UCFACTS

• The future of college football is at UCF with new head coach Gus Malzahn taking over in Orlando on Feb. 15, 2021. Malzahn previously led Auburn to the BCS National Championship Game in 2013, eight straight years of bowl game appearances with the Tigers, an SEC Championship, two SEC West Division titles, and six New Year's Day bowl selections. He was the National Coach of the Year in 2013.

• Since the start of the 2017 season, UCF has accumulated a record of 43-8. The Knights went 13-0 in 2017, 12-1 in 2018, 10-3 in 2019, 6-4 in 2020, and have started the 2021 campaign 2-0 under Malzahn. UCF's 43 wins in its last 51 games trails only Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State and Notre Dame nationally for the most victories in a program's last 51 contests.

• Having started the program in 1979 and only having been playing at the FBS level since 1996, UCF became the youngest program by 35 years to win a New Year's Six/BCS bowl game when the Knights defeated Baylor in the 2014 Fiesta Bowl. UCF is one of just 16 programs to have appeared in three New Year's Six/BCS bowl games since 2013 and one of only 13 to have won two such games in that span.

• Dillon Gabriel came into the 2021 season as one of the top returning quarterbacks in the nation, having led the country in passing yards per game last year. His 357.0 passing yards per game also set a UCF record. He has started the season averaging 315.0 passing yards per game and ranks in the top 10 in the nation in passing touchdowns, points responsible for, and total offense. Gabriel was on the watch list for every national quarterback and offensive player of the year award heading into the 2021 campaign.

• UCF had a program record five players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft (Richie Grant, 2nd Round; Aaron Robinson, 3rd Round; Jacob Harris, 4th Round; Tay Gowan, 6th Round; Tre Nixon, 7th Round). It was more than all other AAC teams, 80% of all Big-12 teams, 79% of all Big Ten teams, 79% of ACC teams, 75% of Pac-12 teams and 57% of SEC teams. The Knights have had nine top 100 picks since 2014 and had 24 former players on NFL rosters during the 2021 preseason.

• The UCF football team announced its captains for the 2021 season prior to the start of the campaign, electing four Knights to leadership roles as voted on by their peers. The four captains are senior defensive end Big Kat Bryant, junior quarterback Dillon Gabriel, senior offensive lineman Samuel Jackson and senior wide receiver Brandon Johnson.

The Knights and Cardinals have only met twice in the all-time series, a Louisville win way back in 1985 and UCF's historic victory at Cardinal Stadium in 2013 that propelled the Knights to their first BCS bowl appearance and win, ultimately leading to UCF's first top 10 finish in the polls.

UCF won that game in 2013 by a score of 38-35 thanks to 250 yards and two touchdowns from Blake Bortles as well as two scores on the ground by William Stanback and 109 rushing yards and a score from Storm Johnson.

Teddy Bridgewater had 341 yards and two scores for the then 8th-ranked Cardinals in the defeat.

• The Cards opened up the 2021 season with a neutral site loss to Ole Miss, falling 43-24 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta on Monday night of week one action. This past Saturday Louisville defeated visiting Eastern Kentucky 30-3.

• Quarterback Malik Cunningham has completed 61.7 percent of his passes for 468 yards and two touchdowns to go with four rushing scores through the first two games.

• Kenderick Dunca is the Cards' top tackler so far in 2021, making 15 total stops including 14 unassisted tackles.

LAST TIME OUT

The UCF football team raced out to 42-7 lead over visiting Bethune-Cookman and never looked back Saturday night at the Bounce House, defeating the Wildcats 63-14 to improve to 2-0 on the season. It was the most points the Knights have scored since putting up 63 against Temple on Oct. 26, 2019.

UCF (2-0) chose to receive and scored on its first drive as senior running back Isaiah Bowser scored his first of four first-half touchdowns from 17 yards out to give the Knights the early lead. Bethune-Cookman (0-2) countered with a score of their own on the ensuing drive to tie the game at 7-7 midway through the first quarter.

The Knights then scored five consecutive touchdowns to take a commanding 42-7 lead into halftime and put the game away. Junior quarterback Dillon Gabriel found senior receiver Brandon Johnson for a 22-yard touchdown late in the first quarter before Bowser put three away with a pair of 1-yard scores and a 9-yard touchdown run to match the UCF record for rushing touchdowns in a game.

