PIVOTAL ROAD WEEK SENDS UC IRVINE TO CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD, CSUN

- **UC Irvine earned four points** last week to put them in a tie for the sixth Big West Championship berth. The top six earn berths with the top two earning first round byes.
- **Aislynn Crowder started the goal scoring** with a 44th-minute penalty Sunday. The goal is the first of her collegiate career and a game-winner. She also converted a shootout try in last year's NCAA Second Round match vs. Brown which UCI won, 4-2, on penalties. **Alyssa Moore** sealed the match and now has a third straight season with six goals scored
- **Glo Hinojosa returned to goal Thursday** and has yet to allowed a score teaming up with **Savanna Arruda** on the team's longest shutout streak of the year entering Thursday at 236. Hinojosa has 26 career shutouts, three from second in program history and four from becoming the second 'Eater along with coach Danielle de Seriere with 30 all-time
- **Gianna Creighton's reached 70 career matches** making her the 16th 'Eater to reach the mark, and she's entered UCI's top 10 at 78 now tying Tanya Taylor and Simone Ferrara. She enters Thursday 85 minutes played from reaching 7,000 in her career
- **Creighton was joined by Glo Hinojosa, Kiera Smeenge, Lilli Rask, Desiree Mendoza, Sophie Gillies, Alyssa Moore,** and from last week **Laila El Behery, Chloe Ragon and Suus de Bakker** to all reach 50 career matches this season alone. The nine Anteaters pushed the all-time total to 103 players to crack 50 career matches played in Anteater history

Thursday at the Roadrunners - 7:00 PM

- **Thursday's match will be a battle of** two squads tied for the final Big West Championship spot as UC Irvine heads to Cal State Bakersfield each with nine points. CSUB has played one more match picking up their Big West points on wins vs. LBSU and at UCSB and draws at UCSD and UC Riverside. They won just once in non-conference while they drew with Sac State and fell to DII Westmont, and have one win in six home matches. UCI is 2-0-1 all-time against CSUB.
- **The 'Runners have allowed 28 goals** while in the top half of the league in corners earned, fouls, and cards issued. Hollee Hercik in goal has shown up when it counted shutting out UCSB Sunday and stopping 11 shots to shutout LBSU. No player has more than two goals, but Hailey Russell, Jette Zimmer, and Karen Flores each have 24 or more shots and are ready to strike

Sunday at the Matadors - 2:00 PM

- **CSUN's season has been a slog** with just one win in 16 matches, one goal in their first eight matches, and six Big West points beating Bakersfield, 4-0, and drawing with two of the better sides in the conference, UC Davis and Fullerton. The 'Eaters have slim edge all-time, 12-11-4, having won four straight, but three wins in their last four at CSUN
- **The Matadors struggle on the stat sheet** with 10 goals to 32 allowed and near the bottom everywhere else. Hayden Mauldin has 89 saves to lead the Big West. Izabel Reyes has three goals, two assists, and the most shots for the Matadors with others like Ashley Cruz (2 G, 18 shots) and Pagie Califf (1 A, 19 shots) looking to break out in crunch time in the 2023 season

SCOTT JUNIPER HEAD COACH 17TH YEAR, 16TH SEASON

The all-time winningest coach in UC Irvine women's soccer history at 160 victories, Scott Juniper has been at the helm for the Anteaters for 16 seasons since taking over in January 2007...

The 2021 season was one to remember, especially after enduring COVID-19 that, among other things, took the 2020 season away from the Anteaters.

UC Irvine came in as a major underdog taking on No. 2 national seed UCLA also ranked No. 3 in the polls to start things off.

The 2020 Anteaters and the entire Big West did not compete due to health and well-being concerns surrounding the COVID-19 virus and pandemic.

The 2018 Anteaters once again finished among the top four in the conference with an 8-7-4 record and a ninth season under coach Juniper with at least four conference victories.

