ucf athletic communications

interview policy

UCF student-athletes and coaches will be available to the media during the season, but all interviews must be coordinated through the UCF Athletics Communications Office. Please do not attempt to contact players, coaches or other team personnel directly by any means of communication, including personal phone numbers, email addresses and social networking accounts.

Post-practice interview requests must be submitted to UCF Athletics Communications by 3 p.m. that day.

head coach greg lovelady

Head coach Greg Lovelady will be available for interviews during the season. Due to the varying schedule of midweek games, UCF will not hold a weekly press conference for Coach Lovelady. Media members wishing to interview Coach Lovelady need to submit a request to Ian MacDougall by email or text.

practice

UCF baseball practices are open to the public and media. Practice is normally held from 2:30 p.m. to around 6 p.m. Contact Ian MacDougall to verify times.

spring regular season

Beginning in the final week of January, Coach Lovelady and players will be available to meet with the media before practice. Requests for interview must be made by 1 p.m. that day.

postgame interviews

Lovelady and selected student-athletes will be available for the media 15 minutes after the game on the first base line.

UCF's locker room is closed to the media.

For road games, interviews will take place in the stadium's designated area or near the Knights' dugout.

"the ucf knights are on the air"

UCF baseball games can be heard on multiple platforms for the 2019 season. Fans in Orlando, can listen to select games on the Home of the Knights, 96.9FM/740AM The Game. The station has been the radio home for UCF sports for over 20 years. The partnership allows fans to also listen to UCF baseball anywhere with the iHeart Radio App.

UCF Baseball home games will also be streamed on UCFKnights.tv, a subscriptionbased platform.

press box meal

UCF will provide a meal and beverages to working media prior to the game, including the return of "Cold Cut Sundays."

parking

Free parking for UCF baseball for media personnel will be in garage f during days without a conflict with the UCF men's basketball team or the Orlando Apollos. Additional parking will be located in the outfield lot.

photographers

In accordance with NCAA rules and regulations, all photographers are required to shoot from designated places in the stadium. Due to the tight confines of the dugouts, John Euliano Park allows photographers to shoot from the stair wells leading into the dugouts and from open seats throughout the stadium. Photographers are not permitted to shoot from the playing surface. There are to be no cameras allowed behind the center field fence other than the originating TV network.

credentials

Media credentials for the UCF Baseball season can be requested through Ian MacDougall. Credentials handed out during soccer and volleyball season will suffice for the baseball and softball seasons. Credentials must be requested no less than 24 hours before first pitch and can be picked up two hours prior to the start of the game in the will-call window.

ucf credential policy

All baseball credentials are a revocable license for admission. UCF Athletics reserves the right to refuse, revoke or terminate this license at any time. Your acceptance of accreditation and subsequent use of the credential is expressly conditional upon, but not limited to, the following:

- UCF Athletics and its rights holders own all copyrights, intellectual property rights and proprietary rights for images, sound and data ensuing from or during UCFAA home athletics contests.

- The unauthorized commercial use of photographs, video or audio emanating from UCF Athletics home contests is forbidden.

- The holder of this credential voluntarily assumes all risks of property loss and personal injury arising during its use.

- Photo or video images taken during UCF Athletics home sporting events may only be used in conjunction and for the purpose of the approved credential grant.

- Any secondary use of any picture, audio description, film/tape or drawing of the game taken or made by the accredited organization or individual to whom this credential has been issued is prohibited without prior specific written approval of UCF Athletics.

- The granted credentials are not transferable. UCF Athletics specifically reserves the right to alter, amend, revise or in anyway change the terms of this license without advance notice to the holder, and such changes may not be reflected on the credential.

Greg Lovelady was named the head baseball coach at UCF on July 11, 2016. He will enter his third season in charge at UCF for the 2019 season.

Prior to the 2019 season and just shy of his 40th birthday, Lovelady was named the top coach in the nation under 40 years of age by DI Baseball.

The 2018 campaign saw the Knights post some historic storylines. On March 6, the Knights downed the top-ranked team in the nation for the first time in program history with a 9-7 victory over Florida. UCF turned around and completed its first sweep of a No. 1 ranked opponent with a 4-2 win in Gainesville the next night.

Lovelady guided UCF to its fifth-longest winning streak in program history at 13 games during the 2018 season. The Knights also recorded the second most shutouts in a single campaign with nine.

There were plenty of individual accolades to go around. Rylan Thomas set the single-season record for UCF and The American with a 47-game on-base streak, which was a part of the second longest streak in program history at 55 games. Thomas and junior pitcher Thad Ward were named to The American All-Conference First Team, while Ray Alejo, Dallas Beaver, Tyler Osik and Matthew Mika garnered Second Team honors.

Pitching was the bedrock of the Knights' success in 2018. The pitching staff led the nation with nine shutouts and finished third in the country in hits allowed per nine innings, a school record 7.2. UCF's 3.32 ERA was among the top-15 nationally, while 9.8 strikeouts per nine innings ranked seventh and a 1.22 WHIP was ninth. The Black and Gold notched its second most punchouts in a single season with 556.

The Knights also wreaked havoc on the base paths with 109 stolen bases on the year, good for ninth in the country. Ray Alejo and Matthew Mika finished in the top two spots in The American with 34 and 27 swipes, respectively. The Knights also stole home on three occasions, led by Alejo with two.

Continuing to improve the culture and talent level at UCF, Lovelady brought in the 16th ranked recruiting class, per Collegiate Baseball, prior to the 2018 campaign. After replacing 20 graduating seniors, the Knights went 35-21 with a 13-10 mark in The American to finish in fifth place, but the season came to a close when the Black and Gold found itself in the first four out of the NCAA Tournament.

After the conclusion of the 2018 season, six Knights were taken in the MLB Draft. Thad Ward (5th, Boston Red Sox), JJ Montgomery (7th, Baltimore), Bryce Tucker (14th, San Francisco), Rylan Thomas (26th, Cincinnati Reds), Eric Hepple (27th, Colorado Rockies) and Cre Finrock (29th, Toronto Blue Jays) made it 10 draft picks during the Lovelady era.

In his first campaign with the Knights, Lovelady guided UCF to the American Athletic Conference regular-season title with an overall record of 40-22 and a 15-9 mark in league action, earning The American Coach of the Year honors in the process.

The Knights saw drastic improvements offensively and pitching in Lovelady's first year. UCF jumped up to 66th in the nation in scoring from 222nd in 2016, eighth in stolen bases up from 77th and 44th in runs from 189th. The pitching staff posted the fifth best ERA in the nation with a 3.0, compared to the 4.23 mark during the previous year. Pitchers took the team to 28th in strikeouts per nine innings, 24th in strikeouts-to-walks ratio and 10th in WHIP.

Lovelady oversaw four Knights selected in the 2017 MLB Draft, including Jason Bahr (5th Round, San Francisco Giants) and Robby Howell (10th Round, Cincinnati Reds).

Also in 2017, Lovelady coached Rylan Thomas (NCBWA, Perfect Game, Baseball America, DI

Baseball and College Baseball News) and Joseph Sheridan (College Baseball News and Perfect Game) to Freshman All-American honors. Senior Robby Howell was tabbed ABCA All-Region.

