Ben Orloff begins his head coaching career in 2019 as the **9th** head coach in program history taking over for Mike Gillespie who led the program to 393 of his 1,156 career wins. For the program, it's the 41st season of Anteater baseball, 33rd in Division I, and 18th since the program returned in 2002.

The Anteaters offense has made its hits count scoring 45 runs on just 49 hits and batting .213 toward its 5-2 record. UCI has yet to record 10 hits in a game, have outhit its opponents just three times, and reached more times without getting a hit (56). UCI holds the third-lowest average for teams with winning records behind West Virginia and George Mason

For the Anteaters, it's the program's first ever trip to the state of Missouri. The 'Eaters do have **2** games on their record against Missouri schools, both in the postseason. UCI defeated Missouri-St. Louis in the Division II CWS in 1973 which happened to be in Springfield, IL, and later in 2006, UCI was bounced from the Malibu Regional in 14 innings by the Missouri Tigers, 5-4.

February 22 in Anteater History - 2004

The 'Eaters were on the verge being swept at Arizona, but jumped out to a 3-0 lead. UA came back to lead 5-3 in the sixth, UCI then scored 5, three against future MLBer Mark Melancon, but the Wildcats tied it back up at 8-8. Future MLBer Jason Donald got his 6th hit in the 10th, but was thrown out trying to stretch a double. He would have scored on the next play, a double, but instead, the 10th ended tied 8-8, and so would the game, an 8-8 tie to avoid the sweep

Anteater Heritage - Anteaters in Texas

UC Irvine began the 2009 season ranked 5th in the nation as it headed to the Shriners College Classic in Minute Maid Park. After falling in the opener, 9-2, to No. 1 Texas A&M, the 'Eaters rebounded to beat Houston, 13-7, and No. 9 UCLA, 7-4. Ben Orloff had 4 hits while Dillon Bell and D.J. Crumlich each parked HRs. UCI would return to Minute Maid in 2012 and defeat Alabama State, Southern, and Texas Southern as part of the MLB Urban Invitational

Anteater Heritage - Anteaters in Texas

The Anteaters' first Division I Regional victory came in the Dell Diamond of Round Rock, Texas in 2007. After dispatching of Wake Forest, 13-0, UCI faced the hosts, Texas, and rode Scott Gorgen's complete game allowing five hits and a run to advance to a

championship rematch with the Longhorns that saw UCI erase a 5-3 deficit in the sixth inning, and Wes Etheridge would reemerged to pick up the save and send the 'Eaters to the Wichita Super Regional

UC Irvine won its weekend series in a sweep over the Rice Owls. The 'Eaters have two straight series wins to start the season for the second year in a row. The 'Eaters won the opening road series of the season for the first time since 2014 at Portland, also in a sweep.

The 'Eaters did lose in the midweek matchup earlier in the week to San Diego State. After winning the first eight midweek games in 2018, UCI has now dropped three straight in the midweek

The UC Irvine offense outscored the Owls 29-9 pushing across more runs than recording hits (25). UCI also reached 30 times without the use of a hit including 20 walks and six times via an error. The offense is still hitting just .213 which is the third lowest among schools with a winning record behind West Virginia and George Mason

The Anteaters found their power swing clubbing six home runs over the weekend. Brendan Brooks came forth as the unlikely source hitting three including his first career 2-HR game on Friday. He entered the weekend with one career HR. Brooks' six-game hitting streak to start the season was snapped on Sunday

Brandon Lewis claimed Big West Player of the Week honors after his seven hits on the week and .462 average at Rice. He homered two more times to put him atop the Big West leaders, and five of his seven hits were for extra bases. He also added eight RBIs including five in Sunday's win. He also made his debut at 1B on Saturday

Christian Koss shaved his head completely bald following Friday night's performance that left him 2-for-18 in the young season. He would promptly smack three hits on Saturday including a towering 2 -run HR and finish the week four walks, four runs, and a team high three stolen bases

Jake Palmer has reached in all seven games to start the season walking five times and scoring five times during last week. Adrian Damla and Brandon Lewis each have hitting streaks of four games entering the week. Mikey Filia had a road hitting streak of nine games dating back to last season snapped on Friday

The pitching staff held opponents to a .218 batting average last week and .179 at Rice. Saturday, the 'Eaters tossed their first shutout of the season and first since April 8 at LBSU. The last three Anteater shutouts have all now come on the road. UCI also struck out 17 Owls Friday night which was one off a program record set back in 2017 in a 14-inning loss.

