2022: HERO SPORTS SOPHOMORE ALL-AMERICAN... ALL-BIG SKY FIRST TEAM selection... Earned the team's **TONY KAYS AWARD** (Most Improved Offensive Player)... **TEAM CAPTAIN... BIG SKY OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK** (Oct. 31)... Led the Big Sky Conference with 3,048 passing yards for a 277.1 yards per contest average...

Also paced the conference with a 69.8 completion percentage... His 154.2 efficiency rating ranked second in the league... Threw for 20 touchdowns paired with only six interceptions... Sported three games with over 300 passing yards... Threw for multiple touchdowns in six contests... Over the course of three wins (NAU, Northern Colorado and Cal Poly), Hastings completed 82-percent of his passes for 1,004 yards and nine touchdowns to zero interceptions... Threw for 425 yards on 22-for-27 passing with four scores against Cal Poly (Oct. 29)... Tossed three touchdowns at No. 2 South Dakota State (Sept. 10)... Completed 16-of-21 passes with three touchdowns against San Diego (Sept. 17)... Threw three touchdowns on 18-of-21 passing at Northern Colorado... Completed a season-high 39 passes against No. 12 Weber State.

2021 FALL: BIG SKY FALL ALL-ACADEMIC... Played in 10 games and started the last five contests of the season at quarterback... Completed 130 passes on 215 attempts (60.5 pct.) for 1,173 yards with seven touchdowns and eight interceptions... DAN HAWKINS
HEAD COACH
SEVENTH SEASON
UC DAVIS '84

He has taken his family on vacation to Machu Picchu in Peru. Most recently put on a football clinic in Quito, Ecuador. He taught science, jumped out of airplanes, and coached football in 14 different countries. For Dan Hawkins, who was introduced as football's new head coach on November 28, 2016, those aren't simply items to cross off a bucket list, they have been opportunities to learn. It's that thirst for learning, and application of that knowledge, that brought Hawkins, a 1984 UC Davis alumnus who played and coached with legendary head coach Jim Sochor, back to his alma mater.

By incorporating the program's core principles of uncommon engineering, quality balance of life and excellence with class, the Aggies thrived both on and off the field, and built the foundation for the program's #AGScension since he returned home. The 2018 campaign, Hawkins' second as head coach and 100th in the history of the program, was a historic campaign that no UC Davis football fan will ever forget.

What started with the program's third victory over a FBS program, in its season opener, continued with a Division I program-record six-game win streak, and undefeated home record, 10 overall and seven league victories — both new program records — and ended with multiple new milestones.

By defeating Sacramento State, 56-13, in this year's rivalry game, UC Davis clinched its inaugural Big Sky Championship. The next day, the Aggies officially earned a First Round bye in the first FCS playoff appearance in program history, thanks to its No. 6 playoff seed, hosted its first-ever FCS playoff game two weeks later and recorded the program's first FCS post-season victory with its 23-16 result versus Northern Iowa.

By leading the Aggies to their most successful season at the Division I level, Big Sky officials bestowed Coach of the Year honors to Hawkins. Following UC Davis' playoff run, Hawkins became UC Davis' inaugural recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award, presented to the top head coach in the NCAA's Division I Football Championship Subdivision.

In addition to excelling inside the classroom at the fifth-ranked public school in the nation, football student-athletes also set a new precedent in the program's history: By moving spring practices to middle of the winter quarter, student-athletes can participate in internships, community service projects, or study abroad — opportunities available to students on campus that are unheard of within a football program at any level across the nation. Thanks to the integration of Hawkins' core principals, new football alums are now pursuing graduate degrees abroad — an uncommon opportunity for any UC Davis student.

Within two seasons, Hawkins successfully created a culture focused on providing a well-rounded college experience that combines elite academics with the opportunity to compete at the highest level of college athletics.

Hawkins, the 17th head coach in the program's history, is married to the former Misti Rae Ann Hokanson.