In his career, Lovelady has coached 38 MLB Draft picks between his three coaching stops, including 14 Top-10 round selections and nine tabbed in the first five rounds. Three players under Lovelady's tutelage have gone in the first round, including the fifth overall pick in 2005 and Milwaukee Brewers outfielder Ryan Braun.

Lovelady came to Orlando after spending three years as the head coach at Wright State, where he led the Raiders to consecutive runner-up finishes at NCAA Regionals in 2015 and 2016. As the Raiders' head coach, he has compiled a 124-56 record in three campaigns and was with the Raiders for a total of 12 years. Wright State has won the Horizon League Regular Season or Tournament Championship (or both) in each of Lovelady's three seasons at the helm. He was named the 2014 and 2016 Horizon League Coach of the Year, as well as the 2016 ABCA/Diamond Mideast Regional Coach of the Year.

Lovelady won a Wright State school record 46 games and its second straight Horizon League tournament title and reached his second straight NCAA Regional Final in Louisville, falling to the #2 ranked and host Cardinals 3-1. Along the way, WSU posted a 7-3 win over Ohio State.

Along with being named the Horizon League Coach of the Year for the second time, Lovelady was also selected as the ABCA/Diamond Mideast Regional Coach of the Year.

Eight Raiders were honored with Horizon League postseason awards, including the Freshman of the Year in Caleb Sampen, who was later named to the Louisville Slugger All-American Freshman Team. Senior Jesse Scholtens, who made history by pitching the first perfect game in WSU history at Dayton on March 11, was chosen First Team All-Horizon League and First Team ABCA/Rawlings All-Mideast Region while senior outfielder Ryan Fucci was also named First Team All-Horizon League and Third Team ABCA/Rawlings All-Mideast Region.

To cap the 2016 season, five Raiders were selected by the Major League Baseball Draft over a three-day period. Catcher Sean Murphy went to the Oakland A's in the third round followed by Scholtens to the San Diego Padres in the ninth round, shortstop Mitch Roman to the Chicago White Sox in the 12th round, pitcher Robby Sexton to the Boston Red Sox in the 14th round and Fucci to the Seattle Mariners in the 25th round.

In 2015, Lovelady guided the Raiders to new heights as Wright State won a then-record 43 games and advanced to the NCAA regional finals against host Illinois after beating Ohio and Notre Dame. 11 Raiders were honored by the Horizon League, including Andrew Elliott being named Relief Pitcher of the Year and Gabe Snyder selected as the Freshman of the Year. Elliott was later drafted by the Baltimore Orioles.

His first season at the helm paid dividends as he guided the Raiders to a 35-22, 25-4 record and the Horizon League regular-season title. 10 Raiders received postseason honors, including Lovelady, who was named the Horizon League Coach of the Year as his squad set a new record for wins in league play. In all, the Horizon League honored WSU with 10 Players of the Week throughout the season.

More honors came in after the season as Andrew Elliott was named Third Team All-American by ABCA as well as First Team All Mideast. Sean Murphy was chosen as a Freshman All-American by Louisville Slugger. Michael Timm received accolades as well, being named to the All-Mideast Second Team, CoSIDA District Academic All American and to the Horizon League Spring Academic Team. In June, Travis Hissong signed a contract with the New York Yankees.

Along with his success with the Raiders, Lovelady has also been involved with USA Baseball, including a lead role in the tryout phase for the 14U team that won a gold medal in Mexico in 2015 and for the 15U team in 2016.

Before being named head coach, Lovelady was on Rob Cooper's staff for nine seasons, the final seven as associate head coach. Lovelady served as the pitching coach and worked with the catchers while off the field, he was the recruiting coordinator for the program, helping WSU to NCAA Tournaments in 2006, 2009 and 2011.

During the 2012 campaign, career win #250 came for the duo of Cooper and Lovelady at UIC on April 22 in the form of a 4-3 decision. The Raiders also posted the program's second-longest winning streak ever as the Raiders reeled off 14 straight victories during March and April, outscored their opponents 185-67 in the process. Also, during that stretch, WSU took home the Joe Nuxhall Classic title for the first time. Two pitchers were honored with Horizon League honors as Michael Schum was selected as the Relief Pitcher of the Year and Jordan Marker was voted to the HL's second-team.

The 2011 season saw head coach Rob Cooper record his 200th coaching victory with an 8-2 decision at home over Youngstown State on March 26. That season also saw Jake Hibberd become his fourth Horizon League Player of the Year, Michael Schum pick up his second HL Relief Pitcher of the Year and Corey Davis named the second League Newcomer of the Year under Cooper and Lovelady.



Prior to the March 14, 2018 game against Miami at John Euliano Park, Lovelady held a special ceremony at home plate to honor his former skipper and longtime Hurricanes manager Jim Morris for his career accomplishments, contributions to the game and guidance during Lovelady's career.

Early-season wins over The Citadel and West Virginia helped catapult the Raiders to a sixth-straight 30-win season.

The 2010 season saw the Raiders win 30 or more games for the fifth straight year. Sophomore pitcher Casey Henn earn First Team All-Horizon League honors as he posted a 7-0 record with a league-leading 3.19 earned run average and 82 strikeouts in 84.2 innings while holding the opposition to a league-best .241 batting average. Senior pitcher Alex Kaminsky was named to the Second Team after winning five games with 88 strikeouts while senior catcher Gerald Ogrinc was selected to the First Team after throwing out 16 of 26 base stealers and recording five pickoffs to lead the league.

2009 saw freshman Michael Schum receive the Horizon League's Relief Pitcher of the Year award after leading the conference with a 1.95 ERA and 13 saves, striking out 57 in 74 innings. Schum was also named to the Second Team and the All-Newcomer Team.

In 2008, Lovelady led a pitching staff that saw Jon Durket earn First Team All-Horizon League honors. As a staff, Wright State ranked second in wins and led the Horizon League in Fewest Hits Allowed. Durket led the league in ERA and Alex Kaminsky led the league in wins and opponents batting average against.

In 2007, the Raiders boasted the most wins in the Horizon League (36) and held the second best team ERA. The Green and Gold boasted only the sixth pitcher in WSU history to win 10+ games in a season, Kyle Kearcher, and compiled the seventh highest win total in school history. The Green and Gold also set the school standard for league wins in a season with 21 victories.

In 2006, the Raiders pitching staff set a new school mark for pickoffs in a season (28) and came within 1/3 of an inning of breaking the school mark for innings pitched in a season. The Green and Gold own a team ERA of 5.14 over the past three seasons and have won 94 games in that span.

Lovelady has also started to shape his pitchers and catchers into major league form. Relief pitcher Joe Smith opted to leave WSU after a spectacular junior season and was taken with the 93rd overall pick in the 2006 Major League Baseball Draft by the New York Mets organization. Smith made his Major League debut on April 1, 2007, in St. Louis.