Tanner Brubaker allowed just three hits for the second straight start. He produced the 'Eaters' first quality start and first win by a starter of 2019 shutting out Rice through seven innings. His ERA and WHIP both stand at 0.71 through two starts, and he's currently clutching a streak of 11 straight innings without allowing a run

Trenton Denholm held Rice hitless through five innings before being relieved. He's trailing Brubaker closely with an 8.2-inning scoreless streak, and has held opponents hitless the last 6.1 innings

The Anteaters bullpen had some magnificent performances led by the duo of Jordan Bocko and Taylor Rashi on Friday. The pair helped cool down the Rice bats tossing 3.2 scoreless innings allowing two baserunners. Bocko scored his second win of the season while Rashi has retired all 10 hitters he's faced, eight via strikeout. On Sunday, Ryan Johnston appeared for the fourth time in 2019 bailing Michael Frias out of a jam, and then when Johnston loaded the bases, Dylan Riddle bounced back from a rough outing Tuesday to escape the seventh without a run and adding a masterful eighth inning to post his longest career outing of two innings on just nine pitches

More Anteater debuts from last week included Kaz Akamatsu making his first appearance since the 2017 season holding SDSU scoreless in an inning Tuesday night. The ninth head coach in program history took home his second series win as he's now the third straight UCI head coach to debut with two series wins and fifth to win his first road series. Of the nine UCI head coaches, Orloff is now the sixth to have a winning record through his first seven games. Ben Orloff returns to the Anteater dugout for a sixth year, but first at the helm. Even though he is the NCAA career and single-season record holder in sacrifice bunts, don't expect to see his the Anteaters bunting their way around the bases.

"You don't have a style, you adjust to your players," the head coach stated recognizing the talent and pop his lineup brings. "Offensively, w have some power bats that are looking to hit in the middle of the lineup with Konnor Zickefoose, Brandon Lewis, and John Jensen. Any of those guys can lift a double or leave the yard so there's potential for the big inning and we look to capitalize on that. A big part of the offense will be an emphasis on walking more, strike zone management, raising that slugging percentage. We'll walk more this year than we ever have in the last five years."

"Alonzo Garcia could be a big bounce back guy that's had a good career as an Anteater, but has been hurt in recent years. He could step into a big role and will be very valuable with the way he pitched over the fall and winter"

"Vergara has interesting potential, but he's been out the whole fall. He only threw three innings in the fall, didn't really get to see him, redshirted last year at Glendale CC, and had a decent summer with the Conejo Oaks. He's kind of a wild card and an intriguing arm, looking forward to seeing what he brings to the fold."

"Mikey Filia is a guy that will step into a much bigger role. He's bided his time over the last three years and now he should be an integral part of the team's success."

The 2019 Anteaters are a squad comprised of players that have a lot of college baseball experience and have put in a lot of time with the Anteater program. Twenty of the 2019 Anteaters are upperclassmen with 14 as juniors and six seniors including graduate student and starter Louis Raymond. Overall, 14 Anteaters have put in at least three years with the program including seven into now their fourth year.

The 'Eaters are looking for their first postseason trip since the 2014 College World Series season, and are off to a solid start earning some recognition from the baseball coaches, writers, and experts of America earning a spot in the preseason rankings from Perfect Game (No. 23), Baseball America (No. 25), and even earning votes from ESPN/USA Today and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. UC Irvine has maintained those rankings through the first two weeks of the season

The Anteaters will play 10 games against the Pac-12 in 2019, eight of which will be in Anteater Ballpark starting with the opening series against Washington fresh its first College World Series and returning their top four hitters. The 'Eaters end non-conference play with the other Pacific Northwest foe as Washington State plays a weekend series at Cicerone Field. UCLA and USC are usual midweek matchups

Other historically prominent baseball programs dot the Anteater schedule starting with trips to Rice and Missouri State. Missouri State is coming off its third straight regionals appearance, second 40-win season in those years, 36 conference wins in the last two years, and are looking for its sixth trip to the College World Series. Topping the tough road slate is a return trip to Utah Valley who stole the series at Anteater Ballpark in 2018. A new face in the midweeks is projected Big Ten champ Michigan. The Wolverines start the 2019 ranked as high as No. 17 and have finished in the conference's top two in each of the last two years including a 40-win season. UCI ventures to the Big Ten near in May during the midst of Big West play traveling to Iowa.