ISAIAH JACKSON
INSIDE LINEBACKERS
SEVENTH SEASON
SOUTH DAKOTA STATE '10

Isaiah Jackson, who enjoyed successful stints at West Virginia State, Sioux Falls and the International Federation of American Football, joined the UC Davis football staff as a linebackers coach in 2017.

During his first season with the Aggies, Coach Jackson led a unit responsible for helping the team win five games

against Division I competition, matching the combined total from the previous three years. That set the stage for a historic 2018 season, one that saw football win its inaugural Big Sky Conference championship, and earn its first FCS playoff appearance in program history.

Jackson previously served five seasons on the WVSU football staff, working with linebackers (2015-16), special teams (2012-16) and the defensive line (2012-15). Overall, six athletes under his tutelage garnered All-Mountain East Conference distinction, including Dennis Gardeck, who also captured HERO Sports Super Region I Defensive Player of the Year honors.

His work with the Yellowjackets followed a four-year stay at the University of Sioux Falls in South Dakota. Jackson began his career as a graduate assistant linebackers coach, then worked with the D-line in the 2011 and 2012 seasons. The Cougars captured the NAIA championship in 2010, with Jackson protege Eric Anderson earning Defensive Player of the Game in that title contest. USF later transitioned to NCAA Division II, posting a 9-2 record in its first season. Jackson mentored four linebackers and a defensive lineman to All-Northern Sun Conference acclaim in his final two seasons.

Jackson made two stops with the IFAF, the second of which partnered him with Hawkins and Tucker. He guided the linebackers for the U.S. team, which defeated Japan for the 2015 gold medal game. Three of Jackson's players garnered IFAF All-Tournament nods.

Jackson graduated from South Dakota State with a degree in education in 2010. He added a master's in education administration from Sioux Falls while serving on the Cougars' staff. Jackson and his wife have one young son, Wenly Isaiah.

2023 SEASON OUTLOOK



The Aggies enter the 2023 campaign coming off their third straight winning season and fourth in the past five years. UC Davis once again heads into camp inside the top-25 as the Ags were tabbed No. 14 in the Athlon Sports' Preseason Top 25 and No. 18 by HERO Sports.

UCD returns eight starters on each side of the ball that started the majority of the contests in 2022, including all-Big Sky first-team selections Miles Hastings, Lan Larison, Rex Connors and Zach Kennedy. Second-team selection Jordan Ford is also joined by third-team honorees Chubba Maae, Teddye Buchanan and Jehiel Budgett.

Making a return to the lineup this season after missing most of the 2022 campaign is offensive line mainstay and All-Big Sky first-teamer (2021) Jake Parks. The Aggie offensive line returns three starters with Ford, Parks and Nico Sarale.

The Ags do have to replace the most prolific running back in program history in school-record holder Ulonzo Gilliam, Jr. UC Davis does have the luxury of welcoming back Lan Larison for his third full season. The Idaho native has amassed back-to-back seasons of 1,000-plus all-purpose yards and is coming off a 2022 campaign that showcased 1,259 all-purpose yards that ranked fifth in the Big Sky.

Big Sky passing leader Miles Hastings takes the helm as the starter for the second straight season under center. Hastings, a HERO Sports sophomore All-American, paced the conference with 3,048 yards threw the air and sported a league-best 69.8 completion percentage.



Familiarity will not be an issue for Hastings as he returns 182 catches from a year ago and his leading receiver in C.J. Hutton, who hauled in 47 passes for 506 yards and four touchdowns. Six receivers return who caught 15 or more passes in 2022.

Defensively, Jerry Rice Award finalist Rex Connors anchors a veteran Aggie defense. The Utah native led the Big Sky with five interceptions for a 0.50 average. He paced the Ags with 92 total tackles to rank fourth in the league at 9.2 tackles per contest.

Sophomore Zach Kennedy had a breakout season, compiling a team-leading four sacks and 8.5 tackles for loss en route to being named a HERO Sports Sophomore All-American.

Team captain and arguably one of the best linebackers in the conference in Teddye Buchanan returns to the middle of the defense for UCD. Buchanan still ranked second on the team with three interceptions and fourth in tackles despite missing significant time over the course of four games.