Lovelady went to WSU after a successful playing career and three-year stint with one of the nation's elite teams in Miami (FL). The Hurricanes won two national championships, in 1999 and 2001, with Lovelady as the catcher. A four-year letterman for the 'Canes, Lovelady captained the 2001 squad that won its second national championship in three years.

Lovelady hit a career best .314 with a 14-game hitting streak during his 1999 campaign. Lovelady was also a fan favorite in Coral Gables, receiving the Arnold Novins Award in 2001, an honor bestowed on the "Most Popular Player" as voted by the fans of Miami. The 'Canes made a postseason appearance during each of Lovelady's years as a player and coach in Coral Gables. UM Reached the College World Series five times and advanced to the NCAA super regional seven times while Lovelady was on campus.

Lovelady graduated from Miami in 2001 with a degree in Finance and a minor in Sports Management as a member of the university's deans list. Professionally, Lovelady played with the Utica Blue Sox, an affiliate of the Florida Marlins, and helped develop two UM catchers and numerous pitchers into major league draft choices.

Lovelady and his wife Lindsay have two sons, Noah Preston, who was born on December 16, 2008, and Gavin Philip, born on June 10, 2012

Ryan Klosterman is in his eighth season as a UCF assistant coach and his third season under UCF head coach Greg Lovelady. Klosterman serves as the Knights' hitting coach and recruiting coordinator. While at UCF, Klosterman has coached a total of 23 players that have been drafted, 3 of which have made it to the Major Leagues and 4 others have garnered the distinct honor of being named an All American.

In 2018, the Knights launched 42 home runs, led by Rylan Thomas' 13. Thomas set the single-season program record with a 47-game on-base and set the American Athletic Conference single-season and career on-base streak at 55 games. Combined with Tyler Osik's team-high 56 RBI, the Knights had two 50-RBI players for the first time since 2011. Klosterman also played a vital role when the Knights were on the base paths where they stole 109 bases in 2018, marking its first back-to-back seasons of 100-plus steals in a decade. Ray Alejo and Matthew Mika topped the league with 34 and 27 steals, respectively.

Much of the Knights' success was attributed to the 2018 signing class that was ranked 16th by Collegiate Baseball and 23rd by Baseball America.

In his first year under Lovelady in 2017, Klosterman took the Knights' offense to higher levels, finishing the year with .278 batting average, more than 20 points above the mark from 2016. UCF climbed up to 66th in the country in scoring with 6.3 runs per game and finished eighth in the country in stolen bases with a total of 106.

Rookie first baseman Rylan Thomas garnered Freshman All-American honors (College Baseball News, Perfect Game, Baseball America, DI Baseball) in 2017 as he finished the year ranked in the top-five in The American with a .343 batting average (4th), 13 homers (5th), a .447 on-base percentage (5th), 55 RBI (4th), and 6 sacrifice flies (4th).

During his first four campaigns as an assistant coach at UCF, Klosterman oversaw the Knights' infielders and team defense. In 2016, under former head coach Terry Rooney, he served as associate head coach adding the roles of recruiting coordinator and hitting coach to his duties. The UCF defense turned 59 double plays in 2016, which ranked 16th nationally and fourth in program history. Junior slugger Matt Diorio thrived under Klosterman's guidance and was selected in the 16th round of the MLB Draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

During the 2015 season the Knights rose to a program-best No. 6 national ranking by Baseball America. Klosterman helped mentor an offense anchored by American Athletic Conference First Team members Dylan Moore, Erik Barber and Tommy Williams and led the nation in a number of offensive categories through the first half of the season.

The Knights had a strong defense in 2014 that combined to post a .970 fielding pct. Moore (.990) and James Vasquez led the UCF infield, defensively. Both were named to The American All-Conference Second Team. Moore committed just three errors in 58 games, while tallying 101 putouts and 186 assists.

In 2013, Vasquez shined defensively under Klosterman's tutelage as he held a team-best .987 fielding percentage in 58 starts. Overall, the Knights recorded a .968 fielding percentage and turned 41 double plays. Third baseman Chris Taladay was selected C-USA Player of the Year after hitting .342 on with 43 RBIs.

In 2012, infielders D.J. Hicks, Travis Shreve, Darnell Sweeney and Chris Taladay all had strong campaigns leading the Knights to the championship final in the Coral Gables Regional. The Knights registered a .972 fielding percentage, the second-highest mark at UCF since 2001. Working with Hicks during his first full year at first base, Klosterman's guidance saw the All-C-USA First Teamer commit just two errors in 62 games while notching 537 putouts and 31 assists. Four Knights position players moved on to professional careers after the 2012 season; Darnell Sweeney was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 13th round, DJ Hicks was drafted by Minnesota in the 17th round, OF Ronnie Richardson was drafted by the Padres in the 18th round and Travis Shreve signed with an independent team.

Prior to his coaching days in Orlando, Klosterman was picked by the Toronto Blue Jays in the fifth round of the 2004 Major League Baseball Draft. He spent eight years playing minor league baseball, most recently at the Triple-A level for the New Orleans Zephyrs of the Florida Marlins Organization before retiring and coming to UCF.

Klosterman, a Central Florida native, was a standout infielder at South Lake High School before going on to a successful collegiate career as an infielder at both Clemson and Vanderbilt from 2001-04.

In his junior season with the Commodores, Klosterman was named to the All-SEC First Team as a shortstop, while also being voted as the team's Most Valuable Player and Defensive Player of the Year. That same year, Klosterman helped lead the Commodores to the NCAA Super Regional in Austin after batting .346 with 91 hits, 72 runs scored and eight triples. Klosterman's eight triples remain a Vanderbilt single-season record. In addition to his success on the field, Klosterman was also honored with a spot on the 2004 Verizon Academic All-District IV Second Team and was a member of the Dean/s List and the Student-Athlete Honor Roll.

Klosterman graduated from Vanderbilt in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in human and organizational development with an emphasis in leadership and organizational effectiveness.

He is married to the former Kaitlyn Arpin and currently reside in Orlando, Fla. with their daughter Kinsley Ann and son Cohen Ryan.

Nick Otte joined UCF Baseball in July of 2018. Otte will be responsible for overseeing the progress and development of the pitchers on the UCF staff.

Otte has guided 14 draft picks over his 15-year coaching career. In 2017, pitcher Zac Lowther became the highest draft pick in Xavier history as the 74th selection in Compensatory Round B.

Otte has five top-10 round draft picks to his credit. Otte arrived in Orlando after spending nine seasons on staff at Xavier, where he served as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator.

He was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2018 campaign. The Musketeers were three-time Big East champions and reached the NCAA Tournament 2014, 2016, 2017.

Under Otte's guidance, Xavier has posted six of the top-10 team ERA's in school history. The Musketeers have also had their two highest-ever draft picks, both pitchers, during Otte's time on staff.

In 2017, the XU pitching staff set a single season school record for strikeouts (461) as junior Zac Lowther posted one of the most dominant seasons by a starter in school history. The lefty, who was drafted 74th overall by the Baltimore Orioles, set XU's single season mark with 123 punchouts in 83.1 innings.