Coach Juniper has built the Anteater program into an annual contender that has taken results from top-tier programs such as USC, BYU, Texas A&M, Auburn, Oregon State, Portland, Santa Clara, Cal, and Long Beach State.

Coach Juniper's student-athletes have experienced a wealth of success with 72 All-Big West honorees over his 12 seasons highlighted by a record eight honorees in 2018.

Under coach Juniper's watch, 12 Anteaters have enjoyed successful professional careers including Kiana Palacios and Cami Privett who each played in Spain's top division.

Juniper's Anteater career began in 2006 when was hired as an assistant coach at UCI under April Heinrichs. Prior to joining the Anteater program, Juniper was an assistant coach for the UC Riverside men's soccer program...

As a collegiate soccer player in England at the University of Bristol, Juniper was named both Freshman and Player of the Year in 1996 and was the leading scorer in 1996 and 1998.

Juniper holds the U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license, UEFA "B" license, USSF National Youth License, NSCAA Goalkeeper license, and a Speed, Agility and Quickness trainer accreditation.

Coaching at the highest levels of women's soccer in North America outside of the NWSL, Juniper coached the LA Galaxy Orange County Women to a National Championship in 2019 alongside Associate Head Coach PJ Woolridge...

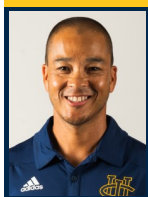
Juniper, a native of Bath in England, resides in Irvine along with his wife, Jill, and their two young children, Glen and Faye.

COACHING STAFF



P.J. WOOLRIDGE ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH, 9TH SEASON

Woolridge begins his ninth season on the Anteater coaching staff in 2023. Woolridge came to the Anteater program in 2014 after three seasons at USC where the Trojans totaled 21 wins and scored notable wins over schools like UCLA, Stanford, and Washington with Woolridge on staff.

"I am truly honored for the opportunity to join the Anteater family. Over the years, I have gained a great deal of respect for the UC Irvine Women's Soccer program and university as a whole so I am extremely excited to begin working with such a great staff and talented group of student-athletes," Woolridge said of his new opportunity.

As a player, Woolridge was a four-year starter at Cal Poly, where he helped lead the Mustangs to the 1995 Division I playoffs and also was a two-time first-team all-conference honoree.

Woolridge grew up in San Jose, Calif., and is a 1995 graduate of Leland High School, where he lettered four times in soccer as a midfielder and forward and served as team captain for two seasons.



DANIELLE de SERIERE ASSISTANT COACH, 9TH SEASON

The 'Eaters welcomed Danielle de Seriere on board for her first coaching season with the program in 2014, and returns for her ninth season as part of head coach Scott Juniper's staff where she trains Anteater keepers.

de Seriere dots the Anteater record books from when she was a goalkeeper from 2006-10. She is the all-time program leader in wins, shutouts, and goals-against-average.

Following college, de Seriere found a place in the Netherlands with the club FC Twente from 2011-13.

In 2016, de Seriere was honored with a selection to the NSCAA 30 Under 30 Program, a year-long education and mentorship opportunity for up-and-comers in the soccer coaching career realm.

She's been heavily involved with the U.S. National Team since then working as the goalkeeper coach for the under-16 team in July 2017 in Chula Vista, Calif. and again in January 2018 in Bradenton, Fla. Most recently, she joined the under-15 U.S. National Team as its goalkeeper coach in June 2018 in Woerden, Netherlands.

