5 rpg, and shooting 56 percent from the field in 11 contests. Meanwhile, in Germany, Pele Gianotti is averaging a robust 18.3 ppg and shooting 55 percent in the country's top division through 19 games with the BasCats USC Heidelberg, adding 4.9 rpg, 1.3 apg, and 1.4 spg, while hitting 35 percent (37-for-107) from beyond the arc.

It is this uncommon commitment towards student-athletes that led to the creation of the Aggie EVO System, a multi-faceted student-athlete outcomes program focused on preparing young men and women for a successful launch after graduating from the sixth-ranked public school in the nation.

We define launch as moving beyond graduation into a meaningful professional path that builds on the college experience, sets a graduate on a path of financial and social well-being and effectively replaces the sport as the primary piece of their identity.

The Aggie EVO System ("EVO" is shorthand for a student-athlete's "evolution" during college) is an important part of the student-athlete experience at UC Davis – just like weights and conditioning, attending class or getting athletic medicine treatment. This unprecedented program was designed to focus on four key elements to help UC Davis student-athletes prepare for future success by helping them better "know and navigate the World of Work":

- **SKILLS** that employers want and will make student-athletes even more effective in their sports: self awareness, emotional intelligence, social/cultural competence and leadership.
- KNOWLEDGE of what careers and paths are out there (we call this the "World of Work"), what fits one's interests and abilities, who in our gigantic network can advise and guide them and each individual can navigate a path to get there.
- **OPPORTUNITIES** to enjoy internships, jobs and other learning opportunities through a powerful network of Aggie alums. Student-athletes hear from and meet alums in a wide variety of fields, attend recruiting events and visit members of the EVO Pro network at companies in San Francisco, Silicon Valley, and Sacramento.
- **TOOLS** that student-athletes need to secure these opportunities. We require a few more basic tools or updates each year they are on campus. This includes resumes and cover letters, LinkedIn profiles, interviewing skills, business cards, professional headshots, and anything else that helps student-athletes prepare for a more successful launch.
