All-Time Series: UCLA leads. 8-1

UCLA has won its last four games against CSUN, including a 77-45 decision last year (Nov. 29, 2015).

BRUINS AT A GLANCE

UCLA returns 10 players who competed last season, including four of the team's five starters – senior Isaac Hamilton, senior Bryce Alford, junior Thomas Welsh and sophomore Aaron Holiday. Other prominent contributors back from last season's team are junior G.G. Goloman and sophomores Alex Olesinski and Prince Ali. UCLA has added three freshmen – Ike Anigbogu, Lonzo Ball and TJ Leaf – who were nationally ranked among the top 25 incoming players by Scout.com and Rivals.com. In all, the roster includes three seniors, four juniors, three sophomores and five freshmen.

FRIDAY'S SEASON OPENER

The Bruins recorded their highest single-game point total since 1997 on Friday night, defeating the University of Pacific by a 119-80 margin before 8,743 in Pauley Pavilion. Freshman Lonzo Ball had 19 points, 11 assists and eight rebounds while classmate TJ Leaf finished with 22 points and a team-leading 15 rebounds. Senior Bryce Alford made 9 of 13 shots, including 6 of 9 from 3-point range, to total 30 points in the Bruins' season opener. Aaron Holiday had 18 points and five assists off the bench, and Isaac Hamilton finished with 17 points and eight assists.

MOST POINTS SINCE: UCLA logged its largest single-game point total since defeating Cal State Fullerton, 120-91, in Pauley Pavilion on Dec. 13, 1997. In addition, the Bruins set their program's all-time single-game record for most 3-point field goals made, connecting on 18 of 30 attempts from 3-point range.

SENIOR LEADERS

Bryce Alford and Isaac Hamilton, a pair of senior guards, have opened the season as two of the Pac-12 Conference's most veteran student-athletes. Alford has averaged 13.2 points in 106 career games. He enters this season as the only returning player in a Power 5 conference to have averaged at least 16.0 points, 5.0 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game last season. Hamilton is the Pac-12's leading returning scorer from last year, having averaged a team-best 16.8 points per game in 2015-16. Now in his third playing season, Hamilton has registered 13.6 points per game.

CRUNCHING NUMBERS

Ranked No. 16 in the preseason AP poll, UCLA returns 77.0 percent of its total scoring and 58.3 percent of its rebounding production from 2015-16. The Bruins bring back 87.3 percent of its assist production from last year. UCLA's returning players accounted for 74.9 percent of the team's minutes in 2015-16. Four returning players from last season's starting lineup averaged at least 10.0 points per game a year ago — Hamilton (16.8 ppg), Alford (16.1 ppg), Welsh (11.2 ppg) and Holiday (10.3 ppg). Those four players accounted for 73 percent of UCLA's scoring from last season.

SOPHOMORE SEASON

Among one of the most Pac-12 freshmen last season, Aaron Holiday scored 18 points and dished five assists (no turnovers) in UCLA's season-opening win last Friday. Holiday came off the bench midway in the first half, scoring UCLA's next 10 consecutive points over a 1-minute, 27-second span. Last season, Holiday averaged 10.3 points per game and started all 32 contests for UCLA. He led the Bruins in 3-point field goal percentage during his freshman campaign, shooting 41.9 percent from beyond the arc. He also averaged 4.0 assists per game last year.

NAISMITH PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Freshman Lonzo Ball was named the Naismith High School Player of the Year as a senior at Chino Hills High School in 2015-16 (23.9 ppg, 11.3 rpg, 11.5 apg), leading his team to a 35-O record and the CIF State Open Division Championship. The 6-foot-6 guard came within two rebounds shy of a triple-double in his collegiate debut on Friday night, recording 19 points, 11 assists and eight rebounds. Ball's 11 assists were one shy of the school's single-game freshman assist record – Pooh Richardson had 12 assists as a freshman in a double-overtime win at Washington State (Jan. 11, 1986).

GOOD COMPANY

Lonzo Ball became UCLA's first-ever freshman to record a point-assist double-double in his collegiate debut (19 points, 11 assists) on Friday night. In addition, TJ Leaf had a point-rebound double-double (22 points, 15 boards) in his UCLA debut last Friday. Ball and Leaf are the fourth and fifth players at UCLA in the last 25 seasons to have registered a double-double in their first games as UCLA freshmen. Charles O'Bannon (Nov. 27, 1993), Kevin Love (Nov. 8, 2007) and Kyle Anderson (Nov. 9, 2012) all had double-doubles in their first contests as freshmen at UCLA.