The 2012 pitching staff closed the season with a 3.87 ERA, third-best in program history. Otte's staffs have also set top-10 marks in 2013 (3.95), 2011 (4.25), 2014 (4.47), 2017 (4.50) and 2016 (4.57).

Otte has been instrumental in the success of several future professional pitchers at XU, including three MLB Draft selections off the 2017 roster: Zac Lowther (Comp. Round B, 74th Pick), Garrett Schilling (18th Rd.), Greg Jacknewitz (22nd Rd.)

Former XU pitchers Jacob Bodner (2015, 27th Rd.), Vinny Nittoli (2014, 25th Rd.), Seth Willoughby (2012, 4th Rd.) and Tommy Shirley (2010, 9th Rd.) have also been drafted during Otte's time with the program.

Prior to joining the Musketeers, Otte spent three seasons at Miami (Ohio). With the RedHawks, Otte was responsible for overseeing the progress and development of the outfielders. Additionally, he designed and implemented a year-long speed development program for the team, as well as a strength and power program for the pitching staff.

Otte spent his previous two years as the first assistant at Georgetown College, overseeing several aspects of the team. He served as the recruiting coordinator, strength and conditioning coordinator and pitching coach while also coordinating outfield play and base running. Otte coached the Mid-South Conference and Region IX Player of the Year and, in his second year, helped the team's ERA plummet from 5.23 to 4.13.

Otte also spent time at IPFW as the head assistant for two seasons while pursuing a master's degree. He served as the pitching coach, strength and conditioning coordinator and prepared advanced scouting reports.

During the summers of 2002 and 2004, Otte was a head coach and pitching instructor at IMG Academies in Bradenton, Fla.

A four-year letter winner at Indiana, Otte was a scholarship student-athlete on the mound for head coach Bob Morgan. Current Xavier head coach Scott Googins was an assistant at IU during three of Otte's four years as a player.

Upon his graduation, Otte ranked in the top 10 at IU for career wins (17) and single season wins (eight in '99 and '01). Otte graduated from Indiana in 2002 with a B.S. in public health education and a minor in human development and family studies.

He and his wife, Erin, reside in Orlando with their daughters, Anna and Paige.

Ted Tom was named an assistant coach for UCF in July of 2017. His duties include working with the outfielders and running Greg Lovelady Camps.

In his first campaign with UCF, Tom had to work with a brand new outfield. Regulars Tyler Osik and Ray Alejo flourished during their first year under Tom. Senior Max Wood stepped up over the final 19 games of the year, including a walk-off winner in the regular-season finale against Tulane.

Tom oversaw a pair of All-Conference selections. Alejo finished the year ranked fifth in the nation with 34 stolen bases. Osik led the team with 56 RBI, good for third in The American. Both players were tabbed to the conference's second team.

Prior to arriving in Orlando, Tom spent three seasons at fellow American Athletic Conference member Cincinnati. He joined the Bearcats as the director of baseball operations in 2015, covering the day to day operations, video and scouting for one season.

In 2016, Tom was promoted to assistant coach and remained in that role for his final two years at Cincinnati. He played an integral part in raising the UC team batting average by 16 points and taking the team scoring average up to five runs per game.

Tom joined UCF after seven seasons as the head coach at his alma mater Shawnee State University, where he compiled a record of 203-193.

In 2011, the Bears entered the Mid-South Conference and ended their first season in the new conference with a bang. After finishing the regular season as the 2nd place team in the Eastern Division, the Bears went undefeated in the conference tournament to advance to the NAIA Opening Round. This marked the Bears return to the National Tournament for the first time in 11 years.

The 2011 season was highlighted by the play of senior catcher Phillip Butler. Butler earned MSC Player of the Year honors while also earning 1stTeam All-MS-C as he led the conference in almost every offensive category including homeruns and RBI's. He was also named to the NAIA All-American 1stTeam becoming the first player in school history to not only make 1stTeam but also become a two-time All-American. Four players, including Butler, earned MSC All-Conference honors. Junior Cody Morrison earned 1stTeam All-MS-C while juniors Danny Gesick and Kendal Coleman made Honorable Mention. Josue Ahorrio, Aaron Suydam, AJ Gomez, and Jordan Stum each earned MSC Scholar Athlete awards.

The 2010 season marked the Bears final season in the American Midwest Conference and what a finale it became. The Bears became the first team in school history to win the Regular Season Championship which allowed them to host the conference tournament in the friendly confines of Branch Rickey Park. Tom earned AMC Coach of the Year honors for his team's performance. For only the second time in school history, the AMC Conference Player of the Year Award went to an SSU Bear. Sophomore outfielder Danny Gesick earned Player of the Year Honors as he led the conference in homeruns and runs batted in. Gesick and junior catcher, Phillip Butler each earned Honorable Mention All-American honors becoming two of only 12 other Bears to earn All-American Honors. Ten of Tom's players earned AMC All-Conference selections. Gesick, Butler, senior first baseman Brian Ramey, sophomore right hand pitcher Austin Dunfee, sophomore infielder Adam Wamsley each earned 1stTeam All-AMC. Junior right hand pitcher Andrew Carter and sophomore third baseman Nick Ball earned 2ndTeam Honors while sophomore outfielder Quentin Everman, junior designated hitter Ricky Masson, and sophomore infielder Jordan Maier each earned Honorable Mention awards. Wamsley was the AMC Gold Glove winner at shortstop. Ramey also became a two-time recipient of the NAIA Scholar Athlete award for his work in the classroom.

In 2009, he led the Baseball Bears to a 25-30 record and for the first time since 2003, a winning record (18-16) in the American Midwest Conference. Four of his players earned All-AMC honors and two more earned NAIA Scholar Athlete Awards including: senior outfielder Drew Howard (1stTeam), senior third baseman Logan Crabtree (2ndTeam), sophomore pitcher Andrew Carter (2ndTeam), junior first baseman Brian Ramey (2ndTeam) and NAIA Scholar Athlete) and junior catcher Mike Roelker (NAIA Scholar Athlete).

In Tom's first season, the Bears finished 16-29 with a 10-16 conference mark. Three of his players earned All-AMC honors including: Jon Venters (2ndTeam), Drew Howard (HM), and Zac Alexander (HM). Jeremy Blackston earned the honor of NAIA Scholar Athlete as well. Jon Venters

has gone on to sign a professional contract to play in the Can Am Independent League marking Tom's first Bear professional player.

Prior to Shawnee State, Tom spent 2007 as the outfield instructor at the IMG Baseball Academies in Bradenton, FL where he also was a head coach in Florida Collegiate Instructional League.

Ted spent the 2005 and 2006 seasons as the volunteer assistant coach at Indiana University. While there, his responsibilities included outfield play, coaching first base, and assisting with the hitters while also working on Sembower Field. During this time, he earned his master's degree in athletic administration.

Tom graduated from Shawnee State with a degree in Sport Management with minors in business and sport coaching in 2004 and having been a red-shirt member of the 2000 team that finished 5th in the NAIA World Series. As a player, Tom earned All-AMC honors as well as the Joe Smith Memorial Award which is given to the outstanding senior student that best exemplifies the attitude and sportsmanship of Smith. In the summer of 2003, he played for the Clarinda A's in the MINK Collegiate Wood Bat Summer League.