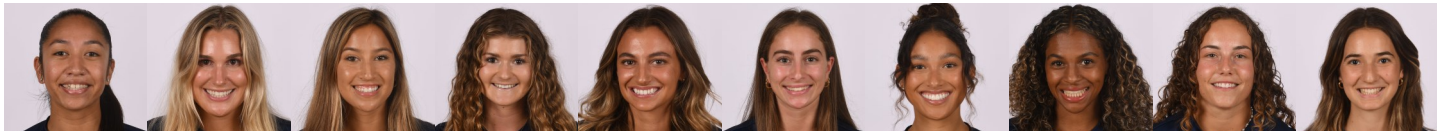

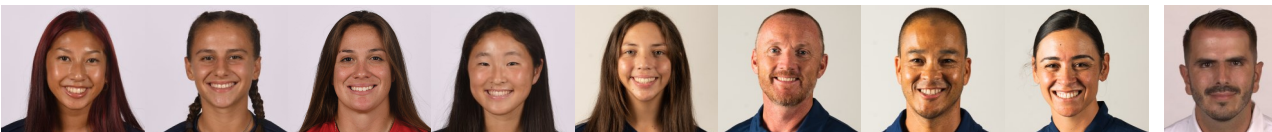

- Anteater sophomore Jenika Davis was honored September 21st with that month's CalHOPE Courage Award. The award recognizes two student-athletes at California colleges and universities monthly for overcoming the stress, anxiety, and mental trauma associated with personal hardships and adversity.
Davis joined the program in 2022 and played five matches earning an assist. The forward was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia midway through the year and began treatment teaming with Be The Match who helped her find a donor and undergo a transplant in March 2023. Davis is redshirting in 2023, but still around the team and has begun working out and running with hopes to return to full health and get back on the pitch again.

Five Things to Know About the 2023 Anteaters

- The Anteaters followed up a monumental 2021 season with an even better 2022 campaign. The 'Eaters took advantage of the first season with six Big West Tournament berths and rode that to a second straight Big West title and automatic NCAA berth. UCI upset a ranked Pac-12 school in the first round for a second straight year downing USC, 2-0, and following that up by advancing to the Sweet Sixteen for a second time in program history after besting Brown University in a shootout, 1-1 (4-2), and 1 of the last 2 unseeded schools in the tourney.
The UC Irvine firepower returns with eight starters back from last year. One is keeper Glo Hinojosa, one of the team's two All-West Region honorees, and along with her are four other All-Big West honorees - Alyssa Moore, Gianna Creighton, Kiera Smeenge, and Emilie Castagna - none of which were on the First Team.
With a heavy arsenal of returners, only four new faces don the Anteater roster. The experienced member is grad transfer Madison Goerlinger who logged over 5,000 minutes in 70 career matches along with 13 points primarily in the defensive third for the University of Arizona. Another addition is Alana Odum who remains at UC Irvine after a freshman year on UCI's cross country, indoor track, and track & field rosters where she ran the 60m, 100m, 200m, and 4x100m relay. Just two freshmen join the squad with a pair of versatile Californians in Kori Pickelle from the Bay Area and San Diego-bred Kelsey Swyney ready to lock in with the veteran group along with a multitude of second-years and redshirts looking to carve out their spot.
The coaching staff is raring to go headed by Scott Juniper for his 17th year and 16th season. He claimed his 150th and 160th career victories in 2022 with both coming at the hand of Pac-12 opponents. His staff remains intact with assistants P.J. Woolridge and Danielle de Seriere on for a ninth year as a unit and a fourth season with goalkeeper assistant Ludo Antunes.
The Anteaters have assembled one of it's most impressive schedules to date. Highlighting the ledger are visits from the reigning national champs UCLA in late August as well as a second all-time visit by Stanford for the team's first two Sunday matchups. Two other NCAA Tournament opponents dot the schedule as UCI travels to play San Jose State and Portland, and on UCI's trip to Oregon they tangle with a third Pac-12 foe in Oregon State. The Big West slate is competitive as always with five home matches that includes the full gamut of UC schools as well as the defending regular season champions, Cal Poly.

