LAST BUT NOT LEAST

The 'Eaters had a lone match with No. 23 Santa Clara over the weekend to close up non-conference play falling 4-0 in Anteater Stadium.

"Outside of the goals, I thought we did alright. We're not happy when we lose by four goals. The first 15 minutes we played really well, stuck with the game plan, and after that first goal went in, I feel like we just went back on our heels a little bit and that caused the second one and now we're up against it. We came out well in the second half and started to get on the front foot. Between the 18s, outside of the goals, I think we can take a lot of positives, but we've got to improve before next Sunday."

Head Coach Scott Juniper saw a lot of positives despite the result Friday night, and a lot of it can be attributed to the distribution of minutes.

Fourteen players have made multiple starts on the year. Another 11 have over 500 minutes. Three of the top minutes-getters have come in the form of sophomores in **Grayson Galbraith, Kiana Palacios, and Andrea Mensen.**

The youth movement marches on. From the 11 non-conference matches, there were seven goals scored and 11 assists leading up to them. Underclassmen accounted for three of the goals and six assists while first-year players alone knocked home two of each.

BIG WEST BALANCING ACT

The real season is about to begin with Sunday's match against UC Riverside as Coach Juniper and his prideful bunch look toward a return to the Big West Tournament this season held at Cal State Fullerton.

Each school played at least 10 non-conference matches with most playing 11. CSUN was the only squad to compete in 12.

The conference itself is rated 10th in the country finishing with a 50-34-13 non-conference record. The Big West was one of 12 conferences to win at least 50 matches, and its 34 losses are the fifth-least in the nation.

The Big West found success against the Big Sky (11-1) and Mountain West (8-3-2) conferences along with spotless marks against the Summit League (5-0) and WAC (4-0). It matched up against the West Coast Conference the most going 5-12-7 in 24 matches. It also fared 2-10-2 against the Pac-12.

The top of the heap thus far is Cal State Fullerton. The defending champs racked up eight wins with its lone loss coming to Washington State, a school currently rated No. 26 in RPI. The Titans haven't faced the toughest of competition, but have taken the lead in scoring while being issued just two cards.

Closely behind CSUF is Long Beach State following a daunting schedule. A win to start the year against UCLA was coupled with draws against formidable USC and Cincinnati sides. LBSU did slip up to LMU, but most of its losses came to top schools in No. 4 BYU and No. 10 Auburn while staying middle of the road in most stat categories.

Cal Poly has fared well with draws against No. 4 BYU, No. 10 Auburn, and Pepperdine, three of their five draws so far. Gritty losses to No. 8 Stanford and No. 15 Virginia follow the squad that leads the conference in cards and fouls.

UC Davis follows along LBSU as far as stats are concerned. They have managed just three losses to No. 6 Santa Clara, No. 8 Stanford, and a shocker against Nevada. The Aggies looked good in wins over San Diego State and handing Eastern Washington its only loss of the year.

UC Riverside won six matches, all to schools rated lower than No. 128. One -goal losses to No. 16 Arizona, No. 18 Cal, and USC bode well for a squad that takes a lot of shots and fouls.

CSUN drew with the 'Eaters, 0-0, in an exhibition match. Since then, they have become a scoring threat with two per match. Losses to Santa Clara, Texas Tech, Pepperdine, and Washington tested the Matadors, and they did manage a win against Portland.

UCSB floated through non-conference snagging seven wins of their own. The Gauchos lead the Big West earning eight corners per match, and its only competition rated higher than 100 were No. 72 Texas, which they defeated, and San Francisco who lands at No. 87 and topped Santa Barbara by a goal.

Hawai'i brings up the rear bringing with it the two lone red cards in the conference. Its best result came as a draw to Wyoming along with losses to Stanford and Cal. The Rainbow Wahine also fell to Nevada, and its three wins have come against a DII school and a pair of programs with one win between them in Bakersfield and Denver.

UC Irvine has plenty to be optimistic about its early play. Five losses to teams rated in the top 100 and four to top-50 squads filled the competitive slate. UCI's best result can be seen in a one-goal loss to No. 10 Auburn which has dropped just one match this season in a schedule that's the 34th-strongest in the nation. The 'Eaters' least-fortunate result looks to be its draw with Abilene Christian, a school rated No. 231 with a 2-7-2 record.

TECHNICAL SQUAD
UC Irvine's Sunday, Oct. 18th match at home against Long Beach State will be broadcast on ESPN3 as one of four live streamed matches featuring Big West women's soccer.

SUNDAY FUNDAY
UC Riverside kicks Big West season off Sunday at 1:00 p.m. in Anteater Stadium. UCI has the edge overall winning 10 of 15 matchups between the two, but UCR has taken the last two including last year in Riverside, 1-0.

The Anteaters have shutout Riverside in three of the last four meetings in Anteater Stadium, all wins, including a total score of 7-0 in the last two meetings.

Fourth-years Tyler Cunningham, Alexa Bustamante, and Blanca Barrio pace the offense with eight points apiece.