Tom also has extensive experience in summer baseball. In 2008, he was the mentor of the Southern Ohio Copperheads in the Great Lakes League. During 2006, he was the head coach of the Outer Banks Daredevils of the Coastal Plain League. He was the head coach of the Miami Valley Express U-17 team during 2002 that went to the CABA World Series.

Ted is married to the former Lisa Dingus of South Webster, Ohio. The couple have two children, Henry and Adaline Lee.

Drew Roberts joined UCF Baseball as the Director of Operations on August 18, 2016. Prior to arriving in Orlando, Roberts served as head coach for St. Andrews University from 2012–2016.

At the helm for St. Andrews, Roberts finished each of his four regular seasons above .500, posting an overall record of 107–99. Under his tutelage, 12 players received All-Conference Team awards including Conference Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year honors. Roberts also served as the recruiting coordinator for St. Andrews from 2010–2012.



2019 season preview

lovelady back for third season

- Head coach Greg Lovelady returns for his third season at UCF after narrowly missing out on a second consecutive NCAA Regional berth in 2018, ending up in the selection committee's "First Four Out."
- Lovelady has changed the culture quickly in Orlando, setting the program record for most wins by a first-year head coach and becoming the fastest coach to 75 victories in UCF history.
- After being named the top coach in the nation under 40, Lovelady enters his sixth year as a head coach with a 199-99 record.

power at the plate

- The Knights return the heart of the order, with the exception of All-Conference selection Rylan Thomas, who went in the 25th round of the MLB Draft to the Cincinnati Reds.
- Tyler Osik and Dallas Beaver will have to step up as the power producers this season. Osik led The American with 56 RBI during his first campaign in Orlando, while Beaver hit .284 as a sophomore with 30 RBI.
- The offense will also receive a major boost with the return of Anthony George after missing the 2018 campaign due to injury. He hit .294 over the course of 42 games as a sophomore in 2017.
- Griffin Bernardo is poised for a sophomore jump following an impressive fall and a solid summer with the Cincinnati Steam of the Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League.

willy, willy

- Redshirt senior Chris Williams will be the lone returner to the rotation in 2019. Last season, Williams was the only Knight to make a start in every weekend series.
- Williams started 15 games with a 4-3 record, a 2.81 ERA and a 1.64 walks per nine inning tally, which led The American. He also posted a 4.65 strikeout-to-walk ratio, good for third in the league.
- Williams was picked to the Preseason All-Conference Team by the coaches in The American.
- Due to an NCAA compliance issue regarding his time as a member of the UCF club baseball team as a freshman 2015, Williams will miss the first nine games of the season.

rotation roles

- While Williams is the only regular starter to return to the rotation, Lovelady will have no shortage of starting arms on the weekends and in the midweek.
- Jordan Spicer is back and poised for a bounce back campaign. After transitioning to the bullpen midway through 2018, the senior made nine appearances and had 15 strikeouts over 13 innings of work.
- Junior college transfer Trevor Holloway is set to be a regular feature in the weekend rotation. Holloway won a national championship with Chipola last season, where he went 8-4 over 13 starts.
- Grant Schuermann is another arm that could find a spot on the weekend or in a midweek starting role. The graduate transfer from Furman has made 35 starts in his career and totaled more than 225 innings of work.

speed on the paths

- One staple of a Greg Lovelady team is a constant threat to steal bases. The Knights ranked ninth in the nation with 109 stolen bases marking the first back-to-back 100-steal seasons since 2005.
- Ray Alejo and Matthew Mika finished fifth and 23rd, respectively, with 61 combined steals. The duo tied for the most combined steals by a tandem last season.
- Alejo was placed on The American Preseason All-Conference Team.
- Of the 109 steals that UCF had last year, the Black and Gold return 84 swipes.

building up the bullpen

- The Knights will have a mixed bullpen of experienced returners and newcomers.
- Jeffrey Hakanson and Garrett Westberg will vie for a one-two punch in the back end. Hakanson struck out 26 batters in 14.6 innings of work last season, and Westberg posted a 1.12 ERA in 24 innings with 31 strikeouts.
- A host of junior college transfers - Tom Cheshareck, Zack Helsel and Ryan Saltonstall - will look to make their mark out of the pen.

staying home

- The Knights are slated to host 35 games this season at John Euliano Park, marking the third straight season with at least 35 games at home.
- The Black and Gold will leave Orlando just once in the opening 20 games, a Feb. 27 trip to Florida.

adding to the park

- Prior to the season, the Knights unveiled a renovated locker room, made possible by the generous contributions of several baseball alumni, including Matt Rhodes '05.
- The \$140,000 project features new lockers, LED light fixtures, graphics on the baseboards and a UCF baseball light fixture in the middle of the room that houses LEDs synced for a light show.
- The Premium Club is also completed for its first full season, including bar service, air conditioning and 240 seats.

otte box

- When pitching coach Justin Parker departed for Indiana in July, Lovelady turned to a familiar foe that he had met during his time at Wright State in Xavier associate head coach Nick Otte.
- After a record setting career at Indiana from 1998 to 2002, Otte spent time on staff at IPFW, Georgetown College, and Miami (Ohio), before moving to Xavier in 2010.
- During nine seasons in Cincinnati, Otte guided the Musketeers to a trio of Big East titles and three NCAA Regional appearances.
- Otte brings a distinct coaching style that helps the pitching staff prepare and perform with a strong mentality. In addition to mentoring the hurlers to shake off any bad pitches, Otte utilizes footage and advanced analytics to help the pitching staff improve.

special knights

- John Euliano Park will be the place to be this spring, as the Knights will not only have some of the most exciting collegiate baseball in the nation, but several fun promotions for the entire season.
- UCF will host Wrestling Knight on March 29, paying homage to Central Florida's close ties to professional wrestling.
- The Black and Gold will sport special Citronaut hats on April 5 for Citronaut Knight.
- UCF will thank the local suburbs for their support with Orlando's Hometown Team Games: Oviedo (March 2), Downtown Orlando (March 3), Winter Park (March 15), Baldwin Park (March 16), Avalon Park (March 30), and Winter Springs (April 27).