BRUINS DOWN UNDER

UCLA spent 10 full days in Australia in August 2016, going 2-1 in three preseason games (NCAA rules allow college programs to take a foreign trip once every four years). The Bruins spent four days in Sydney, three in Melbourne and three in Gold Coast before returning to Los Angeles the morning of Aug. 31. UCLA cruised past Sydney University, 123-76, in its first game. The Bruins followed with two games against professional teams in Australia's National Basketball League (NBL), losing to the Melbourne United (89-84) and defeating the Brisbane Bullets (94-91).

OVERSEAS HIGHLIGHTS: Among several off-the-court highlights for UCLA while in Australia included a tour of the Sydney Opera House, hiking to the top of the Sydney Harbour Bridge, a one-hour bike tour in Melbourne and a group surfing lesson in Surfer's Paradise, located in Gold Coast (nearly one hour south of Brisbane).

Media Availability

Steve Alford's weekly media availability typically takes place on the court in Pauley Pavilion at approximately 2:30 p.m. on Tuesdays (prior to practice). Players are available to the media after Coach Alford speaks. Members of the media are welcome to observe and record the first 15 minutes of practice those days. Media availability is not open to the public.

Credentials

Admission to the press seating and media room is by credential only. All credential requests should be made through UCLA's credential website at least two days prior to the game. Members of the media covering UCLA should request credentials for road games through Timiraos (via email, or phone at 310-206-0524).

Credential Pickup

Credentials are available during the week at the Athletic Communications Office. Credentials not claimed prior to game day will be available at Pauley Pavilion's "Will Call" window (Northwest corner of the arena). The media will call window and entrance opens two hours prior to tip-off.

Media Seating

A press pass enables entrance at Pauley Pavilion's Northwest media gate (across from the intramural field). Press seating is located in the upper level (Section 215) of the arena's south side (opposite team benches). Pauley Pavilion's media workroom is located in the Southeast corner of the building on the event level, adjacent to the Southeast elevator.

Head coach Steve Alford and selected players will be available to the media in Pauley Pavilion's media room following a 10-minute cooling off period after each game. UCLA's locker room is closed to the media. To access the media room during or after the game, follow the stairwell down to the court and proceed to the southeast corner (elevator access available at the arena's southeast corner). The visiting team's head coach will be available following a 10-minute cooling off period outside the visiting locker room (northwest corner, event level).

PRESEASON PROJECTIONS

UCLA was selected third in the preseason Pac-12 media poll, announced at Pac-12 media day in San Francisco on Oct. 21. Oregon was picked to finish first, collecting 23 of 27 first-place votes, while Arizona was selected second (and secured four first-place votes). UCLA was picked to finish third in the conference race. The Bruins last won the Pac-12 regular-season title in 2012-13 and most recently won the Pac-12 Tournament in 2014.

PREDICTIONS: Members of the media have correctly picked the regular-season winner of the conference 14 times in 24 tries, while the winner has been accurately chosen in 16 of the 27 all-time preseason votes. This marks the first time in the history of the 28-year preseason poll in which Oregon has been selected to finish first.

Isaac Hamilton - 6-5, 195 - senior, quard - Los Angeles, Calif. (St. John Bosco HS)

- Finished last season as the team's leading scorer (16.8 ppg), ranking third in that category in the Pac-12
- Entered this year as the Pac-12 Conference's leading returning scorer from last season (16.8 ppg)
- · Has scored in double figures in 52 of his 69 career games, having registered 17 points last Friday night
- Entering Sunday, he's scored 936 career points, just 64 shy of becoming UCLA's 54th player to score 1,000 points

Bryce Alford - 6-3, 185 - senior, guard - Albuquerque, N.M. (La Cueva HS)

- · Has finished each of the last two seasons as UCLA's second-leading scorer (16.1 ppg in 2015-16)
- Entered this season ranking first among all Pac-12 returners in career field goals (411) and 3-pointers (213)
- · Has recorded at least 100 assists and a near 2-to-1 assist-turnover ratio in each of his three collegiate seasons
- Currently ranks No. 26 on UCLA's all-time scoring list with 1,394 career points in 106 games (70 starts)

