## WOMEN'S SOCCER TAKES ON SAN DIEGO, CSUN

After a split in the first week, UC Irvine women's soccer is back at it traveling to undefeated San Diego Thursday night and an important home match Sunday night with Big West foe, CSUN.

### Storylines

- Sunday night, the Anteaters will honor the four members of their 2020 senior class during the match of Caitlin Sanchez, McKenzie Madison, Lauren McKimmey, and Sara Young.
- **Sophie Gillies** earned a pair of awards this week named the Big West Offensive Player of the Week and Big West Freshman of the Week after scoring in each match including in her first career goal Thursday at #5 UCLA. Gillies totaled five points over the two matches. This was the first time Freshman of the Week award has been given in Big West women's soccer.
- The Anteaters scored six goals in Sunday's 6-0 win over Southern Utah. The six goals in a match are the most since 2010, also a 6-0 victory defeating UC Davis at home.
- Sunday had six different goalscorers including four players with their first career goals - **Alyssa Moore**, **Lilli Rask**, **Laila El Behery**, and **Chloe Ragon** who delivered the game-winning goal.
- **Glo Hinojosa** posted her first career win and shutout in Sunday victory over Southern Utah in her fifth match. She stopped three shots in the effort.
- Overall, seven players earned their first career point over the weekend including the five goal scorers and those adding assists such as **Autumn Thompkins** and **Gianna Creighton**.
- The Sunday win kept the 'Eaters' streak of five straight home matches unbeaten (4-0-1) including wins in each of the last two matches in Anteater Stadium.
- Head Coach Scott Juniper is back with his staff for his 16th year with the program, 15th year as the head coach, and 14th season of NCAA soccer. Juniper is the program's all-time winningest coach with 134 wins, three Big West titles, and a Big West-best 58 points over the last four seasons.

## WHY THE ANTEATER?

Two former water polo players, Pat Glasgow and Bob Ernst, are regarded as the main instigators to anoint the Anteater as the mascot for UC Irvine. The character is inspired by the character from the "B.C." comic by Johnny Hart. The student-athletes, along with fellow student Schuyler Hadley Bsasset III, organized a campaign to promote their idea ahead of the 195 student election.

Despite other candidates, the students chose the Anteater to represent the university with a commanding 55.9% majority. Peter The Anteater's famous "Zot" war cry is borrowed from the "B.C." comic strip, and still serves its purpose to this day.



# WE ARE UC IRVINE.



The correct way to refer to the Anteaters is UC Irvine or UCI. Please do not refer to the university as "Cal-Irvine" or Cal State Irvine." The university name is written as "UC Irvine," not "U.C. Irvine," "UC-Irvine" or "Cal Irvine." This naming convention also applies to the majority of the UC-system universities (i.e. UC Riverside, UC Santa Barbara, UC San Diego). The only exceptions are UCLA and California (UC Berkeley).

**This Week's Matches**

- The 'Eaters have another home-and-home heading to San Diego Thursday followed by a home game Sunday evening hosting CSUN in a non-conference contest.
- USD hosts the Anteaters Thursday afternoon at 3:00 p.m. in the third of seven straight home games for USD to start 2021. UCI has won the last four meetings including the last trip to USD in 2017. The Toreros are 2-0 so far defeating Cal State Fullerton, 2-1, in the opener with a second-half winner, and finishing Sunday with a 3-1 win against Army. USD is 1 of 2 WCC opponents UCI takes on and was picked to finish ninth in the conference. WCC holds the reigning NCAA champ in Santa Clara from 2020. Sophomore Aryssa Mahrt leads all with three points, eight shots, and four on target. Junior keeper Elyn Casto has 10 saves in the two matches, both wins, but searching for her first shutout.
- UCI's Sunday opponent is CSUN in a non-conference contest. The Matadors split last week at home falling to Long Beach State, 2-0, and then picking up a 2-1 win over Big Ten side, Iowa State. They have a busy week starting with a trip up to Stanford Thursday before heading down to Irvine. Kacie Garrity provided the game-winning goal over the weekend with Ashley Cruz adding a goal. Amanda Delgado has stopped seven shots in their matches.