2018 Review

2018 season review

leading off

- UCF posted its 22nd season with at least 35 wins.
- Greg Lovelady became the fastest coach to 75 wins in program history. He finished the season with 199 career wins.
- The Knights' 13-game winning streak tied for the fifth longest in school history.
- Lovelady has brought discipline to the plate with 258 walks this season, the most since 2005's 301.

so close but not enough

- UCF nearly punched its ticket to an NCAA Regional for the second straight year, but came up short of a tournament berth as the selection committee's "First Four Out", along with Kentucky, Illinois and Oklahoma State.
- The Black and Gold found success to start the weekend, going 12-1 on Fridays, but the Knights were 5-7 on Sunday afternoon games, with a 9-4 record in weekend series.

all-conference connections

- The Knights put six players on all-conference squads.
- Thad Ward was a first team reliever with a 2.88 ERA and a team-high 52 strikeouts in 40.2 innings of relief this season.
- Rylan Thomas also garnered first team honors after leading the lead in RBI and ranking in the top-five in walks, batting average, hits, home runs, on-base percentage, runs, sacrifice flies and total bases.
- Speedsters Matthew Mika and Ray Alejo were placed on the second team, as well as Dallas Beaver and Tyler Osik.
- Thomas and Mika were selected for the second time in their careers, while Ward, Beaver, Alejo and Osik were first timers.

rocking against ranked opponents

- The Knights stepped up their game when they faced a ranked opponent with a 6-4 record against teams in the top 25.
- On March 6, UCF beat No. 1 Florida 9-7 at John Euliano Park to mark the first time in program history the Black and Gold knocked off the top-ranked team in the country. The Knights matched their historic feat the next night with a 4-2 win over the Gators in Gainesville.
- In addition to the historic wins against Florida, UCF started the season with a 6-3 victory over No. 15 Virginia, which was the first win over a ranked opponent on Opening Night in program history.

stealing all over the place

- UCF finished the year with 109 steals, marking the first back-to-back 100-steal seasons since 2004 and 2005.
- Ray Alejo and Matthew Mika led the American with 34 and 27 swipes, respectively. They're the second most steal-happy duo in the nation, one behind Jake MacKenzie and Billy Godrick from Fordham
- The Knights stole home three times this season, led by Alejo with two.
- Alejo ranked eighth for steals in a single season, four back of Tim Foskett ('81) for seventh. Tim Baker's record is 104 in 1985.

pitching prowess

- The UCF pitching staff posted a 3.32 ERA, the eighth sub-3.50 ERA season in school history.
- Pitchers struck out 556 batters, good for second in program history behind 2001's 597.
- Redshirt junior Chris Williams was the only starter to feature in every weekend series, finishing with a 4-3 record and a 2.81 ERA.
- The Knights set a new program record with 7.1 hits allowed per nine innings, and gave up the third fewest hits at 405.

the streak

- The Knights won 13 straight games in late February and early March.
- The 13 games tied (1998) for the fifth longest streak in program history. 1995's 29-game streak is the record.
- UCF outscored opponents 91-38 during the streak.
- The pitching staff posted a 2.38 ERA with 147 strikeouts.

heading to the draft

- UCF sent six players to the MLB Draft, including five pitchers, the team's most since 2002.
- Thad Ward was picked in the fifth round by the Boston Red Sox and JJ Montgomery went in the seventh round to the Baltimore Orioles.
- On the final day of the draft four more Knights were picked: Bryce Tucker (San Francisco, 11th), Rylan Thomas (Cincinnati, 25th), Eric Hepple (Colorado, 27th) and Cre Finrock (Toronto, 29th).

UCF calls one of the nation's finest college baseball stadiums home in John Euliano Park.

Renamed for John Euliano, the UCF Foundation Board of Directors Vice Chair and a generous friend to the program, for the 2018 season, the ball park accommodates 3,841 fans thanks to major enhancements of the home plate tower.

With the ever-increasing arms race in college athletics, leadership at UCF knew that Knights Baseball was overdue for a much-needed upgrade.

In February of 2016, UCF Vice President and Director of Athletics Danny White, along with head baseball coach Greg Lovelady, announced that change was coming on a Facebook Live video. The pair were elated to bring news that John Euliano, a special friend to UCF Athletics and Vice Chair of the UCF Foundation Board of Directors, had donated \$1.8 million to create a new Home Plate Tower.

The structure will feature a 241-seat premium club will include outdoor seating and indoor amenities, such as an air-conditioned lounge, food and beverage service, private restrooms and a dedicated entrance to the space. The tower will also feature a second-level press box and a large roof line that will provide shade to the concourse and many of the lower level seats behind home plate.

In 2012, UCF completed construction of a second level above the first base line and bench-back bleachers along the first-base line past the home dugout. The playing surface itself is as finely manicured as any in the country, once being dubbed in the media as the South's version of (Stanford's) Sunken Diamond.

With wide open concourses and palm trees lining the concession area, fans have an ideal opportunity to get close to the action in one of the best settings in college baseball. A new scoreboard was added in 2008 and features a 38' by 32.5' display with a pitch-speed area and a 22' by 11' 20mm full color LED video board.

The overall facility includes offices for the UCF baseball coaching staff and a reception area.

Prior to the recent updates, conference and meeting space was remodeled during the 2007 season, transforming into the UCF Tradition Room. This area offers a luxurious spot to relax, watch game film on a flat-screen television or focus on classwork. The walls, meanwhile, feature former members of the team that have set the standard for excellence with the Knights, such as players who have received All-American accolades Plaques that honor UCF's NCAA teams don the walls of the Tradition Room as well.

UCF players enjoy a spacious locker room with tall wooden lockers while the coaching staff has its own separate locker room. The facility also includes a weight room, training room and equipment room with complete laundry facilities. Attached to the players' locker room is an impressive indoor facility that features three batting cages and two pitching mounds. The spacious practice area gives UCF the advantage to practice in all weather elements, all year long.

new year, new renovations



As the UCF baseball team returned from winter break, head coach Greg Lovelady had a special surprise waiting for the team when the Knights gathered for their first team meeting of the year – an upgraded locker room.

"Anytime you upgrade facilities it's a huge plus for the program," Lovelady said. "The excitement it brings added to the newness makes it an awesome experience. It's just a vital space for our players. It's the spot where the camaraderie and brotherhood develop in our program. Having a place like this gives the players a place where they want to hang out more, so they're at the field more."

The locker room now features an exposed ceiling and new LED light fixtures to create a much more open space. Every locker was repainted and refinished and received a new UCF branded seat. Each locker will have graphics at its base and at the top, along with a customizable area behind the name plate. The shower room also received new water fixtures and new tile. The athletic training room received a new coat of paint, and the entire building had new carpet put in.

Perhaps the most thrilling addition to the locker room is the six-foot wide structure hanging in the middle with a UCF logo emblazoned on it. Already a dramatic upgrade from the old gold and wood look, the locker room takes a step into the 21st century with an LED light show on the center logo and with fixtures at the base of the lockers that run the entire color spectrum, complete with a multitude of settings.

The entire project was funded through generous donations from UCF supporters that covered the \$140,000 price tag.

"It feels like every week something new is being built," Lovelady added. "It starts with the fantastic leadership from Danny White and his staff. The players are excited. We're incredibly grateful to everyone who stepped up and helped make this project a reality. This is something that will truly enhance our program. I'm also thankful for Matt Rhodes and his company, not just for the financial component of his donation, but the work that they were able to do in such a short amount of time."

The locker room, which had largely gone untouched since the baseball building's completion more than a decade ago, received some much-needed renovations. Alumnus Matt Rhodes, who played two seasons for the Knights in 2004 and 2005 with 46 strikeouts over 41 innings of work, and his organization Rhodes Building Company provided the manpower to complete the renovation, along with a sizeable gift.