Gabriel rushed for a touchdown of his own early in the third period - the longest rush of his career, a 44-yard jaunt that included running from the left sideline to the right sideline before finding the end zone - and then found Trillion Coles in the end zone for a score before giving way to backups in the rout of the Wildcats.



TEAM NOTES

AWESOME ACADEMICS

- This past spring, UCF Athletics extended its streak to 27 consecutive semesters with a department average GPA of 3.0 or better and it marked the ninth straight semester of a 3.2 or better as a department.
- The UCF football team put 49 student-athletes on the AAC All-Academic Team this past spring.
- A total of 37 football student-athletes earned Dean's List honors over the course of the 2020-21 school year, with Derek Gainous, Anthony Montalvo and Alex Swenson earning the accolades both semesters.
- Gainous, a senior safety for the Knights, also received CoSIDA Academic All-District honors this past year.

KNIGHTS IN THE NFL

- The UCF football team set a program record this spring when five Knights were selected in the 2021 NFL Draft, topping the previous best of four, attained both in 2003 and 2018.
- Safety Richie Grant went to the Falcons in the second round, cornerback Aaron Robinson was picked by the Giants in the third round, wide receiver/tight end Jacob Harris was snagged by the Rams in the fourth round, cornerback Tay Gowan went to the Cardinals in the sixth round, and wide receiver Tre Nixon was picked by the Patriots in the seventh round.
- In all, UCF totaled more NFL Draft picks in 2021 than all other American Athletic Conference teams, 80 % of all Big 12 teams, 79 % of all Big Ten teams, 79% of all ACC teams, 75 % of all Pac-12 teams, and 57% of all SEC teams.

NATIONAL EXPOSURE

- UCF ranks among the FBS leaders in major network national television appearances by its football team over the last three seasons (ABC, CBS, FOX, NBC, ESPN, ESPN2).
- In 2018, 2019 and 2020, the Knights appeared 26 times on either ABC, ESPN or ESPN2, ranking ninth nationally in that category.
- The Knights are appearing on ESPN for the second time in their first three games of the 2021 season.

BOWLS, BCS AND NEW YEAR'S SIX

- The Knights appeared in their fifth straight bowl game in 2020 (Roofclaim.com Boca Raton Bowl vs. BYU), extending the program record for most consecutive bowl game appearances. UCF played in the Cure Bowl in 2016, the Peach Bowl in 2017, the Fiesta Bowl in 2018 and the Gasparilla Bowl in 2019.
- The 2020 Boca Raton Bowl marked UCF's eighth bowl appearance in the last nine seasons and the Knights' 12th in the past 16 years.
- Since the 2013 season, UCF has appeared in three BCS/New Year's Six bowl games and won two (2014 Fiesta Bowl, 2018 Peach Bowl).
- The Knights are one of only 16 FBS programs in the nation to appear in three such games during that span and one of only 13 teams to win two games during that time.
- UCF is the only current non-"Power 5" team to appear on either list.

BIG 12 CONFERENCE

- The University of Central Florida accepted an invitation to join the Big 12 Conference, as announced by Big 12 commissioner Bob Bowlsby, UCF director of athletics Terry Mohajir, and UCF President Alex Cartwright on Friday, Sept. 10.
- The Knights athletics program has now moved from Division III, Division II, the FCS level, the FBS level that included time in the MAC, Conference USA, the AAC, and now to the Big 12 Conference.
- Mohajir: *"This is a landmark day for anyone ever associated with UCF or UCF Athletics. As we anticipate a future move to the Big 12 Conference, we first owe a vote of thanks to all those at UCF who have gone before us. There's a long list of student-athletes, coaches, athletics directors, university presidents and support staff, fans and donors and, of course, our student body, plus so many others whose hard work and successes have helped pave the way for today's announcement. The bases were already loaded, and I feel very blessed and honored to get to step up to the plate on behalf of UCF."*

FUTURE FOOTBALL CAMPUS VISION

- On August 19, new UCF director of athletics Terry Mohajir announced his planned vision for UCF Athletics' football campus at the Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village.
- UCF's previously announced McNamara Cove that will include a recovery river for student-athletes and "Covegating" experiences for fans on game days is part of the plan.
- Also announced was the Launch Club, a new structure on the south side of the stadium located above the Garvy Center for Nutrition, featuring coaches' offices combined with premium seating areas.
- The north end zone will feature additional seating and standing-room only decks for expansion of the Knightmare Student Section.