**2021 So Far**

- The Anteaters opened at No. 5 UCLA to start 2021. The Bruins scored three times in the first 20 minutes, but UCI's defense held the final 70 minutes and scored in the 89th minute as freshmen **Sophie Gillies** and **Laila El Behery** linked up for a goal and nearly a second just before that.
- The home opener was all UCI winning 6-0 over Southern Utah, the program's most goals in a game since 2010. Six different goalscorers were led by four 'Eaters with their first career goals led by **Chloe Ragon** who delivered the game-winner in the 14th minute along with El Behery, **Alyssa Moore**, and **Lilli Rask**.
- The Big West Preseason Coaches Poll projects the 'Eaters to finish in a tie for third with UC Santa Barbara. It's the fourth-straight preseason poll the 'Eaters have been picked in the top four. The 'Eaters also drew four first-place votes which led all team in the poll. The 11-player Preseason All-Big West team included a pair of 'Eaters in fourth-year junior forward **Scarlett Camberos** and third-year sophomore midfielder **Gianna Creighton**.
- UCI played a pair of exhibitions winning 1-0 in 110 minutes at Saint Mary's on a 34th-minute **Alyssa Moore** goal. In a home scrimmage, UCI battled back from down to Cal Poly Pomona to win, 2-1, on a first-half PK from **Sophie Gillies** and 88th-minute winner by **Destine Manzo**.
- Returning to the roster are 18 Anteaters, 15 that have played minutes for UCI. Scoring leaders return in **Scarlett Camberos** who has four goals and three assists for 11 points. **Alex Jaquez** has a pair of goal, both game-winners, and has a pair of assists along with **Amber Huff** and **Destinee Manzo**. The 'Eaters bring in four keepers with two that have minutes in **Glo Hinojosa** playing 300 minutes in four matches in 2019 and **Taesja Paopao** who has played twice including a shutout victory over Northern Colorado.
- Joining the 19 returners are 18 newcomers. Eight joined the squad in 2020. Ten have joined the fold for 2021 including three from four-year college like Oregon, Air Force, and Nevada. **Sophie Gillies** shone with five goals of the team's eight in the spring season where they went 3-0-2.

**Student-Athlete Notes**

- Among the new 'Eaters are the international flavor with freshmen **Suus de Bakker** from the Netherlands, national team members **Aveka Singh** from India and **Laila El Behery** of Egypt, and Gillies from England. The roster is also flushed with players connected to Canada, Mexico, Ireland, Ghana, Guam, and Thailand.
- With no soccer in 2020-21, women's soccer still pushed through placing 47 student-athletes on Fall, Winter, and Spring Dean's Lists. Fifteen different 'Eaters earned Dean's List at least two quarters and 10 were recognized all three quarters including current players **Maddie Lauro**, **Maddy Chavez**, **Sarah**

- Of the 29 'Eaters that have declared a major, 11 different majors are represented with the most common as Sociology with 10 members and another in Social Ecology
- **Maddy Chavez** leads the way in academic exploits earning scholarships over the past year in the social justice leaders category; specifically the Houts Family and Maxine E Nevin Leider scholarships. Chavez is 1 of 4 Anteaters that are currently Criminology, Law, & Society majors.
- Four Anteaters enter the year as public health policy majors. 'Eater alum, Shelby Lee, was a PHP major toward her nursing school aspirations while she was the Big West's representative at National SAAC conferences where she has spoken on panels regarding mental health and helped toward the Time Management Plan that is currently in place to help student-athletes
- Among the other fields Anteaters are studying toward are three Psychological Science majors, two newcomers as Biomedical engineering majors, and other majors represented such as education, film & media studies, engineering, social ecology, and literary journalism.

Stats To Watch

- Two veterans lead the way in matches played with scoring leader **Scarlett Camberos** with 37 matches under her belt, 20 as a starter, and midfielder **Amber Huff**, playing 36 career matches
- The leader in starts is **Alex Jaquez** starting 21 times in her 31 matches played
- As alluded to, Camberos leads all active Anteaters with five goals scored now after her tally Sunday, and three assists for 13 points total. Overall, the team returned 50% of their goals scored in 2019. Jaquez has two career goals, both as game-winners.
- The Anteaters enter 2021 with four keepers on the roster. Two returners in **Glo Hinojosa** and **Taesja Paopao**. Hinojosa joined the roster in 2018 and began 2019 as the starting keeper seeing 300 minutes in four matches starting three times. Paopao joined in 2019 and played in two matches starting once against Northern Colorado where she shut them out for a 2-0 victory. The remaining two keepers are new to the roster with freshman **Gabby Nelms** joining from Carlsbad and transfer **Hannah Roberts** who is originally from the State of Washington and played one match with the University of Nevada in 2019.

# 2021 UC Irvine Soccer Match Notes



## SCOTT JUNIPER HEAD COACH, 14TH SEASON

The all-time winningest coach in UC Irvine women's soccer history, Scott Juniper has been at the helm for the Anteaters for 13 seasons since taking over in January 2007 guiding the program to nine winning seasons, nine Big West Tournament appearances, seven 10-win seasons, three Big West regular season championships (2010, 2011, 2017), and two trips to the NCAA Tournament as an at-large selection in 2010 and 2011 in addition to his 133 wins.

The 2020 Anteaters and the entire Big West did not compete due to health and well-being concerns surrounding the COVID-19 virus and pandemic. The program did compete in Spring season going 3-0-2. The 2019 squad finished 4-12-1 taking on seven Power 5 programs, four ranked teams, and three receiving votes.