"I think that you'll start to see more proud alumni like me back on campus as this athletic department continues to build momentum," Rhodes said. "Danny White and his staff have done a great job of putting proven winners like Greg in charge of programs. I felt like it was a great time to make a contribution and that our company had the right skill set to help make this a reality. Anyone who played here understands how this athletic department continues to grow. We have a lot of national notoriety over the last few years. I would encourage alumni to get back on campus. It doesn't just mean giving money. Come out and support the teams and the student-athletes, because UCF is going to big places."

Dale Whittaker became the University of Central Florida's fifth president on July 1, 2018. He was unanimously confirmed by the Florida Board of Governors in March after the UCF Board of Trustees selected him following a nationwide search.

Whittaker came to UCF in August 2014 to serve as its provost and vice president for Academic Affairs, providing leadership to UCF's 13 colleges, multiple campuses and research centers and institutes. He also oversaw academic support services and was responsible for curriculum, academic planning, faculty appointments, faculty development and promotion and tenure decisions.

He was promoted to provost and executive vice president in 2015.

Since arriving at UCF, he has helped recruit and hire more than 200 new faculty members, launched an interdisciplinary teaching and research faculty cluster initiative, led the creation of a downtown campus, elevated UCF's digital learning efforts to improve student success and embarked on a 20-year strategic planning process.

Also under Whittaker's tenure, UCF began its path to preeminence, designated an "emerging preeminent" institution by the state in 2016. In addition to being the state's largest university, UCF also is one of its highest performing — landing in the top three in the state for the first four years that performance-based funding was awarded.

As president, Whittaker will focus on developing the best talent and creating deeper and wider partnerships across and beyond the university.

Whittaker also is committed to giving students equal opportunities through education; he and UCF President John C. Hitt previously worked together on the University Innovation Alliance, a coalition of 11 prestigious research universities seeking to expand students' access to higher education. Institutions joining UCF in the coalition include Purdue, Arizona State, Michigan State and Ohio State universities.



"I'm deeply committed to lifting lives and livelihoods through knowledge," Whittaker says. "Our core mission as a university is knowledge, and the impact is advancing people's lives economically and socially for generations."

Danny White was named Vice President and Director of Athletics at UCF on Nov. 18, 2015. He began his tenure at UCF Dec. 14, 2015.

Under his leadership, the Knights have seen great success in competition, in the classroom and in the community.

UCF's football program went from winless in 2015 to six victories and a bowl game appearance in 2016. The Knights improved even more in 2017, finishing the season as the only undefeated team in the nation and claiming a national championship. The Knights finished 13-0 in the 2017 season, capping the incredible year with a 34-27 victory over Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

Both the UCF men's and women's basketball teams completed stunning turnarounds under head coaches White hired shortly after his arrival at UCF. Johnny Dawkins and Katie Abrahamson-Henderson both led their teams to 20-win seasons and the best American Athletic Conference finish in both programs' history. Abrahamson-Henderson followed that with another improvement in conference finish and the first-ever back-to-back postseason berths in program history. The UCF Baseball program also turned in a stellar 2017 season, winning the American Athletic Conference regular season title and advancing to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2012 under another White hire – Greg Lovelady.

White was named one of Sports Business Journal's 40 Under 40 award winners in both 2017 and 2018. White was also recognized by the Orlando Business Journal on its 40 Under 40 list for the Central Florida area's top professionals under the age of 40 who have made significant achievements in their careers. He was also named to the 2017 50 Most Powerful People in Orlando by Orlando Magazine. In the Spring of 2018, White was named a finalist for the Sports Business Journal's Athletics Director of the Year honor.

White oversees an athletics department that has boasted a semester grade-point average of 3.0 or better since 2008. The Knights also boast the top NCAA Graduation Success Rate of any public university playing at the Football Bowl Subdivision.

In his first 15 months on the job, White saw numerous game-changing gift commitments made to UCF Athletics. In February of 2017, Ken Dixon committed more than \$5 million to UCF Athletics. It was the largest cash pledge ever to UCF by an alumnus. In recognition of his gift, UCF has named the 95-acre area that houses most of UCF's Athletics Facilities the Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village. White was also instrumental in a \$1.5 million gift commitment from John Euliano that will help fund a renovation of the UCF Baseball Complex, which will be known as John Euliano Park after its completion. Bob Garvy also committed \$1 million toward the development of the Garvy Center for Student-Athlete Nutrition. The Knights also recently broke ground of the Roth Athletics Center, which will house the UCF administration and will include an expansion for football operations.

In addition, White established the UCF Football Excellence Fund in 2017. That initiative has raised more than \$5 million in commitments pledged over five years in an effort to sustain and continue to improve upon the success of the Knights' program.

Other highlights in White's first year at UCF also include the athletic department bringing its multimedia rights and corporate partnerships in house and an extended and improved apparel and shoe agreement with Nike.

White was regarded as one of the nation's most talented young athletic directors when he came to UCF from the State University of New York at Buffalo, where he served as Director of Athletics from May 2012 through December 2015. He brought a strong record of success in competition and in the classroom to UCF.

White, a former college basketball player and New Orleans native, has quickly ascended in the ranks of college athletics leadership. Prior to his role as AD at Buffalo, White was senior associate athletics director at the University of Mississippi from 2009-12. He previously served as associate athletics director for development at California State University – Fresno and assistant athletics director for development at Northern Illinois University from 2006-07.

He played college basketball at Towson University and the University of Notre Dame and was director of operations and assistant coach for one season each with Ohio University's men's basketball team.

During his tenure in Buffalo, White worked with athletics administrators, coaches, and staff to transform the Bulls' program and culture, shattering previous school records for student-athlete GPAs, NCAA tournament berths, fundraising, and football ticket sales.

During White's three years at Buffalo, he, his colleagues and the Bulls' student-athletes raised the program's profile in the community and nationally. Their achievements include:

Buffalo teams, including men's basketball, earned three NCAA tournament bids in 2014-15, compared with just one in the prior 15 years. UB student-athletes have recorded an average GPA of at least 3.0 for seven consecutive semesters. Prior to White's arrival, the average GPA had never exceed 3.0 in any semester.

Financial support for UB athletics has reached an all-time high, with the number of donors increasing by 137 percent since the start of a membership campaign in 2013.

UB shattered its football attendance records in 2013 after adding interactive opportunities for fans, including a tailgate concert series with nationally known artists.

The state's largest public university and the flagship of the SUNY system, UB for the first time adopted a radio network that spanned the entire state. White is a 2002 graduate of Notre Dame with a bachelor's degree in business administration. He earned master's degrees in both business administration and sports administration from Ohio University. He completed a doctorate degree in higher education from the University of Mississippi in 2016.

White comes from a family deeply involved in intercollegiate athletics. His father, Kevin, is director of athletics at Duke University. His brother, Michael, is the head men's basketball coach at the University of Florida. His brother, Brian, is the senior associate athletics director for development at the University of Missouri.