Thomas Welsh - 7-0, 245 - junior, center - Redondo Beach, Calif. (Loyola HS)

- Averaged 11.2 points and a team-leading 8.5 rebounds per game as a sophomore in 2015-16
- · Ranked third last season in the Pac-12 with a 59.0 field goal percentage as a sophomore
- · Has totaled 74 blocks in 68 games (1.09 bpg), currently the sixth-highest career blocks average in school history
- · Registered a team-high 10 double-doubles as a sophomore last season, scoring in double figures in 20 games

Aaron Holiday - 6-1, 185 - sophomore, guard - Chatsworth, Calif. (Campbell Hall HS)

- Recorded 10.3 points and 4.0 assists per game as a freshman in 2015-16
- Led the Bruins last season in three-point field goal percentage (41.9), making 39 of 93 attempts
- · Has scored in double figures in 21 of his 33 career games, including an 18-point effort last Friday evening
- · Dished more assists (127) than any freshman at UCLA since his older brother, Jrue Holiday, had 129 in 2008-09

WELCOME TO WESTWOOD

UCLA's freshman class has been tabbed as high as No. 3, nationally, by Scout.com. The group includes guard Lonzo Ball, forward TJ Leaf and forward/center lke Anigbogu (pronounced ee-KAY ah-nee-BOH-go). Leaf averaged 28.4 points, 12.4 rebounds and 5.3 assists per game as a senior at Foothills Christian High School last year. He led his high school program to the CIF San Diego Section Championship. Anigbogu registered 17.1 points and 9.6 rebounds in 25 games as a senior last season. He shot 61 percent from the field and tallied nine double-doubles for Centennial High School.

ABOUT THE MATADORS

CSUN enters the 2016-17 season under the direction of fourth-year head coach Reggie Theus, who enjoyed a 13-year NBA career from 1979-1991. The Matadors recorded a 96-72 victory against Pomona-Pitzer in their season-opening contest on Friday night in Northridge, Calif. Darin Johnson scored 20 points to lead a group of four CSUN players who scored in double figures (along with Kendall Smith, Aaron Parks and Tavrion Dawson). UCLA last faced CSUN on Nov. 29, 2015, logging a 77-45 win over the Matadors in Pauley Pavilion.

McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

UCLA has seen 41 of its student-athletes compete in the annual McDonald's All-American Game, with only Duke and Kentucky having enrolled more McDonald's All-Americans. Freshmen Lonzo Ball and TJ Leaf competed in the March 2016 McDonald's All-American Game in Chicago. Ball tied the single-game record with 13 assists, joining with Leaf to help lift the West past the East, 114-107. Four of UCLA's players on this season's roster have competed in the McDonald's All-American Game – Ball and Leaf in 2016, Thomas Welsh in 2014 and Isaac Hamilton in 2013.

EXPERIENCED TRAVELERS

Over the course of the last four years, the UCLA basketball program has accrued plenty of mileage. Destinations away from the West Coast have included foreign trips to China (Aug. 2012) and Australia (Aug. 2016), the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament in the Bahamas (Nov. 2014), last season's Maui Invitational in Lahaina (Nov. 2015), three trips to New York City (2012, 2013 and 2015), a trip to Chicago (Nov. 2014) and postseason games in Austin, Texas (March 2013), San Diego (March 2014), Memphis, Tenn. (March 2014), Louisville, Ky. (March 2015) and Houston, Texas (March 2015).

DON'T FORGET VEGAS: UCLA has played in the Pac-12 Tournament in Las Vegas the last four seasons. The Bruins competed in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational in Nov. 2013 and will face Ohio State (Dec. 17) at T-Mobile Arena as part of the CBS Sports Classic. This season's Pac-12 Tournament will be played at T-Mobile Arena.

1,000 POINT CLUB

Senior Isaac Hamilton has scored 936 career points, needing just 64 more to become the 54th player at UCLA to have scored at least 1,000 for the Bruins. Now in his third season on the court at UCLA, Hamilton has averaged 13.6 points per game (69 career games, 69 starts). Senior Bryce Alford crossed the 1,000-point threshold last season and has now tallied 1,394 points (ranks No. 26 on the all-time list). Other UCLA players who have recently joined that 1,000-point club include Jordan Adams (2013), Norman Powell (2015) and Tony Parker (2016).