OFFENSE NOTES

PRETTY DARN OFFENSIVE

- UCF has ranked in the top eight nationally in both total offense and scoring each of the last three seasons, the only team in the country to accomplish that.
- The Knights scored 30 or more points in 31 straight games from Aug. 31, 2017 to Sept. 28, 2019, which set a record for the longest streak in the Associated Press Poll era (since 1936).
- After putting up 63 against Bethune-Cookman last week, UCF has now scored 30 or more points in 47 of its last 50 outings.
- UCF has scored 40 or more points in 30 of its last 50 games and has reached the 50-point plateau 16 times in the last 50 outings.
- Last season, the Knights ranked second in the nation in total offense for the second straight year, averaging 568.1 yards per game, an all-time UCF and American Athletic Conference high.
- UCF also ranked fourth in passing, seventh in first downs and eighth in scoring, averaging 42.2 points per game in 2020.
- The Knights haven't been any different under head coach Gus Malzahn in their first two games of 2021, ranking sixth in the nation in scoring offense at 49.5 points per game and second in total offense with 622.0 yards of total offense per game.

GABRIEL'S GOT IT

- Dillon Gabriel has already made his name as one of the top quarterbacks in the nation and came into the 2021 season as a PFF preseason honorable mention All-American and a watch list honoree for every national quarterback and player of the year award.
- In 2020 he threw for 3,570 yards and 32 passing touchdowns with only four interceptions in just a 10-game season.
- He earned second-team all-conference accolades from the AAC and led the nation with 357.0 passing yards per game.
- Gabriel's 32 passing touchdowns ranked fourth in the nation and were the second most in a single season in UCF history.
- As a sophomore he threw for 400 or more yards in four games in 2020, which was more than any other Knight has done in an entire career.
- Gabriel hasn't missed a step through two games of the 2021 season, ranking seventh in the nation with six passing touchdowns, fifth with 21.0 points responsible for per game, and fifth with 368.5 yards of total offense per game.

BOWSER BEAST MODE

- The UCF rushing attack looks a lot different in 2021, as the Knights had to replace their top three running backs from a season ago in Greg McCrae, Otis Anderson and Bentavious Thompson.
- The most experienced back in the room is graduate transfer Isaiah Bowser, who totaled 334 carries for 1,300 yards and seven touchdowns with Northwestern the last three seasons.
- In his first game as a Knight, Bowser rushed 33 times for a career-high 172 yards and a touchdown. In week two, he scored four rushing touchdowns and currently ranks second in the nation in the category.
- As a team, UCF ranks 11th in the nation in rushing after two weeks of action.

THE BIG BOYS ARE BACK

- UCF returns its entire offensive line from last season, which includes six different o-linemen that started games in 2020.
- Both Matthew Lee at center and Edward Collins at tackle started all 10 games a season ago, while Cole Schneider started nine times at guard, Samuel Jackson started eight times at both guard and tackle, Lokahi Pauole started eight times at guard, and Marcus Tatum started five times at tackle.
- Between the six of them, the offensive linemen have now combined for 98 career starts at UCF and 109 total collegiate starts, including Tatum's 11 starts at Tennessee.
- Schneider leads the pack with 36 career starts in his time at UCF.

RECEIVER ROUNDUP

- Dillon Gabriel's top returning target is Jaylon "Flash" Robinson, who totaled 979 yards and six touchdowns in his first season with the Knights in 2020.
- Jay Flash earned first-team all-conference honors in the AAC as a sophomore, ranking 14th in the nation in receiving yards.
- Robinson went over 100 yards six times on the season, which tied for the third most in UCF history.
- In the 2021 opener, Flash led the crew with six catches for 140 yards and a score.
- Ryan O'Keefe led UCF with eight catches for 110 yards in the win over Bethune-Cookman.
- Graduate transfer Brandon Johnson brings a wealth of experience from Tennessee, having caught 79 passes for 969 in three seasons with the Vols. Through two games as a Knight, Johnson leads the team with 12 catches and two touchdowns to go with 128 receiving yards.
- Junior Amari Johnson has caught four passes for 42 yards, while true freshman Titus Mokiao-Atimalala has hauled in four passes for 24 yards and a touchdown.