The backline is a rotation of eight different Highlanders teamed up with senior foundation Amber Marani. Together, they help senior keeper Elizabeth Silas whose posted a 0.90 goals-against-average in 1,000 minutes stopping 41 shots and four shutouts along the way.

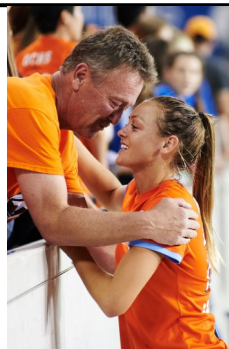

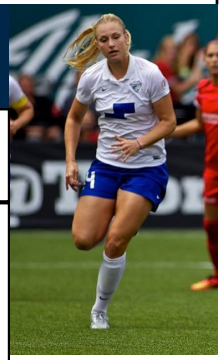

Goodson has found a home in the National Women's Soccer League with Sky Blue FC currently in her 3rd season following a brief hiatus over the summer. Based in New Jersey, Goodson has been a fixture on the backline, and also had a hand in the league's first-ever goal. She added more scoring in 2014 and continues to provide sturdy defense on the backline. She was originally drafted by the Philadelphia Independence in 2012 before the league folded. She then spent a season in the Netherlands with FC Twente in 2012 & 2013 starting 19 matches and putting home 1 goal.

Scott Juniper has been the women's soccer head coach at UC Irvine since January 2006. In eight seasons at the helm, Juniper put the Anteaters on the national map, leading the program to a historic 19-3-2 season and reaching NCAA Tournament for the first time in history in 2010 and returning for a second straight year in 2011 after a 16-win season.

Coach Juniper has built the Anteater program into an annual contender that has taken out top-tier programs in the process such as Texas A&M, Auburn, Oregon State, Portland, and Long Beach State. He has led the program to winning seasons and Big West Tournament berths in six of his eight campaigns drawing Big West and NSCAA West Region Coach of the Year honors following the 2010 season.

Juniper guided UCI to the Sweet Sixteen with victories over Arizona State and Wake Forest, before losing 1-0 in double overtime to the University of Washington at Anteater Stadium. The 2010 team also captured the Big West regular-season title with a record of 8-0-0, the first time that a team has ever been unbeaten and untied in Big West Conference play. The women's soccer team concluded the season ranked No. 14 in the nation and second in California (NSCAA). For his efforts, Juniper was recognized as the 2010 Big West Coach of the Year and NSCAA West Region Coach of the Year.

The 2010 season saw four players named to the Big West first team and the Anteaters came away the majority of conference's awards. Danielle de Seriere was named the Big West Goalkeeper of the Year, Coco Goodson garnered Defender of the Year recognition and Tanya Taylor was voted the Offensive Player of the Year. UCI also had four all-region honorees, two of whom were also named All-Americans, three Academic All-Americans and the program's first ever Women's Professional Soccer league draft pick as Tanya Taylor was selected by the Boston Breakers. Following Taylor has been CoCo Goodson, a 2012 draft pick, who has built a solid professional career with Sky Blue FC along with Rachel Wood (Boston Breakers) and Cami Privett (Houston Dash) sending Anteaters to professional leagues in the Netherlands, Norway, and Iceland in the process.

In 2009, Juniper's Anteaters reached the Big West Tournament going 12-7-2 overall and 4-3-1 in Big West play finishing in a tie for fourth place. In Juniper's first season, he led UCI to an 11-7-2 record overall and a 5-2-1 record in the Big West. That season the 'Eaters finished third in the Big West to qualify for the Big West Conference Tournament. In 2006, Juniper was hired as an assistant coach at UCI under April Heinrichs.

Prior to joining the Anteater program, Juniper was an assistant coach for the UC Riverside men's soccer program for three seasons from 2003-05 and an assistant coach at the University of Bristol (England) from 1998 - 2002. Juniper earned his Bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Bristol (England) in 1998 and went on to receive his Master's in sport and exercise science from the University of Bath (England) in 2002. His Master's thesis investigated group dynamics of elite soccer. Juniper's research was published by the English F.A. Coaches Association Journal in 2003 and "The Sport Psychologist" in 2006. His research, which was based on work with collegiate soccer programs in the U.S. and professional soccer academies in England, highlighted key elements of effective teams. Coach Juniper has delivered presentations on building effective teams to a number of organizations.

As a collegiate soccer player in England at the University of Bristol, Juniper was named both Freshman and Player of the Year in 1996 and was the leading scorer in 1996 and 1998. During that time, Juniper represented England Universities at the regional level. In 1995, he captained the Colchester Sixth Form College to a high school national title and in 2001 he was part of the National Championship winning team at the University of Bath. He also played for a number of semi-professional teams in England. Juniper holds the U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license, UEFA "B" license, USSF National Youth License, NSCAA Goalkeeper license, and a Speed, Agility and Quickness trainer accreditation. He is also on the Cal South coach education staff, coaches with the Cal South and Region IV Olympic Development programs in addition to local clubs and community programs.