INJURY UPDATE

Sophomore guard Prince Ali underwent surgery to repair a torn meniscus (right knee) on July 15, 2016. He is expected to return during the first half of UCLA's 2016-17 season. Freshman forward/center lke Anigbogu had arthroscopic surgery on his right knee on Tuesday, Oct. 25, and is expected to be sidelined for four weeks. Sophomore Alex Olesinski did not play against Pacific last Friday (left foot injury) and is day-to-day.

LOCAL THANKSGIVING

After having spent the Thanksgiving holiday playing in the Bahamas (2014) and Maui (2015) the previous two seasons, UCLA will compete in this season's Wooden Legacy, tipping off against Portland the night of Thursday, Nov. 24. The Bruins will face either Dayton or Nebraska on Friday, Nov. 25. UCLA's games on Thursday and Friday will be played at Cal State Fullerton's Titan Gym. The final day of games is slated for Sunday, Nov. 27, at the Honda Center in Anaheim.

THE ASSIST GOES TO ...

UCLA concluded the 2015-16 season as the only Pac-12 program to have at least three players with 100 or more assists. Bryce Alford finished with a team-high 167 assists, the second-highest total of any Pac-12 player, while Aaron Holiday had 127 anad Isaac Hamilton totaled 106. That marked the first season since 2009-10 in which at least three Bruins had 100 or more assists (prior to 2009-10, that feat had not been accomplished at UCLA since 1997-98).

THREE-POINT THREAT

Bryce Alford ranks first in school history in single-season 3-pointers made and is second in career 3-pointers. He made a school-record 93 treys in 2014-15 (sophomore) and has now made 219 three-pointers, second-most all-time at UCLA behind Jason Kapono (317). Alford made 73 treys last season, becoming UCLA's first player since Arron Afflalo (in 2005-06, 2006-07) to have made at least 70 in consecutive seasons.

THAT'S A LONG STREAK: The Bruins have made at least one 3-point attempt in each of their previous 554 games. The last game UCLA played in which it didn't make a 3-pointer was against Stanford on Feb. 3, 2000.

STEADY PROGRESSION

Junior center Thomas Welsh averaged 11.2 points and a team-leading 8.5 rebounds per game as a sophomore in 2015-16. He led the Bruins in blocked shots (32) and has registered 74 career blocked shots, needing 18 more to crack the school's all-time top 10 leaders in blocks. Last season, Welsh earned second-team Pac-12 All-Academic acclaim, becoming UCLA's first player since the 2009-10 season to earn the conference's academic honor (Mustafa Abdul-Hamid was a first-team selection and Malcolm Lee was a second-team honoree that year).

POINTS AND ASSISTS

Bryce Alford has become the sixth player in school history, on record, to have scored at least 1,300 career points and registered 400 or more assists. Alford has become the first UCLA player to equal or eclipse those two career totals since Darren Collison, who amassed 1,634 points and 577 assists over four seasons (2006-09).

MO OSTIN BASKETBALL CENTER

Construction has begun on the men's and women's basketball programs' new on-campus training and performance facility, known going forward as the Mo Ostin Basketball Center. Named after legendary music industry executive and philanthropist Morris "Mo" Ostin, who generously committed \$10 million to the project, the comprehensive, state-of-the-art facility will be located near Pauley Pavilion at the south end of the Los Angeles Tennis Center.

The Bruins' new training and performance center is expected to be completed in the fall of 2017. Designed by award-winning architectural design firm Kevin Daly Architects in partnership with globally acclaimed high-performance design firm AECOM, the Mo Ostin Basketball Center will include locker rooms, athletic training areas, a strength and conditioning facility, coaches' offices, team meeting rooms, equipment rooms and video rooms among its various amenities. In addition, the facility will incorporate several elements paying homage to the rich history of UCLA Basketball.

The project and its corresponding campaign to raise private funds is part of ths \$4.2 billion campus-wide UCLA Centennial Campaign that was annouced on May 15, 2014. The UCLA Athletic Department aims to surpass its \$260 million goal by 2019. The Mo Ostin Basketball Center directly addresses the Department's primary Centennial Campaign objective: to create a financially sustainable future to build upon UCLA's standing as the premier intercollegiate athletics program in the nation.