Student-Athlete Notes

- Academic standing was evident throughout 2022-23 with Anteaters picking up 45 Dean's List honors, 11 Big West Fall All-Academic nods, 24 UC Irvine Scholar-Athletes, and 23 Big West Commissioner's Honor Roll led by 11 'Eaters that earned each distinction - Ella Colombini, Mia Colombini, Gianna Creighton, Suus de Bakker, Sophie Gillies, Alyssa Moore, Lilli Rask, Kiera Smeenge, Halli Stewart, Autumn Thompkins, and Laurynn Ziller.
Twelve different majors are represented among the 30 'Eaters who have declared, with the most common being Business Economics and Criminology, Law, & Society with five members each. Three majors have declared in Public Health Policy and Biomedical Engineering majors, two each in Public Health Science, Biology, Education, Psychology, and Sociology, and finishing with a solo major of Business Administration.
Four Graduate Students fill out the roster with Lilli Rask staying on for a fifth year in the Master's of Innovation and Entrepreneurship program, and newcomer Madison Goerlinger joining and studying in the Teaching English as a Foreign Language program. Gianna Creighton and Glo Hinojosa also join graduate programs as part of the campus's new certificate program studying public health policy and criminology, law, and society, respectively.
Alyssa Moore returns for a fifth year at UC Irvine while holding the bar for women's soccer as the President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee following Sam Nieto and Shelby Lee as the last three SAAC presidents.
UC Irvine women's soccer is well-represented globally with five foreign players on the roster. Two English nationals represent in senior Sophie Gillies and second-year forward Emilie Castagna. Others that have joined the program from other countries are the trio of third-year Anteaters Laila El Behery from Egypt, Suus de Bakker from the Netherlands, and Aveka Singh from India.
The Anteaters' history of success with players of Mexican descent continues with today's roster. Student-athletes like Desiree Mendoza and Mirayah Villalpando are of Mexican descent on the roster. Second-year Niko Hadzibabic brings her unique blend of Serbian and Ecuadorian heritage as well.
The 'Eaters are fueled by their Hawaiian representation with the dynamic duo of Tati Fung and Aislynn Crowder on the pitch who each were born and raised in Hawai'i. Fung came stateside when she was 10 to Fullerton and joined the 'Eaters after one season at the University of Texas. Crowder came from the islands to attend UCLA her first two seasons before coming to UC Irvine in 2022.
Madison Goerlinger returns to Southern California for her grad transfer season. The Orange-native spent four seasons at the University of Arizona scoring four goals and adding five assists in 70 matches starting 62 of them in the defensive third. She joins the group of transfers in recent years from Arizona, Oregon, Texas, and UCLA.
Sixth-year Anteater Glo Hinojosa is joined in the department by one of her siblings. Hinojosa is the oldest of six children in her family as the only sister to five younger brothers. One of her step brothers, Ricky Tibbett, is a grad transfer to UC Irvine in 2023-24 joining the baseball team from San Diego State.

Anteater Numbers

- The Big West Preseason Coaches Poll came out August 10 with the Anteaters projected to finish third. UCI has been projected first or third in each of the last five seasons. The 'Eaters received three first-place votes. LBSU was projected first and received two, Cal Poly received four and is projected to finish second, and Cal State Fullerton (4th) and UC Santa Barbara (6th) each received first-place votes.