All-conference selection Chubba Maae will continue to plug the middle of the defensive line and all-conference corner Jehiel Budgett brings experience out wide for the Ags.

UC Davis does have to replace record-breaking kicker Isaiah Gomez. Justin Dwinell gained valuable experience last season, punting nine times for 360 yards. Experienced returners Trent Tompkins and Larison have plenty of career returns under their belt.

UC Davis competed in its 100th season of football in 2018, celebrating the occasion with a 10-3 record, a share of the Big Sky Conference championship and an appearance in the NCAA FCS postseason. What follows is your crash course on the high points of Aggie football history, for those unfamiliar with the program and its lore.

20-17

While the Miracle Game (see box at right) arguably ranks as the most storied victory in program history, UC Davis' upset of Stanford on September 18, 2005 certainly rivals for that honor... The Aggies faced a 17-0 deficit by the midway point of the second quarter, with both Cardinal touchdowns coming on defensive plays... However, UC Davis rallied back with 20 unanswered points, culminating with a three-yard TD strike from Jon Grant to Blaise Smith with :08 left.

The win marked the program's first against a I-A team (now called FBS) since 1986, when UC Davis topped Pacific by a 45-41 final down in Stockton.

CRADLE OF COACHES

When UC Davis faced Southern Utah on October 19, it marked a meeting between two Aggie alumni: **Dan Hawkins** ('83) and **Demario Warren** ('08)... In fact, the Aggie football program has a proud tradition of sending alumni to Division I college head coaching positions... The list begins with 1970 graduate **Paul Hackett** (Pitt, USC), rolls through 1973 alumni **Mike Bellotti** (Oregon) and **Bob Biggs** (UC Davis), and continues with former Hawkins assistant and 1988 grad **Chris Petersen** (Boise State, Washington)... This season when the Ags head to Pocatello, Idaho, Hawkins will face his former offensive coordinator and son, **Cody Hawkins**.

Hackett also takes part in a tradition of Aggie football alums serving on NFL staffs, along with current New York Jets offensive coordinator **Nathaniel Hackett**, former teammate **Ejoro Evero** is the defensive coordinator in Carolina. Although no former UC Davis player has had as long of an NFL coaching career as **Myrel Moore**, who served 16 years on the staffs of the Denver Broncos (1972-77, '82-88), Oakland Raiders (1979) and New England Patriots (1991-92)... The Aggie football staff has also served as an early point for such non-alumni mentors as **Gary Patterson**, TCU's head coach since 2000; and **Rich Scangarello**, who earned the post as Denver Broncos OC in 2019... Patterson served as Aggie linebackers coach in 1986, while Scangarello made two different stops at UC Davis as an assistant under Bob Biggs.

PROMINENT ALUMNI

In addition to the coaches list above, UC Davis football has enjoyed dozens of alumni entering the professional ranks, with 17 players earning selection in the NFL Draft... Among the most noted are **Ken O'Brien**, a member of the 1983 "Year of the Quarterback" draft who threw for more than 25,000 yards with the Jets and the Eagles; **Mark Grieb**, who retired as one of the all-time passing leaders in Arena Football League history; **Rolf Benirschke**, who earned NFL Man of the Year honors and kicked 146 field goals for the San Diego Chargers; and **Khari Jones**, who led the Winnipeg Blue Bombers to the 2001 Grey Cup... Jones also deserves a spot in the coaching section, as he took over the Montreal Alouettes in 2019.

AGGIE FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

3 individuals associated with UC Davis football are enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame. Ken O'Brien entered in 1997 for his outstanding playing career. Two years later, Jim Sochor earned induction for his coaching career. Most recently, Mike Bellotti entered the CFB Hall in 2014 in honor of his coaching accomplishments at Oregon.

5: The number of conference affiliations UC Davis football has held, namely the Far Western Conference (1925-81), the Northern California Athletic Conference (1982-92), the American West Conference (1993), the Great West Conference (2004-11) and the Big Sky Conference (2012-present).