DEFENSE NOTES

RUSHING DEFENSE DOMINATING

- The Knights currently rank second in the nation in rushing defense, holding their opponents to 22.0 rushing yards per game through two weeks of play.
- New defensive coordinator Travis Williams has had the task of turning around UCF's defense that ranked 123rd in the nation in total defense a season ago, allowing 491.8 yards per game, and have shown that they are well on their way after two weeks.
- The Knights are currently ranked 28th in the nation in total defense, allowing just 281.0 yards per game and 68th in scoring defense, giving up 22.5 points per game.
- UCF allowed less than 300 yards in each of its first two games, doing so in consecutive outings for the first time since achieving the feat against SMU and South Florida on Nov. 22 and Nov. 28, 2014.

TURNOVER TOWN

- The Knight defense had success turning opponents over in 2020, ranking sixth in the nation with 22 turnovers gained, which helped the Knights rank fifth with a 1.20 turnover margin.
- In fact, UCF led the entire nation in fumbles recovered last season, totaling 13 in a 10-game season.
- The Knights were 6-0 when recording more takeaways than their opponent and 0-4 when having an equal amount of turnovers last season. UCF did not give the ball away more times than its opponent in any game in 2020.
- UCF has two interceptions through the first two games of 2021, one in each game.

D-LINE DEPTH

- With the addition of Auburn transfer Big Kat Bryant, Western Kentucky transfer and freshman All-American Ricky Barber, and the return of Kalia Davis, who opted out last season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the UCF defensive line has been much improved early in 2021.
- Davis led the Knights with a career-high three tackles for loss to go with six tackles in the win over Boise State, while Bryant (1.5 TFLs), Barber (1.5 TFLs), Anthony Montalvo (0.5 TFLs), and Keenan Hester (0.5 TFLs) teamed up to give the Knights a total of 9.0 tackles for loss in the victory.
- The Knights have 13 quarterback hurries in two games, as Bryant leads the way with three.

WHO'S BACK IN THE BACKFIELD?

- A pair of cornerbacks in Davonte Brown and Corey Thornton combined for 15 starts as true freshmen last season. The two have started each of the first two games of the 2021 season.
- Divaad Wilson, Quadric Bullard, and Dyllon Lester have all started at safety early this year.
- Lester recorded his first-career interception against Boise State, while Bullard leads the Knights with 16 total tackles.

THE LINEBACKER LINE

- The one area of the defense that UCF returns all of its experience from a year ago is linebacker, bringing back starters Eriq Gilyard and Tatum Bethune, as well as key reserve Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste.
- Jean-Baptiste and Bethune have started the first two games of 2021. Jean-Baptiste is second on the team with 10 tackles, while Bethune grabbed his second-career pick in the win over Bethune-Cookman.
- UCF newcomer and former FCS All-American Bryson Armstrong is a two-time Big South Defensive Player of the Year and has totaled 40 tackles for loss and 18.5 sacks in his career.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

KICKIN' IT

- Daniel Obarski is the only UCF kicker on the roster with experience kicking field goals at the collegiate level, having gone 12-of-17 and scoring 82 points as a sophomore for the Knights in 2020.
- He has hit all 13 of his extra point attempts in 2021, but has yet to attempt a field goal this season.

OH OH IT'S OSTEEN

- Andrew Osteen returns for his third season on punting duties for the Knights in 2021, and now ranks eighth in UCF history with 104 career punts, seventh with 4,419 career yards punting, and second with a 42.8 yards per punt average.
- Last season, he punted 40 times for 1,756 yards, an average of 43.9 yards per punt, which ranked third in the AAC. Osteen was honored by the Ray Guy Award as a member of its preseason watch list for 2021.

OTHER SPECIALTIES

- Alex Ward returns to snapping duties as a redshirt senior and was among those honored on the Patrick Mannelly Award preseason watch list this summer.
- The Knights have gotten kick returns from Johnny Richardson (4 for 87), Ryan O'Keefe (1 for 37) and Titus Mokiao-Atimilala (1 for 5) so far in 2021.
- On punt returns in 2021 has been Mokiao-Atimilala (4 for 16) and Amari Johnson (3 for 38).

Gus Malzahn, who led Auburn to the Bowl Championship Series National Championship Game following the 2013 season in the first of eight straight years his Tigers qualified for bowl games, was named the ninth head football coach at UCF on Feb. 15, 2021.