- Since 1948, UCLA has produced the second-most NBA draft selections (114) ... Kentucky tops that list with 121 draft picks. Trailing Kentucky and UCLA on the all-time list are North Carolina (110) and Duke (86) ... with 13 former players on NBA rosters, UCLA leads all Pac-12 programs in that category and ranks fifth, nationally ... last season, 16 Bruins competed in the NBA, including five players from UCLA's 2013-14 squad.
- Former UCLA standout Russell Westbrook earned MVP honors at the 2016 NBA All-Star Game (Feb. 14) for the second straight season ... Westbrook was selected to compete in his fifth career All-Star Game, making his first-ever start ... Westbrook concluded the regular season having averaged 23.5 points, 7.8 rebounds and 10.4 assists per game.
- Former UCLA guards stole the show at both NBA All-Star Weekends in 2015 (New York) and 2016 (Toronto) ... during each All-Star Weekend, Zach LaVine won the annual Slam Dunk Contest one night before Westbrook captured NBA All-Star Game Most Valuable Player (MVP) accolades.
- Seven UCLA players under head coach Steve Alford have advanced to the NBA. Four of those Bruins were first-round NBA draft picks (Zach LaVine, Jordan Adams, Kyle Anderson and Kevon Looney). In addition, Norman Powell was a second-round pick in 2015, while Travis Wear and David Wear joined NBA teams as undrafted free agents.

UCLA AND THE NBA

Matt Barnes entered the 2016-17 NBA season as the most veteran former UCLA player in the league (now in his 14th season). A second-round pick (No. 46 overall) by the Memphis Grizzlies in 2002, Barnes didn't make his NBA debut until Jan. 19, 2004, for the Los Angeles Clippers. He entered this season having played in 855 career NBA contests. UCLA's second-most veteran current NBA player is Trevor Ariza, who spent the 2003-04 campaign in Westwood as a freshman. Ariza enters 13th season in the league, his third consecutive year with the Houston Rockets.

CHALLENGING SLATE

Among Pac-12 teams, UCLA's non-conference schedule last year was rated the most challenging by KenPom.com. Overall, the Bruins played seven games against teams ranked in the top 20 of the AP poll.

AGAINST NUMBER ONE

UCLA has faced the nation's No. 1-ranked team four times since the start of the 2013-14 season. Last season, UCLA downed No. 1 Kentucky, 87-77, in Pauley Pavilion on Dec. 3, 2015. In 2014-15, UCLA faced No. 1 Kentucky in Chicago on Dec. 20, 2014. In 2013-14, UCLA lost to No. 1 Arizona in Pauley Pavilion (Jan. 9, 2014) before losing to No. 1 Florida in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16. UCLA has gone 11-22 all-time against the Associated Press' No. 1-ranked team.

- Prior to UCLA's win over No. 1 Kentucky last December, UCLA hadn't defeated the No. 1-ranked team in five previous tries. Previously, UCLA had last downed the No. 1-ranked team on March 13, 2003, upending No. 1 Arizona, 96-89, in overtime in a first-round Pac-10 Tournament game. The Bruins were unable to get the win in meetings against top-ranked Stanford (Feb. 2004), Kansas (Dec. 2009), Arizona (Jan. 2014), Florida (March 2014) and Kentucky (Dec. 2014).
- In 2013-14, UCLA had two games against No. 1-ranked teams. The Bruins lost to Arizona, 79-75, in Pauley Pavilion on Jan. 9, 2014, when the Wildcats entered with a 15-0 record and No. 1 ranking. UCLA had its season end against No. 1 Florida in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 (game played on March 27, 2014 in Memphis).
- UCLA's win over Kentucky on Dec. 3, 2015, marked the program's first victory over a top-10 team (AP poll) since March 15, 2014, when the Bruins downed No. 4 Arizona, 75-71, in the 2014 Pac-12 Tournament championship game. UCLA landed its first home win over the nation's No. 1 team since Jan. 12, 2002 (vs. No. 1 Kansas, 87-77).
- Since the start of the 1999-2000 season, the Bruins have gone 5-8 against the nation's No. 1-ranked team. Eight of those 13 contests took place prior to 2004-05. Prior to two meetings in 2013-14 against Arizona and Florida, the Bruins had not faced the nation's No. 1-ranked team (AP poll) since Dec. 6, 2009 (Kansas).