12 UC Davis players have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Award winners, an honor roll that includes Arena Football Hall of Famer Mark Grieb and San Diego Chargers Hall of Famer Rolf Benirschke.

14 Aggies have won CoSIDA Academic All-America honors (now sponsored by Google Cloud), with Ryan Parenteau and Tiger Garcia being the most recent recipients.

21: The Aggies made their first-ever appearance in the FCS playoffs in 2018, and returned in 2021, making it the 21st overall NCAA postseason berth through all divisions – not counting a pair of College Division bowl games in the 1940s.

22 program alumni have appeared in at least one regular-season NFL game, with four players – Ken O'Brien (1983), Tom Williams (1970), Bo Eason (1984) and Mike Wise (1986) – drafted in one of the top two rounds.

24: Aggie quarterback Ken O'Brien was chosen as the 24th overall pick of the 1983 NFL Draft (a.k.a. the Year of the Quarterback), making him the highest UC Davis selection in history. O'Brien passed for 25,094 yards and 128 touchdowns in the NFL, mostly with the New York Jets.

25: The only retired number in program history belonged to Sam Paneno, who suffered a severe knee injury during overtime of a September 11, 1999 game at Western Oregon. Due to complications with circulation, Paneno had the lower portion of his right leg amputated nine days later. His positive attitude throughout the ordeal earned national attention. Paneno was bestowed with the NCAA's inaugural Inspiration Award in 2001. Paneno graduated from UC Davis' King Hall School of Law in 2005, later established a nonprofit to protect abused and impoverished children and ran a law practice specializing in special education.

30: The 2018 Big Sky Conference title marked the 30th league championship in history, a list that included 20 straight crowns from 1971-90.

37: The number of consecutive winning seasons UC Davis enjoyed (1972-2008) under the guidance of head coaches Jim Sochor (1970-88), Bob Foster (1989-92) and Bob Biggs (1993-2012).



Outside the world of football and onto the screens, Benirschke's heroics with ulcerative colitis (which nearly ended his NFL career) and his subsequent humanitarian efforts made him a national hero, although he arguably gained the most public attention during a brief stint as the host of TV's *Wheel of Fortune*... Former Aggie safety **Bo Eason** went from a successful NFL career to an acting career (*Miami Rhapsody*), with a one-man, semi-autobiographical play called *Runt of the Litter* earning rave critical response... **Tim Lajcik** (pronounced "LAY-sick") an Aggie All-American in both football and wrestling, has 60 credits as a stunt performer (*John Wick*)... The UC Davis football leader for onscreen credits belongs to **Jim Haynie**, who turned his 1963 degree in dramatic art to nearly 100 roles – most notably **The Peacemaker**, **Pretty In Pink** and **The Bridges of Madison County**.

NAMESAKES

Two landmarks stand near the main entrance of UC Davis Health Stadium, both named after key university figures... The victory bell is named for Thomas Tavernetti, a university faculty member from 1913 to 1930... The bell is mentioned in the school fight song, "Aggie Fight," and rung after each home win... Across the plaza is a statue of Jim Sochor, who served as UC Davis head football coach from 1970-88... Sochor won 156 games and 17 conference titles in his career, and instilled a belief system later known as "Aggie Pride" (see below).

THE TOOM

Before moving to Aggie Stadium (now known as UC Davis Health Stadium) in 2007, UC Davis football played almost six decades worth of its home games at the corner of Russell Boulevard and A Street in a venue opened in 1949 and named for athletics director Crip Toomey in 1962... Toomey Field, or "The Toom" as it is known to many an alum, hosted a total of 286 Aggie home football contests, including nationally televised NCAA semifinal games in 1977 (Lehigh), 1982 (North Dakota State) and 1983 (North Dakota State).

AGGIE PRIDE

The term has since been appropriated by various entities on the UC Davis campus, but Aggie Pride belief system has its roots with the football program... After taking the helm in 1970, head coach Jim Sochor instilled a new culture: "We knew that everybody we played would be bigger, stronger and faster than we were. We had to find a way. And that way was that no one would be closer as a football team than we would be. Our central values became trust, unity and togetherness"... Bob Foster, the long-time Sochor assistant and later the Aggie head coach in his own right, is credited for giving Aggie Pride its name.