In eight years as head football coach at Auburn, Gus Malzahn also led the Tigers to a Southeastern Conference Championship, two SEC West Division titles and six New Year's Day bowl selections among those eight postseason appearances.

Malzahn, 77-38 in nine seasons overall as a head coach, has helped teams to seven conference championship game appearances in his 15 seasons as a collegiate coach, including winning a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at Arkansas State in 2012. In the final Associated Press rankings his Auburn teams finished second (2013), 10th (2017), 22nd (2014) and 24th (2016).

"When I started the search process, it became very evident very quickly that, based on the conversations I had with the players last week and what they told me were looking for, Gus Malzahn was the guy for the job," said Mohajir. "He has won at every level, and he has coached a Heisman Trophy winner and NFL draft picks. There has never been a better time for Coach Malzahn to lead this program than right now."

"I'm thrilled to be the head coach at UCF, and I'm truly looking forward to being part of Knight Nation," said Malzahn. "It's exciting to be head of a program where the future is extremely bright. I will be hitting the ground running in terms of getting to know our team and everyone else connected with UCF. Our goal is to be ready to win championships."

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach-of-the-Year honors that season after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history. He led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and top-ranked Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship Game win over fifth-ranked Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

The 34-28 victory over top-rated Alabama in 2013 came on a memorable 100-yard return of a Tide missed field goal on the final play of the game. Malzahn's Tiger squads also defeated seventh-ranked Texas A&M in 2013, seventh-rated Ole Miss in 2014, second-ranked Georgia and top-rated Alabama in 2017 and fifth-ranked Alabama in 2019.

After his eight seasons at Auburn, Malzahn qualified as the second-longest tenured head coach at one school in the SEC. He is one of only 10 active FBS head coaches to take a team to a national championship game. During his time with the Tigers, Auburn was one of only three SEC schools to play in multiple SEC Championships games and play for a national championship.

Malzahn has produced 15 1,000-yard rushers in 15 seasons as a college coach, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 (despite missing significant time with injuries) and Kerryon Johnson led the SEC with 1,320 yards in 2017.

On three occasions, Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 and 2010 (both Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas). Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

During Malzahn's eight years at Auburn, the Tigers had the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 228.6 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) came under Malzahn's leadership. Auburn became just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards (also Texas A&M in 2012).

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing touchdowns in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense versus Missouri in the SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records with 26 rushing first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and 2013 SEC Player of the Year, ranked third in the nation with 23 TDs, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game. Mason set the Auburn single-season record with 1,816 rushing yards and 2,374 all-purpose yards and was second with 317 rushing attempts. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards vs. No. 5 Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

In Malzahn's eight seasons 32 players were selected in the National Football League draft, including four first-round draft picks—including Derrick Brown (No. 7) and Noah Igbinoghene (No. 30) in the 2020 NFL Draft. Malzahn's other first-round picks include Greg Robinson (No. 2 overall) and Dee Ford (No. 23) in the 2014 draft. In the last two drafts, 12 Auburn players have been drafted, the most for the Tigers





in a two-year span in the common draft era.

Malzahn coached 14 All-Americans as head coach at Auburn, including consensus selections center Reese Dismukes (2014) and defensive lineman Derrick Brown (2019). Brown won the Lott IMPACT Trophy in 2019, while Dismukes was named the 2014 Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center.

The Tigers faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's eight years at Auburn, facing 38 ranked opponents, including 21 in the top 10. Auburn was the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1- and No. 2-ranked programs and in 2017 it faced three of the four College Football Playoff semifinalists a total of four times, earning two wins.

Malzahn and his coaching proved highly successful on the recruiting trail, recording five consecutive top-10 nationally ranked recruiting classes, a first in Auburn history. Six of his eight recruiting classes rated in the top 11 nationally.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012 when he led the program to a 9-3 regular-season mark and the Sun Belt Conference title. Mohajir was named the Red Wolves' vice chancellor and director of athletics in the middle of that 2012 season and remained in that role until coming to UCF last week.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957. Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, while leading the SEC and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 TDs, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the No. 1 overall draft pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell Award.

During two seasons (2007-08) as assistant head coach and co-offensive coordinator at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records. The 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally, averaging 47.2 points per games. Malzahn in 2006 spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame. After one year as defensive coordinator in 1991 he spent four years (1992-95) as head coach at Hughes (Arkansas) High School, five years (1996-2000) as head coach at Shiloh (Arkansas) High School and five years (2001-05) as head coach at Springdale (Arkansas) High School.