The premier series in Cicerone Field features the class of the Big West in St. John's. A program that consistently puts up 40 wins every season and is coming off back-to-back regional appearances is stacked on the mound led by one of the premier Friday night matchups in the nation this season when 2018 National Pitcher of the Year finalists square off in Andre Pallante and SJU's Sean Mooney.

The Missouri State Bears out of the Missouri Valley Conference are a Midwest behemoth under head coach Keith Guttin in his 37th year leading the bunch. Guttin has accumulated 1,260 career wins over that time including a winning campaign in each of the last 32 seasons including 12 seasons with 40 wins, 19 conference championships, and 11 trips to the NCAA Tournament including the only trip to Omaha for a school from the state of Missouri when the Bears reached the College World Series in 2003.

The 2018 Bears reached the 40-win plateau going 40-17 and winning 18 of 21 conference matchups on its way to a conference tournament title earning a trip to the NCAA Tournament. The Bears were eliminated from the Oxford Regional losing twice to Tennessee Tech in addition to a win against in-state rival Saint Louis.

Early in the 2019 season, the Bears have struggled to a 1-5 mark including double-digit losses to Nevada and Texas State mixed with a win over Utah in the tournament in San Marcos before last week's winless showing at the Tony Gwynn Legacy falling to CSF, San Diego, and Fresno State in the program's first trip to California in 24 years. The Bears square off with the Bears of Central Arkansas twice during the midweek in their first home games of the season before going at it with the Anteaters this weekend at Hammons Field for UC Irvine's first-ever trip to the Show-Me State.

Missouri State has a few big bats returning such as All-American DH Drew Millas, whose three RBIs currently leads the squad, and All-MVC 2B John Privitera, whose hitting .304 with a pair of doubles, but the Bears have been slow to start hitting just .208 $\,$

Missouri State starters have posted a 9.13 ERA thus far in their six starts with only one able to pitch past the fifth inning this season while striking out 13 hitters in their 22.2 innings. Closer Connor Sechler who was 6-1 with eight saves in 30 appearances in 2018 has yet to try for one this year, but has struck out six and allowed on baserunner in 3.1 innings.

The Bears and Anteaters will meet for the first time in their programs' histories. Missouri State's loss to CSF was just the eighth all-time game against the Big West. Before sweeping CSUN in 2018, the Bears had only played Big West schools in postseason play going 1-1 against CSUN in the 1970 Division II College World Series and matching up with Long Beach State in consecutive NCAA Tournament runs losing to them in 1995 before rebounding with a win in 1996. Missouri State will also travel to UC Santa Barbara later in March.

UCI has a limited history with the Missouri Valley Conference as well, but did travel to Southern Illinois last year dropping two of three. UCI also swept Dallas Baptist at home in the 2005 season.

20 different Bears have gone on to the Major Leagues to take home three World Series titles. Notable players include Ryan Howard, Bill Mueller, and Shaun Marcum along with current players Ross Detwiler, Brad Ziegler, Luke Voit, Matt Hall, Pierce Johnson, and Buddy Baumann

Orloff joined the Anteater coaching staff in 2013 as an assistant coach under legendary skipper Mike Gillespie bringing a dearth of offensive experience and as an infielder. Orloff also served as the third base coach in addition to his efforts on the recruiting trail. He later earned the role of associate head coach before becoming the head coach of the Anteaters ahead of the 2019 season.

Spearheading the Anteater recruiting efforts, Orloff played at UCI from 2006-09 and became the program's first Big West Player of the Year. Orloff won the 2009 Brooks Wallace Award as the nation's top shortstop, and was the first Anteater player to win an American Baseball Coaches Association Gold Glove award. A three-time All-American, Orloff also was named to two NCAA Tournament teams and made four postseason appearances.