Danny and his wife, Shawn, have four children: Aidan, Molly, Caitlin and James.





the american athletic conference

The American Athletic Conference consists of 13 prestigious institutions: the University of Central Florida, the University of Cincinnati, East Carolina University, the University of Connecticut, the University of Houston, the University of Memphis, the U.S. Naval Academy (in football only), the University of South Florida Southern Methodist University, Temple University, Tulane University, the University of Tulsa, and Wichita State University (in basketball and Olympic sports).

Under the leadership of commissioner Mike Aresco, the American Athletic Conference has an impressive list of accomplishments, both in the competitive arena and the classroom. The American has taken its place at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics, with a collection of national team and individual championships and football and men's and women's basketball postseason victories that place The American among the elite Division I FBS conferences.

The league has produced four NCAA championship teams – UConn men's basketball in 2014 and UConn women's basketball in 2014, 2015 and 2016 – in addition to three New Year's Six bowl champions (UCF in 2013 and 2017; Houston in 2015), 11 NCAA individual championships, and a Rhodes Scholar. Additionally, American Athletic Conference teams have advanced to the College World Series, reached the semifinal and final rounds of the NIT, qualified for the match play round of the NCAA Men's Golf Championship and registered top-10 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country and Outdoor Track and Field championships.

The American Athletic Conference was one of six finalists for the 2016 Sports Business Journal Sports League of the Year award, along with Major League Baseball, Major League Soccer, NASCAR, the National Basketball Association and the PGA Tour.


The 2017 football season saw The American enjoy unprecedented success as UCF finished as the only undefeated team in the nation, and the first in the last four college football seasons, capping a 13-0 campaign with a win against Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. UCF ended the year as the No. 1-ranked team in the Colley Matrix and was ranked No. 6 in the final Associated Press poll, marking the best final ranking for a team from The American in the league's brief history. UCF's finish in the AP poll gave teams from The American three top-10 finishes in the last five end-of-the-year polls.

Additionally, seven teams from The American played in bowl games last season as the league went 3-1 against other Power 6 conferences in the postseason. UCF and Memphis finished No. 12 and No. 20, respectively, in the final College Football Playoff rankings, giving The American three straight seasons with multiple teams in the final ranking. UCF, Memphis and USF were all ranked in the final AP top-25 poll of the season. The American is one of only three conferences (along with the Big Ten and the Big 12) that has had at least three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons.

The American has had a combined 22 teams play in bowl games in the last three seasons, highlighted by UCF's win against Auburn last year and Houston's win against Florida State in the 2015 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Additionally, Navy and Temple have both finished in the top 25 of either the CFP, Associated Press or USA Today polls as members of The American.

Individual teams in The American have enjoyed some of their best seasons in program history as members of the conference. UCF has finished in the national top 10 twice in five seasons as a conference member – in 2013 and 2017. Houston went 13-1 in the 2015 football season, setting a school record for wins, while Navy won a program-record 11 games in its first season in the conference, also in 2015. Memphis, which had not won 10 games in a season since 1938, has registered two 10-win seasons in the last four years (2015, 2017), while Temple enjoyed its first 10-win season in school history in 2015. USF has gone 21-4 in the last two seasons and has finished the year in the top 25 for the first two times in program history.

Beyond the gridiron, The American has sent a combined seven teams to the last two NCAA Men's Basketball Championships. Since the conference's reconstitution in 2013-14, teams from The American have registered top-10 national rankings in football, men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball, men's soccer, men's golf, and men's track and field. Student-athletes from The American won five NCAA individual titles in track and field in 2017-18 as Houston's Elijah Hall won the indoor 60- and 200-meter races, while the Cougars' Cameron Burrell won the outdoor title in the 100-meter dash.



Houston also repeated as the national champion in the 4x100-meter relay, while Memphis' Luke Vaughn won NCAA gold in the discus throw.

Under The American's banner, the UConn women's basketball team won its NCAA-record ninth, 10th and 11th national championships and broke its own NCAA record with a 111-game winning streak that spanned three seasons. The American sent four baseball teams to the NCAA Championship in 2018. Houston's men's track and field team took third place at the 2018 NCAA Outdoor Championships. Tulsa placed sixth at the 2016 NCAA Men's Cross Country Championship, while USF finished the 2014-15 season at No. 8 in the final men's golf national ranking.

American Athletic Conference student-athletes have distinguished themselves in all facets of intercollegiate athletics. Temple linebacker Tyler Matakevich won the Bednarik Award and the Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player in 2015, while Navy quarterback Keenan Reynolds finished fifth in the Heisman Trophy voting. More recently, Houston's Ed Oliver won the 2017 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman, while UCF quarterback McKenzie Milton was eighth in the 2017 Heisman balloting. UConn basketball standout Breanna Stewart finished her career in 2016 as the most decorated player in college basketball history as she was chosen as the consensus national player

of the year for the third time and became the first player to be named four times as the Most Outstanding Player at the Final Four. Reynolds and Stewart were selected as the winners of the 2016 AAU James E. Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athletes, marking only the second time in the 86-year history of the award that multiple winners were chosen.

Additionally, SMU's Avery Acker was chosen as the Division I women's volleyball Academic All-America of the Year in 2015, while Tulsa cross country standout Kirk Smith was chosen as a Rhodes Scholar in the fall of 2016. The conference has had a record 31 student-athletes earn Google Cloud CoSIDA Academic All-America accolades in the last two seasons.

American Athletic Conference alumni have made their mark in professional sports as well, beginning with the selection of UCF quarterback Blake Bortles by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the No. 3 pick in the 2014 NFL Draft. The American has produced six student-athletes who have won Super Bowl titles, including three members of the 2017 champion Philadelphia Eagles. A number of American Athletic Conference athletes have been selected in the first round of the professional entry drafts in football, basketball, baseball and soccer. The American had a record 18 total selections in the 2018 NFL Draft.

The American Athletic Conference holds media rights partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports, which provide the conference with outstanding national exposure on the two industry leaders in sports television. The football portion of the contract calls for nearly 90 percent of conference-controlled games on national broadcast or national cable platforms. The first three American Athletic Conference Football Championships were televised by ABC as part of Championship Saturday. The American has had a combined 41 regular-season football games with more than one million viewers in the last three seasons. The 2017 game between UCF and USF, cited by numerous outlets as the best game of the regular season, attracted 4.7 million viewers – a record for a game between two American Athletic Conference teams.

In men's basketball, the television contract calls for all conference-controlled games to be televised, with more than 63 percent slotted for national broadcast or national cable – a minimum of 107 games. The entire postseason tournament is televised, including the championship game, which is on ABC or ESPN (except for the 2018 season, when the semifinals and final were on CBS). Sixty percent of the American's women's basketball games are carried on national cable, regional sports networks or ESPN3.

American Athletic Conference teams have access to the pinnacle of college football's postseason structure. An American representative would be chosen for the College Football Playoff semifinals if it is among the top four teams in the CFP selection committee's final ranking. Otherwise, the league would place its champion in a New Year's Bowl if it is ranked higher than the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference and the Sun Belt Conference. Additionally, The American holds primary or secondary partnerships with 12 bowls for the current six-year cycle, ensuring multiple annual matchups against the nation's top conferences and providing desirable postseason destinations to member institutions.