The 2018 Anteaters once again finished among the top four in the conference with an 8-7-4 record and a ninth season under coach Juniper with at least four conference victories. The 'Eaters did it through one of its toughest schedules to date going up against four Pac-12 schools on top of WCC powers Portland and Pepperdine. Coach Juniper's squads have run up against Pac-12 schools 33 times during his tenure claiming eight victories and drawing four times which includes the team's marvelous tournament run in 2010 where UCI took down Arizona State, ACC power Wake Forest, and pushed Washington to double overtime in the NCAA Tournament Third Round.

Coach Juniper has built the Anteater program into an annual contender that has taken results from top-tier programs such as USC, BYU, Texas A&M, Auburn, Oregon State, Portland, Santa Clara, Cal, and Long Beach State. Juniper has been named Big West Coach of the Year twice, once in 2010 and again last season in 2017. He also earned NSCAA West Region Coach of the Year honors in the 2010 campaign helping guide his squad to the only unbeaten and untied conference campaign when his Anteaters went 8-0-0 to win the program's first Big West regular season title and set a new program record with 19 wins over that season.

Coach Juniper's student-athletes have experienced a wealth of success with 72 All-Big West honorees over his 12 seasons highlighted by a record eight honorees in 2018, 19 named All-West Region, 9 players taking home player of the year awards at their respective positions including at least one each as Offensive, Midfielder, Defender, Goalkeeper, and Freshman of the Year, and a pair of All-Americans in Tanya Taylor in 2010 and two-time recipient CoCo Goodson in 2010 and 2011.

Under coach Juniper's watch, 12 Anteaters have enjoyed successful professional careers including Kiana Palacios and Cami Privett who each played in Spain's top division. Palacios has since teamed up with another alum, Janelly Farias, for Club America in Mexico's top league. Three Anteaters have been selected in the draft from either the Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) league or National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) starting with Tanya Taylor as a fourth round pick in 2011 followed by CoCo Goodson selected in the first round in 2012, and most recently Palacios was taken in the fourth round in 2017. In addition to the success in American pro soccer, Anteaters have made marks in leagues in the Netherlands, Iceland, Czech Republic, Norway, Cyprus, Sweden, and Lithuania with two stints on Champions League squads in Europe.

Juniper's Anteater career began in 2006 when was hired as an assistant coach at UCI under April Heinrichs. Prior to joining the Anteater program, Juniper was an assistant coach for the UC Riverside men's soccer program for three seasons from 2003-05 and an assistant coach at the University of Bristol (England) from 1998-2002. Juniper earned his Bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Bristol (England) in 1998 and went on to receive his Master's in sport and exercise science from the University of Bath (England) in 2002. His Master's thesis investigated group dynamics of elite soccer. Juniper's research was published by the English F.A. Coaches Association Journal in 2003 and "The Sport Psychologist" in 2006. His research, which was based on work with collegiate soccer programs in the U.S. and professional soccer academies in England, highlighted key elements of effective teams. Coach Juniper has delivered presentations on building effective teams to a number of organizations.

As a collegiate soccer player in England at the University of Bristol, Juniper was named both Freshman and Player of the Year in 1996 and was the leading scorer in 1996 and 1998. During that time, Juniper represented England Universities at the regional level. In 1995, he captained the Colchester Sixth Form College to a high school national title and in 2001 he was part of the National Championship winning team at the University of Bath. He also played for a number of semi-professional teams in England.

Juniper holds the U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license, UEFA "B" license, USSF National Youth License, NSCAA Goalkeeper license, and a Speed, Agility and Quickness trainer accreditation. He is also on the Cal South coach education staff, coaches with the Cal South and Region IV ODP in addition to local clubs and community programs.

Coaching at the highest levels of women's soccer in North America outside of the NWSL, Juniper coached the LA Galaxy Orange County Women to a National Championship in 2019 alongside Associate Head Coach PJ Woolridge in the United Women's Soccer league in only their second season. Coach Juniper recently added this new wrinkle to his coaching career jumping on as the team's inaugural coach in the league designed to help collegiate players and recent graduates develop as professionals. Juniper has also worked extensively with the Olympic Development Program and has served as a scout and assistant coach for U.S. Soccer Youth National Team program for a number of years.

Juniper, a native of Bath in England, resides in Irvine along with his wife, Jill, and their two young children, Glen and Faye.

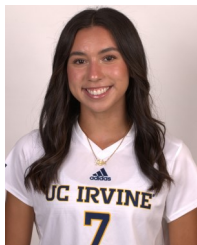

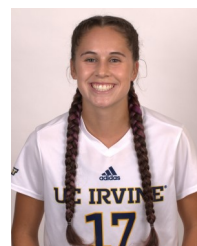

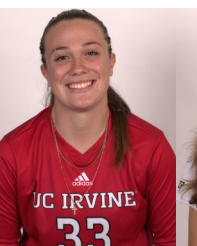