- **The Preseason All-Big West Coaches' Team** of 11 players had the most from UC Irvine with three. **Gianna Creighton** received her second selection along with 2021, **Glo Hinojosa** is the second keeper to be named joining Maddie Newsom, and **Alyssa Moore** rounds out the trio, the second time three Anteaters have been selected joining the 2019 team.
 - **UC Irvine begins the 2023 season receiving votes** in the United Soccer Coaches national rankings. With 14 preseason votes, UCI sits two shy of joining the top 25. **UC Irvine finished the 2022 season ranked No. 18** according to United Soccer Coaches. It's just the second time in program history UCI finished the season ranked joining the 2010 squad that was No. 14.
 - **The Anteaters got their first taste of the rankings in 2022** earning two votes in the United Soccer Coaches weekly poll after the opening week, their first votes since 2011. Another publication, College Soccer News, put UCI at No. 30 in their weekly poll of the top 30. In addition, **Alyssa Moore** was featured on their National Team of the Week.
 - **Head Coach Scott Juniper is back with his staff for his 17th year** at UC Irvine and 16th at the helm. Juniper is the program's all-time winningest head coach with 160 wins including his 150th last year vs. Cal, four Big West regular season titles, and claimed his second Big West Tournament title in 2022. His teams have produced a Big West-leading 96 points (28-12-12) in conference play since 2016.
 - **Coach Juniper's support staff of P.J. Woolridge and Danielle de Seriere** return for their ninth season as a unit, second-longest tenured in California (Santa Clara). Altogether, the trio is 76-64-23 with the Anteaters entering the 2023 season
 - **Anteater Stadium hosted over 2,000 fans** for a second straight season when 2,068 were in attendance for the first No. 1-ranked team and first defending champion to visit UCI. It still stands second-highest in program history, third-highest in stadium history, and third crowd of over 2,000 fans in UCI soccer history
- 'Eaters Playing Professionally**
- **Eskilstuna United—Jessica Miclat** - the Anteater alum is with her third professional club having played seven matches in Denmark with AaB in 2021 and prior to that scored five goals in 15 matches for Aris Limassol in Cyprus. Miclat had been training with the Philippines National Team since helping them qualify for the 2023 Women's World Cup last year, but was not included in the final roster for the competition. Miclat has continued her play now in Sweden with Eskilstuna United
 - **Club America—Kiana Palacios** - the striker continues to shine with Club America helping them to a league title in the most recent season. She's scored 33 goals in 62 appearances for the club coming off a successful run in Spain with Real Sociedad scoring 17 times in 74 matches over three years and scoring the club's first cup title winning the Copa de la Reina. She also continues to impact with the national team with 29 caps to her name scoring nine times including four this year and posting past goals against squads like Nigeria, in a 1-0 win, Costa Rica, three goals in two comps vs. Jamaica, and her first international goal in 2018 to give Mexico the 2-1 lead in a friendly vs. the United States
 - **Pachuca FC—Janelly Farias** - the media sensation has made her name as an activist, reality show participant, and host and analyst for world cup coverage, but she continues to excel in LigaMX with her third club now. After three seasons with Chivas and five with Club America alongside Palacios and Camberos, she's manning the backline for Pachuca FC
 - **Club America—Destinee Manzo** - the 2023 graduate signed last month with Club America to play alongside Palacios, Manzo has played in a handful of matches in the new 2023-24 season
 - **Angel City FC—Scarlett Camberos** - after two seasons, 41 matches, and 18 goals with Club America in Mexico, Camberos joined Angel City FC of the NWSL this Spring. She was called up recently to the Mexican National Team for the Women's Gold Cup qualifiers, and promptly scored in their first match, a game-winner late to defeat Puerto Rico, 2-1.
 - **Pinzgau Saalfelden—Amber Huff** - shortly after the season's end, Huff joined FC Pinzgau Saalfelden of the Salzburger Frauenliga in Denmark where the club currently sits in second place

UCI women's soccer player and psychology major Kiera Smeenge on balancing sports with studies and life with type 1 diabetes

In the fall of 2020, Kiera Smeenge's life was filled with uncertainty. She had just arrived on the UCI campus as a freshman. She had been recruited as a defender to play for the women's soccer team, but due to Covid-19, the team didn't yet know if they'd have a season. Smeenge was excited and motivated for classes and training to begin, but something in her body was off.

At first, she attributed her symptoms to exercise. She was unusually thirsty and eating six meals a day yet was losing weight. She was overcome with brain fog and noticed she had trouble making decisions. When it became clear that something was wrong, she made an appointment to see a doctor. It was then she received the news that she had type 1 diabetes.

After having just arrived at Irvine, Smeenge moved back home to San Diego to recuperate and to get used to the routine of continuous glucose monitoring and insulin injections.

"This was a huge life adjustment," she says.