THE MIRACLE GAME

No two knowledgeable Aggie fans would ever agree on a top five list of the most memorable or significant victories in UC Davis football history, but everyone should have the 30-29 win over Cal State Hayward on Nov. 6, 1971 high on that list (if not on top). The Aggies trailed the defending conference champs, 29-14, entering the final minute of play. What follows is the play-by-play from that point forward.

DRIVE START: Steve Nathan's 30-yard punt return to the Hayward 42 with 0:44 remaining in regulation. UC Davis has no timeouts.

The game clock had expired on Bellotti's touchdown, so the contest is initially ruled over upon the penalty. However, the game cannot end on a penalty, giving the Aggies another opportunity to attempt the two-point conversion from the 8-yard line.

Two-point conversion: illegal procedure called against UC Davis.

Again, the violation occurred before the snap, thus replaying the conversion from the 13-yard line.

Two-point conversion: Bob Biggs complete to Mike Everly. (Everly had to make a diving left-handed catch in heavy traffic in the back of the end zone.)

ABOUT THE EDWARDS FAMILY ATHLETICS CENTER

The Edwards Family Athletics Center is a comprehensive academic, strength and conditioning, sports medicine, and team facility. The more than 50,000-square-foot project, designed by Gensler and built by AECOM Hunt, will provide a new hub for Aggie student-athletes. As the exclusive provider of health care services to student-athletes, UC Davis Health will also serve students, faculty, staff and the Davis community from within the building's footprint with a new out-patient sports medicine clinic.

EDWARDS FAMILY ATHLETICS CENTER TIMELINE

November 15, 2018 – The Student-Athlete Performance Center (now Edwards Family Athletics Center) project was announced with initial renderings and press conference.

August 20, 2019 – UC Davis Health announces a naming rights deal with UC Davis Athletics for Aggie Stadium (now UC Davis Health Stadium). The agreement includes UC Davis Health as a tenant in the new Edwards Family Athletics Center, pushing the size of the project to 52,000 square feet.

October 20, 2019 – The Bob Biggs Practice Field is completed as the first component of the project. The all-grass facility was named for Bob Biggs, retired head football

coach from 1994-2012, after a group of alumni, friends, and teammates of Bob successfully raised \$1M to name the space.

May 5, 2020 – Site prep begins at center construction site, and web-cams are installed for people to follow along with progress.

June 24, 2020 – The Edwards Family Athletics Center officially broke ground at the corner of Hutchison Blvd and La Rue Road. The event was live-streamed online and featured prominent donors to the project.

March 10, 2021 – A major construction milestone (placement of last structural steel beam) was celebrated with a traditional “Topping Out” ceremony.

September 12, 2022 – Aggie student-athletes set foot in the Edwards Family Athletics Center for the first time as the weight room became available for use.

September 24, 2022 – Building officially opens with Grand Opening and Dedication Ceremony prior to UC Davis vs. Weber State Football game.





UC DAVIS CELEBRATES EDWARDS FAMILY ATHLETICS CENTER GRAND OPENING

On Saturday, Sept. 24, 2022, a Grand Opening and Dedication Ceremony for the Edwards Family Athletics Center took place on the UC Davis campus, just outside the new facility. Chancellor Gary May, Athletics Director Rocko DeLuca and lead contributor Bruce Edwards made comments before opening the facility to the public for an open house.

“Words cannot express the gratitude that we have for Bruce and Diane Edwards and his family as the lead donors to this project,” UC Davis Athletics Director **Rocko DeLuca** said. “Bruce’s generosity is not limited to this project and his giving spirit has made a transformational impact on our athletics department. He is an active participant in our university community and a friend to many of our coaches and staff. His vision for this project and positive attitude has helped rally our other donors to this project and we look forward to celebrating Bruce and Diane and the Edwards family this weekend.”