Born in Irving, Texas, Malzahn graduated from high school in Fort Smith, Arkansas, and played football at Arkansas (wide receiver in 1984-85) and Henderson State (receiver and punter in 1988-89), earning his bachelor's degree from Henderson State in 1990. As a player he helped the Razorbacks to the 1984 Liberty Bowl and the 1985 Holiday Bowl (a win over Arizona State).

Malzahn and his wife Kristi (Otwell) are parents of two daughters, Kylie (Collin) Peek and Kenzie (Charl) Stander. •

PRODUCTIVE OFFENSES

Gus Malzahn was responsible for two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history: Auburn in 2013 (7,018 yards of total offense and Auburn in 2010 (6,989 yards of total offense).

50-POINT GAMES

Since the year 2000, in the eight years Malzahn was at Auburn, the Tigers posted 25 50-point games. In the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers recorded three 50-point games in a season four times with Malzahn as head coach (2013, 2016, 2018, 2019).

MALZAHN AT HOME

Malzahn now holds a record of 51-12 (.810) at home as a collegiate head coach. He was 5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State, at Auburn went 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018, 6-1 in 2019 and 4-1 in 2020, and then started 2021 with UCF 1-0 last Thursday. He started his tenure at Auburn with 13 consecutive home victories.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Gus Malzahn earned multiple national coach of the year awards in 2013, including the Eddie Robinson Award, the Bobby Bowden Award, and the Bear Bryant Award, as well as national coach of the year honors from Home Depot, the Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, and USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