Recognized for his defensive talents, Orloff also evolved into a potent offensive threat, ending his collegiate career with a lifetime .320 batting average. Orloff is UCI's all-time hit leader with 281 and owns the top mark in runs scored with 178. He leads all players with 241 games played and 877 atbats. With 62 stolen bases, he is second in the UCI career annals and also dots the single-season records in multiple categories. Orloff led the nation two consecutive years in sacrifice hits and holds the NCAA single-season mark of 34 set in 2007 and in a career with 86 before being drafted in the ninth round by the Houston Astros and climbing as high as Double-A Corpus Christi.

J.T. BLOODWORTH

ASSISTANT COACH, FIRST SEASON

J.T. Bloodworth joins the Anteater coaching staff for the 2019 baseball season as an assistant coach. He spent six seasons at UC San Diego as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator rising up after joining the staff as a volunteer in September of 2012. In addition to overseeing the recruiting operations, Bloodworth was the hitting instructor, worked with the infielders, and also coached third base.



From 2009 through 2011, Bloodworth was at New Mexico State University, where he assisted with recruiting and served as the defensive coach alongside Head Coach Rocky Ward and Hall of Famer Gary Ward. In his first season in Las Cruces, N.M., in 2009, Bloodworth had an immediate impact on the Aggie defense, which broke two school records with 701 assists and 69 double plays (ranked seventh nationally). NMSU also matched the program standard for fielding percentage at .968, committing only 76 errors, a dramatic improvement over a .942 clip and 138 errors the season before. The Aggies won 44 games in 2009, which was another school record.

Bloodworth started his collegiate playing career in 2004 for Andy Lopez at the University of Arizona. After transferring to Dallas Baptist University, he played under Eric Newman (2006, 2007), and Dan Heefner (2008). Bloodworth was named to the 2007 NCAA Division I All-Independent Team, and in 2008, helped DBU to a 37-19 record and a first-ever NCAA Regional berth.

Bloodworth graduated from Dallas Baptist in the spring of 2009 with a sport management degree. In 2010, he received his Master of Arts in sport management. He is also a graduate of Lake Highlands High School in Dallas, Texas.

DANIEL BIBONA

ASSISTANT COACH, SEVENTH SEASON



In 2014 the pitching staff set a school record by posting a program-best 2.76 team ERA, surpassing the previous mark of 2.95 (2011) and becoming just the second Anteater team to log an earned run average below 3.00. The Anteaters also pitched in a programbest 591 innings and posted 27 saves, eclipsing the previous high of 20, recorded in 2009 and 2006.

Bibona mentored Andrew Morales and Sam Moore to multiple All-America honors with the former winning the Senior CLASS Award, the same honor that Bibona captured in 2010. Moore, who struggled on the mound in 2013, became the NCAA, Big West and UCI single-season leader in saves with 23 in 2014. Moore was voted the Gregg Olsen Award, honoring the "Breakout Player of the Year".

Bibona played from 2007-10 and was the first Anteater to be named Big West Pitcher of the Year back-to-back seasons. The southpaw collected five All-America honors and also was a two-time all-conference first-team selection. Bibona helped the Anteaters to four NCAA Tournament berths and was voted to two NCAA Regional All-Tournament teams. He was named a USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award semifinalist and holds the career record in strikeouts. Bibona also won the prestigious Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for displaying excellence in four areas; community service, the classroom, character and competition. Bibona, who received a degree in sociology, was then drafted in the eighth round by the St. Louis Cardinals and pitched for the Quad City River Bandits.

CORY VANDERHOOK

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH, FIRST SEASON

Vanderhook, the nephew of Cal State Fullerton head coach Rick Vanderhook, comes to the 'Eaters for the 2019 season after a year as an assistant at Abilene Christian University in 2018 where he tackled the pitching staff.

Prior to his Texas stop, he spent 2015-17 with the Cal State Fullerton Titans as the Director of Operations under his uncle helping that program to a pair of College World Series appearances, and landed at CSF after four seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Golden West College from 2009-12.

Vanderhook's coaching acumen stems from his versatile collegiate days as a catcher and pitcher between the Cal State Fullerton and South Carolina programs which led to his signing with the Chicago Cubs and later the Baltimore Orioles organizations. He was also drafted in 2003, 42nd round pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers, and originally in the 25th round by the Seattle Mariners of the 2002 draft following his senior year at Edison High School in Huntington Beach.