This capital investment, unlike any project in department history, further strengthens ICA’s commitment towards developing an environment that encourages student-athletes’ personal growth, academic, athletic and positive post-graduate success.

Thanks to a generous donation from its largest supporters, **Bruce and Diane Edwards**, the facility will bear the name “Edwards Family Athletics Center.”

“This facility is a resource unmatched by conference peers when comparing support services for student-athletes,” UC Davis Senior Associate Athletics Director **Liz Martin** said. “Internally, with our great development staff and externally, as supporters with a variety of interests, came together to create this one-stop-shop. I particularly appreciate how many people understood the vision of the Edwards Family Athletics Center and stepped up to the next level with their donations to achieve such an impressive facility.”

The Paul and Nancy Sallaberry Sports Performance Center is the biggest space within the new facility, providing a greater number of student-athletes and teams with the ability to work out at more convenient times. Compared to the current weight room located at Toomey Field, the new training area is nearly four times larger

in size.

In addition, to team meeting rooms that will provide ample areas for teams to study and prepare for games, the Bruce and Marie West Auditorium will seat 140 individuals and is available for student-athletes, coaches and UC Davis students to organize large gatherings. The Edwards Family Athletics Center features technology throughout the entire building that allows coaches to use these meeting rooms, or the auditorium, as a second office.

The Klein Family Educational and Professional Success Center provides additional quiet space for student-athletes to study for exams, work on class projects or enjoy a break from their daily class and workout schedules. This area includes offices for Aggie EVO leaders, opportunities for student-athletes to network, participate in Aggie EVO-related programming, conduct mock interviews and continue preparing for a successful launch upon graduation.

Centrally located to allow maximum efficiency and collaboration with strength and conditioning staff, the Muir Family Sports Medicine Center will become the new home for athletic trainers, doctors and unit leadership. One of the largest areas of the building will feature hot and cold tubs — a common tool for recovery — to help sports medicine and strength staff implement modern and more effective injury prevention and recovery plans.

Every team will have the opportunity to train on Bob Biggs Field — a natural grass area located adjacent to the building and named for the UC Davis alumnus and legendary football coach. This new field will eliminate the need for student-athletes to travel across campus and practice on natural grass and help them create the most time-efficient schedule each week.

In addition to support staff, football, basketball, lacrosse and field hockey coaches will permanently move to the Edwards Family Athletics Center. Conveniently located near the site of practice and competition, this new office complex provides opportunities for everyone to showcase UC Davis Athletics’ points of pride to recruits and additional areas to conduct player or team meetings and prep for games.

UC DAVIS HEALTH STADIUM



No, UC Davis football has not moved to a new home facility: the former Aggie Stadium has been rebranded as UC Davis Health Stadium effective July of 2019.

This comes as a result of an expanded partnership between UC Davis Athletics and UC Davis Health, a collaboration that will feature a new student-athlete performance center located to the immediate north of the campus's multi-use stadium (see AECOM Hunt and Gensler Sport's concept drawing at right).

With an official capacity of 10,849, UC Davis Health Stadium opened in 2007 as one of the three major facilities funded by the Facilities and Campus Enhancement, for F.A.C.E., Initiative of 1999.

The UC Davis women's lacrosse team was the first to compete on its Shaw Sports (formerly Sportexe) turf, defeating Saint Mary's on April 1, 2007. The football team began competing at UC Davis Health Stadium that fall, after more than a half century at Toomey Field.

The Aggie field hockey team also played at UC Davis Health Stadium before moving to its own facility in 2014, while men's soccer has contested key matchups on the turf in past years.

UC Davis Health Stadium was designed by industry leader Ellerbe Beckett, and built by local firm Brown Construction. It features fixed seating on each of the east and west sides, with grass berm seating – now known as the UC Davis Children's Hospital Family Zone – adjacent to each end zones. Beneath the press box resides the Bruce Edwards Club Room, a popular venue for receptions, meetings and other gatherings.

The 2022 season brought a new field turf as installation was started in June of that year by Tarkett Sports - the leaders in sports surfacing.