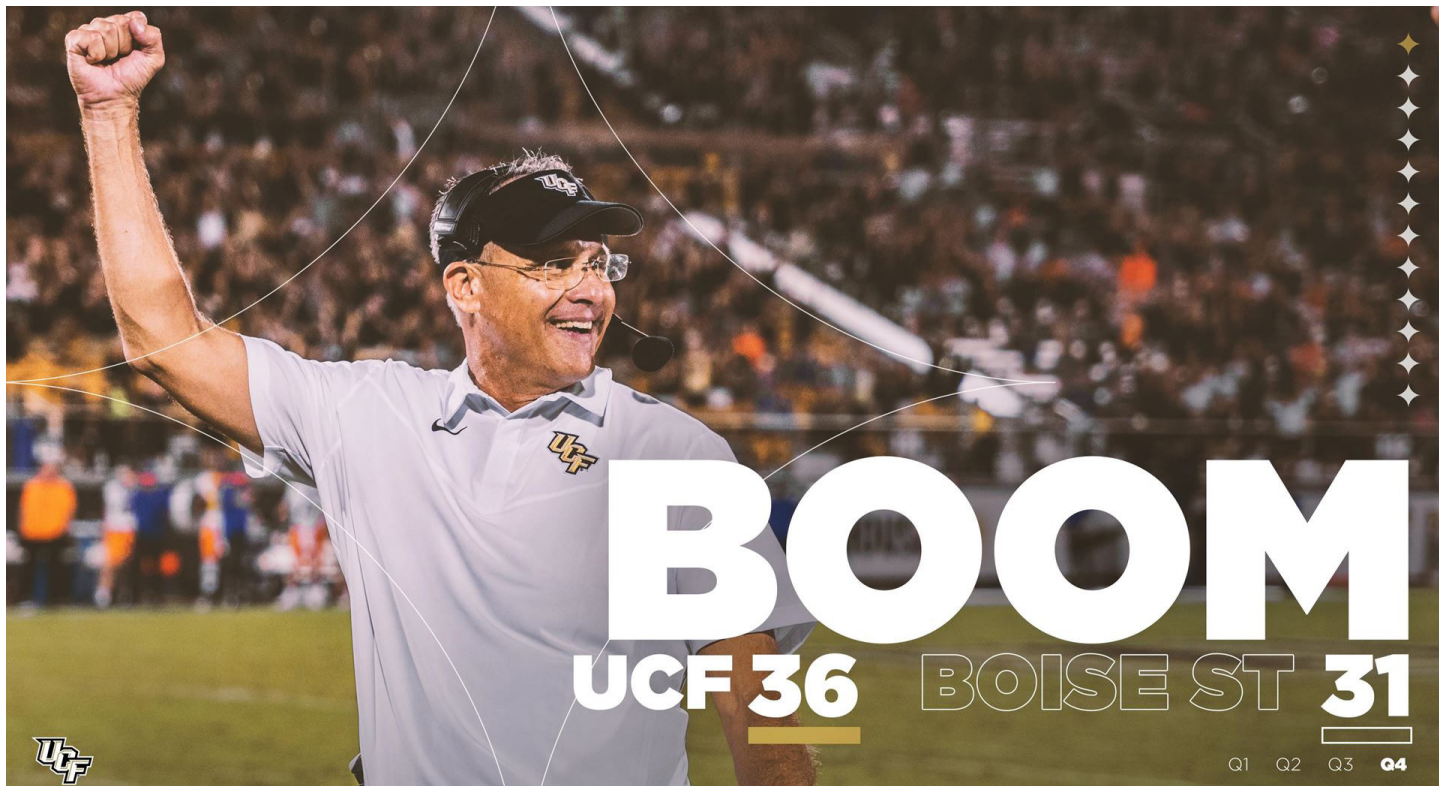

ORLANDO - The UCF football team opened the Gus Malzahn era with a 36-31 defeat of visiting Boise State Thursday night in a delayed start at the Bounce House. Junior quarterback Dillon Gabriel threw for 318 yards and four touchdowns, as the Knights won their season opener for the sixth straight season.

The Knights (1-0) overcame a 21-0 first-half deficit - matching a program record - and scored 23 consecutive points to earn the victory. The UCF defense held the Broncos (0-1) offense to no points and negative seven yards of total offense in the third quarter to take control of the game.

Newcomer Isaiah Bowser led the rushing attack with 33 carries for 172 yards and a score on the ground, while four different Knights scored through the air: Jaylon Robinson (6 for 140), Brandon Johnson (5 for 47), Titus Mokiao-Atimalala (3 for 19) and Alec Holler (2 for 29).

Originally scheduled for a 7:05 p.m. kickoff, the game ultimately started at 9:45 p.m. due to lightning in the area.

THE COMEBACK

• Boise State scored just over five minutes into the game on a 100-yard interception return - the longest against UCF in program history - and then made it 14-0 just over six minutes later. The Broncos extended their lead to 21-0 early in the second quarter on a 19-yard touchdown pass from Hank Bachmeier to Khalil Shakir.

• The Knights fought back with a 23-yard touchdown pass from Gabriel to Holler with 11:23 left in the half, the first catch of the tight end's career. UCF then allowed a field goal to the Broncos, falling behind 24-7.

• UCF used a late-second quarter touchdown - this time Gabriel finding Mokiao-Atimalala for an eight-yard score - to get some momentum heading into the break. The Knights then scored less than four minutes into the third quarter when Gabriel hit Johnson on an 11-yard strike to make it just 24-21 in favor of the Broncos.

• The Knights ultimately took their first lead of the game with less than a minute to play in the third when Gabriel threw his fourth touchdown of the game, connecting with Robinson for a 21-yard score, making it 28-24. A safety on a bad snap

made it 30-24 in favor of UCF.

CLOSING IT OUT

• Boise State battled back in the fourth, taking advantage of Gabriel's second interception to score a 7-yard touchdown from Bachmeier to Shakir and regain the lead, at 31-30.

• Gabriel then led a 10-play, 75-yard game-winning drive that was capped by a 8-yard touchdown by Bowser on a 3rd-and-goal from the eight yard line.

• As the Broncos charged back down the field, the Knights all but clinched the game when Dyllon Lester picked off Bachmeier at the Knights' seven yard line with just over two minutes to play.

GABRIEL GUTS IT OUT

• Gabriel didn't throw multiple interceptions in a single game last season, although he did it three times as a true freshman in 2019. The Knights didn't win any of those three games two seasons ago. This time his teammates rallied around him to earn the victory despite the two hiccups.

• His four touchdown passes give him 65 in his career and it marked the seventh game of his career having four or more touchdown passes.

• Gabriel threw for over 300 yards for the 12th time in his career, tying McKenzie Milton for third all-time at UCF in the category. It was also the 24th straight game he has thrown a touchdown, which is also tied with Milton for second all-time.