UCLA BASKETBALL ON THE AIR

For the ninth straight season, UCLA men's basketball games will be produced by the UCLA Sports Network from IMG, with AM 570 Fox Sports LA in Los Angeles serving as the flagship station for the network. This is the 20th year of UCLA's partnership with AM 570 Fox Sports LA owner Clear Channel. Other stations on the UCLA Sports Network from IMG include KXEX (1550 AM) in Fresno and KSLK (96.1 FM) in Visalia.

In 2016-17, all 31 regular-season basketball games will be televised live. The Bruins will have at least 10 games broadcast by the ESPN family of networks. Six games will be televised by F0X Sports, and 12 will be carried by Pac-12 Networks. CBS will televise UCLA's game against Ohio State on Dec. 17 in Las Vegas and the Bruins' home game against Arizona on Jan. 21.

UCLA hired Josh Lewin as the program's new play-byplay voice in June 2016. He took over for Bill Roth, who was named to the position in April 2015. In addition to calling UCLA men's basketball and football games, Lewin is currently in his 12th season as the voice of the San Diego Chargers and recently completed his fifth season handling play-by-play duties for the New York Mets.

Lewin brings to Westwood over two decades of experience calling NFL, MLB, NHL and NCAA football and basketball contests. From 2002-2010, he was the television play-by-play broadcaster for the Texas Rangers and was a part of Fox's Saturday national baseball coverage including serving as the "dugout reporter" for the American League Championship Series and National League Championship Series.

Joining Lewin at his broadcast position will be Tracy Murray, who will begin his eighth season as an analyst. Murray, who played at UCLA from 1990-92 before enjoying a 12-year NBA career, spent the 2015-16 season as a shooting coach for the Los Angeles Lakers. He served as a radio analyst with UCLA from the 2007-08 season through the Bruins' 2014-15 campaign, working alongside Chris Roberts.

One of the most decorated players in UCLA basketball history, Murray currently ranks ninth on the program's all-time scoring list, having recorded 1,792 points in 98 career games. A three-year standout for the Bruins, Murray averaged 18.3 points and 6.4 rebounds per game while helping lead UCLA to three straight appearances in the NCAA Tournament – including a Sweet 16 trip in 1990 and an Elite Eight trip in 1992.

Murray, who starred at Glendora High School (Glendora, Calif.), was selected in the first round of the 1992 NBA Draft by the San Antonio Spurs following his junior season with the Bruins (1991-92).

Last season, the Bruins went 3-4 against teams ranked in that week's AP top 25 poll. This list also includes all postseason games versus ranked opponents. UCLA's seven regular-season games against top 25 ranked teams in 2015-16 marked the Bruins' highest such total since 2007-08 (which was also six).

POSITIONAL WATCH LISTS

Four of UCLA's players, including two freshmen, have been named to 20-man positional watch lists, as announced in October by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Below is a synopsis of UCLA's four "watch list" candidates.

BOB COUSY AWARD: 6-foot-6 freshman Lonzo Ball has been named to the Bob Cousy Award watch list. The Cousy Award is annually awarded to the nation's premier point guard. Ball (Chino Hills, Calif.) earned McDonald's All-America honors as a senior in high school last season, averaging a triple-double for his high school program.

JERRY WEST AWARD: Senior Isaac Hamilton, UCLA's leading returning scorer from last season, has been named to the watch list for the Jerry West Award, bestowed annually to the nation's top shooting guard. Hamilton shot 47.2 percent from the field last season, including a 37.7 percentage from 3-point range.

KARL MALONE AWARD: 6-foot-10 freshman TJ Leaf is among 20 watch list candidates for the Karl Malone Award, annually presented to the nation's top power forward. Leaf, who excelled at Foothills Christian High School (El Cajon, Calif.), played alongside UCLA teammate Lonzo Ball in last season's McDonald's All-American Game.