Resilience

Now in her fourth year, the psychology major and athlete is thriving. Smeenge was an All-Big West Honorable Mention in 2022 and selected for the Big West All-Freshman Team in 2021. She has started in 49 matches and played in 51 over her career. All of this has totaled to about 4,000 minutes of play. As (primarily) a defender, she has also been a part of 23 shutouts.

"She attacked this adversity with the same positivity and determination she shows on the field. I never heard her complain about it, and she has learned to manage it and remain a top, top player," says UCI women's soccer head coach Scott Juniper about her diagnosis.

It's impressive that Smeenge stands out on a team filled with talent. The UCI women's soccer team has won the Big West conference two years running, and last year, they made it all the way to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen, the farthest the team has ever reached in the tournament.

"She's a high-level competitor. Her opponents just can't get passed her. She is one of the first names on the team sheet because of her consistency and trustworthiness," says Juniper.

Smeenge attributes her resilience to the support of her parents, who have always been her biggest supporters and mentors.

"They taught me how to go with the ebbs and flows and how to deal with the stuff life throws at you," she says.

Soccer to scholar

Smeenge sees a silver lining in her diagnosis. Dealing with the condition has challenged her to succeed despite adversity. Since diabetes is something that must be constantly managed, she has been forced to pay even closer attention to her schedule. This, in turn, has helped her succeed as a full-time college student juggling an intense training schedule and extracurricular activities.

Due to her stellar GPA, Smeenge has twice been selected for the Big West Fall All-Academic Team, been included on the Dean's List every quarter she's been eligible and has been selected for the Big West Commissioner's Honor Roll with highest honors.

"Kiera is an exceptional example of a student-athlete," says Juniper.

Smeenge has an extensive schedule and to-do list (broken down by the hour) and says she's motivated to work hard for the people around her. As if juggling academics and athletics weren't enough, she also works as a peer health educator for the UCI Center for Student Wellness and Health Promotion where she works with the body image and nutrition team promoting health and wellness on campus.

"In soccer, I work hard for my teammates who rely on me on the field. Academically, I work hard so I can have a successful future. Plus, I naturally like to have a full workload," she says.

When it was time to choose a major, Smeenge was drawn to psychology out of a fascination of why people do the things they do and knowing she wanted to pursue a people-oriented field. Plus, when a family member experienced a brain injury, her interest in the field was piqued even more.

Goal-getter

Smeenge began playing soccer at age six and has loved it ever since. While the sport has been a large part of her life, she realizes it isn't everything. As she gets set to enjoy her last year as an Anteater, she maintains a healthy perspective.

"Soccer is a huge part of my life, but it's not all of who I am. It's important to keep that in mind," she says.

After she graduates in June, she plans on pursuing a career in public health. Specifically, she's interested in becoming a registered dietician and a certified diabetes educator to help others with the same disease.

But before then, she hopes to lead her team to another Best West championship.

WHY THE ANTEATER?

Two former water polo players, Pat Glasgow and Bob Ernst, are regarded as the main instigators to anoint the Anteater as the mascot for UC Irvine. The character is inspired by the character from the "B.C." comic by Johnny Hart. The student-athletes, along with fellow student Schuyler Hadley Bsasset III, organized a campaign to promote their idea ahead of the 195 student election.

Despite other candidates, the students chose the Anteater to represent the university with a commanding 55.9% majority. Peter The Anteater's famous "Zot" war cry is borrowed from the "B.C." comic strip, and still serves its purpose to this day.

The correct way to refer to the Anteaters is UC Irvine or UCI. Please do not refer to the university as "Cal-Irvine" or Cal State Irvine." The university name is written as "UC Irvine," not "U.C. Irvine," "UC-Irvine" or "Cal Irvine." This naming convention also applies to the majority of the UC-system universities (i.e. UC Riverside, UC Santa Barbara, UC San Diego). The only exceptions are UCLA and California (UC Berkeley).

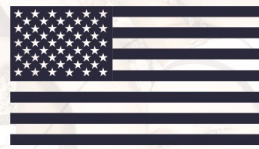