COACH MALZAHN

"I think the whole college football world saw it. That's tough to do. You go down by 21-0 at home against a really good team and to fight back, keep believing, making plays and answering the bell again. They just kept doing it and you could feel it on the sidelines. There wasn't any panic. I'm really proud of our staff too. Our staff did a really good job. Overall, it was a really, really quality victory that will help us moving forward."

KALIA DAVIS

"It felt great (to be back on the field). I feel like I had to get my feet in the dirt, get back acclimated. I feel like I picked it up towards the end. We never thought that we were down 21. We always thought that it was a 0-0 ball game. We just had to make a play - the next play, we need to win it. I feel like we attacked it with a great attitude and you (saw) what happened."

ORLANDO - The UCF football team raced out to 42-7 lead over visiting Bethune-Cookman and never looked back Saturday night at the Bounce House, defeating the Wildcats 63-14 to improve to 2-0 on the season. It was the most points the Knights have scored since putting up 63 against Temple on Oct. 26, 2019.

UCF (2-0) chose to receive and scored on its first drive as senior running back Isaiah Bowser scored his first of four first-half touchdowns from 17 yards out to give the Knights the early lead. Bethune-Cookman (0-2) countered with a score of their own on the ensuing drive to tie the game at 7-7 midway through the first quarter.

The Knights then scored five consecutive touchdowns to take a commanding 42-7 lead into halftime and put the game away. Junior quarterback Dillon Gabriel found senior receiver Brandon Johnson for a 22-yard touchdown late in the first quarter before Bowser put three away with a pair of 1-yard scores and a 9-yard touchdown run to match the UCF record for rushing touchdowns in a game.

Gabriel rushed for a touchdown of his own early in the third period - the longest rush of his career, a 44-yard jaunt that included running from the left sideline to the right sideline before finding the end zone - and then found Trillion Coles in the end zone for a score before giving way to backups in the rout of the Wildcats.

Coles also rushed in a score from four yards out in his first action since 2019 and freshman quarterback Mike Keene found sophomore receiver Kaedin Robinson in the end zone for the first touchdown for both new Knights.

Sophomore Quadric Bullard led the UCF defense with seven tackles, while junior Tatum Bethune recorded his second-career interception in the victory.

GABRIEL CLIMBING THE CHARTS

• Gabriel continues to climb the all-time charts at UCF, now having thrown a touchdown pass in 25 consecutive games, passing McKenzie Milton for the second longest streak in UCF history.
• He also passed Blake Bortles for fifth in touchdowns responsible for with 74 in his career and passed Bortles again, this time in career passing yards, now totaling 7,853 in his three-year career.

• Gabriel finished with 312 passing yards in the game, the 13th time he has thrown for 300 or more yards, moving him into sole possession of third place at UCF, again passing Milton.
• The junior was 23-of-36 and did not turn the ball over on Saturday.

BOWSER BLOWS BY BETHUNE

• In just his second game as a Knight, Bowser did something only three other UCF players can claim to have done, scored four rushing touchdowns in a single game.
• Alex Haynes was the first to do it on Sept. 22, 2001, Kevin Smith did it twice during his historic 2007 season - on Nov. 10, 2007 and Dec. 1, 2007 - and Darriel Mack Jr. did it in the 2018 AAC Championship Game on Dec. 1, 2018.
• It marked the third time Bowser has scored a touchdown in back-to-back games and the third time he has scored multiple touchdowns in a game.
• Bowser finished with 12 rushes for 59 yards and the four scores before sitting the second half.

DEFENSE DIGS DOWN

• The UCF defense allowed only 279 yards of total offense to the Wildcats, marking the second consecutive game of holding its opponent under 300 yards.
• It is the first time a UCF defense has allowed less than 300 yards of total offense to its opponents in back-to-back games since doing so to SMU and South Florida on Nov. 22 and Nov. 28, 2014.
• Tatum Bethune recorded his second-career pick and the second for UCF this season.
• The Knights had eight pass breakups, led by Dyllon Lester with a career-high three in the win.

COACH MALZAHN

"I think our guys handled themselves like champions. There were really good adjustments. I think our coaching staff is communicating well with our players and the players are communicating well with the staff. We are learning each other as we go and in just the first two weeks we have had great communication."

RYAN O'KEEFE

"I tried to take advantage of every target I had. At the end of the day, it's all about performance in this sport. My teammates they're always pushing me to be the best. It was a fun game. I enjoyed it."