KAREEM ABDUL-JABBAR AWARD: Junior Thomas Welsh has been named as a watch list candidate for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award, honoring the game's top center each season. Welsh, a 7-foot center from Redondo Beach, Calif., averaged 11.2 points and a team-leading 8.5 rebounds per game in 2015-16.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE NOTES

UCLA has three triple-doubles on record since the assist became an official statistic in 1983-84 (UCLA's record book also credits Bill Walton with a triple-double on Dec. 8, 1973). Kyle Anderson had the Bruins' most recent triple-double, totaling 13 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists against Morehead State on Nov. 22, 2013 in an 81-70 win in Pauley Pavilion. Other triple-doubles have been accomplished by Toby Bailey (23 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists) against Stephen F. Austin (Dec. 18, 1995) and by Jelani McCoy (15 points, 10 rebounds and 11 blocks) versus Maryland on Dec. 9, 1995. Walton's triple-double in 1973 featured 25 points, 16 rebounds and 11 assists against SMU.

TWO REBOUNDS SHY: Freshman guard Lonzo Ball was just two rebounds shy of securing a triple-double in his first-ever regular-season game for the Bruins last Friday evening. Ball had 19 points, 11 rebounds and eight assists in the Bruins' 119-80 season-opening win against Pacific in Pauley Pavilion.

ON DECK FOR UCLA

The Bruins are in the midst of playing seven games in a 17-day span that opened with Friday night's win against Pacific in Pauley Pavilion. Next up, UCLA hosts CSUN on Sunday, Nov. 13, before taking on San Diego on Thursday, Nov. 17. The Bruins' matchup against San Diego marks UCLA's third regular-season game of the year. Game time next Thursday is 8 p.m. (PT). UCLA has recorded a 3-1 all-time record against USD. Most recently, the Bruins secured a 75-68 win over the Toreros in Pauley Pavilion on Dec. 7, 2014.

LONG BEACH STATE (Nov. 20): The Bruins will face Long Beach State on Sunday, Nov. 20, marking the third consecutive season in which these two SoCal schools will face each other. Last season, UCLA handed the visiting 49ers an 83-76 defeat in Pauley Pavilion (Dec. 6). The Bruins own a 14-1 all-time mark against Long Beach State. The 49ers opened their 2016-17 campaign on Friday with a 95-59 win over Cal State Los Angeles.

UCLA WINS ITS SEASON OPENER

Bruins cruise past Pacific, 119-80, in Pauley Pavilion

Freshmen Lonzo Ball and TJ Leaf each recorded doubledoubles and Bryce Alford scored a game-high 30 points to lead No. 16 UCLA past Pacific, 119-80, in the Bruins' season opener in Pauley Pavilion on Friday night.

Ball finished with 19 points and a game-high 11 assists, committing just one turnover, while classmate Leaf had 22 points and a team-leading 15 rebounds. Ball was two rebounds shy of a triple-double, grabbing eight boards in his official collegiate debut.

In addition, Aaron Holiday recorded 18 points and five assists off the bench and Isaac Hamilton netted 17 points and eight assists.

UCLA was on fire from 3-point range, setting a school singlegame record with 18 made 3-pointers (on 30 attempts). That also marked a single-game record for the most made 3-point shots in Pauley Pavilion — previously, Arizona had made 14 in a game in Pauley in Jan. 2004.

The outcome of Friday night's season opener was never in doubt, as the Bruins built an 11-point lead with 13:09 to play in the game, leading 22-11, before securing a 20-point cushion at 47-27 with 5:56 left in the opening half.

Not missing a beat after a strong freshman season, Holiday entered the contest midway through the first half and proceeded to score UCLA's next 10 points over a 1:27 span. Holiday's spark helped UCLA extend a 17-9 cushion to 24-13 by the 12:34 mark.

UCLA led by a 63-39 margin at halftime and never saw its lead fall to fewer than 25 points through the game's final 18 minutes.

- Leads all coaches, age 51 and under, in career NCAA victories with 529 (Steve Alford will turn 52 on Nov. 23, 2016) ... entered the 2016-17 season with a 528-275 record in 25 years and a 450-246 record at the NCAA Division I level the past 21 seasons ... has averaged 24.4 wins per season the past nine years (2007-08 through 2015-16).
- In his first season as UCLA's head coach (2013-14), he steered the Bruins to a 28-9 overall record, a trip to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 and the Pac-12 Tournament title ... in 2014-15, he guided UCLA back to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 after having advanced to the Pac-12 Tournament semifinals.
- While in Albuquerque, helped New Mexico secure four MWC regular-season championships and two tournament titles ... coached the Lobos to its two highest single-season victory totals (30 wins in 2009-10, 29 wins in 2012-13).
- Only head coach in school history at lowa to have led the Hawkeyes to the Big Ten Tournament's title game (accomplishing that feat in 2001, 2002 and 2006) ... led lowa to the Big Ten Tournament Championship in 2001 and 2006 ... established a school-record seven consecutive winning seasons at lowa (2001-2007).
- Guided Missouri State (then named Southwest Missouri State) to its only appearance in the NCAA Tournament's "Sweet 16" in 1999 ... took over as head coach at Missouri State in the summer of 1995 at age 31 after having led Manchester College to the NCAA Division III championship game in March 1995.

Steve Alford enters his 26th season as a collegiate head coach in 2016-17. In his first two seasons at UCLA, he led the Bruins to two Sweet 16 appearances (2014, 2015) and one Pac-12 Tournament crown (2014).

ELITE COMPANY

Steve Alford is one of 12 head coaches to have led at least four NCAA Division I programs to the NCAA Tournament (Missouri State, lowa, New Mexico and UCLA). His UCLA teams advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in 2014 and 2015. In 2014, he became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the Pac-12 Tournament title in his first year as head coach.

The other 11 coaches to have led at least four NCAA Division I teams to the NCAA Tournament include John Beilein, Lefty Driesell, Cliff Ellis, Larry Eustachy, Jim Harrick, Lon Kruger, Fran McCaffery, Tom Penders, Rick Pitino, Tubby Smith and Eddie Sutton. Eight of those 11 coaches are active head coaches.

Of the 12 coaches who have led four different schools to the NCAA Division I Tournament, only five have won at least one game at all four schools. Lon Kruger has won at least one game at five schools.

Ed Schilling Alma Mater: Miami (Ohio) '88 Assistant Coach, 4th season at UCLA

- Now in his fourth season on the Bruins' coaching staff after an extensive career working with NBA, NCAA Division I and high school programs ... in his first two seasons at UCLA, helped send seven players to the NBA (including four first-round NBA Draft selections).
- Through three seasons at UCLA, has helped guide the Bruins to a 65-40 overall record, including back-to-back trips to the Sweet 16 in 2014 and 2015.
- Prior to arriving at UCLA in April 2013, Schilling spent the previous four years as head coach at Park Tudor High School (Indiana) in addition to specializing in individual skills development programs with NBA players (St. Vincent's Sports Performance and its NBA readiness program) ... he also worked with Adidas Nations and Champions Academy.
- Pre-draft preparation with the St. Vincent's Sports Performance program included working with No. 1 NBA Draft selection Greg Oden, Mike Conley, Mario Chalmers, Gordon Heyward, Jeff Teague, Marquis Teague, Carl Landry and many others.
- Served as head coach at Wright State from 1997-2003 ... was an assistant coach under John Calipari at Memphis in 2003-04 and 2004-05 ... also worked with Coach Calipari with the New Jersey Nets in 1996-97 and at the University of Massachusetts (Amherst) on the Minutemen's NCAA Final Four team in 1995-96.
- When John Calipari was named the New Jersey Nets' VP of Basketball Operations and basketball coach in 1996-97, Schilling joined him as an assistant coach ... Schilling's rise in the coaching profession was chronicled in Sports Illustrated, as he became the only coach to advance from the high school coaching ranks to the Final Four and then to the bench of an NBA team in a period of 310 days.

- Among the all-time great point guards at UCLA, Edney is now in his seventh season as the program's director of operations ... serves as a liasion to the athletic administration and other school officials in his current role and handles day-to-day operational duties.
- As a four-year letterwinner, Edney led UCLA to the 1995 NCAA title as a senior ... one of the nation's top point guards, he enjoyed a tremendous career in Westwood from 1992-95.
- After his collegiate career concluded, he played four seasons in the NBA (1996-98, 2001) and spent nearly 10 years playing internationally in Europe ... at UCLA, Edney was a three-time first-team All-Pac-10 selection ... in UCLA's career record book, he still ranks second all-time on the assists list (652).


